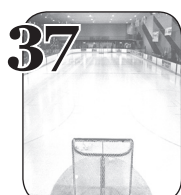

### 2004-05 OUTLOOK

It is safe to say that the Bemidji State women's hockey team would like to forget the 2003-2004 season, as BSU's 5-27-2 overall record and 3-20-1 mark in Western Collegiate Hockey Association play was the lowest win total in the six-year history of the program. Finishing seventh in the WCHA standings, BSU missed the WCHA Final Five for the first time since the inception of the conference in 1999-00.

Head coach Bruce Olson hopes this year's squad can use last season's results as a motivation for success in the 2004-05 campaign.

"Obviously no one wants to finish last in the standings and we have a strong desire to move up to from that bottom spot," Olson said. "One positive part of last year was that many of our young players had the chance to get a lot of ice time and hopefully they can use that experience to perform better this year."

The task of putting last season behind Bemidji State will be made easier with 17 letterwinners returning and ten newcomers joining a squad that also retains 93% of its scoring (44-63) from a year ago. Add to that a recruiting class which includes three members of a state championship team and the top goaltender in the state of Minnesota, and Bemidji State has reason to be optimistic heading into the new season.

"We are expecting the freshmen who saw a lot of playing time last year to come back as better hockey players, but the bigger expectation is that we are getting better as individuals and as a team," Olson said.

#### Forwards

BSU's forward corps returns all but one letterwinner, as **Guyline Haché** graduated. Haché left Bemidji State fourth all-time in games played (131), seventh in points (60), seventh in goals (32), seventh in assists (28), tied for third in power-play goals (10), tied for third in game-winning goals (5) and tied for second in hat tricks (1).

Improved scoring output will be necessary for a team that scored just 48 goals last season.

"Our forwards are all well aware of the fact that we have to come up with more scoring," Olson said. "We have to get more production from several players, as our leading scorers last year were all freshmen."

Three of those returning sophomores whom Olson is counting upon are **Kelly Hart, Kate Robinson** and **Nikki Eckebrecht**.

"They spent last season learning and hopefully they can elevate their scoring as sophomores," Olson said. "We are counting on those three players to be in that 30-40 point range and we need them to establish themselves as the go-to players."

Hart will lead the offensive charge after tallying a team-high 20 points (10-10) in 2003-04, a feat that placed her seventh in the WCHA in scoring among freshmen. In addition, Hart was the only Beaver to score at least two points in four games last season and proved to be a clutch performer by tallying a team-best two game-winning goals.

Second on the team's scoring list last season Robinson netted six goals and five assists, along with three-power play markers. The sophomore from Shanty Bay, Ontario, also collected the longest goal-scoring streak, scoring one goal in four consecutive games.

Eckebrecht solidified herself as one of the more physical offensive threats on the team a year ago, notching 10 points (5-5) and also accumulating a team-high 60 penalty minutes. She also scored one of only three short-handed goals scored by BSU.

Olson is also expecting several newcomers to contribute some additional scoring.

"**Tara Hiscock** and **Jessica Pullar** certainly have the potential to put some points on the board," Olson said. "Hopefully we have added some more

firepower to our offense with the addition of these two players."

A native of Bemidji, Minn., Hiscock netted 28 goals and 13 assists for 41 points in her senior season at Bemidji High School.

Hailing from Elk River, Minn., Pullar was the leading scorer for the 2004 Class AA state champion Elk River Elks, scoring 57 goals and 34 assists for 91 points in her senior year.

#### Defensemen

Another area that Olson believes must improve this year is the play of his defensive unit, which allowed 139 goals last season.

"We definitely need to improve upon how many goals we gave up last year," Olson said. "Our blue-liners need to take more pride in stopping other teams from scoring, as we allowed way too many easy goals last season."

With all seven of the defensemen that competed on last year's squad back for the 2004-05 campaign and with three rookies joining the team, competition for playing time will be at an all-time high.

"We probably have more depth on defense this year so there will be more competition to make the top six spots every weekend," Olson said. "Every player will have to battle each week to crack the lineup."

Olson cites the play of senior **Jenny Schnickel** as a key ingredient necessary for the Beavers to establish a strong defensive crew.

"Schnickel is a senior and she will have to be the leader on defense," Olson said. "She has the most potential to add offensive help, but she will also be the one we look to to play solid defense."

An alternate captain for the second consecutive year, Schnickel scored nine points (4-5) in her junior season, surpassing her point total of 2002-03 (1-4-5). She also led all blue-liners in scoring and was one of three defenders to play in all 34 games in 2003-04. Schnickel is the only player on the roster to have played in all 100 games of her career.

Sophomore **Nina Ziegenhals** (0-4=4) was the only freshman defender to appear in 34 games last season. Juniors **Laura Lankton** (1-4=5), **Sarah Zuelke** (1-2=3), **Mandy Bambrough** (1-1=2) and **Emily Curcuruto** (0-1=1) will also be called upon to add a strong defensive presence. Senior captain **Ashley Medori** (0-2=2) will look to draw upon her 77 games of experience.

Bemidji State welcomes two fresh defenders in Elk River, Minn., product **Haley Balcom** and **Andrea Staton**, who is from Anoka, Minn. A teammate of fellow BSU rookies, Jessica Pullar and Millisa Smith, Balcom played on the 2004 Class AA state championship team tallying 11 goals and 21 assists for 32 points. Staton participated in four consecutive Class AA state tournaments for Anoka High School.

