The Game

- Boston College hits the road for the first time this season as the Eagles head south to New Jersey to face Rutgers at SHI Stadium.
- Kickoff is set for noon with live coverage on Big Ten Network (BTN). Joe Beninati (play-by-play) and Shaun O'Hara (color) call the game for BTN.
- Coverage on the Boston College Learfield IMG Sports Network begins at 11:30 a.m. with Jon Meterparel, Pete Cronan and Scott Mutryn. Fans can listen to the game locally on WEEI 93.7 FM, nationally on TuneIn and on Sirius channel 113, XM channel 386 and online via SiriusXM channel 970.
- Boston College looks to rebound from its first loss of the season after last Friday's 48-24 setback to Kansas at Alumni Stadium.
- Rutgers (1-1) comes off a bye week after starting the season with a 48-21 win over UMass before losing 30-0 the last time out at Iowa on Sept. 7.
- Saturday's game marks the first visit to Piscataway for Boston College since a 35-25 victory in 2003.

The Series

- Boston College and Rutgers meet for the 27th time in series history Saturday in Piscataway. The Eagles lead the all-time series 19-6-1.
- The two former BIG EAST foes meet for the first time since 2004.
- The series began in 1919 and the two schools have faced each other 26 times in series history. Both schools were conference opponents in the BIG EAST from 1991-2004 before the Eagles joined the ACC in 2005.
- BC has not lost to Rutgers since a 20-13 defeat in 1991, the first BIG EAST conference match-up. The Eagles are unbeaten in their last 13 meetings against Rutgers (12-0-1), including a 10-game win streak.
- The game will be a trip home for 17 Boston College student-athletes who hail from the Garden State, including four starters in quarterback Anthony Brown (Cliffwood, N.J.), tight end Korab Idrizi (Fort Lee, N.J.), offensive lineman Ben Petrula (Freehold, N.J.) and defensive end Marcus Valdez (Perth Amboy, N.J.). Boston College has a total of 10 stu-

dent-athletes on its current two-deep from New Jersey.

- Boston College also has three coaches who are natives of New Jersey. Offensive coordinator Mike Bajakian (River Vale, N.J.), wide receivers coach Rich Gunnell (East Windsor, N.J.) and offensive line coach Phil Trautwein (Voorhees, N.J.) all hail from New Jersey.
- Saturday's game marks the fourth straight year that Boston College has faced a team from the Big Ten. The Eagles defeated Maryland 36-30 in the 2016 Quick Lane Bowl, lost 27-20 to Iowa in the 2017 New Era Pinstripe Bowl and suffered a 30-13 setback last season at Purdue.
- All-time, BC is 38-43-2 against current Big Ten members. The 26 games versus Rutgers mark the most against current Big Ten schools.
- BC is in search of its first win on the road versus a Big Ten opponent since a 27-14 win at No. 25 Penn State on Sept. 6, 2003.

To assist in your coverage throughout the year, please read the media information on this page. Briefly, all interviews must be arranged through the Communications Office at least one day in advance and all student-athletes, coaches and support staff will not take part in an interview unless scheduled by the BC Athletic Communications Office.

STEVE ADDAZIO WEEKLY NEWS CONFERENCE

Steve Addazio's weekly news conference is held at noon Monday of each game week at the Conte Forum Media Suite. Lunch is served immediately following the news conference. The transcript will be sent out and available on bceagles.com later in the day along with live video of the news conference on Twitter via @BCFootball and on Facebook Live via Boston College Athletics.

STUDENT-ATHLETE INTERVIEWS

The first 20 minutes of practice on Tuesday and Wednesday is open to the media. Student-athletes are made available for interviews following the conclusion of practice. The starting quarterback will speak after practice on Tuesday.

An attempt is made for telephone interviews for media outside the Boston area if arranged in advance with the BC Communications office on Tuesdays and Wednesdays.

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

All media credential requests must be submitted via www.sportssystem.com/bostoncollege.

Credentials for Boston College home games are issued to working media only and should be requested as early as possible due to space limitations and demand. Media credentials which cannot be mailed will be left at Media Will Call (Media Entrance) at Gate C of Conte Forum.

