## STORYLINES

### BC CAN'T TOP TECH, WILL PLAY FOR BEANPOT FINALS

- Boston College dropped a three-game set at Virginia Tech - the nation's home run leader - but rallied to defeat Northeastern on Wednesday.
- Junior RHP **Brian Rapp** has made two career ACC starts - the last two Sundays - and allowed just two runs over 14.0 innings. He has struck out 16, tallying career-high eight Ks in each game.
- The Eagles defeated Northeastern, 5-1, to advance to the Beanpot title game, where they will face Harvard on April 19 at Fenway Park. Junior OF/RHP **Donovan Casey** led the way, going 2-for-4 with a double and home run, notching his 11th multi-hit game of the year. He has a hit in the last five games.
- Sophomore UT **Jake Alu** extended his career-long hit streak to six games, currently the longest on the team.
- Sophomore RHP **Jack Nelson** has allowed just three runs on the year - all in one outing at No. 2 Florida State on March 10. He has won all three of his starts and threw a career-high five innings to get the victory at Northeastern on Wednesday.
- Nelson and classmate LHP **Zach Stromberg** combined to throw eight scoreless innings against the Huskies. Along with classmate RHP **John Witkowski**, the Eagles allowed just three hits. It was the fourth time this season an opponent logged three hits or less against BC pitchers.

### THE EAGLES HOSTS NO. 4 UNC

- The Eagles will host fourth-ranked North Carolina at Eddie Pellagrini Diamond at Commander Shea Field to open the 2017 home slate.
- BC had five home games moved due to weather and poor field conditions.
- The Tar Heels have a 21-2 all-time series lead over the Eagles. The two teams started facing off when BC joined the ACC in 2006. UNC has won all eight series meetings.
- BC's two wins came at home in 2009 and in 2014.
- The two teams last met in 2015 when the Heels swept the series in Chapel Hill.
- Carolina comes into the series ranked fourth in the nation in most major collegiate polls. The Tar Heels have been ranked in the top 30 in every meeting with the Eagles. BC is 1-13 when UNC is ranked in the top five.
- BC's victory came in 2009 in Chestnut Hill with a 3-1 win when the Heels were ranked fourth. The Eagles also won a 10-9 game in 2014 at home when UNC was the No. 30 team.
- BC is 1-8 on the year against top-25 opponents, as three of the Eagles' four ACC opponents have been ranked in the top 10 this season (at No. 2 Florida State, at No. 1 Louisville, vs. No. 6 Clemson).
- Overall, the Eagles have won 11 games against top-five teams and lost 61 since joining the ACC.

### EAGLES OF NOTE

- Junior RHP **Brian Rapp** has made two ACC starts - the last two Sundays - and allowed just two runs over 16.0 innings. Against No. 6 Clemson on March 26, he threw a career-high seven innings without giving up a run or walk, allowed three hits - all singles - and struck out a career-high eight. He matched his highs at Virginia Tech on April 2, allowing five hits - all singles again - two runs, two walk and eight more Ks over seven strong. The output was against the Hokies who lead the nation in home runs and are second in slugging percentage. His 2.32 ERA and .209 opponent batting average are both ranked 10th in the ACC.
- Junior OF/RHP **Donovan Casey** has been on an offensive tear lately. In the last 10 games, he is 15-for-39 (.385) with a .641 slugging percentage and a .444 on-base percentage. He's logged 11 runs, two doubles, a triple, two home runs, seven RBIs, four walks and just one strikeout. He has also recorded a sac fly, a stolen base and two outfield assists. On the mound, he has six strikeouts over seven innings with a save. He is currently riding a five-game hit streak and hit for the cycle in the March 29 victory over Massachusetts.
- Sophomore UT/RHP **Jake Alu** is on a career-long, six-game hit streak. In that time, he has recorded 11 hits, three runs, five RBIs, three doubles, three walks and two stolen bases. Now an everyday player, Alu leads the Eagles with a .261 batting average in ACC games and is tied for the team lead with 12 hits in conference contests. Overall, he is batting second on the team with a .296 average and has stolen a team-high six bases.
- Sophomore RHP **Jack Nelson** has allowed three runs over 20.1 innings, leading the BC bullpen with a 1.33 ERA. All three runs came at then No. 2 Florida State on March 10. In his last five outings - 15.0 innings - which includes three starts, Nelson has not allowed a run. In that span, he has given up just three hits - all singles - walked six and struck out 10. He is 3-0 on the year and threw a career-high five innings in the win at Northeastern on Wednesday to lift the Eagles into the Beanpot title game. He gave up just one hit and one walk while striking out three.
- Senior UT **Michael Strem**, who usually plays center or left field, has already logged six outfield assists in the young 2017 season, which is second in the nation. Strem's career doubles total is up to 54, fourth all-time. Strem's 15-game on-base streak was the longest of the season for the Eagles.
- Senior 1B **Chris Balogh** has been a constant off the bench for the Eagles. He is 4-for-9 as a pinch hitter in 2017 with three RBIs. He is also 2-for-4 with runners in scoring position. With BC up, 1-0, at Northeastern on Wednesday and the bases loaded in the seventh, Balogh hit a double - his first extra-base hit of the season - to score two and give the Eagles the insurance they would need in the victory.
- Sophomore LHP **Dan Metzdorf** threw six scoreless in his start against then sixth-ranked Clemson on March 25, allowing just two hits. He walked four, struck out three and retired the first seven batters he faced in the no decision.
- Sophomore RHP **Jacob Stevens** started the season by not allowing an earned run in the 19.2 innings. His 3.01 career ERA is currently second in BC record books.
- Sophomore LHP **Zach Stromberg** has not allowed a run in his last three appearances, six innings of relief. He threw three innings in the win at NU on Wednesday, allowed just one hit, walked one and struck out a career-high five in the BC victory. He also pitched two innings of scoreless relief at Virginia Tech on Saturday, striking out three.

