**A**t first glance, one might think Bemidji State had this whole thing planned from the start. How else might you explain perhaps BSU's best team since joining the Division I ranks taking the ice the very same season the College Hockey America tournament champion earns its first-ever automatic qualifier to the NCAA Tournament?

But it appears that is precisely what will happen in 2002-03; Bemidji State will put a team on the ice this season which should contend for its first-ever CHA championship right out of the gates. And at the end of the year it will for the first time have its eyes squarely on the prize sought by every other college hockey program in the nation - a berth in the NCAA Tournament. The NCAA announced earlier this year the expansion of its hockey championship to 16 teams for 2002-03 and, subsequently, the CHA's first-ever automatic qualifier to the championship.

BSU returns the majority of its key players from its second-place CHA finisher of a year ago, including all five of its All-CHA honorees - including first-team all-conference wing **Marty Goulet** and CHA Rookie of the Year **Riley Riddell**. And success for this year could be an indicator of future success for the program - BSU will put just three seniors on the ice in 2002-03 and returns three players who earned CHA All-Rookie Team honors in 2001-02.

##### A look back at 2001-02...

The story of BSU's 2001-02 season could be wrapped up in one word - "maturation."

The Beavers dramatically improved as a team in their third year of life as an NCAA Division I program. BSU's 12-18-5 record in 2001-02 marked an eight and one-half game improvement from 2000-01, when the Beavers finished 4-26-4. In addition, BSU's 12 regular-season wins tied the 1999-00 team for most by a Beaver team in a Division I season and from Jan. 26-Feb. 9 the Beavers put together a five-game unbeaten streak which tied the school record in its Division I era.

BSU's development had to come against one of the most difficult schedules in school history. The Beavers played nine non-conference games against Western Collegiate Hockey Association foes, including five games against Minnesota, St. Cloud State and Denver when those programs were ranked either No. 1 or No. 2 in the nation. BSU posted its first win over a WCHA team since its elevation to Division I when it defeated Minnesota State-Mankato, 7-6, in an opening-night thriller, and also posted its first-ever win over a Central Collegiate Hockey Association program with a 7-5 win at Ferris State on Jan. 26.

**Tom Serratore**, in his first year as head coach at Bemidji State, led the Beavers on an impressive run through College Hockey America. He led the Beavers to a 21-day run tied atop the CHA standings, the first time BSU had been in first place in the conference since Jan. 1, 2000, before eventually finishing second in the league race and earning a first-round bye in the CHA Tournament. BSU also posted the program's second-best single season with 22 points in CHA play, surpassed only by a 23-point (8-8-1) season in 1999-2000, the CHA's inaugural season.

Under Serratore's guidance, BSU center **Riley Riddell** earned CHA Rookie of the Year and Second-Team All-CHA honors, while right wing **Marty Goulet** was named First-Team All-CHA. Goaltender **Grady Hunt**, a four-time CHA Defensive Player of the Week winner during the 2001-02 season, also earned Second-Team All-CHA honors. In addition, three Beavers - Riddell, center **Andrew Murray** and defenseman **Anders Olsson** - were named to the CHA All-Rookie Team.

Serratore was eventually named a finalist for the Spencer Penrose Award, given annually to the national coach of the year as voted by the American Hockey Coaches Association.

##### Expectations for 2002-03

BSU enters the 2002-03 season with just three seniors on its roster and returns all of its key performers from a year ago - including all five players who earned some form of All-CHA honors last year. So the team's question marks have more to do with finding the right combinations of players and less with repairing any gaping holes in their lines.

The Beavers will need to replace some valuable role-players at their forward positions, having lost strongman Frank Udovich, the crafty Says Phrakonkham and steady performer Todd Knott. But its first and second lines return intact, giving BSU guaranteed scoring production at the top of the lineup.

On defense BSU will need to replace its captain and heart and soul on the blue line, Mark Phenow. Phenow, who never missed a game at BSU and set a school record for games played by a defenseman, gave BSU a steady and resilient presence on the blue line. BSU will look to senior **Clay Simmons**, an All-CHA candidate at defenseman, to continue his strong play on the line and provide BSU with on-ice leadership.

Continued development of a backup goaltender to **Grady Hunt** might also be on BSU's agenda for this season. Junior **Dannie Morgan** showed flashes of brilliance a year ago, including his first career shutout in a 2-0 blanking of Connecticut early in the campaign, but failed to show consistency between the pipes late in the year.

##### Outlook: Forwards

The Beavers appear to be set at forward, returning every player from their top two lines. BSU's first line of **Jeff McGill**, **Andrew Murray** and **Marty Goulet** (pictured, next page) exploded onto the scene last year and became one of the deadliest scoring lines in the CHA. Goulet tied for the CHA scoring lead with 39 points and earned first-team all-conference honors. Murray became the first CHA rookie to score 15 goals and just the second CHA rookie to score 30 points in a season, eventually finishing ninth in the nation in rookie scoring. McGill scored a career-high 30 points, spending most of the year ranked amongst the CHA leaders. Goulet and Murray enter the 2002-03 campaign as legitimate pre-season candidates for CHA Player of the Year honors.

Things improve little for defenders when BSU puts its second line on the ice. **Wade Chiodo**, **Riley Riddell** and **Jared Hanowski** developed into a lethal combination midway through the season,

with Riddell eventually finishing second in the nation in rookie scoring and winning CHA Rookie of the Year and Second-Team All-CHA honors.

BSU's third and fourth lines could see some changes in 2002-03. BSU regularly rotated eight players in the six positions on the third and fourth lines, and five of those players return. Those five returnees - **Travis Barnes, Brendan Cook, Donnie DeMars, Kurt Knott** and **Bill Methven** - combined to score just 20 points a year ago, likely leaving newcomers **Lou Garritan, Jean Guy Gervais, Ryan Huddy** and **Myles Kuharski** the opportunity to make an immediate impact at any of the three forward positions below the second line.

### Outlook: Defensemen

**Clay Simmons** and **Bryce Methven** will stand sentinel as BSU's top blue-line unit. The duo combined to score 38 points a year ago; Simmons is BSU's power-play quarterback and possesses one of the strongest slap-shots in college hockey, while Methven is a punishing presence on the boards and one of the more physical defensemen in the CHA. Both will be candidates for all-conference recognition in 2002-03.

**Anders Olsson**, a CHA All-Rookie Team pick a year ago, returns but will need a new linemate on BSU's second line with the departure of Mark Phenow. Eight of Olsson's nine points last year were scored against CHA opposition. **Jesse Balsimo** and **John Haider** held down third-line defense duties a year ago; both return for this season and should continue to provide BSU a solid presence on the line. **Ben Lindell** returns on defense, as does **Peter Jonsson**; Lindell played just one game in 2001-02, while Jonsson sat out the year as a redshirt.

BSU brings in just one new face in its defensive corps for 2002-03 - freshman **Andrew Martens**.

### Outlook: Goaltenders

Bemidji State returns **Grady Hunt**, a junior goaltender who as a sophomore a year ago earned second-team All-CHA honors. Hunt had the inside track on first-team all-conference honors and possible CHA Player of the Year honors as well after an incredible start which saw him post an 8-0-3 mark in his first 11 CHA starts. That streak capped an amazing 15-game run, dating back to 2000-01, in which Hunt went 10-1-4 against College Hockey America opposition.

