BC OPENS BRIGHTON WITH A MARATHON

- The Boston College baseball team played its first-ever game in its new Brighton ballpark on Tuesday, falling after 18 innings to crosstown rival Northeastern, 7-4.
- The game started at 2:30 p.m. but lasted just under five and a half hours, allowing the lights to come on for the first time in BC history.
- It marked the second-longest game in BC history, next to only the 25-inning contest against Texas in the 2009 Austin Regional that set the NCAA record (Texas won, 3-2).
- The Eagles are looking to turn things around against the Hokies as they are on a three-game losing streak, tying for longest of 2018.
- After opening the series at No. 21 Virginia with a 6-2 victory, BC dropped the next two games to the Cavaliers.
- Junior RHP Jacob Stevens allowed just one run and one walk over six innings, while striking out five on Friday.
- On Sunday, the Eagles rallied to tie it in the ninth but lost their first extra-innings game of the year. Junior C Gian Martellini hit a two-run homer in the top of the 10th, but the Cavs scored three to collect the series victory.
- Sophomore OF Dante Baldelli extended his career-long hit streak to six games on Tuesday while freshman OF Chris Galland stole two more bases to lead the ACC with 13.
- Senior INF **Jake Palomaki** is third in the league with a .432 batting clip while Galland is fourth (.429).

EAGLES HOSTS THE HOKIES

- The Eagles host the Hokies for the first ACC contest in Brighton.
- The longtime series dates back to the two teams' days in the BIG EAST. The Hokies have a 24-17 advantage after sweeping last year's series in Blacksburg.
- Since joining the ACC in 2006, the Eagles are 11-17 against the Hokies, although the 2008 victory was a nonconference matchup.
- When the Eagles joined the conference, they won the first two series and three of the first four against the Hokies.
- BC even won the first four meetings against VT and six of the first seven contests. Tech then rattled off six straight
- The Hokies have won four of the last five series meetings, sweeping three of them.
- The last time Tech came to The Heights, BC took two of three to earn a series win. After dropping the Friday game, the Eagles rallied to win the next two.
- The Hokies collected a sweep at English Field in last year's meeting. BC scored a run in the top of the ninth to break a 2-2 tie, but VT matched it in the bottom of the frame and Jack Owens walked off in the 10th.
- In four games, junior UT **Jake Alu** is batting .600 against the Hokies with two RBIs while senior INF Jake Palomaki has five runs, five hits and three walks in six games.

EAGLES OF NOTE

- Senior INF **Jake Palomaki** is third in the ACC with a .432 batting average, which ranks 19th in the nation. His ninegame hit streak (March 2-16) was the longest of the season for BC and he has reached base in the last 13 games. His 35 hits are tied for second in the league while his 10 doubles are tied for first and 10th nationally. His .500 on-base percentage is tied second in the ACC and his 1.94 hits/game is sixth in the nation.
- Palomaki's 128 career walks is first in BC record books, topping the list in three years. He has reached base safely 322 times in his BC career, fourth all-time. His .436 career on-base percentage is tied for fourth, the 49 career stolen bases is tied for second and his 129 runs scored is ninth.
- Freshman OF Chris Galland is right behind Palomaki with the fourth-best batting average in the ACC with a .429 clip. That is 21st in the nation. He is perfect on the stolen-base path, stealing 13 bases, which leads the league and his tied for ninth in the country. His .484 on-base percentage is fifth in the ACC while his .589 slugging percentage is 10th. He recorded a seven-game hit streak from Feb. 25 to March 7 that included 11 hits, 11 runs, eight RBIs, four doubles and seven stolen bases.
- Senior RHP Brian Rapp has hit double-digit strikeouts twice this season. He threw six no-hit innings with a career-high 10 strikeouts at Santa Clara (Feb. 18), walking just one and hitting one for the only two base runners. The performance earned him ACC Pitcher of the Week. He then logged 10 Ks against Army (March 4) in a 5.1-inning start. With 24 strikeouts so far in 2018, he is tied for seventh in the ACC. In the second game of the doubleheader at No. 22 NC State (March 10), he struck out eight over seven innings, allowing just two singles, including one that did not leave the infield.
- Junior RHP Jacob Stevens has two starts without allowing a run: the season-opening win at Santa Clara (Feb. 16) where he threw five and struck out eight and the victory over Niagara (March 2), when he allowed just one hit and struck out nine over seven innings. He pitched his first career complete game, an eight-ininng start at No. 22 NC State on March 9, striking out eight in a 2-1 loss. The only runs surrendered were on a two-out, two-run home run in a 107-pitch performance. In the win at No. 21 Virginia (March 16), he allowed just one run and one walk over six innings, striking out five.
- Stevens' 3.70 career ERA is ninth in BC record books and his 175 career Ks are 10th all-time.
- Sophomore INF Brian Dempsey hit his stride in the second half of 2017 and let it continue in 2018. He logged at
 least one hit in 14 of the final 20 games played, including a career-long, six-game hit streak. He has a hit in 13 of
 the Eagles' 18 games this season, now tallying at least one in 27 of the last 28 games played. He also reached base
 safely in the 17 of the 18 games. His .371 batting average is fifth in the ACC.
- Junior RHP Sean Hughes leads the BC bullpen with a 0.90 ERA. In nine appearances, he has struck out 11 with just one earned run and seven hits.
- Sophomore UT Jack Cunningham has a hit in 14 of the Eagles' first 18 games and recorded a career-long, sevengame hit streak (Feb. 25-March 9). He notched a career-high three RBIs at NC State on March 10.
- Sophomore OF **Dante Baldelli** is riding a career-high, six-game hit streak that began on March 10. He has recorded 12 hits, three RBIs, three runs, six walks and five stolen bases in that span.

