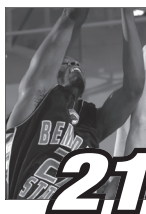
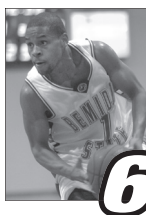

A Quick Look at the 2004-05 Season

2004-05

2004-05 Season Outlook

It is hard to fathom the changes that have taken place within the Bemidji State Men's basketball program in the eight months since the Beavers last stepped on the court. After arguably the greatest season in BSU men's basketball history, the 2004-05 squad is just a vague resemblance of the team that won its first Northern Sun intercollegiate Conference championship in close to 40 years and made its first-ever appearance in the NCAA Tournament. In addition to the exodus of head coach Jeff Guiot at the conclusion of the season; the team lost four players to graduation and eight players to other institutions via transfer. Needless to say the Beavers are building this year's team from square one. The foundation of the squad was put in to place late last spring with the hiring of 20-year veteran head coach Patrick Smith and his staff of assistant Gaston "Chachi" Rodriguez and graduate assistant John Cleaver. The final pieces of that puzzle are still finding their way into place as 17 new faces vie for the final 12 spots on the traveling roster.

The more things change the more they stay the same. Although the roster and coaching staff have undergone major transformations, Bemidji State basketball fans will see distinct similarities between the style of play they have become accustomed to seeing during the Guiot era and the game plan Smith intends to implement. Coach Smith's team will play a fast-paced, run-and-gun game and will do its fair share of scoring.

"We are not a very big team so we are going to have to rely on our strength and speed. I am a coach that believes in the run," Smith commented. "We are going to get out there, push the ball up the court and score points."

In addition to a similar style of play, the team's goals remain the same—to repeat as the NSIC regular season champions.

"We want to compete and contend on a regional basis and that means we need to beat some of the North Dakotas, South Dakotas, Minnesota States etc. so we are looking forward to the challenge," said Smith. "I am determined to send these four seniors out the same way they came in and that is by winning the conference championship," he added.

With close to 80 percent of its scoring gone, coach Smith has some work to do. The biggest hole to fill will be of 2004 All-American forward Charles Hanks. For three seasons Hanks led the Beavers in scoring and was a major force on the boards. He graduated as the second most prolific scorer in BSU men's basketball history amassing 1,613 points and 600 during his three years as a Beaver. But according to Smith, no hole in the roster is too big to fill.

"One thing I want our team, especially the returning players, to prove this year is that we can win another conference title without a Charles Hanks. As good as he was, I do believe any one player is replaceable."

The Returners

Headlining the cast of returnees is the 2004 NSIC Newcomer of the Year, senior point guard James Roberson. "Having James on our basketball team gives me a lot of confidence in our ability to succeed this year," commented Smith. "One thing I have learned in my 20-plus years of coaching is that it all starts and ends with your point guard. James is a guy that will not only make some big baskets for us, he is also a tremendous passer and has a great knowledge of the game."

Roberson is coming off an inaugural season at BSU in which he finished the season ranked fourth among his teammates in scoring with an 11.1 points per game average. He also emerged as one of the great floor generals in BSU history breaking the single-season assists record with 167 on the season. He shot .448 from the floor, close to .400 from behind the arc, .855 from the free-throw line and was second on the team with 34 steals.

Amir Major also figures to be a player Smith looks to this season. He returns for his senior season after appearing in 28 games last winter. He averaged 3.4 points per game while shooting .463 from the floor in a reserve role. "We are expecting big things from Amir this season. Last year he was a role player and we think that after playing in the league for a year and understanding what it takes to succeed at this level, he is ready for a breakout season."

Returning as one of the most prolific shot blockers in the conference, Ian Atkins will be a force in the paint for the Beavers this season. During the 2003-04 campaign, his 37 blocks in just 11.5 minutes per game helped the Beavers set a school record for blocks in a season with 119. "Defensively, I am glad he is on our team," said coach Smith. "He will be tremendous defensive presence at the end out our press where he can both block and alter shots." After a season as a role player Smith and his staff are looking for the senior to step up and assume more responsibility on the court. "We really want him to find a bigger offensive niche than he had last year. He has a nice little jump hook, allowing him to score inside but just as importantly he can crash the offensive glass and run the floor."

The Newcomers

Due to the limited numbers of returning players, Smith will need his corps of newcomers to

step right into the lineup and contribute from day one. One of the players he thinks can do that is 6-foot, junior guard Derrick Beechum. "I coached against him in junior college the last two seasons and I knew he was good, but what I have seen of him so far, he is a better player than I first thought. He is explosive and strong and has tremendous intensity."

Another aspect of his game that has Smith and his staff pleasantly surprised is the emergence of Beechum as a leader. "If there is one player that has stepped up for us to become a leader this year it is Derrick even though he it is his first season in the program," Smith said.

Another player that could make an impact on the floor this season is forward Spencer Carter. Carter comes to BSU after averaging 10 points and seven rebounds at Highland Community College last season. "Spencer Carter had some legitimate chances to play at the Division I level and chose to come with us. He's got a chance to make a tremendous impact on us this year. He is 6-7 and can play three positions, he's a tremendous offensive rebounder, plays with a relentless enthusiasm and loves to compete."

An All-American at Los Angeles Southwest College, 6-3 Duane Fields is another of the many players Smith is looking to step up. "Not only does he have great athletic ability, he has the talent to make other players around him better," commented Smith. "I don't think there is any doubt that he will be one of the guys that will compete for the newcomer of the year award I this league. As many new comers as we have I hope we have a lot of guys competing for that award."

The Schedule

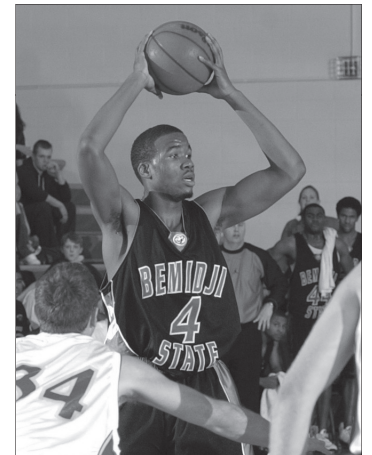
The 2004-05 schedule features three four-game road swings and a five-game homestand to wrap up December and begin the conference season in January. The slate features eight first-time opponents including Division I Iowa State while the Beavers are scheduled to face North Central Conference schools like Minnesota State, Augustana, St. Cloud State and North Dakota. Then it is on to the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference schedule where things will not get any easier for BSU. Northern State who is coming off a 24-7 season and is ranked 16th in the North Central Region Preseason Poll and is favored to win the NSIC championship headlines the group.

