THE GAME

- Boston College returns to Alumni Stadium for the third consecutive week as the Eagles host No. 3 Clemson Friday night.
- ESPN has coverage of the game beginning at 7:30 p.m. Friday. Adam Amin (play-by-play), Mack Brown (color analyst) and Boston College alum Molly McGrath (sideline reporter) have the call.
- Coverage on the Boston College IMG Sports Network begins at 7 p.m. Jon Meterparel, Pete Cronan and Scott Mutryn have the call. Fans can listen to the game locally on 93.7 FM WEEI.

THE SERIES

- Boston College and Clemson have met 25 times with the Tigers holding a 14-9-2 series advantage.
- Clemson has won five consecutive meetings over Boston College. The last win for BC in the series was a 16-10 triumph at Alumni Stadium in 2010.
- BC is 6-7-1 all-time at home vs. Clemson.
- The series began in 1940 as the two teams met in the Cotton Bowl in Dallas, Texas. No. 12 Clemson defeated the 11th-ranked Eagles, 6-3, in the first meeting between the two schools.
- BC has played Clemson 12 times when the Tigers have been ranked, going 2-9-1 vs. Clemson.
- Friday's meeting is the third time Clemson has been ranked in the top five at the time facing BC. No. 5 Clemson won, 34-17, last season and No. 3 Clemson earned a 24-14 victory in 2013.

1ST AND 10

- Boston College looks to win its third consecutive game for the first time since 2013 season Friday with a win over Clemson.
- Last week, the Eagles ripped off 400 yards of total offense and held Buffalo to 67 yards in a 35-3 victory over the Bulls at Alumni Stadium.
- Boston College yielded just 67 yards of total offense vs. Buffalo, the third-lowest single-game total in school history.
- Boston College looks for its first top-10 win since Steve Addazio led the Eagles to a 37-31 victory over Southern California at Alumni Stadium on Sept. 13, 2014.
- Boston College has not defeated an opponent ranked in the top-five since a 14-7 win at No. 4 Notre Dame on Nov. 2, 2002.
- A win Friday vs. No. 3 Clemson would be against the highest-ranked opponent since the 41-39 victory over No. 1 Notre Dame on Nov. 20, 1993.

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

All media credential requests must be submitted via www.sportssystem.com/bostoncollege.

Admittance to the Alumni Stadium Press Box is limited to working media members only. Credential requests must be made through BC's credentialing website.

Please request credentials at least two weeks in advance of the game to permit sufficient time for mailing. Media credentials which cannot be mailed will be left at Media Will Call (Media Entrance) at Gate C of Conte Forum.

Working space in the Alumni Stadium Press Box is allotted on the following basis: (1) daily newspaper writers covering for next-day publication; (2) sports editors of newspapers in New England; (3) radio personnel for broadcast originations; (4) official school student daily newspaper; (5) approved special coverage; (6) press and TV working photographers; (7) weekly press representatives; non-originating radio repre-

sentatives of AM news stations; and Internet writers for sites affiliated with established, nationally-recognized media outlets will be considered on a game-by-game basis as space permits. Visiting freelance and amateur photographers are not eligible for media credentials.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Sideline photographers and media members must follow NCAA guidelines, which prohibit entry to the bench areas.

PARKING

Media parking is located in the Commonwealth Avenue parkage garage. Use the intersection of St. Thomas More Road and Commonwealth Avenue, Chestnut Hill, MA 02467. From St. Thomas More Road, take Campanella Way to the Commonwealth Avenue Garage. You should request your parking at the same time you request your game credential. If time permits, both will be mailed to you. There is no day-of-game media parking list and therefore members of the media must have a media parking credential in advance of the game.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

Complete NCAA statistics, play-by-play, and quote sheets from both teams are all regular services on gameday. Upon your arrival, you will receive a press folder with a game program, flip card, updated stats and game day notes. The press box has wireless Internet access. Login information will be provided on gamedays.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS

Coach Addazio and players, following the designated cooling off period, will be made available after each game to members of the media. Coach Addazio's press conference will take place in the Barber Room of the Yawkey Center, which is located opposite the playing field from the press box.

With approximately five minutes remaining in the game, members of the media will be escorted across the field towards the Yawkey Center.

Boston College's locker room is closed to the media. Select players will be made available in the Barber Room following Addazio's press conference. The visiting team's press conference will be held in the Conte Forum Media Center. A member of the Boston College Athletic Communications office will escort the visiting media to the Conte Forum Media Center.

