STORYLINES

EAGLES WIN FINAL THREE NON-CONFERENCE GAMES

- Boston College won its final three non-conference games of the 2017 season, sweeping a doubleheader against Quinnipiac on Saturday and coming back to beat Maine on Tuesday.
- The Eagles finish the season with a 14-7 non-conference record, including going a perfect 5-0 at home.
- BC never trailed in the two games against the Bobcats. The game-two, 3-0 victory was the third shutout win of the season. BC pitchers allowed just six hits - three in each game - and one run in the 18 innings. The final game was canceled due to rain.
- While the Eagles led the Black Bears early, they trailed by five without a hit heading into the eighth. BC scored six runs on five hits and four walks to go ahead to pull out the win.
- Junior INF **Jake Palomaki** started the first game against Quinnipiac with a walk to break BC's all-time walks record with 115. He now has 117 in his three years.
- Sophomore UT **Jake Alu** has a hit in 15 of the last 18 games, including the last five.
- Sophomore C **Gian Martellini**'s career-long, 14-game hit streak came to an end on Tuesday. It was the longest of the season for the Eagles and tied for sixth in BC record books. He has at least one hit in 39 of the 47 games played.
- BC's 1.44 stolen bases per game are second in the ACC.

BC HOSTS THE IRISH AS SHEA FIELD ERA CLOSES

- The Eagles host rival Notre Dame in a three-game ACC set to close out the regular season. The outcome will determine if BC makes the ACC Tournament for the second straight year and fourth overall.
- They will also be the final baseball games played on Eddie Pellagrini Diamond at Commander Shea Field. Baseball and softball field are being built on BC's Brighton Campus, where the Eagles will call home next season.
- All former BC baseball players have been invited to a pre-game tailgate and there will be a first-pitch ceremony. Members of **Eddie Pellagrini**'s family - the winningest coach in BC baseball history - will be in attendance.
- BC is 10-28 all time against Notre Dame, 2-7 in ACC games.
- The Eagles and Irish's history dates back to the Big East. ND won the first seven meetings before BC opened a three-game series with a 10-7 win in South Bend on April 17, 1999.
- In 2000, the Eagles took two Big East Tournament games, but dropped one in 2004 and one in 2005.
- The first ACC meeting came in 2014 in Chicago. BC earned a 4-1, 11-inning win in the series opener before ND swept a doubleheader.
- BC has never won a series against the Irish.
- The Eagles are 3-11 against Notre Dame at home, coming away with one win in 2015, on a walk-off to end the season.

BC-ND CONNECTIONS

- Former BC baseball coach **Mik Aoki** (2007-10) is the head coach at Notre Dame. He compiled a 114-108-1 record at the helm, 48-69 in ACC action. Aoki led BC to its first ACC Tournament appearances in 2009 and 2010 and BC's first NCAA Tournament berth since 1967 in 2009.
- The Eagles played the longest game in NCAA history - a 25-inning, 3-2 loss at Texas - at the 2009 Austin Regional.
- BC's highest draft pick - C **Tony Sanchez** (2007-09) was selected fourth overall (Pittsburgh) under Aoki.
- The Eagles set 13 school records under Aoki, including hits (649), doubles (151), saves (14-tied) and fielding percentage (.979).
- BC head coach **Mike Gambino** and Aoki were assistants together on the BC staff under **Pete Hughes** in 2004 and 2005. The Eagles' 37 wins in 2005 still stand as a program record.

TRIP TO LOUISVILLE ON THE LINE

- For the first time, 12 of the 14 ACC teams will make the conference tournament, being held May 23-28 at Louisville Slugger Field in Louisville, Ky.
- Louisville (Atlantic) and North Carolina (Coastal) have clinched their respective divisions. Six other teams - Clemson, Wake Forest, Florida State, NC State, Virginia and Miami - are assured of spots.
- None of the league's 14 teams have been mathematically eliminated.
- BC and Pitt are currently tied for 13th place with eight wins each. Virginia Tech has nine while Notre Dame and Georgia Tech 10 each.
- Duke is at No. 3 North Carolina, Pitt is at No. 15 Wake Forest, Georgia Tech hosts No. 8 Virginia and Virginia Tech ends the season at Miami.
- BC has made the ACC Tournament three times since joining the league in 2006. The first appearance came in 2009 when the Eagles went 2-1, defeating Georgia Tech and Miami in Durham, N.C.
- They also earned a bid in 2010 (1-2) and 2016 (0-1). Last year, BC fell to Georgia Tech, 6-0, in a first-round game.
- In 2009 and 2010, eight of the 12 conference teams earned a spot and in 2016, 10 of the 14 teams collected a bid.