The 2004-05 schedule will test the Beavers early and continue right through the end of the conference season. BSU starts with exhibition game versus NCAA Division I Iowa State at the Hilton Coliseum in Ames, Iowa, marking the first time the Beavers have faced a Division I opponent since BSU traveled to Northern Arizona in December of 1991. Only to return to the region to face four NCC opponents in the team's next five including Augustana and Minnesota State in the Maverick's Pepsi Tip Off. Sandwiched between the quartet of NCC battles, the Beavers will open the home portion of the season with a non-conference match-up versus Lake Superior State. Then it is off to Colorado, where Bemidji State will pack their bags for a four-game road swing in the Rocky Mountains. BSU will visit Colorado Christian University, ranked No. 8 in the final regional ranking last season, and Regis University before competing in the Chuck Stephens Classic hosted by Colorado State-Pueblo. In the classic the Beavers are slated to face the host Thunderwolves and New Mexico Highlands University. Then it is back to Minnesota for St. Cloud State and North Dakota before the Beavers' final tune-up before the NSIC season versus Upper Iowa.

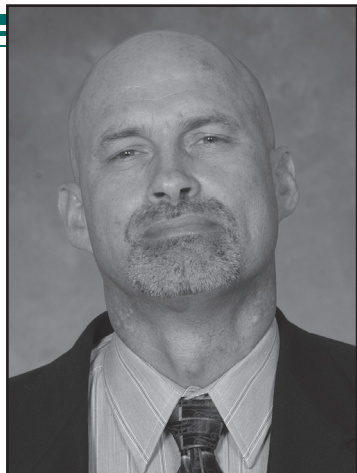
"We've got a tough slate first semester but I think the schedule can really help us if we use it correctly. What I really want to focus on is that we continually get better, day-by-day and game-by-game," commented Smith.

As the conference season begins, BSU will be the hunted. For the first time in close to 40 years, the team returns as the regular season champion. After walking through the NSIC season last winter with a 14-2 record and a perfect 8-0 mark in the conference at home, there are seven NSIC teams looking to avenge losses as the new season begins. The Beavers will begin their league itinerary hosting their first four league games; the downfall is that they will end the season with their final four games on the road.

"It is going to be tough this year because experience-wise, every team has us. But luckily the game is not played on experience, it is played on talent and who gels better and learns to play together." Smith added, "If I didn't like challenges I would have not followed coach Guiot and the season BSU had last year. We relish those opportunities and are looking forward to the challenges that lay ahead."

Patrick Smith

Head Coach

Patrick Smith became the 18th head men's basketball coach at Bemidji State May 6, 2004. He comes from Moberly Area Community College in Moberly, Mo. where he was head men's basketball coach and athletic director for each of the past three seasons.

"I am thrilled with Patrick because he is an optimist and really wants to get things done," said Director of Athletics Dr. Rick Goeb. "His positive approach really stood out. We got a coach who is a proven winner, who has great recruiting contacts and an excellent reputation. Everyone we talked to who knows him speaks highly of Patrick."

Before making the move to the NCAA and Bemidji State, Smith held head coaching positions at the junior college level for 20 years. Beginning at now-defunct Sue Bennett Junior College (Ky.) in 1982, Smith made his way from St. Catharine Junior College (Ky.) in the early 1980s and a pair of schools in Illinois from 1988-1994. After that, he passed through programs in Kansas, Texas and Missouri in addition to an assistant role at NCAA Division I, University of Miami.

Throughout his career there has been one constant for the native of Somerset, Ky. -- winning.

"I am fired up about this opportunity," said Smith. "I am impressed with the campus, the character of the players and the university's commitment to the athletic program as a whole. BSU has a good program in the recent past and I plan on continuing that success. I am tremendously excited and honored about coaching men's basketball at Bemidji State."

As head men's basketball coach and athletic director at Moberly since 2001, Smith engineered his program to an NJCAA Region 16 Tournament Championship and a 28-5 mark in 2003-04. He mentored freshman Eddie Smith to recognition on the NJCAA Division I All-America Honorable Mention team. His stay at Moberly saw his club take fifth place at the NJCAA National Tournament in 2001-02 and post a three-year mark of 69-32 (.683).

Smith spent five seasons at Jacksonville CC (Tex.) prior to Moberly where he enjoyed four winning seasons and a 78-65 (.545) overall log. His 1996-97 team made it to No. 14 in the NJCAA poll. He took a year off from his stint at Jacksonville to be an assistant coach at Miami in 1997-98 where he helped the Hurricanes advance to the NCAA Tournament for the first time in 38 years.

Turning around losing programs has been a constant attribute of Smith. His 58 wins in three years (1985-88) at St. Catharine Junior College (Ky.) followed a two-year span in which the program had just one combined win. At Lincoln Land CC (Ill.), Smith inherited a program stuck on losing. In his three years there (1988-91), he averaged 20 wins -- the 27 previous seasons, Lincoln compiled just one winning campaign.

Wabash CC (Ill.) did not have a winning record the three years prior to his arrival in 1991 posting a 47-52 overall record (.475). Smith came on board and tallied three 25-win seasons and finished seventh at the NJCAA National Tournament in 1992-93.

Overall, Smith has averaged 22 wins per season since 1991-92 and holds a 401-261 (.605) junior college career mark. Entering the 2003-04 season, Smith ranked No. 40 on the NJCAA winningest active coaching list. He is a six-time Coach of the Year ranging from conference to region honors.

Gaston "Chachi" Rodriguez *Assistant Coach*

Making his coaching debut at Bemidji State in 2004-05 as well as at the NCAA Division II level is Gaston "Chachi" Rodriguez. As BSU's top assistant, Rodriguez will handle recruiting, academic counseling and player development duties as well as a number of game-day and practice responsibilities.

Serving in coaching capacities at the high school and community college levels, Rodriguez brings 16 years of various coaching and administrative skills to BSU. He was the assistant men's coach at South Miami H.S. in 2003 and, prior to that, was the assistant at Dade C.C. from 2001-03.

