SETTING THE SCENE

- No. 1 overall seed Boston College takes on No. 3 Denver in the National Championship on Saturday from Xcel Energy Center in Saint Paul, Minn. The game will be broadcast on ESPN2 at 6 p.m. ET.
- The Eagles are the No. 1 overall seed for the third time in 37 NCAA Tournament appearances.
- Boston College is making its 12th National Championship and seeking the program's sixth title. The Wolverines are tied with Denver for the most National Championships, while the Eagles have five; tied with BU for the most in Hockey East.
- BC, which is No. 1 in the country for the 11th week in a row, is making its first National Championship appearance since defeating Ferris State in 2012.

EAGLES IN THE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

- Boston College is 5-6 in National Championship game. The Eagles have won its last three title game appearances in 2008, 2010 and 2012. BC also won championships in 1949 and 2001. The Eagles are 51-43 all-time in the NCAA Tournament.
- Greg Brown becomes the fourth head coach to lead Boston College into a National Championship game. Snooks Kelly led BC to the 1949 title and Jerry York won four titles between 2001 and 2012. Len Ceglarski also guided the Eagles into the 1978 National Championship game.

WITH A WIN...

- BC would win its sixth National Championship and first since 2012.
- BC would own the most National Championships in Hockey East.
- BC would establish the program record for wins at 35. The Eagles' previously won 33 during the team's 2001 and 2012 National Championship seasons.
- BC would win 16 games in a row for the first time since the 2012 National Champions won 19 in a row to end the season. It would mark the third longest win streak in program history. The BC record is 22 games from February 1949 to February 1950, including the 1949 National Championship.
- BC would improve to 17-20 all-time against Denver and 2-3 against the Pioneers in the NCAA Tournament.
- BC would improve to 62-48-3 all-time against teams from the NCHC.

HOBEBY HAT TRICK

- Cutter Gauthier was announced as Hobey Hat Trick Finalist for the Hobey Baker Award. The winner will be announced on Friday in Saint Paul.
- In the last five postseason games, Gauthier has totaled 13 points on six goals and seven assists.
- Three Eagles have won the Hobey Baker; most recently Johnny Gaudreau in 2014.
- Freshman Will Smith, who leads the nation in points at 69, was one of 10 initial finalists announced for the Hobey Baker Award last month.

HOCKEY EAST CHAMPIONSHIP

- BC won its 12th Hockey East Tournament Championship and first since 2012 with a 6-2 win over No. 2 Boston University. Will Smith scored four goals and was named Tournament MVP.
- Smith was joined on the All-Tournament Team with forwards Cutter Gauthier and Gabe Perreault as well as defenseman Eamon Powell and goaltender Jacob Fowler.
- Smith's hat trick was the first by a freshman in the Hockey East Championship Game.

HOCKEY EAST AWARDS

- Greg Brown was honored with the Bob Kuller Award for Coach of the Year. He is the third BC coach to win the award and first since Jerry York in 2021. Overall, it marks the seventh such award for BC as York claimed five honors and Len Ceglarski won the award in 1985.
- Six Eagles earned Hockey East All-Star status with goaltender Jacob Fowler and forwards Cutter Gauthier and Will Smith on the first team. Defenseman Eamon Powell and forwards Ryan Leonard and Gabe Perreault earned second team recognition.
- In the first round of Hockey East postseason awards released on March 13, five Eagles earned recognition. Powell, along with UMass defenseman Ryan Ufko, was honored with the Len Ceglarski Individual Sportsmanship Award.
- The Eagles claimed four spots on the All-Rookie Team. Leonard and Perreault were both unanimous selections. Smith and Fowler also earned a spot on the team.

CUT TO THE CHASE

- Cutter Gauthier is the Hockey East and NCAA leader in goals at 38. He is the first Eagle to reach 30 goals in a season since Hobey Baker Award winner Johnny Gaudreau in 2013-14.
- His 38 goals tie him with David Emma (1989-90) and Scott Harlow (1985-86) for the BC single-season record.
- He is the first player in the NCAA to score 38 or more goals in a season since Minnesota's Ryan Potulny scored 38 in 2005-06, tied for the most this century.
- Gauthier had a career-best 14-game point streak, with a 11-10-21 scoring line, snapped against BU (2/5) at the Beanpot. He bounced back from his streak being snapped with a four-point, two-goal performance against No. 17 New Hampshire (2/9).
- Gauthier scored his first career hat trick at Merrimack (1/19).
- He leads the country in game-winning goals with 10, including the Hockey East Championship Game against BU (3/23).
- Gauthier's 13 power play goals are the most in Hockey East and second most in the NCAA.