KING OF WALKS

- Junior INF Jake Palomaki broke the record for career walks on Saturday, May 13, drawing the 115th in his career to start the first game against Quinnipiac. He currently has 117.
- The Kennesaw, Ga., native already holds the record for single-season walks with 46, set as a freshman in 2015. His 42 in 2016 is second in BC record books. He currently has 29, two away from the top 10, even after missing 11 games with a hamstring injury.
- He is sixth all-time with a .426 career on-base percentage and has reached base safely 266 times, nine times outside BC's all-time top 10.

EAGLES OF NOTE

- Sophomore LHP **Dan Metzdorf** has not allowed a run in his last two appearances - 11.0 innings - and six runs in his last five, 28.0 innings (1.93 ERA). He gave up just one hit over five innings of scoreless relief to pick up the win in the first game against Quinnipiac. He walked one and struck out four. The lefty allowed just four hits and no runs while striking out five in a six-inning start on May 6 to aid in the first shutout of the season at home for then 17th-ranked Wake Forest. It was just the Demon Deacon's fifth home loss in 2017. The only extra-base hit allowed was a double, even though the Demon Deacons came into the game with 78 home runs, averaging almost two per game (1.77). It was the second start for Metzdorf he did not allow a run; He went six strong against then No. 6 Clemson on March 25, allowing just two hits and striking out four.
- Junior RHP **Brian Rapp** gone at least five innings without allowing an earned run four times in 2017, including recording the first complete game of his career - a three-hit shutout to complete the sweep of NC State on April 23. He allowed just five base runners on the day and none advanced past first base. He struck out six, walked just two and all three hits were singles. It was the first complete-game shutout since **Mike King** recorded on against No. 24 Georgia Tech on April 17, 2015. He is one of four ACC pitchers throw a shutout this season and one of eight to pitch a complete game. He then threw five scoreless innings, allowing just one hit and one walk and striking out eight to tie a career high against Quinnipiac in the second game of a doubleheader, aiding in the Eagles' third shutout of the season. He did not give up the hit through 4.2 innings. In five of his seven ACC starts this season, Rapp has 31 strikeouts, just nine walks and eight earned runs over 36.0 innings (No. 6 Clemson, at Virginia Tech, NC State, Miami, at No. 17 Wake Forest).
- Sophomore C **Gian Martellini** has started 47 games for the Eagles behind the plate and logged at least one hit in 39 of them. He has never recorded two straight games without a hit. His career-long, 14-game hit streak came to an end against Maine on May 16. It was the longest of the season for the Eagles and tied for sixth in BC record books. In that span, he has tallied 20 hits - including four doubles, a triple and two home runs, - five runs, nine RBIs, 32 total bases, a sac fly and three walks. Martellini recorded a career-high five RBIs in the victory over Duke on April 15 with his first career grand slam.
- Freshman INF **Brian Dempsey** has hit his stride in the second half of the season. He has logged at least one hit in 11 of the last 15 games played, including a career-long, six-game hit streak. In the last 15 games, he recorded a .368 batting average (14-for-38) with five runs and six RBIs. He laid down a team season-high three sacrifice bunts against Miami on April 29, including one for an RBI.
- Sophomore UT/RHP **Jake Alu** has hit in 15 of the last 18 games, including the last five. He leads the Eagles with a .320 batting average and 33 hits in ACC games. His .320 overall average also leads the team and his 11 stolen bases is tied for the team lead. He is tied for 15th in the ACC for his batting clip. He recorded a career-high four hits in the victory at Duke on April 15.
- Junior RHP **Donovan Casey** entered BC's single-season record books tied for eighth with five save on the year. He combined with sophomore RHP **Jacob Stevens** to throw a one-hitter at Duke on April 14, retiring all six batters faced with one strikeout. His five saves on the season is tied for sixth in the ACC. The two-way player earned his third win of the season by throwing the final 1.1 innings against Maine on May 16, allowing just two hits, no runs or walks and striking out the final batter of the game. He is third in the country with eight outfield assists.