Steve Addazio was named Boston College's 35th head football coach in December of 2012 and wasted no time making his mark on the program. Addazio took over an Eagles program that had suffered back-to-back losing seasons for the first time in 14 years (including a 2-10 mark in 2012) and engineered a remarkable turnaround. In what were supposed to be rebuilding years, Addazio led the Eagles to back-to-back seven-win seasons and two consecutive bowl games.

When Addazio took over the BC football program in 2013, the team had won a total of six games the previous two seasons; BC fans knew the rebuilding process would take time, but few would have predicted the Eagles would receive back-to-back bowl invitations in Addazio's first two years as head coach. Although Addazio's youthful 2015 team was plagued by injuries and finished with a 3-9 record, they were led by the nation's top defense and came within a touchdown of winning five more games. In the final NCAA statistical rankings, the BC defense finished first in total defense (254.3 yards per game) and third down conversion defense (24.1 percent), second in fourth down conversion defense (20.0 percent), second to national champion Alabama in rushing defense (82.8 ypg.) and fourth (behind bowl teams Wisconsin, Ohio State and Alabama) in scoring defense (15.3 ppg.).

In 2014, the Eagles were picked by media to finish fifth in the ACC's Atlantic Division but surprised many by posting a second consecutive seven-win season and, in fact, falling a few yards and several plays short of finishing with a 10-2 mark. The season was highlighted by a prime-time upset of No. 9 USC, dominating the Trojans 506-337 in total offense, and a nailbiter in which the Eagles had a chance to upend undefeated Florida State in Tallahassee, a game FSU won by a last-second field goal after the Eagles had missed the go-ahead kick just minutes before.

Seven members of the 2014 BC team earned spots on the All-ACC team. Center Andy Gallik led the way as a first-team nod on the offensive side of the ball. He was joined

by Hilliman and tackle Seth Betancourt on the third team, while tackle Ian Silberman and guard Bobby Vardaro earned honorable mention. On defense, tackle Connor Wujciak took home third-team honors and linebacker Josh Keyes earned honorable mention. Silberman, Gallik and defensive end Brian Mihalik were drafted while five more Eagles signed free agent contracts.

During the 2013 season, running back Andre Williams led the nation in rushing, earned the Doak Walker Award as the nation's premier running back and took a trip to New York as one of six finalists for the Heisman Trophy. Williams, a consensus All-America selection, finished the season ranked fifth among all FBS running backs in the history of college football in single-season rushing yards with 2,177.

Addazio's coaching pedigree includes 14 postseason bowl games (including six BCS bowl games) and two national titles while on the coaching staff at the University of Florida (a 41-14 win over Ohio State on Jan. 8, 2007 in Glendale, Ariz., and a 24-14 win over Oklahoma on Jan. 8, 2009 in Miami, Fla.).

Prior to his arrival in Chestnut Hill, Addazio led the Temple University Owls in a two-year period of success, transition and growth. Addazio coached the Owls to a nine-win campaign and a bowl victory for the first time in 32 seasons in his first year as head coach.

Prior to leading the Owls, Addazio spent six seasons (2005-10) at Florida under head coach Urban Meyer, serving as offensive coordinator in 2009-10 and interim head coach from Dec. 2009 to July 2010. During his tenure in Gainesville, the Gators participated in six postseason bowls and won two BCS national championships.

Born June 1, 1959, Addazio is married to the former Kathleen Donoghue. They have three children – Nicole, Jessica and Louie.

Defensive Prowess

• The 2016 Boston College defense has continued to play at an elite level following last year's superior performance. In 2015, the Eagles allowed 254.3 yards per game, tops in the nation. They maintained the No. 1 spot for 12 of the 13 weeks of the 2015 regular season. The Eagles also allowed just 82.8 rushing yards per game - second in the country - and just six rushing touchdowns - good for first in the nation.

• The 2015 BC defense surrendered the fourth-fewest points in 2015 (15.3 per game) and the fewest touchdowns (19).

• The 2016 BC defense ranks first nationally in total defense, allowing 202 yards per game. The Eagles also rank seventh nationally in rushing defense (78.0 yards per game), despite the fact they already faced the triple-option attack of Georgia Tech.

• The BC pass defense has yielded just 124.0 passing yards per game, first nationally.

News and Notes ...

• 64 of 99 members of the Boston College football team are freshmen, redshirt freshmen, sophomores or redshirt sophomores.