But as BSU struggled down the stretch in 2002, going winless in its final eight games to close the campaign, Hunt's numbers declined as well. Hunt took each decision during BSU's late-season swoon, going 0-6-2 in his last eight decisions and giving up four or more goals in five consecutive games for the first time in his career.

BSU's coaches expect **Dannie Morgan** to bounce back and have a productive season as Hunt's backup, but are looking to newcomer **Kelly Shields** to develop into a legitimate presence between the pipes as well.

### Outlook: Schedule

At first glance, BSU's slate for 2002-03 appears to be far more favorable to the Beaver cause than did its 2001-02 schedule. BSU tackled perhaps the most brutal schedule in school history a year ago, playing five games against teams ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the nation at the time of the game,

and against opponents who finished the 2001-02 season a combined 42 games over .500. But based on last year's numbers its 2002-03 slate should be easier to stomach.

While BSU's non-conference slate finished the 2001-02 season a combined 43 games over .500 with a .569 winning percentage - including three NCAA Tournament teams - BSU's non-conference lineup this coming season finished a combined 10 games under .500 in 2001-02 with an aggregate winning percentage of just .483. Only one opponent on BSU's 2002-03 schedule finished last season more than two games over .500 - that being Nebraska-Omaha, which finished 21-16-4 and fifth in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association. Only two others - Sacred Heart at 16-14-4 and Clarkson at 17-15-6 - finished above .500. And only Neb.-Omaha won at least 20 games last year, while in 2001-02 BSU played three 20-win non-conference foes, including 30-game winners in Denver and Minnesota. None of BSU's 2002-03 foes made the 2002 NCAA Tournament.

BSU finished second in the CHA a year ago and clearly enters 2002-03 with similar, if not higher, expectations for success. But the league will not be an easy road; only BSU and Findlay (11-22-2) finished below .500 last year. The CHA race will be wide open from the start, but one thing is certain - how a team finishes the season will be more important than how it starts. BSU's returning core of stars and a less-devastating non-conference slate should help this team build confidence and, in turn, wins as the season progresses.

Combine BSU's expectations for performance in the CHA and its potential success against non-conference foes with a strong returning team, and on paper you have what BSU's coaches hope to see - the strongest Bemidji State team in the program's Division I era, entering the season with a legitimate opportunity to earn the CHA's first-ever automatic NCAA Tournament bid.

To say **Tom Serratore** took over the Bemidji State men's hockey program with the proverbial "big shoes to fill" was perhaps the understatement of all time. After all, he needed only to look at the trophy case running the length of the John Glas Fieldhouse entryway - and the 13 small-college national championship trophies it encases, won by future hockey Hall of Fame member R.H. "Bob" Peters - to see the legacy he was being asked to continue. And not only did he have the challenge of rebuilding one of the true dynasties in the history of collegiate athletics, but also continue its maturation and growth as a Division I program.

"I can't approximate what Coach Peters did at BSU. No coach can," Serratore said.

Perhaps not, but after a stellar debut campaign in 2001-02, there should be little doubt that the Bemidji State men's hockey program is in the right hands. In Serratore's first year as BSU's head coach, the Beavers dramatically improved as a team in their third year of life as an NCAA Division I program. BSU's 12-18-5 record in 2001-02 marked an eight and one-half game improvement from 2000-01, when the Beavers finished 4-26-4.

In addition, BSU's 12 regular-season wins tied the 1999-00 team for most by a Beaver team in a Division I season. From Jan. 26-Feb. 9, 2002, the Beavers put together a five-game unbeaten streak which tied the school record in its Division I era.

Serratore took over the reigns for BSU after having spent the previous three seasons as the associate head coach for R.H. "Bob" Peters. Brought on board in August 1998, Serratore helped Peters oversee the transition of the BSU program from a small-college dynasty to the ranks of Division I.

#### **• Prior to BSU...**

Serratore came to the Beaver hockey program after spending five years as the recruiting coordinator for Western Collegiate Hockey Association member St. Cloud State University. He helped the Huskies to a 96-84-15 record, including three 20-win seasons and four WCHA Final Five berths during his tenure. Serratore recruited several National Hockey League draft selections while at St. Cloud State, including Matt Cullen, Mark Parrish and Josh DeWolf. He also was an assistant coach for the 1998 WCHA All-Star Team which participated in the Kolin Cup in Zug, Switzerland.

Serratore began his coaching career as an assistant coach at Brainerd (Minn.) High School (1987-'91), and took his first head coaching job at Henry Sibley High School (1991-'93), leading Henry Sibley to a Class A third-place finish at the State Tournament. An active member of USA Hockey for the past seven years, Serratore coached the USA Hockey Select 17 camp in 1994.

#### **• Playing career**

Serratore knows first-hand the tradition of BSU men's hockey, having played three years under Peters in the mid-1980s. He was a three-year letterwinner at forward for BSU from 1985-'87 and played in three NCAA Division III Tournaments. Serratore was a member of BSU's 1986 NCAA Division III national championship team and captained the 1986-'87 team. He averaged 1.03 points per game in his BSU career (1986--20 goals, 23 assists, 1987--12 goals, 27 assists).

#### **Family matters...**

Pictured to the right, Tom Serratore and his brother Frank Serratore, the head coach at CHA rival Air Force, are part of an exclusive club as one of just two combinations in Division I (any sport) where family members coach against each other in the same conference in the same sport.

The only other such combination currently active is Bobby Bowden (Florida State) and his son Tommy (Clemson) in football in the ACC.

The youngest Serratore won bragging rights with his elder brother in the first edition of the family showdown, as BSU captured the season series from Air Force, 2-0-1. However, BSU's tie with Air Force helped knock the Beavers out of first place in the CHA.

Frank Serratore was a goaltender at Bemidji State during the 1980-81 season. He posted a 6-0-0 record with one shutout in 10 games played between the pipes for BSU.





## ASSISTANT COACHES

### Bert Gilling

Minnesota-Duluth '99  
Fourth Year at Bemidji State

Bert Gilling is entering his second season as assistant coach Bemidji State and his fourth year with the program.

Gilling holds responsibilities as BSU's academic advisor and strength coach. As academic advisor, Gilling has helped raise BSU's team overall GPA to 3.29. On the ice, he helps oversee BSU's defensive corps.

"Bert is extremely organized," BSU head coach Tom Serratore said. "Take a look at our academics last year; he holds our guys accountable, and that carries over onto the ice."

Gilling joined Serratore's staff as an assistant after having served as an assistant under former BSU coach R.H. "Bob" Peters from 1999 until Peters' retirement in spring 2001. Under Peters, Gilling held responsibilities for game-plan preparation, practice sessions, video breakdown and also served as the team's bench and core defense coach. In addition, Gilling held numerous other responsibilities within the BSU program ranging from recruiting to academic advising to strength-and-conditioning programs.

"Bert brings continuity to our staff after two years as a graduate assistant," Serratore said upon Gilling's promotion to assistant coach in the spring of 2001. "He has a bright coaching mind that will help shape our young defensive core. He brings a wealth of experience in strength and conditioning, as well as academics, to our program."

As a player, Gilling was a four-year letterwinner, senior captain and member of the 1998-99 Captain's Committee at Minnesota-Duluth. There, he built a reputation as one of the finest defensemen in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association. He was nominated for the 1997-98 WCHA Defensive Player of the Year award and was a member of the 1998 WCHA All-Star team which participated in tournament in Zug, Switzerland. He won school awards as Duluth's top freshman in 1995-96 and won the Bob Junkert Plus/Minus Award in 1995-96.

