STORYLINES

BC WINS FOURTH STRAIGHT, SWEEPS STATE

- Boston College won its second straight ACC series by sweeping NC State. The Eagles have won the last four games, the longest win streak of the season, after capturing its 13th Beanpot title over Harvard on April 19.
- The Eagles only used five pitchers versus State, as the three starters - sophomores RHP **Jacob Stevens** and LHP **Dan Metzdorf** and junior RHP **Brian Rapp** - combined for 23.2 innings, four runs and 13 Ks.
- Rapp threw his first career complete game, shutting out the Wolfpack on Sunday, striking out six, allowing just three hits - all singles - and walking two.
- Junior RHP **Donovan Casey** picked up two saves on the week to tie for eighth in BC record books.
- The Eagles defeated NC State, 8-3, at Fenway Park on Saturday in the Sixth Annual ALS Awareness Game, which honored former BC captain and ALS advocate **Pete Frates**.
- BC took down Harvard, 3-2, in five innings after a rain-shortened game, also at Fenway, to capture to third straight Baseball Beanpot title, fourth under-seventh year head coach **Mike Gambino**.
- Sophomore UT **Jake Alu** was 8-for-16 (.500) with two doubles and just one strikeout in the four games last week.
- The Eagles have not recorded an error in 13 games in 2017, including the last four.

THE EAGLES WELCOME MIAMI; HOST FIFTH WWP GAME

- The Eagles face Miami in a rematch of the 2016 Super Regional, in which Boston College came within one game of the College World Series.
- The Hurricanes took game one before BC earned a game-two victory for a decisive third game. UM won, 9-4, after a seventh-inning grand slam by Edgar Michelangeli off LHP **Jesse Adams**.
- The Canes lead the all-time series, 20-7, earning the first seven victories before the Eagles notched a win in the 2009 series finale.
- The two teams met once before becoming ACC conference opponents, playing a two-game set in 2003.
- BC has won just one series, in 2013 at home, which was decided by a walk-off solo home run by **Matt Paré**.
- The Canes have swept the Eagles four times - in 2008, 2012 and 2014 in Coral Gables and in 2011 in Chestnut Hill.
- BC has won both meetings in the ACC Tournament, earning a 10-1 victory and a 12-10, 12-inning victory in 2009 and 2010, respectively.
- In the last three years, the Eagles are 3-6 against the Canes, including 2-4 in conference matchups.
- On Saturday, the Eagles will host the Fifth Annual Wounded Warrior Project Game. Local veterans will participate in a pre-game ceremony and be honored throughout the game.

EAGLES OF NOTE

- Junior RHP **Brian Rapp** threw the first complete game of his career - a three-hit shutout - to complete the sweep of NC State in the second gam of a doubleheader on Sunday. He allowed just five base runners on the day and none advanced past first base. He struck out six, walked just two and all three hits were singles. It was the first complete-game shutout since **Mike King** recorded on against No. 24 Georgia Tech on April 17, 2015. In three of his five ACC starts this season, Rapp has 22 strikeouts, just four walks and two runs over 23.0 innings (No. 6 Clemson, at Virginia Tech, NC State). He has not allowed a run twice.
- Sophomore LHP **Dan Metzendorf** threw a career-high eight innings and allowed just one run, three hits and one walk in the Eagles' second win against NC State. It was his best outing since allowing just two hits and no runs or walks with four strikeouts in a six-inning start against then No. 6 Clemson on March 25.
- Sophomore RHP **Jacob Stevens** started the season by not allowing an earned run in the 19.2 innings. After a few mid-season bumps, he got back on a track, allowing just one hit and one run over a seven-inning start at Duke on April 14, tying a career high for innings pitched. He followed that by picking up his fourth win against the Pack on Saturday at Fenway Park. His 3.50 career ERA is currently sixth in BC record books.
- Junior RHP **Donovan Casey** entered BC single-season record books tied for eighth by logging two saves on the week to bring his season total to five. He got the final two outs in the one-run ballgame against Harvard on Wednesday and then threw a 123 ninth, striking out the final batter in a 12-pitch at bat, against NC State on April 23.
- The Eagles used just five pitchers in three games - Stevens, Metzendorf, Rapp, Casey and reliever RHP **John Witkowski** - to get the best of NC State. The Pack entered the series with a .268 batting average, almost one home run per game and scored 5.73 runs per game. Against the BC staff, State averaged .176 at the plate, scored four runs over three games and did not tally a homer. In fact, NC State logged just five extra-base hit total, all doubles.
- Sophomore UT/RHP **Jake Alu** led the way at the plate for the Eagles against the Pack, going 6-for-10 with two runs, two doubles, an RBI and just one strikeout. He also scored the game-winning run against Harvard in the Beanpot championship, stealing both second and third and crossing the plate on a wild pitch in the fourth. He leads the Eagles with a .342 batting average and 27 hits in ACC games. His .333 overall average and nine stolen bases also leads the team. He recorded a career-high four hits in the victory at Duke on April 15.
- Freshman OF **Jacob Yish** has played in 14 games for the Eagles and has recorded a hit in eight of them. Je ta;oned a career-high three hits at Duke on April 15, logging his first career double, a career-high two runs and tied a career high with two RBIs.
- Sophomore C **Gian Martellini** has started 37 games for the Eagles behind the plate and logged at least one hit in 30 of them. He has never recorded two straight games without a hit and has at least one in the last five. He notched a career-long, seven-game hit streak from March 29 to April 9, tallying eight hits, seven runs, six RBIs, two doubles, a triple and two home runs. Martellini leads the team with 11 doubles, three home runs, 26 RBIs and a .444 slugging percentage. He recorded a career-high five RBIs in the victory over Duke on April 15 with his first career grand slam to put the Eagles ahead in the fourth inning.