• There are only 14 seniors and three graduate students on the team.

• Only six seniors or graduates are on the offensive side of the ball, tying the Eagles for the sixth fewest in the nation.

• In 2015, the Eagles tied for seventh in the country for playing the most freshmen, as 26 (16 true, 10 redshirt) saw time on the field.

Noting the Win over Buffalo

• Boston College moved to 3-2 overall with its second consecutive victory as the Eagles defeated Buffalo, 35-3.

• It marked the first time since the start of the 2015 season that Boston College recorded two straight wins.

• Boston College moved to 7-2 all-time against Buffalo. BC has won the last three meetings and head coach Steve Addazio is 2-0 all-time against the Bulls.

• The Eagles did not commit a turnover in seven quarters of football with the last turnover coming in the second quarter at Virginia Tech, Sept. 17, 2016. The streak was snapped on a fumble in the second quarter.

• Boston College is 17-2 under Steve Addazio when leading at halftime. The Eagles held a 21-3 advantage at the break Saturday vs. Buffalo.

• For the second straight game, the Eagles put up 400 yards of offense as they recorded 400 against Buffalo and 490 against Wagner last week. The last time the Eagles recorded back-to-back 400-yard games was when in 2014 against Colorado State (408; Sept. 27) and at NC State (411; Oct. 11).

• It was also the second straight game Boston College scored at least 30 points, as the Eagles put up 42 against Wagner a week ago.

• The 258 passing yards were the most the BC offense tallied since recording 285 against Villanova on Aug. 31, 2013 when Chase Rettig was behind center. John Fadule recorded 257 in 2015 against NC State.

• Graduate QB Patrick Towles set his career-high wearing Maroon and Gold with 234 passing yards and 14 completions. He finished the game 14-of-25 passing with two touchdowns. For the third time this season, he threw for two touchdowns. It was his first 200+ yard

game at BC.

- Redshirt freshman RB Davon Jones registered his first career touchdown on a one-yard rush with 35 seconds left in the first quarter. His 38-yard reception in the second quarter, which set up a BC touchdown, was the longest of his young career. He finished the day with 53 rushing yards on 14 carries.
- Junior WR Charlie Callinan recorded his first touchdown reception of the season at 9:25 in the second quarter on a seven-yard reception, bringing his career total to four TDs. He recorded two catches for 22 yards.
- Sophomore WR Michael Walker caught his second touchdown of the season and his career with 21 seconds left in the first half on an 11-yard reception.
- Sophomore WR Jeff Smith led the way for the Eagles with five catches for 65 yards, including a 43-yard reception.
- Redshirt freshman WR Chris Garrison recorded a career-long catch of 44 yards late in the first quarter to put the Eagles in the red zone, which led to the Jones touchdown. Garrison was injured on the play and did not return to the game.
- The 67 total offensive yards allowed by Boston College are the third fewest all-time. Steve Addazio has been the head coach for two of the four best single-game defensive efforts in terms of total offensive yardage allowed by Boston College.
- The BC defense allowed just 26 rushing yards on the day. It was the 18th time in 30 games that the Eagles have not allowed an opponent to tally 100 yards on the ground.
- Boston College allowed just five first downs on the day. It was tied for the fifth-fewest amount of first downs allowed by BC in a game in school history.
- The BC defense forced five three-and-outs to bring the season total to 30, averaging six per game. Boston College limited Buffalo to just one third down conversion in 11 attempts.
- Junior DE Harold Landry recorded a sack in the second quarter, forcing his third fumble of the year. The Bulls were able to recover and punt on fourth down. Landry now has 5.5 sacks on the season.
- In the fourth quarter, senior DT Truman Gutapfel forced his first career fumble and junior LB Connor Strachan recovered it for his second recovery of 2016, fifth in his career.

Opening in Ireland

- Boston College started the 2016 campaign in Dublin, hosting Georgia Tech in Aviva Stadium on Sept. 3 in the Aer Lingus College Football Classic.
- The Yellow Jackets edged the Eagles, 17-14, scoring a touchdown with 35 seconds left in the game.
- It was the third time in six years an American college football game took place in Ireland and the second BC played on the Emerald Isle.
- In 1988, BC defeated Army, 38-24, in front of 45,000

fans at Lansdowne Road Stadium in the Emerald Isle Classic. Aviva Stadium was built on the site of that stadium. That was the first American football game played in Europe.