A native of Alexander, Manitoba, Gilling played junior hockey with the Estevan Bruins of the Saskatchewan Junior Hockey league from 1992-95. During his junior career, he won two team MVP (1994, 1995) and two team Most Valuable Defenseman (1994, 1995) awards, was the Most Valuable Rookie during the 1992-93 campaign and won the inaugural Bill Shinske Ethics Award in 1995.

In addition to his playing laurels, Gilling has also compiled an impressive academic resume. In 1999, Gilling was a nominee for the College Hockey Humanitarian Award, was nominated for WCHA Student Athlete of the Year and was named the Rasmussen Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year at Duluth. Gilling was a three-time Academic All-WCHA honoree, a member of the Dean's List and received the Top Scholastic Player award from his junior club in 1993. He began graduate studies at Bemidji State in 1999 and in 2000 was named a Beck Scholarship award winner.

Shawn Kurulak is entering his second season as an assistant coach with Bemidji State, having joined the program last year after stints with the Denver Pioneers and Colorado Avalanche. Kurulak maintains responsibilities as BSU's recruiting coordinator, oversees video breakdown and assists with the team's defensive corps.

"Shawn has evolved into an excellent recruiter," BSU head coach Tom Serratore said. "He has a great passion for recruiting and is a tireless worker."

Kurulak starred for the Pioneers during a four-year career that began in 1995. He spent the 1999-00 season as a volunteer assistant coach on the Denver staff, assisting with developing and implementing game plans and strategies, and coordinating and supervising the varsity team practices.

He was active in Denver's 2000 summer camp program, developing and executing lessons and supervising junior instructors. He also handled administrative functions of the camp and helped prepare classroom demos.

In the modern era of sports, breaking down and analyzing game film has become a form of art. Kurulak brings the Beaver program a great deal of expertise in this area, having served as video coordinator during his stint as an assistant at Denver. He also held a four-month internship with the NHL's Colorado Avalanche from Nov. 1999 to Feb. 2000 in which he served as the team's assistant video analysis coach. In that role, Kurulak assisted with all facets of game-tape production, editing and distribution for a franchise that would reach the Western Conference Finals.

Kurulak played junior hockey for the Melfort Mustangs of the Saskatchewan Junior Hockey League from 1993-94. He was voted team co-captain for 1994 and that year was also selected to participate in the SJHL all-star game.

Former Bemidji State standout Marc Lafleur returns to Tom Serratore's staff for his second year as a graduate assistant.

"Marc Lafleur is a young, enthusiastic coach who is very committed to making this his profession," Serratore said. "He knows the ins and outs of the Beaver program and it's good to have him back with us."

Lafleur turned in a stellar playing career as a center for the Beavers from 1995-99. He played in 109 games, scoring 37 goals and 64 assists for a total of 101 points, tied for 49th on the BSU all-time scoring list and one of just 51 players in school history to top the 100-point plateau for his career. His 64 assists are tied for 41st on the all-time list.

The Beavers won 80 games during Lafleur's career, including the 1996-97 Division II national championship. He served as the team's alternate captain as a senior in 1998-99, the last year before the program advanced to the Division I ranks.

Lafleur earned his bachelor of science degree in physical education from Bemidji State in May, 2000. He has put his degree to work as a physical education teacher at Hearst High School in Hearst, Ontario; a substitute

teacher in the Morris, Minn. school district and as a student teacher in Cass Lake, Minn. He holds teaching licenses in both the state of Minnesota and the Canadian province of Ontario.

Lafleur has previously served as head hockey coach of the Morris Area Tigers, competing in section 4A of the Minnesota State High School Hockey League. He is currently working on his advanced-level certification for the Canadian National Coaching Certification Program.

Lafleur was a four-time All-NCHA Academic Scholar during his playing days at Bemidji State and was a United States Achievement Academy All-American Scholar.

He also hosted a weekly television program, "Hockey Talk with Marc Lafleur."

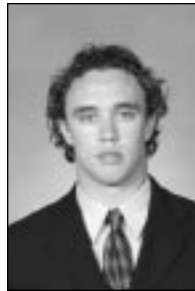

## A LOOK BACK AT 2001-02

### **BSU ends 2001-02 at 12-18-5**

Bemidji State men's ice hockey continued its maturation process, dramatically improving as a team in its third year of life as an NCAA Division I program. BSU's 12-18-5 record in 2001-02 marked an eight and one-half game improvement from 2000-01, when the Beavers finished 4-26-4. In addition, BSU's 12 regular-season wins tied the 1999-00 team for most by a Beaver team in a Division I season and from Jan. 26-Feb. 9 put together a five-game unbeaten streak which tied the school record in the Division I era.

BSU's development had to come against one of the most difficult schedules in school history. The Beavers played nine non-conference games against Western Collegiate Hockey Association foes, including five games against Minnesota, St. Cloud State and Denver when those programs were ranked either No. 1 or No. 2 in the nation.

BSU posted its first win over a WCHA team since its elevation to Division I when it defeated Minnesota State-Mankato, 7-6, in an opening-night thriller, and also posted its first-ever win over a Central Collegiate Hockey Association program with a 7-5 win at Ferris State on Jan. 26.

**Tom Serratore**, in his first year as head coach at Bemidji State, led the Beavers on an impressive run through College Hockey America. He led the Beavers to a 21-day run tied atop the CHA standings, the first time BSU had been in first place in the conference since Jan. 1, 2000, before eventually finishing second in the league race and earning a first-round bye in the CHA Tournament.

BSU also posted the program's second-best single season with 22 points in CHA play, surpassed only by a 23-point (8-8-1) season in 1999-2000, the CHA's inaugural season.

Under Serratore's guidance, BSU center **Riley Riddell** earned CHA Rookie of the Year and Second-Team All-CHA honors, while right wing **Marty Goulet** was named First-Team All-CHA. Goaltender **Grady Hunt**, a four-time CHA Defensive Player of the Week winner during the season, also earned Second-Team All-CHA honors. In addition, three Beavers - Riddell, center **Andrew Murray** and defenseman **Anders Olsson** - were named to the CHA All-Rookie Team.

### **Serratore named Penrose finalist**

Head coach **Tom Serratore** was named one of 14 finalists for the 2002 Spencer Penrose Award, given annually to the nation's top coach by the American Hockey Coaches Association.

"It is a great honor," Serratore said. "It means your players had success, and as a team we improved a lot from the previous year. It means Bemidji State is recognized as having a competitive team, and we did well in the conference this year. This is an honor you share with everybody involved in your program."

Serratore's nomination for AHCA National Coach of the Year completed a sweep for BSU, as head women's coach Jason Lesteberg was a finalist for the Association's national award on the women's side. BSU and Minnesota were the only programs in the nation to see both their head men's and head women's coaches amongst the finalists for AHCA National Coach of the Year in 2001-02.

Finalists for the Penrose Award are automatically determined by selecting the top vote-getters

from conference coach of the year ballotings as well as coaches who take their teams to the Frozen Four.

### **Goulet ties for CHA scoring lead**

Junior wing **Marty Goulet** tied Air Force's Derek Olson for the College Hockey America scoring title with 39 points. Goulet's effort tied Olson and Alabama-Huntsville's Nathan Bowen for fifth-best in CHA history.

