#### BOSTON COLLEGE VS. UTAH - ALL-TIME SERIES

- Today's game marks the fourth meeting between the two schools.
- Boston College is 1-2 all-time vs. Utah, dating back to 1966-67.
- The last meeting came in the first round of the 2004 NCAA Tourney.
- Led by 19 points and eight boards from Craig Smith, the Eagles outdualed the Utes, 58-51. Andrew Bogut led Utah with 16 points.
- BC lost to Utah, 117-93, in the semifinals of the 1974 NIT at Madison Square Garden. Bob Carrington had 33 points for the Eagles.
- The first meeting came also came in an in-season tournament - the 1966 Sugar Bowl Classic in New Orleans.

#### BOSTON COLLEGE VERSUS THE PAC-12 CONFERENCE

- Boston College is 9-14 against teams that are members of the Pac-12.
- USC and UCLA are the Eagles' most common Pac-12 foe.
- BC's last game versus a Pac-12 opponent : a 64-60 win over Cal on Dec. 21, 2019 in the Al Attles Classic in San Francisco.
- BC vs. the Pac-12: Arizona (0-3); Arizona State (1-2); California (3-0); Stanford (1-0); UCLA (1-3); USC (0-4); Utah (1-2); Washington (1-0); Washington State (1-0).

#### BOSTON COLLEGE IN MTE / IN-SEASON TOURNAMENT PLAY

- Today is the second game of three in the Sunshine Slam.
- BC downed Holy Cross, 85-55, in the opening game on Nov. 12.
- Dating back to 1951-52, Boston College has compiled a 98-88 record in multi-team events (MTE) and in-season tournaments.
- Last season, BC was 1-1 in the 2K Sports Empire Classic held at Bubbleville at Mohegan Sun Arena in Uncasville, Conn.
- In 2018-19, the Eagles captured the inaugural Fort Myers Tipoff in Fort Myers, Fla.

#### BOO FROM THE WOO - LANGFORD JR. BREAKING OUT

- Through four games, DeMarr Langford Jr. is showing no signs of a sophomore slump.
- He averaged 17.3 points per game while shooting nearly 63.3% (19-30) from the floor in the Eagles' first three wins..
- Langford Jr. scored in double figures in each of those three games, including a career-high 20 points (6-9 FG; 8-8 FT) in 31 minutes vs. Holy Cross.
- The sophomore connected 13 of his first 15 field goal attempts on the season, making his first five shots vs. Holy Cross.
- He opened the season with a 16-point performance vs. Dartmouth, making 8-of-10 shots on the night.
- Since 1996-97, only 22 Boston College players have shot at least 80.0% from the floor while attempting at least 10 field goals.
- Last season as a freshman, he averaged 6.7 points and 4.2 boards while adding 1.4 assists, and 1.1 steals per game.
- Langford Jr. - nicknamed Boo by his grandmother - is the younger brother of starting point guard Makai Ashton-Langford.
- On Nov. 26, 2020 vs. Rhode Island, they became the first brothers from Massachusetts to start in the same game for BC.

## ON THIS DATE: NOVEMBER 20

- Boston College is 5-1 on the November 20 calendar date. Five games (4-1) came during in-season tournament/MTE play.
- November 20 marks the dual celebration of National Peanut Butter Fudge and National Child's Days.
- Several notable events in history occurred on November 20 - 1789 - New Jersey becomes first state to ratify Bill of Rights; 1866 - Howard University founded in Washington, D.C.; 1914 - the U.S. State Department begins requiring photos for passports; 1923 - Garrett Morgan patents to the traffic light; 1945 - The Nuremberg war trials begin; 1988 - BC beats Army, 38-24, in the Emerald Isle Classic - the first NCAA football game to be played in Europe.
- Notable November 20 birthdays: President Joe Biden; rapper Future; former U.S. Senator and attorney general Robert F. Kennedy; actress Bo Derek; actor Bob Einstein.

## BICKERSTAFF BIG AT RHODE ISLAND

- T.J. Bickerstaff registered his first career double-double, with career-highs in points (22) and rebounds (15).
- Bickerstaff added three steals and two blocks - one of only two players to have a stat line with at least 22-15-3-2.
- The 6-9 transfer was averaging 11.7 points and 6.3 rebounds in only 22 minutes per contest through the first three games.
- The transfer from Drexel is shooting nearly 53% from the floor, including 4-of-7 from beyond the arc.