- During the 2016 game, former quarterback Mark Kampaus was honored. He was the MVP in 1988, completing 15 of 20 passes for 194 yards and scoring a rushing TD.

Welcome to the Heights

- Fourth-year head coach Steve Addazio welcomed five new assistant coaches to Boston College during the offseason.
- Jim Reid returned to The Heights as the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach. The Medford, Mass., native was the defensive coordinator for the Eagles under Dan Henning in 1994. BC went 7-4-1 and ranked 11th in the nation, defeated Kansas State in the Aloha Bowl on Christmas Day. The Eagles recorded 47 sacks that season, a school record that still stands today.
- Scot Loeffler, BC's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, is working with Addazio for a third time in his career, after calling the plays at Temple and coaching QBs at Florida.
- Paul Pasqualoni joined the BC staff as the defensive line coach. He was the head coach at the Connecticut (2011-13), Syracuse (1991-2004) and Western Connecticut State (1982-86). Addazio got his start in coaching on Pasqualoni's Western Connecticut State coaching staff as the offensive line coach and recruiting coordinator in 1985.
- Former BC wide receiver Rich Gunnell returned to The Heights to coach his former position group. Gunnell was a four-year letter winner, served as team co-captain and earned the team's most valuable player award and All-ACC honorable mention accolades. He ranks on four BC career record lists.
- Anthony Campanile rounded out the BC staff as the defensive backs coach. He was a member of the Rutgers coaching staff for the last four years, working with wide receivers, tight ends and on the defensive side of the ball.
- In other coaching news, Justin Frye was promoted to run game coordinator and continues to coach the offensive line. Al Washington moved to special teams coordinator and works with the defensive line. Brian White oversees the running backs and Frank Leonard was promoted to assistant head coach.

Back to Where it All Began

- There are currently six members of the BC football staff who graduated from Boston College, including two coaches.
- Al Washington and Rich Gunnell both played football and earned degrees from BC.
- Current graduate assistants Ian White and Ty-Meer Brown are BC men; White earned his undergraduate degree from BC, while Brown transferred to BC for the 2014 season after completing his undergraduate work at Connecticut.
- Barry Gallup, the associate athletics director for football and alumni relations, has been at Boston College for 37 years, while former linebacker Ricky Brown, the Eagles' director of football initiatives, returned to The Heights in 2016.

2016 BC Captains

• Seniors Truman Gutapfel, John Johnson, Tyler Rouse and Myles Willis were voted team captains of the 2016 Boston College football team, head coach Steve Addazio announced before the first week of the season.

Towles Takes Over

• Graduate QB Patrick Towles made his Boston College debut on Sept. 3, getting the start against Georgia Tech in Ireland. He completed 11 passes on 27 attempts for 144 yards and scored his first BC touchdown on a six-yard run.

• On a 14-for-25 day with two touchdowns, he amassed 234 passing yards - the most in a BC uniform - in the 35-3 victory over Buffalo on Oct. 1. It was also the most completions to date in Towles' time with the Eagles and the first time a BC quarterback threw for over 200 yards since John Fadule hit the 257 mark against NC State on Nov. 7, 2015.

• In the Eagles' first win of 2016, defeating Massachusetts 26-7 at Gillette Stadium on Sept. 10, Towles tallied 191 yards in the air and threw for two touchdowns. He rushed for 66 yards, a single-game high as an Eagle, and just 10 yards shy of his career best, which came against Mississippi State on Oct. 24, 2014.

• In BC's home-opening, 42-10 win over Wagner on Sept. 24, Towles was responsible for four of the Eagles' six touchdowns, throwing for two and accounting for two on the ground. His 17-yard rushing TD in the first quarter was the longest run in a BC uniform while his 58-yard TD pass to Jeff Smith was the longest pass while wearing Maroon and Gold.

• Towles' 14.65 yards per completion is 17th in the nation and third in the ACC. He has thrown for two touchdowns all three BC wins.

King of the Hilliman

• Redshirt sophomore RB Jon Hilliman made an impact at the start of the 2016 season after missing eight games in 2015 with an ankle injury.

• Against Georgia Tech on Sept. 3, he averaged six yards per carry as he led the Eagles rushing core in attempts (17) and total yards (102). He recorded his fifth 100-yard game while scoring the first touchdown of the season, rushing for a career-long 73 yards on the play.

