## SENIOR DAY

- Sunday's game will be the Eagles' annual Senior Day
- The six seniors will be honored in a pregame ceremony: Alexa Brazauskas, Leah Frome, Audra Hampsch, Emily McCoy, Eryn McCoy and Brittany Sheenan

#### LAST REGULAR-SEASON GAME

- Sunday's game is the Eagles' final regular-season game of the 2016 season
- BC will next face No. 8 Virginia in the quarterfinals of the 2016 ACC Championship on Thursday, Nov. 3 at 4 p.m. ... the 2016 ACC Championship will be contested at Wake Forest's Kentner Stadium

#### THE 10-WIN STREAK STRETCHES ON ...

- · Boston College posted its 10th win of the season on Thursday night, topping No. 16 Harvard 4-1 on the road
- · This marks the 17th straight year BC has reach the 10-win mark
- The last time BC did not collect double-digit wins was 1999, when the Eagles went 9-11 on the season

#### ... AGAINST CONSISTENTLY HARD SCHEDULE

- BC has hit the 10-win mark for the 17th-straight year in spite of playing the nation's second-hardest schedule (see below)
- Of the Eagles' 18 regular-season opponents, 12 were or will be ranked at the time the teams played
- Adding in next week's ACC Championship where all seven participants are ranked the Eagles could play as many as 15 ranked opponents in 21 ranked games should BC advance to the final

#### TOUGHEST TEST TO CLOSE THE SEASON

- Entering the final weekend of play, Boston College boasts the nation's second-toughest schedule this
- Overall, BC's opposition past and future has a .668 winning percentage, which was the second-hardest cumulative total in the nation behind Virginia's opponents (.679 winning percentage)
- The Eagles' past opponents had a combined .646 winning percentage, the fifth-hardest mark
- However, its future opponents (Harvard and UConn) have a combined .839 winning percentage entering the weekend – denoting the nation's hardest remaining schedule still to be played
- BC's regular-season schedule includes 12 ranked opponents in 18 games, including a stretch of five straight from Sept. 2 through Sept. 16 and four of the final five opponents to close the regular-season
- Through 16 games, the Eagles are 4-6 against ranked teams with the wins coming against No. 14 Stanford,
   No. 3 North Carolina. No. 8 Louisville and No. 16 Wake Forest
- At the ACC Championship, all of the Eagles' potential opponents including quarterfinal foe No. 8 Virginia would be ranked opponents. Every ACC team has been ranked in 44 straight NFHCA Polls, a streak dating to October of 2012.

#### HIGHEST RPI RANK AS SEASON'S END APPROACHES

- Boston College is ranked a season-high No. 11 in the most recent RPI (ratings percentage index)
- The Eagles were ranked No. 15 in the first release (Sept. 18), before falling to No. 21 on Sept. 25 ... BC improved to No. 16 (Oct. 1), then No. 12 (Oct. 8) before dipping to No. 13 last week
- The RPI rankings are heavily weighted in the selection of the at-large berths to the 16-team NCAA Tournament

## MILESTONES IN ACC PLAY THIS YEAR

- · Boston College met and established new bests in ACC field hockey play this year
- In the regular season, BC matched its best-ever finish in the nation's toughest field hockey conference, going 3-3 ... the Eagles also posted a 3-3 mark in 2014
- BC has earned two wins in ACC play three different seasons: 2006, 2010, 2012
- Additionally, the Eagles gained the No. 3 seed in the ACC Championship, the team's highest-ever seed in the conference's annual tournament
- Three times previously BC was the No. 4 seed (2006, 2007 and 2012), but had been the No. 7 seed each of the last three years (2013, 2014, 2015)

#### **EAGLES OUT-PERFORM COACHES' PROGNOSTICATIONS**

- Boston College was chosen to finish seventh in the ACC this season according to the preseason coaches poll
- However, the Eagles finished tied for third with North Carolina, Virginia and Louisville, all
  who finished the year with a 3-3 conference mark

#### **OVERTIME TESTS**

- Five of the Eagles' 17 games have gone to overtime this season, including one double-OT game
- BC is 2-3 in games where the extra session is needed
- And oddity of the Eagles' OT record, however, is that all three of their overtime losses have come at home, while both of their wins have come in road or neutral games
- BC has taken wins against No. 14 Stanford (neutral) and Providence (away), while falling to No. 16 Virginia, Massachusetts and No. 14 Boston University at home.