## ASHTON-LANGFORD'S JOURNEY CONTINUES

- Makai Ashton-Langford enters his fourth season of college basketball in 2021-22.
- He is averaging 11.0 points, 4.5 rebounds, 4.0 assists, and 1.0 steals per game.
- He did not miss a shot in 37 minutes of play against Dartmouth in the season opener (2-2 FG; 4-4 FT).
- Against Fairfield, Ashton-Langford scored a season-high 17 points (6-9 FG; 3-4 3FG).
- Last season, he posted career-highs averages in scoring (9.6 ppg), rebounding (3.3), assists (3.2), and steals (1.7).
- Over the final four games of the 2020-21 season, he averaged 13.0 points, 3.3 rebounds, 4.8 assists - one of just two ACC players to post those averages over the final stretch of the regular season.
- During that span, the 6-3 guard shot nearly 56% from the floor (20-36) and 40% from 3FG (6-15), while posting an assist/turnover ratio of 2.71:1 (19:7) and a steal/turnover ratio of 0.86:1 (6:7).
- Ashton-Langford ranked 56th nationally in steal percentage (3.6) and 201st in assist rate (24.5) per KenPom.
- He tallied double-digits in the scoring column on seven occasions and dished out six or more assists on three occasions.
- This past summer, Ashton-Langford was awarded his undergraduate degree in communications from Boston College.
- He began his college career at Providence, playing 63 games for the Friars from 2017-19.

## QUINTEN POST-ING NUMBERS

- Quinten Post made an impact in his first game for Boston College, registering a new career-high with 14 points vs. Dartmouth.
- The 7-0 center is averaging 11.0 points per game through four outings.
- He has reached double figures three times this year, while nearly logging a double-double vs. Fairfield (9 pts/8 reb).

## ZACKERY DISHIN' AND SWISHIN'

- Jaeden Zackery is averaging 11.0 points and 4.3 assists over the last three games, with an assist/turnover ratio of 6.5:1.
- Zackery became the first BC freshman to dish out at least six assists in consecutive games in nearly a decade.
- During the 2012-13 season, Joe Rahon had six dimes against Providence (12/21/12) and Holy Cross (12/29/12).
- Zackery has made 13-of-26 shots from the floor over the last three games.

## THE TALLEST COLLEGE DORM ROOM IN THE COUNTRY

- Justin Vander Baan and Quinten Post are what is believed to be the tallest pair of roommates in America.
- The pair of 7-footers live together on campus - and mark the first time since 2014-15 that BC has two 7-footers on its roster.
- Dennis Clifford and Kyle Caudill were together on the BC roster from 2011-15.
- Prior to that, Nate Doornekamp and Kirsten Zoellner played together from 2001-03.
- Boston College is one of seven schools with at least two 7-footers on its roster in 2021-22. Florida State tops the list, with four.
- According to Google, there are approximately 2,800 7-footers in the world. @BCMABB has two of them.

## ITHE EARL GRANT ERA IS UNDERWAY

- Earl Grant was introduced as the 13th head men's basketball in Boston College history on March 17.
- On Nov. 9, he earned his first victory at the helm of the Eagles - a 73-57 win over Dartmouth.
- Grant arrived at the Heights after a highly successful seven-year stint at the College of Charleston.
- From 2014-21, he compiled a 127-89 overall record, including the 2018 CAA regular season and conference championship.
- Under Grant, CofC was one of only 21 NCAA Division I schools to have players drafted in both the 2019 and 2020 NBA Drafts.
- He was a finalist for the 2019 Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award, presented annually to a coach who not only achieves success on the basketball court, but who also displays moral integrity off the court.