CASEY AT THE BAT

- Junior OF/RHP **Donovan Casey** hit for the cycle in the victory over Massachusetts on March 29, a feat that had not been done in 14 years at Boston College.
- He started the game with a triple off the wall in right center. In his next at bat, he homered over the left-field fence. He then hit a single up the middle and in his fourth at bat, he doubled to right center to complete the cycle.
- The last BC player to hit for the cycle was Jason Delaney on April 27, 2003 in a 3-2 win against Seton Hall.
- Classmate INF **Jake Palomaki** injured his hamstring on March 18 at No. 1 Louisville and Casey took over in the lead-off spot. He is batting .390 (16-for-41) with a .610 slugging percentage and a .444 on-base percentage. He led off the April 5 game at Northeastern with a home run over the left-field fence.

"JUNIOR" NO MORE?

- Sophomore UT/RHP **Jake Alu** made his first career start - as the designated hitter - against Villanova on March 5 and recorded a then career-high three hits (3-for-4), three RBIs and three stolen bases.
- He made his first career start in the field on March 7 against Toledo, playing left - the first time he ever set foot in the outfield - and made a diving catch in foul territory for the first out in the third. He recorded a hit and a run in the win over the Rockets.
- He then scored a career-high three run in the win at No. 2 Florida State on March 10.
- Alu - more affectionately known as "Junior" or "Junezy" - drove in three runs against UMass on March 29 on a 2-for-3 day with two doubles, two runs and a walk.
- He matched his then career high with three hits on a 3-for-5 day at Virginia Tech on April 1 but set a new record with four hits on a 4-for-6 day at Duke on April 15.
- Alu recorded a career-long, eight-game hit streak from March 26 to April 9. In that time, he recorded 14 hits, six runs, six RBIs, three doubles, four walks and two stolen bases.
- He led the way at the plate for the Eagles against NC State (April 23-24), going 6-for-10 with two runs, two doubles, an RBI and just one strikeout. He also scored the game-winning run against Harvard on April 19 in the Beanpot championship game, stealing both second and third and crossing the plate on a wild pitch in the fourth.
- Since March 5, he has started every game for the Eagles. He leads the team with a .333 batting average and nine stolen bases. His .342 ACC clip is also first on the team.
- The righty has also pitched nine times in 2017 and recorded eight strikeouts after learning to the art before the season.

WATCH WHEN YOU RUN

- The BC outfield has proven it's a dangerous one to test.
- The Eagles have racked up 11 outfield assists, which is fourth in the nation.
- Senior UT **Michael Strem**'s six outfield assists are third in the country.
- Junior OF **Donovan Casey** has the Eagles' other five, tied for fourth.

IRON MAN WAS OUT...BUT NOW HE'S BACK

- Junior INF **Jake Palomaki** started 116 straight games for the BC baseball team before he suffered a hamstring injury in the second game at Louisville on March 18.
- The injury cost him a spot in the lineup as he rehabilitated the injury. The last time Palomaki did not start a game was on March 1, 2015.
- In his BC career, Palomaki only did not play the first four games his freshman year.
- He had played in 123 of the Eagles' 127 games until the injury and he started 120 of those games.
- Palomaki returned to the diamond as a defensive replacement in the eighth inning on April 8 against No. 4 North Carolina and drew a walk at the plate. He got back to regular play by starting all three games at Duke (April 14-16).
- Mak, as he more commonly known, has started seven of the last eight games, and recorded six hits, six runs, three RBIs and three walks.
- He is currently third all-time in BC record books with 102 career walks and seventh all-time with 39 career stolen bases.

EAGLES HOST FIFTH ANNUAL WWP GAME

- BC baseball will team up with the Wounded Warrior Project (WWP) for the fifth straight year to honor current and former U.S. military members for the April 29 game against Miami.
- The Eagles will wear specially-designed Under Armour camo uniforms and local veterans will be honored during the game.
- On Thursday, the Eagles invited local military members to campus to engage in a softball game on Shea Field.
- The players and veterans build backpacks with hand-written notes to send to Walter Reed Medical Center, listen to a WWP speaker talk and share a meal provided by Sweet Cheeks in Boston, Mass.

