QUICK HITTERS

- Belmont Basketball returns to game action November 19 vs. Oral Roberts.
- Belmont, Gonzaga, Kansas and Oregon are the only NCAA Division I programs to win 20 or more games 14 consecutive seasons.
- Belmont, Gonzaga, Kansas and San Diego State are the only NCAA Division I programs to win 19 or more games 19 consecutive seasons.
- Belmont has earned postseason play 15 of the last 19 years. That includes NCAA Tournament appearances in 2006, 2007, 2008, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015, 2019 & 2020.
- Belmont has won 20 conference championships (eight tournament, 12 regular season) since 2006. Only Gonzaga and Kansas have won more conference championships over that span.
- Belmont has 121 victories since the start of the 2020 season, ranks T-13 nationally to start 2024-25
- Belmont has posted 347 conference wins since 2003 (includes tournament), second to Gonzaga nationally.
- Belmont's 433 victories since 2007 leads the state of Tennessee - including Tennessee, Memphis and Vanderbilt.
- Belmont won an OVC-record 30 consecutive conference games from Jan. 30, 2020-Feb. 24, 2021.
- Belmont is the only school in the nation to win 20 or more games nine consecutive seasons in men's and women's basketball.
- Belmont, Gonzaga, Princeton and Buffalo are the only four programs outside the autonomous conferences (plus Big East/AAC) to win NCAA Tournament games in men's and women's basketball since 2019.
- Belmont will play 13 games vs. teams who were Q1/Q2 in the final 2023-24 NET rankings.
- Belmont is among select programs with two or more first-round selections in the NBA Draft over the last six years.
- This marks Belmont's third season in the Missouri Valley Conference.

BRUIN TRACKS



Former Belmont men's basketball All-American Ian Clark ('13) earned a regular season roster spot on the NBA New Orleans Pelicans and completed six years in the association. Clark won an NBA Championship ring with the Golden State Warriors in 2017. The Memphis, Tennessee native became an integral member of the Pelicans 2017-19, averaging 6.7 points per game in 60 game appearances last season. As part of New Orleans' playoff push, Clark buried a decisive 3-pointer in Game 1 of the Pelicans' opening round sweep of Portland, and scored a playoff career-high 18 points vs. Golden State in the NBA Western Conference semifinals. He averaged 11.0 points per game on 49 percent shooting after the NBA All-Star break. Clark led Belmont to three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and four consecutive regular season conference championships, standing as Belmont's NCAA Division I era career leader in points (1,920) and made three-point field goals (340). After strong performances in the Portsmouth Invitational and Orlando NBA Summer League for the Miami Heat, Clark latched on with the Golden State Warriors for 2013 Vegas NBA Summer League. Clark would score a then-record 33 points in the championship game, leading Golden State past Phoenix en route to Championship Game Most Valuable Player honors. Though Clark would ultimately agree to a two-year deal with the Utah Jazz, his impression upon the Golden State organization was undeniable. After closing the season with the Denver Nuggets - and shining with the team from the Mile High City in summer league - Clark and Golden State got together. But emblematic of his career journey, nothing would be handed to Clark; he would have to earn a regular season roster spot. And that meant beating out a collection of accomplished perimeter players from major conference programs, including former NCAA champion and No. 3 overall pick Ben Gordon. Clark is close friends with Stephen Curry and was part of Curry's pre-game warmup antics. He scored a career-high 36 points at San Antonio March 11. Clark won another championship in 2022, claiming the Australia NBL Championship with the Sydney Kings, reconnecting with former Golden State teammate and No. 1 NBA Draft selection Andrew Bogut. He currently plays for Melbourne.