### CASEY AT THE BAT

- Junior OF/RHP **Donovan Casey** hit for the cycle in the victory over Massachusetts on March 29, a feat that had not been done in 14 years at Boston College.
- He started the game with a triple off the wall in right center. In his next at bat, he homered over the left-field fence. He then hit a single up the middle and in his fourth at bat, he doubled to right center to complete the cycle.
- The last BC player to hit for the cycle was Jason Delaney on April 27, 2003 in a 3-2 win against Seton Hall.
- Classmate INF **Jake Palomaki** injured his hamstring on March 18 at No. 1 Louisville and Casey has taken over in the lead-off spot. He is batting .387 (12-for-31) with a .704 slugging percentage and a .414 on-base percentage. He led off Wednesday's game with a home run over the left-field fence.

### WATCH WHEN YOU RUN

- The BC outfield has proven it's a dangerous one to test.
- The Eagles have racked up nine outfield assists, which is tied for fourth in the nation.
- Senior UT **Michael Strem**'s six outfield assists is second in the country.
- Junior OF **Donovan Casey** has the Eagles' other three, tied for ninth.

### BITTEN BY THE INJURY BUG

- One of the largest hurdles the Eagles have faced this season is injuries and illness.
- At any given point this season, as many to 15 players on the Eagles' 35-man roster have been sidelined due to injury or illness.
- The injury bug has given other players - like sophomore UT/RHP **Jake Alu** and freshmen INF **Brian Dempsey** and UT/RHP **Jack Cunningham** the chance to step up and garner more playing time, but with BC heading into the bulk of the 2017 schedule, which includes five games a week - the Eagles are hoping for quick recoveries.
- **Out for 2017:** Junior OF **Scott Braren** (knee), sophomore OF **Connor Bacon** (hip), freshman RHP **Michael Marzonie** (elbow), freshman LHP **Joey Walsh** (elbow), sophomore RHP **Thomas Lane** (suspension)
- **Day to Day:** Senior INF **Johnny Adams** (ribs), juniors RHP **Carmen Giampetruzzi** (back), INF **Jake Palomaki** (hamstring) and RHP **Bobby Skogsbergh** (shoulder) and freshman RHP **Matt Gill** (shoulder)
- **Missed Games Due to Injury:** Sophomores OF **Dominic Hardaway** (hamate, 17 games), RHP **Sean Hughes** (shoulder, 9 games) and RHP **John Witkowski** (shoulder, 17 games)

### ROAD WARRIORS

- Boston College traveled over 12,000 miles before playing at Eddie Pellagrini Diamond at Commander Shea Field in Chestnut Hill, Mass. The Eagles played 26 games before hosting UNC at The Heights on April 7-9.
- The Eagles' first scheduled game at what is affectionately known as the "Birdcage" was slated for March 24 against Clemson in a three-game, conference matchup, but field conditions forced BC to move the series to Rhode Island's Bill Beck Field in Kingston, R.I.
- Due to a grass field and unpredictable New England weather, the Eagles have averaged playing the first 24 games elsewhere before opening at The Heights under seven-year head coach **Mike Gambino**. In 2015, the Eagles played the first 30 games away from Shea Field as Boston saw a record amount of snowfall that winter.
- BC started the 2017 journey in Florida with a three-game series at Bethune-Cookman in Daytona Beach.
- The second weekend of the season, the Eagles traveled to the middle of the country for the 19 Ways Invitational hosted by Oklahoma. It was the first time the Eagles played in the Sooner State.
- The Eagles returned to Florida the following weekend for five games in the Snowbird Classic in Port Charlotte before opening the Atlantic Coast Conference slate in Tallahassee against No. 2 Florida State.
- Because of a mid-March snowstorm, BC's instate contest at Holy Cross was postponed so the Eagles flew out to Kentucky for a three-game conference set against top-ranked Louisville.
- After the Eagles traveled four miles down Commonwealth Ave. for a midweek tilt with Northeastern and the scheduled three-game set against the Tigers.
- Due to field conditions, the Eagles' New England rivalry game at Connecticut was postponed and BC had to move its midweek game against Massachusetts to the New England Baseball Complex in Northborough, Mass.
- The Eagles headed to Blacksburg, Va., for a three-game ACC series with the Hokies and moved the first round of the Beanpot from Chestnut Hill to Brookline.