SPEEDY EAGLES

- BC's 69 stolen bases are fourth in the ACC and rank 45th nationally.
- The Eagles' 1.44 stolen bases per game is second in the league and ranks 36th in the country.
- They are five swipes away from entering the top five for team records.
- BC stole 10 bases in the victory over Villanova (April 5), the most since BC stole 11 at Northeastern in a 7-6 victory on May 4, 2016.
- The Eagles have stolen at least four bases in a game five times this season.

WATCH WHEN YOU RUN

- The BC outfield has proven it's a dangerous one to test.
- The Eagles have racked up 14 outfield assists, which is tied for third in the nation.
- Junior OF **Donovan Casey** has eight outfield assists, third in the country.
- Senior OF **Michael Strem** has six, tied for fourth overall.
- Charleston Southern leads the way with 19 team outfield assists while CSU's Chris Singleton's 10 leads the nation.

"JUNIOR" NO MORE?

- Sophomore UT/RHP **Jake Alu** made his first career start - as the designated hitter - against Villanova on March 5 and recorded a then career-high three hits (3-for-4), three RBIs and three stolen bases.
- He made his first career start in the field on March 7 against Toledo, playing left - the first time he ever set foot in the outfield - and made a diving catch in foul territory. He recorded a hit and a run in the win over the Rockets.
- He then scored a career-high three run in the win at No. 2 Florida State on March 10.
- Alu - more affectionately known as "Junior" or "Junezy" - drove in three runs against UMass on March 29 on a 2-for-3 day with two doubles, two runs and a walk.
- He matched his then career high with three hits on a 3-for-5 day at Virginia Tech on April 1 but set a new record with four hits on a 4-for-6 day at Duke on April 15.
- Alu recorded a career-long, eight-game hit streak from March 26 to April 9. In that time, he recorded 14 hits, six runs, six RBIs, three doubles, four walks and two stolen bases.
- He led the way at the plate for the Eagles against NC State (April 23-24), going 6-for-10 with two runs, two doubles, an RBI and just one strikeout. He also scored the game-winning run against Harvard on April 19 in the Beanpot championship game, stealing both second and third and crossing the plate on a wild pitch in the fourth.
- Since March 5, he has started every game for the Eagles. He leads the team with a .320 batting average and 11 stolen bases. His .320 ACC clip is also first on the team.
- The righty has also pitched nine times in 2017 and recorded eight strikeouts after learning to the art before the season.

CASEY AT THE BAT

- Junior OF/RHP **Donovan Casey** hit for the cycle in the victory over Massachusetts on March 29, a feat that had not been done in 14 years at Boston College.
- He started the game with a triple off the wall in right center. In his next at bat, he homered over the left-field fence. He then hit a single up the middle and in his fourth at bat, he doubled to right center to complete the cycle.
- The last BC player to hit for the cycle was Jason Delaney on April 27, 2003 in a 3-2 win against Seton Hall.

IRON MAN WAS OUT...BUT NOW HE'S BACK

- Junior INF **Jake Palomaki** started 116 straight games for the BC baseball team before he suffered a hamstring injury in the second game at Louisville on March 18.
- The injury cost him a spot in the lineup as he rehabilitated the injury. The last time Palomaki did not start a game was on March 1, 2015.
- In his BC career, Palomaki only did not play the first four games his freshman year.
- He had played in 123 of the Eagles' 127 games until the injury and he started 120 of those games.
- Palomaki returned to the diamond as a defensive replacement in the eighth inning on April 8 against No. 4 North Carolina and drew a walk at the plate. He got back to regular play by starting all three games at Duke (April 14-16).
- Mak, as he more commonly known, has started 17 of the last 18 games, and recorded 13 hits, 14 runs, seven RBIs, 18 walks and two stolen bases.
- He returned to his lead-off spot in the lineup in the series finale against Miami on April 30 and went 1-for-3 with two runs, a walk and two RBIs. He is batting .327 as the leadoff this season.
- He broke BC's all-time record for career walks, ranks sixth with a career .426 on-base percentage and is tied for sixth all-time with 41 career stolen bases.

RUNS AT THE RECORD BOOKS

- Some Eagles are looking to make a splash in the BC record books.
- Senior UT **Michael Strem** is the ACC's current active leader with 58 all-time doubles while junior INF **Jake Palomaki** is second on the active leaders list for career walks (117) and tied for fourth for career stolen bases (41).
- Senior INF **Johnny Adams** leads with the way with 196 career games started, is third for games played (198) and is tied for fifth with 24 career sacrifice hits.