BITTEN BY THE INJURY BUG

- One of the largest hurdles the Eagles have faced this season is injuries and illness.
- At any given point this season, as many as 15 players on the Eagles' 35-man roster have been sidelined due to injury or illness.
- The injury bug has given other players - like sophomore UT/RHP **Jake Alu** and freshmen INF **Brian Dempsey** and UT/RHP **Jack Cunningham** the chance to step up and garner more playing time.

ROAD WARRIORS

- Boston College traveled over 12,000 miles before playing at Eddie Pellagrini Diamond at Commander Shea Field in Chestnut Hill, Mass. The Eagles played 26 games before hosting UNC at The Heights on April 8 and 9.
- The Eagles' first scheduled game at what is affectionately known as the "Birdcage" was slated for March 24 against Clemson in a three-game, conference matchup, but field conditions forced BC to move the series to Rhode

Island's Bill Beck Field in Kingston, R.I.

- Due to a grass field and unpredictable New England weather, the Eagles have averaged playing the first 24 games elsewhere before opening at The Heights under seventh-year head coach **Mike Gambino**. In 2015, the Eagles played the first 30 games away from Shea Field as Boston saw a record amount of snowfall that winter.
- BC started the 2017 journey in Florida with a three-game series at Bethune-Cookman in Daytona Beach.
- The second weekend of the season, the Eagles traveled to the middle of the country for the 19 Ways Invitational hosted by Oklahoma. It was the first time the Eagles played in the Sooner State.
- The Eagles returned to Florida the following weekend for five games in the Snowbird Classic in Port Charlotte before opening the ACC slate in Tallahassee against then No. 2 Florida State.
- Because of a mid-March snowstorm, BC's instate contest at Holy Cross was postponed so the Eagles flew out to Kentucky for a three-game conference set against top-ranked Louisville. After, the Eagles traveled four miles down Commonwealth Ave. for a midweek tilt with Northeastern and the scheduled three-game set against the Tigers.
- Due to field conditions, the Eagles' New England rivalry game at Connecticut was postponed and BC had to move its midweek game against Massachusetts to the New England Baseball Complex in Northborough, Mass.
- The Eagles headed to Blacksburg, Va., for a three-game ACC series with the Hokies and moved the first round of the Beanpot from Chestnut Hill to Brookline.

LAST MEETING: MIAMI

- The Eagles and Hurricanes battled in Coral Gables for a chance to the 2016 College World Series with the No. 2 seed Miami coming out on top, winning two of three. It was the first time BC had earned a spot in a Super Regional since the NCAA Tournament had expanded to 64 teams and the first time the Eagles had advanced beyond a regional since 1967.
- Miami took game one, 12-7, even as BC roared back in the ninth. The Canes took the lead on two home runs in the third. Carl Chester hit one back at the mound that hit off BC's RHP **Justin Dunn**'s foot and bounced back toward the plate. With two on, Zack Collins launched a home run over the right-field wall to put the Hurricanes on top, 3-1. Dunn surrendered a two-out solo shot to Johnny Ruiz to right center to give the Canes a three-run lead. Trailing by six going into the ninth inning, the Eagles scored four runs and had the tying run in the on-deck circle as the bases were loaded with two outs but closer RHP Bryan Garcia struck out current junior OF/RHP **Donovan Casey** to end the game and preserve the Miami win. Senior UT **Michael Strem** led the Eagles with a 3-for-4 night while junior OF **Scott Braren** launched a home run in the ninth and plate three runs.
- BC evened the series with a 5-3 victory in the second game. Miami scored two runs to take a lead in the fourth but the Eagles fired back in the bottom of the inning with four to go up by two. It was a lead they would not relinquish. RHP **Mike King** went six innings, allowed three runs on nine hits and a season-high four walks while strike out six. Current junior 1B/LHP **Mitch Bigras** led the Eagles with a career-high two RBIs on a 2-for-4 day. Casey blasted his first home run of the season and junior RHP **Bobby Skogsbergh** earned the save, throwing the ninth and allowing just one hit with one strikeout.
- The Canes took the series - and the trip to Omaha - with 9-4 victory in game three. In a two-run game in the seventh, Edgar Michelangeli hit a grand slam off LHP **Jesse Adams** to give the Canes a six-run lead. Casey led the Eagles with three RBIs on the day, turning in a 2-for-5 performance. Braren went 2-for-4 with a double, the Eagles' only extra-base hit of the day. Senior 1B **Chris Balogh** came up with a pinch-hit RBI single in the eighth, notching his first career RBI in a BC uniform.