Ben Sheppard was selected by the Indiana Pacers with the No. 26 pick in the 2023 NBA Draft. The Atlanta native led Belmont to 98 victories and three conference championships during his decorated career, impressing NBA organizations throughout the pre-draft process. Beyond individual workouts, Sheppard was among the top performers at the 2023 NBA Combine in Chicago, posting the fastest shuttle-run time and scoring a game-high 25 points in his final scrimmage. Sheppard averaged 18.8 points, 5.2 rebounds and 2.9 assists per game this past season as Belmont won 20 or more games for a 13th consecutive season. A finalist for the Lou Henson National Player of the Year award this past season, Sheppard posted 29 double-figure scoring games, including 12 games with 20 or more points. Sheppard was one of only four players in college basketball this past season with at least 600 points, 150 rebounds, 75 assists, 75 3-point field goals while shooting at least 40 percent from 3-point distance (Brandin Podziemski, Souleye Boum, Landers Nolley). The first player in the conference named Missouri Valley Conference Player of the Week three times this season, Sheppard was the only player this season named All-MVC First Team and MVC All-Defensive Team. Named to the Paradise Jam All-Tournament Team, Sheppard ranked among conference leaders in 16 statistical categories, including second in field goals made, third in total points and points per game and fourth in 3-point field goals made. The guard stood among select company in college basketball as players with at least 1,500 points, 450 rebounds, 200 assists and 100 steals. A two-time first team all-conference and NABC All-District selection, Sheppard joined program legends Clark and Kerron Johnson to earn first team all-conference honors in consecutive seasons in two different conferences. Sheppard was also runner-up for the Larry Bird Trophy - given to the MVC Player of Year. Among his notable performances, Sheppard scored a career-high 41 points at Tennessee Tech, a conference season-high 35 points at Murray State Feb. 1 and 33 points vs. Middle Tennessee Dec. 10. He made the game-winning shot at Bradley Jan. 21, game-winning free throws vs. Indiana State Feb. 22, and scored eight points in 100-seconds to give Belmont the lead late against Indiana State in the MVC quarterfinal round. Sheppard was one of the top Pacer players in efficiency in their run to the NBA Eastern Conference Finals. He and Derek Lively II of Dallas played the most minutes among rookies in the NBA Playoffs.

Dylan Windler played for the Atlanta Hawks, Los Angeles Lakers and New York Knicks in 2023-24. Windler played the previous four seasons with the Cleveland Cavaliers, after being selected No. 26 overall in the 2019 NBA Draft. The 6-7 guard told belmontbruins.com he had meaningful conversations with Knicks head coach Tom Thibodeau during NBA Summer League in Las Vegas and is excited to contribute to the storied franchise. Windler scored a career-high 15 points vs. Atlanta and made nine consecutive 3-pointers during a two-game stretch - the most for a Cav in six years. The Indianapolis, Indiana native led Belmont to 94 victories and three conference championships in his career, including A5 victories over UCLA, Georgia and Vanderbilt. Windler capped his career by helping the Bruins earn their first-ever NCAA Tournament victory with a win over Temple. Two days later, he scored a game-high 35 points against Maryland. As a senior, Windler averaged 21.3 points, 10.9 rebounds and 2.5 assists per game. He joined future Hall of Famer Kevin Durant as one of two players in NCAA Division I history to average 20.0 points, 10.5 rebounds and at least two made 3-point field goals per game in a single season. Windler became just the fourth Ohio Valley Conference player since 1971 to post at least 1,600 career points and 1,000 career rebounds (Popeye Jones, Kenneth Faried, Chris Horton). In fact, of the nine 30 point-20 rebound games in college basketball over the last two seasons, only Windler and South Dakota State All-American Mike Daum recorded multiple 30-20 games. He graduated 18th in college basketball history in effective field goal percentage (.640) and ranked fourth nationally in offensive efficiency by noted statistician Ken Pomeroy (Brandon Clarke, Zion Williamson, Matt Rafferty). Windler was a finalist for the Julius Erving Award and Lou Henson Award and was named All-District by the United States Basketball Writers Association (USBWA) and National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC). Windler averaged 12.2 points and 5.9 rebounds per game on 41 percent 3-point shooting in 11 game appearances for the Canton Charge of the NBA G-League last season - including 70 points over his final three games. He averaged 15.3 points and 10.6 rebounds per game for Canton in 2021-22. He currently plays for Perth.