### JUNIOR NO MORE?

- Sophomore UT/RHP **Jake Alu** made his first career start - as the designated hitter - against Villanova on March 5 and recorded a career-high three hits (3-for-4), three RBIs and three stolen bases.
- He made his first career start in the field on March 7 against Toledo, playing left - the first time he ever set foot in the outfield - and made a diving catch in foul territory for the first out in the third. He recorded a hit and a run in the win over the Rockets.
- Alu scored a career-high three run in the win at No. 2 Florida State on March 10.
- Now a regular starter in the BC lineup, Alu - more affectionately known as Junior or Junezy - drove in three against UMass on March 29 on a 2-for-3 day with two doubles, two runs and a walk.
- He matched his career high with three hits on a 3-for-5 day at Virginia Tech on April 1.
- He is on a career-long, six-game hit streak. In that time, he has recorded 11 hits, three runs, five RBIs, three doubles, three walks and two stolen bases.
- Alu leads the Eagles with a .261 batting average in ACC games and is tied for the team lead with 12 hits in conference contests.
- Overall, he is batting second on the team with a .296 average and has stolen a team-high six bases.
- Since March 5, he has started every game for the Eagles.
- The righty has also pitched seven times in 2017 and recorded five strikeouts after learning to the art before the season.

### IRON MAN DOWN JUST FOR NOW

- Junior INF **Jake Palomaki** started 116 straight games for the BC baseball team before he suffered a hamstring injury in the second game at Louisville on March 18.
- The injury cost him a spot in the lineup as he continues to rehab the injury. The last time Palomaki did not start a



game was on March 1, 2015.

- In his BC career, Palomaki only did not play the first four games his freshman year.
- He had played in 123 of the Eagles' 127 games until the injury and he started 120 of those games.
- Palomaki is tied for the BC team lead with 10 walks and leads the Eagles with five stolen bases. He is currently fourth all-time in BC record books with 98 career walks and seventh all-time with 39 career stolen bases.
- He is currently day-to-day as he tries to return to his lead-off spot in the lineup.
- In the six games he has missed, sophomore **Jake Alu** has started four games in the lead-off spot and junior **Donovan Casey** has started the last six.
- Alu has started six games at second base, Palomaki's usual spot, and freshman **Brian Dempsey** the other four.

#### LAST MEETING: NORTH CAROLINA

- North Carolina won all three games the last time the two teams faced each other, which was down in Chapel Hill.
- The April 24 contest turned into a pitchers' duel, with the then 18th-ranked Tar Heels coming away with the 1-0 victory. The only run of the game was scored in the second when UNC loaded the bases and drew a walk to go up, 1-0. RHP **Mike King** pitched a complete game, allowing just five hits, one run, two walks and striking out five. After allowing a run in the second, he settled in and retired eight straight batters and 17 of the final 20. UNC's Zac Gallen also went the full nine, allowed three hits, two walks and struck out eight. Senior INF **Johnny Adams** recorded one of the Eagles' three hits.
- The Tar Heels took the series with a 6-1 victory on April 25. After the two teams played even baseball for the first three and a half innings, the North Carolina scored in the five straight innings, while UNC starter JB Bukauskas did not allow a run through seven. INF **Blake Butera** led the Eagles with a 2-for-4 day. He has at least one hit in eight of the last 10 games as well.
- The Heels blanks the Eagles, 6-0, in the series finale to complete the sweep. They got on the board in the second with a two-run homer by Korey Dunbar off LHP **Jesse Adams**. Starter RHP Benton Moss threw eight shutout innings. Adams was one of only two BC batters to tally a hit in the game. RHP **Justin Dunn** pitched three scoreless innings of relief. He did not allow a hit, walked one, hit one and struck out two.

#### LAST TIME OUT: VIRGINIA TECH AND NORTHEASTERN

- The Eagles couldn't pick up a win in Blacksburg against power-hitting Virginia Tech but got a midweek victory at Northeastern.
- On Friday, Virginia Tech earned a 16-4 victory, hitting three home runs. The game was tied at three in the fifth, but the Hokies scored two in the bottom of the inning and chased sophomore starter RHP **Jacob Stevens** from the game. They added seven runs off three different BC pitchers in sixth to take a commanding lead. Senior INF **Johnny Adams** led the way at the plate with a 2-for-4 night with a double, walk, RBI and run.
- VT clinched the series with a 10-6 victory on Saturday. Sophomore starter LHP **Dan Metzdorf** allowed his first home runs of the season. The Hokies jumped out to an early, 3-0 lead and each time the Eagles got within one, they were able to pull away. Again, they used the long ball to score seven runs, with four homers in the game. Senior UT **Michael Strem** doubled and drove in a run for the Eagles while sophomore UT **Jake Alu** led the way for the Eagles on offense, going 3-for-5. Classmate C **Gian Martellini** hit his second home run of the season in the ninth.
- BC lost the third game, 4-3, in extra innings, the first of the season for the Eagles. With BC leading by one in the ninth, Ryan Tufts doubled off junior OF/RHP **Donovan Casey** to tie the game. In the bottom of the 10th, the Hokies loaded the bases with two outs and Jack Owens hit a single off of sophomore RHP **John Witkowski** for the walk-off win. Junior RHP **Brian Rapp** matched his career highs from one week ago, throwing seven innings and striking out eight. He allowed five hits, two walked and two runs. After giving up two hits in the first inning he did not allow another until the sixth. Strem turned in two doubles on the day, while Alu led the Eagles again with a 2-for-3 day. Casey tallied three hits for the first time this season on a 3-for-5 outing.
- The Eagles rebounded with a 5-1 victory at Northeastern to propel themselves into the Beanpot Championship. Up 1-0, thanks to a lead-off solo homer by Casey, senior 1B **Chris Balogh** stepped to the plate as pinch hitter with the bases loaded and doubled to bring in two more run. The Eagles got two insurance runs in the ninth to take a five-run lead. Sophomores RHP **Jack Nelson** and LHP **Zach Stromberg** combined for eight scoreless innings with just two hits and two walks. Nelson threw a career-high five innings without allowing a run. He struck out three, walked one and allowed just one single while Stromberg pitched three shutout innings of relief and struck out a career-high five. He walked one batter and gave up just one hit.