#### Goaltending

Gone is **Anik Côté** who finished her career first in save percentage (.893), first in goals against average (3.50), second in minutes played (3377:13), second in wins (12) and second in games played (62). In are two highly competitive newcomers in **Emily Brookshaw** and **Millisa Smith** along with two-year netminder **Jill Luebke**.

"I feel we have three quality goaltenders on our roster in Luebke, Brookshaw and Smith," Olson said. "I think it will be a great combination and it will be interesting to see who rises to the top and puts together a couple good games to establish themselves as the number-one goaltender."

Luebke appeared in 18 games as a sophomore, starting 15 and compiling a 3-13-1 record. She also earned a 4.45 goals against average and a .847 save percentage and stopped a career-high 48 shots at Minnesota (12/5/03).

Olson acknowledges that Luebke has an early edge on the other two goalies having already played two years in the WCHA.

"Obviously Luebke brings a great deal of experience in this league and she has shown that she is definitely a top goaltender in the WCHA," Olson said.

Brookshaw joins the Beavers after being named Minnesota's **Let's Play Hockey's 2004 Senior Goalie of the Year** during her senior season at Hill-Murray High School. The Webster, Wis., native, is the first student-athlete to join the Bemidji State program after receiving Minnesota's top goaltender award. Brookshaw recorded a 1.47 goals against average and a .928 save percentage in 15 games in the 2003-04 campaign.

One of three players to play for the 2004 Class AA state champion Elk River Elks, Smith secured a 1.22 goals against average, a .921 save percentage and seven shutouts in her senior year.

"Brookshaw and Smith come from winning programs and they won some big games in their high school careers," Olson said. "These two are both fierce competitors that will compete very hard for playing time."

#### The Schedule

BSU will begin play Oct. 2 with an exhibition contest against Regina at the John S. Glas Fieldhouse and then open the regular season with a two-game series at College Hockey America champion Mercyhurst on Oct. 9-10.

From there, the Beavers will travel to Wisconsin for a pair of games with the Badgers on Oct. 16-17.

BSU welcomes defending national champion Minnesota for its regular season home-opening series on Oct. 22-23. Minnesota-Duluth comes to Bemidji on Oct. 29-30, capping an eight-game stretch in which the Beavers face off with four teams that finished among the top 10 in both the US College Hockey Online and *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* polls.

"Those first eight games will tell us a lot about this team, as each team finished in the top-10 in the country last year," Olson said. "Honestly, we look forward to the challenge because it will give us a great idea of how we stack up against teams of that caliber and it will give us a good indication of what we need to work on."

In addition to Mercyhurst, Bemidji State will field a total of six non-conference games with a two-game road series at Wayne State on Dec. 3-4 and a two-game set with Cornell at home on Jan. 1-2.

After competing as a Division I independent during the past two seasons, North Dakota will begin play in the WCHA in the 2004-05 campaign and will host BSU on Nov. 6-7. The Beavers conclude the regular season with a pair of home games with UND on Feb. 25-26.

## Bruce Olson

Minnesota-Duluth '79  
 Third year at Bemidji State



Bruce Olson enters his third season at Bemidji State with a 14-44-9 overall record and an 8-33-7 mark in Western Collegiate Hockey Association play. Olson will try to avenge a disappointing 2003-2004 season in which the Beavers finished 5-27-2 and 3-20-1 in WHCA play.

The task of putting last season behind them will be made easier with 17 letterwinners returning and nine newcomers joining a squad that also retains 93% of its scoring from a year ago. Sophomore Kelly Hart will lead the offensive charge, after tallying a team-high 20 points (10-10) in 2003-04, a feat that placed her seventh in the WCHA in scoring among freshmen.

In the first three years of Olson's tenure at Bemidji State, he has coached the program's first All-WCHA pick, Amber Fryklund, who ended her playing days as the lone 100-point scorer (122) in school history. Meanwhile, former players Anik Côté and Guylaine Haché were each named *WCHA Student Athlete of the Year*, Côté in 2003 and Haché in 2002. Additionally, Côté became just the second athlete in school history to

be recognized on the *Verizon Academic All-American Team* in consecutive seasons, as she was a second team honoree both years.

Olson came to Bemidji State after a highly-successful career at the high school level which has spanned more than two decades. After a four-year playing career at Minnesota, Duluth from 1975-79, Olson took over the boy's program at Minot High School in Minot, N.D. He directed Minot High to a pair of North Dakota state runner-up finishes in 1985 and 1987, and in '87 was named North Dakota Hockey Coach of the Year.

In 1991, Olson left Minot to take over the varsity boy's program at Roseau High. During his run at Roseau, Olson earned Minnesota 8AA Coach of the Year honors twice (1995-96 and 1998-99), was named State Coach of the Year in 1998-99 and led Roseau to the 1999 state championship. Olson's 1999 state championship team was the sixth state champion in Roseau history. In addition, Olson's 1999 team won state Academic Champion honors.

Olson took a one-year leave of absence from Roseau in 1999-00, spending that year working on a master's degree in educational leadership at the University of North Dakota. During that year, Olson also took over head coaching duties for the UND women's ice hockey club team. He helped set the stage for the elevation of the North Dakota club program to NCAA varsity status; the Sioux make their debut at the Division I level this fall.