BIRDBALL CONNECTIONS

- Boston College head coach Mike Gambino was an assistant coach at Virginia Tech for four years (2007-10) under then skipper Pete Hughes. Hughes was the Eagles' helm from 1999 to 2006.
- While John Szefc is in his first year at the helm of the Hokies, he is in no stranger to the Eagles. He coached Maryland from 2013-17, including Maryland's final two seasons in the ACC.
- Gambino is 4-2 against Szefc from when both teams were in the ACC. The Eagles swept the Terps in 2014.
- The connection between the coaching staff goes a little deeper as Gambino, Szefc and associate head coach Alex
 Trezza are all from the same area in New York. Both Trezza and Szefc hail from Middletown, N.Y.. while Gambino is
 from Garrison, N.Y., just 35 miles away.
- While Szefc was an assistant coach at Sacred Heart in 1995, he recruited Gambino, then a high school senior.

ROAD WARRIORS

- Boston College traveled almost 13,000 miles before opening the new Brighton Baseball Field in Brighton, Mass., as
 the Eagles played the first 17 games on the road before returning to The Heights.
- The Eagles' first scheduled home game was slated for March 13 but Massachusetts was hit with a Nor'easter, posting the game against Holy Cross. BC will open a newly constructed facility against Northeastern on March 20.
- BC started the 2018 journey in California with a three-game series at Santa Clara.
- The Eagles' second weekend began with an exhibition game against the Boston Red Sox at JetBlue Park Fenway South in Fort Myers, Fla. It was the 27th meeting between the two Boston teams.
- Before returning home, BC played three Big Ten teams in Port Charlotte at the Snowbird Classic. It was the Eagles'
 fifth time at the annual invitational, where they are 15-8 all-time.
- BC is spending its spring break in North Carolina, as it started at the USA Baseball Complex in Cary, N.C. The final
 game was against host Army, where former associate head coach Jim Foster is in his second year at the helm and
 former volunteer assistant coach John Murphy is a first-year assistant.
- The Eagles faced another familiar face former assistant Scott Friedholm in a midweek game at UNC Asheville.
 Friedholm has led the Bulldog since leaving Chestnut Hill after the 2014 season. BC then took on Wofford at Fluor Field, home of the Greenville Drive, a Red Sox affiliate.
- BC opened conference play at NC State. They have won five of the last nine meeting between the two teams in Raleigh. With the true home opener moved due to snow, the Eagles traveled to Charlottesville, Va. for a meeting with Virginia.
- The first game at home on the new Brighton Baseball Field was one to remember as BC and Northeastern played 18 innings on March 20, 2018 in the first-ever game in Brighton. The Huskies won, 7-4.