### **Five Beavers earn All-CHA honors**

Five Bemidji State Beavers earned some form of All-College Hockey America honors after the team's 12-18-5 campaign, including first-team All-CHA pick **Marty Goulet** and CHA Rookie of the Year **Riley Riddell**.

Goulet became BSU's first First-Team All-CHA honoree after tying for the league's scoring title, and Riddell was the first player win four league Rookie of the Week awards en route to becoming BSU's first CHA Rookie of the Year.

Riddell also earned Second-Team All-CHA honors, as did goaltender **Grady Hunt**, while Riddell, center **Andrew Murray** and defenseman **Anders Olsson** held three of the six spots on the All-Rookie Team.

### **BSU fares well on CHA leaderboards**

As would be expected for a team which went into the season's final two weekends contending for the league championship, the Bemidji State Beavers were well-represented on the College Hockey America individual leaderboards in most scoring categories.

**Marty Goulet** tied for the CHA scoring title with 39 points, spending seven consecutive weeks atop the league scoring leaderboard down the stretch, and at 1.11 points per game finished 26th in the nation in scoring average.

**Riley Riddell** won BSU's only other individual scoring crown, leading the CHA and finishing second in the nation in rookie scoring with 32 points (0.91 ppg). Riddell fell just one point shy of the CHA's all-time single-season record for rookie scoring - 33 points by Air Force's Andy Berg in 1999-2000.

In total, BSU had two players in the Top 10 in scoring, three in the Top 10 in goals scored and two in the Top 10 in assists.

### **BSU places 7 on CHA academic team**

Seven Bemidji State men's ice hockey players earned a spot on the 2002 College Hockey America Academic All-Conference Team. The BSU skaters were part of a league-record 51-member Academic All-CHA Team.

**Travis Barnes**, **Marty Goulet**, **Todd Knott**, **Jeff McGill**, **Bill Methven**, **Bryce Methven** and **Dannie Morgan** earned Academic All-CHA honors for the Beavers. The seven honorees for BSU on the 2002 All-Academic Team matched its previous total for the first two years of the CHA's existence

combined. BSU had two members on the 1999-2000 All-Academic Team and five on the 2000-01 squad.

**Todd Knott** and **McGill** were BSU's first-ever repeat Academic All-CHA selections, having also earned Academic honors in 2001.

BSU's All-Academic performers helped the Beavers post a team GPA of 3.12 during the Fall 2001 semester. Fourteen of 26 BSU players posted a GPA of 3.20 or better during the fall semester, while 18 players finished with a 3.0 or better.

To be eligible for Academic All-CHA honors, student-athletes must have completed at least one year of residency at the institution, have a grade-point average of 3.00 (on a 4.00 scale) for the previous two semesters or qualify with a cumulative 3.00 GPA.

### **"Axe" inks pro deal**

Senior **Frank Udovich** signed a contract to play with the Reading (Pa.) Royals of the East Coast Hockey League shortly after the team returned from the 2002 CHA Tournament. Udovich joined the Royals, a farm team of the NHL's Los Angeles Kings, on March 19 for the team's final seven regular-season games. He ended the season in injured reserve.

Udovich scored five points in 27 games for Bemidji State in 2001-02, including a career-high three goals. He finished third on the team with 17 penalties and led the Beavers with 53 penalty minutes. In his four-year BSU career, Udovich played 77 games and scored eight points (six goals, two assists).

#### The Birth of a Conference

College ice hockey's continuing development and expansion received another boost during the summer of 1999 with the formation of **College Hockey America**. The seven charter members of College Hockey America were the United States Air Force Academy (Colorado), University of Alabama-Huntsville, United States Military Academy (Army-New York), Bemidji State University (Minnesota), University of Findlay (Ohio), Niagara University (New York), and Wayne State University (Michigan). (The United States Military Academy departed the CHA for the MAAC after the inaugural season.)

"Hockey at all levels is experiencing unprecedented growth and popularity," said CHA Commissioner Bob Peters. "The advent of College Hockey America is a monumental and historic event evidencing this growth at the collegiate level. To quote the late Bob Johnson, legendary college, Olympic and National Hockey League coach, 'It's a great day for hockey'."

College Hockey America is the sixth NCAA Division I men's ice hockey conference, joining the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA), Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC), Hockey East Association (HEA), Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference (MAAC) and Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA).

#### Leadership

In its inaugural season, the CHA coaches brought a collective 95 years of coaching experience, 1,754 wins and 33 postseason appearances to the conference. R.H. "Bob" Peters, who accepted the role of CHA Commissioner after retiring from coaching, was the dean of CHA coaches with more than 740 wins. The CHA was fortunate to have the guidance and leadership of WCHA commissioner Bruce McLeod for its first two years. McLeod worked with the seven league coaches and was instrumental in establishing the conference in 1999.

#### Something Old, Something New

The CHA encompasses programs steeped in tradition, such as Bemidji State and Air Force and former Division II power Alabama-Huntsville, to up and coming programs Niagara, Wayne State and Findlay.

Bemidji State and Alabama-Huntsville competed for the Division II national championship six times in the 1990's with the Beavers winning four and the Chargers winning two, and the two teams have now carried that rivalry to Division I in the CHA. Bemidji State, which began playing hockey in 1948, had won a total of 13 national championships at the small college level before making the jump to Division I.

Air Force began its program in 1968 and under the direction of fifth-year head coach Frank Serratore, the Falcons have experienced a new level of success, earning two straight trips to the postseason.

Niagara began its Division I hockey program in 1996 and posted a winning season each of its first four years, culminating in a NCAA Elite Eight berth in the 1999-2000 NCAA Tournament. Findlay also started its program in 1996 and the Oilers earned trips to the postseason the last two years. Wayne State's program was started in 1999-2000, and in just its second year, the Warriors captured the CHA Tournament championship last season.

#### Inaugural Season

The CHA made a splash in Division I hockey in its first year as an official conference as regular season and conference tournament champion Niagara earned an at-large bid to the 2000 NCAA Championship. The Purple Eagles landed in the West Region and advanced to the second round after defeating New Hampshire 4-1 at Mariucci Arena in Minneapolis, Minn. NU fell to eventual national champion North Dakota 4-1 in the second round.

#### CHA Championship

In addition to a challenging non-conference schedule and 56-game conference slate, College Hockey America will conduct a postseason championship tournament for the fourth straight year. This year's tournament will take place March 14-16, 2003 in Kearney, Neb.

#### Automatic NCAA Qualifier

For the first time ever, the 2003 CHA Champion will receive an automatic berth into the NCAA Championship. The NCAA Tournament expands to 16 teams for 2002-03.

# BEMIDJI STATE *Men's Hockey 2002-03*

## R.H. "BOB" PETERS



While the early building blocks were already in place, it was not until R.H. "Bob" Peters took the reigns as the program's fifth head coach in 1966 that Bemidji State University hockey began to take shape as a recognizable masterpiece. And although Peters himself would not claim to be an artist, he constructed a 35-year dynasty at Bemidji State which remains unparalleled in the world of collegiate athletics.

Peters entered the college hockey head coaching ranks in 1964 as bench boss at the University of North Dakota. During his initial campaign, Peters, the eventual Western Collegiate Hockey Association Coach of the Year, led the Fighting Sioux to a WCHA title and a third-place finish at the NCAA Championships. He coached in Grand Forks for two seasons, leading the Sioux to a 42-20-1 mark before making a career decision that would change the face of collegiate hockey.

