The Eagles And The Wolfpack

- Boston College holds an 8-4 all-time record against NC State with two meetings coming in the 1930s and the rest after the Eagles joined the Atlantic Coast Conference in 2005.
- The Eagles are 7-3 against the Wolfpack since joining the league.
- The home team has the advantage in the series as it as won nine of the 12 times. The Eagles won by a touchdown in Raleigh in 2008 and had a decisive 16-point win last season for the two ACC road wins.
- The Eagles are 6-1 at The Heights with the lone loss coming in 1937.
- The game marks the final home contest of the season for BC. Twentythree seniors will be honored before the start of the game.

BC-State Ties

- Defensive coordinator **Don Brown** was the DC at Connecticut in 2011-12 with NC State safeties coach/co-special teams coordinator Clayton White. The Huskies were 5-7 that season.
- Running backs coach Al Washington was a defensive graduate assistant at NC State in 2008 under then head coach Tom O'Brien. The Wolfpack was 6-7 that season.
- NC State offensive coordinator Matt Canada coach at his alma mater Indiana from 2004-10. BC offensive line coach Justin Frye was a member of the Hoosiers' 0-line from 2002-06 and then was a graduate assistant on the staff with Canada in 2007-08.

RALEIGH, N.C. - Boston College defeated NC State, 30-14, on Oct. 11, 2014 at Carter-Finley Stadium. Quarterback Tyler Murphy rushed for 132 yards and scored two touchdowns to lead the Eagles to their first ACC win of the season.

While the game started quickly with the Eagles scoring on their first three opening drives and State scoring on its first two, it did not turn out to be high-scoring set it started out as. The BC defense held strong, allowing just 43 rushing yards and 217 yards overall. NC State did not score after the first quarter, turned it over twice and quarterback Jacoby Brissett was sacked four times.

Murphy was 12-for-19 through the air with 101 yards and no interceptions. Brissett was 14-for-30 on the night, tallying 174 passing yards and one interception.

The Eagles began the game with an eight-play, 75-yard drive that lasted just under four minutes. **Jon Hilliman** capped it off with a 10-yard TD run with just over 11 minutes to play in the first quarter.

The Wolfpack answered right back with a 65-yard, 13-play drive that lasted just over four minutes. Tony Creecy ran it in from two yards out to even the score.

Murphy scored the next time down the field to put BC back by seven. With 3:43 to play in the quarter, he found a hole toward the outside, got a block by **Josh Bordner** and accelerated down the sideline for a 47-vard score.

It took the Pack less than two minutes to answer and retie the game. Brissett hit David Grinnage on a 16-yard pass with 1:45 left in the quarter to even it at 14.

The Eagles notched their third rushing touchdown of the half to retake the lead. On a nine-play, 75-yard drive, BC ran the ball seven times and Murphy hit **Sherman Alston** for a 14-yard pass for the longest of the young wide receiver's career before Alston ran 24 yards into the end zone for his second TD of the season.

The second half started with rain and a huge play by defensive lineman **Brian Mihalik**. After receiving the kick, on second-and-16, Mihalik intercepted Brissett's pass and returned it 21 yards to NC State's 10-yard line. The teams then were forced to evacuate the field due to lightning in the area.

After a 57-minutes rain delay, **Mike Knoll** hit his first career field-goal attempt - a 28-yarder - to put the Eagles up, 24-14, with just under 12 minutes to go in the third quarter.

Murphy scored his second TD of the game with five minutes to go in the game. In another drive laden with rushes, the BC QB took it 26 yards to put the Eagles up, 30-14. The extra point failed after a botched snap.

As the Wolfpack attempted to come back, Josh Keyes sacked Brissett, forcing him to fumble. Steven Daniels picked up the ball and securing the BC win.

A Fixture on Top

 The Eagles have allowed 223.8 yards per game, which is first in the nation. They have maintained the No. 1 spot for eight of the nine weeks of the 2015 season.

 The Eagles have also allowed just 64.2 rushing yards per game, just 1.90 yards per carry, both tops in the country.

• The BC D has surrendered the fourth-fewest points: just 13.3 per game.