LAST MEETING: NOTRE DAME

- The Fighting Irish earned a series sweep in South Bend last year.
- ND won the first game, 4-1, on April 15, as junior OF **Scott Braren** logged BC's only RBI. Current sophomore RHP **Jacob Stevens** struck out seven and did not walk a batter in his six-inning start, but allowed a then season-high four runs on seven hits. Senior UT **Michael Strem**, Braren and junior INF **Anthony Maselli** tallied the hits for the Eagles - all singles.
- The Irish took the second game to clinch the series by the same score. After four and a half scoreless innings, ND plated three in the bottom of the fifth to take a 3-0 lead. With two down, after one run had come in, a dropped foul ball allowed the inning continue and Notre Dame made BC pay for the error with a two-run home run. C **Nick Sciortino** hit a solo shot in the seventh to record his first career home run. This year's Saturday starter junior RHP **Brian Rapp** threw a 123 eighth with one strikeout.
- The Irish completed the sweep with a 11-9 Sunday victory. The Eagles led the Irish, 9-4, heading into the bottom of the seventh but gave up five runs to tie the game. Notre Dame took the lead with two runs in the eighth and even though the Eagles loaded the bases in the ninth, they could not push across any runs. Senior INF **Johnny Adams** tied career highs with four hits and four RBIs. He also recorded his first home run of the season with a solo shot in the seventh. Sophomore C **Gian Martellini** hit his first career triple and drove in two.

ROAD WARRIORS

- Boston College traveled over 12,000 miles before playing at Eddie Pellagrini Diamond at Commander Shea Field in Chestnut Hill, Mass. The Eagles played 26 games before hosting UNC at The Heights on April 8 and 9.
- The Eagles' first scheduled game at what is affectionately known as the "Birdcage" was slated for March 24 against Clemson in a three-game, conference matchup, but field conditions forced BC to move the series to Rhode Island's Bill Beck Field in Kingston, R.I.
- Due to a grass field and unpredictable New England weather, the Eagles have averaged playing the first 24 games elsewhere before opening at The Heights under seventh-year head coach **Mike Gambino**. In 2015, the Eagles played the first 30 games away from Shea Field as Boston saw a record amount of snowfall that winter.
- BC started the 2017 journey in Florida with a three-game series at Bethune-Cookman in Daytona Beach.
- The second weekend of the season, the Eagles traveled to the middle of the country for the 19 Ways Invitational hosted by Oklahoma. It was the first time the Eagles played in the Sooner State.
- The Eagles returned to Florida the following weekend for five games in the Snowbird Classic in Port Charlotte before opening the ACC slate in Tallahassee against then No. 2 Florida State.
- Because of a mid-March snowstorm, BC's instate contest at Holy Cross was postponed so the Eagles flew out to Kentucky for a three-game conference set against top-ranked Louisville. After, the Eagles traveled four miles down Commonwealth Ave. for a midweek tilt with Northeastern and the scheduled three-game set against the Tigers.
- Due to field conditions, the Eagles' New England rivalry game at Connecticut was postponed and BC had to move its midweek game against Massachusetts to the New England Baseball Complex in Northborough, Mass.
- The Eagles headed to Blacksburg, Va., for a three-game ACC series with the Hokies and moved the first round of the Beanpot from Chestnut Hill to Brookline.

NO. 8 TABBED AS UNSUNG HERO

- Senior INF **Johnny Adams** was honored as the male recipient of the Unsung Hero Award on May 5 at BC's annual Golden Eagle Awards.
- The award is presented to those whose efforts toward, and passion for, the program go above and beyond.
- Adams has been the Eagles' starting shortstop the last four years and was voted a captain by his teammates as a senior.
- He was the first two-year recipient the No. 8 jersey, worn in honor of former baseball player **Peter "Sonny" Nictakis**. Each season a player who represents the best qualities of BC Baseball is voted by the baseball team to wear Nictakis's old number. Adams was the first-ever junior selected a season ago.
- Nictakis was a two-time captain for the Eagles in 1998-99 and lost his courageous battle with Hodgkin's disease in the summer of 2000. His No. 8 had not been worn since the 1999 season and in the first year at the helm, Gambino tabbed **Mike Sudol** to be the first to don the number during the 2011 campaign.
- Adams was the first-ever junior selected a season ago. His father, **Jay**, was a captain in 1987 under head coach **Eddie Pellagrini** and it is believed that they are the first father-son duo to be captains at Boston College.
- He has played in the Cape Cod Collegiate Baseball League the last two summers. In 2016, Adams was voted the winner of the Daniel J. Silva Sportsmanship Award by the league's umpires, and in 2015, he earned the league's Manny Robello 10th Player Award, given to a player who has shown dedication both on and off the field and all to the game.
- Other former No. 8 recipients are: **Kyle Prohovich** (2012), **Matt Paré** (2013), **Tom Bourdon** (2014) and **Travis Ferrick** (2015).