During his coaching career, Olson has directed 15 players who have gone on to Division I playing careers, nine of which played for North Dakota. That group includes current Minnesota-Duluth goaltender Maghan Grahn, who competed for the Roseau boy's team during her high school career. Grahn posted an 0.66 goals-against average in five appearances for the repeat national champion Bulldogs a year ago, allowing just one goal in 90 minutes of work.

Olson was a four-year letterwinner for the Minnesota-Duluth Bulldogs from 1975-79. He played 137 games at left wing for the Bulldogs, tallying 93 points (35 goals, 58 assists) in his career.

Fourth Year at Bemidji State



Jim Ingman enters his fourth season behind the bench for the Beavers bringing stability and a keen eye to recruit with the best. Ingman was part of the most successful season in the history of the Division I program (12-13-8 overall and 7-11-6) in 2001-02.

Ingman coaches the goaltenders and several of the netminders he has coached have made their mark in the record books at Bemidji State. Outgoing goalkeeper Anik Côté ended her career as the school's all-time leader in goals against average (3.50) and save percentage (.893), while junior Jill Luebke currently sits third all-time in goals against average (4.14) and save percentage (.862).

Before joining the staff at Bemidji State, Ingman helped former BSU coach Jason Lesteberg build the Wisconsin-Stevens Point program.

Ingman developed the Stevens Point club program, organizing the club in 1998 and helping prepare it for its eventual rise to varsity status. Ingman's first team finished 3-17, but improved to 22-3 in 1999 in its final season as a club program. The club team was elevated to NCAA Division III status for the 2000-01 season.

Ingman handed head coaching reigns of the Stevens Point program over to Lesteberg upon its NCAA elevation, but stayed on staff as an assistant coach. Ingman and Lesteberg guided Stevens Point to a 13-13-1 record, including a 10-0-0 mark against other first-year programs. Ingman held responsibilities for goaltenders, helping develop eventual First-Team All-Northern Collegiate Hockey Association goalie Diane Sawyer.

Ingman was a standout goaltender for Tomahawk High School. He posted a 43-20-3 career record and was four times named to the All-Conference team. He was named All-State in 1996.

Ingman played on the USA Developmental Team in 1997. An injury to his left ankle ended his college playing career.

Ingman received a bachelor of science degree in soil and waste resources with an environmental law emphasis in May, 2001.

Paulsen begins her first season as an assistant coach at Bemidji State. Prior to her hiring at BSU, Paulsen served as a student assistant coach and assistant goalie coach for the University of Wisconsin last season. Paulsen's most recent coaching stint came in the summer of 2004 with the USA Hockey Girls Select 14 team, where she was co-head coach.

Paulsen has also served as strength and conditioning coach for Acceleration Madison (Wis.), a skill development program designed to condition athletes in a variety of sports.

Hailing from Eau Claire, Wis., Paulsen graduated from Wisconsin in 2004 after playing for the Badgers in 1999-2003. A three-year captain and four-year letterwinner, Paulsen is the all-time leading scorer among Western Collegiate Hockey Association defenders with 42 goals and 88 assists. Paulsen finished her career as Wisconsin's third all-time leading scorer with 130 points and tied for third in games played at 136. In addition, Paulsen was a first-team All-WCHA pick in her freshman year (1999-00) and a second-team All-WCHA selection as a senior (2002-03). The 2000 Wisconsin Most Valuable Player also earned team honors as Defensive Player of the Year in 2003.

Paulsen received a bachelor of science degree in human development and family studies in May, 2004.

Paulsen will work closely with BSU's defensemen and its power-play and penalty-killing units.

Spencer was an assistant coach for the Minot High Magicians in the 2002-03 season, leading the team to the West Regional Championship both seasons.

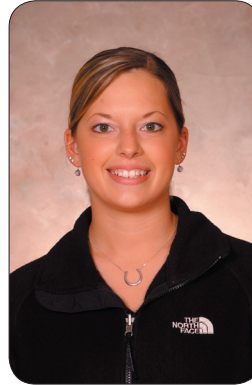

**Second year at Bemidji State**



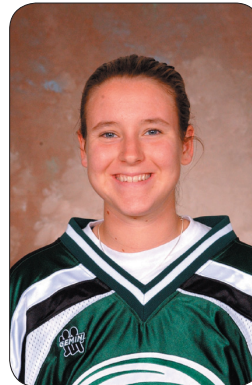

### A LOOK BACK AT 2003-04

#### **BSU Finishes Seventh in the WCHA**

Bemidji State struggled to a 5-27-2 record in the 2003-04 campaign, marking the lowest win total in the six-year history of the program. The Beavers finished seventh in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association standings with seven points, marking the first time since the inception of the WCHA in 1999-00, in which BSU has not qualified for the Final Five.

#### **Freshmen Producing Early**

The 2003-04 freshman class scored 60 points last season, making them the fourth-highest scoring crew of rookies in the WCHA. The rookie classes from Wisconsin (95), Minnesota-Duluth (88) and Minnesota (79) round out the top-four freshmen classes in overall scoring.

#### **Hart Atop Scoring List**

Sophomore forward Kelly Hart led the Beavers in scoring last season with 10 goals and 10 assists good for 20 points. Hart ended the year in a tie for sixth place among WCHA freshmen in overall scoring, tied for fifth in goals and tied for seventh in assists. Wisconsin's Sara Bauer (8-25-33) led the WCHA in rookie scoring a year ago.