1. The Athletics Communication Office will do its best to accommodate legitimate requests for game credentials. Criteria for media credentials vary, as they are dependent on the availability of media seating. Priority seating for any event is as follows: local beat media, opponent beat media, local media, opponent media, national media, state/regional media, professional scouts, recognized Internet media and unaffiliated media. Those members of the media who are credentialed are asked to comply with guidelines set forth by the Football Writers Association of America. There is no cheering allowed in the press box, where there is also a no smoking policy in accordance with University regulations. Violators in both instances will first receive a warning, and upon any repeat violation, will be asked to leave the press facilities.

2. When the press box is not expected to be at capacity, legitimate single-game credential requests will be granted. For those high-volume games, the criteria under No. 3 below are used in processing and approving credential requests.

3. Credentials for home and road football games for local media are dependent on its organization's coverage of the BC football and athletic program (all sports). To qualify for passes, the team must be covered on a regular basis, and media personnel need to make an effort to have a presence at press conferences and practices (when open). Newspapers must provide feature coverage; radio and television stations must occasionally cover practice and attend the weekly luncheon (Mondays).

Media credentials are issued solely to the person identified on it. It may not be

transferred or used by any other person. Acceptance of a media credential requires compliance with all Boston College rules and regulations applicable to the media credential. Any breach or failure to comply with these terms, conditions, rules and/or regulations may result in the cancellation and withdrawal of the media credential, including but not limited to expulsion from the athletics event for which it was issued, and denial of a media credential for any and all future athletics events.

PARKING

Media parking is located in the Commonwealth Avenue parking garage. Use the St. Ignatius Gate on lower campus at Campanella Way to access the Commonwealth Avenue parking garage. You should request your parking at the same time you request your game credential. If time permits, both will be mailed to you. There is no day-of-game media parking list and therefore members of the media must have a media parking credential in advance of the game.

PRESS BOX SERVICES

Complete NCAA statistics, play-by-play, and quote sheets from both teams are all regular services on gameday. Upon your arrival, you will receive a press folder with a game program, flip card, updated stats and game day notes. The press box has wireless Internet access. Login information will be provided on gamedays.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS

Steve Addazio and student-athletes, following the designated cooling off period, will be made available after each game to members of the media. Addazio's press conference will take place in the Barber Room of the Yawkey Center, which is located opposite the playing field from the press box.

With approximately five minutes remaining in the game, members of the media will be escorted across the field towards the Yawkey Center.

Boston College's locker room is closed to the media. Select student-athletes will be made available in the Barber Room following Addazio's press conference. The visiting team's press conference will be held in the Conte Forum Media Center. A member of the Boston College Athletic Communications office will escort the visiting media to the Conte Forum Media Center.

Boston College, Head Coach

Steve Addazio was named Boston College's 35th head football coach in December of 2012 and wasted no time making his mark on the program. The Gregory P. Barber '69 and Family Head Football Coach, Addazio took over an Eagles program that had suffered back-to-back losing seasons for the first time in 14 years (including a 2-10 mark in 2012) and engineered a remarkable turnaround. In what were supposed to be rebuilding years, Addazio led the Eagles to back-to-back seven-win seasons and two consecutive bowl games.

Addazio is the first coach in Boston College history to lead the Eagles to five bowls in the first six seasons as head coach after guiding BC to the SERVPRO First Responder Bowl in 2018.

The 2018 regular season featured a return to the national rankings for the first time since 2008 and the Eagles appeared in the College Football Playoff Top 25 for the first time in school history. Boston College appeared in the AP Top 25 poll four times in the 2018 season, the most appearances in the national rankings for BC since 2007.

National excitement surrounding the Eagles was rampant in 2018 as a school-record 13 players garnered All-ACC honors and ESPN's College GameDay built by the Home Depot returned to the Heights for the matchup between the #22 Eagles and #2 Clemson.

Sophomore running back AJ Dillon collected All-ACC first-team honors for the second consecutive season while senior offensive guard Chris Lindstrom, graduate student tight end Tommy Sweeney and junior cornerback Hamp Cheevers all earned All-ACC first-team accolades for the first time.

Senior defensive lineman Zach Allen and senior return specialist Michael Walker collected All-ACC second-team honors for the first time.

Four Eagles were named to the All-ACC third-team for the first time in their respective careers as senior offensive tackle Aaron Monteiro, senior defensive end Wyatt Ray, graduate student linebacker Connor Strachan, senior defensive tackle Ray Smith and senior strong safety Will Harris were cited.