 The Eagles gave up 34 points to No. 5 Clemson on Oct. 17, more than they had allowed through the first half of the sesaon. In the first six games, opponents scored just 29 total points only two touchdowns - when the defense was on the field.

 BC was the first FBS school to allow two or fewer TDs through the first six games since Wisconsin allowed two in 2004.

 Boston College holds 14 spots in the top three in defensive categories and 21 top-10 spots.

Starting Out with Stops

 Boston College allowed just three points in the first two games and 29 to the offense over the first six.

 Maine scored three on Sept. 5 and in the week two game against Howard, the Eagles did not concede a point. It was the first shutout since 2009, when BC shutout Northeastern, 54-0, in Chestnut Hill on Sept. 5.

 The BC defense allowed a game-opening touchdown drive to No. 9 Florida State (Sept. 18) but the only other score was on an offensive turnover. The Eagles did not allowed a touchdown drive of more than 15 yards until the loss to No. 5 Clemson on Oct. 17.

• In the victory over Northern Illinois (Sept. 26), the Eagles conceded one offensive touchdown and they did not allow one for 10 start quarters, giving up four field goals to Duke (3; Oct. 3) and Wake Forest (1; Oct. 10) until the loss at Clemson.

 The BC defense allowed 10 points at Louisville (Oct. 24), all in the first half.

 The 11 yards BC allowed Howard were the fewest in school history.

 The Eagles defense also allowed just two first downs to the Bison, which is the fewest in school history.

 BC is third in the nation with a 22.9 percent opposition thirddown converstion rate. The Eagles have allowed just 30 on the year.

Special Special Teams

- The Eagles' special teams coverage is improved under firstyear coach Coleman Hutzler.
- BC has blocked three punts and returned one for a touchdown.
- Junior LB Matt Milano has blocked two punts, which is tied for second in the nation.
- Junior DB John Johnson blocked a punt in the second quarter at Louisville (Oct. 24) and freshman WR Elijah Robinson returned it 12 yards for his first career touchdown.

 The Eagles are one of 16 schools to have three blocked kicks in 2013, which his tied for sixth overall.

- Boston College is not the only defensive juggernaut in the Atlantic Coast Conference.
- While the Eagles rank first in many defensive categories, three other ACC teams rank in the top 10 and five others the top 25.

Swigert Nominated for Courage Award

Senior WR **Bobby Swigert** was the first weekly nominee for the 2015 Orange Bowl-FWAA Courage Award.

He returned to the gridiron on Sept. 5, 2014 for BC's season opener against Maine after missing two full seasons due to complications from a knee injury sustained against Notre Dame on Nov. 10, 2012. After tearing most of the ligaments in his knee, Swigert was continually sidelined with infections, undergoing 11 surgeries in all.

The Louisville, Ohio, native made two catches for 16 yards, including an 11-vard grab in the end zone with 26 seconds left in the first half to break a 3-3 tie.

One for the Books

Boston College defeated Howard, 76-0, on Sept. 12. The point total tied a school record for the second-most points in a game with a 76-O victory over former instate rival Holy Cross on Nov. 26, 1949 and was two points shy of the school record of 78 in a 78-0 win over St. Anselm on Sept. 20, 1941.

It's was the most points the Eagles have scored since joining the ACC in 2005.

The Eagles scored 41 points in the first quarter, which was just eight shy of the NCAA FBS record of 49 held by three teams.

The Eagles scored 62 points in the first half, which is the most by any FBS team in the last 10 years.

Some Experience Needed

Boston College is tied for fifth in the Atlantic Coast Conference for number of graduated players on the roster with seven. Virginia leads the way with 12. Syracuse and Pittsburgh each have

eight, while Georgia Tech also has seven graduates.

Boston College is playing 10 straight weeks of football before a bve week on Nov. 14.

The Eagles are tied for 13th for the most consecutive weeks of games with nine other schools. Colorado and Hawaii lead the way with 13 straight weeks.

64 of 97 members of the Boston College football team are freshmen, redshirt freshmen or sophomores.

There are only 16 seniors and one graduate student on the team. In that group of seniors, only four are skill positions (QB, RB, WR, TE), tying for 19th in the country with the fewest. UCF has the

least with none. Six schools, including Piitsburgh, Syracuse and Wake Forest, have one.