#### BIRDS GO FOR THIRD STRAIGHT BEANPOT

- After a 5-1 victory over Northeastern on April 5, BC will play Harvard for their chance at the Beanpot title on April 19 at Fenway Park.
- With the victory, BC is 36-16-1 all-time in the Beanpot and 18-8 in first-round games.
- It will be the 21st time since the inception of the tournament in 1990 that the Eagles will play for the title.
- BC has won a tournament-high 11 titles, including the last two and three (2011, 2015, 2016) under seventh-year head coach **Mike Gambino**.

## ADAMS CHOSEN TO WEAR NICTAKIS' NO. 8

- In 2011, head coach **Mike Gambino** started a new tradition at The Heights. Each season, a player who has battled adversity and represents the best qualities of BC Baseball wears No. 8 in honor of former player **Peter "Sonny" Nictakis**.
- Sonny was a two-time captain for the Eagles in 1998-99 and lost his courageous battle with Hodgkin's disease in the summer of 2000. His No. 8 had not been worn since the 1999 season and in the first year at the helm, Gambino tabbed **Mike Sudol** to be the first to don the number during the 2011 campaign.
- At the 2017 Baseball Night in Boston, Gambino announced senior INF **Johnny Adams** Gambino would be the first two-time recipient of the honor, donning No. 8 for the 2017 season. Adams was the first-ever junior selected a season ago.
- Adams, named a co-captain for the 2016-17 season, is a career .246 hitter with a .960 fielding percentage, mostly playing shortstop at The Heights. The Walpole, Mass., started all 57 games at shortstop for the Eagles in 2016. He was named to the 2016 Oxford All-Regional Team and earned Most Outstanding Player after going 7-for-12 with four doubles, three runs and three RBIs. He tied a career high with a 4-for-4 day in the regional championship against No. 15 Tulane, notched a team season-high three doubles, three RBIs and scored two runs as the Eagles swept the Regional. Adams led BC with 17 doubles and was second on the team with 60 hits and 80 total bases.
- Adams father, **Jay**, was a captain in 1987 under head coach **Eddie Pellagrini** and it is believed that they are the first father-son duo to both be captains at Boston College.
- Other former winners are: **Kyle Prohovich** (2012), **Matt Paré** (2013), **Tom Bourdon** (2014) and **Travis Ferrick** (2015).

## ALL IN PERSPECTIVE

- What has Boston College accomplished as program in the last two years under head coach **Mike Gambino**?
- While a record 10 ACC teams made the NCAA Tournament in 2016, the Eagles were one of four (BC, Miami, Florida State and Louisville) to advance to a Super Regional. BC faced off against Miami in a conference tilt that went the maximum three games.
- BC was one of five schools (BC, Illinois, Florida, Tennessee and Louisville) to have first-round draft picks in the last two years (**Chris Shaw**, 31st in 2015 and **Justin Dunn**, 19th in 2016)
- BC is one of 19 schools to have at least one player on D1baseball.com's Top 100 Draft Prospect List (**Donovan Casey**) and two freshmen on D1baseball.com's Top 100 Freshmen Prospect List (**Matt Gill** and **Dante Baldelli**). BC is the only team from the Northeast on the list and one of six ACC Teams (Florida State, NC State, Miami, Virginia, Louisville).
- Along with BC, Louisville is the only other team in the ACC to have consecutive first-round draft picks the last two years, make the 2016 Super Regional, have two freshmen on the Top 100 Prospect List and at least one player on the Top 100 2017 Draft Prospect List.

