SIMS PROFILE

ENTERING HIS FIFTH SEASON AS THE HEAD BALL COACH OF BETHUNE-COOKMAN UNIVERSITY, TERRY SIMS HAS EXPERIENCED VERY FEW THINGS THAT HIS PREDECESSORS ENDURED BEFORE HIM.

FROM TAKING HIS WILDCAT TEAM TO A FIRST-EVER VISIT TO A BIG 10 STADIUM WHEN BCU FACED NEBRASKA IN OCTOBER TO UNPRECEDENTED SUCCESS IN THE FLORIDA BLUE FLORIDA CLASSIC — A 33-19 VICTORY MARKED BCU'S EIGHTH CONSECUTIVE TRIUMPH OVER FLORIDA A&N AND HIS FOURTH STRAIGHT IN AS MANY TRIES, SIMS HAS BEEN A GUIDING FORCE FOR A PROGRAM THAT HAS ENJOYED SUCCESS ON THE FIELD AND MOLDS THE CHARACTER OF YOUNG MEN OFF IT.

SIMS IS 27-17 AS HEAD COACH, WITH WINNING CAMPAIGNS IN THREE OF HIS FOUR YEARS.











GAME ONE RECAP: BETHUNE-COOKMAN 36, JACKSON STATE 15

ATLANTA – That flexible and opportunistic Bethune-Cookman defense rejuvenated what had been a listless MEAC/SWAC Challenge effort by scoring two touchdowns and setting up another in the second half as the Wildcats rallied for a 36-15

victory over Jackson State Sunday before a Georgia State Stadium crowd of 23,333 and a national ESPN 2 audience.

Trevor Merritt and Sam Marc registered the touchdowns, while Devuntray Hampton's interception set up the go-ahead touchdown as Bethune-Cookman erased a 9-0 deficit, then finished with the game's final 29 points. The victory gave Terry Sims his first in a season-opener in his five years as Head Coach, and BCU's 36 points were its highest opening day output since a 38-28 in the 2012 MEAC/SWAC Challenge against Alabama State.

Jackson State could manage only a 3-0 halftime lead, but took a 9-0 lead on Jordan Johnson's eight-yard run at the start of the third quarter.

Merritt's 50-yard pick six cut the deficit to 9-7 three minutes and gave life to the Wildcats.

Yes, the Tigers answered with a 33-yard Warren Newman pass from Jalon Jones, but BCU's offense came to live with a 57-yard drive of its own after a penalty on the JSU mascot and Jimmie Robinson's kickoff return put the Wildcats in solid field

position. Akevious Williams capped off the drive with a 20-yard run that closed it to 15-14 with 4:09 left in the third.

Hampton, burned for a long play on the game's first possession, redeemed himself with a 50-yard pick that set the ball on the JSU 20. Three plays later, Williams

connected with Taron Mallard and Robinson scored on the two-point conversion with 2:33 left for a 22-15 lead.

A five-play drive aided by a JSU penalty and Williams' 23-yarder to Darryl Powell, Jr. produced a 5-yard LaDerrien Wilson score with 11:16 left.

JSU put together a scoring threat, but it quickly turned the other way when Sam Marc scooped up a fumbled and went 96 yards the other way to put BCU ahead by 21.

BCU's defense gave up 506 total yards, but won the turnover battle 4-0.

Williams, making his first start since a season-injury ended to North Carolina A&T last year, finished 16 of 29 for 144 passing while rushing for 53 yards.

Isaac Washington rushed for 61 yards on nine carries, while Robinson caught five passes for 37 yards and Mallard four for 60. Rashon McNeil paced the defensive with 8.5 tackles, a sack and a forced fumble.











GAME TWO RECAP: MIAMI 63, BETHUNE-COOKMAN O

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. - On to Mississippi Valley State.

