EAGLES SWEEP IRISH TO PUNCH TICKET TO LOUISVILLE

- Boston College has won its last six games, the longest win streak of 2017, and finished the regular season with a series sweep of Notre Dame at home to earn the 11th seed in the ACC Baseball Championship.
- It was the Eagles' first-ever series win over the Irish in the two teams' history, which dated back to the Big East days in 1996. They have won the last four games in Chestnut Hill and are 5-7 in ACC games.
- BC trailed in all three games against Notre Dame in the series, coming back to win in all three contests. The Eagles were down by two in game one, down by four twice in game two and trailed by four in game three.
- Junior OF/RHP **Donovan Casey** collected two wins in the series and three on the week, making appearances in all four games played. He threw 6.1 innings of scoreless relief with just three hits and three walks while striking out four. He also batted .400 with five hits and four runs in the Notre Dame series. He has at least one hit in the last six games and has reached base safely in the last 12.
- Sophomore UT **Jake Alu** extended his hit streak to eight games, tying a career long. He has at least one hit in 18 of the last 21 games. He led the Eagles in the ND series with a .545 batting clip, six hits, two doubles and five RBIs.
- BC's 74 stolen bases is tied for fifth in single-season record books.

BC RETURNS TO ACC TOURNAMENT

- The Eagles return to the ACC Baseball Championship for the second straight year and second time under seventh-year head coach **Mike Gambino**.
- It is BC's fourth appearance since joining the ACC in 2006.
- It seemed likely BC would miss the postseason as the Eagles started the conference slate 1-14. They won the first game at No. 2 Florida State before dropping 14 straight to five conference opponents, of which four were ranked in the top six. They rallied to win 10 of their final 15 ACC games.
- BC is 3-4 all-time at the postseason competition.
- The first appearance came in 2009 when the Eagles went 2-1, defeating Georgia Tech and Miami in Durham, N.C. They also earned a bid in 2010 (1-2) and 2016 (0-1). Last year, BC fell to Georgia Tech, 6-0, in a first-round game.
- The Eagles played both Pool B opponents at home in 2017, sweeping the Wolfpack and losing all three games to third-ranked UNC.
- BC has won eight of the last 11 contests against the Wolfpack. This year's series victory was the second straight series win over State and the fifth overall. It was the second series sweep of the Pack and the first Gambino. NC State never led in the 2017 series.
- BC has won just two of the 26 all-time contests with UNC, coming at home in 2009 and in 2014.

EAGLES OF NOTE

- Junior OF/RHP **Donovan Casey** entered BC's single-season record books tied for eighth with five save on the year. He combined with sophomore RHP **Jacob Stevens** to throw a one-hitter at Duke on April 14, retiring all six batters faced with one strikeout. His five saves on the season is tied for sixth in the ACC. His five wins - thanks to three over the last four appearances - leads the Eagles and he leads all relievers with 31 Ks. In BC's final four games, Casey did not allow a run in 6.1 innings of relief, giving up just three hits and three walks and striking out four. Opponents batted just .136 against him. He also batted .375 with six hits, five runs and two RBIs, scoring the game-winning run on Sunday, leading off the eighth inning with an infield single. He has reached base safely in the last 12 games and has a hit in the last six. He is also third in the nation with eight outfield assists.
- Sophomore RHP **Jacob Stevens** started his 15th game of the season on Thursday against Notre Dame, tying for second in BC's single-season record book. He recorded a career-high 10 strikeouts in a seven-inning start, allowing just four hits, two runs and two walks. He retired nine ND batters in a row from the third to the sixth innings. The seven innings tied a career high. His 3.82 career ERA is ninth in BC record books.
- Sophomore C **Gian Martellini** has started 50 games for the Eagles behind the plate and logged at least one hit in 41 of them. His career-long, 14-game hit streak came to an end against Maine on May 16. It was the longest of the season for the Eagles and tied for sixth in BC record books. In that span, he has tallied 20 hits - including four doubles, a triple and two home runs, - five runs, nine RBIs, 32 total bases, a sac fly and three walks. Martellini recorded a career-high five RBIs in the victory over Duke on April 15 with his first career grand slam.
- Sophomore UT/RHP **Jake Alu** has hit in 18 of the last 21 games and extended his hit streak to eight games, tying a career long. It is his second eight-game hit streak of the season. He led the Eagles with a .342 batting average and 39 hits in ACC games. His .335 overall average and 12 stolen bases also leads the team. He is eighth in the ACC for his conference batting clip. Alu led the team with a .545 batting average, .727 slugging percentage and five RBIs in the sweep of Notre Dame. His three RBIs in the series-opening win over the Irish on Thursday tied a career high and he recorded a career-high four hits in the victory at Duke on April 15.
- Freshman INF **Brian Dempsey** has hit his stride in the second half of the season. He has logged at least one hit in 13 of the last 18 games played, including a career-long, six-game hit streak. In the last 18 games, his batting .370 with 17 hits, eight runs, two doubles, six RBIs and seven walks. He laid down a team season-high three sacrifice bunts against Miami on April 29, including one for an RBI.
- Junior INF **Jake Palomaki** already has his name all over the BC record book. In three years at The Heights, he broke the all-time walks record, currently sitting at 119. His 46 walks in 2015 ranks first on the single-season list, 42 in 2016 is second and his 31 this season is tied for 10th. That is after missing 11 games due to an injury. His 41 career stolen bases is tied for sixth in record books and the 19 he stole last year is tied for third.
- The Eagles' .974 fielding percentage is fourth in record books while their 74 stolen bases is tied for fifth on the team record list. They are sixth in the conference for their fielding percentage and third for swipes.