Digging Deep

Already a young team, the Eagles have used many first-players in the 2015 season.

Injuries to sophomore QB Darius Wade, sophomore RB Jon Hilliman, senior TE Mike Giacone and more have forced third-year head coach Steve Addazio to shift players around and thurst new faces into the game.

35 first-time players have seen time for BC this season.

That number is third in the country with Colorado. Kansas leads the way with 38 and TCU has played 36 first-time players.

The Eagles are also tied for seventh in the nation for most freshmen played with 26. Sixteen true freshmen and 10 redshirt freshmen have seen time on the field. Rice leads the way with 31.


Getting Back on Track

The Eagles have lost the last five games, which is the longest losing streak under third-year head coach Steve Addazio.

Under the tutelage of Addazio, BC only lost two games in a row three times (once in 2014, twice in 2013).

The last time BC lost five games in a row was in 2012, dropping games to Northwestern (Sept. 15), No. 17 Clemson (Sept. 29), Army (Oct. 6), No. 11 Florida State (Oct. 13) and Georgia Tech (Oct. 20).

That year, the Eagles went 2-10.



EAGLES OFFENSE

Fadule Takes Flight

 Freshman QB John Fadule played in his first career game on Oct. 31 against Virginia Tech.

 The Wellesley, Mass., native is a walk-on and grew up just eight miles from The Heights.

In his first appearance in the Maroon and Gold, Fadule tallied 143
passing yards - the second-highest output of the season for the
Eagles. Sophomore Darius Wade threw for 155 against Maine on
Sept. 5.

 Fadule was 8-for-20 with an interception. He also tallied a teamhigh 53 yards on 15 carries and on his first career play from scrimmage, notched a 25-yard run.

Fadule is believed to the first freshman walk-on to play significant time in a Boston College game since the World War II era.

 Seven other schools have played a walk-on quarterback this season (Arizona, Fresno State, Kansas, Kansas State (2), USTA, Oregon and Syracuse).

Keeping Up Under Center

 Four different quarterbacks have played quarterback for Boston College with three making starts.

 Sophomore QB Darius Wade started the first three games before suffering a broken ankle against Florida State (Sept. 18), sidelining him for the rest of the season.

 Redshirt freshman Troy Flutie and true freshman Jeff Smith split time under center in three games with Flutie getting the start before head coach Steve Addazio announced that Smith would get the start and play the entire game at No. 5/6 Clemson (Oct. 17).

 Smith was the first true freshman to start at quaterback for BC since Chase Rettig (2010-13) did so against Notre Dame (Oct. 2) in 2010.

 Smith was injured at Louisville (Oct. 17) and Flutie started against Virginia Tech (Oct. 31) before freshman John Fadule took over midway through the first quarter.

Stacking Up Starters

 While four quarterbacks was not in the Eagles' preseason plans, many schools have also played four QBs in 2015.

 Five other teams have started at least three quarterbacks this season and nine others have played four difference quarterbacks.

Frenso State is the only school to start four different quarterbacks.

Operation O-Line

 The biggest question coming in to the 2015 season was the young offensive line.

 Coming off the 2014 season in which BC boasted an O-Line of five graduates that combined for 134 career starts, the Eagles did not return a starter from last year.

 Senior OL Harris Williams leads the way after missing last season with a broken ankle. After his 22 career starts, the next most experienced lineman is senior OL Dave Bowen, a converted blocking tight end, who has played in 35 games.

The Eagles are one of two offensive lines in the country in which all five linemen did not start a game last season. (The other is Toledo, which also had five graduates on the line in 2014.)

Head coach Steve Addazio chose to give his young linemen a
go at Louisville (Oct. 24), starting freshman Aaron Monteiro and
redshirt freshman James Hendren for the first time. Freshman
Chris Lindstrom tallied his first start against Northern Illinois
(Sept. 27).

In fact, the starting five against the Cardinals and then Virginia Tech (Oct. 31) were all from Massachusetts (Monteiro - Brockton, Williams - Lynn, Baker - Millis, Lindstrom - Dudley and Hendren -Medfield)

Big Day for Big Gains

 The Eagles rushed for eight touchdowns in the 76-0 victory over Howard on Sept. 12. It was the first time the team ran for six or more since Sept. 25, 1993, against Temple when BC rushed for seven.