EAGLES WIN 13TH BEANPOT TITLE

- Boston College collected its 13th Baseball Beanpot title, the most of the four schools, with a 3-2, five-inning victory over Harvard at Fenway Park on April 19. The game was shortened due to rain.
- The Eagles have won the last three straight titles and four total under seventh-year head coach **Mike Gambino**. The three-year run in the longest win streak for BC since the inception of the Boston-based tournament in 1990.
- It was the fifth time the Eagles claimed the title over the Crimson and improve to 14-4-1 overall against Harvard in the tournament.
- The Eagles hold a 37-16-1 record in the Beanpot.
- BC reached the championship game after a 5-1 victory over Northeastern on April 5.

SIXTH ANNUAL ALS GAME AT FENWAY PARK

- The Boston College baseball team played the Sixth Annual ALS Awareness Game at Fenway Park on April 22 against NC State. The game was televised nationally on ESPNU and broke an ALS Game record with 3,603 in attendance.
- The game is played annually in honor of former captain **Pete Frates** who was diagnosed with ALS in March 2012.
- Tickets were general admission for \$10 with all proceeds benefiting the Pete Frates #3 Fund. The fund was created to aid in Frates' medical costs not covered by health insurance.
- The teams also honored Chris Combs, who played baseball for NC State from 1994-97 and was diagnosed with ALS in May 2016. He is an associate director with the Wolfpack Club. He is also fighting to bring awareness and funds to the disease.
- The Eagles wore Strikeout ALS ribbon patches with Frates' No. 3 on the their sleeves and "The Cure for Combs"

hats. The Pack wore "Strikeout ALS" jerseys with Combs' logo on the arm. Both teams had "PF3" wristbands as part of the "Band Together to Strikeout ALS" initiative. BC also donned its red, PF3 StrikeoutALS tee shirts for batting practice.

- The Frates and Combs families were presented with \$5,000 donation checks for their respective foundations from the game's sponsor, I Star Ventures. Combs threw out the first pitch, while Frates' two-year-old daughter, Lucy, said "Play Ball" in the opening ceremonies.
- Each year since Frates' diagnosis, the Eagles have held an ALS Awareness Game at Eddie Pellagrini Diamond at Commander Shea Field. In each of the last five seasons, over 2,000 fans have been in attendance to show their support for a cause very close the BC community's heart.
- Last year Frates' No. 3 was retired and in 2015, the largest crowd in Shea Field history, 3,033 fans, attended the Eagles' ALS game against Georgia Tech.
- Frates was diagnosed with Amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS) at 27 years old. Since then, he, along with his family and friends, have worked tirelessly to raise awareness and funds to find a cure for the disease. In the summer of 2014, Frates championed the Ice Bucket Challenge through the use of social media. Along with the amount of awareness brought to ALS, over \$220 million was raised to help find a cure.
- A Beverly, Mass., native, Frates played in the outfield for the Maroon and Gold from 2004-07. A captain his senior year, he finished his BC career with 107 starts, a .228 average, 88 hits, 56 RBIs, 11 home runs and 34 stolen bases.

FRATES: AN INSPIRATION FOR ALL

- In November 2016, the NCAA announced that former BC baseball captain **Pete Frates**, who has been battling ALS in the public spotlight for almost five years, was the recipient of the 2017 NCAA Inspiration Award.
- The Inspiration Award is presented to a coach or administrator currently associated with intercollegiate athletics, or to a current or former varsity letter winner at an NCAA institution. It is reserved for people, who when confronted with a life-altering situation, used perseverance, dedication and determination to overcome their trauma, and, most importantly, are role models giving hope and inspiration to others in similar situations.
- Normally, the award is presented to the recipient at the NCAA Honors Celebration at the NCAA Convention each year, but because it is very difficult for Frates to travel long distances, NCAA president Dr. Mark Emmert presented Frates the award in his home in Beverly, Mass., in front of his family, friends, former teammates, the entire baseball team, media and local government leaders.
- In January, Frates' father John and brother Andrew accepted the award on his behalf in Nashville, Tenn., at the annual dinner.