LAST TIME OUT: DUKE AND BEANPOT VICTORY

- The Eagles have won the last four games, the longest win streak of the season, going 4-1 last week. They started with an 8-3 road loss at Dartmouth on Tuesday before bouncing back to defeat Harvard, 3-2, in five innings to keep the Beanpot at The Heights. BC then won all three games against NC State to sweep the ACC series.
- In Hanover, N.H., the Eagles trailed the Big Green by one in a 3-2 ballgame going to the sixth, but Dartmouth plated five runs in the inning to take a commanding lead. Freshman OF **Jacob Yish** and senior **Johnny Adams** led the way with 2-for-4 days. Yish had two stolen bases while Adams recorded one swipe and a double. Junior LHP **Carmen Giampetrucci** returned to the mound after missing time due to a back injury. He threw two innings of scoreless relief, allowing one hit and three walks with two strikeouts.
- BC won its tournament-high 13th Beanpot title, the third in a row, in victory at Fenway Park on Wednesday against the Crimson. The game was shortened to five innings due to rain. In a one-run game in the fifth, and with a runner on first and one out, junior RHP/OF **Donovan Casey** came in and got two outs, including a strikeout swinging, to end the game. In the fourth, sophomore UT **Jake Alu** drew a walk stole second and third and scored on a wild pitch, which ended up being the winning run. Senior UT **Michael Strem** and freshman INF **Brian Dempsey** were both 2-for-2. Freshman RHP **Jack Cunningham** earned his first career win, throwing 2.1 innings of

relief. He allowed three hits, one run and struck out one.

- The Eagles started the series against the Wolfpack with an 8-3 victory at Fenway Park on Saturday in the Sixth Annual ALS Awareness Game, honoring former BC captain **Pete Frates**. The Pack got within one in the top of the sixth, scoring two to make it a 4-3 game, but the Eagles answered with four runs in the bottom of the inning to take a five-run lead. Sophomore RHP **John Witkowski** and Casey combined to pitch 2.1 scoreless innings of relief to close out the game for the Eagles. Both allowed one hit and Casey walked one and struck out two. Sophomore RHP **Jacob Stevens** turned in a 6.2-inning start to pick up his fourth win of the season. He allowed eight hits, three runs, just one walk and struck out four. Alu and Dempsey were 3-for-4 to lead the way and two of Alu's three hits were doubles. Yish was 2-for-4 with two RBIs while Strem also drove in two.
- BC swept a doubleheader in two pitchers' duels, winning, 2-1, and 1-0, on Sunday to take the series.
- In the first game, the game was tied at one in the eighth and sophomore C **Gian Martellini** doubled down the left-field line with a man on second to score the go-ahead run. Casey threw a 123 ninth to close out the game for the Eagles. Sophomore LHP **Dan Metzdorf** threw a career-high eight innings and allowed just one run, three hits and one walk. He struck out three and struck out the final seven batters he faced.
- Junior RHP **Brian Rapp** pitched a complete-game shutout, going nine for the first time in his career, to earn the game two victory. Only five Wolfpack runners reached base on the day on three hits - three singles - and two walks, while Rapp struck out six. Alu led the way with a 2-for-3 day. Martellini and junior INF **Jake Palomaki** doubled in the game - the only two extra-base hits recorded of either team.

EAGLES WIN 13TH BEANPOT TITLE

- Boston College collected its 13th Baseball Beanpot title, the most of the four schools, with a 3-2, five-inning victory over Harvard at Fenway Park on April 19. The game was shortened due to rain.
- The Eagles have won the last three straight titles and four total under seventh-year head coach **Mike Gambino**. The three-year run in the longest win streak for BC since the inception of the Boston-based tournament in 1990.
- It was the fifth time the Eagles claimed the title over the Crimson and improve to 14-4-1 overall against Harvard in the tournament.
- The Eagles hold a 37-16-1 record in the Beanpot.
- BC reached the championship game after a 5-1 victory over Northeastern on April 5.

SIXTH ANNUAL ALS GAME AT FENWAY PARK

- The Boston College baseball team played the Sixth Annual ALS Awareness Game at Fenway Park on April 22 against NC State. The game was televised nationally on ESPNU and broke an ALS Game record with 3,603 in attendance.
- The game is played annually in honor of former captain **Pete Frates** who was diagnosed with ALS in March 2012.
- Tickets were general admission for \$10 with all proceeds benefiting the Pete Frates #3 Fund. The fund was created to aid in Frates' medical costs not covered by health insurance.
- The teams also honored Chris Combs, who played baseball for NC State from 1994-97 and was diagnosed with ALS in May 2016. He is an associate director with the Wolfpack Club. He is also fighting to bring awareness and funds to the disease.
- The Eagles wore Strikeout ALS ribbon patches with Frates' No. 3 on the their sleeves and "The Cure for Combs" hats. The Pack wore "Strikeout ALS" jerseys with Combs' logo on the arm. Both teams had "PF3" wristbands as part of the "Band Together to Strikeout ALS" initiative. BC also donned its red, PF3 StrikeoutALS tee shirts for batting practice.
- The Frates and Combs families were presented with \$5,000 donation checks for their respective foundations from the game's sponsor, L Star Ventures. Combs threw out the first pitch, while Frates' two-year-old daughter, Lucy, said "Play Ball" in the opening ceremonies.
- Each year since Frates' diagnosis, the Eagles have held an ALS Awareness Game at Eddie Pellagrini Diamond at Commander Shea Field. In each of the last five seasons, over 2,000 fans have been in attendance to show their support for a cause very close the BC community's heart.
- Last year Frates' No. 3 was retired and in 2015, the largest crowd in Shea Field history, 3,033 fans, attended the Eagles' ALS game against Georgia Tech.
- Frates was diagnosed with Amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS) at 27 years old. Since then, he, along with his family and friends, have worked tirelessly to raise awareness and funds to find a cure for the disease. In the summer of 2014, Frates championed the Ice Bucket Challenge through the use of social media. Along with the amount of awareness brought to ALS, over \$220 million was raised to help find a cure.
- A Beverly, Mass., native, Frates played in the outfield for the Maroon and Gold from 2004-07. A captain his senior year, he finished his BC career with 107 starts, a .228 average, 88 hits, 56 RBIs, 11 home runs and 34 stolen bases.

