THE GAME

- Boston College closes out the regular season on the road at Wake Forest. The Eagles need a win to become bowl-eligible for the third time in four seasons under Steve Addazio.
- The game will air on Regional Sports Networks throughout ACC markets beginning at 3 p.m. Saturday afternoon. Wes Durham (play-by-play), James Bates (color analyst) and Jenn Hildreth (sideline reporter) will be calling the game.
- Coverage on the Boston College IMG Sports Network begins at 2:30 p.m. with Jon Meterparel, Pete Cronan and Scott Mutryn on the call. Fans can listen to the game locally on WEEI 850 AM.
- Boston College is coming off its most complete performance of the season in all three phases as the Eagles rolled to a 30-0 victory over UConn last Saturday on Senior Day at Alumni Stadium.

THE SERIES

- Boston College and Wake Forest meet for the 24th time Saturday. The Eagles lead the series 12-9-2 against the Demon Deacons and have won two of the last three meetings.
- The two teams began series play in 1941 (26-6 BC win).
- BC is 3-3-1 all-time in Winston-Salem against Wake, including a 3-2 mark in ACC play at Wake.
- BC has two North Carolina natives on its roster - junior defensive end Harold Landry and true freshman linebacker John Lamot.
- BC fullback Bobby Wolford faces off against his brother John this week on the gridiron. John is a quarterback for the Demon Deacons. Both players missed last week's games due to injuries.

1ST AND 10

- Steve Addazio would become the first BC coach since Tom O'Brien to have the Eagles bowl-eligible in three of the first four years as head coach with a win Saturday at Wake Forest.
- Steve Addazio would join O'Brien and Jack Bicknell as the only BC head coaches since 1981 to have the Eagles bowl-eligible in three of their first four seasons as head coach.
- Boston College held UConn to its lowest single-game yardage total (121) and single-game rushing total (-6) in last week's 30-0 shutout of the Huskies.
- The BC shutout of UConn was the first since defeating Howard, 76-0, on Sept. 12, 2015. It was the first November shutout for the Eagles since a 17-0 victory over Notre Dame on Nov. 8, 2008.

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

All media credential requests must be submitted via www.sportssystems.com/bostoncollege.

Admittance to the Alumni Stadium Press Box is limited to working media members only. Credential requests must be made through BC's credentialing website.

Please request credentials at least two weeks in advance of the game to permit sufficient time for mailing. Media credentials which cannot be mailed will be left at Media Will Call (Media Entrance) at Gate C of Conte Forum.

Working space in the Alumni Stadium Press Box is allotted on the following basis: (1) daily newspaper writers covering for next-day publication; (2) sports editors of newspapers in New England; (3) radio personnel for broadcast originations; (4) official school student daily newspaper; (5) approved special coverage; (6) press and TV working photographers; (7) weekly press representatives; non-originating radio repre-

sentatives of AM news stations; and Internet writers for sites affiliated with established, nationally-recognized media outlets will be considered on a game-by-game basis as space permits. Visiting freelance and amateur photographers are not eligible for media credentials.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Sideline photographers and media members must follow NCAA guidelines, which prohibit entry to the bench areas.

PARKING

Media parking is located in the Commonwealth Avenue parkage garage. Use the intersection of St. Thomas More Road and Commonwealth Avenue, Chestnut Hill, MA 02467. From St. Thomas More Road, take Campanella Way to the Commonwealth Avenue Garage. You should request your parking at the same time you request your game credential. If time permits, both will be mailed to you. There is no day-of-game media parking list and therefore members of the media must have a media parking credential in advance of the game.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

Complete NCAA statistics, play-by-play, and quote sheets from both teams are all regular services on gameday. Upon your arrival, you will receive a press folder with a game program, flip card, updated stats and game day notes. The press box has wireless Internet access. Login information will be provided on gamedays.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS

Steve Addazio and players, following the designated cooling off period, will be made available after each game to members of the media. Addazio's press conference will take place in the Barber Room of the Yawkey Center, which is located opposite the playing field from the press box.

With approximately five minutes remaining in the game, members of the media will be escorted across the field towards the Yawkey Center.

Boston College's locker room is closed to the media. Select players will be made available in the Barber Room following Addazio's press conference. The visiting team's press conference will be held in the Conte Forum Media Center. A member of the Boston College Athletic Communications office will escort the visiting media to the Conte Forum Media Center.