Other coaching stops include head mentor roles at Champagnat Catholic High School (Miami) and La Progresiva Presbyterian School (Miami), assistant varsity coach at St. Brendan Senior High School (Miami) and camp instructor at the University of Miami and Marquette University. The Miami, Fla., native has held athletic director and assistant positions at several high schools as well.

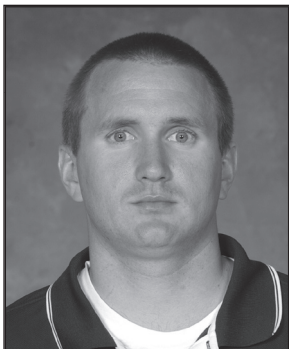
Rodriguez comes to Bemidji State with a background deep in the development of athletic and academic abilities in student-athletes while he is no stranger to a successful program at both the high school and junior college levels.

As an assistant coach at South Miami H.S., he was responsible for aiding the team to a 21-9 overall record and its first trip to Florida's 6A State Championship game since 1996. In his three seasons as head coach at Chamagnat Catholic H.S., Rodriguez's teams racked up and impressive 101-13 overall record appearing three consecutive FHSAA State Championship games and a No. 23 ranking in the final *USAToday* High School Poll of 2000. For his efforts and accomplishments during the 2000 season, Rodriguez was named as the recipient of the Dade County Coach of the Year Award.

A native of Miami, Fla., Rodriguez graduated with a bachelor's degree in business administration from Florida International University in 1995.

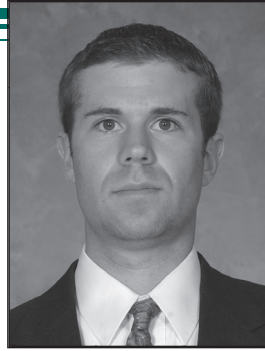

Also in his first season at Bemidji State, John Cleaver will fill the graduate assistant role on the BSU coaching staff with responsibilities in game preparation and player development.

Cleaver arrives at BSU after wrapping up his bachelor's degree at the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse. At UW-L, Cleaver was an assistant men's basketball coach from 2001-04. He also held responsibilities as an assistant event manager in the athletic department while coaching several YMCA youth basketball teams. The Oshkosh, Wis., native was a summer league coach for his high school Alma mater Oshkosh Lourdes High School in 2000. During his prep career at Lourdes, Cleaver was a team captain of the 1999 WISSA Division II State Championship Basketball Team.

Cleaver also has substantial basketball camp coaching and organizational experience. During the 2001-02 school year, Cleaver worked individual, team and skill theme camps for head coaches Tom Crean at the University of Marquette, Bo Ryan at the University of Wisconsin and Jack Bennett at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point.

Cleaver received his bachelor's degree in sport science-physical education from the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse in 2003. He is currently working toward his master's degree in sport studies at Bemidji State.

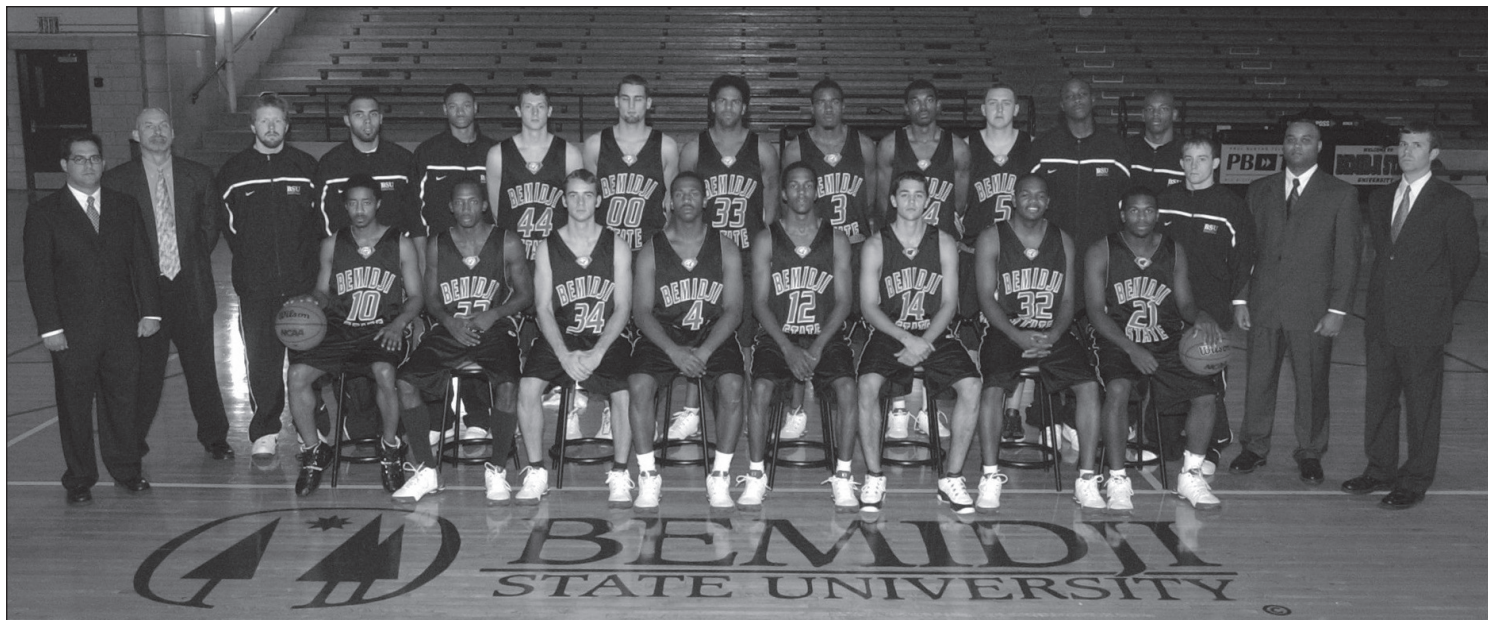

A Quick Look Back at 2003-04

A Season to Remember

The Bemidji State University men's basketball team ended a historic 2003-04 campaign with its first appearance in the NCAA Division II North Central Regional March 13. Reaching the 20-win mark for the first time in BSU history, the Beavers hung tough against No. 7 Nebraska-Kearney, but dropped a 104-90 decision in the NCAA Tournament first round. BSU held a 42-39 halftime edge against the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference institution but allowed the Lopers to shoot 63 percent in the second half.

