2025 Outlook

A Look Back at 2024

- » The Bison's lone win in 2024 came in the penultimate week against St. Vincent. The Green and White defeated the Bearcats on the road, 21-13 marking their first victory since the beginning of the 2022 season. Three other Bison losses were decided by one possession while the Green and White put up 22 points against NCAA Division III Tournament Qualifier Grove City: the most the Wolverines allowed all season in a victory.

The 2025 Schedule

- » The Green and White open the season at Bison Stadium as they host Sewanee, The University of the South out of the Southern Athletic Association on Sept. 6. for the first ever matchup between the two teams. The Bison will also travel to Kalamazoo for the first time before opening the conference portion of the schedule which includes five opponents that finished in the bottom half of the PAC standings last season.

New Faces

- » While Coach Robinson does welcome back 32 players from last season's squad, the Bison welcome 96 newcomers including 71 freshmen.

What Returns in 2025

- » Bethany returns two 2024 All-PAC Honorable Mention selections in quarterback Brett Phillips and defensive lineman Amaron Williams.
- » Phillips returns as the program's first 2,000-yard passer since Lincon Reyes took the snaps for the Bison in 2015. Phillips was third in the PAC in completions with 175 on 305 attempts, and was fifth in the conference in yards and touchdowns with 2,042 and 17, respectively leading him to a spot on the PAC Honorable Mention.

2025 Outlook (cont.)

What Returns (cont.)

- » Williams, another PAC Honorable Mention selection, returns as the team's leading tackler with a career-high 60 tackles including 27 solos. He also led the Green and White with seven sacks and will continue to be a threat up front in 2025.
- » Three of the Bison's five leading rushers from last season return including Phillips, graduate TJ Owensby, and sophomore Richard Buchannon.
- » Gearing up for his senior year is tight end Elijah Moffatt. After a breakout year last season, the 6-foot, 4-inch Moffatt is the Green and White's returning receiving leader.
- » The defense also returns a lot of snaps including junior defensive lineman Grant Snyder, sophomore defensive back Devan Colson, and junior linebacker Cam Bailey
- » For the first time in Head Coach Brandon Robinson's time at Bethany, the Bison coaching staff returns each coordinator from the previous season providing veteran leadership for the Green and White.

In the Community

- » Graduate running back TJ Owensby is leaving his mark as a leader both on and off the field. As villages across the Ohio Valley were left devastated due to flash flooding in the area, Owensby gave back by organizing TJ's Helping Hands Flag Football Camp with all proceeds going directly to area victims of the natural disaster.

Brandon Robinson Head Coach FOURTH YEAR AT BETHANY



Robinson enters his fourth season as the Bison head football coach. During his first season, the Bison finished 1-9 (0-8).

Since his hiring in February 2022, Robinson has led the Bethany football program through its most foundational years, emphasizing recruiting across a variety of regions including the Ohio Valley, culture-building, academic accountability, and character development. Under his leadership, the Bison have showed plenty of competitive promise including against the perennial football powerhouses of the Presidents' Athletic Conference. In 2024, Robinson led the team to its first win since the 2022 campaign with three other games decided by only one possession. Robinson's approach at Bethany centers on establishing a sustainable program identity rooted in defensive toughness, efficient spread-option offense, and consistent off-field development to lay the groundwork for the future of Bethany football.

Robinson came to Bethany after two seasons as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Baldwin Wallace University.

At Baldwin Wallace, Robinson served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. During his tenure with the Yellow Jackets, the offense ranked at the top of the Ohio Athletic Conference (OAC) in multiple categories while coaching four All-OAC athletes and one First-Team All-American.

Prior to Baldwin Wallace, Robinson served as the offensive coordinator, offensive line coach and recruiting coordinator at Wheeling University from 2017-2020.

During the Cardinals' first varsity season, they averaged 16.09 points per game, 281.5 points per game and totaled 25 touchdowns.

Prior to Wheeling, Robinson was the wide receivers coach at Lindsey Wilson (Ky.) College for one season. Under his tutelage, the Blue Raider offense finished fourth in the NAIA in total passing offense and sixth in scoring offense per game.

Robinson spent time at Ohio Dominican and served as the tight ends coach as a graduate assistant.

Before his college coaching stints, he was the wide receivers coach and junior varsity head coach at his alma mater Eaton High School in Ohio.