#### MCCOYS MAKING WAVES IN THE RECORD BOOK

- Senior twins Emily and Eryn McCoy are making their marks on the Eagles' career scoring lists
- The twins sit back-to-back on the points list, with Eryn currently in 10th, while Emily is
- Eryn now has 83 career points (33 goals, 17 assists) ... she broke into the top 10 on Oct. 7 with a 1-goal, 1-assist effort in the 3-1 road win at No. 8 Louisville
- Emily comes into Sunday's game with 82 points from 33 goals and 16 assists ... she
  moved into 11th place on Thursday night with her two-goal effort to jump Sara York '09
  who had 79 career points (36q, 7a)
- On BC's career goals chart, both Eryn and Emily are each one goal back of 10th place with 33 goals apiece ... Julie Ober '95 and Janna Anctil '11 both occupy 10th place with 34 goals each.

## SUPER SOPHOMORES

- The Eagles' sophomore class has been stellar this year
- All six of them Elizabeth Dennehy, Kaitie Fink, Ymke Rose Gote, Frederique Haverhals, Carly Kauffman and Lucy Lytle – have played in all 17 games and have been heavy contributors
- Five of them (Dennehy, Gote, Haverhals, Kauffman and Lytle) have started the last seven games
- Lytle leads the team in scoring with 12 goals, while Haverhals leads the team in assists
   (6) and is fourth overall in scoring (12 pts.)
- Gote and Fink are tied for second on the team in assists (4) with senior Eryn McCoy, while Kauffman has been an anchor in the defensive midfield all season
- Dennehy has been instrumental the last seven games starting as the right back because of injuries

## LYTLE LIGHTING IT UP

- Sophomore Lucy Lytle leads the Eagles in scoring with 24 points, all coming on her 12 anals
- Her 12 goals are the team's most since Janna Anctil potted 14 in 2010 in 19 games
- 11 of her 12 goals have come in the last 11 games, and she also had a six-game scoring streak intact from Sept. 18 through Oct. 9
- · As a freshman, she notched four goals in 22 games
- Lytle was a member of the U.S. Under-19 Women's National Team last spring when it toured Germany in May
- In 39 career games, Lytle has scored 16 goals and added two assists for 32 career points

## DENNEHY MAKING THE UNFAMILIAR FAMILIAR

- With injuries striking two of the Eagles' regular right backs, head coach Kelly Doton called on midfielder Elizabeth Dennehy to fill the role in the last six games
- Before stepping into the back line, Dennehy had previously made 29 appearances all in the midfield - where she scored three goals and added one assist
- With Dennehy along the back line in the last seven games, the Eagles have allowed just 1.00 goals per game with one shutout and just one game allowing more than one goal against a lineup that has included four ranked opponents

#### HAMPSCH CLAIMING THE CAGE AS HER OWN

· Audra Hampsch has settled into the No. 1 goalkeeper job this year after All-American

#### TEAM NOTES

- BC trails Connecticut 12-22-1 in the all-time series between the team programs
- The Eagles are 6-9-1 at home against UConn, while they are 6-9 on the road in Storrs and 0-4 at neutral site games
- The teams met at least once every year while both were members of the BIG EAST Conference
- After BC joined the ACC in 2005, the teams played the first three seasons 2005-07 as non-conference opponents before picking the annual regional rivalry back up in 2010
- The teams have meet in the postseason a total of nine times, including five meetings in the BIG EAST Tournament and four showdowns in the NCAA Tournament ... BC was 3-2 against UConn in the BIG East Tournament (including wins in the 1994 and 1997 championship games)
- UConn is 4-0 against the Eagles in NCAA play ... the last three meetings including the 2015
   Elite Eight game have been one-goal decisions
- Nine times the teams have played overtime, with the 2014 regular-season meeting advancing to penalty strokes – which BC won
- 23 of the 35 meetings have been decided by a single goal or less, including each of the last five