BSU, which was honored with three 2003-04 All-Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference First-Team selections in addition to Coach of the Year, Player of the Year and Newcomer of the Year awards, won its eighth NSIC regular season championship and first since 1966-67 with a 14-2 league mark. There were 18 BSU and NSIC Tournament records set last season including team marks for field goals, blocks, rebounds and points.

The Beavers ran through the league with a perfect 8-0 home mark, the first time since the NSIC was formed in 1992-93 that BSU has accomplished that feat. Individually, senior Charles Hanks ended his legacy as perhaps one of the most successful players in BSU lore. Hanks, who became the first Beaver to be recognized to the Daktronics All-North Central Region First Team, became just the second athlete in the 71-year history of the conference to rank first in the league (NSIC games only) in points (21.5), rebounds (7.8) and field goal percentage (.636). Junior James Roberson topped the BSU season assists chart with 167—breaking the old mark by 22. Also, senior Adam Daley improved on his school season-best three-point total from a year earlier with 79 in 2003-04; he stands first on the career list with 152.

Head coach Jeff Guiot, who was named the first outright NSIC Coach of the Year in BSU history, announced his resignation from Bemidji State after the loss to Nebraska-Kearney. Guiot left for Southwest Baptist University, a Division II school in Bolivar, Mo., to take over head coaching duties at the Mid-American Intercollegiate Athletic Association institution.

Making the NCAA Tournament

BSU earned its first-ever berth into the NCAA Division II Men's Basketball Tournament, earning an at-large bid into the tournament's North Central Region. BSU, the No. 7 seed in the North Central, lost 104-90 to No. 2 seed Nebraska-Kearney in the first round. Kearney received an at-large bid to the Regional tournament after a 24-4 season and a loss to North Central Regional No. 1 seed Metropolitan State in the RMAC championship game.

Bemidji State posted a 1-4 record this season against teams in the North Central Regional. BSU dropped a 95-86 decision to then-15th ranked South Dakota State on Nov. 28; was beaten 88-79 by then-No. 3 South Dakota on Nov. 29; posted a 94-83 win over Northern State in Bemidji on Jan. 6; and lost at Northern State, 97-93, on Feb. 14.

Regionally Ranked

The Bemidji State men's basketball team ended the 2003-04 season ranked seventh in the North Central Region (Feb. 29) - the fourth straight week to be so honored. The ranking is the highest in school history and just the second ranking ever that BSU has enjoyed; the 1992-93 team held down the eighth-spot when the Beavers were members of the Great Lakes Region.

Bemidji State joined Northern State (fifth) as the only Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference teams in the poll. The Beavers faced four of the region's top eight programs this season - Nebraska-Kearney (second) South Dakota State (fourth), Northern State and South Dakota (sixth). BSU defeated Northern State, 94-83, Jan. 6, 2004.

Conference Champions

The 2003-04 Beaver squad turned around history in a big way. With a school-best 14-2 league mark, BSU won the 2003-04 NSIC Regular Season Championship for the first time since 1966-67 - the longest current drought among NSIC programs. In school history, the Beavers now have eight overall league titles, seven when they were members of the Northern Intercollegiate Conference (NIC). Since the NIC and NSC (women's former conference, Northern Sun) merged before the 1992-93 season, BSU earned its highest seed (No. 1) in the NSIC Tournament.

All-NSIC Honors

At the conclusion of the 2003-04 season, the Northern Sun Intercollegiate conference office announced that seniors Adam Daley and Charles Hanks and junior James Roberson were selected to the All-NSIC First Team. The three members of the 2004 All-Conference first team mark the first time BSU has landed as many as three on the squad.

Beaver men's head coach Jeff Guiot was tabbed as NSIC Coach of the Year for the first BSU coach in history to solely win such an award - Dave Hutchins shared the honor in 1971-72. Also, Hanks is the NSIC Player of the Year and Roberson the Newcomer of the Year. Hanks, who won the Newcomer of the Year in 2001-02, becomes the first Beaver ever to be recognized as the best performer in the league.

Stat Watch

Looking at the school career record books, senior All-American forward Charles "Buster" Hanks finished his career second on the school's top 10 career points list with 1,613 points. Also, he became BSU's fifth-best career rebounder with 600. Hanks ended the 2003-04 year fifth in the NSIC (league games only) with 1,021 career points (19.2 ppg); he had 354 career rebounds (6.2 rpg) in league play, which was good for 13th.

The Bemidji Bombers

In 2003-04, the Beavers ranked fourth in the country with 10.8 three-pointers per game (Mar. 21). That honor followed up an NCAA-best 11.7 three-pointers per game in 2002-03. The 2003-04 season-high was 18 against Northern State (2/14/04) with 18 games of 10+ this year.

Displaying their marksmanship from three-point range, the Beavers have gone 204 straight games with at least one three-point basket. The last time BSU went without a trifecta was against Wayne State (NE), Feb. 1, 1997. BSU has hit on four three-pointers or more in the last 89 contests, including five-plus in 65 straight games. Individually, junior guard Adam Daley had his streak of at least one three-pointer halted at 35 games against SW Minnesota State (1/17/04).

The Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference



Founded in 1932, the Northern Intercollegiate Conference (NIC) has enjoyed a varied existence in the upper Midwest region it calls home. In the spring of 1992, the Northern Sun Intercollegiate Conference (NSIC) was formed out of the merger of the NIC, the men's conference, and the women's Northern Sun Conference (NSC). The NSC had existed since 1979. The NSIC is currently made up of institutions from Minnesota, Nebraska and South Dakota. In the 1999-00 academic year, the NSIC became an expanded 10-team league from a previous seven-member conference. The conference will feature eight members in 2004-05.

Since 1932, various institutions have competed in the NSIC. Bemidji State University, Minnesota State University Moorhead and Winona State University are charter members and have remained in the conference for its 71 years of existence. The University of Minnesota Duluth, which departed following the 2003-04 season, was also an original member. Other current members joined in later years: Southwest Minnesota State University in 1969, Northern State University in 1978, Wayne State College (Nebraska) in 1998, while Concordia University-St. Paul and the University of Minnesota, Crookston became members in 1999. The University of Minnesota, Morris became a league member in 1966, however, the Cougars opted for the NCAA Division III ranks beginning in 2003-04.

Before the NSIC became eligible for National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) championship competition in 1995, its member institutions had an extremely rich tradition in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). The NIC's and NSC's tenure in the NAIA included several national championship teams and individuals as well as many national qualifiers.