Steve Addazio was named Boston College's 35th head football coach in December of 2012 and wasted no time making his mark on the program. Addazio took over an Eagles program that had suffered back-to-back losing seasons for the first time in 14 years (including a 2-10 mark in 2012) and engineered a remarkable turnaround. In what were supposed to be rebuilding years, Addazio led the Eagles to back-to-back seven-win seasons and two consecutive bowl games.

When Addazio took over the BC football program in 2013, the team had won a total of six games the previous two seasons; BC fans knew the rebuilding process would take time, but few would have predicted the Eagles would receive back-to-back bowl invitations in Addazio's first two years as head coach. Although Addazio's youthful 2015 team was plagued by injuries and finished with a 3-9 record, they were led by the nation's top defense and came within a touchdown of winning five more games. In the final NCAA statistical rankings, the BC defense finished first in total defense (254.3 yards per game) and third down conversion defense (24.1 percent), second in fourth down conversion defense (20.0 percent), second to national champion Alabama in rushing defense (82.8 ypg.) and fourth (behind bowl teams Wisconsin, Ohio State and Alabama) in scoring defense (15.3 ppg.).

In 2014, the Eagles were picked by media to finish fifth in the ACC's Atlantic Division but surprised many by posting a second consecutive seven-win season and, in fact, falling a few yards and several plays short of finishing with a 10-2 mark. The season was highlighted by a prime-time upset of No. 9 USC, dominating the Trojans 506-337 in total offense, and a nailbiter in which the Eagles had a chance to upend undefeated Florida State in Tallahassee, a game FSU won by a last-second field goal after the Eagles had missed the go-ahead kick just minutes before.

Seven members of the 2014 BC team earned spots on the All-ACC team. Center Andy Gallik led the way as a first-team nod on the offensive side of the ball. He was joined

by Hilliman and tackle Seth Betancourt on the third team, while tackle Ian Silberman and guard Bobby Vardaro earned honorable mention. On defense, tackle Connor Wujciak took home third-team honors and linebacker Josh Keyes earned honorable mention. Silberman, Gallik and defensive end Brian Mihalik were drafted while five more Eagles signed free agent contracts.

During the 2013 season, running back Andre Williams led the nation in rushing, earned the Doak Walker Award as the nation's premier running back and took a trip to New York as one of six finalists for the Heisman Trophy. Williams, a consensus All-America selection, finished the season ranked fifth among all FBS running backs in the history of college football in single-season rushing yards with 2,177.

Addazio's coaching pedigree includes 14 postseason bowl games (including six BCS bowl games) and two national titles while on the coaching staff at the University of Florida (a 41-14 win over Ohio State on Jan. 8, 2007 in Glendale, Ariz., and a 24-14 win over Oklahoma on Jan. 8, 2009 in Miami, Fla.).

Prior to his arrival in Chestnut Hill, Addazio led the Temple University Owls in a two-year period of success, transition and growth. Addazio coached the Owls to a nine-win campaign and a bowl victory for the first time in 32 seasons in his first year as head coach.

Prior to leading the Owls, Addazio spent six seasons (2005-10) at Florida under head coach Urban Meyer, serving as offensive coordinator in 2009-10 and interim head coach from Dec. 2009 to July 2010. During his tenure in Gainesville, the Gators participated in six postseason bowls and won two BCS national championships.

Born June 1, 1959, Addazio is married to the former Kathleen Donoghue. They have three children – Nicole, Jessica and Louie.

Scouting This Week's Opponent: Wake Forest

• Wake Forest enters Saturday's game 6-5 overall and 3-4 in the ACC. The Demon Deacons own wins over Tulane (7-3), Duke (24-14), Delaware (38-21), Indiana (33-28), Syracuse (28-9) and Virginia (27-20). Wake Forest has lost games to NC State (33-16), Florida State (17-6), Army (21-13), Louisville (44-12) and Clemson (35-13).

• Head coach Dave Clawson is in his third year at Wake Forest and has the Demon Deacons bowl-eligible for the first time during his tenure. Wake went 3-9 in each of Clawson's first two years before this season's six-win campaign.

• Wake Forest ranks 124th nationally in total offense (308.5 yards per game), 101st in rushing offense (147.3 yards per game), 114th in passing offense (161.3 yards per game) and 121st in scoring offense (19.7 points per game).