A TRIPLE THREAT

- Junior OF/RHP **Donovan Casey** shows his athleticism at the plate, on the mound and in right field, making him on the Eagles' biggest threats on the diamond.
- He is third on the team with a .290 batting average and second with 56 hits and 23 walks. His speed is on display as he is tied for second with 11 stolen bases and leads BC with 39 runs. His five stolen bases in ACC action is first on the team.
- On the hill, the closer leads the way with five wins, five saves and 22 appearances. His three saves in league play are tied for seventh in the ACC. His 31 strikeouts and 3.03 ERA are first among relievers.
- Casey picked up three victories in four appearances last week, throwing 6.1 scoreless innings of relief. The righty entered the game against Maine on May 16 with the Eagles trailing and came in twice with BC tied with Notre Dame.
- In the field, his eight outfield assists ranks third in the nation.
- Casey hit for the cycle in the victory over Massachusetts on March 29, a feat that had not been done in 14 years at Boston College. He started the game with a triple off the wall in right center. In his next at bat, he homered over the left-field fence. He then hit a single up the middle and in his fourth at bat, he doubled to right center to complete the cycle.
- The last BC player to hit for the cycle was Jason Delaney on April 27, 2003 in a 3-2 win against Seton Hall.

KING OF WALKS

- Junior INF **Jake Palomaki** broke the record for career walks on May 13, drawing the 115th in his career to start the first game against Quinnipiac. He currently has 119.
- The Kennesaw, Ga., native already holds the record for single-season walks with 46, set as a freshman in 2015. His 42 in 2016 is second in BC record books. He currently has 31, tied for 10th, even after missing 11 games with a hamstring injury.
- He drew a career-high and season-high four walks at Wake Forest on May 7.
- Palomaki is sixth all-time with a .428 career on-base percentage and has reached base safely 273 times, on the cusp on BC's top 10.

TURNING IT AROUND

- The Eagles opened Shea Field by dropping a three-game series to then fourth-ranked North Carolina at home by a combined score of 48-14.
- Since that weekend, BC has gone 16-6, outscoring opponent, 121-102. The Eagles lost only two more games in what is affectionately known as "The Birdcage" as ACC foe Miami took two of three.
- They did not surrender a home game to a non-conference opponent all season.
- Three Eagles - freshman INF **Brian Dempsey** and sophomores UT **Jake Alu** and C **Gian Martellini** - batted over .300 with Dempsey leading the way with a .383 clip and Martellini driving in 19.
- The team also logged 10 home runs - doubling the season total before that - three triples, 32 doubles, 110 RBIs, 92 walks and 36 stolen bases. In the field, the Eagles made just 13 total errors, logging a .984 fielding percentage.
- The Eagles ended the season - and closed out the home slate with a six-game winning streak, the longest of the season. In those six games, they batted .311 as a team with Alu leading the way with a .450 clip. They recorded a .420 on-base percentage, were 9-of-10 stealing and recorded a .991 fielding percentage.

FRIENDLY CONFINES OF SHEA FIELD

- The BC baseball team will miss Eddie Pellagrini Diamond at Commander Shea Field, as the Eagles played their final game on the diamond on Saturday. This season, they are 12-8, a perfect 4-0 in non-conference action.
- They ended the season on a six-game win streak, all played at home, and swept two series in the friendly confines.
- Four Eagles - junior INF **Jake Palomaki**, sophomores UT **Jake Alu** and C **Gian Martellini** and freshman INF **Brian Dempsey** - all hit over .300 at Shea and the Eagles blasted 10 of their 15 homers at the field.
- In the field, they recorded a .982 fielding percentage with 17 double plays.

SPEEDY EAGLES

- BC's 74 stolen bases are third in the ACC and rank 38th nationally.
- The Eagles' 1.45 stolen bases per game is second in the league and ranks 33rd in the country.
- They currently sit tied for fifth on BC's team record list.
- BC stole 10 bases in the victory over Villanova (April 5), the most since BC stole 11 at Northeastern in a 7-6 victory on May 4, 2016.
- The Eagles have stolen at least four bases in a game five times this season.