#### **Learning From the Best**

Bemidji State once again endured a very demanding schedule in 2003-04, as BSU competed against four of the top-10 teams in the country, according to the US College Hockey Online Poll (Mar. 29, 2004) and the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* Poll (Mar. 30, 2004). Minnesota (1), Wisconsin (5/6), Minnesota-Duluth (6/5) and Mercyhurst (7) combined to generate a 101-28-11 record and a .761 winning percentage last year. The Beavers went 0-14-0 against these four opponents.

#### **Haché and Côté Go Out Strong**

Seniors Guylaine Haché and Anik Côté ended their careers on a positive note, as each made a mark in BSU record book in several categories.

Haché recorded six points (2-4) last season, including a goal against North Dakota (Feb. 8, 2004), which marked the 60th point of her career. The forward sits fourth all-time in games played (131), seventh in points (60), seventh in goals (32), seventh in assists (28), tied for third in power-play goals (10), tied for third in game-winning goals (5) and tied for second in hat tricks (1).

Côté set several career goaltending records at BSU, as she leaves the program first in save percentage (.893), first in goals against average (3.50), second in minutes played (3377:13), second in wins (12) and second in games played (62).

#### **Schnickel Scoring Bonus Points**

Senior Jenny Schnickel led the Beavers in scoring by a defenseman in 2003-04 with nine points (4-5). The assistant captain shattered her point total (1-4-5) during the 2002-03 season and improved her career scoring total to 18 (6-12).

#### **Sophomore Surge**

Carly Napier and Melissa Schaeffer achieved several milestones in their sophomore seasons. Napier doubled her point total of her freshman year (3-2) by tallying five goals and five assists last season. The Toronto, Ontario, native also set single game career-highs in assists and points when she recorded two helpers against Ohio State (Jan. 23, 2004).

After being held scoreless in her rookie season, Melissa Schaeffer tabbed two goals and three assists in her sophomore campaign. The forward from Milwaukee, Wis., tallied three points in the last 10 games of the 2003-04 season.

#### **International Flavor**

Sophomore forward Helena Tageson and sophomore defenseman Nina Ziegenhals became the first European players to put on a Beaver uniform in the history of the program last season. Tageson hails from Malmö, Sweden, while Ziegenhals is from Sankt Augustin, Germany. Both players participated on the national team for their respective countries and Ziegenhals was a member of three German Championship teams. The duo turned in solid freshman seasons, as Tageson notched 10 points (4-6) and Ziegenhals secured four points (0-4).

#### **Seven Earn WCHA Academic Honors**

BSU had seven players honored at the 2003-04 WCHA annual awards banquet on the campus of the University of Minnesota. Mandy Bambrough, Anik Côté, Guylaine Haché, Jill Luebke, Ashley Medori, Cassi Petsch and Jenny Schnickel were each named to the WCHA All-Academic Team.

#### **WCHA Weekly Honors Handed Out**

Sophomores Kate Robinson and Jenn Sadler each earned WCHA weekly awards for their performances in BSU's series sweep of St. Cloud State (Dec. 12-13, 2003), its only sweep of the 2003-04 season. Robinson was named the WCHA Offensive Player of the Week, while Sadler was selected as the WCHA Rookie of the Week. The tandem were the only BSU players to receive a WCHA weekly award last season.

#### **Robinson and Hart Streaky on Offense**

Kate Robinson and Kelly Hart each scored points in four consecutive games last season, a feat not touched by anyone else on the BSU roster. Robinson tallied four goals and two assists from Dec. 12, 2003, to Jan. 10, 2004, while Hart netted two goals and two assists from Dec. 6, 2003, to Jan. 9, 2004. In addition, Robinson also achieved the longest goal-scoring streak on the 2003-04 squad by lighting the lamp in four straight games from Dec. 12, 2003, to Jan. 10, 2004.

#### **Get Shorty**

Last year's team compiled more short-handed goals (3) than in the previous two seasons (1) combined. Helena Tageson, Guylaine Haché and Nikki Eckebrecht each registered short-handed markers. The most short-handed tallies ever recorded in the six-year history of the program was set during the 2000-01 season when Amber Fryklund (3) and Caesare Stimson (2) netted five short-handed scores.

The Western Collegiate Hockey Association Women's League looks to continue the success it had the previous five seasons, as the league has amassed five national championships. In its first year of existence, Minnesota took home the 2000 AWCHA Championship, while Minnesota-Duluth captured the 2001, 2002 and 2003 NCAA Championships. Minnesota solidified the league's fifth national title in 2004 by beating Harvard 6-2 in Providence, R.I.

The WCHA is the oldest of the Division I college hockey leagues recognized by the NCAA. It was formed in 1959 as an outgrowth of two earlier western college associations, the Midwest Intercollegiate Hockey League and the Western Intercollegiate Hockey League.

It is not only the oldest league, but most successful as well. In the league's 44-year history, member schools have claimed 29 NCAA Championships.

The WCHA Women's League began for the 1999-2000 season with seven charter members: Bemidji State University; University of Minnesota; University of Minnesota-Duluth; Minnesota State University; Ohio State University; St. Cloud State University and University of Wisconsin.

Three of the schools, Minnesota-Duluth, Ohio State and Wisconsin, are in just the sixth year of their programs while programs at Bemidji State, Minnesota State and St. Cloud State are beginning their seventh year of existence. Minnesota started its program in 1997-98 and is the first of the league's teams to reach the seventh season. The WCHA welcomes its eighth member, the University of North Dakota, for the 2004-2005 season.