#### PLAYER NOTES

- · Four current players have registered points against Connecticut

## **COACHING NOTES**

· Kelly Doton is 0-2 against Connecticut

- and four-year starter Leah Settipane graduated last year
- Hampsch has started all 17 games so far, posting a 10-7 record, a 1.65 goals against average and a .748 save percentage
- She has also earned two shutouts Sept. 26 at Quinnipiac and Oct. 9 at Indiana, both 2-0 road wins
- Entering the weekend, her 86 saves lead the ACC while her 5.06 saves per game average rank second in the conference and 30th nationally among all goalkeepers ... her save percentage ranks 13th nationally

#### HAVERHALS HAS IT

- Sophomore Frederique Haverhals has started all 17 games this season at center back, after starting all 22 games last season as a freshman
- This year, she has scored three goals and leads the team in assists (6) to rank fourth on the squad in scoring (12 pts.)
- Two of her three goals have been game-winners, including the second of her two last Friday against No. 16 Wake Forest
- Haverhals was one of just four players last season to start all 22 games, and is one of six to start all 17 games so far this year
- The Dutchwoman was an NFHCA second-team all-region honoree last year and was the ACC Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 11 for her two-way performances at Louisville and Indiana

## LIGHTNING STRIKING TWICE - FOR THE THIRD TIME

- Frederique Haverhals' ACC co-Defensive Player of the Week honor on Oct. 11 marked the second time this season an Eagle earned league weekly honors
- This is just the third season in the Eagles' 12-year ACC history that BC has drawn more than one weekly honor after Chelcie Mendonca picked up co-defensive player of the week honors earlier in the year on Sept. 20
- In 2005, Bob Dirks (Sept. 26) and Crystal Frates (Oct. 24) earned offensive player of the week honors
- In 2014, Eryn McCoy (Oct. 21) and Emily McCoy (Oct. 28) copped back-to-back weekly
  offensive honors
- Additionally, Haverhals' honor was just the Eagles' 13th weekly honor from the ACC in field hockey since joining the league in 2005 ... BC was not honored with a weekly award in either 2007 or 2011

#### NATIONAL LIGHTS HIT MENDONCA

- Junior Chelcie Mendonca had a great week in mid-September, leading to national honors
- Playing just her third game of the season at back, Mendonca scored the game-winning goal in the 2-1 against No. 3 North Carolina on Sept. 16, helping the Eagles earn their first win over the Tar Heels since 2008
- · Two days later, she assisted on the game-winning goal at Northeastern
- For her efforts, Mendonca not only claimed co-ACC Defensive Player of the Week honors, but also took NFHCA National Defensive Player of the Week accolades
- They were the first conference and national awards of her career

## FINK FINDING A WAY TO HELP

- · Sophomore Kaitie Fink is tied for second on the team in assists with Eryn McCoy
- · All of her assists have come in a substitute role
- So far this year, Fink has appeared in all 17 games and made one start against Massachusetts on Sept. 25
- · Last season as a freshman, Fink made a single appearance

#### **MATHERSON'S TIMELY SCORING**

- Brooke Matherson has had a knack for the timely goal this season
- Two of her strikes have been insurance goals to secure 2-0 road wins while her latest goal came with first-half time expired to level the score at 1-1
- The junior opened the season by scoring the Eagles' second goal at Quinnipiac on Sept.
   26 to wrap up the two-goal shutout
- At Indiana on Oct. 9, she added the team's insurance goal to again help the team post the 2-0 road win
- On Oct. 14, she netted the game-tying goal with no time left in the first half as the Eagles went on to defeat UNH, 2-1
- Her assist last Friday night against No. 16 Wake Forest on Lucy Lytle's goal to give the Eagles a then 3-2 lead - was her first since her freshman season
- Matherson has appeared in 15 games this season, and 33 in her career ... she has five career goals and three assists for 13 career points