Peters left the Division I powerhouse in 1966 and took over a small-college program in the early stages of its existence - at Bemidji State University. Within two seasons Peters led BSU to its first national championship and set the foundation for what would become one of the most dominant programs in college hockey.

Thirty-five years later, Peters retired from coaching with one of the most impressive lists of achievements in the history of collegiate sports - 744 victories as a head coach, 702 coming at Bemidji State alone to make Peters the first coach to win 700 or more games at a single school, 13 small-college national championships, and still-standing national collegiate records for most wins in an unbeaten season (31-0-0 in 1983-'84) and longest unbeaten streak (43 games from Nov. 8, 1983 to Jan. 1, 1985). Today, only one coach in the sport - Michigan State's Ron Mason - has won more games at the collegiate level.

Peters, the only coach to lead a team to a national championship game in three divisions of college hockey and the only coach to reach the Final Four in all four divisions (Division I, III, III and NAIA), developed five NHL players and numerous Olympians and All-Americans.

A 1960 graduate of the University of North Dakota, Peters spent his collegiate days as goaltender for the Fighting Sioux. He coached at the high school level for one season before rejoining the UND staff as an assistant coach.

Although now retired from coaching, Peters remains heavily involved in the sport of college hockey. His latest challenge is overseeing the continued growth of the fledgling College Hockey America conference, having been named the league's commissioner on April 27, 2001.

"It is with great enthusiasm that I look forward to extending my commitment to the growth and development of collegiate hockey," Peters said.

College Hockey America is the third conference Peters has been involved with as a founding member, and with more than four decades of experience in college hockey Peters' leadership will prove invaluable as the CHA evolves.

"I am extremely enthusiastic about this new aspect of my college hockey career," Peters said. "We have a committed membership group with tremendous vision and a very strong understanding of Division I hockey."

The original concept for the CHA began with Air Force head coach Frank Serratore and then-BSU head coach Peters at the 1998 hockey meetings in Florida. The conference sprang forth the following year with a full league schedule in the 1999-2000 season. Then in the fall of 2001, under the guidance of Peters, the CHA gained an automatic bid for its tournament champion in the 2003 NCAA Tournament.

In addition to appointing Peters CHA commissioner, the CHA athletic directors approved the recommendation by the coaches to name the regular-season championship trophy in honor of Peters as the **R.H. "Bob" Peters Cup**—an appropriate honor capping an illustrious coaching career.

Peters' influence on college hockey also has stretched outside the arena. He has proven his administrative skills at Bemidji State by serving as athletic director and head hockey coach, and he lent service to several committees. Under Peters' guidance, BSU hockey progressed from NAIA to NCAA Division III to NCAA Division II, and in 1999, BSU elevated its hockey program to Division I. He served on championship committees for the NAIA and NCAA for over 20 years, and in 2001 was named a Hobey Baker Legend of Hockey.

Peters continues to provide administrative assistance to the Bemidji State athletic department in addition to his role as CHA commissioner.

### Memorable Moments in the Peters era

**April, 1966-** R.H. "Bob" Peters becomes the fifth Beaver hockey head coach after a two-year stint as head coach for the University of North Dakota.

**March 9, 1968-** Bemidji State captures the school's first national championship in any sport, winning the first-ever NAIA National Tournament with a 5-4 overtime victory over Lake Superior State. Over the next 12 seasons, the Beavers would capture six more NAIA national crowns.

**March 10, 1968-** The first Bemidji State All-Americans are named--Terry Bergstrom, Terry Burns, Barry Dillon, Bryan Grand and Jim McElmury. Beavers would produce over 80 All-America selections through the years.

**Winter, 1970-** Jim McElmury, Charlie Brown and Bryan Grand help the U.S. National Team to the World B Championship while still remaining active members of the BSU roster.

**Winter, 1972-** Jim McElmury and Charlie Brown help carry the USA to the silver medal at the Olympics in Sapporo, Japan.

**March 3, 1973-** Bemidji State wins its fifth NAIA national title with a 3-2 overtime win at Lakehead.

**Feb. 25, 1979-** BSU wins its sixth NAIA championship with a 5-1 win over Concordia-Moorhead.

**March 2, 1980-** Bemidji State wins its seventh NAIA national title with a 4-3 win over Michigan-Dearborn.

**Nov. 8, 1983-** Bemidji State begins 31-0 season march with a 9-1 win over Winnipeg. The Beavers would capture the school's first NCAA Division II national title with an 8-1 win over Merrimack March 18. BSU would continue its win streak to an NCAA-record 43 straight games.

**March 21, 1986-** Bemidji State picks up a game-tying goal at 19:56 of the third period versus RIT, and moves on for the 5-4 overtime win en route to its first NCAA Division III national championship. The Beavers beat Plattsburgh State 8-5 to cap the tournament run, winning the school's ninth title.

**March 19, 1993-** Bemidji State welcomes back the NCAA II National Championship series with a two-game sweep of Mercyhurst to win the school's 10th national title. In addition to the 1993 national title, the Beavers would win NCAA Division II crowns in 1994, '95 and '97 to bring the total to 13 national titles in the program's 42-year history.

**May 26, 1998-** Bemidji State announces that it will move the men's hockey program to NCAA Division I status beginning with the 1998-99 season.

**Feb. 9, 2001-** Peters leads Bemidji State to a 6-2 win over Niagara, his 700th victory as BSU's head coach. Peters was the first college hockey coach to lead one school to 700 victories.

Bemidji State's 1983-84 season saw the Beavers not only bring home their eighth national championship - and first at the Division II level - the program also set a still-standing collegiate hockey record for most victories in an unbeaten season with 31 (31-0-0).

### In Memory of Galen Nagle

Bemidji State University and the Galen Nagle Memorial Fund Committee have established a memorial scholarship fund in honor of the former Beaver hockey standout, designed to support the Bemidji State hockey program.

Galen W. Nagle was a goaltender for the Beaver hockey team from 1980-'84, and served as a coach and teacher in the state of Minnesota for several years before losing his life to cancer Oct. 18, 1996 at the age of 34.

"Galen exemplified Beaver hockey," said former Bemidji State coach R.H. "Bob" Peters. "Hard work, dedication and loyalty were inherent to his character, and through his efforts, he became a vital part of our team."

Nagle and the 1984 Beaver hockey team made college hockey history with a perfect 31-0-0 season en route to the school's first NCAA Division II National Championship. An All-Tournament selection from the 1984 Division II Championship, Nagle completed his Bemidji State hockey goaltending career with an 8-1 victory in the title game.

Initially a walk-on at Bemidji State, Nagle's determination and willingness to give forged a special bond with teammates and coaches. He never lost a game in goal for Bemidji State, posting a 22-0-0 career record with three shutouts. He allowed just 37 goals in his career, leaving Bemidji State as the program's all-time leader in save percentage (.9308) and goals-against average (2.039) - records that still stand today.

"Galen considered it a privilege and an honor to be a part of the team, and conversely, we valued his contribution to the team," Peters said. "He has had a lasting impact on the lives of the people he touched, and we will always remember him."

A 1984 graduate of Bemidji State, Nagle taught industrial arts at Scotts-Highland Middle School in Apple Valley for several years and coached in hockey programs at Rosemount, Holy Angels Academy, Richfield, Bloomington, Wayzata and Thief River Falls. He also served as the chief goalie instructor for Coach Peters' Bemidji International Hockey Camp at BSU.