• On Sept. 24, Hilliman notched his sixth career multi-touchdown game, scoring two TDs in the BC victory over Wagner. He opened the scoring for the Eagles on a one-yard touchdown in the first quarter, carrying all five times on the drive, including a 41-yard run. He then added a second TD on a six-yard rush in the third quarter. He finished the day with 83 yards on 19 carries.

• He is fourth in the ACC with 87 rushing attempts on the season and tied for fifth with five rushing TDs.

• His 20 career TDs on the ground is tied for 12th in BC record book.

QB Connection

• Graduate QB Patrick Towles and sophomore WR Jeff Smith have asserted themselves as a dynamic duo in the 2016 season.

• Three of Towles' touchdown passes have been to Smith and they have all be over 30-yard throws.

• Against UMass on Sept. 10, Towles and Smith connected on five catches for 98 yards and two touchdowns. The TD passes, on consecutive drives in the second quarter, were the first of Smith's career and the first for Towles in a BC uniform.

• The 58-yard touchdown pass in the victory against Wagner on Sept. 24 was the longest of Smith's career and longest for Towles in a BC uniform.

• Through five games, the two have combined for 14 receptions for 247 yards and three touchdowns with an average TD completion of 46.67 yards.

• Smith's 17.6 yards per catch average is eighth in the ACC.

Keeping Up with Our Jones

• Redshirt freshman RB Davon Jones transitioned from defensive back to running back in the offseason and the move has paid off.

• In the first three games of 2016, he carried the ball eight times for 26 yards with a long run of eight yards. Ready to roll in the home opener against Wagner on Sept. 24, Jones ran a career-high 12 times and led the Eagles with 90 yards. He rattled off runs of back-to-back runs of 25- and 26-yards in the third quarter to set up an eventual QB keeper TD play.

• Jones scored his first career touchdown on a one-yard run in the victory over Buffalo on Oct. 1, the first TD of the game. He finished the game with 53 rushing yards on 14 carries and did not lose a yard on the day. He also hauled in a career-long, 38-yard reception which set up the Eagles' third touchdown.

Hello Mr. Walker

- Sophomore Michael Walker has begun to assert himself as a receiving threat after mainly focusing on kick returning in his first-year campaign.
- He made two catches for a 35 yards in the season opener against Georgia Tech on Sept. 3, then career bests, before recording three receptions in the victory over UMass on Sept. 10.
- Walker went on to have a career day in the home opener against Wagner on Sept. 24, hauling in his first career touchdown on a 17-yard completion in the third quarter. He finished the game with a career-high four catches for a career-best 72 yards.
- In the win against Buffalo on Oct. 1, Walker hauled in an 11-yard TD reception.

Operation O-Line

- The 2015 Eagles did not return a starter from the 2014 team, in which boasted an O-Line of five graduates who combined for 134 career starts. BC had one of two offensive lines in the country in which all five linemen did not start a game last season.
- Now with a year of experience under their belts, the Eagles have allowed just four sacks on the season, fourth in the ACC.

Quest to Stay on Top

- The Boston College defense has been one of the best in the nation since head coach Steve Addazio took over the program in 2014.
- In 2014, the Eagles ranked 11th overall in total defense, allowing 324.2 yards per game, giving up 94.5 rushing yards per game, second best in the nation. They also surrendered just 21.3 points per game, 21st in the country.
- In 2015, the BC defense was first in the nation in total defense, allowing just 254.3 yards per game. The rush defense was second again (83.2 yards/game), while the pass defense was sixth (171.2 yards/game). The Eagles allowed just 15.3 points per game, fourth best in the country.
- The Eagles ascended to the top of the rankings again through the first five games of the 2016 season. They are the top-ranked overall defense, allowing just 202.0 yards per game and the No. 1 passing defense, giving up a mere 124.0 yards per game. The 78.0 rushing yards per game is seventh overall and second in the ACC.

Recording-Setting Squad

- The Eagles defense continues to fill the record books with its stops.
- BC allowed just 67 total offensive yards to Buffalo on Oct. 1, the third fewest all-time.
- Steve Addazio has been the head coach for two of the four best single-game defensive efforts in terms of total offensive yardage allowed by Boston College.