Drew Hanlen is the CEO of Pure Sweat Basketball and has become the leading NBA Strategic Skills Coach & Consultant in the world. His client list includes NBA MVP Joel Embiid, All-Stars Jayson Tatum, Zach LaVine, Bradley Beal and rising stars Tyler Herro, Jordan Clarkson and RJ Barrett. As a honor student in entrepreneurship at Belmont, Hanlen built his business from the ground up, connecting with NBA Champion David Lee as his first client. As a senior point guard for Belmont in 2011-12, he averaged 10.8 points and 3.9 assists a game and ranked second nationally in 3-point field goal percentage. Real Leaders named Hanlen among the "Top 50 Keynote Speakers in the World," those who have stayed relentless in their commitment to making a difference, including Oprah Winfrey and Brene Brown.

Belmont University Athletics officially opened the Crockett Center for Athletic Excellence on May 27, 2021 with a ribbon-cutting ceremony and celebration.



CASEY ALEXANDER

HEAD COACH



Casey Alexander was introduced as the 10th head men's basketball coach in program history Wednesday, April 10, 2019.

He begins his sixth season as head coach in 2024-25.

Alexander's first five seasons as head coach at Belmont - succeeding hall of fame coach Rick Byrd - have been extraordinary.

Belmont's 118 victories since the start of the 2019-20 season rank tied for 13th nationally with Creighton, St. Mary's (CA), and Utah State - more than Alabama, Illinois, Auburn and Tennessee and among the likes of Gonzaga, Houston, Kansas and Purdue.

Belmont posted another 20-win season in 2023-24, joining the exclusive company of Gonzaga, Kansas and Oregon as programs to win 20 or more games in 14 consecutive seasons.

Alexander has also posted eight consecutive 20-win seasons himself (dating back to his tenure at Lipscomb) - one of only six active NCAA Division I head coaches, joining Dana Altman, Mark Few, Greg McDermott, Kelvin Sampson and Bill Self.

Alexander also has one of the best conference records in the nation over the last eight seasons, 109-31 (.779).

Belmont finished Top 3 in the Missouri Valley Conference in 10 statistical categories in 2023-24, and ranked among national leaders in 3-point field goal percentage, effective field goal percentage, assists and scoring offense.

Belmont has posted 17 all-conference honorees during Alexander's tenure, including three in 2023-24.

With two-time all-conference guard Ben Sheppard selected No. 26 by the Indiana Pacers in the 2023 NBA Draft, Belmont is among exclusive company with two or more first-round selections in the NBA Draft over the last five years.

Despite graduating program legends Grayson Murphy and Nick Muszynski and seven of the Bruins' top eight scorers, Alexander led Belmont to a 21-11 record in its inaugural season in the always-competitive Missouri Valley Conference.

Belmont earned season sweeps of regular season champion Bradley and 2022 regular season champion Northern Iowa.

Belmont's 14 conference victories also represented the most league victories in the nation for any program in its first year in a new league since 2016.

Sheppard, Drew Friberg, Ja'Kobi Gillespie and Cade Tyson earned MVC conference honors.

Belmont ranked Top 50 nationally in eight statistical categories, including seventh in 3-point field goal percentage and 17th in effective field goal percentage.

Alexander was also named finalist for the Skip Prosser Man of the Year Award for the third time, an award he received in 2018.

He joined the exclusive company of Mark Few, Tom

Izzo and Jay Wright as the only coaches in America to win 100 or more games and win four consecutive conference championships from 2018-21.

Belmont has earned national Top 25 poll votes to 11 of the last 13 seasons, while finishing the season ranked Top 100 12 consecutive seasons - joining the likes of Gonzaga, Saint Mary's (CA), San Diego State and Wichita State outside the autonomous conferences.

Following another impressive campaign, Belmont finished its decade in the Ohio Valley Conference with an 81-5 record at the Curb Event Center in league games. The Bruins finished first or second in conference standings 17 consecutive seasons (12 first, 5 second) before placing third in its inaugural Missouri Valley Conference season.

Belmont finished the 2021-22 season with a 25-8 record, and joined Saint Mary's (CA) and San Francisco as one of three programs (outside traditional multi-bid conferences) to earn at-large bids to the NCAA Tournament and National Invitation Tournament over the last 15 years.

The Bruins played one of the nation's toughest non-conference schedules, earning victories over four programs receiving national Top 25 votes - including Drake and Iona - en route to the ESPN Events Invitational Championship game, broadcast by Jon Sciambi and Dick Vitale.