In 2003-04, Minnesota Duluth captured their final NSIC All-Sports Competition trophy. The Bulldogs took home top honors in eight of 14 NSIC sports. Minnesota Duluth swept men's and women's cross country, indoor and outdoor track and field championships as well as women's soccer and women's tennis. The Bulldog women also won the 2004 NSIC Women's Basketball Tournament and advanced to the NCAA Division II Women's Basketball Tournament.

Winona State was second in the NSIC All-Sports Competition as the Warriors placed first or second in nine of the 14 conference sports in which they participate. Winona State won the men's golf title and shared top honors in football. The Warriors finished second in baseball, softball, women's golf, women's soccer, women's indoor and outdoor track and field and women's tennis. On the gridiron, Winona State achieved two firsts - hosting an NCAA playoff game and advancing to the second round of the playoffs.

Northern State University finished third in the all-sport standings. The Wolves won the 2004 NSIC Men's Basketball Tournament after finishing second in the regular season standings. Northern State also earned a berth to the NCAA Division II Basketball Tournament, its first since 1999. The Wolves were second in wrestling and finished third in men's indoor track and field and women's outdoor track and field.

Continuing to make their mark in the league, Concordia University-St. Paul was fourth in the All-Sports standings. The Golden Bears won the league titles in volleyball and women's basketball and shared the title in football while the softball team captured the tournament championship. Three Concordia-St. Paul teams advanced to their respective NCAA tournaments, volleyball, women's basketball and softball. The volleyball team won the North Central Regional title and advanced all the way to the national championship match where they finished as runners-up. The football team played in its first-ever post season game as they represented the league in the Mineral Water Bowl.

Other NSIC champions for 2003-04 include Southwest Minnesota State which captured its fourth-straight women's golf championship and its first softball title since 1998. Bemidji State won the men's basketball regular-season championship and participated in the NCAA tournament while Wayne State won the baseball tournament and advanced to the NCAA regional tournament. Minnesota State Moorhead won its second consecutive wrestling title.

The league gears up for the next school year with the annual NSIC Summer Kickoff Event the last weekend in July. The event includes the NSIC Golf Tournament, Hall of Fame Banquet, officiating clinics and meetings involving the conference leadership. The 2004-05 academic year will once again feature numerous premier events. The NSIC schools will again compete at the NCC/NSIC Volleyball Challenge in early September, this year hosted by Northern State. For the first time, the NSIC will sponsor a volleyball championship tournament, hosted by the regular-season champion. The men's and women's basketball tournaments return to campus as the teams will vie throughout the regular season for the right to host the tournament.

The Northern Sun Showcase television program (39 shows in last five years) returns to the airwaves again on Fox Sports Net. Also, the Northern Sun Spotlight radio show (over 100 shows the past five academic seasons) will air on several stations throughout the Midwest for 20 weeks during 2004-05 sports season.

Over the years, the NSIC, comprised of schools of modest size, has provided extremely competitive intercollegiate athletic programs for its members. Although the programs are not designed to be equal to Division I athletics, many former NSIC athletes have distinguished themselves in national and international competition. Each member school emphasizes the educational, entertainment and unifying value of sports while pointing with pride to the many advantages to be gained by attending these colleges and universities. As some affiliated with the conference have coined, the NSIC quite possibly is, "the most competitive conference in NCAA Division II."

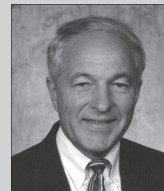

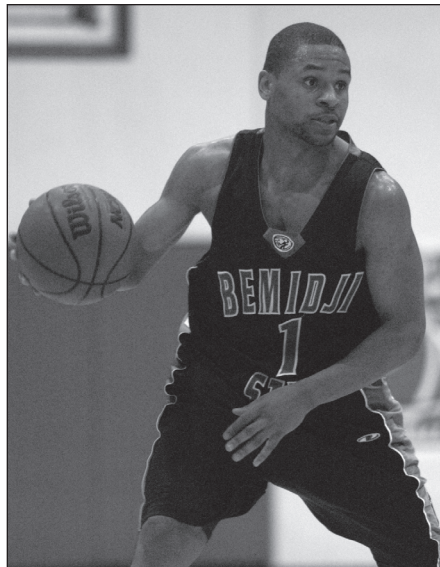

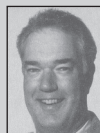

The 2,500-seat BSU Gymnasium, officially became home to the Bemidji State basketball program January 4, 1960 in front of a crowd of community members and dignitaries. The grand opening ceremony was led by the Governor of Minnesota Orville Freeman. Later that evening the Beavers broke the facility in with a 74-51 victory over the University of North Dakota. In nearly five decades since the building was opened, the facility has been home to the BSU volleyball and men's and women's basketball teams as well as a number of high school tournaments and playoff games. In addition the gym is also used for events ranging from concerts and recitals to faculty meetings and commencement ceremonies.

The BSU Gym is only a portion of the physical education complex that was erected beginning in 1959 with funds secured from the state legislature. The one million-dollar complex also houses a six lane Olympic size swimming pool, classrooms and offices for faculty and athletic staff. Encompassed at the gym-floor level are locker room facilities for all BSU athletic teams, faculty, staff and students as well as for visiting teams, officials and coaches. There is also space allotted for athletic training facilities and laundry and equipment rooms.

Not only does it house an array of activities, but perhaps more importantly it gives a distinct "home-court" advantage for the athletic squads that

use it. BSU fans and boosters of all ages are regularly seen sporting the green and white colors in peculiar styles.

As Governor Freeman said at the grand opening of the facility, "the one million dollars that the new Bemidji State College Gymnasium cost is not a debt, but an investment." Since that time countless student-athletes have called the BSU gymnasium their athletic home while spectators have come on droves to watch BSU events, proving that this really was an investment.

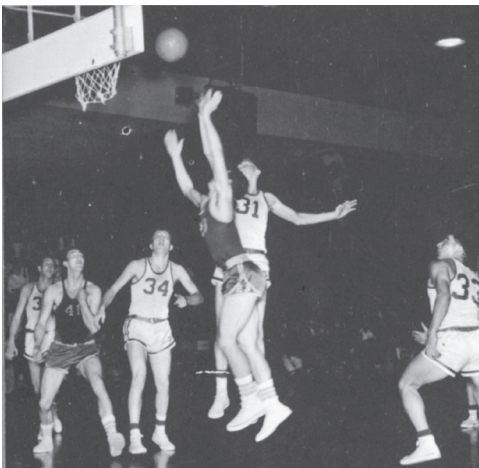
This fall the BSU Gymnasium was closed Oct. 6, to undergo a \$150,000 floor replacement project. The face-lift will not only give the 45-year-old facility an update and a fresh look, the new maple stripped floor will also be a softer, more athlete-friendly foundation.