• The Demon Deacons rank 51st in the country in total defense (388.5 yards per game), 53rd in rushing defense (161.6 yards per game), 64th in passing yards allowed (226.9 yards per game) and 31st in scoring defense (22.5 points per game).

Noting the Win over UConn

• Boston College closed out its home schedule with a 30-0 victory over Connecticut Saturday afternoon at Alumni Stadium.

• With the victory, the Eagles moved to 11-0-2 in the all-time series against UConn and 6-0-1 in Chestnut Hill against the Huskies. BC has won the last 10 meetings and outscored the Huskies, 297-59.

• The BC shutout was the first since defeating Howard, 76-0, on Sept. 12, 2015. It was the first November shutout for the Eagles since a 17-0 victory over Notre Dame on Nov. 8, 2008.

• Prior to the game, 17 seniors were honored for their contributions to the football program as part of the team's Senior Day festivities: TE Brendan Nosovitch • DB EJ Fortenberry • TE Cameron Croteau • WR Drew Barksdale • OL Jimmy Lowery • QB Patrick Towles • LS Leonard Skubal • LB Mike Strizak • OL Jim Cashman • FB Bobby Wolford • DE Kevin Kavalec • LB Matt Milano • TE Mike Giacone • DT Truman Gutapfel (captain) • DB John Johnson (captain) • RB Tyler Rouse (captain) • RB Myles Willis (captain)

• In a special halftime ceremony, former BC quarterback Matt Ryan was recognized and his jersey was retired. He is the 11th player in program history to have their jersey retired on the Heights. Ryan played at BC from 2004-07, compiling over 9,000 passing yards and 56 touchdowns. Among several accolades, Ryan was the 2007 ACC Player of the Year.

• Graduate student quarterback Patrick Towles was 14-for-19 with 183 passing yards and one touchdown. Towles completed 73.7 percent of his passes, the best single-game completion percentage of his BC career.

• Sophomore wide receiver Jeff Smith racked up a career-high 121 all-purpose yards, recording 87 receiving yards on four receptions and 34 rushing yards. He tallied his second reception over 50 yards on a 54-yard pass from Towles that set up a field goal in the third quarter.

• Redshirt freshman running back Davon Jones opened the scoring for the Eagles on a one-yard carry with 10:36 remaining in the second quarter. It was his second touchdown on the season.

• Sophomore wide receiver Michael Walker tallied his third touchdown of the season on a 10-yard pass from

Towles with 8:25 left in the third quarter. Walker finished with four catches for 45 receiver yards.

• Freshman tight end Korab Idrizi recorded his first-career reception on a 12-yard pass in the third quarter.

• The BC defense forced a season-high four turnovers (three interceptions and one forced fumble), which was the most since forcing five against Notre Dame on Nov. 21, 2015.

• The defense held UConn to -6 yards rushing, the second time this season that the defense has held an opponent to negative rushing yards (Massachusetts, -23).

• The Eagles have held opponents to under 100 rushing yards 21 times in the last 36 games. In 2016, BC has not allowed more than 50 rushing yards in all five victories. BC tallied four sacks on the day, tying for the fourth-highest total of the season.

• Senior linebacker Matt Milano recorded his first career interception in the fourth quarter, returning it 19 yards for a touchdown. The pick-six was the first defensive score of the season for the Eagles. It was the first interception return for a touchdown by a BC defender since Connor Strachan against Howard (Sept. 12, 2015).

• Junior defensive end Harold Landry's fourth-quarter sack for a loss of 17 yards increased his season total to 12 for a loss of 111 yards. Landry entered the game tied for third nationally in sacks. The sack forced his seventh fumble, which leads the nation.

• Junior defensive back Kamrin Moore tallied his second interception of the season and of his career in the second quarter. He also recovered a fumble caused by Landry in the fourth quarter, which marked his first career fumble recovery.

• Sophomore defensive end Wyatt Ray increased his season sack total to 3.5 and the third-quarter stop was also the first solo sack of his career.

• Sophomore DB Taj-Amir Torres recorded his first career interception in the fourth quarter to close out the 30-0 victory.