FRATES: AN INSPIRATION FOR ALL

- In November 2016, the NCAA announced that former BC baseball captain **Pete Frates**, who has been battling ALS in the public spotlight for almost five years, was the recipient of the 2017 NCAA Inspiration Award.
- The Inspiration Award is presented to a coach or administrator currently associated with intercollegiate athletics, or to a current or former varsity letter winner at an NCAA institution. It is reserved for people, who when confronted with a life-altering situation, used perseverance, dedication and determination to overcome their trauma, and, most importantly, are role models giving hope and inspiration to others in similar situations.
- Normally, the award is presented to the recipient at the NCAA Honors Celebration at the NCAA Convention each year, but because it is very difficult for Frates to travel long distances, NCAA president Dr. Mark Emmert presented Frates the award in his home in Beverly, Mass., in front of his family, friends, former teammates, the entire baseball team, media and local government leaders.
- In January, Frates' father John and brother Andrew accepted the award on his behalf in Nashville, Tenn., at the annual dinner.

ADAMS CHOSEN TO WEAR NICTAKIS' NO. 8

- In 2011, head coach **Mike Gambino** started a new tradition at The Heights. Each season, a player who has battled adversity and represents the best qualities of BC Baseball wears No. 8 in honor of former player **Peter "Sonny" Nictakis**.
- Sonny was a two-time captain for the Eagles in 1998-99 and lost his courageous battle with Hodgkin's disease in the summer of 2000. His No. 8 had not been worn since the 1999 season and in the first year at the helm, Gambino tabbed **Mike Sudol** to be the first to don the number during the 2011 campaign.
- At the 2017 Baseball Night in Boston, Gambino announced senior INF **Johnny Adams** Gambino would be the first two-time recipient of the honor, donning No. 8 for the 2017 season. Adams was the first-ever junior selected a

season ago.

- Adams, named a co-captain for the 2016-17 season, is a career .244 hitter with a .958 fielding percentage, mostly playing shortstop at The Heights. The Walpole, Mass., started all 57 games at shortstop for the Eagles in 2016. He was named to the 2016 Oxford All-Regional Team and earned Most Outstanding Player after going 7-for-12 with four doubles, three runs and three RBIs. He tied a career high with a 4-for-4 day in the regional championship against No. 15 Tulane, notched a team season-high three doubles, three RBIs and scored two runs as the Eagles swept the Regional. Adams led BC with 17 doubles and was second on the team with 60 hits and 80 total bases.
- Adams father, **Jay**, was a captain in 1987 under head coach **Eddie Pellagrini** and it is believed that they are the first father-son duo to both be captains at Boston College.
- Other former winners are: **Kyle Prohovich** (2012), **Matt Paré** (2013), **Tom Bourdon** (2014) and **Travis Ferrick** (2015).

ALL IN PERSPECTIVE

- What has Boston College accomplished as program in the last two years under head coach **Mike Gambino**?
- While a record 10 ACC teams made the NCAA Tournament in 2016, the Eagles were one of four (BC, Miami, Florida State and Louisville) to advance to a Super Regional. BC faced off against Miami in a conference tilt that went the maximum three games.
- BC was one of five schools (BC, Illinois, Florida, Tennessee and Louisville) to have first-round draft picks in the last two years (**Chris Shaw**, 31st in 2015 and **Justin Dunn**, 19th in 2016)
- BC is one of 19 schools to have at least one player on D1baseball.com's Top 100 Draft Prospect List (**Donovan Casey**) and two freshmen on D1baseball.com's Top 100 Freshmen Prospect List (**Matt Gill** and **Dante Baldelli**). BC is the only team from the Northeast on the list and one of six ACC Teams (Florida State, NC State, Miami, Virginia, Louisville).
- Along with BC, Louisville is the only other team in the ACC to have consecutive first-round draft picks the last two years, make the 2016 Super Regional, have two freshmen on the Top 100 Prospect List and at least one player on the Top 100 2017 Draft Prospect List.