Nagle was born to Richard and Marlys June 18, 1962 in Baudette, Minn. He and his family moved to Bemidji in 1979, and he graduated from Bemidji High School in 1980. An annual golf tournament was inaugurated in his honor Aug. 7, 1998.



### Hobey Baker winner Joel Otto

A 1984 graduate of Bemidji State, Joel Otto spent four seasons making his mark in the Beavers hockey program under coach R.H. "Bob" Peters. The three-time All-America selection helped the 1984 BSU squad make history en route to the school's first NCAA Division II National Championship and only the second perfect season in NCAA hockey history at 31-0-0. BSU set a college hockey record for most wins in an undefeated season and remain one of just five unbeaten, untied teams in the history of the sport. The perfect season helped BSU build a 42-game winning streak, another still-standing collegiate record.

Otto captained BSU's 1983-84 national champions, scoring 32-43=75 points and leading the team in assists, scoring and short-handed goals (4). Otto earned Division II All-America honors for his efforts.

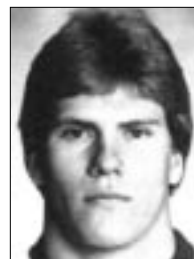
In addition, Otto was the 1984 recipient of college hockey's most prestigious honor, the **Hobey Baker Memorial Award** (Division II).

Otto departed Bemidji State in 1984 and went on to a lengthy career in the NHL. He played 14 seasons in the NHL for the Calgary Flames (1984-'95) and Philadelphia Flyers (1995-'98), finishing his career with 195-313=508 points in 943 games played.

Otto exemplified sportsmanship, perseverance and dedication on the ice. His playing style earned a host of accolades in the NHL, including nominations for the Frank J. Selke Trophy, awarded to the best defensive forward, and the Bill Masterton Memorial Trophy, awarded to the league's top player representing dedication and sportsmanship.

Drafted by Calgary in 1984, Otto's game-winning goal in Game Seven of the 1989 Smythe Division Finals served as the impetus for the Flames' Stanley Cup Championship run later that year.

Otto would earn another memorable championship in 1996, driving Team USA to the World Cup of Hockey Championship as an alternate captain.

### WELCOME TO BEMIDJI



#### **The City of Bemidji**

The Bemidji area is home to a population of more than 30,000 and includes the Leech Lake, White Earth, and Red Lake Indian Reservations, and Lake Itasca, the headwaters to the Mississippi River. The City of Bemidji provides a focus for educational, business, and medical services. Recreational and cultural activities reflect a multicultural heritage that includes American Indian, Scandinavian, European, and Canadian influences.

Bemidji is a "golden city" along the river's bank, only miles from where the mighty Mississippi River begins its 2,552 mile journey to New Orleans and the Gulf of Mexico, a city at the center of the legends of Paul Bunyan and Babe the Blue Ox.

Bemidji's natural beauty and bounty as a meeting or group tour destination is also enhanced with historic character. From world renown statues and architecture listed on the National Register of Historic Places, to ancient earth mounds and burial grounds, the past takes an interesting turn in Bemidji.

Bemidji's waterfront is home to the world-famous statues of Paul Bunyan and Babe the Blue Ox listed in the National Register of Historic Places. Nearby is Bemidji's Tourist Information Center. In addition to Paul Bunyan memorabilia, The Bunyan House features the Fireplace of States built with stones from every state in the U.S. and Canadian provinces. To the north, you'll encounter Library Park and the statue of Bemidji's founding Chief Bemidji, as well as the Community Arts Center in the Carnegie Building, also on the National Register. At

the south end of Lake Bemidji is Nymore Beach, site of the Crookston Lumber Co. The burning of the mill in 1924 marked the end of the county's logging era.

On the way into Bemidji, you may cross over the historic Mississippi River Bridge, built in 1916. This structure is listed on the National Register as one of the earliest examples of a steel-reinforced concrete bridge. At the southern end of Minnesota Avenue lies the Great Northern Depot, completed in 1913. On the Historic Register, the Depot is the last early 20th century railroad building left in its original condition.

The Commercial Building at 403 Third Street is a 1910 structure cited in the Architecture of Minnesota Guide as a successful prairie-style solution for a single-story building. Other examples of historic architecture include the Beltrami County Courthouse built in 1902. Across the street you'll find the 1917 Colonial Revival-style former Post Office.

Perhaps Bemidji's best-known historic district is the eight-block section of Lake Boulevard. Once known as Bemidji's "Gold Coast," among the many venerable domiciles to be viewed is the Dr. Johnson House built in 1910 with a showcase garden. The Bacon House was also built in 1910, later used for a Catholic convent. An unusual log structure, the Fisk House was reconstructed log-by-log at the present site. Judge Fisk enjoyed entertaining many distinguished guests, including writer F. Scott Fitzgerald. Further along you'll find Warfield House, the 1912 home of the man who built Bemidji's electric light plant. Two lady teachers resided at the 1930s Parker & Mangelsdorf House, also known for its large, informal gardens.

Birchmont Avenue displays two art deco classics built in 1937, one with a semicircular glass projection, is located at Bemidji State University, the only lakeshore campus in the state with architecture dating back to 1919.

Located about equal distance between Minneapolis/St. Paul to the south and Winnipeg, Canada to the north, Bemidji has easy access by air, motor carrier, and automobile to metropolitan services and international airports.

### **Goals**

Bemidji State approaches the 21st century with a deep sense of commitment to its region, a national reputation for quality programming and an international perspective for its 4,800 students. Founded on a sound liberal education, University programs are designed to educate students so that they may live as responsible, productive and free citizens in a global society.

### **History**

Bemidji State began as a state Normal school in 1919, became a leading teachers' college in the region, and achieved University status in 1975. Currently, BSU recognizes over 28,000 alumni.

### **Academic Program**

The only baccalaureate institution in northern Minnesota, Bemidji State offers over 70 major fields of study housed in one of three major colleges: Arts and Letters, Social and Natural Sciences, and Professional Studies. Quality education is a priority at BSU, as many programs have earned national acclaim. The accounting program ranks among the nation's Top 10 in preparing student for the CPA examination, and scientific research has gained national exposure in a variety of fields.

### **Students / Faculty**

Nearly 70 percent of Bemidji State students come from northern Minnesota, but the University broadens its services to attract students and faculty from diverse backgrounds and aspirations. Through teaching and informed attention to the educational needs of students, the University seeks to instill the spark of openness and commitment for lifelong learning. In fact, many Bemidji State faculty members continue to pursue knowledge as specialists and educators in their fields.



### **Location**

In the heart of the Minnesota lakes and forest region, the University is situated in the heart of the city of Bemidji, midway between Minneapolis/St. Paul and Winnipeg, Manitoba. With stands of pine, oak and birch reflecting the nearby presence of the northern woods, the east side of campus lines the shores of Lake Bemidji. The City of Bemidji (population 30,000) provides a focus for educational, business and medical services. Entertainment and activities include lively downtown Bemidji, shopping malls, theatre, art, downhill and cross country alpine skiing, and various forms of water recreation.

### **Facilities**

The modern campus spans 89 acres on the shores of Lake Bemidji, including the recently renovated Physical Education Complex which houses John S. Glas Fieldhouse, an official site for NCAA Championships. The BSU Gymnasium hosts the basketball and volleyball events, and a 3,000 square foot weight room, human performance laboratory, indoor track, and tennis, racquetball and swimming areas complete the complex. Football fans can catch a spectacular view of Lake Bemidji through the east end zone of Chet Anderson Stadium.