• Senior defensive back John Johnson wore No. 31 in his final home game in honor of Jay McGillis. Johnson is the 2016 recipient of the Jay McGillis Memorial Scholarship, given annually since 1993 to a Boston College defensive back who best exemplifies the personal qualities of team dedication and leadership by example, an extraordinary competitive spirit, and personal concern for family friends and teammates. McGillis, a starting defensive back for BC, passed away from Leukemia in 1992. The Eagles' spring game is played in his honor each year.

• Junior kicker/punter Mike Knoll connected on a career-high three field goals, going 3-for-3 from 39, 35 and 24 yards. He is 10-for-11 on the season.

• Knoll tallied three touchbacks on kickoffs and averaged 41.0 yards per punt, including one inside the 20.

Defensive Prowess

• The 2016 Boston College defense has continued to play at an elite level following last year's superior performance. In 2015, the Eagles allowed 254.3 yards per game, tops in the nation. They maintained the No. 1 spot for 12 of the 13 weeks of the 2015 regular season. The Eagles also allowed just 82.8 rushing yards per game - second in the country - and just six rushing touchdowns - good for first in the nation.

• The 2015 BC defense surrendered the fourth-fewest points (15.3 per game) and the fewest touchdowns (19).

• The 2016 BC defense ranks 12th nationally in total defense, allowing 312.7 yards per game. The Eagles also rank eighth nationally in rushing defense (103.0 yards per game).

- Boston College is 5-9-1 all-time on games played on Nov. 26.
- BC has lost five consecutive games played on Nov. 26. The last win for the Eagles on this date was in 1955 when BC defeated Holy Cross, 26-7, at Fenway Park.

 - Recipient of the 78th annual George "Bulger" Lowe Award, "New England's Heisman Trophy" and one of America's oldest college football accolades
 - ACC Co-Defensive Lineman of the Week (Oct. 31) following his performance in the win over NC State

News and Notes ...

- 64 of 99 members of the Boston College football team are freshmen, redshirt freshmen, sophomores or red-shirt sophomores.
- There are only 14 seniors and three graduate students on the team.
- Only six seniors or graduates are on the offensive side of the ball, tying the Eagles for the sixth fewest in the nation.
- In 2015, the Eagles tied for seventh in the country for playing the most freshmen, as 26 (16 true, 10 redshirt) saw time on the field.

Opening in Ireland

- Boston College started the 2016 campaign in Dublin, hosting Georgia Tech in Aviva Stadium on Sept. 3 in the Aer Lingus College Football Classic.
- The Yellow Jackets edged the Eagles, 17-14, scoring a touchdown with 35 seconds left in the game.
- It was the third time in six years an American college football game took place in Ireland and the second BC played on the Emerald Isle.
- In 1988, BC defeated Army, 38-24, in front of 45,000 fans at Lansdowne Road Stadium in the Emerald Isle Classic. Aviva Stadium was built on the site of that stadium. That was the first American football game played in Europe.
- During the 2016 game, former quarterback Mark Kampas was honored. He was the MVP in 1988, completing 15 of 20 passes for 194 yards and scoring a rushing TD.

Back to Where it All Began

- There are currently six members of the BC football staff who graduated from Boston College, including two coaches.
- Al Washington and Rich Gunnell both played football and earned degrees from BC.
- Current graduate assistants Ian White and Ty-Meer Brown are BC men; White earned his undergraduate degree from BC, while Brown transferred to BC for the 2014 season after completing his undergraduate work at Connecticut.
- Barry Gallup, the associate athletics director for football and alumni relations, has been at Boston College for 37 years, while former linebacker Ricky Brown, the Eagles' director of football initiatives, returned to The Heights in 2016.

Towles Takes Over

- Graduate quarterback Patrick Towles made his Boston College debut on Sept. 3, getting the start against Georgia Tech in Ireland. He completed 11 passes on 27 attempts for 144 yards and scored his first BC touchdown on a six-yard run.
- On a 14-for-25 day with two touchdowns, he amassed 234 passing yards - the most in a BC uniform - in the 35-3 victory over Buffalo on Oct. 1. It was the first time a BC quarterback threw for over 200 yards since John Fadule hit the 257 mark against NC State on Nov. 7, 2015.
- In the Eagles' first win of 2016, defeating Massachusetts, 26-7, at Gillette Stadium on Sept. 10, Towles tallied 191 yards in the air and two touchdowns.
- In BC's home-opening, 42-10 win over Wagner on Sept. 24, Towles was responsible for four of the Eagles' six touchdowns, throwing for two and accounting for two on the ground. His 58-yard TD pass to Jeff Smith was the longest pass while wearing Maroon and Gold.
- Towles rushed for a career-high 104 yards against Syracuse on Oct. 22, including a career-long, 75-yard touchdown run for his fourth rushing TD of the season. The QB led the Eagles on the day in rushing yards.
- He topped the 200-yard mark again in the road win at NC State on Oct. 29, going 18-for-33 with 204 passing yards. The 18 completions were the most for Towles in the Maroon and Gold.
- Towles was 14-for-19 with 183 passing yards and one touchdown in the victory against Connecticut on Nov. 19. His 73.7 completion percentage was the best in his BC career.
- Towles' 12.8 yards per completion is sixth in the ACC.