The Eagles finished the regular season 7-5 overall and 4-4 in the ACC. For the second time in 16 years, BC finished the season with wins over Virginia Tech and Miami.

Four players captured All-America honors (Hamp Cheevers, Chris Lindstrom, Michael Walker and Zach Allen) while BC tied a modern-day record with four players selected in the 2019 NFL Draft (Chris Lindstrom, Zach Allen, Will Harris, Tommy Sweeney). Lindstrom became the 20th first-round pick in school history going 14th overall to the Atlanta Falcons.

Powered by the sixth-highest scoring offense in BC history (120 seasons) at 32.0 points per game in 2018, sophomore QB Anthony Brown's 20 touchdowns were the second-most by any sophomore in BC history (Glenn Foley threw 21 TDs as a sophomore in 1991).

BC opened the 2018 season scoring 40+ points in its first three games, the first time in 120 seasons of football at the Heights that the Eagles scored 40+ in the first three games.

Boston College finished the 2017 regular season win-

ning five of its last seven games as the Eagles closed out a 7-6 season and 4-4 mark in the ACC. BC was one of 21 teams nationally - and just one of 13 teams from Power Five conferences - to win at least five of the final six games of the regular season. Only Clemson (6-0) and Boston College (5-1) won at least five of their last six in the regular season among ACC schools.

Boston College had the seventh-most improved scoring offense among Power 5 teams nationally. The Eagles featured ACC Rookie of the Year AJ Dillon, the nation's second-leading rusher among freshmen and the country's No. 7 overall rusher with 1,589 yards and 14 touchdowns.

BC tied a then school record with nine players earning All-ACC football honors in 2017. True freshman running back AJ Dillon was named first team All-ACC and tied with Louisville quarterback Lamar Jackson for most votes among the all-conference teams. Dillon was the first true freshman running back to be named first team All-ACC since T.A. McLendon of NC State in 2002. He was also the first BC true freshman to collect first team All-ACC accolades since linebacker Luke Kuechly in 2009.

In addition to Dillon, junior free safety Lukas Denis and junior offensive tackle Chris Lindstrom earned second team All-ACC honors, senior defensive end Harold Landry, senior linebacker Ty Schwab, junior tight end Tommy Sweeney and junior specialist Michael Walker collected third team All-ACC accolades while junior defensive end Zach Allen and junior offensive guard Sam Schmal were name All-ACC honorable mention.

Three Eagles earned All-America honors following the year, including Walter Camp All-America defensive back Lukas Denis and Freshmen All-Americans AJ Dillon and offensive lineman Ben Petula.

In the 2018 NFL Draft, three BC players were selected in defensive end Harold Landry (second round, Tennessee Titans), cornerback Isaac Yiadom (third round, Denver Broncos) and cornerback Kamrin Moore (sixth round, New Orleans Saints). It marked the fifth consecutive year under Addazio that at least two Eagles were selected in the NFL Draft. In all, 14 players who have played for Addazio at Boston College have heard their names called at the NFL Draft.

In 2016, Boston College ranked as one of the nation's top defenses. The Eagles ranked on eight top-10 lists nationally, including ninth in total defense (314.2 yards/game), second in sacks (3.62 sacks/game) and 10th in turnovers gained (27).

During the 2013 season, running back Andre Williams led the nation in rushing, earned the Doak Walker Award as the nation's premier running back and took a trip to New York as one of six finalists for the Heisman Trophy. Williams, a consensus All-America selection, finished the season ranked fifth among all FBS running backs in the history of college football in single-season rushing yards with 2,177.

Addazio's coaching pedigree includes 18 postseason bowl games (including six BCS bowl games) and two national titles while on the coaching staff at the University of Florida (a 41-14 win over Ohio State on Jan. 8, 2007 in Glendale, Ariz., and a 24-14 win over Oklahoma on Jan. 8, 2009 in Miami, Fla.).

121st Season of Boston College Football

- The 121st season of Boston College football began with an impressive 35-28 victory over Virginia Tech. All-time, BC is 668-493-37 in 1,198 games according to the NCAA.
- Under head coach Steve Addazio, BC is 16-12 in the month of September, including a 14-6 mark in September home games.
- BC is 35th in NCAA history with 668 victories. The Eagles are one of eight ACC schools ranked in the top 40 all-time in victories.