BAND TOGETHER TO STRIKE OUT ALS

- For the second straight year, former BC captain and ALS patient and advocate **Pete Frates** is calling on baseball teams across the country to band together to raise awareness for amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS).
- In 2016, Frates and his family launched "Band Together to Strike Out ALS," encouraging teams to wear wristbands in May, ALS Awareness Month, to raise awareness for the disease.
- Band Together to Strike Out ALS was formulated by the Frates family, BC head coach **Mike Gambino**, Wake Forest head coach Tom Walter and CollegeBaseballInsider.com co-founder Sean Ryan. The wristbands read "Strike Out ALS" and feature Frates' initials and number (PF3) and are available for purchase here. Proceeds from the wristbands support the fund raising efforts of Frates.
- BC and all the ACC programs donned the wristbands during the final weekend of the 2016 ACC season. In addition, the Boston Red Sox joined the Eagles in wearing the wristbands in the exhibition game in February. Across New England, college, high school and Little League teams supported Frates and raised awareness by wearing the specially-designed wristbands. Collegiate teams from the Big 12, MAC and Southern also participated.

RECORD BOOK RANKINGS

- In 2016, the Eagles ranked on 54 of BC's single-season, career and team top-five and top-10 record lists.
- As a team, they placed on 13 top-five team record lists, including breaking the walks record with 240 on the season. The 38 sacrifice hits tied for fifth and the 1,190 at bats ranked fourth.
- The 35 wins ties for third all-time, while the .614 win percentage was fourth.
- The pitching staff's 431 strikeouts and 3.82 team ERA were fifth all-time while opponents' .245 batting average was second. The 14 saves on the year tied for first all-time and the 507.2 innings pitched was third.
- LHP **Jesse Adams** finished his career with 84 appearances, third in BC record books. His nine career saves ranked seventh all-time.
- INF **Joe Cronin** set the BC walks record with 114 career walks. His 52 career doubles tied for second all-time. He finished fifth for career at bats (731), third for games played (203), third for games starts (201), tied for seventh for career triples (6) and tied for fifth by reaching base safely 304 times. His 35 walks in 2016 tied for sixth on BC's single-season list.
- RHP **Justin Dunn**'s 2.06 ERA in 2016 ranked fourth on BC's single-season list, while his .214 opponent batting average tied for seventh. His 3.66 career ERA is eighth all-time.
- RHP **Mike King**'s career 3.14 ERA is second all-time at Boston College while his .500 win percentage tied for 10th. His 209.1 career innings pitched is 10th and he set the single-season record with 104 innings pitched in 2016.
- Junior INF **Jake Palomaki** entered the top-10 for career walks with 88, tied for ninth. His 42 in 2016 is second only to the record he set as a freshman. His 19 stolen bases in 2016 tied for third.
- Senior UT **Michael Strem** has 47 career doubles, tied for sixth in BC record books.
- Sophomore RHP **Jacob Stevens**' 2.54 ERA is ninth on BC's single-season list.

BIRDS IN THE CAPE

- Four members of the Boston College baseball team saw action in the prestigious Cape Cod Baseball League during the 2016 summer: senior INF **Johnny Adams**, juniors INF **Jake Palomaki** and OF/RHP **Donovan Casey** and sophomore RHP **Jacob Stevens**.
- Adams hit .254 for the Harwich Mariners, playing there for the second straight summer. He recorded 31 hits, including six doubles, a triple and one home run, nine RBIs and 11 walks over 33 games. He recorded a .943 fielding percentage. He was voted the winner of the Daniel J. Silva Sportsmanship Award by the league's umpires.
- Casey, Palomaki and Stevens all played for the Chatham Anglers. Casey hit .221 with 23 hits, seven RBIs and eight walks. He also made three appearances on the mound, struck out six, did not walk a batter and allowed two earned runs.
- Palomaki recorded a .215 average with 14 runs, 28 hits, including five doubles and a home run, six RBIs and 23 walks. He notched a .964 fielding percentage in the A's infield.
- Stevens made two appearances as his pitch count was limited. He threw 9.2 innings, allowed five earned runs, seven hits and eight walks while striking out five.

2017 CAPTAINS

- Senior INF **Johnny Adams** and junior RHP **Bobby Skogsbergh** were voted captains of the 2017 BC baseball team.
- "Leadership starts with character and integrity and those are off the charts with Johnny and Bobby. The leadership of our club last year - starting with **Joe (Cronin)** and **Scores (Nick Sciortino)**, along with the other juniors and seniors - would be really hard to follow up but having these two boys step into those roles, I believe, is going to allow us not to miss a beat as far as our leadership. Just like last year, the captains have included the junior and senior class in a lot of the leadership of this ball club, which allowed the team to be successful, and this team will do the same thing. I love these two as leaders and I love the group of upperclassmen that we have." - **Mike Gambino**

NEW ADDITION TO THE STAFF

- Alex Trezza** was named BC's associate head baseball coach in July.
- Coming to The Heights after a two-year stint at the helm of LIU-Brooklyn, Trezza spent time at Sacred Heart, New Haven, Adelphi University and Anna Maria College.
- Trezza, Stony Brook's first All-American, works with the BC pitching staff and catching core.
- He has been a featured presenter, including at the World Baseball Coaches' Convention, with presentations that include "The Hierarchy of Catching" and "The Prepared Catcher."
- Before his coaching days, Trezza was a standout player at Stony Brook, becoming the program's first All-American. He earned Freshman of The Year and New York State Baseball Conference Player of the Year honors in his first season in 1999. He holds several school records, including single-season home runs (23), career home runs (55) and career RBIs (176). Trezza was drafted in the 18th round by the Detroit Tigers following his junior year and played four seasons in the organization. He received the Most Improved Player award in 2003 in High Class-A Lakeland. Trezza graduated from Stony Brook with a bachelor's degree in political science in 2004.

