BC vs. Wagner

- This is the first-ever meeting between the Eagles and the Seahawks.

The Eagles vs. FCS Opponents

- In 1978, the NCAA split Division I football into two levels: I-A, which became FBS, and I-AA, later named FCS.
- Boston College is 24-1 all-time against FCS schools.
- The Eagles' only loss was a 27-0 shutout to Massachusetts in 1978.
- BC has won the last 24 consecutive meetings against FCS foes.
- The Eagles have out-scored FCS opponents, 240-30, in the last six meetings, averaging 40 points per game, while allowing just five.
- Last year, BC defeated Maine, 24-3, and Howard, 76-0, in the first two games of the season.
- The 76 points the Eagles scored tied a school record for the second-most points scored in a game (76 vs. Holy Cross in 1949) and was two shy of the school record of (78 vs. St. Anselm in 1941). It's was the most points BC scored since joining the ACC in 2005.
- In the same game, the BC defense allowed just 11 total yards of offense, the fewest in school history.
- BC also rushed for eight touchdowns, marking the first time the team ran for at least six since Sept. 25, 1993 in a 66-14 win over Temple when the Eagles rushed for seven. The 483 total yards of offense was the most since racking up 549 against Maine on Sept. 20, 2014.

FBS vs. FCS

- Since 2007, Power Five conferences are 59-26 against FCS schools.
- The 2016 season has already seen the most losses to FCS teams as Virginia (Richmond), Iowa State, (Northern Iowa), Washington State (Eastern Washington), Northwestern (Illinois State) and Iowa (North Dakota State) have all lost this season.
- Before this season, the 2010 and 2013 seasons both saw four FBS teams come up in the loss column.

Leading the Way

- Seniors **Truman Gutapfel**, **John Johnson**, **Tyler Rouse** and **Myles Willis** were voted team captains of the 2016 Boston College football team, head coach Steve Addazio announced before the first week of the season.

A Fixture on Top

- In 2015, the Eagles allowed 254.3 yards per game, tops in the nation. They maintained the No. 1 spot for 12 of the 13 weeks of the 2015 regular season.
- The Eagles also allowed just 82.8 rushing yards per game - second in the country - and just

six rushing touchdowns - good for first in the nation.

- The BC D surrendered the fourth-fewest points in 2015 (15.3 per game) and the fewest touchdowns (19).

Eagles Stumble in Blacksburg

- Boston College is looking to get back on track after a 49-0 loss to Virginia Tech in Blacksburg on Sept. 17.
- The Eagles' 44-yard rushing total was the team's lowest since posting 28 yards rushing at NC State on Nov. 7, 2015.
- The defense allowed 532 total yards to the Hokies, the most it surrendered since Oct. 17, 2015 at Clemson. The Hokies tallied 223 yards rushing, the most allowed by the BC defense since allowing 303 to Pittsburgh on Sept. 5, 2014.

Eagles Getting a Look

- A number of Eagles were named to award watch lists and preseason teams before the start of the 2016 season.

Opening in Ireland

- Boston College started the 2016 campaign in Dublin, hosting Georgia Tech in Aviva Stadium on Sept. 3 in the Aer Lingus College Football Classic.
- The Yellow Jackets edged the Eagles, 17-14, scoring a touchdown with 35 seconds left in the game.
- It was the third time in six years an American college football game took place in Ireland and the second BC played on the Emerald Isle.
- In 1988, BC defeated Army, 38-24, in front of 45,000 fans at Lansdowne Road Stadium in the Emerald Isle Classic. Aviva Stadium was built on the site of that stadium.
- It was the first American football game played in Europe.
- During the 2016 game, former quarterback **Mark Kampaus** was honored. He was the MVP in 1988, completing 15 of 20 passes for 194 yards and scoring a rushing TD.

Eaglets

- 64 of 99 members of the Boston College football team are freshmen, redshirt freshmen, sophomores or redshirt sophomores.
- There are only 14 seniors and three graduate students on the team.
- Only six seniors or graduates are on the offensive side of the ball, tying the Eagles for the sixth fewest in the nation.
- In 2015, the Eagles tied for seventh in the country for playing the most freshmen, as 26 (16 true, 10 redshirt) saw time on the field.