### **Financial Aid / Scholarships**

Eighty-two percent of students at Bemidji State receive some form of financial assistance. Over \$16 million was awarded last year to students, including \$6 million in grants and scholarships.

### **Internships**

Each year, students complete internships with the NASA space program in Houston, Tex., Disneyland, Compaq Computers, Rubbermaid and a host of architectural firms.

### **Beavers at the Glas**

Since its debut as Bemidji State's home arena for the 1967-68 season, the Beavers have built one of college hockey's strongest home-ice advantages at John Glas Fieldhouse. In 568 games played over 35 full seasons at the Glas, BSU has posted a remarkable 425-115-28 record on its home ice (.773).

In addition, BSU has posted 44 shutouts at the Glas and out-scored its opposition by an average of nearly three goals per game.

Bemidji State went 3-3-0 in its first six games played at the Glas, but from there won 13 in a row and 32 of the next 33 games played in its new facility to set the tone for the level of home-ice dominance which would become a storied part of BSU's hockey tradition.

Bemidji State hockey debuted its fourth home on Nov. 17, 1967 with the introduction of the Fieldhouse Expansion to the BSU Physical Education Complex. In the 35 seasons since, BSU has developed one of the most-secure home-ice advantages in college hockey.

Simply put, BSU has dominated on its home ice. The Beavers have posted a 425-115-28 record in 568 games played at John Glas Fieldhouse, and have had a losing home-ice record just once during the life of the arena. Eleven times in its history BSU has assembled unbeaten streaks of 10 or more games in the building, while averaging nearly six goals per game. In total, BSU has out-scored its opposition by more than 1,600 goals at "The Glas."

Final plans for the \$970,000 Fieldhouse expansion were laid in the mid-1960s under the direction of then-BSU President Dr. Harry Bangsberg and athletics director Dr. Vic Weber. The Minnesota legislature granted authority to build the expansion in 1965, and the fieldhouse expansion was dedicated on Feb. 10, 1968.

In addition to its role as BSU's home facility for both men's and women's ice hockey, the Glas Fieldhouse also plays a prominent role in a variety of events for the BSU and Bemidji communities. High school contests and area youth figure skating shows occur while the ice is in place, while when the ice is removed the building plays host to events varying from the annual Jaycees Home, Sport and Travel Show to BSU's commencement ceremonies.

### **Championship Tradition**

Only adding to Bemidji State's already-stellar winning tradition at John Glas Fieldhouse are the five national championships BSU has won on its home ice. The Beavers have competed for a national title six times on its home ice, bringing home an NAIA Championship in 1971 and four NCAA Division II Championships in 1984, 1986, 1993 and 1997.

In total, BSU has posted a 15-2-0 record on its home ice in national tournament play.

### **John S. Glas**

From the time of its completion until Oct. 1, 1975, BSU's hockey facility held the name of BSU Fieldhouse. But it was renamed in honor of the retiring **John S. Glas (right)**, the acting president of Bemidji State University at the time of the arena's completion. Glas arrived in Bemidji in 1939 to serve as business manager under then-BSU President Charles R. Sattgast and would remain with BSU for 36 years. When Glas arrived, the campus consisted of just two buildings - Deputy and Stanford halls - which served as the educational environment for the institution's 340 students.



In 1957, Glas was appointed Assistant to the President, and in 1968 he was elevated to Vice President for Administrative Affairs and later earned the title Vice President Emeritus.

The decision to rename the Fieldhouse was recommended by the Men's Physical Education Department. The Long Range Planning Committee endorsed the change, and President Dr. R.D. Decker submitted a request to the State University Board that it officially name the fieldhouse for Glas, "in recognition of his long and dedicated service to Bemidji State University."

### Previous BSU arenas

The Bemidji State hockey team, referred to at times as the "Hard Luck Boys" in its early history, tried out several hockey rinks before finding a home in 1967 at the John S. Glas Fieldhouse.

#### 1947-50 / Bemidji Sports Arena

Not originally intended to be a hockey facility, the Bemidji Sports Arena was plagued with a number of problems from the start... Poor sight lines and seating along with an undersized ice surface were only a few of the arena's more-obvious drawbacks... At 2:20 p.m., January 4, 1949, the arena's roof collapsed due to structural failure... Several children were skating directly under the caved-in section of the roof, but miraculously escaped the falling beams and timbers.

The team continued to use the facility for another season, but after an attempt at Lake Bemidji for a home venue, the Beaver program would cease for a nine-year period... The first BSU game played at the Bemidji Sports Arena is believed to be a 12-1 loss to the Grand Rapids Raiders on Feb. 16, 1947.

#### 1959-60 / 17th Street Rink

Located at the Bemidji High School athletic field, the Beavers found a new outdoor home rink... The new facility was underwritten with a \$1,000 donation from the Beaver Union Board... However, the site would be temporary; after just two games the site was moved to the college campus... 200 fans were on hand to witness the return of Beaver hockey at Bemidji State Feb. 13, 1960 after a nine-year absence... The Beavers fell to St. Cloud State 4-2 in their return engagement... Referee Dick Kroll was injured at 3:21 of the third period, bringing a halt to the opening game of the season.

- record at 17th Street Rink: 1-1-0 (.500)

#### 1960-67 / College Rink

Often referred to as the 19th Street Rink, the facility was located just south of the physical education building and gymnasium... The Beavers played seven seasons here before moving to the John S. Glas Fieldhouse. The first game played at the College Rink took place Jan. 5, 1961 when the Beavers defeated St. John's 3-1 under balmy temperatures and on melting ice... The Beavers would close out their last game at the College Rink Feb. 4, 1967 with an 8-1 win over Wisconsin-Superior... Bemidji State won its final 17 games played at the College Rink before moving into the newly-constructed John S. Glas Fieldhouse for the 1967-68 season.

Michaels, who also hosts the morning show on Real Country 98.3, provides the Beavers with one of the most enthusiastic young radio voices in college athletics today. **Brian Bisonette** provides expert analysis and color commentary.

KKBJ's coverage of BSU football begins 30 minutes prior to kickoff with a comprehensive pre-game show, featuring interviews with BSU players, coaches and others involved with the school's athletics programs, as well as analysis and insights on the coming game.

KKBJ is scheduled to provide live coverage of all 11 scheduled regular-season games in 2002 and also will have broadcasts available for any potential post-season contests.

Additionally, all game broadcasts will be streamed live over the Internet via KKBJ's web site. Broadcasts are available to Windows, Macintosh and UNIX computer users and are distributed in RealAudio format (requires RealOne player, available as a free download at <http://www.real.com>).

Internet listeners should be aware that server limitations allow only 120 concurrent listeners to BSU's audio broadcasts. Internet audio broadcasts do not begin until approximately five minutes prior to the scheduled starting time of the pre-game show.

## KBSU TV 17

In 2002, Bemidji State hockey continues a new era of coverage and recognition when the campus television station, KBSU TV 17, will once again provide live local broadcasts of all BSU home games. In partnership with Bemidji's local cable providers, BSU ice hockey games and other covered athletics contests are available to Northern Minnesota residents served by Charter Communications of Bemidji and the Paul Bunyan Telephone Cooperative.