Touchdown Dillon

- Junior running back AJ Dillon totaled his 17th career game with at least one rushing touchdown Sept. 13 versus Kansas. BC is 12-5 when Dillon rushes for at least one TD.
- Dillon moved into a tie with Andre Williams for third place in Boston College history with his 28th career rushing touchdown for the game's first score against Kansas.

Closer Look at AJ Dillon in the Starting Lineup

- In 22 games since AJ Dillon was named the starter at running back on Oct. 14, 2017 at Louisville, Boston College is 14-8 overall and has averaged:

32.9 points per game
223.5 rushing yards per game
201.1 passing yards per game
424.6 total offense yards per game
2,682 rushing yards by Dillon
134.1 rushing yards per game by Dillon
26 rushing touchdowns by Dillon
12 100-yard rushing games by Dillon

- Dillon missed the games at No. 23 NC State and vs. Louisville with an ankle injury in 2018.
- Since Oct. 14, 2017, Dillon is second nationally with 134.1 rushing yards per game. Only Wisconsin's Jonathan Taylor has averaged more rushing yards per game during that time span (151.7 rushing yards per game).
- Dillon became the first player in 120 seasons of Boston College football to begin his career with back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons. Dillon went over the 1,000-yard mark on his four-yard touchdown run

at Florida State in 2018.

- Dillon is just the fourth player in BC history with two seasons of 1,000+ yards rushing. He joins Derrick Knight, Montel Harris and William Green with two years of 1,000 or more rushing yards.

- AJ Dillon is sixth nationally and leads the ACC with 3,015 career rushing yards. Among the top 10 active career rushing leaders, Dillon has played in the fewest amount of games among the top 10 rushers.

100-yard Games Piling Up

- AJ Dillon has just 20 career starts, but he has 13 career 100-yard games already at Boston College in 26 games played.
- He is tied for sixth in BC history with 13 career 100-yard games.
- BC is 9-4 when Dillon rushes for 100+ yards in a game.
- Dillon posted his 13th career 100-yard game - and eighth with at least 150 yards - against Kansas. Dillon finished with 151 yards, tying William Green (1999-01) for the sixth-most 100-yard rushing games in BC history.

Opportunistic Defense

- For just the fourth time since 2010, Boston College forced five turnovers in a game in the season opening win against Virginia Tech on August 31. BC forced five Virginia Tech turnovers, including three in the first half. That included the first career interceptions for Joe Sparacio and Tanner Karafa.
- It marked the first time since Nov. 21, 2015 that BC forced five turnovers in a game.
- BC is second nationally with a +2.33 turnover margin per game and ranks seventh nationally with eight turnovers gained in 2019.

Starting the Season with an ACC Victory

- Boston College has started the season against an ACC opponent four times in school history. The 35-28 victory over Virginia Tech in the 2019 opener marked just the second time in school history BC defeated an ACC foe in the first game of the year.
- The only other ACC win to start a new season was the 38-28 victory over Wake Forest in 2007.

Noting the Virginia Tech Victory

- Boston College improved to 10-18 all-time against Virginia Tech, picking up its second straight victory over the Hokies after winning 31-21 in Blacksburg last season.
- BC has won two straight in the series against the Hokies for just the third time in school history.
- The Eagles are 6-1 in season openers under Steve Addazio and have won 13 of their last 16 openers overall.
- Anthony Brown finished with three touchdowns (two passing, one rushing) as the redshirt junior quarterback finished 15-of-26 passing for 275 yards.
- AJ Dillon's second quarter touchdown was the 25th rushing TD of his career, moving him into a tie for eighth place with Derrick Knight ('03) and Mike Cloud ('98) on BC's all-time rushing TD list.
- Nine Eagles made their first career start: Kyiev Bennermon, Anthony Palazzolo, Tyler Vrabel, Joey Luchetti, Joe Sparacio, Tate Haynes, Medhi El Attrach, Mike Palmer and Brandon Barlow.
- The appearance by graduate transfer Richard Yeargin was his first game played since the 2016 College Football Playoff championship game at Clemson. Yeargin missed all of 2017 and 2018 recovering from a neck injury suffered in an automobile accident.
- The Eagles have now intercepted a pass in nine consecutive games.
- Tate Haynes was second on the team with nine tackles, including a sack.
- The Eagles' 356 yards of offense in the first half was the most vs. an FBS opponent since posting 453 yards vs. UMass (9/1/18) and most in a half vs. an ACC opponent since totaling 361 at Louisville (10/14/17).
- Redshirt junior linebacker Max Richardson led BC with 10 tackles.
- Redshirt freshman linebacker Joe Sparacio finished with six tackles and an interception in the end zone in his first career start.
- BC's defense held Virginia Tech to 2.3 yards per rushing as the Hokies finished with just 98 rushing yards on 42 carries.