Bletzter Brothers

- Freshman LB **Curt Bletzter** joins sophomore **Kevin Bletzter** at The Heights, reuniting the Medfield, Mass., pair who both attended Catholic Memorial High School.
- The Bletzters are one of 76 pairs of brothers from 48 schools in the nation.
- They are also one of 28 pairs who play the same position.

Welcome to The Heights

- Fourth-year head coach **Steve Addazio** welcomed five new assistant coaches to Boston College during the offseason.
- Jim Reid** returned to The Heights as the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach. The Medford, Mass., native was the defensive coordinator for the Eagles under **Dan Henning** in 1994. BC went 7-4-1 and ranked 11th in the nation, defeated Kansas State in the Aloha Bowl on Christmas Day. The Eagles recorded 47 sacks that

season, a school record that still stands today.

- Scot Loeffler**, BC's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach, is working with Addazio for a third time in his career, after calling the plays at Temple and coaching QBs at Florida.
- Paul Pasqualoni** joined the BC staff as the defensive line coach. He was the head coach at the Connecticut (2011-13), Syracuse (1991-2004) and Western Connecticut State (1982-86). Addazio got his start in coaching on Pasqualoni's Western Connecticut State coaching staff as the offensive line coach and recruiting coordinator in 1985.
- Former BC wide receiver **Rich Gunnell** returned to The Heights to coach his former position group. Gunnell was a four-year letter winner, served as team co-captain and earned the team's most valuable player award and All-ACC honorable mention accolades. He ranks on four BC career record lists.
- Anthony Campanile** rounded out the BC staff as the defensive backs coach. He was a member of the Rutgers coaching staff for the last four years, working with wide receivers, tight ends and on the defensive side of the ball.
- In other coaching news, **Justin Frye** was promoted to run game coordinator and continues to coach the offensive line. **Al Washington** moved to special teams coordinator and works with the defensive line. **Brian White** oversees the running backs and **Frank Leonard** was promoted to assistant head coach.

Nowhere to Go but Up

- After the Eagles ranked No. 1 in total defense and held numerous top-10 positions in defensive categories in 2015, the entire staff moved to defensive coordinator positions.
- Don Brown, former defensive coordinator and linebackers coach, is now the defensive coordinator at Michigan. Defensive line coach Ben Albert is the associate defensive coordinator at Duke. Defensive backs coach Kevin Lempa is now the DC at Hawaii and brought former graduate assistant and BC linebacker **Sean Duggan** with him to coach his former position.

Returning to Where it Started

- There are currently six members of the BC football staff who graduated from Boston College, including two coaches.
- Al Washington** and **Rich Gunnell** both played football and earned degrees from BC.
- Current graduate assistants **Ian White** and **Ty-Meer Brown** are BC men; White earned his undergraduate degree from BC, while Brown transferred to BC for the 2014 season after completing his undergraduate work at Connecticut.
- Barry Gallup**, the associate athletics director for football and alumni relations, has been at Boston College for 37 years, while former linebacker **Ricky Brown**, the Eagles' director of football initiatives, returned to The Heights in 2016.

BC Picked to Finish Fifth in Atlantic

- Boston College was picked to finish fifth in the Atlantic Division of the Atlantic Coast Conference in the 2016 season.
- The Eagles received 441 points from the 144 media members in attendance at the 2016 ACC Football Kickoff at the Westin Charlotte.
- Clemson was chosen as the favorite to claim the ACC title. North Carolina was picked to repeat as the Coastal Division winner.

Towles Takes Over

- Graduate QB **Patrick Towles** made his Boston College debut on Sept. 3, getting the start against Georgia Tech in Ireland. Towles finished the game throwing 11-for-17 with 144 passing yards, one interception and a six-yard rushing touchdown.
- Following his performance in Ireland, Towles took control against Massachusetts on Sept. 10. He finished the game 12-for-22 for 191 yards and two touchdowns.
- On the ground against the Minutemen, Towles scrambled for 66 yards, just 10 yards shy of his career best which was set during his time at Kentucky against Mississippi State on Oct. 24, 2014.

King of the Hilliman

- Redshirt sophomore RB **Jon Hilliman** made an impactful start to kick off the 2016 season after missing eight games in 2015 with an injury.
- Against Georgia Tech on Sept. 3, he averaged six yards per carry as he led the Eagles rushing core in attempts (17) and total yards (102) against Georgia Tech on Sept. 3.
- Hilliman recorded his fifth 100-yard game while scoring the first touchdown of the season, rushing for a career-long 73 yards on the play.
- He rushed for his second touchdown of the season and 17th of his career against Massachusetts on Sept. 10.