King of the Hilliman

- Redshirt sophomore running back Jon Hilliman has made an impact in 2016 after missing eight games in 2015 with an ankle injury.
- Against Georgia Tech on Sept. 3, he averaged six yards per carry as he led the Eagles rushing core in attempts (17) and total yards (102). He recorded his fifth 100-yard game while scoring the first touchdown of the season, rushing for a career-long 73 yards on the play.
- On Sept. 24, Hilliman notched his sixth career multi-touchdown game, scoring two touchdowns in the BC victory over Wagner. He opened the scoring for the Eagles on a one-yard touchdown in the first quarter, carrying all five times on the drive, including a 41-yard run. He then added a second TD on a six-yard rush in the third quarter. He finished the day with 83 yards on 19 carries.
- In the victory at NC State on Oct. 29, Hilliman led the Eagles with 20 carries for a game-high 74 yards.
- He is ninth in the ACC with 149 rushing attempts on the season.
- His 20 career touchdowns are tied for 12th in school history.

QB Connections

- Patrick Towles has found his go-to guys in 2016 and it's a trio of sophomores: wide receiver Jeff Smith, wide receiver Michael Walker and tight end Tommy Sweeney.
- Four of Towles' touchdown passes have been to Smith and all three were 30 yards or longer. Against UMass on Sept. 10, Towles and Smith connected on five catches for 98 yards and two touchdowns. The touchdown passes, on consecutive drives in the second quarter, were the first of Smith's career and the first for Towles in a BC uniform. The 58-yard touchdown pass in the victory against Wagner on Sept. 24 was the longest of Smith's career and longest for Towles at Boston College. Towles hit Smith for a 54-yarder in the victory against UConn on Nov. 19.
- Smith has also shown his speed on the ground. In the last five games, he has recorded 22 rushes for 168 yards, including a 26-yard carry against Clemson on Oct. 7 and a 60-yard touchdown run at NC State on Oct. 29.
- He set a career high with 121 all-purpose yards in the victory over Connecticut, recording 87 receiving yards on four receptions and 34 rushing yards.
- After recording six receptions for 74 total yards in the first three games in 2016, Walker had a breakout game in the home opener against Wagner. He hauled in his first career touchdown on a 17-yard completion. He finished the game with four catches for 72 yards, then career bests. In the win against Buffalo on Oct. 1, he grabbed another TD reception and then he put up career numbers in the road victory at NC State, catching six passes for 78 yards, including snagging a career-long 29 grab. He hauled in his third TD of the season in the shutout of UConn with a 10-yard reception, ending the day with four receptions for 45 yards.
- Walker has also showed he is a dual threat, recording a career-high three carries for 28 yards against Syracuse on Oct. 22.
- Sweeney has emerged as another target for Towles. In the loss to Clemson on Oct. 7, he hauled in four catches for 48 yards and tied a career-long reception of 22 yards. In the win in Raleigh, Sweeney recorded a career-high five receptions and a career-high 78 yards. His first career touchdown came at a critical time: catching a 14-yard pass with just under five minutes to play and the Eagles down one to give BC the lead. He then caught the two-point conversion to give BC the 21-14 lead, which held in the victory.