Just Try to Run

- The Eagles have held opponents to under 100 rushing yards 18 times in the last 30 games.
- In 2016, BC has not allowed more than 50 rushing yards in all three victories.
- Boston College has allowed the second-fewest 100-yard rushers - just 22 - since 2005. Alabama is first with 16.
- In the victory over Massachusetts on Sept. 10, the Eagles defense allowed -23 rushing yards, the second fewest in school history and the fewest since allowing -30 to Louisville on Nov. 10, 1991.
- When BC defeated Wagner on Sept. 24, the BC defense gave up just 45 rushing yards and allowed a rushing touchdown of 55 yards.
- In the win over Buffalo on Oct. 1, the Bulls mustered just 26 rushing yards against the BC defense.

They Are Called Rushmen

- BC led the nation in 2015 with 9.5 tackles for loss per game and was second overall with 114 total. The 463 yards lost was fourth.

Racking Up the Sacks

- The Eagles are tied for 16th in the nation with 16 sacks and rank sixth with 133 yards lost.
- They are tied for fifth in the ACC for their sack total.
- The eight sacks posted in the win against UMass on Sept. 10 tied a school single-game record, set three other times in program history, the last against NC State in 2005.
- Junior DE Harold Landry is tied for sixth in the country and third in the ACC with 5.5 sacks. His 46 yards lost total is seventh overall. Senior LB Matt Milano has three sacks this season, tied for 10th in the league.
- Landry tallied a career-high three sacks and five tackles for loss in the victory over Wagner on Sept. 24.

Marked Improvement

- Since head coach Steve Addazio took over the program in 2014, the Eagles have vastly improved their numbers of sacks and tackles for loss.
- In 2012, BC recorded six sacks (last in the nation) and 45 tackles for a loss of 147 yards. In just one year, the number jumped to 36 sacks and 88 tackles for a loss of 371 yards in 2013.
- In 2014, BC recorded 33 sacks and 89 tackles for a loss of 351 yards.
- 2015 was the best year to date as the Eagles notched 34 sacks, tying for 24th in the nation, for a loss of 263 yards, good for eighth overall.
- So far in 2016, the Eagles have tallied 16 sacks, good for 16th in the nation and 133 yards lost, sixth overall.

Knoll's Knocks

- Junior P/K Mike Knoll took over all the kicking duties heading into the UMass game on Sept. 10. He was 2-for-2 on field goal attempts from 37 and 40 yards in the BC win, tying a career long (40 vs. Florida State, Nov. 22, 2014). He was 1-for-2 on extra-point attempts and set a career long with a 63-yard punt.
- Knoll then set a Boston College record with 13 punts in the loss at Virginia Tech on Sept. 17, surpassing former teammate Alex Howell (2015) and John Cooper (1980), who both punted 12 times in a game. He finished the day with a career-high 537 yards, averaging 41.3 yards per punt with a long of 51.
- In the home-opening victory over Wagner on Sept. 24, he was a perfect 6-for-6 on extra-point attempts, recording a career high for PATs.
- He went 5-for-5 on extra-point attempts in the win over Buffalo on Oct. 1.

Myles Ahead, Yards Away

- Senior RB Myles Willis currently sits fourth all-time in total return yards with 1,738 career yards and is also fourth in BC record books with 72 career returns.
- He has returned five kickoffs for 125 yards in 2016, averaging 25.0 yards per return.
- Along with classmate Tyler Rouse, the Eagles' 28.43 yards per return is 12th in the nation and fourth in the ACC.

Tyler of All Trades

- For the first time in his career, senior RB Tyler Rouse is returning punts for the Eagles.
- He started the season with two returns for 36 yards in the opener against Georgia Tech on Sept. 3.
- Rouse set a new career-long return of 53 yards in the home opener against Wagner on Sept. 24, setting the Eagles up for a TD score on the next play.
- In the same game, the running back recorded a ca-

reer-long 44-yard kickoff return, setting the Eagles up for their first touchdown of the game.

- He amassed a career-high, 59 punt return yards in the victory over Buffalo on Oct. 1. Along with a 30-yard kickoff return and a 27-yard reception, Rouse put up a career-high 116 all-purpose yards against the Bulls.
- His 14.9-yard punt return average is 14th in the nation and sixth in the ACC. His 282 combined kick return yards is 25th overall and seventh in the league.

Matt on the Block

- Senior LB Matt Milano blocked a punt in the first quarter in the win against Buffalo on Oct. 1. It was his third career blocked punt.
- Boston College is one of 33 teams in the country have blocked a punt this season.
- Milano blocked his first career punt in the Eagles' victory over Howard on Sept. 12, 2015. He then did it against in the victory over Northern Illinois on Sept. 26.
- The blocks marked the first time a BC player blocked a punt since Manuel Asprilla did so at Maryland on Nov. 23, 2013.