WATCH WHEN YOU RUN

- The BC outfield has proven it's a dangerous one to test.
- The Eagles have racked up 14 outfield assists, which is tied for fourth in the nation.
- Junior OF **Donovan Casey** has eight outfield assists, third in the country.
- Senior OF **Michael Strem** has six, tied for fourth overall.
- Charleston Southern leads the way with 19 team outfield assists while Wofford's Kody Ruedisili leads the nation with 13.

"JUNIOR" NO MORE?

- Sophomore UT/RHP **Jake Alu** made his first career start - as the designated hitter - against Villanova on March 5 and recorded a then career-high three hits (3-for-4), three RBIs and three stolen bases.
- He made his first career start in the field on March 7 against Toledo, playing left - the first time he ever set foot in the outfield - and made a diving catch in foul territory. He recorded a hit and a run in the win over the Rockets.
- He then scored a career-high three run in the win at No. 2 Florida State on March 10.
- Alu - more affectionately known as "Junior" or "Junezy" - drove in three runs against UMass on March 29 on a 2-for-3 day with two doubles, two runs and a walk. He matched that RBI total against Notre Dame on May 18 against the Irish as he went 6-for-11 in the three-game series with five RBIs.
- He matched his then career high with three hits on a 3-for-5 day at Virginia Tech on April 1 but set a new record with four hits on a 4-for-6 day at Duke on April 15.
- Alu recorded a career-long, eight-game hit streak from March 26 to April 9. In that time, he recorded 14 hits, six runs, six RBIs, three doubles, four walks and two stolen bases. He is currently riding another eight-game hit streak in which he has tallied a .414 clip with 12 hits, six runs, 10 RBIs, four walks and two stolen bases.

- Since March 5, he has started every game for the Eagles. He leads the team with a .335 batting average and 12 stolen bases. His .342 ACC clip is also first on the team.
- The righty has also pitched nine times in 2017 and recorded eight strikeouts after learning to the art before the season.

IRON MAN WAS OUT...BUT NOW HE'S BACK

- Junior INF **Jake Palomaki** started 116 straight games for the BC baseball team before he suffered a hamstring injury in the second game at Louisville on March 18.
- The injury cost him a spot in the lineup as he rehabilitated the injury. The last time Palomaki did not start a game was on March 1, 2015.
- In his BC career, Palomaki only did not play the first four games his freshman year.
- He had played in 123 of the Eagles' 127 games until the injury and he started 120 of those games.
- Palomaki returned to the diamond as a defensive replaced in the eighth inning on April 8 against No. 4 North Carolina and drew a walk at the plate. He got back to regular play by starting all three games at Duke (April 14-16).
- Mak, as he more commonly known, has started 17 of the last 18 games, and recorded 13 hits, 14 runs, seven RBIs, 18 walks and two stolen bases.
- He returned to his lead-off spot in the lineup in the series finale against Miami on April 30 and went 1-for-3 with two runs, a walk and two RBIs. He is batting .370 as the leadoff this season.
- He broke BC's all-time record for career walks, ranks sixth with a career .428 on-base percentage and is tied for sixth all-time with 41 career stolen bases.

RUNS AT THE RECORD BOOKS

- Some Eagles are looking to make a splash in the BC record books.
- Senior UT **Michael Strem** is the ACC's current active leader with 58 all-time doubles while junior INF **Jake Palomaki** is second on the active leaders list for career walks (119) and tied for fourth for career stolen bases (41).
- Senior INF **Johnny Adams** leads with the way with 199 career games started, is third for games played (201) and is tied for fifth with 24 career sacrifice hits.

- All former players were invited back for the closing ceremonies and were on hand when Al Pellagrini, Eddie's bother, and Anne, his daughter, threw out the first pitch before the game.
- **Eddie Pellagrini** was the Eagles' head coach for 30 years, from 1958-68, 70-88. He is also the winningest coach with a 570-346-5 (.622) all time record. He led the Eagles to 17 winning seasons, seven postseason berths in the

BITTEN BY THE INJURY BUG

- One of the largest hurdles the Eagles have faced this season is injuries and illness.
- At any given point this season, as many to 16 players on the Eagles' 35-man roster have been sidelined due to injury or illness.
- The injury bug has given other players - like sophomore UT/RHP **Jake Alu** and freshmen INF **Brian Dempsey** and UT/RHP **Jack Cunningham** the chance to step up and garner more playing time.