NOW THIS IS A STORY

- Will Smith has set the BC record for points and assists in a season by a freshman at 71 and 46, respectively. He broke Ken Hodge's (1984-85) records of 64 and 44.
- Totaled five points in the Hockey East Championship Game; the first five-point game for an Eagle since Alex Newhook against UMass Lowell in the 2021 Hockey East Semifinals. His four-goal effort was the first since Nathan Gerbe against Harvard in 2007.
- Smith's NCAA-best 18-game point streak was snapped vs. UNH (3/3).
- He is first in the nation and Hockey East in points (71) and assists (46) and fourth in the league in goals (25).
- Smith has recorded a team-leading 23 multi-point games.
- Smith was named the HCA National Rookie of the Month for January as well as the Hockey East Player of the Month for January.
- One of two Eagles to be named a finalist for the Hobey Baker Award.

RICHTER AWARD FINALIST

- Jacob Fowler posted his 31st win of the season in the NCAA Tournament's quarterfinal. He passed Al Montoya (Michigan, 2002-03) for the most wins in a season by a freshman across the NCAA.
- Fowler is first in the league and ranks fourth nationally with a .926 save percentage.
- The rookie's 2.14 GAA ranks eighth among NCAA goalies and is third in Hockey East.
- Fowler has been named one of three finalists for the Mike Richter Award, recognizing the top goalie in the country. BC's Thatcher Demko previously won the award in 2016.
- His 1,014 saves passed Parker Milner (2012-13) for seventh most in a season in BC history. Only seven players in BC history have recorded 1,000 saves in a season.

KID LINE

- Boston College's all-freshman line of Gabe Perreault, Will Smith and Ryan Leonard has combined for 75 goals, 116 assists and 191 points.
- The trio is averaging 4.78 points per game, including 103 points in Hockey East play.
- The Perreault-Smith-Leonard line combined for nine goals and 12 assists in the Hockey East semifinals and finals.
- Smith (71) is the leading points-getter in the nation at 1.78 points per game. Perreault is second in the NCAA at 1.71 ppg and Leonard fourth at 1.50.

FRESHMAN SUPERLATIVES

- Will Smith surpassed Ken Hodge (1984-85) for most points in a season by a BC freshman during the Hockey East Championship Game. His 71 points the 10th most in a season by an Eagle. Gabe Perreault and Ryan Leonard's 60 points are fourth all-time by a freshman.
- Smith's 46 assists surpassed Hodge for the most in a season by a BC freshman. Perreault ranks fourth among BC freshman at 39, having recently passed Hall of Famer Brian Leetch.
- Ryan Leonard broke the record for goals in a season by a BC freshman with two goals against Quinnipiac (3/31) to pass Brian Gionta (1997-98).

THE B-SIDE [VIA COLLEGE HOCKEY INC.]

- BC enters the Frozen Four on the longest active win streak in the country (14).
- The Eagles have made the biggest turnaround in wins among the tournament field this season at +19. BC went 14-16-6 last season and are 33-5-1 entering Thursday.
- Will Smith (69) and Cutter Gauthier (64) are the highest scoring duo in the tournament field at 133 points; 20 ahead of BU's Macklin Celebrini and Lane Hutson.
- BC's freshman class has totaled 218 points; the most in the NCAA Tournament. Fellow Frozen Four participants Denver (159) and BU (147) ranks second and third, respectively.

RED HOT LENNY

- Ryan Leonard is third in the NCAA and Hockey East in goals with 31 tallies; the most in a season by a BC freshman.
- Leonard and Cutter Gauthier became the first pair of BC teammates with 30 or more goals in a season since Jeff Farkas (33) and Brian Gionta (32) in 1999-00.
- The Amherst native is tied for fourth in the league in points (60).
- Leonard has posted 19 multi-point games this season and eight multi-goal outings. He scored his first career hat trick vs. UMass (2/18).
- He was named Hockey East Rookie of the Month for February with 10 goals.