Nick Muszynski, Grayson Murphy and Ben Sheppard earned First Team All-OVC and NABC All-District honors.

In 2020-21, Belmont went 26-4, which included 21 consecutive victories, an OVC record 30 consecutive conference victories (over two seasons, including tournament), national Top 25 poll votes eight consecutive weeks and the program's 12th regular season conference championship in 16 years.

Belmont also entered Selection Sunday with the most wins in America (26, Gonzaga).

The 1995 Belmont graduate was named 2021 Tennessee Sports Writers Association (TSWA) Men's Basketball Coach of the Year, was a candidate for the Naismith Men's Coach of the Year, and finalist for the Hugh Durham National Coach of the Year Award and the Jim Phelan National Coach of the Year Award.

Nick Muszynski and Grayson Murphy earned several national honors, while Luke Smith was named All-OVC Newcomer Team and CoSIDA Academic All-American.

Alexander led Belmont to Ohio Valley Conference regular season and tournament titles in 2020, and the program's ninth NCAA Tournament bid since 2006.

Alexander's 26 victories represented the most by any first-year head coach in NCAA Division I in 2019-20, and Belmont's victory at Boston College became the latest Power 5 Conference conquest.

Adam Kunkel, Grayson Murphy and Nick Muszynski earned All-OVC First Team honors, marking the third consecutive year Belmont had three players earn first team all-conference honors in the same season.

Moreover, Murphy joined NBA Champion Ian Clark as the second Belmont player of the program's NCAA Division I era to earn conference defensive player of the year honors.

One of the most instrumental contributors to Belmont's ascension to national prominence in NCAA Division I and NAIA, Alexander spent six seasons as head coach at Lipscomb University.

Alexander led Lipscomb to a 29-8 record in 2018-19, rewriting the program's record book from total wins, national top 25 poll votes and top 50 ranking in the inaugural NET ranking system. The Bisons won the Atlantic Sun Conference regular season championship and defeated Davidson, UNC Greensboro, North Carolina State and Wichita State in succession during an historic run to the 2019 Postseason NIT Championship game.

Earlier in the season, Lipscomb defeated No. 18 TCU for the program's first-ever victory over a nationally ranked opponent.

Prior to Lipscomb, Alexander spent two seasons as head coach at Stetson University. Inheriting a program that spent the previous decade under .500, Alexander led the Hatters to an 11-7 conference mark in Year 2, equaling the most league wins for Stetson since 1987.

Alexander spent two decades at Belmont; first as a player and later as a member of Rick Byrd's coaching staff.

A product of nearby Brentwood Academy, Alexander played point guard for Byrd at Belmont from 1991-95. He compiled a 119-25 record as a player, and helped lead Belmont to the top of the NAIA. As a senior in 1995, Alexander directed the then-Rebels to a 37-2 record, a No. 1 national ranking and an appearance in the NAIA National Semifinals.

From there, he spent 16 seasons as part of Byrd's coaching staff. Belmont won 287 games with Alexander on staff. Over Alexander's final eight seasons, the Bruins tallied 172 victories, six postseason appearances (four NCAA Tournaments, one NIT, one CIT), four Atlantic Sun Conference regular season championships, four Atlantic Sun Conference tournament titles, a remarkable 132-41 record in Atlantic Sun play, and road victories over Missouri, Alabama, and Cincinnati.

Alexander's final season as a Byrd assistant in 2011 was arguably the finest in program history; Belmont went 30-5 and led the nation in scoring margin.

Alexander played an integral role in the recruitment and development of Belmont standouts, such as NBA Champion Ian Clark ('13), Kerron Johnson ('13), Drew Hanlen ('12), Alex Renfroe ('09) and Justin Hare ('08).

Alexander was inducted into the Belmont University Athletic Hall of Fame in 2005.

He received a bachelor's degree in physical education from Belmont in 1995 and a master's degree in sports management from Austin Peay in 1996.

Alexander and his wife, the former Sunni Dixon, also a 1995 Belmont graduate, are the parents of three children: Allie, Reed and Mason.