The WCHA took its first step towards creating a women's league at its annual meeting in Marco Island, Fla., April 29, 1999. The unanimous vote followed a year-long planning process. On June 29, 1999, the WCHA announced the hiring of Sara Martin as associate commissioner with primary responsibilities for the Women's League.

The WCHA followed up on that commitment in 1999-00. In its first year, the league race came down

to the wire as Minnesota-Duluth edged Minnesota by one point for the league title. The two teams met for the league championship March 4, 2000, in Bloomington, Minn. as the Bulldogs claimed the title in a 2-0 victory.

Minnesota would rebound from its narrow second-place regular-season finish in 1999-00, turning the tables and topping Minnesota-Duluth by four points for the 2000-2001 regular-season crown. The Golden Gophers would be upset by Ohio State in the second round of the WCHA Tournament, which UMD would go on to win with a 3-0 win over Ohio State before advancing to the NCAA Championship.

Minnesota claimed both the regular-season and WCHA Tournament titles in 2001-02, but again the Bulldogs from Minnesota-Duluth finished as the national champion by defeating Brown 3-2. The Bulldogs earned a triple crown of sorts in the 2002-03 season, as UMD earned the WCHA regular-season title, the WCHA Tournament title and their third consecutive national title with a 4-3 overtime triumph over Harvard.

The Minnesota Golden Gophers finally broke Minnesota-Duluth's reign atop the Division I women's hockey world last season, as UM compiled a 30-4-2 overall record and a 19-3-2 conference record enroute to its third WCHA regular-season title. The Golden Gophers used a home-ice advantage at Ridder Arena to win the WCHA Final Five Championship 4-2 over Minnesota-Duluth. Minnesota then took home the biggest prize, the 2004-05 NCAA National Championship.

For the first time in its six-year history, the WCHA Women's League will see each of its member institutions play a 28-game league schedule due to the addition of North Dakota to the conference. Each team will play the other seven league teams four times, twice at home and twice on the road.

The league will wrap up its sixth season of play with the WCHA Playoff Championship to be held March 3-6, 2004, at Ridder Arena in Minneapolis, Minn.

## Women's Hockey 2004-05

### JOHN S. GLAS FIELDHOUSE



The John S. Glas Fieldhouse debuted as the fourth home of the Bemidji State men's ice hockey program on Nov. 17, 1967 with the introduction of the Fieldhouse Expansion to the BSU Physical Education Complex. In the 35 seasons since, the BSU men developed one of the most-secure home-ice advantages in college hockey playing at the Glas, and in 1998 the storied Fieldhouse became the home of BSU's women's ice hockey program.

The Bemidji State women have posted a 16-34-8 record all-time in their home arena, including a school-record 8-7-2 home-ice campaign in 1999-00. BSU finished 4-7-5 at home in 2001-02, but that record came against a brutal schedule which saw the Beavers play 12 of 16 home games against teams ranked or receiving votes in the coaches poll.

Perhaps BSU's most-dramatic home weekend came Jan. 12-13, 2002 against then No. 2-ranked Minnesota. BSU skated to a 2-2 draw in Game 1 of that series, and saw a 2-0 lead evaporate and lose a tough 3-2 overtime decision in Game 2. At one stretch in the series, BSU goaltender Anik Cote held the Gophers without a goal for a span of 82:00.

Final plans for the \$970,000 Fieldhouse expansion were laid in the mid-1960s under the direction of then-BSU President Dr. Harry Bangsberg and athletics director Dr. Vic Weber. The Minnesota legislature granted authority to build the expansion in 1965, and the fieldhouse expansion was dedicated on Feb. 10, 1968.

In addition to its role as BSU's home facility for both men's and women's ice hockey, the Glas Fieldhouse also plays a prominent role in a variety of events for the BSU and Bemidji communities. High school contests and area youth figure skating shows occur while the ice is in place, while when the ice is removed the building plays host to events varying from the annual Jaycees Home, Sport and Travel Show to BSU's commencement ceremonies.

#### John S. Glas

From the time of its completion until Oct. 1, 1975, BSU's hockey facility held the name of BSU Fieldhouse. But it was renamed in honor of the retiring John S. Glas (right), the acting president of Bemidji State University at the time of the arena's completion. Glas arrived in Bemidji in 1939 to serve as business manager under then-BSU President Charles R. Sattgast and would remain with BSU for 36 years. When Glas arrived, the campus consisted of just two buildings - Deputy and Stanford halls - which served as the educational environment for the institution's 340 students.



In 1957, Glas was appointed Assistant to the President, and in 1968 he was elevated to Vice President for Administrative Affairs and later earned the title Vice President Emeritus.

The decision to rename the Fieldhouse was recommended by the Men's Physical Education Department. The Long Range Planning Committee endorsed the change, and President Dr. R.D. Decker submitted a request to the State University Board that it officially name the fieldhouse for Glas, "in recognition of his long and dedicated service to Bemidji State University."

#### BSU at the Glas

Since making its debut as a varsity program in 1998-99, Bemidji State's women's ice hockey program has steadily developed a solid home-ice reputation.