Keeping Up with Our Jones

- Redshirt freshman running back Davon Jones transitioned from defensive back to running back in the offseason and the move has paid off.
- In the first three games of 2016, he carried the ball eight times for 26 yards with a long run of eight yards. Ready to roll in the home opener against Wagner on Sept. 24, Jones ran a career-high 12 times and led the Eagles with 90 yards. He rattled off back-to-back runs of 25- and 26-yards in the third quarter to set up an eventual QB keeper for a touchdown.
- Jones scored his first career touchdown on a one-yard run in the victory over Buffalo on Oct. 1, the first touchdown of the game. He finished the game with 53 rushing yards on 14 carries and did not lose a yard on the day. He also hauled in a career-long, 38-yard reception which set up the Eagles' third touchdown.
- Against third-ranked Clemson on Oct. 7, the running back tied a career high with another 12-carry game. He also totaled two catches for 25 yards.
- Jones registered his first career start on Oct. 22 against Syracuse and tallied 66 yards on 14 carries, averaging 4.7 yards per carry. He lost only two yards on the day.
- He showed his versatility in the road win at NC State on Oct. 29, recording two rushes, one catch for 20 yards and he threw the game-winning touchdown to tight end Tommy Sweeney on a trick play with just under five minutes to play in the game.
- In the shutout victory against UConn on Nov. 19, Jones recorded 11 carries for 40

yards without any yards lost. He also opened the scoring in the second quarter with a one-yard TD run.

Operation O-Line

- The 2015 Eagles did not return a starter from the 2014 team, in which boasted an offensive line of five graduates who combined for 134 career starts. BC had one of two offensive lines in the country in which all five linemen did not start a game last season.
- Now with a year of experience under their belts, the Eagles have allowed just 18 sacks on the season, sixth in the ACC.

Quest to Stay on Top

- The Boston College defense has been one of the best in the nation since head coach Steve Addazio took over the program in 2014.
- In 2014, the Eagles ranked 11th overall in total defense, allowing 324.2 yards per game, giving up 94.5 rushing yards per game, second best in the nation. They also surrendered just 21.3 points per game, 21st in the country.
- In 2015, the BC defense was first in the nation in total defense, allowing just 254.3 yards per game. The rush defense was second again (83.2 yards/game), while the pass defense was sixth (171.2 yards/game). The Eagles allowed just 15.3 points per game, fourth best in the country.
- On Oct. 2, 2016, the Eagles notched the No. 1 spot again. Through the first five games of the season, they had allowed just 202.0 yards per game and the 124.0 passing yards per game also ranked first.
- The Eagles have allowed 312.7 total yards per game, 12th in the national and second in the ACC. The 103 rushing yards per game allowed is eighth overall and fourth in the conference. Giving up just 209.7 passing yards per game, they are 41st in the nation and No. 5 in the conference.

Recording-Setting Squad

- The Eagles defense continues to fill the record book with its stops.
- BC allowed just 67 total offensive yards to Buffalo on Oct. 1, the third fewest all-time.
- Steve Addazio has been the head coach for two of the four best single-game defensive efforts in terms of total offensive yardage allowed by Boston College.

Brick Wall of Boston

- Boston College averages 5.1 three-and-outs per game, tied for seventh in the country with Ohio State. Alabama leads the nation with 6.4 three-and-out per game.
- The Eagles force three-and-outs on 41.2 percent of opponent drives, sixth-best nationally.
- In the victory against Massachusetts on Sept. 10, BC forced the Minutemen to punt after just three plays (or caused a turnover) on nine of the 12 drives.
- The Eagles closed out the home slate with a shutout over Connecticut on Nov. 19 and forced seven three-and-outs on the day with a season-high four turnovers.

Just Try to Run

- The Eagles have held opponents to under 100 rushing yards 21 times in the last 36 games.
- In 2016, BC has not allowed more than 50 rushing yards in all five victories.
- In the victory over Massachusetts on Sept. 10, the Eagles defense allowed -23 rushing yards, the second fewest in school history and the fewest since allowing -30 to Louisville on Nov. 10, 1991.
- When BC defeated Wagner on Sept. 24, the BC defense gave up just 45 rushing yards and allowed a rushing touchdown of 55 yards.
- In the win over Buffalo on Oct. 1, the Bulls mustered just 26 rushing yards against the BC defense.
- When the Eagles beat NC State to capture their first ACC victory since 2014, the BC defense allowed just 31 rushing yards. In the first half, the Wolfpack recorded -14 yards on the ground. State's RB Matt Dayes - who had tallied 100 yards in three straight games this year - ended the day with 45 yards on 19 carries and had a 24-yard run.
- In the shutout victory over UConn on Nov. 19, the BC defense allowed negative rushing yards for the second time in 2016, as the Huskies put -6 on the board.