## INSIDE THE METRICS - STYLE OF PLAY (per KenPom)

- Earl Grant-coached teams have shown a strong ability to take care of the ball.
- Through four games, BC is averaging 12.3 turnovers per outing - including a low of nine vs. Holy Cross.
- Last season through four games, Boston College averaged 15.3 turns per game.
- From 2016-21, Grant's Charleston teams consistently ranked among the top teams in the country in TO% (# of poss/turns).
- In 2017-18 - CofC's NCAA Tournament season, the Cougars posted a 15.1% TO rate - good for 16th-best nationally.
- Other TO rate marks: 2016-17 - 15.9 (24); 2017-18 - 15.1 (16); 2018-19 - 5.6 (19); 2019-20 - 16.3 (33); 2020-21 - 16.3 (48).
- That is coupled with CofC's consistent ranking among the top 100 in eFG%, including a high of 37th nationally in 2018-19 (54.2), and the Cougars' high rate of shooting from the perimeter.
- Last year, CofC connected on 38.2% from beyond the arc - 11th-best nationally.
- Grant's teams have ranked among the nation's top 100 in 3-point percentage in three of the last four seasons.

## IF THIS, THEN THAT...

### WITH A WIN VS. UTAH...

- Boston College would move to 4-1 overall on the season.
- It would be the first 4-1 start for BC since 2019-20.
- BC would improve to 2-2 all-time versus Utah, including 10-14 vs. teams from the Pac 12.
- Boston College would move to 4-1 in November and 1-0 in neutral games in 2021-22.
- The Eagles would improve to 2-0 in day games and 2-0 in weekend games this season.
- BC would move to 99-88 in MTE/in-season tourney games.
- Head coach Earl Grant would earn his fourth victory at Boston College and his 131st as a collegiate head coach.
- BC would earn victory #1,228 all-time through 88 seasons of basketball, dating back to 1904-05.

### WITH A LOSS VS. UTAH...

- Boston College would fall to 3-2 on the season.
- The Eagles would move to 1-3 all-time vs. Utah and 9-15 all-time against Pac 12 opponents.
- The Eagles would move to 3-2 in November, 1-1 in day games, 1-1 on weekends, and 0-1 in neutral games.
- BC would fall to 98-89 in MTE/in-season tourney games.
- Boston College would register the 1,047th loss all-time in program history, dating back to the 1904-05 season.

### BOSTON COLLEGE ANNOUNCES NATIONALLY-RANKED RECRUITING CLASS

- Boston College has secured one of its highest-rated recruiting classes in program history.
- The quartet of Prince Aligbe, D.J. Hand, Chas Kelley, and Armani Mighty - rank 26th nationally as a class per Rivals.com.
- Aligbe is a 6-7, 215 lb. forward from Minnehaha Academy in Minneapolis, Minn. and is a four-star rated recruit by the three major recruiting indexes.
- He averaged 11.2 points per game as a junior in a program that has featured two of the top prep players in the country over the past two seasons - Jalen Suggs and Chet Holmgren, both of Gonzaga.
- Hand is a 6-5, 180 lb. guard from Landstown H.S. in Virginia Beach, Va. and is also a four-star ranked player.
- One of the top shooting guards in the country, Hand averaged nearly 33 points per game as a junior and was a First Team All-State selection.
- Kelley is a 6-5, 180 lb. guard from Houston who is playing his final prep season at The Phelps School in Malvern, Pa.
- A high three-star rated recruit, Kelley played his first two seasons of prep basketball at Cy-Creek H.S. in Houston, averaging nearly 16 points, five rebounds, five assists, and four steals as a sophomore.
- Mighty is a 6-10, 220 lb. center from Toronto and United Scholastic Academy.
- Born in Jamaica, the three-star rated big man has been playing organized basketball for only three years and shined on the grassroots circuit this past summer with Canada Elite - the country's top AAU program.
- Head coach Earl Grant on his four-player class: *"We believe that we added four high character guys to our program. They are welcome additions and we look forward to seeing the impact they will have in Boston!"*

### BOSTON COLLEGE SEVENTH-LOWEST PERCENTAGE OF MINUTES RETURNING

- Boston College has the seventh-lowest percentage nationally of minutes played returning for 2021-22.
- Returning BC players accounted for 27.6% of minutes played a season ago.
- This ranks fourth-lowest among power conferences, behind Creighton (18%), Missouri (19.7%), and Iowa State (25.1%).
- The Eagles return 30.3% of its scoring, 37.2% of its rebounding, and 39.1% of its assists from last season.