ROAD WARRIORS

- Boston College traveled over 12,000 miles before playing at Eddie Pellagrini Diamond at Commander Shea Field in Chestnut Hill, Mass. The Eagles played 26 games before hosting UNC at The Heights on April 8 and 9.
- The Eagles' first scheduled game at what is affectionately known as the "Birdcage" was slated for March 24 against Clemson in a three-game, conference matchup, but field conditions forced BC to move the series to Rhode Island's Bill Beck Field in Kingston, R.I.
- Due to a grass field and unpredictable New England weather, the Eagles have averaged playing the first 24 games elsewhere before opening at The Heights under seventh-year head coach **Mike Gambino**. In 2015, the Eagles played the first 30 games away from Shea Field as Boston saw a record amount of snowfall that winter.
- BC started the 2017 journey in Florida with a three-game series at Bethune-Cookman in Daytona Beach.
- The second weekend of the season, the Eagles traveled to the middle of the country for the 19 Ways Invitational hosted by Oklahoma. It was the first time the Eagles played in the Sooner State.
- The Eagles returned to Florida the following weekend for five games in the Snowbird Classic in Port Charlotte before opening the ACC slate in Tallahassee against then No. 2 Florida State.
- Because of a mid-March snowstorm, BC's instate contest at Holy Cross was postponed so the Eagles flew out to Kentucky for a three-game conference set against top-ranked Louisville. After, the Eagles traveled four miles down Commonwealth Ave. for a midweek tilt with Northeastern and the scheduled three-game set against the Tigers.
- Due to field conditions, the Eagles' New England rivalry game at Connecticut was postponed and BC had to move its midweek game against Massachusetts to the New England Baseball Complex in Northborough, Mass.
- The Eagles headed to Blacksburg, Va., for a three-game ACC series with the Hokies and moved the first round of the Beanpot from Chestnut Hill to Brookline.

NO. 8 TABBED AS UNSUNG HERO

- Senior INF **Johnny Adams** was honored as the male recipient of the Unsung Hero Award on May 5 at BC's annual Golden Eagle Awards.
- The award is presented to those whose efforts toward, and passion for, the program go above and beyond.
- Adams has been the Eagles' starting shortstop the last four years and was voted a captain by his teammates as a senior.
- He was the first two-year recipient the No. 8 jersey, worn in honor of former baseball player **Peter "Sonny" Nictakis**. Each season a player who represents the best qualities of BC Baseball is voted by the baseball team to wear Nictakis's old number. Adams was the first-ever junior selected a season ago.
- Nictakis was a two-time captain for the Eagles in 1998-99 and lost his courageous battle with Hodgkin's disease in the summer of 2000. His No. 8 had not been worn since the 1999 season and in the first year at the helm, Gambino tabbed **Mike Sudol** to be the first to don the number during the 2011 campaign.
- Adams was the first-ever junior selected a season ago. His father, **Jay**, was a captain in 1987 under head coach **Eddie Pellagrini** and it is believed that they are the first father-son duo to be captains at Boston College.
- He has played in the Cape Cod Collegiate Baseball League the last two summers. In 2016, Adams was voted the winner of the Daniel J. Silva Sportsmanship Award by the league's umpires, and in 2015, he earned the league's Manny Robello 10th Player Award, given to a player who has shown dedication both on and off the field and all to the game.
- Other former No. 8 recipients are: **Kyle Prohovich** (2012), **Matt Paré** (2013), **Tom Bourdon** (2014) and **Travis Ferrick** (2015).

EAGLES WIN 13TH BEANPOT TITLE

- Boston College collected its 13th Baseball Beanpot title, the most of the four schools, with a 3-2, five-inning victory over Harvard at Fenway Park on April 19. The game was shortened due to rain.
- The Eagles have won the last three straight titles and four total under seventh-year head coach **Mike Gambino**. The three-year run in the longest win streak for BC since the inception of the Boston-based tournament in 1990.
- It was the fifth time the Eagles claimed the title over the Crimson and improve to 14-4-1 overall against Harvard in the tournament.
- The Eagles hold a 37-16-1 record in the Beanpot.
- BC reached the championship game after a 5-1 victory over Northeastern on April 5.

SIXTH ANNUAL ALS GAME AT FENWAY PARK

- The Boston College baseball team played the Sixth Annual ALS Awareness Game at Fenway Park on April 22 against NC State. The game was televised nationally on ESPN and broke an ALS Game record with 3,603 in attendance.
- The game is played annually in honor of former captain **Pete Frates** who was diagnosed with ALS in March 2012.
- Tickets were general admission for \$10 with all proceeds benefiting the Pete Frates #3 Fund. The fund was created to aid in Frates' medical costs not covered by health insurance.
- The teams also honored Chris Combs, who played baseball for NC State from 1994-97 and was diagnosed with ALS in May 2016. He is an associate director with the Wolfpack Club. He is also fighting to bring awareness and funds

to the disease.