QB Connection

- Graduate QB **Patrick Towles** and sophomore WR **Jeff Smith** have asserted themselves as a dynamic duo in the 2016 season.
- Against Massachusetts on Sept. 10, Towles and Smith connected on five catches for 98 yards and two touchdowns, including a career-long 46-yard reception.
- The touchdown passes, on consecutive drives in the second quarter, were the first of Smith's career and the first for Towles in a BC uniform.
- In 2016, the two have combined for 11 receptions for 156 yards and two touchdowns through three games.

Ready to Run

- In 2014, the running back corps ranked 14th in the nation and second in the Atlantic Coast Conference, averaging 254.7 yards on the ground per game.
- Current redshirt sophomore **Jon Hilliman** earned All-ACC third-team honors, was named the ECAC Co-Rookie of the Year and broke BC's rookie record for rushing attempts (210). He also tied for ninth in school record books for single-season rushing touchdowns (13).
- But things changed in 2015 when Hilliman's season ended early with an injury, after recording a team season-high 119 yards against Northern Illinois (Sept. 26) and current seniors **Myles Willis** and **Tyler Rouse** battled nagging injuries for the entire year.
- Through three games in 2016, Hilliman leads the group with 158 yards and two touchdowns. Meanwhile, Willis has the highest yards per carry average with 3.5.
- Redshirt freshman **Davon Jones** moved over from the defensive side of the ball as he worked in the secondary in his first year at The Heights. He is second among the core with 3.3 yards per carry and recorded career highs in the early stages of his campaign with 17 rushing yards on five carries at Virginia Tech on Sept. 17.

New Look Receivers

- The Eagles are featuring a deeper wide receiving core in the 2016 season.
- In 2015, BC averaged 111.2 yards per game but through two games in 2016, the Eagles are up to 167.5 yards per game.
- In the season opener against Georgia Tech (Sept. 3) receivers caught 10 passes for 140 yards and in game two, they helped BC record the most passing yards (191) since Nov. 7, 2015 when then freshman QB **John Fadule** threw for 257 against NC State.
- Junior **Charlie Callinan** recorded a career-high four catches for 53 yards, leading the Eagle wideouts in both categories against the Ramblin' Wreck. He added three more catches for 48 yards against UMass on Sept. 10.
- In game one, sophomore **Jeff Smith** and redshirt freshman **Chris Garrison** both recorded their first career receptions as Smith transitioned from quarterback and had three catches for 26 yards. Garrison missed his true freshman season due to injury; he caught one pass for 26 yards.
- Smith went on to put up 98 yards on five catches and two touchdowns against Massachusetts.

- Sophomore **Michael Walker** added three catches for 26 yards in the victory over the Minutemen.
- Junior WR **Thadd Smith** recorded his first catch of the season as the Eagles look to get him going as a deep threat in the loss at Virginia Tech on Sept. 17. He finished the day with 14 receiving yards on two grabs.
- Sophomore TE **Tommy Sweeney** is also getting in on the action. He had a career day in Blacksburg, notching 30 receiving yards and tying a career long with a 22-yard reception.

Operation O-Line

- The BC offensive line has a year of experience under its belt after getting thrown into the fire in 2015.
- Heading into last season, the Eagles did not return a starter from the 2014 team, in which BC boasted an O-Line of five graduates that combined for 134 career starts.
- BC had one of two offensive lines in the country in which all five linemen did not start a game last season.
- The Eagles total have only allowed two sacks all season tying them for first in the ACC and 13th in the nation.
- Junior **Jon Baker** returns to center after starting the final nine games as the ball snapper in 2015. As a true freshman, he played 10 games as the backup left guard.
- Sophomore **Chris Lindstrom** was thrown into the fire, getting nine starts and playing all 12 games, mainly at right guard. He added 38 pounds between the start of his freshman year and his sophomore season.
- Classmate **Aaron Monteiro** started the final five games at left tackle while senior **Jim Cashman** will be the veteran on the line, entering the year with 23 games played and seven career starts.
- The Eagles also get experience with graduate transfer **Jimmy Lowery**, who comes to The Heights from Eastern Illinois.