## EAGLES WILL HONOR FRATES AT FENWAY

- The Boston College baseball team will play the Sixth Annual ALS Awareness Game at Fenway Park on Saturday, April 22 at 4 p.m. against Atlantic Coast Conference foe NC State.
- The game is played in honor of former captain **Pete Frates** who was diagnosed with ALS in March 2012.
- Tickets will be general admission for \$10 with all proceeds benefiting the Pete Frates #3 Fund. Fans can purchase them by visiting [redsox.com/ALSGame](http://redsox.com/ALSGame) or at the gate the day of the game. The fund was created to aid in Frates' medical costs not covered by health insurance.
- The teams will also honor Chris Combs, who played baseball for NC State from 1994-97 and was diagnosed with ALS in May 2016. He is an associate director with the Wolfpack Club. He is also fighting to bring awareness and funds to the disease.
- Each year since Frates' diagnosis, the Eagles have held an ALS Awareness Game at Eddie Pellagrini Diamond at Commander Shea Field. In each of the last five seasons, over 2,000 fans have been in attendance to show their support for a cause very close the BC community's heart. Last year Frates' No. 3 was retired and in 2015, the largest crowd in Shea Field history, 3,033 fans, attended the Eagles' ALS game against Georgia Tech.
- The Eagles have played 36 times at Fenway Park, all in the Baseball Beanpot Tournament. They hold a 25-10-1 record in the iconic venue.
- Frates was diagnosed with Amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS) at 27 years old. Since then, he, along with his family and friends, have worked tirelessly to raise awareness and funds to find a cure for the disease. In the summer of 2014, Frates championed the Ice Bucket Challenge through the use of social media. Along with the amount of awareness brought to ALS, over \$220 million was raised to help find a cure.
- Frates completed his own ice bucket challenge to cap off the historic August 2014 at Fenway Park and during the spring training game between the Eagles and Red Sox in 2015, the teams donned No. 3 jerseys in honor of Frates at JetBlue Park in Fort Myers, Fla. Both sets were put up for auction to benefit his fund. The Red Sox also signed him to a contract to make him part of the organization before opening day the same year.
- A Beverly, Mass., native, Frates played in the outfield for the Maroon and Gold from 2004-07. A captain his senior year, he finished his BC career with 107 starts, a .228 average, 88 hits, 56 RBIs, 11 home runs and 34 stolen bases.

FRATES: AN INSPIRATION FOR ALL

- In November 2016, the NCAA announced that former BC baseball captain **Pete Frates**, who has been battling ALS in the public spotlight for almost five years, was the recipient of the 2017 NCAA Inspiration Award.
- The Inspiration Award is presented to a coach or administrator currently associated with intercollegiate athletics, or to a current or former varsity letter winner at an NCAA institution. It is reserved for people, who when confronted with a life-altering situation, used perseverance, dedication and determination to overcome their trauma, and, most importantly, are role models giving hope and inspiration to others in similar situations.
- Normally, the award is presented to the recipient at the NCAA Honors Celebration at the NCAA Convention each year, but because it is very difficult for Frates to travel long distances, NCAA president Dr. Mark Emmert presented Frates the award in his home in Beverly, Mass., in front of his family, friends, former teammates, the entire baseball team, media and local government leaders.
- In January, Frates' father John and brother Andrew accepted the award on his behalf in Nashville, Tenn., at the annual dinner.

TWICE AS NICE

- Not only will Boston College host the Sixth Annual ALS Awareness Game at Fenway Park, but the Eagles will play the annual Baseball Beanpot in the historic venue three days before, on Wednesday, April 19.
- It will be the 21st time the historic ballpark hosts the four-team tournament since its inception in 1990.
- The consolation game will begin at 3 p.m. and feature UMass and Northeastern. BC and Harvard will face off 45 minutes after the conclusion of the first game. Gates will open at 2 p.m.
- Ticket proceeds (\$10, general admission for both games) will also benefit the Pete Frates #3 Fund. They can be purchased at [www.redsox.com/beanpot](http://www.redsox.com/beanpot) or at the gate the day of the game.
- In 2006, Frates was named Beanpot MVP - an award no longer given out - after a 4-for-4 day with a home run into Fenway's right field bullpen, a double and three RBIs as the Eagles defeated Harvard, 10-2, for the title.

FIFTH ANNUAL WWP GAME SET

- BC baseball will team up with the Wounded Warrior Project (WWP) for the fifth straight year to honor current and former U.S. military members for the April 29 game against Miami.
- The Eagles will wear specially-designed Under Armour uniforms and local veterans will be honored during the game.
- On Thursday, April 27, the Eagles invite local military members to campus to engage in a softball game on Shea Field.

RECORD BOOK RANKINGS

- In 2016, the Eagles ranked on 54 of BC's single-season, career and team top-five and top-10 record lists.
- As a team, they placed on 13 top-five team record lists, including breaking the walks record with 240 on the season. The 38 sacrifice hits tied for fifth and the 1,190 at bats ranked fourth.
- The 35 wins ties for third all-time, while the .614 win percentage was fourth.
- The pitching staff's 431 strikeouts and 3.82 team ERA were fifth all-time while opponents' .245 batting average was second. The 14 saves on the year tied for first all-time and the 507.2 innings pitched was third.
- LHP **Jesse Adams** finished his career with 84 appearances, third in BC record books. His nine career saves ranked seventh all-time.
- INF **Joe Cronin** set the BC walks record with 114 career walks. His 52 career doubles tied for second all-time. He finished fifth for career at bats (731), third for games played (203), third for games starts (201), tied for seventh for career triples (6) and tied for fifth by reaching base safely 304 times. His 35 walks in 2016 tied for sixth on BC's single-season list.
- RHP **Justin Dunn**'s 2.06 ERA in 2016 ranked fourth on BC's single-season list, while his .214 opponent batting average tied for seventh. His 3.66 career ERA is eighth all-time.
- RHP **Mike King**'s career 3.14 ERA is second all-time at Boston College while his .500 win percentage tied for 10th. His 209.1 career innings pitched is 10th and he set the single-season record with 104 innings pitched in 2016.
- Junior INF **Jake Palomaki** entered the top-10 for career walks with 88, tied for ninth. His 42 in 2016 is second only to the record he set as a freshman. His 19 stolen bases in 2016 tied for third.
- Senior UT **Michael Strem** has 47 career doubles, tied for sixth in BC record books.
- Sophomore RHP **Jacob Stevens**' 2.54 ERA is ninth on BC's single-season list.