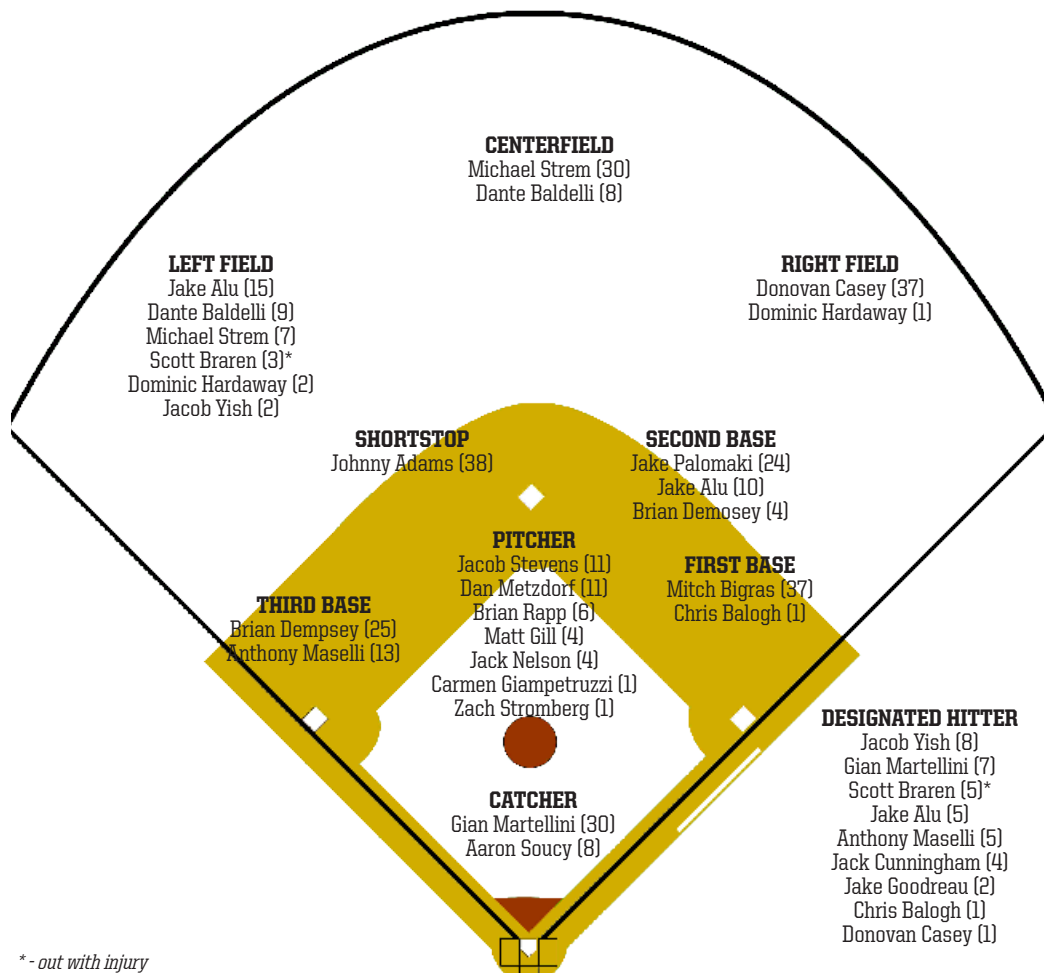

Boston College '99

Mike Gambino, a 1999 Boston College graduate, was named head baseball coach on July 19, 2010. In 2016, he brought the Eagles to the program's first NCAA Tournament in seven years and the team's third-ever Atlantic Coast Conference Championship appearance.

Gambino guided the 2016 Eagles to 35 overall wins, the most since 2005, tying for the second most in program history. They also tallied 13 ACC wins, the most since 2010, while their six conference series victories set a school record. BC swept the Oxford Regional as the three seed to advance to the program's first-ever Super Regional and move on for the first time in 49 years. BC also earned national ranking for the first time in school history, ending the season in the top 25 in all four major polls (15th - D1Baseball, 16th - Baseball America, NCBWA and 21st - USA Today/Coaches Poll).

For his efforts, Gambino was named the American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA) Northeast Region Coach of the Year, was a D1Baseball finalist for Coach of the Year and earned a spot on the website's top-10 coaching performances of the season.

Gambino saw Justin Dunn garner All-America third-team honors, the first pitcher to do so since 2009, and newcomer Jacob Stevens collect freshman All-America honors from two media outlets, the first BC honoree since 2002. Stevens picked up New England Intercollegiate Baseball Association (NEIBA) Freshman of the Year accolades and All-ACC Freshman team honors, while Dun was named to the All-ACC Third Team and four players were named to the NEIBA All-New England team.