As a three-year starter and All-GLIAC receiver at Ohio Dominican. He led the team with 59 receptions for 738 yards as a sophomore and still ranks among the top-10 in program history with 164 career receptions and 1,877 receiving yards.

Bryar DeSanti joined the Bison football coaching staff in January of 2024. DeSanti serves as the assistant head coach, the offensive coordinator, and the offensive line coach.

In DeSanti's first season, the Bison averaged 14.1 points and 283.9 yards per game including 204.2 through the air. Against No. 8 nationally ranked Grove City in Week 4, the Bison air attack totaled 380 yards to score 22 points which is the second-most the Wolverines would allow all season. The offense's biggest run-game came against Waynesburg in Week 6 as Bison rushers combined for 155 yards. DeSanti returns three of last season's top five rushers including All-Presidents' Athletic Conference honorable mention Brett Phillips: the Green and White's first 2,000 yard passer since 2015.

Desanti comes from Chadron State College (CSC) where he last served as the Recruiting Coordinator and wide receivers coach. He was a part of the Eagles staff since 2016. He started his coaching career at CSC as a running backs coach and a special teams assistant. Desanti continued working with special teams in his third season, but switched his positionary group to tight ends. Since then, Desanti has controlled the wide receiver and recruiting coordinator duties for CSC.

Prior to Bethany, DeSanti served as the interim OC for a game during the 2020 "COVID Season" where he guided an Eagles offense to 35 points, 478 total yards, and 192 rushing yards.

DeSanti played college ball at NAIA/Division II (transitioned) Black Hills State University where he earned All-Conference honors, second team all-conference honors, and Rookie of the Year honors. At Black Hills State, DeSanti double majored in Physical Education and Exercise Science. He then went on to earn his Masters of Science in Organizational Management

Nicholas Thayer joined the Bison football coaching staff in January of 2024. Thayer serves as the defensive coordinator, recruiting coordinator, and the defensive backs coach.

In Thayer's first season, the Bison held opponents to 42 points and 401.7 points per game, but forced 14 turnovers including three in each of the Bison's games against Washington & Jefferson and Thiel. Against the Tomcats, Thayer's defense limited the opposition to a season-best 250 yards and also had two of the team's six interceptions on the year. Returning for the Bison defense is an All-Presidents' Athletic Conference honorable mention in Amaron Williams as well as a handful of other members of the Bison's interior and secondary.

Thayer comes from Division III Anna Maria College where he performed duties as the DC for the Amcats. During his four season tenure at Anna Maria (2019-2023), Thayer filled roles as the Associate Head Coach and Academic Coordinator while being the DC. Thayer won an Eastern Collegiate Football Conference (ECFC) title in 2021. Last season, the Amcats had the #1 overall defense in the conference and a DIII top 25 passing defense in both yards per game and interceptions.

Thayer specializes in the secondary with a decade of experience coaching linebackers and the defensive backfield. His coaching career began as a graduate assistant from 2014-2016 at Anderson University (Indiana) where he was a jack of all trades coaching four different position groups in four semesters: linebackers, defensive backs, defensive line, offensive line. Thayer's first post-graduate coaching gig came with Maine Maritime Academy where he coached inside linebackers for a season before moving "out" to outside linebackers- and Oregon- to coach at Willamette University from 2017-2019.

Thayer played collegiate ball at Endicott University. He graduated with a Bachelor's of Science in Sport Management. Thayer earned his MBA during his graduate assistantship at Anderson University.

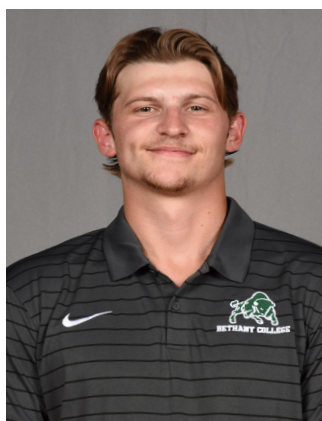
Marc Hull joined the Bison football coaching staff ahead of the 2025 season. Hull serves as the Co-Special Teams Coordinator and the Running Backs Coach

The Green and White finished with an overall record of 5-4 and a 5-1 conference record including clinching the outright championship over Washington & Jefferson in the final game of the season by a final score of 24-13.

Ault, who served as head coach from 1973 through 1981, was a pivotal figure in the program's success, culminating in this standout 1975 season that cemented his legacy and later led to the field at Bison Stadium being named in his honor.