### THREE VETERAN TRANSFERS JOINING THE ROSTER IN 2021-22

- Three transfers will suit up for Boston College this season.
- Brevin Galloway is a graduate transfer from the College of Charleston.
- Last season, the 6-2, 200 lb. guard was averaging 15.0 points, 3.0 rebounds, and 2.8 assists - including a 27-point/5-rebound/4-assist/3-steal performance vs. Marshall - before suffering a season-ending knee injury.
- T.J. Bickerstaff is a transfer from Drexel. A junior academically, the 6-9, 210 lb. forward has three years of eligibility remaining.
- Last year, averaging 10.2 points and 4.1 rebounds in 20 games, as the Dragons advanced to the NCAA Tournament.
- Quinten Post is a 7-0 forward who transferred to Boston College from Mississippi State. He has three seasons of eligibility.
- Last season, when the athletic post man scored six points or more, MSU was 5-2.

### TRANSFERS WITH SOME EXPERIENCE VS. THE ACC

- While at CofC, Brevin Galloway averaged 12.5 points, 2.5 rebounds, 2.5 assists, and 1.5 steals in two games vs. ACC foes.
- In the 2020-21 opener, Galloway scored 15 points - knocking down 3-of-6 from the perimeter - at North Carolina.
- As a junior, Galloway tallied 10 points in a non-conference matchup against Wake Forest.
- T. J. Bickerstaff registered 19 points, five rebounds, and two steals at Pitt last season while at Drexel.

### READY FREDDIE

- Frederick Scott enters his final season as a collegian having connected on nearly 40% from beyond the arc.
- Scott - a 6-8, 230 lb. forward - has made 108 of-279 shots from the outside in 103 career games.
- In limited action last season, Scott averaged 7.6 points and 3.9 boards.
- The grad transfer from Munster, Ind. came off the bench to score 18 points vs. Notre Dame on Feb. 27.
- Between Rider and BC, Scott has compiled 1,203 career points and a career 11.7 points per game average.

### KARNIK A SEASON AGO

- James Karnik saw action in 14 games in 2020-21 for Boston College, missing three games prior to gaining his eligibility waiver.
- The 6-9 forward averaged 6.8 points and 5.4 rebounds per game, ranking third on the team on the glass.
- Karnik led BC with 20 points (8-13 FG) - one off his career-high - to go with eight boards vs. Syracuse on Dec. 12, 2020.
- As a starter, the Surrey, British Columbia product averaged nearly 8.0 points to go with 6.3 boards per game.
- He scored in double figures twice and had seven or more rebounds on six occasions.

### ABOUT THE NEWCOMERS

- Four Boston College freshmen are making their Division I debuts tonight vs. Dartmouth.
- Kanye Jones is a 6-4 guard from Orlando. Jones originally committed to Earl Grant at Charleston before signing at BC.
- A 2020-21 FHSAA Class 7A All-State pick, he averaged nearly 21.0 points, 3.0 rebounds, 2.0 assists, and 2.0 steals.
- Devin McGlockton is a 6-7 forward from Cumming, Ga. McGlockton earned All-State accolades in football and basketball.
- As a senior, he led South Forsyth H.S. to a record 23 wins as he averaged 18.0 points and 10.0 boards per outing.
- Gianni Thompson is a 6-8 forward from Newton, Ma. He was rated as a four-star recruit on 247Sports.com.
- As a junior, he was an All-NEPSAC selection at Brimmer & May, averaging 19.0 points and 9.0 rebounds per game.
- Jaeden Zackery is a 6-2 guard from Salem, Wisc. He was a 2020-21 Third Team NJCAA All-American at Chipola College.
- Zackery averaged 12.5 points, 3.8 boards, and 4.2 assists for Chipola, which finished 23-5, winning the Panhandle Conference.

### BOSTON COLLEGE PICKED TO FINISH 15TH

- Boston College was picked to finish 15th on the 2021-22 ACC Preseason Order of Finish poll.

- Boston College will face either Tulsa or Rhode Island on Sunday in the final day of the Sunshine Slam MTE.