The 483 total yards of offense in the win over the Bison was the most since racking up 549 against Maine on Sept. 20, 2014. BC tallied 500 yards of offensive five times in 2014.

 In the win over Howard, the Eagles scored a touchdown on each of their first six drives of the game.

 Boston College's 344 yards in first half were the most in a half since racking up 318 against Georgia Tech on Sept. 15, 2007.

Wade Suffers Season-Ending Injury

 Sophomore QB Darius Wade suffered a season-ending ankle injury in the fourth quarter of the third game of the season against No. 9/6 Florida State on Sept. 18.

 He was named the starter after spring practice was 21-for-42 with 232 passing yards, two touchdowns and 73 rushing yards when he was knocked out of the game. He threw his first career interception in the second quarter.

The Middletown, Del., native began his career completing his first six pass attempts in the win over Maine (Sept. 5) and he tallied recorded his first career touchdown pass on an 11-yard grab by senior WR **Bobby Swigert**. He rushed for a career-high 38 rushing yards against FSU.



EAGLES DEFENS

Stopping 'Em in Their Tracks

The BC defense has flexed its muscles through the first half of the season, allowing just 583 total rush yards, 13.3 points per game and only eight touchdowns.

The 11 yards the defense allowed against Howard (Sept. 12) was a

school record.

In back-to-back games, the BC defense surrendered seven rushing yards in the first two games of 2015. Before this season, the last time the Eagles allowed single-digit rushing yards was on Sept. 11,

2010, holding Kent State to four on 17 attempts in a 26-13 victory. No. 9/6 Florida State entered the game on Sept. 18 averaging 272.0 rushing yards per game, 538.5 total yards per game and 46.5 points per game. The BC D allowed just 98 rushing yards, 217 total yards including 134 after giving up an 83-yard opening TD drive - and just seven offensive points, 14 total.

BC eighth in the country for long scrimmage plays allowed. The Eagles have allowed 82 plays of 10 or more yards, 28 over 20 yards, nine over 30 yards and 11 of 40-plus yards.

The Eagles caused five turnovers at Louisville (Oct. 24), which was

the most since racking up five against Villanova on Aug. 31, 2013.

It's All About the D

The Eagles have held opponents to under 100 rushing yards 14 times in the last 22 games, including seven games in 2015.

Clemson (Oct. 17) and Louisville (Oct. 24) recorded back-to-back games of over 100 rushing yards. The Cardinals (Nov. 8) and Florida State (Nov. 22) were the last teams to go back to back against the Eagles in 2014.

BC has allowed the second-fewest 100-yard rushers - 22 - since

2005. Alabama is first with 16.

Virginia Tech's Travon McMillian rushed for 105 yards on Oct. 31. He was the first 100-yard rusher against BC since Colorado State's Dee Hart rushed for 117 on Sept. 27, 2014.

The Eagles are first in the nation, allowing 223.8 yards per game, and lead the country with just 64.2 rushing yards per game. Opponents are averaging just 1.90 yards per carry against BC, which is also first among all FBS teams.

The 159.6 passing yards per game allowed is fifth, the 12.8 first downs per game is first and the 13.3 points per game surrendered

is fourth.

Can't Even Get Started

In 2015, Boston College is one of the best teams in the nation at forcing three-and-outs.

The BC defense averages 5.44 three-and-outs per game, which is

eighth in the country.

Glemson lead the way with 6.50 per game. 49 of the BC's opponents 111 drives have resulted in three-andouts, which is 44.1 percent and is tied for third in the nation.

The Eagles are sixth for overall third downs, allowing just 30, and rank third with a 22.9 percent convertion rate.

They Are Called Rushmen

BC is first in the nation with 88 tackles for loss and are second with 390 yards lost.

in 2015.

The Eagles recorded 16 tackles for loss at Louisville (Oct. 17), the most since racking up 16 agianst ninth-ranked USC on Sept. 13,

The Eagles also notched seven sacks for a loss of 62 yards in the loss to the Cardinals. The total was the second most in program history. BC recorded eight sacks three different times in school history, most recently in 2005 against NC State.