- The Eagles wore Strikeout ALS ribbon patches with Frates' No. 3 on the their sleeves and "The Cure for Combs" hats. The Pack wore "Strikeout ALS" jerseys with Combs' logo on the arm. Both teams had "PF3" wristbands as part of the "Band Together to Strikeout ALS" initiative. BC also donned its red, PF3 StrikeoutALS tee shirts for batting practice.
- The Frates and Combs families were presented with \$5,000 donation checks for their respective foundations from the game's sponsor, I Star Ventures. Combs threw out the first pitch, while Frates' two-year-old daughter, Lucy, said "Play Ball" in the opening ceremonies.
- Each year since Frates' diagnosis, the Eagles have held an ALS Awareness Game at Eddie Pellagrini Diamond at Commander Shea Field. In each of the last five seasons, over 2,000 fans have been in attendance to show their support for a cause very close the BC community's heart.
- Last year Frates' No. 3 was retired and in 2015, the largest crowd in Shea Field history, 3,033 fans, attended the Eagles' ALS game against Georgia Tech.
- Frates was diagnosed with Amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS) at 27 years old. Since then, he, along with his family and friends, have worked tirelessly to raise awareness and funds to find a cure for the disease. In the summer of 2014, Frates championed the Ice Bucket Challenge through the use of social media. Along with the amount of awareness brought to ALS, over \$220 million was raised to help find a cure.
- A Beverly, Mass., native, Frates played in the outfield for the Maroon and Gold from 2004-07. A captain his senior year, he finished his BC career with 107 starts, a .228 average, 88 hits, 56 RBIs, 11 home runs and 34 stolen bases.

FRATES: AN INSPIRATION FOR ALL

- In November 2016, the NCAA announced that former BC baseball captain **Pete Frates**, who has been battling ALS in the public spotlight for almost five years, was the recipient of the 2017 NCAA Inspiration Award.
- The Inspiration Award is presented to a coach or administrator currently associated with intercollegiate athletics, or to a current or former varsity letter winner at an NCAA institution. It is reserved for people, who when confronted with a life-altering situation, used perseverance, dedication and determination to overcome their trauma, and, most importantly, are role models giving hope and inspiration to others in similar situations.
- Normally, the award is presented to the recipient at the NCAA Honors Celebration at the NCAA Convention each year, but because it is very difficult for Frates to travel long distances, NCAA president Dr. Mark Emmert presented Frates the award in his home in Beverly, Mass., in front of his family, friends, former teammates, the entire baseball team, media and local government leaders.
- In January, Frates' father John and brother Andrew accepted the award on his behalf in Nashville, Tenn., at the annual dinner.

EAGLES HOST FIFTH ANNUAL WWP GAME

- BC baseball teamed up with the Wounded Warrior Project (WWP) for the fifth straight year to honor current and former U.S. military members for the April 29 game against Miami.
- The Eagles wore Under Armour camo uniforms and local veterans were honored before the game.
- On April 27, the Eagles invited local military members to campus to engage in a softball game on Shea Field.
- The players and veterans build backpacks with hand-written notes to send to Walter Reed Medical Center, listen to a WWP speaker talk and share a meal provided by Sweet Cheeks in Boston, Mass.

ALL IN PERSPECTIVE

- What has Boston College accomplished as program in the last two years under head coach **Mike Gambino**?
- While a record 10 ACC teams made the NCAA Tournament in 2016, the Eagles were one of four (BC, Miami, Florida State and Louisville) to advance to a Super Regional. BC faced off against Miami in a conference tilt that went the maximum three games.
- BC was one of five schools (BC, Illinois, Florida, Tennessee and Louisville) to have first-round draft picks in the last two years (**Chris Shaw**, 31st in 2015 and **Justin Dunn**, 19th in 2016)
- BC is one of 19 schools to have at least one player on D1baseball.com's Top 100 Draft Prospect List (**Donovan Casey**) and two freshmen on D1baseball.com's Top 100 Freshmen Prospect List (**Matt Gill** and **Dante Baldelli**). BC is the only team from the Northeast on the list and one of six ACC Teams (Florida State, NC State, Miami, Virginia, Louisville).
- Along with BC, Louisville is the only other team in the ACC to have consecutive first-round draft picks the last two years, make the 2016 Super Regional, have two freshmen on the Top 100 Prospect List and at least one player on the Top 100 2017 Draft Prospect List.

- Band Together to Strike Out ALS was formulated by the Frates family, BC head coach **Mike Gambino**, Wake Forest head coach Tom Walter and CollegeBaseballInsider.com co-founder Sean Ryan. The wristbands read "Strike Out ALS" and feature Frates' initials and number (PF3) and are available for purchase here. Proceeds from the wristbands support the fund raising efforts of Frates.
- BC and all the ACC programs donned the wristbands during the final weekend of the 2016 ACC season. In addition, the Boston Red Sox joined the Eagles in wearing the wristbands in the exhibition game in February. Across New England, college, high school and Little League teams supported Frates and raised awareness by wearing the specially-designed wristbands. Collegiate teams from the Big 12, MAC and Southern also participated.