Noting the Richmond Win

- Boston College improved to 2-0 with a convincing 45-13 victory over Richmond. BC has started 2-0 in consecutive seasons and for the fourth time under head coach Steve Addazio.
- Boston College moved to 5-1 all-time versus Richmond in the first series meeting between the two schools since 1971.
- In 1978, the NCAA split Division I football into two levels: I-A, which became FBS, and I-AA, later named FCS. Boston College is 27-1 all-time against FCS schools. The Eagles' only loss was a 27-0 shutout to Massa-

chusetts in 1978.

- BC has won 27 consecutive meetings against FCS foes.
- In the first half in 2019, Boston College has scored 63 points and totaled 730 yards of offense.
- Freshman wide receiver Zay Flowers scored the game's first touchdown on a career-long 46-yard run. It marked the first rushing touchdown of Flowers' career, giving him two total touchdowns on his first six career touches. Flowers finished the afternoon with 92 rushing yards on three carries (30.7 yards per carry).
- BC is 11-0 under Addazio when totaling 500+ yards of total offense. The Eagles have gone over the 500-yard mark in total offense seven times since 2017. Saturday's 518 yards of total offense ranks eighth in the Addazio era.
- The Eagles also ran for 300+ yards for the 14th time in the Addazio era, finishing with 346 on the ground on 50 carries (6.9 yards per carry). The 346 yards were the seventh-highest total under Addazio.
- Graduate student safety Nolan Borgersen recorded his first career interception in the first quarter for the Eagles. It marked the 40th interception for Boston College since 2017 and the 10th straight game with an interception for BC.
- Junior running back AJ Dillon logged his 16th career game with at least one rushing touchdown. BC is 12-4 when Dillon rushes for at least one TD.
- Dillon finished with three touchdowns overall and two rushing scores on the afternoon. Dillon's 27 career rushing touchdowns are tied for fourth in BC history. Keith Barnette (1973-75) holds the school record with 34 career rushing touchdowns.
- It marked the third three-touchdown game of Dillon's career.
- Dillon moved into a tie for 15th all-time in career scoring at BC with 174 points.
- Dillon caught his second career receiving touchdown on a career-long 42-yard reception from Brown to extend the BC lead to 28-7 in the second quarter.
- Graduate student tight end Jake Burt hauled in a career-long 55-yard touchdown reception to extend the BC lead to 35-10.
- Anthony Brown improved to 14-10 as BC's starting quarterback. The 14 wins as a starter place Brown in a tie for sixth place in BC history for victories by a quarterback with Tim Hasselbeck (1998-00). Doug Flutie owns the school record with 30 career wins.

First Half Fireworks

- Boston College has been explosive in the first half of both games in 2019 on offense. BC has totaled 87 points in the first half over the first three games of the year, an average of 29.0 per game in the first 30 minutes of play.
- BC has totaled 1,061 yards of total offense in the first half in 2019. The Eagles are averaging 353.7 yards per game in the first half through the first three games of 2019.

Flowers in Full Bloom

- Zay Flowers wowed coaches and teammates from the first practice of preseason camp in August. It took the Fort Lauderdale, Fla., native just three minutes into his first collegiate game to show the college football world his potential as well.
- Flowers ignited a BC offense that scored 28 first-half points in a 35-28 win over Virginia Tech.
- On BC's first scoring drive, Flowers started the drive with a 16-yard rush and ended the drive with a 33-yard touchdown reception. The 33-yard touchdown was Flowers' first career reception for the Eagles.
- He also added a 58-yard reception against the Hokies to finish with two receptions for 91 yards. He led BC with 116 all-purpose yards.
- The Eagles scored the second-most points in series history (28 games) against the Hokies. Only the 1993 BC team scored more against a Virginia Tech defense in a 48-34 victory.
- Flowers is averaging 15.8 yards per carry in 2019 (126 yards on eight rushing attempts) and 33.7 yards per reception (three receptions for 101 yards).