## SHEENAN STRIKING IT SENIOR YEAR

- Senior Brittany Sheenan has been among the Eagles' goal leaders since the first game of the season
- The forward has a career-high nine goals eight of which came in the first seven games of the season ... she scored her first goal since Sept. 18 on Thursday night at Harvard

# HEAD COACH KELLY DOTON

Kelly Doton was promoted to head coach of the Boston College field hockey program on April 1, 2015. She is the eighth head field hockey coach in Boston College history.

The Greenfield, Mass., product has been with the Eagles since 2012 when she joined the program as associate head coach. She held the same position at Indiana prior to her arrival at Boston College.

Doton took the Eagles to the 16-team NCAA Tournament in her first seaso in 2015, earning the program its 10th berth in the bracket and the third straigh (2013-present).

In 2015, in Doton's first year at the helm, the Eagles finished 13-9 on the season, defeating six ranked opponents and earning a 5-0 mark in overtime games. Among the highlights: Boston College earned its first-ever victory against Maryland, first-ever ACC Tournament victory and advanced to the quarterfinals of the NCAA Tournament for just the third time in program history and for the first time since 1998.

Before her promotion, Doton served as Ainslee Lamb's associate head coach for three seasons beginning in 2012. After a three-year absence from the NCAA Tournament, the Eagles returned to the postseason in 2013 with a 12-8 campaign. In 2014, BC went 13-7 with five wins over ranked opponents, including upsets over No. 2 UConn, No. 4 Syracuse, No. 7 Louisville, and No. 8 Virginia.

Doton came to BC from Indiana, where she had been coaching since 2008. The Greenfield, Mass., product was an assistant coach for four seasons before being named the Hoosiers' associate head coach in 2011. In 2009, she was instrumental in helping Indiana reach the NCAA Tournament for the second time in program history after finishing second in league standings and reaching the Big Ten Tournament title game.

A 2004 graduate of Wake Forest, Doton was an asset to the Demon Deacons on both sides of the ball during her collegiate career, helping to lead her squad to back-to-back NCAA championships. Providing her team with her disciplined defensive skills, and quickly establishing herself as one of the best attack corner hitters in the country, she was honored as the 2003 Honda Award winner, the National Field Hockey Player of the Year.

In addition to being named the ACC Player of the Year in 2002, she was also a two-time NFHCA First-Team All-American and a three-time All-ACC honoree during her career.

In addition to her collegiate playing experience, Doton was a member of the U.S. Women's Senior National Team from 2005-10. In 2008, she was part of the U.S. squad that competed in the Summer Olympics in Beijing, China. She began her career with Team USA on the New Zealand Tour and scored her first international goal against Australia in 2005.

- Senior Alexa Brazauskas is the Eagles' captain this year
- She was chosen to lead BC this season after an extensive process last spring

## HIGHEST PRESEASON RANKING EVER

- The Eagles kicked off the 2016 season ranked No. 8 nationally, their highest-ever preseason ranking
- It was also the team's highest-ever ranking in the first poll of the season (pre-dating the
  official preseason poll)
- Previously, the team's highest opening ranking was No. 9 in both 2007 and 2010.

## ACC PRESEASON HONORS FOR McCOY

- Senior All-American Emily McCoy was one of 11 selections to the Preseason All-ACC Field Hockey Team
- This was the second-straight season in which McCoy has earned the preseason designation
- McCoy earned second-team All-ACC honors in 2015 after she posted 26 points (10 goals, 6 assists) in 22 games as a junior.