That coverage will continue for the 2002-03 as KBSU will again broadcast live the full slate of BSU home contests. BSU's home schedule includes non-conference series against Sacred Heart and Union College and a single game of the home-and-home series with Minnesota-Duluth. In addition, BSU plays its full slate of CHA contests.

Local radio personality **Scott Williams** handles play-by-play duties for BSU hockey. Williams also handles television play-by-play duties for KBSU's broadcasts of Beaver football and men's and women's basketball.

Students in BSU's department of mass communications, under the direction of **Roger Paskvaan**, handle all camera duties for KBSU's television broadcasts; **Kai Matthes** is the producer.

In total, KBSU will expand its commitment to Bemidji State athletics from less than two dozen total broadcasts during the 2001-02 season to nearly 45 broadcasts for 2002-03. KBSU will carry live all BSU home football and men's hockey contests, 15 of 16 scheduled home women's hockey contests and a selection of men's and women's basketball events.

In addition to live broadcasts, BSU's games are typically available on a tape-delayed replay basis throughout the week on KBSU.

### **Dr. Jon E. Quistgaard**

President, Bemidji State University  
Arizona



Dr. Jon Quistgaard became the ninth president of Bemidji State University in August of 2001. The Minnesota State Colleges and Universities Board of Trustees named him to the position in late

May following a national search.

A member of the BSU community for 22 years, he had served since 1997 as the vice president for academic and student affairs. As the chief academic officer of the institution, he was responsible for academic programming in three colleges, integrative studies, distance learning, academic services, international student services, counseling, career services, the American Indian Resource Center, and student development programs.

Quistgaard began his association with BSU in 1979 as an admissions representative. He became the director of admissions and advising in 1980; was named the dean of undergraduate admissions and graduate studies in 1988; served as acting vice president for academic and student affairs from 1993-94; and was the associate vice president for academic affairs and dean of academic services from 1994-1997.

He is an active presenter on the national level in the areas of continuous quality improvement, challenges in higher education, planning, assessment models, and transforming higher education. Quistgaard received a doctorate in political science from the University of Arizona, where he also earned his master's and bachelor's degrees in government.

### **Dr. Rick Goeb**

Director of Athletics  
North Dakota State '89



A new era in Bemidji State University athletics began on July 13, 2001 when Dr. Rick Goeb was named as Bemidji State University's first full-time director of intercollegiate athletics.

At BSU, Goeb directs a 17-sport varsity athletics program, with men's and women's ice hockey competing at the NCAA Division I level and 15 additional sports competing in Division II.

Bemidji State athletics has undergone dramatic changes in Goeb's first year at the helm, having seen nearly a dozen positions created or filled with new hires - including head coaches for women's hockey, women's basketball, soccer, softball, baseball, women's golf and volleyball.

BSU's 2001-02 competition season, Goeb's first at the helm, was one of its most successful ever. Football extended its school-record streak of six-win seasons to four; men's basketball finished as the No. 2 seed in the NSIC Tournament and hosted a conference playoff game for the first time ever; Jeanne Larson was selected to compete in the NCAA regional women's golf championship; Aaron Feia earned NSIC Athlete of the Year for the indoor track season and helped lead the BSU track teams to six individual NSIC crowns; baseball had its best season since 1997, finishing first in the regular-season NSIC standings and hosting the conference tournament; men's hockey had its best season since elevating to Division I status, finishing second in the CHA and seeing five players earn all-conference honors; and women's hockey had the finest season in its brief history with a fifth-place WCHA finish.

Goeb came to Bemidji State after six years as senior associate athletics director at the University of Alaska-Fairbanks. In his role at Fairbanks, Goeb served as the NCAA compliance officer, monitored academic eligibility and acted as the liaison for booster clubs.

Prior to his position at Fairbanks, Goeb spent two years at the University of North Dakota in the athletics administration. Goeb has also served as the head wrestling coach at St. Cloud State University from 1990-'93 when he was an instructor in physical education and a facility coordinator; was the strength and conditioning coach at Northern Colorado from 1989-'90; and served as an assistant wrestling coach at North Dakota State from 1988-'89.

Originally from Anoka, Minn., Goeb received his undergraduate degree at North Dakota State, where he was also a national wrestling champion. Goeb earned his master's from Northern Colorado and doctorate from North Dakota. He and his wife Carol have two daughters, Amber and Anne and one son, Jordan.

### **Andy Bartlett**

Andy Bartlett begins his second season as Sports Information Director at Bemidji State. He directs all publicity and media relations operations for BSU's 17-sport athletics department, and directly handles the university's football, men's hockey, baseball and men's and women's golf programs.

Bartlett, 30, joined the BSU staff in May, 2001 after spending the previous eight years in the sports information office at Big 12 Conference power Kansas State. After one year as a student volunteer intern and two years as a graduate assistant, Bartlett was named Assistant SID at K-State in May, 1997. He directly oversaw K-State's baseball and volleyball teams and was involved with a variety of other programs until being promoted to a newly-created position of Internet Coordinator in 1999.

Bartlett is an active member of College Sports Information Directors of America. In addition, he has won two CoSIDA awards for excellence in publications.

#### **The School Colors**

In Feb., 1920, an assembly hour was set aside for the selection of school colors. After the balloting on colors had resulted in a deadlock, Cyrillus Freeman, a student from Minneapolis, rose and commanded attention.

"As we sat here discussing this question," she said, "I happened to glance out the window. The sight that met my eyes was fresh, green pines silhouetted against pure white snow. What could be more appropriate than green and white?"

This idea was immediately accepted unanimously.

#### **The Naming of the Beavers**

As President Deputy reviewed football practice one evening in May, 1932, he called the team into a huddle and raising his hands above their heads declared, "I christen this team the Beavers."

The name Beavers is symbolic of the Northern, silent, hard-working teams representing Bemidji State.

#### **Red-Line Swingers**

The World Famous Red Line Swingers pep band has provided music, entertainment and excitement for Bemidji State hockey for three decades. Open to all Bemidji State undergraduates and alumni, the Red Line Swingers accommodate 15-25 members annually.

Formed in 1974 by then-head coach R.H. "Bob" Peters, the band is currently under the direction of faculty advisor Del Lyren.

### **The BSU Logo**

During the fall semester of 1998, campus-wide discussions were held on the need for new marks to represent the University as well as BSU athletics. The University marks at the time had been in place since 1974, with minor revisions in 1987, while no official athletic mascot, logo or image had been adopted for University use.

A committee was formed and for the next academic year an audit and review were conducted on the school logo and athletics imagery to determine what images were being used to represent the institution.

During the spring and summer of 1999, requests for proposals (RFP) were sought from outside firms to assist the university in this historic undertaking.

The BSU coaching staffs took great interest in the efforts to produce the new Beaver logo. They desired an image that would represent pride and confidence while being gender-neutral and not appearing cartoonish in nature.

The public relations firm of Russell & Herder of Brainerd was awarded the RFP for the logo project during the summer of 2000. For the remainder of 2000 and through early 2001, Russell & Herder helped oversee focus groups and surveys regarding the logo change.

In Dec. 2000, preliminary logo designs were presented to the committee, and revisions were made until the time the new marks were formally adopted and officially unveiled March 28, 2001 at a ceremony on campus.

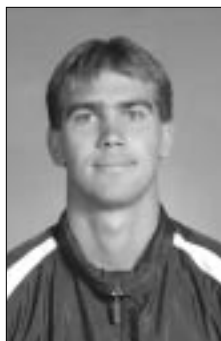