They Are Called Rushmen

- BC led the nation in 2015 with 9.5 tackles-for-loss per game and was second overall with 114 total. The 463 yards lost were fourth nationally.
- The Eagles are currently tied for 15th in the nation with 84 tackles-for-loss and rank fifth with 400 yards lost.
- In the last 36 games, the Eagles have recorded 11 double-digit totals for tackles-for-loss.
- At No. 18/20 Florida State, the BC defense recorded

- In the win over Massachusetts on Sept. 10, BC recorded 13 TFLs and then notched 11 TFLs in the victory against Wagner.
- Junior DE Harold Landry is tied for 15th in the nation and is fifth in the ACC with 16 TFLs. He is first in the nation with 117 yards lost on those tackles.

Racking Up the Sacks

- The Eagles are 13th in the nation with 35 sacks and third with 272 yards lost.
- They are fourth in the ACC for their sack total.
- The eight sacks posted in the win against UMass on Sept. 10 tied a school single-game record, set three other times in program history, the last against NC State in 2005.
- Junior DE Harold Landry is tied for third in the country and is second in the ACC with 12 sacks. His 111 yards lost total is No. 1 nationally.
- Landry tallied a career-high three sacks and five tackles for loss in the victory over Wagner on Sept. 24.

Marked Improvement

- Since head coach Steve Addazio took over the program in 2014, the Eagles have vastly improved their numbers of sacks and tackles-for-loss.
- In 2012, BC recorded six sacks (last in the nation) and 45 TFLs of 147 yards. In just one year, the number jumped to 36 sacks and 88 tackles for a loss of 371 yards in 2013.
- In 2014, BC recorded 33 sacks and 89 tackles for a loss of 351 yards.
- 2015 was the best year to date as the Eagles notched 34 sacks, tying for 24th in the nation, for a loss of 263 yards, good for eighth overall.
- So far in 2016, the Eagles have tallied 25 sacks, good for 13th in the nation, and 272 yards lost, third overall.

Get That Ball

- The Eagles have wreaked havoc on defense this season. Their 14 forced fumbles are tied for eighth in the nation and their 11 recoveries are tied for 13th overall.
- BC ranks second in the ACC for forced fumbles and tied for third for recoveries.
- Harold Landry has forced seven fumbles in the 2016 season, which tops in the country and in the ACC.
- Landry averages 0.64 forced fumbles per game, also first in the nation and in the league.
- Junior linebacker Connor Strachan has recovered three fumbles, third in the nation and first in the ACC.
- Sophomore defensive end Zach Allen and senior defensive back John Johnson have two recoveries, 19th overall and third in the conference.

A Special Kind of Team

- The BC special teams units have given opponents fits this season.
- The Eagles rank 10th in the nation and third in the ACC with a 13.85 punt return yard average. On the flip side, they allow just 6.25 yards per punt return, fourth in the ACC and 47th in the country.
- On kickoff return, BC is averaging 23.42 yards per return, 23rd in the nation and fourth in the conference. The defense allows 17.24 yards per return, 10th in the nation and first in the ACC.
- Senior Tyler Rouse averages 13.9 yards per punt return, sixth nationally and second in the league.
- Classmate Myles Willis averages 23.8 yards per kickoff return, 39th in the national and sixth in the ACC. Willis has a kickoff return for a touchdown in 2016 for the third

time in his career.

- Sophomore Michael Walker has returned six kickoffs for 101 yards, averaging 16.8 yards per return.
- BC has also blocked one punt this season.