In 1999-00, when the program won a school-record eight games on its home ice, the BSU women put together a school-record eight-game home unbeaten streak. The team went 7-0-1 during that streak, which started with a 7-1 win over Wayne State (Mich.) on Oct. 29, 1999 and ended with a tight 4-2 loss to sixth-ranked Minnesota on Jan. 10, 2000.

BSU survived a brutal home schedule in 2001-02, posting a 4-7-5 record in a 16-game home slate which included 12 games against teams ranked or receiving votes in the USA Today / American Hockey Coaches Association Coaches Poll at the time of the game. BSU picked up one win and four ties in those 12 games.

## WELCOME TO BEMIDJI



The Bemidji area is home to a population of more than 30,000 and includes the Leech Lake, White Earth, and Red Lake Indian Reservations, and Lake Itasca, the headwaters to the Mississippi River. The City of Bemidji provides a focus for educational, business, and medical services. Recreational and cultural activities reflect a multicultural heritage that includes American Indian, European and Canadian influences.

Bemidji is a "golden city" along the river's bank, only miles from where the mighty Mississippi River begins its 2,552 mile journey to New Orleans and the Gulf of Mexico, a city at the center of the legends of Paul Bunyan and Babe the Blue Ox.

Bemidji's natural beauty and bounty as a meeting or group tour destination is also enhanced with historic character. From world renowned statues and architecture listed on the National Register of Historic Places, to ancient earth mounds and burial grounds, the past takes an interesting turn in Bemidji.

Bemidji's waterfront is home to the world-famous statues of Paul Bunyan and Babe the Blue Ox listed in the National Register of Historic Places. Nearby is Bemidji's Tourist Information Center. In addition to Paul Bunyan memorabilia, The Bunyan House features the Fireplace of States built with stones from every state in the U.S. and Canadian provinces.

To the north, you'll encounter Library Park and the statue of Bemidji's founding Chief Bemidji, as well as the Community Arts Center in the Carnegie Building, also on the National Register.

At the south end of Lake Bemidji is Nymore Beach, site of the Crookston Lumber Co. The burning of the mill in 1924 marked the end of the county's logging era.

On the way into Bemidji, you may cross over the historic Mississippi River Bridge, built in 1916. This structure is listed on the National Register as one of the earliest examples of a steel-reinforced concrete

bridge. At the southern end of Minnesota Avenue lies the Great Northern Depot, completed in 1913. On the Historic Register, the Depot is the last early 20th century railroad building left in its original condition.

The Commercial Building on Third Street, built in 1910, is cited in the Architecture of Minnesota Guide as a successful prairie-style solution for a single-story building.

Other examples of historic architecture include the Beltrami County Courthouse built in 1902. Across the street you'll find the 1917 Colonial Revival-style former Post Office.

Perhaps Bemidji's best-known historic district is the eight-block section of Lake Boulevard. Once known as Bemidji's "Gold Coast," among the many venerable homes to be viewed is the Dr. Johnson House built in 1910 with a showcase garden.

The Bacon House was also built in 1910, later used for a Catholic convent. An unusual log structure, the Fisk House was reconstructed log-by-log at the present site. Judge Fisk enjoyed entertaining many distinguished guests, including writer F. Scott Fitzgerald. Further along you'll find Warfield House, the 1912 home of the man who built Bemidji's electric light plant.

Two lady teachers resided at the 1930s Parker & Mangelsdorf House, also known for its large, informal gardens.

Birchmont Avenue displays two art deco classics built in 1937, one with a semicircular glass projection, is located at Bemidji State University, the only lakeshore campus in the state with architecture dating back to 1919.

Located about midway between Minneapolis/St. Paul to the south and Winnipeg, Canada to the north, Bemidji has easy access by air, motor carrier, and automobile to metropolitan areas and international airports.

# BEMIDJI STATE UNIVERSITY

### **Goals**

Bemidji State approaches the 21st century with a deep sense of commitment to its region, a national reputation for quality programming and an international perspective for its 4,800 students. Founded on a sound liberal education, University programs are designed to educate students so that they may live as responsible, productive and free citizens in a global society.

### **History**

Bemidji State began as a state Normal school in 1919, became a leading teachers' college in the region, and achieved University status in 1975. Currently, BSU recognizes over 28,000 alumni.

### **Academic Program**

The only baccalaureate institution in northern Minnesota, Bemidji

State offers over 70 major fields of study housed in one of three major colleges: Arts and Letters, Social and Natural Sciences, and Professional Studies. Quality education is a priority at BSU, as many programs have earned national acclaim. The accounting program ranks among the nation's Top 10 in preparing students for the CPA examination, and scientific research has gained national exposure in a variety of fields.

### **Students / Faculty**

Nearly 70 percent of Bemidji State students come from northern Minnesota, but the University broadens its services to attract students and faculty from diverse backgrounds and aspirations. Through teaching and informed attention to the educational needs of students, the University seeks to instill the spark of openness and commitment for lifelong learning. In fact, many BSU faculty members continue to pursue knowledge as specialists and educators in their fields.

### **Location**

Bemidji State University lies in the heart of the city of Bemidji, midway between Minneapolis/St. Paul and Winnipeg, deep within Minnesota's lakes and forest region. With stands of pine, oak and birch reflecting the nearby presence of the northern woods, the east side of campus lines the shores of Lake Bemidji. The city of Bemidji, which serves a population of approximately 40,000, provides a regional focus for educational, business and medical services. Entertainment and activities include lively downtown Bemidji, shopping malls, theatre, art, downhill and cross country skiing and various forms of water recreation.