# EARL GRANT

## THE CLEMENT AND ELIZABETH IZZI FAMILY HEAD MEN'S BASKETBALL COACH



On March 17, Earl Grant was introduced as The Clement and Elizabeth Izzu Family Head Men's Basketball Coach at Boston College. Grant brings an impressive track record to BC after he turned the College of Charleston men's basketball program into a consistent championship contender in the Colonial Athletic Association.

Under Grant's leadership, the College of Charleston was one of only 21 NCAA Division I schools to have players drafted in both the 2019 and 2020 NBA Drafts. Grant led the Cougars to a top-four finish in the CAA in each of the last five seasons, including the 2018 regular season and conference tournament championship.

A finalist for the 2019 Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award, presented annually to a coach who not only achieves success on the basketball court, but who also displays moral integrity off the court, Grant led the Cougars to a memorable run in 2017-18 that included the program's second-straight 25-win campaign, an impressive 26-8 overall record and 14-4 mark in Colonial Athletic Association play. The co-regular-season champions earned the No. 1 seed in the CAA Men's Basketball Championship and defeated No. 2 seed Northeastern in an overtime thriller to punch the program's first ticket to the NCAA Tournament since 1999.

Grant is the 13th head coach in Boston College men's basketball history.

"When we began our search for a new head men's basketball coach, we set out to find a leader of young men, someone who shares our vision and our values, who could lead our program to championships while ensuring a world-class student-athlete experience and education for our players," said Kraft. "After a comprehensive national search, it was clear that Earl is exactly what we were looking for and what our basketball program needs at this moment and I am confident he will have tremendous success in Chestnut Hill, on the court and off."

Grant guided the Cougars to three 20-win campaigns and a 67-22 home-court winning record over the previous six years and produced 12 all-conference honorees.

"My family and I are really excited about the opportunity to start a new journey," Grant said. "I look forward to representing such a prestigious academic institution, to coach in the top basketball conference in America, and do it in one of the best cities in the world. I can't wait to meet and develop a relationship with all who have worked so hard over the years to make BC a special place. I am thankful to Pat Kraft, Father Leahy and the Board of Trustees for affording me this tremendous opportunity."

For the first time in program history, College of Charleston's men's basketball was recognized by the NCAA for the 2018-19 academic year. Under the guidance of Grant, the programs' four-year rolling APR was in the Top 10% of all men's basketball programs in the country. The Cougars were one of only 51 men's basketball programs honored nationally. In all, 24 players have gone on to earn their degree at The College.

In 2018-19, CofC posted a 24-9 overall record with non-conference victories over Rhode Island, VCU and Memphis. Two players – Grant Riller and Jarrell Brantley – were named to the All-CAA First Team. Known for their gritty defense, the Cougars led the CAA in scoring defense for the fourth-straight year holding opponents to 68.6 points per game. CofC also ranked No. 17 in the nation in turnovers per game (10.5 avg.) and No. 16 in free-throw percentage (76.4%).

Known as a player's coach, Grant and his staff helped develop Brantley into a 2019 NBA Draft Pick and Riller into a 2020 NBA Draft Pick - the third and fourth-ever College of Charleston players to be drafted. Brantley is currently a two-way player with the Utah Jazz and was named to the 2020 NBA G League First Team and All-Rookie Team as a member of the Salt Lake City Stars. He was second in voting for NBA G League Rookie of the Year honors. Riller was selected in the second round by the Charlotte Hornets giving the Cougars back-to-back NBA Draft picks for the first time in school history.

In 2016-17, Grant led the Cougars to a 25-10 overall record and 14-4 mark in Colonial Athletic Association play. It marked the program's first 20-win campaign since 2013. Charleston, seeded a program-best No. 2, advanced to the championship game of the CAA Tournament for the first time since CofC joined the Colonial in 2013. They were also selected and made their fifth all-time appearance in the Postseason NIT. It was their first postseason berth (NCAA or NIT) since 2011.

In his second season with the Cougars, Grant and his staff turned the program into one of the most improved in NCAA Division I and developed four all-conference players including Colonial Athletic Association Rookie of the Year and All-CAA Third Team selection Jarrell Brantley – the first freshman to receive such honors since 2006.

Known as a top recruiter, Grant has shown impressive credentials in both identifying and developing top-flight talent. No stranger to the ACC, he previously spent four seasons as an assistant coach at Clemson under Brad Brownell, where he made a positive impact on the Tiger men's basketball program, both in recruiting and with player development. He worked primarily with Clemson's point guards.