EAGLES HOST FIFTH ANNUAL WWP GAME

- BC baseball teamed up with the Wounded Warrior Project (WWP) for the fifth straight year to honor current and former U.S. military members for the April 29 game against Miami.
- The Eagles wore Under Armour camo uniforms and local veterans were honored before the game.
- On April 27, the Eagles invited local military members to campus to engage in a softball game on Shea Field.
- The players and veterans build backpacks with hand-written notes to send to Walter Reed Medical Center, listen to a WWP speaker talk and share a meal provided by Sweet Cheeks in Boston, Mass.

ALL IN PERSPECTIVE

- What has Boston College accomplished as program in the last two years under head coach **Mike Gambino**?
- While a record 10 ACC teams made the NCAA Tournament in 2016, the Eagles were one of four (BC, Miami, Florida State and Louisville) to advance to a Super Regional. BC faced off against Miami in a conference tilt that went the maximum three games.
- BC was one of five schools (BC, Illinois, Florida, Tennessee and Louisville) to have first-round draft picks in the last two years (**Chris Shaw**, 31st in 2015 and **Justin Dunn**, 19th in 2016)
- BC is one of 19 schools to have at least one player on D1baseball.com's Top 100 Draft Prospect List (**Donovan Casey**) and two freshmen on D1baseball.com's Top 100 Freshmen Prospect List (**Matt Gill** and **Dante Baldelli**). BC is the only team from the Northeast on the list and one of six ACC Teams (Florida State, NC State, Miami, Virginia, Louisville).
- Along with BC, Louisville is the only other team in the ACC to have consecutive first-round draft picks the last two years, make the 2016 Super Regional, have two freshmen on the Top 100 Prospect List and at least one player on the Top 100 2017 Draft Prospect List.

- BC and all the ACC programs donned the wristbands during the final weekend of the 2016 ACC season. In addition, the Boston Red Sox joined the Eagles in wearing the wristbands in the exhibition game in February. Across New England, college, high school and Little League teams supported Frates and raised awareness by wearing the specially-designed wristbands. Collegiate teams from the Big 12, MAC and Southern also participated.

RECORD BOOK RANKINGS

- In 2016, the Eagles ranked on 54 of BC's single-season, career and team top-five and top-10 record lists.
- As a team, they placed on 13 top-five team record lists, including breaking the walks record with 240 on the season. The 38 sacrifice hits tied for fifth and the 1,190 at bats ranked fourth.
- The 35 wins ties for third all-time, while the .614 win percentage was fourth.
- The pitching staff's 431 strikeouts and 3.82 team ERA were fifth all-time while opponents' .245 batting average was second. The 14 saves on the year tied for first all-time and the 507.2 innings pitched was third.
- LHP **Jesse Adams** finished his career with 84 appearances, third in BC record books. His nine career saves ranked seventh all-time.
- INF **Joe Cronin** set the BC walks record with 114 career walks. His 52 career doubles tied for second all-time. He finished fifth for career at bats (731), third for games played (203), third for games starts (201), tied for seventh for career triples (6) and tied for fifth by reaching base safely 304 times. His 35 walks in 2016 tied for sixth on BC's single-season list.
- RHP **Justin Dunn**'s 2.06 ERA in 2016 ranked fourth on BC's single-season list, while his .214 opponent batting average tied for seventh. His 3.66 career ERA was eighth all-time.
- RHP **Mike King**'s career 3.14 ERA ranked second all-time at Boston College while his .500 win percentage tied for 10th. His 209.1 career innings pitched is 10th and he set the single-season record with 104 innings pitched in 2016.
- Junior INF **Jake Palomaki**'s 19 stolen bases in 2016 tied for third.