Big-Play Passing Offense

- Boston College is fifth nationally with three pass plays of 50+ yards in 2019. Quarterback Anthony Brown connected with Zay Flowers for a 58-yard reception and hit Kobay White on a 56-yard bomb against Virginia Tech. In the win over Richmond, Brown connected on a 55-yard touchdown pass to tight end Jake Burt.
- Brown is tied for third nationally with three passes covering 50+ yards in 2019. He is just one of 11 quarterbacks in the country to have three passes of 50+ yards this season.
- In 2018, BC had just three pass plays of 50 yards or more the entire season.
- Going back to 2014, the Eagles have just five total passing plays covering more than 50 yards.
- Steve Addazio's first season marked the largest total of 50-yard pass plays as BC connected on eight passes of 50 yards or more.

New Look Defense

- Seven new starters opened the season on defense for BC against Virginia Tech. The new look defense featured a mix of underclassmen and veterans, including three redshirt freshmen (DT Kyiev Bennermon, DE Joey Luchetti, LB Joe Sparacio), a redshirt sophomore (CB Tate Haynes), two redshirt juniors (DE Brandon Barlow, FS Mike Palmer) and a fifth-year graduate student (SS Mehdi El Attrach).
- Luchetti recorded his first career sack and finished with 1.5 TFLs in the win over the Hokies. Bennermon finished with five tackles along with a TFL in his first collegiate game at Boston College.
- Sparacio recorded six tackles and his first career interception in the end zone to end a Hokie scoring threat near the end of the first half.
- Haynes finished with a career-high nine tackles to go along with his first career sack and forced fumble to set up a BC touchdown.

No Fly Zone

- Since the start of the 2017 season, Boston College is second nationally with 42 interceptions. The opportunistic defense started the season right where they left off in 2018 with three picks in the Virginia Tech win on August 31 and two in the win over Richmond.
- BC is second nationally in 2019 with six interceptions. Only Arizona has more interceptions this season with eight.
- BC has picked off at least one pass in 11 consecutive games. The last time BC did not record an interception in a game was Sept. 22, 2018 at Purdue.

• Anthony Brown threw for a career-high 304 yards and five touchdowns on 16-for-25 passing in the 41-34 win at Wake Forest on Sept. 13, 2018. The New Jersey native is one of two Boston College quarterbacks in school history to have thrown five or more touchdowns in a game without an interception. Doug Flutie threw for 354 yards and 6 TDs without a pick in 1984 at home vs. North Carolina.
• Brown became the first BC quarterback to throw for over 300 yards and five TDs in a game since Matt Ryan vs. Wake Forest (9/1/07). It was the first 300-yard passing performance by an Eagle since Chase Rettig vs. Wake Forest (11/3/12).
• Brown was sixth in BC single-season history with 20 touchdown passes in 2018. He was just the fifth player in BC history to throw at least 20 touchdowns in a season.

What Can Brown Do for You?

• Anthony Brown finished with the best single-game passer rating (245.9) by a BC QB dating back to the 1996 season with his performance against UMass in the season-opener in 2018. He finished 15-of-21 passing for 279 yards and four touchdowns. The yards and TD passes were then career-highs for the New Jersey native.
• Brown finished with the second-best single-game passer rating in the 41-34 win at Wake Forest later in the season. Brown became the first BC quarterback to throw for over 300 yards and five TDs in a game at Wake Forest (9/13/18) since Matt Ryan vs. Wake Forest (9/1/07). It was the first 300-yard passing performance by an Eagle since Chase Rettig vs. Wake Forest (11/3/12).
• Brown was named the ACC Quarterback of the Week for his performance in the win at Wake. In addition, he was one of eight quarterbacks nationally recognized by the Davey O'Brien Award and The Manning Award for his play in the win at Wake.
• In 2017, Brown was named ACC Rookie of the Week for the first time in his career following the UVA victory and also was one of eight quarterbacks nationally recognized by The Manning Award as its "Stars of the Week."
• He was the first Boston College player with three passing touchdowns and zero interceptions in a conference game since Quinton Porter in 2003 in the 41-10 victory at UVA.
• It marked the third-best single-game passer rating by a BC quarterback since 1996 at the time. The performance now ranks fourth since 1996.
• Brown was the second freshman in BC history to start a season opener under center in the Sept. 1, 2017 win at Northern Illinois. He is the only freshman quarterback in school history who started to win a season opener on the road.