EAGLES DEFENSE

Looking to Stay on Top

- The Boston College defense has been one of the best in the nation since head coach **Steve Addazio** took over the program in 2014.
- In 2014, the Eagles ranked 11th overall in total defense, allowing 324.2 yards per game, giving up 94.5 rushing yards per game, second best in the nation. They also surrendered just 21.3 points per game, 21st in the country.
- In 2015, the BC defense was first in the nation in total defense, allowing just 254.3 yards per game. The rush defense was second again (83.2 yards/game), while the pass defense was sixth (171.2 yards/game). The Eagles allowed just 15.3 points per game, fourth best in the country.
- In three games in 2016, the Eagles have held opponents to 287.7 total yards per game, ranking 19th in the nation and fifth in the ACC.

Eagles Interrupt the Run

- The Eagles have held opponents to under 100 rushing yards 16 times in the last 28 games.
- BC has allowed the second-fewest 100-yard rushers - 22 - since 2005. Alabama is first with 16.
- In the victory over Massachusetts on Sept. 10, the Eagles defense allowed -23 rushing yards, the second fewest in school history and the fewest since allowing -30 to Louisville on Nov. 10, 1991.

- Through the first three games of the 2016 season, the Eagles defense has tied or broken 11 career highs.
- Against Georgia Tech on Sept. 3, three players broke their career highs in tackles: senior DT **Truman Gutapfel** (8), junior LB **Ty Swab** (9) and sophomore DE **Zach Allen** (3). Two other players also tied career high: sophomore DB **William Harris** (5) and sophomore DE **Wyatt Ray** (3).
- Junior LB **Connor Strachan** recorded a career-high four tackles for a loss. His four TFLs matched the total of the Yellow Jackets' entire defense.
- In the game against Massachusetts on Sept. 10, the Eagles tied a program single-game record eight sacks and three players set individual highs in sacks: Strachan (2.5), Ray (1.5) and Allen (1.5).
- On the road against Virginia on Sept. 17, senior DT **Kevin Kavalec** tallied 10 tackles, tying his career high. He was the first BC player to tally double-digit tackles in 2016. Harris set a new career high with eight tackles in the game while junior DT **Noa Merritt** recorded his first career tackle for a loss.

They Are Called Rushmen

- BC led the nation in 2015 with 9.5 tackles for loss per game and was second overall with 114 total. The 463 yards lost was fourth.
- In the win over Massachusetts on Sept. 10, BC recorded 13 tackles for a loss of 73 yards, the ninth double-digit TFL total in the past 27 games.
- The Eagles also notched eight sacks for a loss of 59 yards. The sack total tied a school single-game record, set three other times in program history, the last in 2005 against NC State.
- BC is currently tied for 15th in the nation with 10 sacks and tied for ninth with 78 yards lost by sack.
- The Eagles' 26 tackles for a loss of 122 yards tie for 19th and 10th in the nation, respectively.
- Junior LB **Connor Strachan** is tied for fifth in the country with 6.5 tackles for a loss

Marked Improvement

- Since head coach **Steve Addazio** took over the program in 2014, the Eagles have vastly improved their numbers of sacks and tackles for loss.
- In 2012, BC recorded six sacks (last in the nation) and 45 tackles for a loss of 147 yards. In just one year, the number jumped to 36 sacks and 88 tackles for a loss of 371 yards in 2013.
- In 2014, BC recorded 33 sacks and 89 tackles for a loss of 351 yards.
- 2015 was the best year to date as the Eagles notched 34 sacks, tying for 24th in the nation, for a loss of 263 yards, good for eighth overall.

Each Year, It Gets Better

- The overall defense also saw improvement from the 2014 season to 2015.
- The Eagles ranked 18th in the nation allowing six fewer points per game in one season and were eighth overall allowing 69.9 fewer yards per game.
- Georgia State led the way in improvement in the points category, allowing 15 fewer per game, while Illinois gave up 105.6 yards per game.