BIRDS IN THE CAPE

- Four members of the Boston College baseball team saw action in the prestigious Cape Cod Baseball League during the 2016 summer: senior INF **Johnny Adams**, juniors INF **Jake Palomaki** and OF/RHP **Donovan Casey** and sophomore RHP **Jacob Stevens**.
- Adams hit .254 for the Harwich Mariners, playing there for the second straight summer. He recorded 31 hits, including six doubles, a triple and one home run, nine RBIs and 11 walks over 33 games. He recorded a .943 fielding percentage. He was voted the winner of the Daniel J. Silva Sportsmanship Award by the league's umpires.
- Casey, Palomaki and Stevens all played for the Chatham Anglers. Casey hit .221 with 23 hits, seven RBIs and eight walks. He also made three appearances on the mound, struck out six, did not walk a batter and allowed two earned runs.
- Palomaki recorded a .215 average with 14 runs, 28 hits, including five doubles and a home run, six RBIs and 23 walks. He notched a .964 fielding percentage in the A's infield.
- Stevens made two appearances as his pitch count was limited. He threw 9.2 innings, allowed five earned runs, seven hits and eight walks while striking out five.

2017 CAPTAINS

- Senior INF **Johnny Adams** and junior RHP **Bobby Skogsbergh** were voted captains of the 2017 BC baseball team.
- "Leadership starts with character and integrity and those are off the charts with Johnny and Bobby. The leadership of our club last year - starting with **Joe (Cronin)** and **Scores (Nick Sciortino)**, along with the other juniors and seniors - would be really hard to follow up but having these two boys step into those roles, I believe, is going to allow us not to miss a beat as far as our leadership. Just like last year, the captains have included the junior and senior class in a lot of the leadership of this ball club, which allowed the team to be successful, and this team will do the same thing. I love these two as leaders and I love the group of upperclassmen that we have." - **Mike Gambino**


NEW ADDITION TO THE STAFF

- **Alex Trezza** was named BC's associate head baseball coach in July.
- Coming to The Heights after a two-year stint at the helm of LIU-Brooklyn, Trezza spent time at Sacred Heart, New Haven, Adelphi University and Anna Maria College.
- Trezza, Stony Brook's first All-American, works with the BC pitching staff and catching core.
- He has been a featured presenter, including at the World Baseball Coaches' Convention, with presentations that include "The Hierarchy of Catching" and "The Prepared Catcher."
- Before his coaching days, Trezza was a standout player at Stony Brook, becoming the program's first All-American. He earned Freshman of The Year and New York State Baseball Conference Player of the Year honors in his first season in 1999. He holds several school records, including single-season home runs (23), career home runs (55) and career RBIs (176). Trezza was drafted in the 18th round by the Detroit Tigers following his junior year and played four seasons in the organization. He received the Most Improved Player award in 2003 in High Class-A Lakeland. Trezza graduated from Stony Brook with a bachelor's degree in political science in 2004.

Mike Gambino, a 1999 Boston College graduate, was named head baseball coach on July 19, 2010. In 2016, he brought the Eagles to the program's first NCAA Tournament in seven years and the team's third-ever Atlantic Coast Conference Championship appearance.

Gambino guided the 2016 Eagles to 35 overall wins, the most since 2005, tying for the second most in program history. They also tallied 13 ACC wins, the most since 2010, while their six conference series victories set a school record. BC swept the Oxford Regional as the three seed to advance to the program's first-ever Super Regional and move on for the first time in 49 years. BC also earned national ranking for the first time in school history, ending the season in the top 25 in all four major polls (15th - D1Baseball, 16th - Baseball America, NCBWA and 21st - USA Today/Coaches Poll).

For his efforts, Gambino was named the American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA) Northeast Region Coach of the Year, was a D1Baseball finalist for Coach of the Year and earned a spot on the website's top-10 coaching performances of the season.

Gambino saw Justin Dunn garner All-America third-team honors, the first pitcher to do so since 2009, and newcomer Jacob Stevens collect freshman All-America honors from two media outlets, the first BC honoree since 2002. Stevens picked up New England Intercollegiate Baseball Association (NEIBA) Freshman of the Year accolades and All-ACC Freshman team honors, while Dunn was named to the All-ACC Third Team and four players were named to the NEIBA All-New England team.

The 2016 Eagles ranked in the top five on 13 school record lists, including setting the program record for walks (240), tying the record for saves (14), and ranking second in opponent batting average (.245). Ten Eagles ranked on 26 of BC's career top-10 lists while eight Eagles found themselves 17 times on single-season, top-10 lists.

In his last two seasons, Gambino has mentored two first-round draft picks: Dunn, taken 19th overall by the New York Mets in 2016, and Chris Shaw, taken 31st overall by the San Francisco Giants. Shaw earned a spot on the Class A Advanced California League All-Star roster in 2016 and participated in the home run derby competition. The 2016 season saw five baseball players drafted - Dunn, Michael King (12th round), Jesse Adams (14th round), Nick Sciortino (19th round) and Joe Cronin (34th round).