He recruited 2014 first-team All-ACC selection K.J. McDaniels to Clemson, where he ultimately ended up averaging 17 points per game as a junior and was named ACC Defensive Player of the Year, before declaring early for the NBA Draft. McDaniels was selected 32nd overall in the 2014 NBA Draft by the Philadelphia 76ers.

Several Tiger point guards have flourished under Grant's mentoring including incumbent starter Rod Hall. After recruiting the Augusta, Ga., native to Clemson, Grant has seen Hall develop into one of the leaders of the program. During the 2013-14 season, Hall was second on the team in scoring average and ranked among the ACC's top 10 in both assists per game and assist-to-turnover ratio.

In 2010-11, Grant worked with Demontez Stitt, who was named third-team All-ACC and was a member of the All-ACC Tournament Team. That same season, Grant helped Andre Young to an ACC-leading 2.55 assist-to-turnover ratio. Young went on to lead the conference in steals per game as a senior in 2011-12, earning All-ACC Defensive Team honors. He also led the Tigers in scoring under Grant's direction.

Clemson put together strong team results with Grant in the fold as well. In 2013-14, the Tigers went 23-13 overall and recorded a 10-win improvement from the previous season. Clemson advanced to the NIT semifinals and was 10-8 during the ACC regular season.

In Grant's first season in 2010-11, Clemson put together a 22-12 overall record and 9-7 league mark in the ACC. The Tigers earned the No. 4 seed at the ACC Tournament and advanced to the semifinals in Greensboro, N.C. Clemson also went to a fourth-consecutive NCAA Tournament and won its first-round game over UAB, 70-52, in Dayton, Ohio.

Clemson was strong defensively in four seasons with Grant part of its coaching staff. In 2010-11, the Tigers ranked No. 24 nationally in scoring defense. In 2011-12, Clemson yielded just 60.6 points per game to the opposition, the second-best figure among ACC schools. In 2012-13, the Tigers dropped their average even further to 60.1 points per game. That figure dropped to an ACC era-best at Clemson – 58.4 points per game – in 2013-14. The Tiger perimeter defense was No. 1 nationally defending the three-pointer (.286).

Grant personally signed 10 of Clemson's 15 players recruited by Brownell's staff. He was Clemson's lead recruiter for players such as Austin Ajukwa, Jaron Blossomgame, Gabe DeVoe, Ibrahim Djambo, Sidy Djitte, Hall, K.J. McDaniels and Patrick Rooks.

Prior to Clemson, Grant served as an assistant coach first at Winthrop and then at Wichita State. He helped the Eagles to three consecutive Big South championships and three straight NCAA Tournament appearances. In 2004-05, the Eagles were 27-6 overall. The next season, Winthrop finished the year with a 23-8 overall record and came within two points of upsetting Tennessee in the NCAA Tournament. In 2007, Grant helped the Eagles to a 29-5 overall record and unblemished 14-0 mark in Big South play.

The 2007 campaign was a memorable one for Winthrop. With Grant's assistance, the Eagles claimed a 74-64 upset over No. 6 seed Notre Dame in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament. It was Winthrop's first-ever NCAA Tournament win in seven tries.

Grant was at Wichita State from 2007-10, when the Shockers made gradual improvement each season. In 2008-09, Wichita State made its first postseason appearance in three years and also defeated one of the nation's top mid-major programs in Siena during the regular season. In 2009-10, Wichita State improved its win total by eight and finished 25-10 overall, 12-6 in the Missouri Valley Conference. The Shockers advanced to the championship game of the conference tournament and also earned a bid to the National Invitation Tournament.

Prior to his stint at Winthrop, Grant was an assistant coach at The Citadel from 2002-04. Grant played two years at the Division II level at Georgia College. He led the school to two appearances in the NCAA Tournament and to consecutive Peach Belt Conference championships (1999, 2000). In 2000, the Bobcats advanced to the Elite Eight of the Division II national tournament.

A native of North Charleston, S.C., Grant earned his bachelor's degree in psychology from Georgia College in 2000. He and his wife, Jacci, have three sons: Trey, Eyziah and Elonzo.