Bethune-Cookman dropped its fifth setback to Miami in as many tries as the Hurricanes posted a 63-0 decision before an announced Hard Rock Stadium crowd of 52,036 and an ACC Network national audience. DeeJay Dallas rushed for 108 yards and three touchdowns, and Jarren Williams also gave the home fans something to cheer about with 254 yards and three touchdown passes as the Hurricanes (1-2) pulled away with two touchdowns in the minute of the first half.

It was BCU's first shutout loss since 2017, a 45-0 loss to Florida Atlantic. Miami's 63 points were the most scored on the Wildcats (1-1) since November 20, 1999 when Florida A&M won the Florida Classic 63-14 and the margin of defeat was BCU's largest since a 73-7 loss to North Carolina A&T on November 2, 1996. The Wildcats, who managed just four first downs and 137 yard total yards, now shift focus to their second Southwest Athletic Conference opponent, Mississippi Valley State, on the road next Saturday.

"This week won't be a deal where we're going to go and have a yelling and screaming match every day at practice," said BCU Head Coach Terry Sims. "We're going to watch the films, clean up the mistakes and start getting ready for Valley."

Sims never underestimated Miami despite the Hurricanes dropping their first two games to Florida and North Carolina.

"You can't look at the record and say 'They're 0-2 and not a good football team.'" Sims said. "Miami's a good team and they were prepared for us. You can't make the mistakes we made against that caliber of opponent. The team that makes the fewest mistakes will win the game."

BCU's defense had some early success, holding the Hurricanes to seven points on their first three red zone chances. Miami missed a field goal and Devin James made a fourth-down stop to give BCU possession.

The Wildcats had one late scoring threat after Kyle Smith's 29-yard pass to Trenten Jackson put the ball at the Hurricane 20, but a pass to Tyrese Spain in the end zone was broken up as time expired.

Akevious Williams completed nine of 18 passes for 42 yards, while Aaron Thompson rushed for 29 yard on five carries and Spain caught three passes for 17.

Jimmie Robinson returned six kickoffs for 103 yards, and punter Bryce Coward had 11 kicks – one shy of the single-game record shared by the late Zach Adrian and Stacey O'Neal for 377 yards, tying him for fourth on the single-game punting yards list.

Jamauri Laguerre and Marquis Hendrix each had six tackles to lead the BCU defense.









GAME THREE RECAP: BETHUNE-COOKMAN 22. MVSU 6

ITTA BENA, Miss. – What Bethune-Cookman will remember from this 21st night of September is a career half from Isaac Washington and a defensive effort that maintained the status quo as the Wildcats downed Mississippi Valley State 22-6 at Rice-Totten Stadium.

Washington rushed for 149 yards – 117 in the first half as the Wildcats (2-1) registered their eighth consecutive victory over a Southwest Athletic Conference opponent dating back to 2006 in their first appearance at the stadium where Jerry Rice played his college ball since 1968.

"That's the kind of back Isaac is," said BCU Head Coach Terry Sims. "We always knew he was a hard runner who has a good speed and great vision. The game is slowing down for him -- he understands it better and did a good job of keeping us in the game."

The Delta Devils (0-3) took a 6-2 lead on Jarius Clayton's nine-yard pass from Dejeric Bryant with 25 seconds remaining in the first quarter.

BCU answered on Washington's longest run of his career – a 57-yard burst that made it 9-6 with nine minutes remaining in the half. Later, Washington capped off an 84-yard drive with a 21-yard run that let the Wildcats take a 15-6 halftime lead.

The Wildcat offense struggled in the second half, managing just three total yards in the third quarter, but the defense stopped three potential scoring threats to preserve the lead.

"We got a little too comfortable and went away from what we were doing in the second quarter," said Sims, particularly annoyed with BCU's giving up eight third down conversions. "We can't play a football game like that and move forward in conference play. We'll take the win as it is, but we have to put a better product on the field."

Rashon McNeil's interception and Marques Ford's fourth down sack were among the key plays.

Akevious Williams added an insurance touchdown with 5:30 remaining, turning the corner and getting a block on a third down run into a 38-yard that made it 22-6.