BIRDS IN THE CAPE

- Four members of the Boston College baseball team saw action in the prestigious Cape Cod Baseball League during the 2016 summer: senior INF **Johnny Adams**, juniors INF **Jake Palomaki** and OF/RHP **Donovan Casey** and sophomore RHP **Jacob Stevens**.
- Adams hit .254 for the Harwich Mariners, playing there for the second straight summer. He recorded 31 hits, including six doubles, a triple and one home run, nine RBIs and 11 walks over 33 games. He recorded a .943 fielding percentage. He was voted the winner of the Daniel J. Silva Sportsmanship Award by the league's umpires.
- Casey, Palomaki and Stevens all played for the Chatham Anglers. Casey hit .221 with 23 hits, seven RBIs and eight walks. He also made three appearances on the mound, struck out six, did not walk a batter and allowed two earned runs.
- Palomaki recorded a .215 average with 14 runs, 28 hits, including five doubles and a home run, six RBIs and 23 walks. He notched a .964 fielding percentage in the A's infield.
- Stevens made two appearances as his pitch count was limited. He threw 9.2 innings, allowed five earned runs, seven hits and eight walks while striking out five.

BIRDS OVER THE AIRWAVES

- Boston College, IMG College and the Financial Exchange Radio Network announced eight baseball games will air on the radio in 2017.
- The Eagles' "Game of the Week" will air on Boston's 102.9 FM and 1120 AM starting with the matchup against Clemson. All games will also stream on MoneyMattersBoston.com.
- The remaining Saturday conference games will also be heard on air (weather permitting): at Virginia Tech (April 1), North Carolina (April 8), NC State at Fenway Park (April 22), Miami (April 29), at Wake Forest (May 6), Quinnipiac (May 13) and Notre Dame (May 20).

### BC ON TV

- The Eagles are scheduled to be televised at least 16 times during the 2017 season, including an ESPN broadcast for the Sixth Annual ALS Awareness Game at Fenway Park on April 22. The Eagles will host NC State at 4 p.m.
- BC will also appear on the ACC Network Extra, which is streamed online through WatchESPN, as well as Sooner Sports TV at Oklahoma.
- All three games of the series at Florida State (March 10-12), at Louisville (March 17-19), at Duke (April 14-16) and at Wake Forest (May 5-7) will be on the ACCNE. The first game at Virginia Tech on March 31 will also be broadcast.
- A total of 374 Atlantic Coast Conference games will be broadcast across ESPN and regional networks, which is the most in league history and more than twice as many as the previous record of 176.
- The 2017 ACC Baseball Championship, scheduled for May 23-28 in Louisville, Ky., will be televised in its entirety.

### BAND TOGETHER TO STRIKE OUT ALS

- For the second straight year, former BC captain and ALS patient and advocate **Pete Frates** is calling on baseball teams across the country to band together to raise awareness for amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS).
- In 2016, Frates and his family launched "Band Together to Strike Out ALS" to encourage teams to wear a special wristband in May, which is ALS Awareness Month, to raise awareness for Lou Gehrig's Disease, which Frates was diagnosed with in March 2012.
- Band Together to Strike Out ALS was formulated by the Frates family, BC head coach **Mike Gambino**, Wake Forest head coach Tom Walter and CollegeBaseballInsider.com co-founder Sean Ryan. The wristbands read "Strike Out ALS" and feature Frates' initials and number (PF3) and are available for purchase here. Proceeds from the wristbands support the fund raising efforts of Frates.
- BC and all the ACC programs donned the wristbands during the final weekend of the 2016 ACC season. In addition, the Boston Red Sox joined the Eagles in wearing the wristbands in the exhibition game in February. Across New England, college, high school and Little League teams supported Frates and raised awareness by wearing the specially-designed wristbands. Collegiate teams from the Big 12, MAC and Southern also participated.

### 2017 CAPTAINS

- Senior INF **Johnny Adams** and junior RHP **Bobby Skogsbergh** were voted captains of the 2017 BC baseball team.
- "Leadership starts with character and integrity and those are off the charts with Johnny and Bobby. The leadership of our club last year - starting with **Joe (Cronin)** and **Scores (Nick Sciortino)**, along with the other juniors and seniors - would be really hard to follow up but having these two boys step into those roles, I believe, is going to allow us not to miss a beat as far as our leadership. Just like last year, the captains have included the junior and senior class in a lot of the leadership of this ball club, which allowed the team to be successful, and this team will do the same thing. I love these two as leaders and I love the group of upperclassmen that we have." - **Mike Gambino**

### NEW ADDITION TO THE STAFF

- Alex Trezza** was named BC's associate head baseball coach in July.
- Coming to The Heights after a two-year stint at the helm of LIU-Brooklyn, Trezza spent time at Sacred Heart, New Haven, Adelphi University and Anna Maria College.
- Trezza, Stony Brook's first All-American, works with the BC pitching staff and catching core.
- He has been a featured presenter, including at the World Baseball Coaches' Convention, with presentations that include "The Hierarchy of Catching" and "The Prepared Catcher."
- Before his coaching days, Trezza was a standout player at Stony Brook, becoming the program's first All-American. He earned Freshman of The Year and New York State Baseball Conference Player of the Year honors in his first season in 1999. He holds several school records, including single-season home runs (23), career home runs (55) and career RBIs (176). Trezza was drafted in the 18th round by the Detroit Tigers following his junior year and played four seasons in the organization. He received the Most Improved Player award in 2003 in High Class-A Lakeland. Trezza graduated from Stony Brook with a bachelor's degree in political science in 2004.