The gym is scheduled to be ready for play again shortly after the first of the year--just in time for the Northern Sun intercollegiate Conference season.

After more than a decade of playing without a building to call its own, Bemidji State received news in the spring of 1937 that it had been allocated \$220,000 for campus building construction in a State of Minnesota legislative act. The funding for the building came close to 20 years after plans for a gym were included in the initial building plans of the university, but were dropped down the priority list and eventually scrapped.

Construction of Memorial Hall began on December 15, 1937, with plans to include a second gym, a swimming pool, an auditorium and several classrooms, but even before construction was started, it was realized that funds granted were insufficient. The college applied to the Works Progress Administration for aid, which was granted to construct the main gym first with the other parts of the complex to be added as more funding came in. No additional funds were granted to the college as all of the allotted funds--\$220,000 from the state and \$140,000 from the federal government--were used to complete "Plan A" of the project. When Memorial Hall was completed in the 1939, it was the largest WPA project in State of Minnesota at the time.

The Bemidji State basketball team officially called the gym home in the fall of 1939. Rueben Frost led the Beavers to a 13-4 overall record and a 8-1 record in Northern Intercollegiate Conference play garnering the school's first conference championship.

The building included the gym (also used as an auditorium), locker rooms, classrooms.

During two decades of play in 1,500-seat gym, the Beavers collected 160 wins while posting a .804 winning percentage. The building was witness to a pair of undefeated home slates. The 1944-45 team was 5-0 while the 1947-48 squad began a streak of 20-consecutive home wins with a perfect 10-0 home campaign.

Since the Beavers moved to the BSU Gymnasium in 1960, the gym has been used as a classroom, practice facility, and the temporary home to the university's library from 1996-2000 while the A.C. Clark Library underwent renovations.



Bemidji, Minnesota **FIRST CITY ON THE MISSISSIPPI**



The Bemidji area is home to a population of more than 30,000 and includes the Leech Lake, White Earth, and Red Lake Indian Reservations, and Lake Itasca, the headwaters to the Mississippi River. The City of Bemidji provides a focus for educational, business, and medical services. Recreational and cultural activities reflect a multicultural heritage that includes American Indian, European and Canadian influences.

Bemidji is a "golden city" along the river's bank, only miles from where the mighty Mississippi River begins its 2,552 mile journey to New Orleans and the Gulf of Mexico, a city at the center of the legends of Paul Bunyan and Babe the Blue Ox.

Bemidji's natural beauty and bounty as a meeting or group tour destination is also enhanced with historic character. From world renown statues and architecture listed on the National Register of Historic Places, to ancient earth mounds and burial grounds, the past takes an interesting turn in Bemidji.

Bemidji's waterfront is home to the world-famous statues of Paul Bunyan and Babe the Blue Ox listed in the National Register of Historic Places. Nearby is Bemidji's Tourist Information Center. In addition to Paul Bunyan memorabilia, The Bunyan House features the Fireplace of States built with stones from every state in the U.S. and Canadian provinces.

To the north, you'll encounter Library Park and the statue of Bemidji's founding Chief Bemidji, as well as the Community Arts Center in the Carnegie Building, also on the National Register.

At the south end of Lake Bemidji is Nymore Beach, site of the Crookston Lumber Co. The burning of the mill in 1924 marked the end of the county's logging era.

On the way into Bemidji, you may cross over the historic Mississippi River Bridge, built in 1916. This structure is listed on the National Register as one of the earliest

examples of a steel-reinforced concrete bridge. At the southern end of Minnesota Avenue lies the Great Northern Depot, completed in 1913. On the Historic Register, the Depot is the last early 20th century railroad building left in its original condition.

The Commercial Building on Third Street, built in 1910, is cited in the Architecture of Minnesota Guide as a successful prairie-style solution for a single-story building.

Other examples of historic architecture include the Beltrami County Courthouse built in 1902. Across the street you'll find the 1917 Colonial Revival-style former Post Office.

Perhaps Bemidji's best-known historic district is the eight-block section of Lake Boulevard. Once known as Bemidji's "Gold Coast," among the many venerable homes to be viewed is the Dr. Johnson House built in 1910 with a showcase garden.

The Bacon House was also built in 1910, later used for a Catholic convent. An unusual log structure, the Fisk House was reconstructed log-by-log at the present site. Judge Fisk enjoyed entertaining many distinguished guests, including writer F. Scott Fitzgerald. Further along you'll find Warfield House, the 1912 home of the man who built Bemidji's electric light plant.

Two lady teachers resided at the 1930s Parker & Mangelsdorf House, also known for its large, informal gardens.

Birchmont Avenue displays two art deco classics built in 1937, one with a semicircular glass projection, is located at Bemidji State University, the only lakeshore campus in the state with architecture dating back to 1919.

Located about midway between Minneapolis/St. Paul to the south and Winnipeg, Canada to the north, Bemidji has easy access by air, motor carrier, and automobile to metropolitan areas and international airports.

BEMIDJI STATE UNIVERSITY

Goals

Bemidji State approaches the 21st century with a deep sense of commitment to its region, a national reputation for quality programming and an international perspective for its 4,800 students. Founded on a sound liberal education, University programs are designed to educate students so that they may live as responsible, productive and free citizens in a global society.

History

Bemidji State began as a state Normal school in 1919, became a leading teachers' college in the region, and achieved University status in 1975. Currently, BSU recognizes over 28,000 alumni.

Academic Program

The only baccalaureate institution in northern Minnesota, Bemidji State offers over 70 major fields of study housed in one of three major colleges: Arts and

Letters, Social and Natural Sciences, and Professional Studies. Quality education is a priority at BSU, as many programs have earned national acclaim. The accounting program ranks among the nation's Top 10 in preparing students for the CPA examination, and scientific research has gained national exposure in a variety of fields.

Students / Faculty

Nearly 70 percent of Bemidji State students come from northern Minnesota, but the University broadens its services to attract students and faculty from diverse backgrounds and aspirations. Through teaching and informed attention to the educational needs of students, the University seeks to instill the spark of openness and commitment for lifelong learning. In fact, many BSU faculty members continue to pursue knowledge as specialists and educators in their fields.