Knoll's Knocks

- Junior punter/kicker Mike Knoll took over all the kicking duties heading into the UMass game on Sept. 10. He was 2-for-2 on field goal attempts from 37 and 40 yards in the BC win, tying a career-long (40 vs. Florida State, Nov. 22, 2014). He was 1-for-2 on extra-point attempts and set a career-long with a 63-yard punt.
- Knoll then set a Boston College record with 13 punts in the loss at Virginia Tech on Sept. 17, surpassing former teammate Alex Howell (2015) and John Cooper (1980), who both punted 12 times in a game. He finished the day with a career-high 537 yards, averaging 41.3 yards per punt with a long of 51.
- In the home-opening victory over Wagner on Sept. 24, he was a perfect 6-for-6 on extra-point attempts, recording a career high for PATs. He also went 5-for-5 on extra-point attempts in the win over Buffalo on Oct. 1.
- Knoll hit from 30 yards and 39 yards against Syracuse on Oct. 22 and made 24-yards and 29-yards at NC State on Oct. 29. With a blocked kick in the game against the Wolfpack, he is 7-for-8 on the year. He is also 17-for-18 on extra-point attempts.
- He recorded a career-high three field goals in the shutout victory over Connecticut on Nov. 19, going 3-for-3 and hitting from 39, 35 and 24 yards. He was also 3-for-3 on extra-point attempts for the day, recording a career-high 12 points.
- The junior is first in the ACC and 11th in the nation with a 90.9 field-goal percentage, going 10-for-11 on the year.
- Knoll is first in the ACC with 75 punts and second with 2,880 yards.

Myles Ahead, Yards Away

- Senior running back Myles Willis currently sits second all-time in total return yards with 2,017 career yards and is tied for third in BC record books with 84 career returns.
- For the third time in his career, he returned a kickoff for a touchdown as he ran one back 89 yards against Syracuse on Oct. 22.
- It was the second time he did so against the Orange, taking the kickoff return for a 95-yard touchdown on the opening play of the game on Nov. 29, 2014.
- The longest of Willis' career was at New Mexico State on Nov. 9, 2013 when he ran one back for 98 yards as a rookie.
- He has returned 17 kickoffs for 404 yards in 2016, averaging 23.8 yards per return, which is 39th in the nation and sixth in the ACC.
- Willis is one of 41 players in FBS football to return at least one kickoff for a touchdown in 2016.
- Along with classmate Tyler Rouse and sophomore Michael Walker, the Eagles' 23.42 yards per return is 26th in the nation and fifth in the conference.

Tyler of All Trades

- For the first time in his career, senior running back Tyler Rouse is returning punts for the Eagles.
- He started the season with two returns for 36 yards in the opener against Georgia Tech on Sept. 3.
- Rouse set a new career-long return of 53 yards in the home opener against Wagner on Sept. 24, setting the Eagles up for a touchdown on the next play.
- In the same game, the running back recorded a career-long 44-yard kickoff return, setting the Eagles up for their first touchdown of the game.
- He amassed a career-high, 59 punt return yards in the victory over Buffalo on Oct. 1. Along with a 30-yard kickoff return and a 27-yard reception, Rouse put up a career-high 116 all-purpose yards against the Bulls.
- His 13.9-yard punt return average is sixth in the nation and second in the ACC.

Matt on the Block

- Senior linebacker Matt Milano blocked a punt in the first quarter in the win against Buffalo on Oct. 1. It was his third career blocked punt.
- Boston College is one of 50 teams in the country to block at least one punt this season.
- Milano blocked his first career punt in the Eagles' victory over Howard on Sept. 12, 2015. He then did it against in the victory over Northern Illinois on Sept. 26.
- The blocks marked the first time a BC player blocked a punt since Manuel Asprilla did so at Maryland on Nov. 23, 2013.

Willis Represents BC, ACC

- Myles Willis was chosen to represent the Atlantic Coast Conference on the NCAA's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC).
- He is one of two football players on the panel and the only one from an FBS school.
- He also serves on the Football Oversight Committee, a voting committee devoted to player safety, student-athlete guidelines, restrictions and more.
- Willis is the co-marketing chair on Boston College's SAAC board.

Johnson Named McGillis Scholarship Recipient

- Senior defensive back John Johnson was named the recipient of the Jay McGillis Memorial Scholarship at the annual spring game, also named in honor of the former BC student-athlete. McGillis' family was on hand before the game to present Johnson with the award.
- The award is given annually since 1993 to a Boston College defensive back who best exemplifies the personal qualities of team dedication and leadership by example, an extraordinary competitive spirit, and personal concern for family friends and teammates. McGillis, a starting defensive back for Boston College, passed away from Leukemia in 1992. The Eagles' spring game is played in his honor each year.
- In the final home game of the season, Johnson donned McGillis' No. 31.
- Before the start of the 2016 campaign, Johnson was voted a team captain.

- Seniors Truman Gutapfel, John Johnson, Tyler Rouse and Myles Willis were voted team captains of the 2016 Boston College football team, head coach Steve Addazio announced before the first week of the season.
