The Game

• For the second time under head coach Steve Addazio, the Boston College football team opens the season against UMass on Saturday, Sept. 1. BC also started the 2014 campaign against the Minutemen.

• The game will be broadcast on ACC Network Extra. Doug Sherman provides play-by-play commentary while Matt Chatham has the color commentary.

• Coverage on the Boston College IMG Sports Network begins at 12:30 p.m. with Jon Meterparel, Pete Cronan and Scott Mutryn. Fans can listen to the game locally on WEEI 850 AM, nationally on TuneIn and on Sirius channel 134 and XM channel 384.

• Boston College returns 17 starters from last season's 7-6 squad that finished 4-4 in the ACC. The Eagles won five of their last six regular season games a year ago and finished the season in the New Era Pinstripe Bowl vs. Iowa.

• UMass is 1-0 to start the season after last Saturday's 63-15 win over Duquesne in Amherst.

The Series

• BC holds a 21-5 series advantage over Massachusetts and has won the last nine meetings, the latest coming in 2016 (26-7 at Gillette Stadium).

• The Eagles are 33-5-2 all-time against New England's two FBS schools, UMass and UConn.

• In the 2016 win over UMass, then sophomore wide receiver Jeff Smith finished with five receptions for 98 yards, including two touchdown receptions of 46 and 36 yards.

• BC is 12-3 all-time at home against UMass. The last time the two schools met at Alumni Stadium was in 2011 as BC prevailed 45-17.

• BC defensive coordinator Jim Reid was the head coach at Massachusetts from 1986 to 1991. He compiled a 36-29-1 record and guided the Minutemen to three Yankee Conference titles. He was named the Yankee Conference Coach of the Year in 1988 and 1990. Reid got his start at UMass as a graduate assistant in 1973.

1st and 10

• Boston College is set to begin the 120th season in school history as the Eagles host in-state foe UMass.

• Boston College has nine straight wins in the series vs. UMass. The last time the Minutemen defeated the Eagles was a 27-0 shutout in 1978.

• BC head coach Steve Addazio enters his sixth season at the Heights (31-33) and is 4-1 in season openers. The lone loss in a season opener under Addazio was in 2016 in Ireland to Georgia Tech.

• Under Addazio, BC is 10-10 in the month of September, including a 9-6 mark in September home games.

• All-time, BC is 69-48-2 in season openers, including a 13-5 mark since 2000.

• Saturday's game against UMass marks the first time since 2015 that Boston College has opened the season at Alumni Stadium. The Eagles defeated Maine 24-3 in the 2015 opener.

STEVE ADDAZIO WEEKLY NEWS CONFERENCE

Steve Addazio's weekly news conference is held at noon Monday of each game week at the Conte Forum Media Suite. Lunch is served immediately following the news conference. The transcript will be sent out and available on bceagles.com later in the day along with live video of the news conference on BCEagles.com.

STEVE ADDAZIO MEDIA OPPORTUNITIES

For those who cannot attend the Monday press conference, the head coach may be available for short interviews after practice on Tuesday. He is also available on the ACC teleconference each Wednesday during the season at 12:20 p.m. Transcripts are made available through the ACC. Please contact Kevin Best at the ACC for call-in information.

STUDENT-ATHLETE INTERVIEWS

The first 20 minutes of practice on Tuesday and Wednesday is open to the media. Players are made available for interviews following the conclusion of practice. The starting quarterback will speak after practice on Tuesday.

An attempt is made for telephone interviews for media outside the Boston area if arranged in advance with the BC Communications office on Tuesdays and Wednesdays.

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

All media credential requests must be submitted via www.sportssystem.com/bostoncollege.

Admittance to the Alumni Stadium Press Box is limited to working media members only. Credential requests must be made through BC's credentialing website.

Please request credentials at least two weeks in advance of the game to permit sufficient time for mailing. Media credentials which cannot be mailed will be left at Media Will Call (Media Entrance) at Gate C of Conte Forum.

Working space in the Alumni Stadium Press Box is allotted on the following basis: (1) daily newspaper writers covering for next-day publication; (2) sports editors of newspapers in New England; (3) radio personnel for broadcast originations; (4) official school student daily newspaper; (5) approved special coverage; (6) press and TV working photographers; (7) weekly press representatives; non-originating radio representatives of AM news stations; and Internet writers for sites affiliated with established, nationally-recognized media outlets will be considered on a game-by-

game basis as space permits. Visiting freelance and amateur photographers are not eligible for media credentials. Sideline photographers and media members must follow NCAA guidelines, which prohibit entry to the bench areas.