RECORD BOOK RANKINGS

- In 2016, the Eagles ranked on 54 of BC's single-season, career and team top-five and top-10 record lists.
- As a team, they placed on 13 top-five team record lists, including breaking the walks record with 240 on the season. The 38 sacrifice hits tied for fifth and the 1,190 at bats ranked fourth.
- The 35 wins ties for third all-time, while the .614 win percentage was fourth.
- The pitching staff's 431 strikeouts and 3.82 team ERA were fifth all-time while opponents' .245 batting average was second. The 14 saves on the year tied for first and the 507.2 innings pitched was third.
- LHP **Jesse Adams** finished with 84 career appearances, third all-time, and nine career saves, seventh.
- INF **Joe Cronin** set the BC walks record with 114 career walks. His 52 career doubles tied for second all-time. He finished fifth for career at bats (731), third for games played (203), third for games starts (201), tied for seventh for career triples (6) and tied for fifth by reaching base safely 304 times. His 35 walks in 2016 tied for sixth on BC's single-season list.
- RHP **Justin Dunn**'s 2.06 ERA in 2016 ranked fourth on BC's single-season list, while his .214 opponent batting average tied for seventh. His 3.66 career ERA was eighth all-time.
- RHP **Mike King**'s career 3.14 ERA ranked second all-time at Boston College while his .500 win percentage tied for 10th. His 209.1 career innings pitched is 10th and he set the single-season record with 104 innings pitched in 2016.
- Junior INF **Jake Palomaki**'s 19 stolen bases in 2016 tied for third.

BIRDS IN THE CAPE

- Four members of the Boston College baseball team saw action in the prestigious Cape Cod Baseball League during the 2016 summer: senior INF **Johnny Adams**, juniors INF **Jake Palomaki** and OF/RHP **Donovan Casey** and sophomore RHP **Jacob Stevens**.
- Adams hit .254 for the Harwich Mariners, playing there for the second straight summer. He recorded 31 hits, including six doubles, a triple and one home run, nine RBIs and 11 walks over 33 games. He recorded a .943 fielding percentage. He was voted the winner of the Daniel J. Silva Sportsmanship Award by the league's umpires.
- Casey, Palomaki and Stevens all played for the Chatham Anglers. Casey hit .221 with 23 hits, seven RBIs and eight walks. He also made three appearances on the mound, struck out six, did not walk a batter and allowed two earned runs.
- Palomaki recorded a .215 average with 14 runs, 28 hits, including five doubles and a home run, six RBIs and 23 walks. He notched a .964 fielding percentage in the A's infield.
- Stevens made two appearances as his pitch count was limited. He threw 9.2 innings, allowed five earned runs, seven hits and eight walks while striking out five.

2017 CAPTAINS

- Senior INF **Johnny Adams** and junior RHP **Bobby Skogsbergh** were voted captains of the 2017 BC baseball team.
- "Leadership starts with character and integrity and those are off the charts with Johnny and Bobby. The leadership of our club last year - starting with **Joe (Cronin)** and **Scores (Nick Sciortino)**, along with the other juniors and seniors - would be really hard to follow up but having these two boys step into those roles, I believe, is going to allow us not to miss a beat as far as our leadership. Just like last year, the captains have included the junior and senior class in a lot of the leadership of this ball club, which allowed the team to be successful, and this team will do the same thing. I love these two as leaders and I love the group of upperclassmen that we have." - **Mike Gambino**