Location

Bemidji State University lies in the heart of the city of Bemidji, midway between Minneapolis/St. Paul and Winnipeg, deep within Minnesota's lakes and forest region. With stands of pine, oak and birch reflecting the nearby presence of the northern woods, the east side of campus lines the shores of Lake Bemidji. The city of Bemidji, which serves a population of approximately 40,000, provides a regional focus for educational, business and medical services. Entertainment and activities include lively downtown Bemidji, shopping malls, theatre, art, downhill and cross country skiing and various forms of water recreation.

Facilities

The modern campus spans 89 acres on the shores of Lake Bemidji, including the recently-renovated Physical Education Complex which houses the John S. Glas Fieldhouse, host to several NCAA Championships. The BSU Gymnasium hosts the basketball and volleyball events, and a 3,000 square foot weight room, human performance laboratory, indoor track, and tennis, racquetball and swimming areas complete the complex.

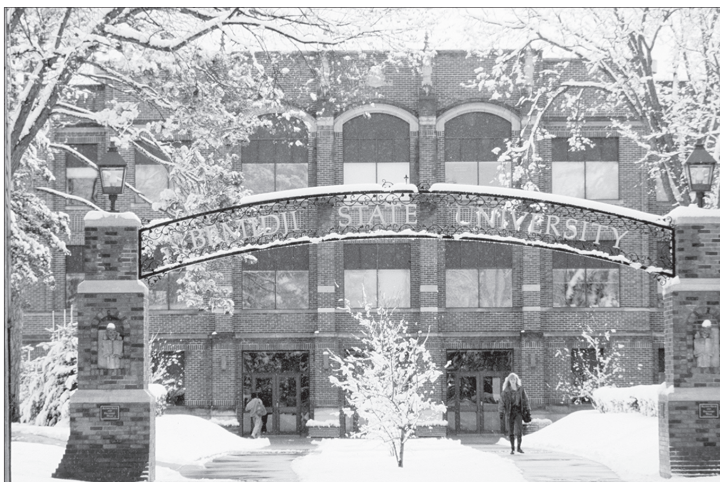
Football fans can catch a spectacular view of Lake Bemidji through the east end zone of Chet Anderson Stadium.

Internships

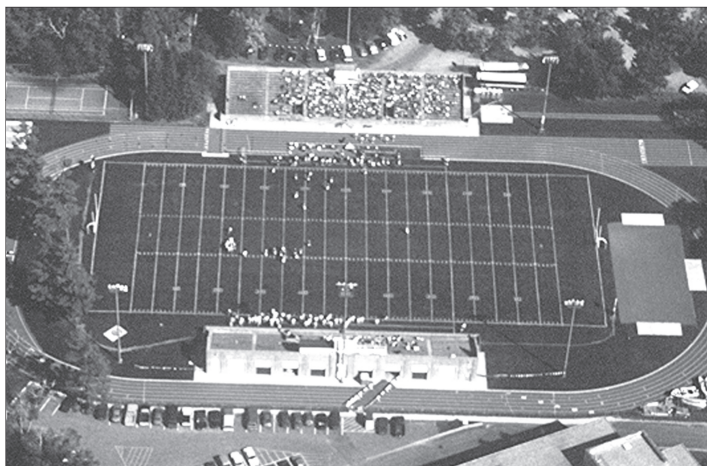
Each year, students complete internships with the NASA space program in Houston, Tex., Disneyland, Compaq, Rubbermaid and a host of architectural firms.

Media information

Internet Services

Bemidji State provides extensive Internet information resources for those covering BSU basketball and its other athletics programs.

The BSU athletics web site contains schedules, rosters, updated statistics and some historical information from previous seasons. Print-quality photos of BSU players and coaches are also available for download.

BSU's weekly game-notes package is completed and made available on-line Wednesday afternoons during the season, following the release of national statistics by the NCAA. BSU's game notes are in Adobe PDF format and will be distributed via electronic means only (e-mail or web). Due to the size of the release, it will not be regularly distributed via fax.

Game-Day Services

Gameday packages containing programs, game notes and other information will be available at press row prior to all home contests.

Final statistics include an official NCAA box score, game summary, individual and team statistics. Game notes and quotes from coaches and selected players will also be available. Telephone, copier and fax services are available on a first-come, first-served basis.

Credentials / Pass List

Season credentials will be issued to all media covering the Beavers on a regular basis.

For single-game passes and credentials, contact the BSU sports information office no less than 24 hours before the scheduled starting time of the event. Credential requests must be submitted via fax on official letterhead.

Credentials will be issued only to representatives of an accredited media outlet who will be working in an official capacity to cover a BSU athletic event. No credentials will be issued to friends, spouses, children or other family members.

Credentials remain the property of Bemidji State University and may be revoked at any time.

Interview Policies

All player interviews outside of post-game and practice time must be arranged through the BSU sports information office. For interviews with coaches, contact the sports information office at (218) 755-2763.

By NCAA rule, no player interviews will be available on gameday until the conclusion of that day's contest. Contact the sports information office with questions or for assistance.

Directions

Highway 2 passes through Bemidji east-west, and Highway 71 is the main north-south thoroughfare. Each leads to Bemidji Avenue/Paul Bunyan Drive. Follow Bemidji Avenue / Paul Bunyan Drive to 19th Street and follow to Birchmont Drive. BSU Gymnasium is on the left.

Who Are Boosters?

You are considered a booster or a representative of Bemidji State University Athletics interests if you:

- Participated in or are currently a member of any athletics department booster group, including Beaver Pride
- Have made a donation to the athletic program
- Have assisted or been asked to assist with recruiting of prospective student athletes
- Have assisted in providing benefits to enrolled-student athletes or families
- Have helped to promote BSU athletics or BSU athletic interests in any way

Once a person has become identified as a booster to BSU they retain that identity indefinitely even if they no longer support the athletics program.

Who Are Prospective Student-Athletes?

The NCAA defines a "prospect" as anyone who has started classes for the ninth grade.

In addition, a student who has not started classes for the ninth grade becomes a prospect, if the institution provides any financial assistance or other benefits not provided to any prospective student

What Are Permissible Activities by Boosters?