WELCOME TO A NEW HOME

- Boston College opened the Brighton Baseball Field, part of the Brighton Campus Complex, on March 20 in a game against Northeastern.
- The Eagles and Huskies ended up playing an 18-inning marathon in which NU won, 7-4. The game started at 2:30 p.m. but ended 5:24 later, allowing the lights to come on for the first time in a home game at BC.
- Construction began in the summer of 2017 as the Eagles closed out Eddie Pellagrini Diamond at Commander Shea Field with seven straight wins, including a series sweep of Notre Dame to make the ACC Tournament.
- The new field is equipped with AstroTurf Diamond Series to allow the Eagles to play in harsh New England weather
 and Musco LED lights to allow night games and are in compliance with NCAA Regional broadcast standards.
- The new ballpark includes 1,000 seat-back chairs with capacity for 2,500, batting cages, heated dugouts equipped
 with restrooms, bullpens with three pitching mounds (two turf, one dirt), a Daktronic standard scoreboard, video
 replay capabilities and a press box.
- The facility meets the ESPN and ACC Network standard for broadcast capabilities, and for the first time, BC's home
 games will be streamed.
- The complex, which includes Brighton Softball Field, includes 750 parking spaces, full service restrooms, ADA accessibility and concessions. It will be free general admission for both BC baseball and softball games.

BC BATS COME ALIVE

- The Eagles are seventh in the ACC with a .276 batting average.
- The Eagles have logged at least 10 hits in 11 games in 2018, including seven of the last eight games.
- They have also recorded 10 or more runs four times this season and logged seven runs in a single inning four times.
- They are tied for fifth in the league in doubles (36) and second with 35 stolen bases.
- Senior INF Jake Palomaki and freshman OF Chris Galland rank 10 times on ACC's top 10 offensive lists.

MAK AT THE PLATE

- Senior INF Jake Palomaki leads BC with a .432 batting average, which is third in the ACC and 19th in the nation.
- His nine-game hit streak was the longest for BC this season. From March 2 to March 16, he racked up 21 hits, 10 runs, eight RBIs, four walks and five stolen bases.
- In the 18 games this season, Palomaki has tallied a hit in all but four of them. He has 11 multiple-hit games and six multiple-RBI games, both of which lead the team.
- In the ACC, the Kennesaw, Ga., native is tied for first with 10 doubles, tied for second with 35 hits and a .500 onbase percentage, tied for sixth with 50 total bases, ranks seventh with a .617 slugging percentage and is tied for seventh with eight stolen bases.
- He is tied for 10th in the country for his doubles total and ranks sixth for recorded 1.94 hits/game.
- Palomaki broke the Boston College all-time walks record in just three years and he continues to add to the total, which is currently 128. His 46 walks in 2015 ranks first on the single-season list, 42 in 2016 is second and his 31 in 2017 tied for 10th.
- He has reached base safely 322 times in his BC career, fourth all-time. His .436 career on-base percentage is tied
 for fourth, the 49 career stolen bases is tied for second, his 18 sacrifice hits is tied for eighth and his 129 runs
 scored rank ninth.
- Palomaki along with junior UT Jake Alu tallied two hits in the same inning this season, a feat that had not been
 accomplished in over two years. Palomaki singled to start the game and had an RBI base hit in the first against
 Wofford (March 7). Three Eagles completed the feat in the win over Maine on May 12, 2015.

GET READY FOR GALLAND

- Freshman OF Chris Galland at one point led the nation with his batting average. He is now fourth ACC and 21st in
 the country with in a .429 clip.
- In his first 44 plate appearances, he only struck out twice.
- In the 14 games he has recorded at bats, he has tallied a hit in 13 of the them.



- He is 13-for-13 on the stolen-base path, leading ACC for his stolen base total. He is tied for ninth in the country and his 0.76 stolen bases/game ranks fourth nationally.
- He has stolen multiple bases four times and his three swipes against Niagara on March 2 was the first multiplesteal game for BC in 2018. It was the first time an Eagle stole three since March 5, 2017 (Jake Alu vs. Villanova).

• His .484 on-base percentage ranks fifth in the ACC while his .589 slugging percentage is 10th.

- He recorded a seven-game hit streak from Feb. 25 to March 7 that included 11 hits, 11 runs, eight RBIs, four doubles and seven stolen bases.
- He hit back-to-back RBI triples in the doubleheader at No. 22 NC State on March 10.

EYES ON GIAN

 Junior C Gian Martellini was named to the Johnny Bench Award Watch List, the Greater Wichita Area Sports Commission announced. The watch list is made up of 97 catchers nominated by coaches around NCAA baseball.