PARKING

Media parking is located in the Commonwealth Avenue parking garage. Use the St. Ignatius Gate on lower campus at Campanella Way to access the Commonwealth Avenue parking garage. You should request your parking at the same time you request your game credential. If time permits, both will be mailed to you. There is no day-of-game media parking list and therefore members of the media must have a media parking credential in advance of the game.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

Complete NCAA statistics, play-by-play, and quote sheets from both teams are all regular services on gameday. Upon your arrival, you will receive a press folder with a game program, flip card, updated stats and game day notes. The press box has wireless Internet access. Login information will be provided on gamedays.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS

Steve Addazio and players, following the designated cooling off period, will be made available after each game to members of the media. Addazio's press conference will take place in the Barber Room of the Yawkey Center, which is located opposite the playing field from the press box.

With approximately five minutes remaining in the game, members of the media will be escorted across the field towards the Yawkey Center.

Boston College's locker room is closed to the media. Select players will be made available in the Barber Room following Addazio's press conference. The visiting team's press conference will be held in the Conte Forum Media Center. A member of the Boston College Athletic Communications office will escort the visiting media to the Conte Forum Media Center.

Boston College, Head Coach

Steve Addazio was named Boston College's 35th head football coach in December of 2012 and wasted no time making his mark on the program. Addazio took over an Eagles program that had suffered back-to-back losing seasons for the first time in 14 years (including a 2-10 mark in 2012) and engineered a remarkable turnaround. In what were supposed to be rebuilding years, Addazio led the Eagles to back-to-back seven-win seasons and two consecutive bowl games.

Addazio is the first coach in Boston College history to lead the Eagles to four bowls in the first five seasons as head coach after guiding BC to the New Era Pinstripe Bowl in 2017.

Boston College finished the regular season winning five of its last seven games as the Eagles closed out a 7-6 season and 4-4 mark in the ACC. BC was one of 21 teams nationally - and just one of 13 teams from Power Five conferences - to win at least five of the final six games of the regular season. Only Clemson (6-0) and Boston College (5-1) won at least five of their last six in the regular season among ACC schools.

Boston College had the seventh-most improved scoring offense among Power 5 teams nationally. The Eagles featured ACC Rookie of the Year AJ Dillon, the nation's second-leading rusher among freshmen and the country's No. 7 overall rusher with 1,589 yards and 14 touchdowns.

BC tied a school record with nine players earning All-ACC football honors in 2017. True freshman running back AJ Dillon was named first team All-ACC and tied with Louisville quarterback Lamar Jackson for most votes among the all-conference teams. Dillon was the first true freshman running back to be named first team All-ACC since T.A. McLendon of NC State in 2002. He was also the first BC true freshman to collect first team All-ACC accolades since linebacker Luke Kuechly in 2009.

In addition to Dillon, junior free safety Lukas Denis and junior offensive tackle Chris Lindstrom earned second team All-ACC honors, senior defensive end Harold Landry, senior linebacker Ty Schwab, junior tight end Tommy Sweeney and junior specialist Michael Walker collected third team All-ACC accolades while junior defensive end Zach Allen and junior offensive guard Sam Schmal were name All-ACC honorable mention.

Three Eagles earned All-America honors following the year, including Walter Camp All-America defensive back Lukas Denis and Freshmen All-Americans AJ Dillon and offensive lineman Ben Petrucci.

In the 2018 NFL Draft, three BC players were selected in defensive end Harold Landry (second round, Ten-

nessee Titans), cornerback Isaac Yiadom (third round, Denver Broncos) and cornerback Kamrin Moore (sixth round, New Orleans Saints). It marked the fifth consecutive year under Addazio that at least two Eagles were selected in the NFL Draft. In all, 14 players who have played for Addazio at Boston College have heard their names called at the NFL Draft.

In 2016, Boston College ranked as one of the nation's top defenses the entire season. The Eagles ranked on eight top-10 lists nationally, including ninth in total defense (314.2 yards/game), second in sacks (3.62 sacks/game) and 10th in turnovers gained (27).

During the 2013 season, running back Andre Williams led the nation in rushing, earned the Doak Walker Award as the nation's premier running back and took a trip to New York as one of six finalists for the Heisman Trophy. Williams, a consensus All-America selection, finished the season ranked fifth among all FBS running backs in the history of college football in single-season rushing yards with 2,177.