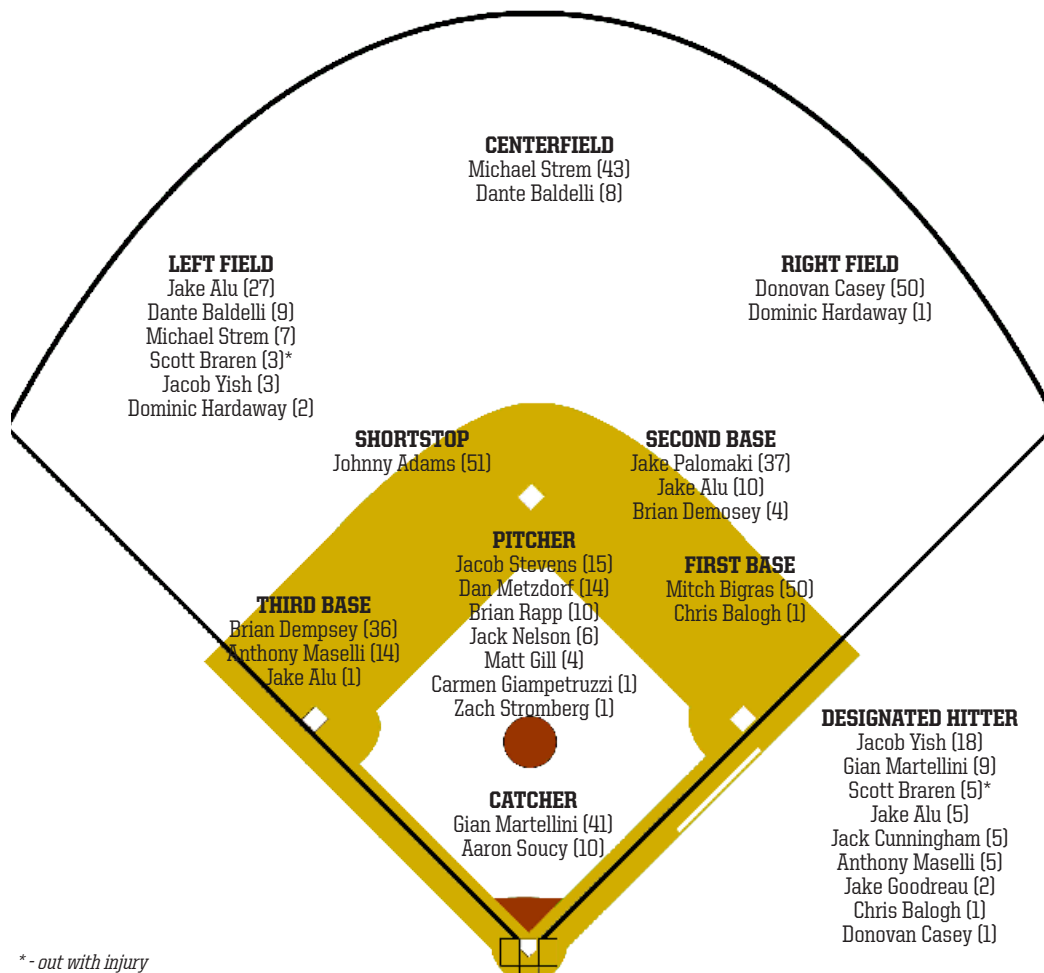
NEW ADDITION TO THE STAFF

- Alex Trezza** was named BC's associate head baseball coach in July 2016.
- Coming to The Heights after a two-year stint at the helm of LIU-Brooklyn, Trezza spent time at Sacred Heart, New Haven, Adelphi University and Anna Maria College.
- Trezza, Stony Brook's first All-American, works with the BC pitching staff and catching core.
- He has been a featured presenter, including at the World Baseball Coaches' Convention, with presentations that include "The Hierarchy of Catching" and "The Prepared Catcher."
- Before his coaching days, Trezza was a standout player at Stony Brook. He earned Freshman of The Year and New York State Baseball Conference Player of the Year honors in his first season in 1999. He holds several school records, including single-season home runs (23), career home runs (55) and career RBIs (176). Trezza was drafted in the 18th round by the Detroit Tigers following his junior year and played four seasons in the organization.

Boston College '99

Mike Gambino, a 1999 Boston College graduate, was named head baseball coach on July 19, 2010. In 2016, he brought the Eagles to the program's first NCAA Tournament in seven years and the team's third-ever Atlantic Coast Conference Championship appearance.

Gambino guided the 2016 Eagles to 35 overall wins, the most since 2005, tying for the second most in program history. They also tallied 13 ACC wins, the most since 2010, while their six conference series victories set a school record. BC swept the Oxford Regional as the three seed to advance to the program's first-ever Super Regional and move on for the first time in 49 years. BC also earned national ranking for the first time in school history, ending the season in the top 25 in all four major polls (15th - D1Baseball, 16th - Baseball America, NCBWA and 21st - USA Today/Coaches Poll).

For his efforts, Gambino was named the American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA) Northeast Region Coach of the Year, was a D1Baseball finalist for Coach of the Year and earned a spot on the website's top-10 coaching performances of the season.

Gambino saw Justin Dunn garner All-America third-team honors, the first pitcher to do so since 2009, and newcomer Jacob Stevens collect freshman All-America honors from two media outlets, the first BC honoree since 2002. Stevens picked up New England Intercollegiate Baseball Association (NEIBA) Freshman of the Year accolades and All-ACC Freshman team honors, while Dun was named to the All-ACC Third Team and four players were named to the NEIBA All-New England team.

The 2016 Eagles ranked in the top five on 13 school record lists, including setting the program record for walks (240), tying the record for saves (14), and ranking second in opponent batting average (.245). Ten Eagles ranked on 26 of BC's career top-10 lists while eight Eagles found themselves 17 times on single-season, top-10 lists.