The award is given annually to the top Division I collegiate catcher.

Martellini leads the ACC with eight runners caught stealing. He has also picked off one also been part of two
double plays. He has made one error in 157 chances for a .994 fielding percentage behind the plate.

In 18 games, he has recorded 14 hits, including two doubles and three home runs, nine runs and 17 RBIs.

• He has driven in 11 runs in the last six games.

• The watch list will be narrowed down to the semifinalists, announced on May 16 and the finalists will be announced on June 4. The winner will be announced at the 21st Annual Greater Wichita Sports Banquet on June 28.

LAST TIME OUT VS. VIRGINIA TECH

In 2017, the Hokies swept the series in Blacksburg.

VT won the first game, 16-4, on March 31. With the game tied at three in the fifth, the Hokies scored two in the
bottom of the inning and chased current junior RHP Jacob Stevens from the game. Virginia Tech added seven runs
off three different BC pitchers in sixth to take a commanding lead.

The second game came down to a 10-6 decision on April 1. Tech jumped out to an early, 3-0 lead and each time
the Eagles got within one, the Hokies were able to pull away. They scored seven runs on four homers in the game.
Current junior UT Jake Alu led the way for the Eagles on offense, going 3-for-5 while junior C Gian Martellini hit
his a home run in the ninth.

• The third game came down to the wire as the teams were tied at two until the Eagles scored one in the ninth. VT matched it and then walked off with a 4-3 victory in the 10th. VT's Ryan Tufts doubled off RHP Donovan Casey to tie the game. In the 10th, the Hokies loaded the bases with two outs and Jack Owens hit a single for the walk-off win. Current senior RHP Brian Rapp threw seven innings with eight Ks in his start. He allowed five hits, two walks and two runs. After giving up two hits in the first inning he did not allow another until the sixth. Alu led the Eagles again with a 2-for-3 day.

The Frates family presented the Hall of Fame a rare signed Pete Frates baseball, autographed before his ALS
diagnosis. It was announced that the Hall would be adding an exhibit, "ALS and Baseball," the story of Frates and
hall of famers Lou Gehrig and Catfish Hunter, both of whom passed away from the disease.

• Frates' parents, Sherman and head baseball coach Mike Gambino participated in a panel discussion to talk about the former BC ballplayer's life, the ALS ice Bucket Challenge, which changed the course of the disease, and the

progress that has been made since that August 2014.

The BC players had the chance to view rare baseball artifacts that were specifically tied to ALS, including Gehrig's
bat. The final stop in the Hall was Frates' own. In June, the bucket and sunglasses he used in his own Ice Bucket

- Lassiter was a career .324 hitter for the Tar Heels. He earned his bachelor's degree in interpersonal communications in 2017.

2018 CAPTAINS

- Seniors LHP Carmen Giampetruzzi and INF Jake Palomaki were voted the 2018 captains by the BC baseball team.
- "I am extremely excited to have Carmen and Jake lead this team as captains," Gambino said. "Leaders possess integrity, character and commitment and these two showcase that on a daily basis. Our junior and senior classes are filled with great people and ball players. We had a great fall because of the leadership on this team."