Willis Represents BC, ACC

- Senior RB Myles Willis was chosen to represent the Atlantic Coast Conference on the NCAA's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC).
- He is one of two football players on the panel and the only one from an FBS school.
- He also serves on the Football Oversight Committee, a voting committee devoted to player safety, student-athlete guidelines, restrictions and more.
- Willis is the co-marketing chair on Boston College's SAAC board.

Johnson Named McGillis Scholarship Recipient

- Senior DB John Johnson was named the recipient of the Jay McGillis Memorial Scholarship at the annual spring game, also named in honor of the former BC student-athlete. McGillis' family was on hand before the game to present Johnson with the award.
- The award is given annually since 1993 to a Boston College defensive back who best exemplifies the personal qualities of team dedication and leadership by example, an extraordinary competitive spirit, and personal concern for family friends and teammates. McGillis, a starting defensive back for Boston College, passed away from Leukemia in 1992. The Eagles' spring game is played in his honor each year.
- Before the start of the 2016 campaign, Johnson was voted a team captain.

Eagles Greats' Jerseys to be Retired

- Boston College will retire the jerseys of quarterback Matt Ryan and linebacker Luke Kuechly in separate ceremonies during the 2016 season.
- Kuechly's jersey will be retired at the Eagles' Oct. 22 game vs. Syracuse while Ryan will be honored at the Nov. 19 game vs. Connecticut.
- Kuechly became the most decorated defensive player in BC football history after sweeping every major defensive postseason award in 2012, including the Dick Butkus Award, the Lott IMPACT Trophy, the Bronko Nagurski Award and the Rotary Lombardi Award. The two-time consensus first-team All-American finished his three-year BC career with a school-record 532 tackles and ranked among the NCAA career leaders in several defensive statistical categories. He was selected by the Carolina Panthers ninth overall in the 2012 NFL Draft.
- Ryan, nicknamed "Matty Ice," capped an illustrious

Boston College career by being selected third overall by the Atlanta Falcons in the NFL draft, becoming BC's highest draft pick ever in any sport. During his standout senior season in 2007, he led the team to an 8-0 start and No. 2 national ranking en route to an 11-3 record (best since 1940), the ACC Atlantic Division championship and the school's first-ever appearance in the ACC Championship game. He was the winner of the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, the Manning Award, ACC Player of the Year and finished seventh in Heisman Trophy balloting. He set the BC school record for single-season passing yards.

- Previously, Boston College has retired the numbers of Heisman Trophy-winning quarterback Doug Flutie and Outland Trophy winner Mike Ruth and the jerseys of eight other standouts: Art Donovan, Bill Flynn, Gene Goodreault, Mike Holovak, Lou Montgomery, Charles O'Rourke, Tony Thurman and Louis Urban.

- Fans can tune in every Monday from 7 to 8 p.m. on WEEI 850 AM or tunein.com to hear Addazio, Eagles' play-by-play announcer Jon Meterparel and color analyst and former BC linebacker Pete Cronan, along with special guests.
- The Eagles' fourth-year head coach will be at Jake N JOES in Waltham, Mass. (70 Market Place Drive).

ACC Network Hits the Air

- ESPN and the Atlantic Coast Conference announced the launch of the ACC Network, a comprehensive linear and digital network.
- The 20-year partnership will provide ACC fans unprecedented access to live events via a comprehensive, multi-platform network.
- It also provides for the extension of the conference's existing rights agreement with ESPN to 2036. ESPN is the ACC's exclusive worldwide rights holder.
- Beginning in August 2016, fans can now access more than 600 exclusive live events from across the conference via a digital live-events channel 'ACC Network Extra', immediately available to users who have access to ESPN3 via WatchESPN and the ESPN app, with that number growing each year.
- More than 1,300 ACC events will be distributed across the platforms in 2019 when the linear network launches.

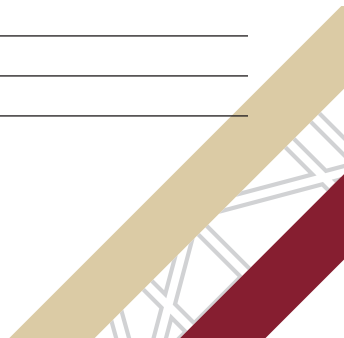