In 2014, the Eagles were picked by media to finish fifth in the ACC's Atlantic Division but surprised many by posting a second consecutive seven-win season and, in fact, falling a few yards and several plays short of finishing with a 10-2 mark. The season was highlighted by a prime-time upset of No. 9 USC, dominating the Trojans 506-337 in total offense, and a nail biter in which the Eagles had a chance to upend undefeated Florida State in Tallahassee, a game FSU won by a last-second field goal after the Eagles had missed the go-ahead kick just minutes before.

Addazio's coaching pedigree includes 16 postseason bowl games (including six BCS bowl games) and two national titles while on the coaching staff at the University of Florida (a 41-14 win over Ohio State on Jan. 8, 2007 in Glendale, Ariz., and a 24-14 win over Oklahoma on Jan. 8, 2009 in Miami, Fla.).

Prior to his arrival in Chestnut Hill, Addazio led the Temple University Owls in a two-year period of success, transition and growth. Addazio coached the Owls to a nine-win campaign and a bowl victory for the first time in 32 seasons in his first year as head coach.

Prior to leading the Owls, Addazio spent six seasons (2005-10) at Florida under head coach Urban Meyer, serving as offensive coordinator in 2009-10 and interim head coach from Dec. 2009 to July 2010. During his tenure in Gainesville, the Gators participated in six postseason bowls and won two BCS national championships.

Born June 1, 1959, Addazio is married to the former Kathleen Donoghue. They have three children - Nicole, Jessica and Louie.

• Boston College was one of 21 teams nationally - and just one of 13 teams from Power Five conferences - to win at least five of the final six games of the regular season.

• Boston College was just one of two bowl teams nationally to play 10 teams who qualified for a bowl in 2017.

• Only Clemson (6-0) and Boston College (5-1) won at least five of their last six in the regular season among ACC schools.

• Head coach Steve Addazio has led the Eagles to four bowls in his first five years, the first head coach in BC history to do so.

• The Eagles return ACC Rookie of the Year AJ Dillon, the nation's second-leading rusher among freshmen and the country's No. 7 overall rusher with 1,589 yards and 14 touchdowns.

• Dillon was BC's first ACC Rookie of the Year. He had 1,099 rushing yards over the last six regular season games, the most of any player in the country.

• Dillon's 1,589 rushing yards were the second-most by any ACC freshman in conference history.

• Dillon tied for the most All-ACC votes with reigning Heisman Trophy winner Lamar Jackson. Dillon had four games of 190+ yards of rushing in 2017.

• Boston College had nine players earn All-ACC honors, tied for the most in school history. Seven of the nine All-ACC selections return in 2018.

• Over the last six regular season games, BC averaged 36 points per game and outscored the opposition by 19 points per contest including wins over Florida

State (35-3), at Louisville (45-42) and at Virginia (41-10).

• Boston College was third nationally in pass efficiency defense in 2017.

• Boston College was 12th nationally in interceptions (18) in 2017.

• BC scored 35+ points in three consecutive games for the first time since 2002.

• BC scored 40+ points in consecutive conference games once in school history in the BIG EAST and ACC (this season).

• 500+ yards of total offense in consecutive games against Louisville and Virginia was also a first in ACC history for BC.

• Boston College's rushing offense was the most improved unit of any Power 5 school in yards per carry (96th to 25th).

• Boston College was 12th nationally and was second in the ACC in sacks allowed in 2017.

• Boston College was 18th nationally in total plays in 2017. In 2016, the Eagles ranked 94th nationally in total plays.

• Lukas Denis was tied for second nationally with seven interceptions in 2017.

Dillon Named ACC Preseason Player of the Year

• Sophomore running back AJ Dillon returns as the ACC Preseason Player of the Year after a record-setting freshman campaign in 2017.

• Dillon's 1,589 yards rushing last season were the second-most by any freshman in ACC history. The New London, Connecticut, native ranked second nationally among all freshmen in rushing in 2017 and seventh among all players. Dillon set the Boston College freshman rushing record while posting the fourth-highest single-season total in school history.

• Dillon received 45 votes in this year's ACC Preseason Player of the Year balloting to edge Clemson defensive tackle Christian Wilkins by three votes. NC State quarterback Ryan Finley placed third with 37 votes, and Florida State running back Cam Akers followed with 13.

Second in ACC History

• AJ Dillon became the 12th freshman in ACC history to run for 1,000 yards in a season after his 196-yard performance against No. 23 NC State on Nov. 11, 2017. He finished 2017 second in ACC history with 1,589 rushing yards by a freshman.

• Dillon has seven career 100-yard games, including two games of 200+ rushing yards.