The 2016 Eagles ranked in the top five on 13 school record lists, including setting the program record for walks (240), tying the record for saves (14), and ranking second in opponent batting average (.245). Ten Eagles ranked on 26 of BC's career top-10 lists while eight Eagles found themselves 17 times on single-season, top-10 lists.

In his last two seasons, Gambino has mentored two first-round draft picks: Dunn, taken 19th overall by the New York Mets in 2016, and Chris Shaw, taken 31st overall by the San Francisco Giants. Shaw earned a spot on the Class A Advanced California League All-Star roster in 2016 and participated in the home run derby competition. The 2016 season saw five baseball players drafted - Dunn, Michael King (12th round), Jesse Adams (14th round), Nick Sciortino (19th round) and Joe Cronin (34th round).

In 2015, Gambino logged his 100th career win as a head coach in the final game of the season with a walk-off, 10th-inning victory against No. 24 Notre Dame. The Eagles ranked in the top five on six school record lists, including the second-fewest walks (231), the third-best fielding percentage (.976) and the pitching staff recording the fourth-most strikeouts (433). BC also ranked sixth on the year in the ACC in stolen bases (63) and doubles per game (1.78), fifth for stolen bases per game (1.17) and walks per game (4.28) and second in fielding percentage.

Four players from the 2015 team were drafted in the MLB First-Year Players Draft, including Shaw, the first BC first-rounder since. Pitchers John Gorman (31st round) and Jeff Burke (32nd round) and infielder Blake Butera (35th round) were also taken. Four Eagles earned New England Intercollegiate Baseball Association (NEIBA) All-New England accolades while Gorman was named to the ACC All-Academic Team and Shaw collected All-ACC Second-Team, Perfect Game USA All-American Third-Team and American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA) All-Northeast First-Team honors.

The Eagles went 17-33 in Gambino's first season at the helm, but he saw four players get selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft. In 2011, the Eagles improved to 20-33, winning 10 games in the highly-competitive ACC. In just one year, the team's batting average improved 19 points, slugging percentage 54 points and on-base percentage 27 points.

In his second year, Gambino saw infielder Anthony Melchionda and outfielder Tom Bourdon earn All-ACC second-team honors and take home ABCA All-Northeast Region and NEIBA All-Star accolades. Melchionda and classmate Matt Brazis were both drafted in the 2012 MLB Draft.

A young team in 2013, the Eagles regularly started five freshmen, and Gambino worked to improve through the year. The overall batting average, on-base percentage and slugging percentage all rose significantly from the first half of the season to the second and the Eagles doubled their win total.

In his fourth year at The Heights, Gambino saw the more improvement, recording 22 wins and tying for the most in conference, going 10-20 in the ACC. Shaw earned First-Team All-ACC and ABCA honors while pitcher Andrew Chin was drafted in the 15th round.

Since taking over at the Heights, Gambino has stressed off the field success as well, raising the team's GPA as a whole. Eagles have earned six spots on the All-ACC Academic baseball team and 52 on the ACC Academic Honor Roll.

Gambino, who was an assistant coach for the Eagles from 2003-05, came from Virginia Tech where he spent four seasons as an assistant coach under former BC head coach, Pete Hughes. He served as the Hokies' recruiting coordinator and also worked with the hitters and infielders. In his four years, he saw 15 players get drafted in the MLB Draft, including nine in 2010. From 1997 through 2006, only 13 Hokies were drafted in total.

Virginia Tech's batting average improved 40 points under Gambino's direction since the 2006 season. With his help, the 2010 Hokies made their first appearance in the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and finished the season ranked No. 20 in the country.

Prior to working in Blacksburg, Gambino spent two years as a regional scout for the Detroit Tigers.

Gambino played for the Eagles from 1997-2000, starting 166 games in the middle infield. He held a career batting average of .313 with 22 doubles, eight homers, 87 RBIs and 117 runs. His 78 hits in 2000, which was No. 1 when he graduated, was tied for fifth, until 2011, when his own player, Bourdon, knocked it down one with 79 hits of his own. Gambino's 52 runs his final year is still tied for eighth.

The Garrison, N.Y., native was a first-team All-Big East, All-New England and All-Northeast region honoree following his senior campaign. He also earned second-team All-New England and Big East Academic Team accolades during his playing career.

Following his career with BC, Gambino played two seasons in the Boston Red Sox minor league system. He spent the 2000 season with the Augusta Green Jackets before splitting the 2001 season between Augusta and the Lowell Spinners. In 2002, the Red Sox hired Gambino as a special assistant to the Major League staff before heading back to Lowell for a coaching role with the Spinners just prior to the June draft. Following his stint in Lowell, the Red Sox sent Gambino to the MLB Scout Development Program.

In January 2003, Gambino returned to Boston College as an assistant coach under Hughes.

Gambino received his bachelor's degree from the Heights in English and theology. He currently lives in Newton, Mass., with his wife, Jill, and their son, Sonny.