In his last two seasons, Gambino has mentored two first-round draft picks: Dunn, taken 19th overall by the New York Mets in 2016, and Chris Shaw, taken 31st overall by the San Francisco Giants. Shaw earned a spot on the Class A Advanced California League All-Star roster in 2016 and participated in the home run derby competition. The 2016 season saw five baseball players drafted - Dunn, Michael King (12th round), Jesse Adams (14th round), Nick Sciortino (19th round) and Joe Cronin (34th round).

In 2015, Gambino logged his 100th career win as a head coach in the final game of the season with a walk-off, 10th-inning victory against No. 24 Notre Dame. The Eagles ranked in the top five on six school record lists, including the second-fewest walks (231), the third-best fielding percentage (.976) and the pitching staff recording the fourth-most strikeouts (433). BC also ranked sixth on the year in the ACC in stolen bases (63) and doubles per game (1.78), fifth for stolen bases per game (1.17) and walks per game (4.28) and second in fielding percentage.

Four players from the 2015 team were drafted in the MLB First-Year Players Draft, including Shaw, the first BC first-rounder since. Pitchers John Gorman (31st round) and Jeff Burke (32nd round) and infielder Blake Butera (35th round) were also taken. Four Eagles earned New England Intercollegiate Baseball Association (NEIBA) All-New England accolades while Gorman was named to the ACC All-Academic Team and Shaw collected All-ACC Second-Team, Perfect Game USA All-American Third-Team and American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA) All-Northeast First-Team honors.

The Eagles went 17-33 in Gambino's first season at the helm, but he saw four players get selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft. In 2011, the Eagles improved to 20-33, winning 10 games in the highly-competitive ACC. In just one year, the team's batting average improved 19 points, slugging percentage 54 points and on-base percentage 27 points.

In his second year, Gambino saw infielder Anthony Melchionda and outfielder Tom Bourdon earn All-ACC second-team honors and take home ABCA All-Northeast Region and NEIBA All-Star accolades. Melchionda and classmate Matt Brazis were both drafted in the 2012 MLB Draft.

A young team in 2013, the Eagles regularly started five freshmen, and Gambino worked to improve through the year. The overall batting average, on-base percentage and slugging percentage all rose significantly from the first half of the season to the second and the Eagles doubled their win total.

In his fourth year at The Heights, Gambino saw the more improvement, recording 22 wins and tying for the most in conference, going 10-20 in the ACC. Shaw earned First-Team All-ACC and ABCA honors while pitcher Andrew Chin was drafted in the 15th round.

Since taking over at the Heights, Gambino has stressed off the field success as well, raising the team's GPA as a whole. Eagles have earned six spots on the All-ACC Academic baseball team and 52 on the ACC Academic Honor Roll.

Gambino, who was an assistant coach for the Eagles from 2003-05, came from Virginia Tech where he spent four seasons as an assistant coach under former BC head coach, Pete Hughes. He served as the Hokies' recruiting coordinator and also worked with the hitters and infielders. In his four years, he saw 15 players get drafted in the MLB Draft, including nine in 2010. From 1997 through 2006, only 13 Hokies were drafted in total.

Virginia Tech's batting average improved 40 points under Gambino's direction since the 2006 season. With his help, the 2010 Hokies made their first appearance in the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and finished the season ranked No. 20 in the country.

Prior to working in Blacksburg, Gambino spent two years as a regional scout for the Detroit Tigers.

Gambino played for the Eagles from 1997-2000, starting 166 games in the middle infield. He held a career batting average of .313 with 22 doubles, eight homers, 87 RBIs and 117 runs. His 78 hits in 2000, which was No. 1 when he graduated, was tied for fifth, until 2011, when his own player, Bourdon, knocked it down one with 79 hits of his own. Gambino's 52 runs his final year is still tied for eighth.

The Garrison, N.Y., native was a first-team All-Big East, All-New England and All-Northeast region honoree following his senior campaign. He also earned second-team All-New England and Big East Academic Team accolades during his playing career.

Following his career with BC, Gambino played two seasons in the Boston Red Sox minor league system. He spent the 2000 season with the Augusta Green Jackets before splitting the 2001 season between Augusta and the Lowell Spinners. In 2002, the Red Sox hired Gambino as a special assistant to the Major League staff before heading back to Lowell for a coaching role with the Spinners just prior to the June draft. Following his stint in Lowell, the Red Sox sent Gambino to the MLB Scout Development Program.

In January 2003, Gambino returned to Boston College as an assistant coach under Hughes.

Gambino received his bachelor's degree from the Heights in English and theology. He currently lives in Needham, Mass., with his wife, Jill, and their children, Sonny and Callahan.