The following are activities that BSU boosters can participate in:

- May attend events such as contests or banquets where prospects are present so long as the booster is there on their own initiative. Boosters are NOT able to contact prospects or prospect's relatives at such events.
- Boosters can inform BSU coaches of prospects in their area by contacting the BSU staff and/or sending newspaper clippings about the prospect.
- Boosters may arrange employment for prospects. Prospects may not start the job until after completion of their senior year in high school, and compensation must be based on actual work performed at a normal rate.
- Boosters can continue to establish family relationships with friends and neighbors. Contacts with prospects are permitted as long as they are NOT for recruiting purposes and are NOT initiated by BSU staff members.

What is a Contact and what is Considered Recruiting?

A **contact** is any face-to-face encounter between a prospect or their parents/guardians and a BSU staff member or athletics representative (booster) during which dialogue occurs in excess of a greeting.

Recruiting is any solicitation of a prospect or the prospect's relatives by a BSU staff member or athletics representative (booster) for the purpose of securing the prospect's enrolment and eventual participation in the BSU intercollegiate athletics program.

Dr. Jon E. Quistgaard

Dr. Jon E. Quistgaard became the ninth president of Bemidji State University in August, 2001. The Minnesota State Colleges and Universities Board of Trustees named him to the position in late May, 2001 following a national search.

A member of the BSU community for 22 years, he had served since 1997 as the vice president for academic and student affairs. As the chief academic officer of the institution, he was responsible for academic programming in three colleges, integrative studies, distance learning, academic services, international student

services, counseling, career services, the American Indian Resource Center, and student development programs.

Quistgaard began his association with BSU in 1979 as an admissions representative. He became the director of admissions and advising in 1980; was named the dean of undergraduate admissions and graduate studies in 1988; served as acting vice president for academic and student affairs from 1993-94; and was the associate vice president for academic affairs and dean of academic services from 1994-1997.

Quistgaard is an active presenter on the national level in the areas of continuous quality improvement, challenges in higher education, planning, assessment models, and transforming higher education. He received a doctorate in political science from the University of Arizona, where he also earned his master's and bachelor's degrees in government.

A new era in Bemidji State University athletics began July 13, 2001 when Dr. Rick Goeb was named BSU's first full-time director of intercollegiate athletics.

Goeb directs a 17-sport varsity athletics program at BSU with NCAA Division I men's and women's ice hockey and 15 Division II sports.

Beaver athletics has undergone dramatic changes in Goeb's three years at the helm, having seen more than a dozen positions created or filled with new hires - including head coaches for women's hockey, men's and women's basketball, soccer, softball, baseball, women's golf and volleyball - and the hiring of the institution's first full-time athletics fundraiser.

The 2003-04 season may have been BSU's best ever. Men's hockey won College Hockey America and reached the title game of the CHA Tournament for the second consecutive season, men's basketball won the NSIC regular-season title reached the NCAA Tournament for the first time in its history and women's basketball hosted and won its first-ever NSIC playoff game.

In 2002-03, women's ice hockey turned in its finest season at the Division I level, men's and women's golf each had NCAA regional participants, and outdoor track had two individuals at the NCAA Championships. Additionally, nearly one in four BSU

student-athletes earned Academic All-Conference honors including two Academic All-America selections.

BSU's 2001-02 competition season, Goeb's first at the helm, was one of its most successful ever. Men's basketball hosted its first-ever NSIC playoff game; Jeanne Larson was selected to compete in the NCAA women's golf championship; Aaron Feia earned NSIC Athlete of the Year for the indoor track season and helped lead the BSU track teams to six individual NSIC crowns and baseball had its best season since 1997 and hosted the NSIC Tournament.

Goeb came to Bemidji State after six years as senior associate athletics director at the University of Alaska-Fairbanks. At Fairbanks, Goeb served as NCAA compliance officer, monitored academic eligibility and acted as the liaison for booster clubs.

Prior to his position at Bemidji State, Goeb spent two years as an administrator at North Dakota. Goeb also served as the head wrestling coach at St. Cloud State from 1990-93 when he was an instructor in physical education and a facility coordinator; was the strength and conditioning coach at Northern Colorado from 1989-'90; and served as an assistant wrestling coach at North Dakota State from 1988-'89.

Originally from Anoka, Minn., Goeb received his undergraduate degree at North Dakota State, where he was also a national wrestling champion. Goeb earned his master's from Northern Colorado and doctorate from North Dakota. He and his wife Carol have two daughters, Amber and Anne and one son, Jordan.

Andy Bartlett
Sports Information Director
Kansas State '95

Andy Bartlett is in his fourth year as Sports Information Director at Bemidji State. He directs all publicity and media relations operations for BSU's 17-sport athletics department, and directly handles the university's football, men's hockey and baseball programs.

Bartlett, 31, joined the BSU staff in May, 2001 after spending the previous eight years in the sports information office at Big 12 Conference power Kansas State. After one year as a student volunteer intern and two years as a graduate assistant, Bartlett was named Assistant SID at K-State in May, 1997. He directly oversaw K-State's baseball and volleyball programs and was involved with a variety of programs until moving to a newly-created position of Internet

Coordinator in 1999. He served two years in that position, overseeing one of the largest on-campus athletics sites in the nation.

Bartlett was a volunteer on the media services staff for the 2003 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Final Four in New Orleans, and has volunteered at numerous other Division I conference- and national-level post-season events.

He is an active member of College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). He is in his fifth year serving on the organization's Computer Committee and has been twice published in *CoSIDA Digest*, a monthly publication serving the organization's membership of more than 2,000 professionals.

In addition, he has won three CoSIDA awards for excellence in publications including a Fifth in the

Bartlett earned his bachelor of science degree in mass communication from Kansas State in 1995. Bartlett is married to the former Melissa Vene, a 1999 graduate of Bemidji State. He has a daughter, Megan (6).

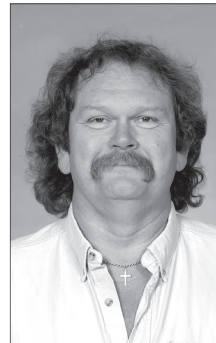

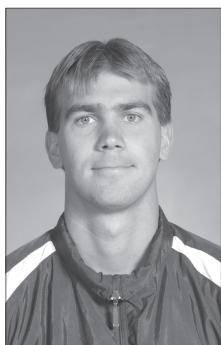

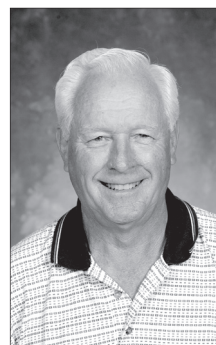