EAGLES SPECIAL TEAMS

Knoll's Knocks

- Junior P/K **Mike Knoll** set a Boston College record with 13 punts in the loss at Virginia Tech on Sept. 17, surpassing former teammate **Alex Howell** (2015) and **John Cooper** (1980), who both punted 12 times in a game.
- Knoll finished the day with a career-high 537 yards, averaging 41.3 yards per punt with a long of 51.
- In the victory over Massachusetts on Sept. 10, Knoll took over all the kicking duties. Knoll went 2-for-2 on field goal attempts from 37 and 40 yards with just under four minutes to go in the third quarter, increasing the BC lead to 12.
- His 40-yard attempt matched his career long dating back to Nov. 22, 2014 against Florida State.
- Knoll was also 1-for-2 on extra-point attempts in the UMass win.
- He also set a new career long with a 63-yard punt against the Minutemen.
- After punting three times in the season opener against Georgia Tech on Sept. 3 and averaged 35.7 yards per punt - but pinned the Yellow Jackets at the one-yard line - he punted nine times against the Minutemen and averaged 41.9 yards.
- He also kicked off seven times and averaged 60.7 yards per kick.

Myles Ahead, Yards Away

- Senior RB **Myles Willis** currently sits fourth all-time in total return yards with 1,725 career yards and is also fourth in BC record books with 71 career returns.
- He returned two kickoffs for 66 yards (33.0 yards per return) against Massachusetts on Sept. 10 at Gillette Stadium.

Tyler of All Trades

- For the first time in his career, senior RB **Tyler Rouse** is returning punts for the Eagles.
- He returned two punts for 36 yards - including a run of 22 yards - in the season opener against Georgia Tech on Sept. 3.
- Rouse set a new career-long return of 33 yards in the fourth quarter against Massachusetts, Sept. 10.
- The 13.1-yard average is tied for fourth in the Atlantic Coast Conference and his seven returns is tied for third.

The Kicking Game

- Sophomore **Colton Lichtenberg** was named the Eagles' kicker to start the 2016 season.
- In the season opener against Georgia Tech, Lichtenberg had troubling connecting, missing a 35-yard field goal in the third quarter and having a 43-yarder blocked.
- It was the first time one of Lichtenberg's kicks was blocked in his BC career. In fact, it was the first time the Eagles had a field goal blocked since Oct. 29, 2011 at Maryland.
- Lichtenberg was 2-for-2 on extra-point attempts.
- He also averaged 60.7 yards on three kickoffs.
- Lichtenberg has missed the last two games of the season due to a leg injury.
- Last season, he was 3-for-6 in field-goal attempts on the year and a perfect 6-for-6 kicking the extra point. He connected on longs of 43 yards in the final two games of the season - against Notre Dame (Nov. 21) at Fenway Park and at Syracuse (Nov. 28). He averaged 60.1 yards per game on kickoffs with four touch backs.

Mr. Walker's Welcome

- Current sophomore **Michael Walker** came to The Heights as a defensive back but moved to wide receiver before the first game of the 2015 season.
- He added kickoff returner to his repertoire. He led the Eagles with 24 returns for 686 yards, averaging 28.6 yards per game, fourth in the ACC.
- He notched a career-long, 67-yard return against No. 5/4 Notre Dame (Nov. 21), which was the longest of the season for the Eagles.

Matt on the Block

- Senior LB **Matt Milano** blocked his first career punt in the Eagles' victory over Howard on Sept. 12, 2015. He then did it again in the victory over Northern Illinois on Sept. 26.
- They marked the first time a BC player blocked a punt since **Manuel Asprilla** did so at Maryland on Nov. 23, 2013.

EAGLE SIDE NOTES

Willis Represents BC, ACC

- Senior RB **Myles Willis** was chosen to represent the Atlantic Coast Conference on the NCAA's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC).
- He is one of two football players on the panel and the only one from an FBS school.
- Willis is the marketing chair on Boston College's SAAC board.

Johnson Named McGillis Scholarship Recipient

- Senior DB **John Johnson** was named the recipient of the Jay McGillis Memorial Scholarship at the annual spring game, also named in honor of the former BC student-athlete. McGillis' family was on hand before the game to present Johnson with the award.
- The award is given annually since 1993 to a Boston College defensive back who best exemplifies the personal qualities of team dedication and leadership by example, an extraordinary competitive spirit, and personal concern for family friends and teammates. McGillis, a starting defensive back for Boston College, passed away from Leukemia in 1992. The Eagles' spring game is played in his honor each year.
- Before the start of the 2016 campaign, Johnson was voted a team captain.