THE CAPTAIN

- Eamon Powell has produced career-highs in scoring with five goals, 33 assists and 38 points. His career-best 13-game point streak was snapped vs. UMass (3/22).
- He posted 20 points on four goals and 16 assists over that 13-game stretch.
- Powell secured the Hockey East regular season with the lone goal in a win vs. UNH (3/3).
- His 38 points are the most among BC defenseman and his 44 blocked shots rank fourth.

ON A PERR-ROLL

- Gabe Perreault has posted point streaks of 11 and 18 this season. His 18-game point streak, which tied linemate Will Smith for the longest in the country this season, was snapped in the NCAA first round vs. Michigan Tech (3/29).
- He recorded six multi-point games from Dec. 2 to Jan. 21 and has 21 this season.
- Perreault returned from a five-game absence with a two-goal, two-assist effort against UMass (3/22) and totaled seven points with three goals during the championship weekend.
- He has been named Hockey East Rookie of the Week three times this season.

HOCKEY EAST SUCCESS

- Boston College won its 18th Hockey East Regular Season Championship. The Eagles also finished the 2020-21 season atop the league standings, but the league voted to not recognize a regular season champion due to the Covid-19 impacted schedule.
- The Eagles went 20-3-1 in Hockey East; the most since claiming the second of back-to-back regular season titles with a 19-7-1 record in 2011-12. BC last won 20 games in 2010-11.
- BC exceeded 20 wins the first three seasons of Hockey East before the league schedule was reduced following the 1986-87 season.

TRULY SPECIAL TEAMS

- Boston College's penalty kill is the top-ranked unit in the nation at 88.9%.
- BC ranks first in Hockey East on the power play and second in the NCAA, clicking at 29.3%.
- The PP has converted in 28 games this season.
- BC has scored 33 power play goals over its last 26 games, including matching a season-high four PPG against BU (3/23).

- Seven members of the Eagles won gold medals as the U.S. National Junior Team beat host Sweden 6-2 to win the 2024 IIHF World Junior Championship on Jan. 5.
- Forwards Cutter Gauthier, Ryan Leonard, Gabe Perreault and Will Smith, defensemen Drew Fortescue and Aram Minnetian, and goaltender Jacob Fowler earned gold medals.
- The U.S. claimed its sixth gold at World Juniors, second in four years, with the 2021 team featuring Matt Boldy, Drew Helleson and Spencer Knight.
- Boston College set a USA Hockey record with seven players from the same school on a World Junior Championship roster.
- BC has now had 17 players earn a total of 18 gold medals in the history of the tournament; 16 of those gold medals have been won by American skaters.
- The U.S. finished at 6-1-0 and earned its 15th tournament medal.

WORLD JUNIORS REWIND

- Gauthier was tied for the tournament lead in scoring with 12 points on two goals and 10 assists; he was named Best Forward of the World Junior Championship and scored the game-winning goal late in the third period of the Semifinal against Finland.
- Perreault (3-7-10) was tied for sixth in scoring at the event, while Smith (4-5-9) ranked 13th overall in points; Leonard added six points on three goals and three assists. As linemates, the trio combined for two goals and four assists in the Gold Medal Game.
- Fortescue also collected an assist in gold medal victory over Sweden and closed the tournament with a plus-6 rating in seven games.
- Fowler made three starts and went 3-0-0 with a 2.59 goals against average, beating Latvia in the Quarterfinal round.

HISTORIC DRAFT

- For the second time in four years, three incoming Boston College players – U.S. National Team Development Program linemates Will Smith, Ryan Leonard and Gabe Perreault – were selected in the first round of the 2023 NHL Draft at Bridgestone Arena in Nashville.
- Smith went fourth overall to the San Jose Sharks, becoming the highest drafted player in BC history; Bill Guerin (1989), Noah Hanifin (2015) and Cutter Gauthier (2022) all went fifth.
- Leonard was drafted with the eighth overall pick by the Washington Capitals, while the New York Rangers took Perreault with the 23rd overall selection in the first round.