Look Out for Lukas

- Lukas Denis made a flawless transition from cornerback to free safety in 2017. The Everett native tied for second nationally with seven interceptions last year.
- He is the only player in the country over the last decade to total at least 80 tackles, seven interceptions, 10 pass breakups and two forced fumbles in a single-season.
- Denis ended the season earning Walter Camp Football Foundation Second-Team All-America honors and was an All-ACC selection for the first time in his career.
- Denis also tied for 12th nationally with 17 passes defended in 2017.

The Nation's Most Complete Defensive Lineman

- Boston College defensive end Zach Allen has quietly become the most complete defensive lineman in the nation.
- Allen, a Preseason All-America selection, was one of two defensive linemen nationally in 2017 that recorded 100 or more tackles.
- An All-ACC honorable mention pick last year, Allen finished the season with 100 tackles, 15.5 tackles-for-loss and 6.0 sacks. The 15.5 TFLs ranked Allen in the top-10 in BC single-season history.
- Allen recorded a career-high 14 tackles, leading all players, in the Oct. 7, 2017 game against No. 16 Virginia Tech. He notched a career-high three tackles for loss and one sack on the night. He was named the ACC Defensive Lineman of the Week for his efforts in the Virginia Tech game.

All-ACC Linebacker Returns

- Connor Strachan collected All-ACC honorable mention honors in 2016 and returns as one of the top defensive players in the nation in 2018. Strachan's 2017 season was cut short due to a knee injury and he earned a medical redshirt.
- Strachan earned All-ACC honors for the first time after he led the Eagles with 80 tackles in 2016. Appearing in 12 games including 12 starts, Strachan was third on the team with 11.0 tackles-for-loss and led the Eagles with four fumble recoveries. The four fumbles recovered ranked second nationally.

What Can Brown Do for You?

- Anthony Brown had his best performance of his young career in the Oct. 21, 2017 win at Virginia. The New Jersey native finished 19-of-24 passing for 275 yards and three touchdowns.
- Brown was named ACC Rookie of the Week for the first time in his career following the UVA victory and also was one of eight quarterbacks nationally recognized by The Manning Award as its "Stars of the Week."
- Brown established new career-highs in passing yards and passing touchdowns in the victory.
- He was the first Boston College player with three passing touchdowns and zero interceptions in a conference game since Quinton Porter in 2003 in the 41-10 victory at UVA.
- It marked the second-best single-game passer rating by a BC quarterback since 1996.
- Brown was the second freshman in BC history to start a season opener under center in the Sept. 1, 2017 win

at Northern Illinois. He is the only freshman quarterback in school history who started to win a season opener on the road.

- Brown was 26-for-42 with 191 passing yards and two touchdowns in the NIU win. He threw one interception.

Defending the Pass

- Boston College is tied for 12th nationally with 18 interceptions last season.
- Opponents had a tough time completing passes against the BC pass defense last season. The Eagles ranked third nationally in passing efficiency defense as opponents finished with a 101.8 pass efficiency rate. BC led the ACC in passing efficiency defense in 2017.

Watch Out for Walker

- Michael Walker was all over the field for the Eagles in 2017. The Naples, Fla., native led the nation in combined kick returns with 1203 yards in 2017.
- In punt returns, Walker was fourth nationally with 354 punt return yards in 2017.
- Against Central Michigan last year, Walker registered 128 punt return yards - including 124 in the first half - the fourth-best single-game total in BC history. It was the most punt return yards in a game since Ed Rideout finished with 131 punt return yards against Holy Cross in 1970. He finished the game with 135 all-purpose yards.

Dillon's 272 yards vs. Louisville on Oct. 14 were the most of any player in the nation that week and his 200 yards Nov. 18 vs. UConn also led the country.

Last Time vs. UMass (Sept. 10, 2016)

- Graduate QB Patrick Towles threw his first two career touchdowns in a Boston College uniform as the Eagles captured a 26-7 win over UMass at Gillette Stadium. He was 12-for-22 on the day with 191 passing yards with one interception. He added 66 yards on the ground to lead the Eagles.
- Sophomore WR Jeff Smith caught his first career touchdowns, a 46-yarder and a 36-yarder, on back-to-back offensive plays in the second quarter to give the Eagles the lead. He finished the day with five catches for 98 yards.
- Junior LB Connor Strachan anchored the Eagles' defense with six tackles (tied for the third on team), in-

The Millis, Mass., native is the first Eagle to be named captain in two consecutive years since Mike McLaughlin in 2008 and 2009.