Ten Eagles have combined for at least one sack. Junior LB **Matt**

Milano leads the way with 6.5 sacks for a loss of 45 yards. Senior LB **Steven Daniels** leads the team with 14 tackles for a loss of 70 yards after recording a career-high four TFLs at Louisville. He is seventh in the nation for that total and ranks 16th with 1.56 TFL

Marked Improvement

· Since the arrival of defensive coordinator Don Brown and defensive line coach Ben Albert, the Eagles have vastly improved their numbers of sacks and tackles for loss.

In 2012, BC recorded six sacks (last in the nation) and 45 tackles for a loss of 147 yards. In just one year, the number jumped to 36 sacks and 88 tackles for a loss of 371 yards in 2013 and last year, BC recorded 33 sacks and 89 tackles for a loss of 351 yards.

So far this year, BC has 30 sacks for a loss of 241 yards.

The Eagles also return the top two tacklers from a year ago. Seniors DB Justin Simmons and LB Steven Daniels hope to make the same impact they did in 2014.

Daniels is currently the leader on BC with 67 tackles, incluiding 41

solo stops, 14 tackles for a loss, six sacks and an interception. Simmons is third with 48 tackles, including 34 unassisted, two

fumble recoveries and two interceptions.

Daniels logged his 200th career tackle in the victory over Northern Illinois (Sept. 26). He then led the way at Duke, recording a careerhigh 12 tackles, including a sack and 2.5 TFLs.

Eagles Honored

Three BC defenders have been honored by the ACC in 2015.

Sophomore LB Connor Strachan earned Linebacker of the Week honors (Sept. 28), while sophomore DL Harold Landry (Sept. 21) and senior DL Mehdi Abdesmad (Sept. 8) earned ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week.

Strachan led the Eagles in tackles for the third time with a careerhigh nine in the victory over Northern Illinois (Sept. 26), logged seven solo stops and tallied career highs with one sack for a loss

of nine yards and 2.5 tackles for a loss of 11 yards.

Abdesmad took home the award after returning to the gridiron after missing much of the previous two seasons with a knee injury. He recorded 1.5 sacks for a loss of nine yards, 2.5 tackles for a loss of 14 yards and finished the day with four tackles, including three solo stops. He helped lead the BC defense to allow just seven rushing yards and 91 total yards in the victory over Maine (Sept. 5).

Landry logged a career-high 11 tackles, including seven solo stop and a career-high 4.5 tackles for a loss of 27 yards, in the loss to No. 9/6 Florida State (Sept. 18). He also recorded 1.5 sacks for a

Perfectly Good Punting

- Senior K/P Alex Howell resumed his punting duties from a year ago, in which he excelled. A right quad strain after the Florida State game (Sept. 18) has limited his ability to fulfill all his kicking
- He was named All-New England Team for his punting abilities,
- averaging 42.5 yards per punt, good for sixth in the ACC. Howell has averaged 42.1 yards on 68 punts (ninth in the ACC) with 15 fair catches, 12 longer than 50 yards and 22 inside the 20.
- He is first in the nation for punts (68), punt yards (2,863) and second for punts per game (7.6) and yards per game (318.1).
- He averaged 47.9 yards per punt in a field-position battle vs. No. 9/6 Florida State (Sept. 18) and three of his punts were over 50
- At No. 5/6 Clemson (Oct. 17), Howell logged 10 punts and 452 yards. He booted two over 50 yards, including a season-long 58-yarder and he put one down at the two-yard line from the Tigers' 33-yard line. He earned the Ray Guy Award Player of the Week honors for his performance in Death Valley.
- At Louisville (Oct. 24), he set career highs with 12 punts and 507 total yards.

Welcome Mr. Walker

- Freshman Michael Walker came to The Heights as a defensive back, but the BC coaches moved him to wide receiver before the first game of the season.
- He caught his first pass for nine yards in the victory against Howard (Sept. 12)
- He has since added kickoff returner to his repertoire. He leads the team with 14 returns for 388 yards, averaging 27.7 yards per game, fourth in the ACC.
- He notched a caeer-long, 56-yard return against Virginia Tech (Oct. 31), which was the longest of the season for the Eagles.