DRAFTED BIRDS

- Three Boston College baseball players were drafted in the 2017 MLB First-Year Players Draft.
- Nineteen players have been drafted under eight-year head coach Mike Gambino, including two in the first round (Justin Dunn, 19th overall - 2016; Chris Shaw, 31st overall - 2015).
- OF **Donovan Casey** was selected in the 20th round by the LA Dodgers. The 610th overall pick, Casey recorded a .287 batting average, 150 hits, 54 RBIs and 22 stolen bases in three years at The Heights. He also tallied a 2.41 ERA in 33 appearances with 37 strikeouts and opponents hit under .200 against him. The Stratford, N.J., native has six career saves, tying for ninth all-time while his five saves in 2017 tied for eighth. He hit for the cycle in 2017, becoming the first BC player to do so since 2013. He earned 2017 New England Intercollegiate Baseball Association (NEIBA) All-New England Second-Team honors.
- INF Johnny Adams was taken in the 22nd round by the Seattle Mariners. The Walpole, Mass., native was the 663rd overall pick. He was a career .243 hitter with 100 runs, 169 hits, 79 RBIs and 28 stolen bases in his four-year career. A mainstay at shortstop, he compiled a .961 career fielding percentage, making just 34 errors in 835 chances. He was the first two-time recipient of the No. 8 jersey after he was the first junior selected in 2016. He started his senior season by being voted a team captain by his teammates and ended it by earning BC's Unsung Hero Award as the male recipient. Adams ranked on 10 different BC record lists. He was named to the 2016 Oxford All-Regional Team and earned Most Outstanding Player.
- Junior RHP Jacob Stevens was drafted in the 33rd round by the New York Yankees but chose to return to BC. The 992nd overall pick, he is currently ninth in BC's record book with a 3.89 career ERA. In 31 appearances, the Darien, Conn., native has a 9-11 record for the Eagles with 143 career strikeouts. He earned Freshman All-American second-team honors from Dlbaseball and Baseball America, picked up ACC All-Freshman Team accolades and was named the New England Intercollegiate Baseball Association (NEIBA) Rookie of the Year. The 33rd-round selection was the second for Stevens, as he was also taken in the 33rd round coming out of Choate Rosemary Hall in 2015 by the Philadelphia Phillies.



Mike Gambino, a 1999 Boston College graduate, was named head baseball coach on July 19, 2010. He brought the Eagles to the program's first NCAA Tournament in seven years in 2016 and back-to-back Atlantic Coast Conference Championship appearances.

Gambino guided the 2016 Eagles to 35 overall wins, the most since 2005, tying for the second most in program history. They also tallied 13 ACC wins, the most since 2010, while their six conference series victories set a school record. BC swept the Oxford Regional as the three seed to advance to the program's first-ever Super Regional and move on for the first time in 49 years. BC also earned national ranking for the first time in school history, ending the season in the top 25 in all four major polls (15th - D1Baseball, 16th - Baseball America, NCBWA and 21st - USA Today/Coaches Poll).

For his efforts, Gambino was named the American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA) Northeast Region Coach of the Year, was a D1Baseball finalist for Coach of the Year and earned a spot on the website's top-10 coaching performances of the season.

Gambino saw Justin Dunn garner All-America third-team honors, the first pitcher to do so since 2009, and newcomer Jacob Stevens collect freshman All-America honors from two media outlets, the first BC honoree since 2002. Stevens picked up New England Intercollegiate Baseball Association (NEIBA) Freshman of the Year accolades and All-ACC Freshman team honors, while Dun was named to the All-ACC Third Team and four players were named to the NEIBA All-New England team.

The 2016 Eagles ranked in the top five on 13 school record lists, including setting the program record for walks (240), tying the record for saves (14), and ranking second in opponent batting average (.245). Ten Eagles ranked on 26 of BC's career top-10 lists while eight Eagles found themselves 17 times on single-season, top-10 lists.

In 2017, the Eagles returned to the ACC Championship, the first time they went to the conference tournament in back-to-back years since 2009-10. BC accomplished the feat by winning 10 of its last 15 ACC games with sweeps over Notre Dame and NC State. Two players - Donovan Casey (second team) and Jake Alu (third team) - earned All-New England status.

The '17 Eagles ranked fourth in BC record books for their .975 fielding percentage and fifth all-time with 76 stolen bases. Jake Palomaki broke BC's career walks record and ranked on two other career record lists while Jacob Stevens is ranked ninth for career ERA. Johnny Adams earned a spot on five career top-10 lists, Michael Strem on eight and Casey tied for ninth for career saves. Overall, Eagles ranked on 13 single-season lists in BC history in 2017.

The Eagles' 10 stolen bases against Villanova (March 5) was the standard for the ACC in 2017 and their four double plays turned (at Florida State, March 10) and 54 total bases (vs. Notre Dame, May 19) tied for the league's season highs. The 76 stolen bases were second in the conference and 39th in the nation. BC's fielding percentage (.975) was fifth in the league while its 46 double plays turned tied for fourth.

In 2016 and 2015, Gambino mentored two first-round draft picks: Dunn, taken 19th overall by the New York Mets in 2016, and Chris Shaw, taken 31st overall by the San Francisco Giants. It was the first time in program history the Eagles saw back-to-back first rounders. BC was also one of five programs to have first-round selections both years.