### **Facilities**

The modern campus spans 89 acres on the shores of Lake Bemidji, including the recently-renovated Physical Education Complex which houses the John S. Glas Fieldhouse, host to several NCAA Championships. The BSU Gymnasium hosts the basketball and volleyball events, and a 3,000 square foot weight room, human performance laboratory, indoor track, and tennis, racquetball and swimming areas complete the complex.

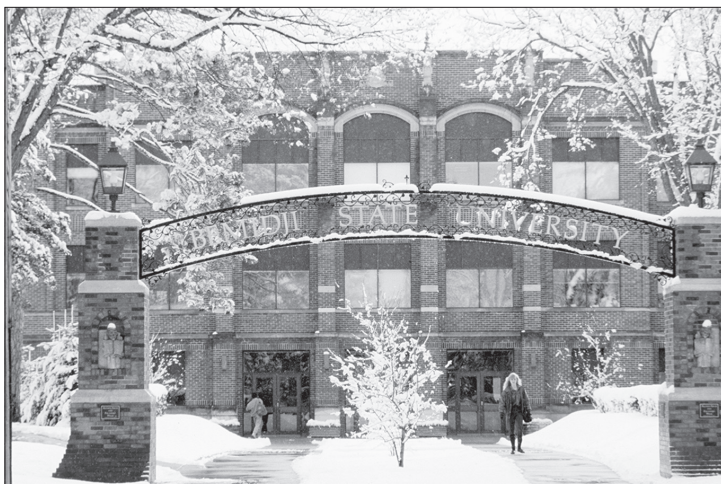
Football fans can catch a spectacular view of Lake Bemidji through the east end zone of Chet Anderson Stadium.

Eighty-two percent of students at Bemidji State receive some form of financial assistance. Over \$16 million was awarded last year to students, including \$6 million in grants and scholarships.

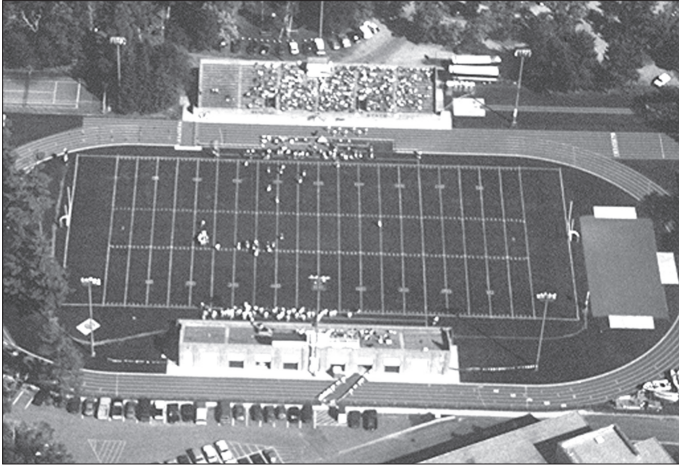
### **Internships**

Media information

### Internet Services

Bemidji State provides extensive Internet information resources for those covering BSU women's hockey and its other athletics programs.

The BSU athletics web site contains schedules, rosters, updated statistics and some historical information from previous seasons. Print-quality photos of BSU players and coaches are also available for download.

BSU's weekly game-notes package is completed and made available on-line Tuesday afternoons during the season, following the release of national statistics by the NCAA. BSU's game notes are in Adobe PDF format and will be distributed via electronic means only (e-mail or web). Due to the size of the release, it will not be regularly distributed via fax.

### Game-Day Services

Gameday packages containing programs, game notes and other information will be available in the press box prior to all home contests.

Final statistics include an official NCAA box score, game summary, individual and team statistics. Game notes and quotes from coaches and selected players will also be available. Telephone, copier and fax services are available on a first-come, first-served basis.

### Credentials / Pass List

Season credentials will be issued to all media covering the Beavers on a regular basis.

For single-game passes and credentials, contact the BSU sports information office no less than 24 hours before the scheduled starting time of the event. Credential requests must be submitted via fax on official letterhead.

Credentials will be issued only to representatives of an accredited media outlet who will be working in an official capacity to cover a BSU athletic event. No credentials will be issued to friends, spouses, children or other family members.

Credentials remain the property of Bemidji State University and may be revoked at any time.

### Interview Policies

All player interviews outside of post-game and practice time must be arranged through the BSU sports information office. For interviews with coaches, contact the sports information office at (218) 755-2763.

By NCAA rule, no player interviews will be available on gameday until the conclusion of that day's contest. Contact the sports information office with questions or for assistance.

### Directions

Highway 2 passes through Bemidji east-west, and Highway 71 is the main north-south thoroughfare. Each leads to Bemidji Avenue/Paul Bunyan Drive. Follow Bemidji Avenue / Paul Bunyan Drive to BSU. Turn right; John S. Glas Fieldhouse is on the right.

### Who Are Boosters?

You are considered a booster or a representative of Bemidji State University Athletics interests if you:

- Participated in or are currently a member of any athletics department booster group, including Beaver Pride
- Have made a donation to the athletic program
- Have assisted or been asked to assist with recruiting of prospective student athletes
- Have assisted in providing benefits to enrolled-student athletes or families
- Have helped to promote BSU athletics or BSU athletic interests in any way

Once a person has become identified as a booster to BSU they retain that identity indefinitely even if they no longer support the athletics program.