NHL DRAFT NOTES

- BC joined Minnesota as the only NCAA schools to have three players selected in the first round of the same draft on more than one occasion.
- Boston College became just the third NCAA school to have two top-10 picks in the same draft.
- The program's six total picks at the 2023 NHL Draft tied for the most in a single draft for Boston College since 1989 when seven were selected.
- BC leads Hockey East and ranks third all-time with 25 first round picks.
- The Eagles are tied for first nationally with 14 draft picks on the 2024 roster.

NHL NOTES

- Thatcher Demko (Vancouver) has been elected to his second NHL All-Star Game, receiving the most votes (1,398,699) of any skater or goalie in fan voting.
- Chris Kreider (NY Rangers) scored his 166th goal at Madison Square Garden (regular season and playoffs) on Jan. 2 to surpass Rod Gilbert for the most ever at the venue.
- Johnny Gaudreau (Columbus) recorded his 700th career NHL point on Dec. 16. The only active American-born skater to reach 700 points faster is Patrick Kane.
- Three of the top-8 fastest American-born skaters all-time to hit 700 are former Eagles (Joe Mullen and Craig Janney are second and fourth, respectively).
- Former BC defenseman Jack St. Ivany became the 87th Eagle alum to debut in the NHL on March 22 with the Pittsburgh Penguins.

EAGLES IN THE NHL

- 18 former BC men's hockey players have appeared in at least one NHL game this season.
- Skating for new teams this season are Patrick Brown (BOS), Kevin Hayes (STL), Alex Newhook (MON), Zach Sanford (ARI), Miles Wood (COL) and Brian Dumoulin (SEA).
- Boston College led Hockey East and ranked second among Division I schools behind only Minnesota with 25 former players who reached the NHL level last season.
- The Eagles also had the most 30-goal scorers of any program with three in Matt Boldy (Minnesota), Chris Kreider (NY Rangers) and Alex Tuch (Buffalo).

HOME ICE ADVANTAGE

- Boston College went 16-2-0 at home, outscoring its opponents 86-43.
- BC led Hockey East and ranked fifth nationally in average home attendance with more than 124,000 total fans in 18 games for an average of 6,895 per home date.
- BC posted its largest total and average attendance since the 2013-14 season and most sellouts since 2012-13.

TEAM NOTES

- BC is 18-26 in 26 trips to the Frozen Four.
- In 2012, Boston College won its third national title in five years and fifth overall. Boston College is the first team since 1961 to win three championships in five seasons; Murray Armstrong's Denver team won three titles in four years (1958, 1960 and 1961) and BC has captured titles in 2008, 2010 and 2012. The all-time best is five titles in six years, accomplished by Michigan (1951, 1952, 1953, 1955 and 1956).
- The 2012 national championship marked Boston College's fifth NCAA Frozen Four and national championship game appearance in the last seven years. BC fell in the title game in 2006 (to Wisconsin, 2-1) and 2007 (Michigan State, 3-1), but captured the national title in its last three NCAA Championship game appearances – in 2008 (4-1 over Notre Dame), 2010 (5-0 over Wisconsin), and 2012 (4-1 over Ferris State).
- The 2010 NCAA Championship game between Boston College and Wisconsin at Ford Field in Detroit, Mich., was played before 37,592 fans, establishing a world record (at the time) for indoor hockey.
- Parker Milner's .982 save percentage (110 saves, two goals against) in the 2012 tournament is third best all-time; it marked the best percentage since 1972 and the best since the tournament expanded beyond four teams.
- Milner's 0.50 goals against average in the 2012 NCAA Tournament ties him for the best all-time with three others (Ken Dryden, Cornell in 1967; Gerry Powers, Denver in 1968, and Tim Regan, Boston University in 1972).
- In three of its most recent National Championship runs (2008, 2010, 2012), BC outscored its opponents by a 32-5 margin in the Frozen Four.
- Boston College's 4-1 win over Ferris State on April 7, 2012 marked the team's 19th straight victory that season.
- Boston College advanced to four straight Frozen Fours from 1998-2001. It participated in three straight Frozen Fours twice — 1948-50 and 2006-08.