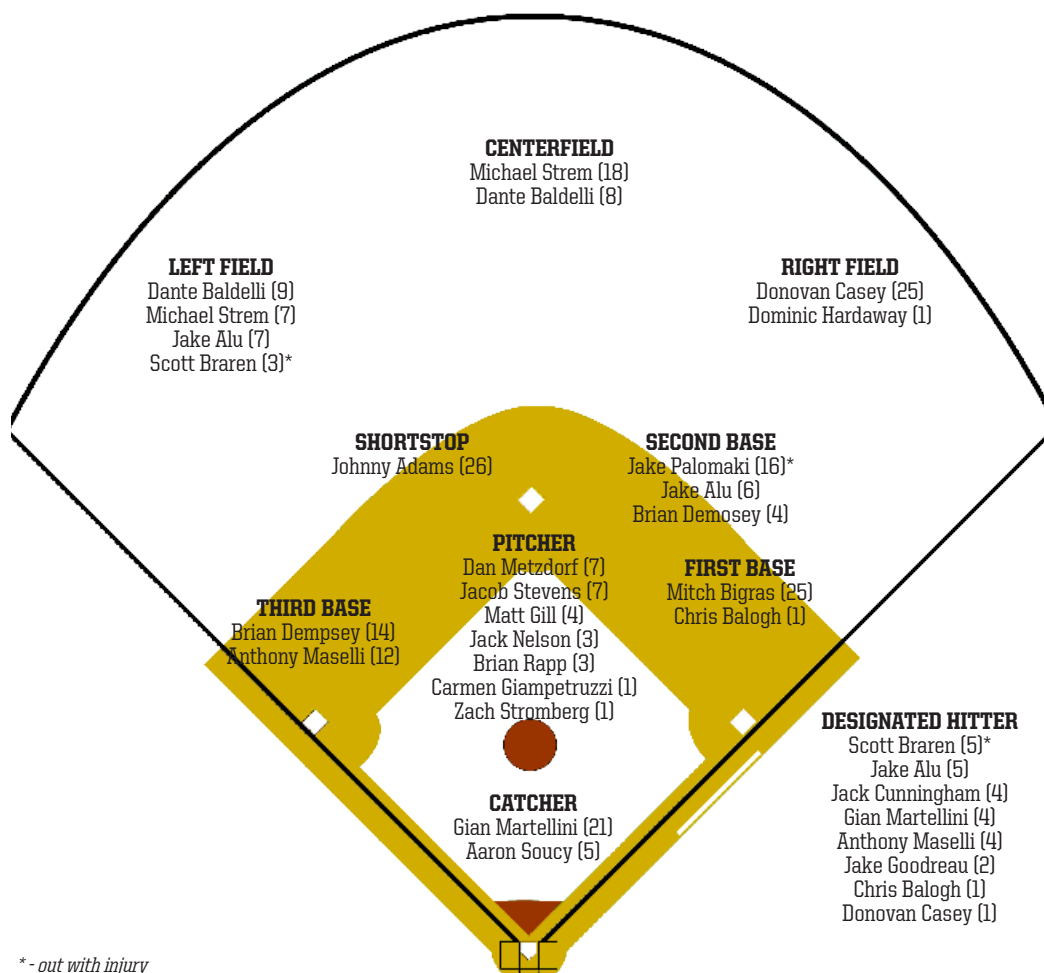

# head coach MIKE GAMBINO

seventh season  
Boston College '99

Mike Gambino, a 1999 Boston College graduate, was named head baseball coach on July 19, 2010. In 2016, he brought the Eagles to the program's first NCAA Tournament in seven years and the team's third-ever Atlantic Coast Conference Championship appearance.

Gambino guided the 2016 Eagles to 35 overall wins, the most since 2005, tying for the second most in program history. They also tallied 13 ACC wins, the most since 2010, while their six conference series victories set a school record. BC swept the Oxford Regional as the three seed to advance to the program's first-ever Super Regional and move on for the first time in 49 years. BC also earned national ranking for the first time in school history, ending the season in the top 25 in all four major polls (15th - D1Baseball, 16th - Baseball America, NCBWA and 21st - USA Today/Coaches Poll).

For his efforts, Gambino was named the American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA) Northeast Region Coach of the Year, was a D1Baseball finalist for Coach of the Year and earned a spot on the website's top-10 coaching performances of the season.