### Who Are Prospective Student-Athletes?

The NCAA defines a "prospect" as anyone who has started classes for the ninth grade.

In addition, a student who has not started classes for the ninth grade becomes a prospect, if the institution provides any financial assistance or other benefits not provided to any prospective student

### What Are Permissible Activities by Boosters?

The following are activities that BSU boosters can participate in:

- May attend events such as contests or banquets where prospects are present so long as the booster is there on their own initiative. Boosters are NOT able to contact prospects or prospect's relatives at such events.
- Boosters can inform BSU coaches of prospects in their area by contacting the BSU staff and/or sending newspaper clippings about the prospect.
- Boosters may arrange employment for prospects. Prospects may not start the job until after completion of their senior year in high school, and compensation must be based on actual work performed at a normal rate.
- Boosters can continue to establish family relationships with friends and neighbors. Contacts with prospects are permitted as long as they are NOT for recruiting purposes and are NOT initiated by BSU staff members.

### What is a Contact and what is Considered Recruiting?

A contact is any face-to-face encounter between a prospect or their parents/guardians and a BSU staff member or athletics representative (booster) during which dialogue occurs in excess of a greeting.

Recruiting is any solicitation of a prospect or the prospect's relatives by a BSU staff member or athletics representative (booster) for the purpose of securing the prospect's enrolment and eventual participation in the BSU intercollegiate athletics program.

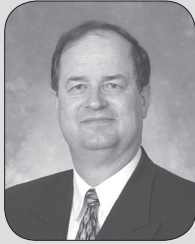

**Dr. Jon E. Quistgaard**  
**President, Bemidji State University**  
 Arizona '70



Dr. Jon E. Quistgaard became the ninth president of Bemidji State University in August, 2001. The Minnesota State Colleges and Universities Board of Trustees named him to the position in late May, 2001 following a national search.

A member of the BSU community for 22 years, he had served since 1997 as the vice president for academic and student affairs. As the chief academic officer of the institution, he was responsible for academic programming in three colleges, integrative studies, distance learning, academic services, international student services, counseling, career services, the American Indian Resource Center, and

student development programs.

Quistgaard began his association with BSU in 1979 as an admissions representative. He became the director of admissions and advising in 1980; was named the dean of undergraduate admissions and graduate studies in 1988; served as acting vice president for academic and student affairs from 1993-94; and was the associate vice president for academic affairs and dean of academic services from 1994-1997.

Quistgaard is an active presenter on the national level in the areas of continuous quality improvement, challenges in higher education, planning, assessment models, and transforming higher education. He received a doctorate in political science from the University of Arizona, where he also earned his master's and bachelor's degrees in government.

**Dr. Rick Goeb**  
**Director of Athletics**  
 North Dakota State '89



A new era in Bemidji State University athletics began July 13, 2001 when Dr. Rick Goeb was named BSU's first full-time director of intercollegiate athletics.

Goeb directs a 17-sport varsity athletics program at BSU with NCAA Division I men's and women's ice hockey and 15 Division II sports.

Beaver athletics has undergone dramatic changes in Goeb's three years at the helm, having seen more than a dozen positions created or filled with new hires - including head coaches for women's hockey, men's and women's basketball, soccer, softball, baseball, women's golf and volleyball - and the hiring of the institution's first

full-time athletics fundraiser.

The 2003-04 season may have been BSU's best ever. Men's hockey won College Hockey America and reached the title game of the CHA Tournament for the second consecutive season, men's basketball won the NSIC regular-season title reached the NCAA Tournament for the first time in its history and women's basketball hosted and won its first-ever NSIC playoff game.

In 2002-03, women's ice hockey turned in its finest season at the Division I level, men's and women's golf each had NCAA regional participants, and outdoor track had two individuals at the NCAA Championships. Additionally, nearly one in four BSU student-athletes earned Academic All-Conference honors including two Academic All-America selections.

BSU's 2001-02 competition season, Goeb's first at the helm, was one of its most successful ever. Men's basketball hosted its first-ever NSIC playoff game; Jeanne Larson was selected to compete in the NCAA women's golf championship; Aaron Feia earned NSIC Athlete of the Year for the indoor track season and helped lead the BSU track teams to six individual NSIC crowns and baseball had its best season since 1997 and hosted the NSIC Tournament.

Goeb came to Bemidji State after six years as senior associate athletics director at the University of Alaska-Fairbanks. At Fairbanks, Goeb served as NCAA compliance officer, monitored academic eligibility and acted as the liaison for booster clubs.

Prior to his position at Fairbanks, Goeb spent two years as an administrator at North Dakota. 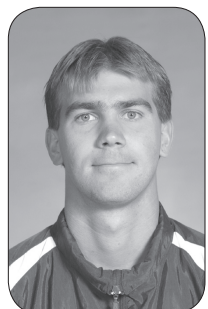

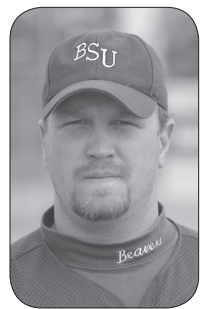

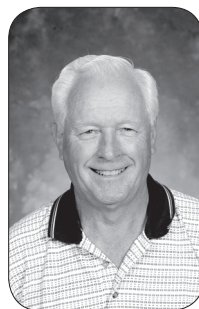