After two scoreless first halves in the first two games, the defense registered the first points thanks to a Bryce Coward punt that Marcus Riley downed at the MVSU 2. Two plays later, Marquis Hendrix and Judas McKenzie combined to register the safety.

Williams finished with 98 yards rushing and completed 10 of 21 passes for 76 yards. Jimmie Robinson caught three passes for 29 yards. BCU finished the total yards battle ahead 357-244.

Hendrix finished with 12.5 tackles to pace the defense. Four of Coward's seven punts landed inside the 20-yard line.

"Bryce was huge," Sims said. "He flipped the field and changed the field position many times. That was a great job of placing the ball."

BCU opens Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference play next Saturday at Howard.

NOTES: BCU is 2-1 for the first time since 2015 ... MVSU's six points were the fewest for a BCU opponent since the Wildcats beat Lane 7-3 in 2015 ... This was the first time in nine games BCU has outgained the opponent. The last time? MVSU at homecoming last year ... Que'shaun Byrd made his return to the field with eight carries for 27 yards ... The defense finished with six sacks -- most since Morgan State last year and only gave up three plays longer than 20 yards .. Sims is now 21-0 when leading at halftime.

GAME FOUR RECAP: BETHUNE-COOKMAN 37. HOWARD 29

WASHINGTON, D.C. – So much for those slow starts ... and those second half doldrums as Bethune-Cookman opened Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference play with a 37-29 victory over Howard Saturday at Greene Stadium.

Akevious Williams rushed for 101 yards and a career-high three touchdowns as the Wildcats (3-1 overall, 1-0 MEAC) won their league opener for the first time since 2015 and snapped a two-game losing streak to the Bison (1-4,1-1).

After three games without an offensive score in the first quarter, BCU scored on its first two offensive possessions, both culminating with Williams touchdown runs en route to leads of 14-0 and 24-7.

Howard closed to 24-21 on Quinton Williams' 12-yard run with 12:39 remaining, but the Wildcats answered with a nine-play, 72-yard drive that gave BCU a 31-21 lead with 11:51 remaining.

"We wanted to start out fast, but then we sputtered," said BCU Head Coach Terry Sims, who won his 30th game overall and his first against Howard. "In the first quarter, we settled down and ran our offense...we weren't doing anything different. We weren't pressing or trying to win the game on one play.

"In the third quarter, guys were doing their own thing and got comfortable with the lead," Sims added. "We thought we could take our foot off the gas and gave up too many yards and let Howard back in the game."

Trevor Merritt's interception gave BCU the ball back, and the Wildcats matriculated it on a seven-play between the tackles march that produced an eight-yard Que-Shaun Byrd touchdown with 5:28 to play for a 37-21 advantage.

"We got back into form," Sims said about the 13-0 run. "We trusted the plays that were called and ran the offense."

The Bison closed to one possession on Damion Gillespie's 20-yarder from Williams with 3:26 left, but Jamauri Laguerre recovered the onside kick, and a 32-yard Williams to Jimmie Robinson completion on third down helped BCU run out the clock.

Isaac Washington scored BCU's other touchdown on a two-yard second quarter run set up by Robinson's 92-yard kickoff return after Howard's first touchdown.

Williams, who posted his second career 100-yard rushing game, also completed 16 out of 23 passes for 199 yards, including a 44-yarder to Marcus Riley on BCU's first play from scrimmage.

Robinson finished with four catches for 55 yards and 147 yards on three kickoff returns. Byrd rushed eight times for 43 yards and caught one pass for 40, while Taron Mallard had four catches for 37 yards.

"Akevious managed the game well," Sims said. "Byrd is back in game shape and Jimmie's going to have a big day every day."

BCU's defense, which also had a fourth down stop in the third quarter that helped preserve the lead, forced five sacks.

The Wildcats host Morgan State next Saturday at Daytona Stadium at 4 p.m.