Gambino saw Justin Dunn garner All-America third-team honors, the first pitcher to do so since 2009, and newcomer Jacob Stevens collect freshman All-America honors from two media outlets, the first BC honoree since 2002. Stevens picked up New England Intercollegiate Baseball Association (NEIBA) Freshman of the Year accolades and All-ACC Freshman team honors, while Dun was named to the All-ACC Third Team and four players were named to the NEIBA All-New England team.

The 2016 Eagles ranked in the top five on 13 school record lists, including setting the program record for walks (240), tying the record for saves (14), and ranking second in opponent batting average (.245). Ten Eagles ranked on 26 of BC's career top-10 lists while eight Eagles found themselves 17 times on single-season, top-10 lists.

In his last two seasons, Gambino has mentored two first-round draft picks: Dunn, taken 19th overall by the New York Mets in 2016, and Chris Shaw, taken 31st overall by the San Francisco Giants. Shaw earned a spot on the Class A Advanced California League All-Star roster in 2016 and participated in the home run derby competition. The 2016 season saw five baseball players drafted - Dunn, Michael King (12th round), Jesse Adams (14th round), Nick Sciortino (19th round) and Joe Cronin (34th round).

In 2015, Gambino logged his 100th career win as a head coach in the final game of the season with a walk-off, 10th-inning victory against No. 24 Notre Dame. The Eagles ranked in the top five on six school record lists, including the second-fewest walks (231), the third-best fielding percentage (.976) and the pitching staff recording the fourth-most strikeouts (433). BC also ranked sixth on the year in the ACC in stolen bases (63) and doubles per game (1.78), fifth for stolen bases per game (1.17) and walks per game (4.28) and second in fielding percentage.

Four players from the 2015 team were drafted in the MLB First-Year Players Draft, including Shaw, the first BC first-rounder since. Pitchers John Gorman (31st round) and Jeff Burke (32nd round) and infielder Blake Butera (35th round) were also taken. Four Eagles earned New England Intercollegiate Baseball Association (NEIBA) All-New England accolades while Gorman was named to the ACC All-Academic Team and Shaw collected All-ACC Second-Team, Perfect Game USA All-American Third-Team and American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA) All-Northeast First-Team honors.

The Eagles went 17-33 in Gambino's first season at the helm, but he saw four players get selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft. In 2011, the Eagles improved to 20-33, winning 10 games in the highly-competitive ACC. In just one year, the team's batting average improved 19 points, slugging percentage 54 points and on-base percentage 27 points.

In his second year, Gambino saw infielder Anthony Melchionda and outfielder Tom Bourdon earn All-ACC second-team honors and take home ABCA All-Northeast Region and NEIBA All-Star accolades. Melchionda and classmate Matt Brazis were both drafted in the 2012 MLB Draft.

A young team in 2013, the Eagles regularly started five freshmen, and Gambino worked to improve through the year. The overall batting average, on-base percentage and slugging percentage all rose significantly from the first half of the season to the second and the Eagles doubled their win total.

In his fourth year at The Heights, Gambino saw the more improvement, recording 22 wins and tying for the most in conference, going 10-20 in the ACC. Shaw earned First-Team All-ACC and ABCA honors while pitcher Andrew Chin was drafted in the 15th round.

Since taking over at the Heights, Gambino has stressed off the field success as well, raising the team's GPA as a whole. Eagles have earned six spots on the All-ACC Academic baseball team and 52 on the ACC Academic Honor Roll.

Gambino, who was an assistant coach for the Eagles from 2003-05, came from Virginia Tech where he spent four seasons as an assistant coach under former BC head coach, Pete Hughes. He served as the Hokies' recruiting coordinator and also worked with the hitters and infielders. In his four years, he saw 15 players get drafted in the MLB Draft, including nine in 2010. From 1997 through 2006, only 13 Hokies were drafted in total.

Virginia Tech's batting average improved 40 points under Gambino's direction since the 2006 season. With his help, the 2010 Hokies made their first appearance in the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and finished the season ranked No. 20 in the country.

Prior to working in Blacksburg, Gambino spent two years as a regional scout for the Detroit Tigers.

Gambino played for the Eagles from 1997-2000, starting 166 games in the middle infield. He held a career batting average of .313 with 22 doubles, eight homers, 87 RBIs and 117 runs. His 78 hits in 2000, which was No. 1 when he graduated, was tied for fifth, until 2011, when his own player, Bourdon, knocked it down one with 79 hits of his own. Gambino's 52 runs his final year is still tied for eighth.

The Garrison, N.Y., native was a first-team All-Big East, All-New England and All-Northeast region honoree following his senior campaign. He also earned second-team All-New England and Big East Academic Team accolades during his playing career.

Following his career with BC, Gambino played two seasons in the Boston Red Sox minor league system. He spent the 2000 season with the Augusta Green Jackets before splitting the 2001 season between Augusta and the Lowell Spinners. In 2002, the Red Sox hired Gambino as a special assistant to the Major League staff before heading back to Lowell for a coaching role with the Spinners just prior to the June draft. Following his stint in Lowell, the Red Sox sent Gambino to the MLB Scout Development Program.

In January 2003, Gambino returned to Boston College as an assistant coach under Hughes.

Gambino received his bachelor's degree from the Heights in English and theology. He currently lives in Newton, Mass., with his wife, Jill, and their son, Sonny.