Eagles Greats' Jerseys to be Retired

- Boston College will retire the jerseys of quarterback **Matt Ryan** and linebacker **Luke Kuechly** in separate ceremonies during the 2016 season.
- Kuechly's jersey will be retired at the Eagles' Oct. 22 game vs. Syracuse while Ryan will be honored at the Nov. 19 game vs. Connecticut.
- Kuechly became the most decorated defensive player in BC football history after sweeping every major postseason award in 2012, including the Dick Burkus Award, the Lott IMPACT Trophy, the Bronko Nagurski Award and the Rotary Lombardi Award. The two-time consensus first-team All-American finished his three-year collegiate career with a school-record 532 tackles and ranks among the NCAA career leaders in several defensive statistical categories. He was selected by the Carolina Panthers ninth overall in the 2012 NFL Draft.
- Ryan, nicknamed "Matty Ice," capped an illustrious Boston College career by being selected third overall by the Atlanta Falcons in the NFL draft, becoming BC's highest draft pick ever in any sport. During his standout senior season in 2007, he led the team to an 8-0 start and No. 2 national ranking en route to an 11-3 record (best since 1940), the ACC Atlantic Division championship and the school's first-ever appearance in the ACC Championship game. He was the winner of the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, the Manning Award, ACC Player of the Year and finished seventh in Heisman Trophy balloting. He set the BC school record for single-season passing yards.
- Previously, Boston College has retired the numbers of Heisman Trophy-winning quarterback **Doug Flutie** and Outland Trophy winner **Mike Ruth** and the jerseys of eight other standouts: **Art Donovan**, **Bill Flynn**, **Gene Goodreault**, **Mike Holovak**, **Lou Montgomery**, **Charles O'Rourke**, **Tony Thurman** and **Louis Urban**.

Addazio on the Airwaves

- After its premiere season, head coach **Steve Addazio**'s weekly radio show is back for a second year.
- Fans can tune in every Monday from 7 to 8 p.m. on WEEI 850 AM or tunein.com to hear Addazio, Eagles' play-by-play announcer Jon Meterparel and color analyst and former BC linebacker **Pete Cronan**, along with special guests.
- The Eagles' fourth-year head coach will be at Jake N JOES in Waltham, Mass. (70 Market Place Drive) for the first two live shows. Additional locations will be announced on bceagles.com and on the @BCFootball Twitter account.

Eagles in the BC Hall

- Former Boston College football players **William Green** and **Paul Zukauskas** will be inducted in the Boston College Varsity Club Hall of Fame as two of the nine-member 2016 class.
- They will be inducted in a ceremony on Friday, Sept. 23 and be recognized at halftime of the Eagles' football game against Wagner on Sept. 24.
- William Green was a consensus first-team All-American in 2001 as he ran for 1,559 yards and scored 15 touchdowns. A native of Atlantic City, N.J., Green arrived at BC as a much heralded recruit and lived up to his potential as he scored four touchdowns as a rookie and was used as a short-yardage back. He started only two games in his second season but rushed for 1,164 yards with 14 touchdowns. He was the second-leading rusher in the conference and 20th in the country. In Green's final season, he rushed for 100 or more yards in nine of 10 games and 200 yards in two games. He is second on the all-time list for rushing touchdowns with 22. He ranks fourth for most TDs in a single season (15) and is the sixth-leading rusher in program history. He was drafted 16th by the Cleveland Browns in 2001.
- Zukauskas, a native of Weymouth, Mass., was the first true freshman to start on the offensive line in 20 years when he arrived on campus in 1997. He proceeded to start all but one game in the next four seasons. As a senior, he led an offensive line that allowed only six sacks the entire season and earned a third-place ranking by the conference for total offense. Zukauskas was a first-team All-America selection by American Football Coaches Association, second team Walter Camp All-American, first team All-Big East and Outland Trophy Watch List in 2000. Zukauskas was drafted by the Cleveland Browns in 2001 and played professionally for five years.

ACC Network Hits the Air

- ESPN and the Atlantic Coast Conference will launch the ACC Network – a comprehensive linear and digital network.
- The 20-year partnership will provide ACC fans unprecedented access to live events via a comprehensive, multi-platform network.
- It also provides for the extension of the conference's existing rights agreement with ESPN to 2036. ESPN is the ACC's exclusive worldwide rights holder.
- Beginning in August 2016, fans can access more than 600 exclusive live events from across the conference via a digital live-events channel 'ACC Network Extra', immediately available to users who have access to ESPN3 via WatchESPN and the ESPN app, with that number growing each year.
- More than 1,300 ACC events will be distributed across the platforms in 2019 when the linear network launches.