- Boston College is 5-6 in the national championship game.
- Boston College has a 5-7 overtime record in tournament play.
- Jerry York led Boston College to 12 Frozen Fours while "Snooks" Kelley guided BC to nine; Len Ceglarski led the Eagles to four.
- Jerry York went 41-24-1 in 24 NCAA Tournament berths, including a 36-14 mark in 18 tournaments at Boston College. York's 41 NCAA Tournament victories is the highest total in Division I history.
- With his five NCAA Championships (four with Boston College, one with Bowling Green), Jerry York tied Denver's Murray Armstrong for second place among Division I head coaches. Only Michigan's Vic Heyliger (1948-56; six titles) has more championships than York.
- Jerry York is one of just three coaches to lead two different schools to national titles. York led Bowling Green to the 1984 title, and Boston College to the 2001, 2008, 2010, 2012 titles.
- Jerry York led BC to 18 NCAA Tournament appearances. Snooks Kelley and Len Ceglarski each led BC to nine NCAA Tournament berths.
- Goaltender John Muse went 8-1 in NCAA Tournament competition in his career. He earned NCAA Championships in 2008 and 2010. He allowed just one goal in two national-title game appearances and is just the fourth goaltender top post a shutout in the championship game (Boston College 5, Wisconsin 0; 2010), joining Denver's Adam Berkhoel (2004), Boston University's Tim Regan (1972) and Denver's Gerry Powers (1968).
- Nathan Gerbe tied the NCAA record with seven goals in four 2008 tournament victories. Additionally, Gerbe's five goals in the 2008 Frozen Four in Denver, marked the first time since Dave Silk in 1977 that a player registered five goals in Frozen Four play. That mark is tied for fourth-most all-time.

Former Boston College All-American defenseman Greg Brown '90 enters his second year leading the program in 2023-24 after being named The Schiller Family Head Hockey Coach on May 6, 2022, becoming just the fifth head coach of BC men's hockey since 1932.

Brown spent 14 seasons behind the bench for the Eagles from 2004-18 as an assistant on former head coach Jerry York's staff, helping to bring three national championships to the Heights in 2008, 2010 and 2012. After eight seasons as an assistant coach, he was elevated to associate head coach following the 2012 NCAA title, BC's third championship in a five-year span.

During his 14 years coaching at Boston College, Brown helped lead BC to six Hockey East Tournament Championships, seven Hockey East Regular Season Championships, 11 NCAA Tournament appearances, and seven NCAA Frozen Four berths. Brown was also selected as an assistant coach for Team USA at three different IIHF World Junior Championships.

Brown served as an assistant coach in the NHL for the New York Rangers for three years from 2018-21, where he coached former Eagle forwards Chris Kreider and Kevin Hayes. During the 2021-22 season as the head coach of Dubuque in the USHL, he led the Fighting Saints to a second-place finish in the USHL Eastern Conference and an increase of 16 wins from the year prior.

While at Boston College, Brown won back-to-back Hockey East Player of the Year Awards in 1989 and 1990. He was named a First Team All-American and a finalist for the Hobey Baker Award both years. In three NCAA seasons, Brown registered 24 goals and 96 assists for 120 points in 119 career games.

He was the captain of the Eagles as a senior in 1989-1990 for a team that won 28 games and reached the NCAA Semifinal. Boston College went 84-33-5 (.709) during his three seasons on the Heights, winning Hockey East Championships in 1987 and 1990.

He was selected to the U.S. Olympic Team during his sophomore year for the Calgary Olympics in 1988 and again for the Albertville Olympics in 1992.

Brown was drafted 26th overall by the Buffalo Sabres in the 1986 NHL draft and played four NHL seasons for Buffalo, Pittsburgh, and Winnipeg. He played professional hockey in Europe for eight more seasons before retiring in 2003, and made his return to the Heights in 2004 as an assistant coach for York.

The Brown family has many connections to Boston College men's hockey. Greg's older brother Doug was a four-year standout forward for the Eagles from 1982-86, posting 162 points and earning a spot on two All-America teams. Greg and Doug are members of the Boston College Varsity Club Athletic Hall of Fame.

Greg's nephews Patrick Brown (2010-14) and Christopher Brown (2015-19) were also forwards at Boston College and both served as captains of the team.