Matt on the Block

- Junior LB Matt Milano blocked his first career punt in the Eagles' victory over Howard on Sept. 12. He then did it against in the victory over Northern Illinois on Sept. 26.
- They marked the first time a BC player blocked a punt since Manuel Asprilla did so at Maryland on Nov. 23, 2013.
- Milano is one of 12 players in the FBS to record two blocked kicks or punts in 2015. Two players have three.

Punting to Alston

- Sophomore WR Sherman Alston is averaging 8.9 yards per punt
- He tabbed a career-long, 39-yard return in the victory against Howard (Sept. 12).
- He has also fielded two kickoffs, notching 31 total return yards.

Miles for Myles

- Junior RB Myles Willis currently sits fourth on BC's all-time list with 1,613 return yards and is tied for fourth with 67 returns.
- He was named to the Paul Hornung watch list for the second straight time. The award is given to the most versatile player in college football.
- Last season, Willis returned 34 kickoffs for 895 yards (26.3 average third best in the ACC), including a 95-yard return for a touchdown against Syracuse (11/22). He was one of three players in the ACC to return a kickoff for a TD.
- His kickoff returns and yardage ranked first in the ACC.
- The total yardage was also second in BC's single-season record books and his returns tied for second.

Still Questions in the Kicking Game

- Kicking field goals and extra points was a rocky road for the Eagles in 2014. Heading into the year, BC had to replace fouryear veteran Nate Freese, who connected on 70-of-81 field goal attempts in 50 career games and set a school record for field goals and points (324).
- Senior Alex Howell was the lone man on kicking duty against Maine on Sept. 5. He went 1-for-2 on field goal attempts, making a 31-yarder and missing a 35-yard attempt. He was 3-for-3 on extrapoint attempts.
- In the victory against Howard (Sept 12), Howell went 5-for-5 on extra-point attempts.
- Sophomore Mike Knoll was 4-for-4 on point-after attempts and averaged 63.3 yards on three kickoffs.
- Freshman Colton Lichtenberg helped out with the kicking duties in the victory against Northern Illinois (Sept. 26). He connected on his first career attempt, logging a 25-yarder in the fourth quarter, which turned out to be difference maker. He also kicked off three times, averaging 56.0 yards per kick and went 2-for-2 on extra points.
- Lichtenberg missed his only attempt at Duke (Oct. 3), a 45-yarder with 3:35 left in the game that would have put the Eagles ahead. He did make his lone extra-point attempt and recorded two kickoffs for 101 yards. In the loss to Wake Forest (Oct. 10), Lichtenberg was O-for-2 on field-goal attempts, hitting the upfront from 31 yards and missing from 26 yards with 2:17 to play in the third quarter with BC down, 3-0.
- Knoll was successful on a 21-yard field goal attempt to end the first half at No. 5/6 Clemson (Oct. 17) and bring BC within seven. He was also 2-for-2 in extra-point attempts in the contest. He successful on both extra-point attempts at Louisville (Oct. 24). In the loss to Virginia Tech (Oct. 31), Knoll missed a 43-yard attempt and made a 29-yarder.

Simmons Named McGillis Scholarship Recipient

- Senior DB Justin Simmons was named the recipient of the Jay McGillis Memorial Scholarship.
- The award has been given annually to a BC defensive back who best exemplifies the personal qualities of team dedication and leadership by example, an extraordinary competitive spirit, and personal concern for family friends and teammates. McGillis, a starting defensive back for Boston College, passed away from Leukemia in 1992. The Eagles' spring game is played in his honor each year.

Allen Exemplifies "Ever to Excel"

- Freshman DE Zach Allen was was one of five student-athletes to earn the NFF National High School Scholar-Athlete Award by the National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame.
- Criteria for the award includes but are not limited to academic achievement, athletic accolades and community involvement.
- Allen was a three-year letter winner as an outside linebacker, defensive end and tight end at New Canaan High School. He was named Connecticut Gatorade Player of the Year and the New Haven Register's Player of the Year in his senior season. He also collected First-Team All-Tri-State honors and was named to all-state by Walter Camp and USA Today. He is New Canaan's leader in career and single-season sacks and helped the Rams to Class L State Championships in 2013 and 2014.