The 2016 season saw five baseball players drafted - Dunn, Michael King (12th round), Jesse Adams (14th round), Nick Sciortino (19th round) and Joe Cronin (34th round). In 2017, Gambino saw Casey (20th round) and Adams (22nd round) leave The Heights for the MLB.

In 2015, Gambino logged his 100th career win as a head coach in the final game of the season with a walk-off, 10th-inning victory against No. 24 Notre Dame. The Eagles ranked in the top five on six school record lists, including the second-fewest walks [231], the third-best fielding percentage (.976) and the pitching staff recording the fourth-most strikeouts (433). BC also ranked sixth on the year in the ACC in stolen bases (63) and doubles per game (1.78), fifth for stolen bases per game (1.17) and walks per game (4.28) and second in fielding percentage.

Four players from the 2015 team were drafted in the MLB First-Year Players Draft, including Shaw, the first

BC first-rounder since 2009. John Gorman (31st round), Jeff Burke (32nd round) and Blake Butera (35th round) were also taken. Four Eagles earned New England Intercollegiate Baseball Association (NEIBA) All-New England accolades while Gorman was named to the ACC All-Academic Team and Shaw collected All-ACC Second-Team, Perfect Game USA All-American Third-Team and American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA) All-Northeast First-Team honors.

The Eagles went 17-33 in Gambino's first season at the helm, but he saw four players get selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft. In 2011, the Eagles improved to 20-33, winning 10 games in the highly-competitive ACC. In just one year, the team's batting average improved 19 points, slugging percentage 54 points and on-base percentage 27 points.

In his second year, Gambino saw infielder Anthony Melchionda and outfielder Tom Bourdon earn All-ACC second-team honors and take home ABCA All-Northeast Region and NEIBA All-Star accolades. Melchionda and classmate Matt Brazis were both drafted in the 2012 MLB Draft.

A young team in 2013, the Eagles regularly started five freshmen, and Gambino worked to improve through the year. The overall batting average, on-base percentage and slugging percentage all rose significantly from the first half of the season to the second and the Eagles doubled their win total.

In his fourth year at The Heights, Gambino saw the more improvement, recording 22 wins with 10 in conference. Shaw earned First-Team All-ACC and ABCA honors while pitcher Andrew Chin was drafted in the 15th round.

Since taking over at the Heights, Gambino has stressed off the field success as well, raising the team's GPA as a whole. Eagles have earned seven spots on the All-ACC Academic baseball team and 58 on the ACC Academic Honor Roll.

Gambino, who was an assistant coach for the Eagles from 2003-05, came from Virginia Tech where he spent four seasons as an assistant coach under former BC head coach, Pete Hughes. He served as the Hokies' recruiting coordinator and also worked with the hitters and infielders. In his four years, he saw 15 players get drafted in the MLB Draft, including nine in 2010. From 1997 through 2006, only 13 Hokies were drafted in total.

Virginia Tech's batting average improved 40 points under Gambino's direction since the 2006 season. With his help, the 2010 Hokies made their first appearance in the NCAA Tournament since 2000 and finished the season ranked No. 20 in the country.

Prior to working in Blacksburg, Gambino spent two years as a regional scout for the Detroit Tigers.

Gambino played for the Eagles from 1997-2000, starting 166 games in the middle infield. He held a career batting average of .313 with 22 doubles, eight homers, 87 RBIs and 117 runs. His 78 hits in 2000, which was No. 1 when he graduated, was tied for fifth, until 2011, when his own player, Bourdon, knocked it down one with 79 hits of his own. Gambino's 52 runs his final year is still tied for eighth.

The Garrison, N.Y., native was a first-team All-Big East, All-New England and All-Northeast region honoree following his senior campaign. He also earned second-team All-New England and Big East Academic Team accolades during his playing career.

Following his career with BC, Gambino played two seasons in the Boston Red Sox minor league system. He spent the 2000 season with the Augusta Green Jackets before splitting the 2001 season between Agusta and the Lowell Spinners. In 2002, the Red Sox hired Gambino as a special assistant to the Major League staff before heading back to Lowell for a coaching role with the Spinners just prior to the June draft. Following his stint in Lowell, the Red Sox sent Gambino to the MLB Scout Development Program.

In January 2003, Gambino returned to Boston College as an assistant coach under Hughes.

Gambino received his bachelor's degree from The Heights in English and theology. He currently lives in Needham, Mass., with his wife, Jill, and their children, Sonny and Callahan.