In 2015, Gambino logged his 100th career win as a head coach in the final game of the season with a walk-off, 10th-inning victory against No. 24 Notre Dame. The Eagles ranked in the top five on six school record lists, including the second-fewest walks (231), the third-best fielding percentage (.976) and the pitching staff recording the fourth-most strikeouts (433). BC also ranked sixth on the year in the ACC in stolen bases (63) and doubles per game (1.78), fifth for stolen bases per game (1.17) and walks per game (4.28) and second in fielding percentage.

Four players from the 2015 team were drafted in the MLB First-Year Players Draft, including Shaw, the first BC first-rounder since. Pitchers John Gorman (31st round) and Jeff Burke (32nd round) and infielder Blake Butera (35th round) were also taken. Four Eagles earned New England Intercollegiate Baseball Association (NEIBA) All-New England accolades while Gorman was named to the ACC All-Academic Team and Shaw collected All-ACC Second-Team, Perfect Game USA All-American Third-Team and American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA) All-Northeast First-Team honors.

The Eagles went 17-33 in Gambino's first season at the helm, but he saw four players get selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft. In 2011, the Eagles improved to 20-33, winning 10 games in the highly-competitive ACC. In just one year, the team's batting average improved 19 points, slugging percentage 54 points and on-base percentage 27 points.

In his second year, Gambino saw infielder Anthony Melchionda and outfielder Tom Bourdon earn All-ACC second-team honors and take home ABCA All-Northeast Region and NEIBA All-Star accolades. Melchionda and classmate Matt Brazis were both drafted in the 2012 MLB Draft.

A young team in 2013, the Eagles regularly started five freshmen, and Gambino worked to improve through the year. The overall batting average, on-base percentage and slugging percentage all rose significantly from the first half of the season to the second and the Eagles doubled their win total.

In his fourth year at The Heights, Gambino saw the more improvement, recording 22 wins and tying for the most in conference, going 10-20 in the ACC. Shaw earned First-Team All-ACC and ABCA honors while pitcher Andrew Chin was drafted in the 15th round.

Since taking over at the Heights, Gambino has stressed off the field success as well, raising the team's GPA as a whole. Eagles have earned six spots on the All-ACC Academic baseball team and 52 on the ACC Academic Honor Roll.

Gambino, who was an assistant coach for the Eagles from 2003-05, came from Virginia Tech where he spent four seasons as an assistant coach under former BC head coach, Pete Hughes. He served as the Hokies' recruiting coordinator and also worked with the hitters and infielders. In his four years, he saw 15 players get drafted in the MLB Draft, including nine in 2010. From 1997 through 2006, only 13 Hokies were drafted in total.

Virginia Tech's batting average improved 40 points under Gambino's direction since the 2006 season. With his help, the 2010 Hokies made their first appearance in the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and finished the season ranked No. 20 in the country.

Prior to working in Blacksburg, Gambino spent two years as a regional scout for the Detroit Tigers.

Gambino played for the Eagles from 1997-2000, starting 166 games in the middle infield. He held a career batting average of .313 with 22 doubles, eight homers, 87 RBIs and 117 runs. His 78 hits in 2000, which was No. 1 when he graduated, was tied for fifth, until 2011, when his own player, Bourdon, knocked it down one with 79 hits of his own. Gambino's 52 runs his final year is still tied for eighth.

The Garrison, N.Y., native was a first-team All-Big East, All-New England and All-Northeast region honoree following his senior campaign. He also earned second-team All-New England and Big East Academic Team accolades during his playing career.

Following his career with BC, Gambino played two seasons in the Boston Red Sox minor league system. He spent the 2000 season with the Augusta Green Jackets before splitting the 2001 season between Augusta and the Lowell Spinners. In 2002, the Red Sox hired Gambino as a special assistant to the Major League staff before heading back to Lowell for a coaching role with the Spinners just prior to the June draft. Following his stint in Lowell, the Red Sox sent Gambino to the MLB Scout Development Program.

In January 2003, Gambino returned to Boston College as an assistant coach under Hughes.

Gambino received his bachelor's degree from the Heights in English and theology. He currently lives in Needham, Mass., with his wife, Jill, and their children, Sonny and Callahan.