Celebrating 10 Years in the ACC

- During the BC game against Florida State on Sept. 18, former coach Tom O'Brien and members of the 2005 team were honored on the field at Alumni Stadium to mark the 10-year anniversary of Boston College in the Atlantic Coast Conference.
- BC played Florida State in its first-ever ACC football game on Sept. 17, 2005. The Eagles lost, 28-17.
- The Eagles are 42-39 in the conference with the most wins coming in 2007 when they went 6-2.
- BC went to back-to-back ACC Championship games in 2007 and 2008, falling to Virginia Tech both times.

Like Father Like Son

- Senior TE **Louie Addazio** is one of seven players who currently plays for his father, the head coach.
- The younger Addazio transferred to Boston College for the 2013 after Steve Addazio accepted the head coaching job.
- The other schools include: Colorado, Iowa, Iowa State, Massachusetts, Middle Tennessee and Utah.

Pack Your Bags for Dublin

- Boston College will host Georgia Tech in Dublin's Aviva Stadium on Saturday, Sept. 3 in the Aer Lingus College Football Classic to open the 2016 season. The game will be televised on ESPN2.
- It will be the third time in six years an American college football game will take place in Ireland and the second BC will play on the Emerald Isle.

 In 1988, the Eagles defeated Army, 38-24, in front of 45,000 fans in the old Lansdowne Road Stadium in the Emerald Isle Classic. It was the first American football game played in Europe.

Check Out the Throwbacks

- The football team will wear uniforms commemorating the 30th anniversary of the 1985 Cotton Bowl victory and the famous Hail Mary pass when the Eagles face Notre Dame on Nov. 21 at Fenway Park.
- The specially-designed Under Armour uniforms were inspired by the "Miracle in Miami," Doug Flutie's last-second touchdown pass to Gerard Phelan on Nov. 23, 1984 in the Orange Bowl to give the No. 10 Eagles a 47-45 win over 12th-ranked Miami. BC finished the season with a 10-2 record and defeated Houston, 45-28, in the Cotton Bowl on Jan. 1, 1985.

Join Coach Addazio for the BC Football Radio Show

- Head coach Steve Addazio will join the Eagles' play-by-play announcer Jon Meterparel for a weekly radio show for the 2015 season.
- The Boston College Football Radio will air on ESPN WEEI 850 AM and on tunein.com every Monday from 7 to 8 p.m.
- Fans can also join the coach at the live airing at The Stockyard restaurant in Brighton, Mass.

Eagles in the BC Hall

- Former BC football players Doug Brzezinski and Damien Woody are two of the eight former student-athletes were inducted into the BC Varsity Club Hall of Fame on Oct. 9, 2015.
- Brzezsinki started 46 games on the offensive line for the Eagles. He was a two-time All-Big East first-team honoree, was a team captain and earned the Thomas F. Scanlon Award as the team's top scholar-athlete. Brzezinski was drafted in the third round of the 1999 NFL Draft by the Philadelphia Eagles. He played in 73 games in the NFL.
- Woody was another success story of the much-heralded offensive line tradition at Boston College. He earned All-Big East second team honors and was the 17th overall selection by the New England Patriots in the first round of the 1999 NFL Draft. He is currently an NFL analyst for ESPN.

Former Boston College offensive lineman **Dan Koppen** was named to the 2015 Class of Atlantic Coast Conference Legends. Along with 13 other members, the two-time Super Bowl champion will be honored at the ACC Night of Legends on Dec. 4 in Charlotte, N.C.

Koppen (1998-02) made his mark as the center on Boston College's strong offensive lines before moving on to start on four Super Bowl teams with the New England Patriots. He was a three-year starter for the Eagles and head coach Tom O'Brien. The Whitehall, Pa., native earned all-conference honors each of his final three collegiate seasons and helped pave the way for BC attacks that featured a 1,000-yard rusher each year. He was named to the 2001 Rimington Trophy watch list as a junior and was a 2002 finalist for the award, presented annually to the top center in college football. Koppen played on teams that posted four winning seasons and won three bowl games.

Koppen went on to a 10-year NFL career highlighted by two Super Bowl titles with the New England Patriots and a 2007 Pro Bowl selection. He currently coaches high school football. BC ACC Legends:
