Bowling Green leads, 3-0. Last meeting: Bowling Green 47, Massachusetts 42; Sept. 27, 2014

MINUTEMEN BEGIN #MACTION AT BOWLING GREEN

UMass football will compete its first Mid-American Conference contest of the season at Bowling Green on Saturday, Oct. 10 with kickoff set for 2 p.m.

Last time these teams met, quarterback **Blake Frohnapfel** reset the UMass record for passing yards in a game (589) and tied the mark for most touchdowns thrown (5) as the sides combined for 1,306 yards of total offense in the Falcons' 47-42 win over the Minutemen during 2014 Homecoming on Sept. 27. The game also marked the first for UMass back at McGuirk Stadium since the 2011 season and a sell-out crowd of 17,000 fans packed the venue.

The game will be available on ESPN3.com and MinuteFans can also listen to each game on their radio dials via a UMass Sports Network broadcast. Voice of the Minutemen **Josh Maurer** serves as the play-by-play broadcaster, UMass alumnus **Matt Goldstein** fills the analyst role and **Mike Antonellis** provides updates from the sideline. Fans can tune in locally to WEEI 105.5 FM (Amherst/Springfield) along with affiliates in Boston (WXKS 1200 AM), Worcester (WCRN 830 AM) and on the South Shore (WATD 95.9 FM). Additionally, fans can listen online through the WEEI streaming player or use their mobile devices to catch the game on the TuneIn Radio app (tunein.com/radio). Pregame coverage begins 30 minutes prior to kickoff.

OUICK SNAPS

University of Massachusetts football...

- Created one of the nation's best offensive turnarounds from 2013 to 2014. Scoring increased 15.6 points per game (11.7 in 2013 to 27.3 in 2014) and the prolific pro-style offense saw total yards per game jump from 281.6 to 421.1 as well.
- Produces the second-most total offensive yards per game across the Mid-American Conference with 445.0 on average during the opening four contests against Colorado, Temple, No. 6 nationally ranked Notre Dame and FIU.
- Averages 327.0 passing yards per game through the arms of Blake Frohnapfel (303.5 per game) and Ross Comis (47.0), the third-most by a team in the Mid-American Conference.
- Limited the Temple run game to 1.8 yards per carry when the Owls visited Gillette Stadium on Sept. 19 after Temple entered the game averaging 4.6 yards per attempt.
- MinuteFans helped UMass put up its single-season best attendance mark in 2014. Massachusetts football averaged 16,088 fans per game last season. The UMass-Boston College attendance (30,479) broke the UMass home game attendance record. The Minutemen previously packed Gillette Stadium with 32,848 fans for a game against New Hampshire in 2010, but UNH was designated the home team for the contest.
- Has three returning coaches assuming new responsibilities for the 2015 season: Liam Coen
 (co-passing game coordinator and quarterbacks), Spencer Whipple (co-passing game
 coordinator, recruiting coordinator and wide receivers) and Steve Costello (tight ends).
- Has two new faces patrolling the sideline during 2015 in special teams coordinator and outside linebackers coach Mark Michaels and running backs coach Darrius Smith.
- Senior Tajae Sharpe etched his name into the UMass record book for single-season and
 career record numbers in the previous year. The now-senior wide receiver is first all-time for
 receptions (211) and receptions per game (5.41) and second in receiving yards (2,703). During
 his junior year he produced the most grabs per game (7.08) and second-greatest yard (1,281)
 and catch (85) totals for one season in program history.
- Senior Tajae Sharpe has seven games of 100 or more receiving yards to his credit, each of
 which occurred in the span of the previous 12 contests dating back to the 2014 season. During
 that time, Sharpe accrued 1,472 receiving yards on 111 receptions for an average of 122.7 yards
 and 9.3 receptions per appearance.
- True freshman **Marquis Young** averages 9.0 yards per carry with 188 rushing yards on 25 touches during the opening four games.
- Senior Tajae Sharpe averages 11.3 receptions per game with 45 covering 536 yards during the opening four weeks of the UMass season. Sharpe sits second overall in the MAC NCAA Division I FBS for receptions per game.
- Junior running back Shadrach Abrokwah sits 163 rushing yards away from 1,000 for his
 collegiate career. Abrokwah accumulated his 837 yards in only 182 carries over 12 games and
 currently averages 4.6 rushing yards per carry as well as 69.8 yards per game.
- Redshirt-senior Marken Michel enters play against Bowling Green 30 receiving yards shy of 1,000 for his UMass career. Michel owns 83 receptions covering 930 yards with five touchdowns in 33 games played.
- Senior Rodney Mills emerged as a pass-catching and touchdown-earning offensive weapon
 a year ago. After he entered 2014 with five receptions, 47 career yards and zero trips to the
 endzone over two seasons, Mills put up 489 yards on 30 receptions (16.3 ypc) as a junior, five
 of which went as touchdown grabs. He has five receptions for 104 yards and two scores in 2015.
- Senior **Trey Dudley-Giles** sits at 986 career kick return yards, good for eighth all-time. He needs 23 yards to pass Jesse Julmiste (1,009) for seventh.
- Redshirt-sophomore Logan Laurent averages 43.5 yards per punt during 23 attempts in his
 first season handling punting duties, the third-best mark in the MAC currently.
- Was also lauded for its work in the classroom during the 2014-15 school year. Fabian Hoeller
 and Matt Sparks picked up Capital One Academic All-District I honors. Both student-athletes
 also appeared on the MAC All-Academic Team while Sparks was a MAC Distinguished Scholar
 with Blake Frohnapfel.
- Is one of only six teams nationally that will play 12 consecutive contests during the 2015 season. The other five are Arizona, Colorado, Florida International, Hawai'i and North Texas. Colorado plays 13 games in a row while the rest play one dozen.

SHARPE LEAVING AN INDELIBLE MARK

Four games into his senior season, **Tajae Sharpe** continues to climb toward the top of the UMass football records listings in receiving yards and touchdowns while simultaneously establishing new top program marks in receptions and catches per game.

In 39 games played with the Minutemen, Sharpe stands atop the list for career receptions with 211. He is also first all-time in catches per game and currently averages 5.41 in each contest entering play at Bowling Green. His 2,703 yards receiving ranks second all-time and puts him 189 away from surpassing **Adrian Zullo** for first all-time (2,892; 1998-2002).

Sharpe's 2014 season was among the most successful for a receiver in UMass history. He notched 1,281 yards (second in program history) on 85 receptions (second) and averaged 7.08 grabs per game (first). On three separate occasions, Sharpe tied the program's single-game record for catches in a contest (13) when he had as many against Bowling Green, Eastern Michigan and Ball State.

In the game against Ball State, Sharpe torched the Cardinals for 239 yards through the air. It marked the 11th-best receiving performance in the history of the MAC and the second-most yards recorded in one game during UMass history.

SHARPE STAYS STEADY

Tajae Sharpe has at least one reception in each of his 39 games, the third-longest active streak in the nation behind D.J. Foster's 45 (Arizona State) and Alonzo Russell's 42 (Toledo) and one of only nine players with a current streak above 30 contests.

Four games into his senior season, Sharpe owns 211 career receptions. He recorded 85 catches as a junior, 61 prior to that as a sophomore and 20 during his true freshman campaign. With his final grab during his 11-reception, 156-yard game against Temple, Sharpe reset the program record for receptions in a career, previous held by **Adrian Zullo** (187; 1998-2002).

SHARPE MAKING 100-YARD GAMES A ROUTINE

Tajae Sharpe has seven games with 100 or more yards receiving in the previous 12 Minuteman football games. In that span, including the opening four games in 2015, Sharpe owns 1,472 yards (122.7 per game) with six touchdowns. Prior to the most recent 12 games, Sharpe did not record a 100+ receiving yard performance as a Minuteman.

SHARPE BECOMES THE GO-TO GUY

In **Tajae Sharpe's** freshman and sophomore seasons he provided 886 receiving yards and four touchdowns on 81 receptions (10.9) during 23 appearances for an average of 38.5 yards and 3.5 receptions per game. Since becoming an upperclassman, Sharpe has amped up his production to 1,817 receiving yards and eight touchdowns on 130 catches in 16 games, an average of 113.6 yards through the air and 8.1 receptions per appearance.

GET TO THE ENDZONE!

Of its 12 touchdown drives in 2015, UMass reached the endzone in under two minutes during eight of those trips. The quick conversion rate ties the Minutemen for second nationally in touchdown drives spanning less than two minutes in length (8-12; 66.7 percent). Troy (7-10; 70.0) ranks ahead of Massachusetts and Baylor in second. TCU follows at 62.5 percent (20-32). Hat tip to Kyle Neaves at Western Kentucky for organizing this list.

Four of the touchdown drives took one minute or less, while all 12 combined average just under 118 seconds in total length.

MICHEL ECLIPSES 1,000 ALL-PURPOSE YARDS

Marken Michel began his final year of eligibility at 907 career all-purpose yards (646 receiving, 145 kick return, 116 rushing). Over the opening four games in 2015, Michel tallied 284 yards on 22 catches (three for touchdowns) with 48 more yards via five rushing attempts and now sits at 1,239 all-purpose yard broken down to 930 receiving, 164 rushing and 145 kick return.

YOUNG BURSTS ONTO THE SCENE

True freshman running back **Marquis Young** provided 103 yards rushing over only five carries vs. the defense of No. 6 nationally ranked Notre Dame on Sept. 26. The game was Young's first 100-yard performance in college and the first-such by a UMass running back in 2015.

Young leads the Minutemen in rushing yards (188) and yards per attempt (9.0) with 21 carries over the opening four games of his career. He provided an 83-yard touchdown run against the Irish, the longest carry by a UMass true-freshman in the modern era of the program - dating back to 1978 - and also the longest since R.J. Cobb scampered 84 yards against Delaware on Nov. 2, 2002. It was 149 games between Cobb and Young's 80-plus yard carries.

MILLS FINDING THE ENDZONE

After he did not record a reception during the first game of the year at Colorado, **Rodney Mills** exploded for a personal-best 104 yards on four receptions against Temple, including a pair of TD strikes from **Blake Frohnapfel**. It was Mills' second career two-TD game, following up his multitouchdown performance at Vanderbilt on Sept. 13, 2014.

Mills, who fills a hybrid role as a fullback and tight end, had five touchdowns in 2014 after he did not reach the endzone during his first two seasons at UMass. He ended the year fourth on the team in touchdowns, with five in 30 catches covering 489 yards.

KEEPING THEIR LEGS MOVING

With 25 carries and 119 net yards to his ledger in 2015, starting running back **Jamal Wilson** has been stopped in the backfield for a loss on only two occasions during his redshirt-senior season. He is averaging 4.8 yards per carry through four games and scored touchdowns in each of the first three games (rushing TDs vs. Colorado, No. 6 Notre Dame; receiving TD vs. Temple). Wilson, combined, the five additional players listed as running backs with at least one carry this year (**Shadrach Abrokwah, Andy Isabella, Sekai Lindsay, Lorenzo Woodley** and **Marquis Young**) own a combined 502 yards gained against only 25 yards lost over 91 carries for an average of 5.2 net yards per rushing attempt.

FRESHMEN FLASHES

UMass has seen six true freshmen take the field in the first four games of the 2015 season. Running back **Marquis Young** and defensive back **James Oliphant** played in the season opener at Colorado and in each game since. **Sekai Lindsey** earned his first action vs. Temple and scored his first career TD at Notre Dame. **Andy Isabella** and **Mike Caggiano** made their debuts in South Bend. Isabella slid in to the kick return spot with six returns for 116 yards. Caggiano was 3-for-3 in point after attempts. Defensive back **Lee Moses** earned special teams playing time in UMass' 24-14 win over FIU.

ABROKWAH NEARING 1,000 CAREER RUSHING YARDS...

With his 56 yards on only nine carries (6.2 ypc) at Colorado, **Shadrach Abrokwah** drew within 200 yards of 1,000 for his career. Through only 11 career appearances, Abrokwah owns 837 rushing yards for an average of 76.1 per game. The Worcester, Mass., native has 182 career rushing attempts for an average of 4.6 yards per carry.

Abrokwah notched 203 yards as a freshman before he posted 578 as a sophomore in 2014. Based on his current yards per game average, Abrokwah will reach 1,000 career rushing yards against Toledo (Oct. 24).

...AND WOODLEY IS TOO

Lorenzo Woodley is 225 rushing yards shy of 1,000 for his career and only 123 from reaching quadruple digits in all-purpose yardage including his 112 yards receiving over 14 catches. Woodley averages 34.8 rushing yards per game and has a pair of 100-yard performances to his credit. He is on pace to eclipse 1,000 all-purpose yards at Ball State on Oct. 31 and reach 1,000 rushing during Senior Day against Miami (Ohio) on Nov. 21 if he keeps to his current per game pace.

VETERAN CENTER IN SPARKS

A veteran unit overall, the UMass offensive line is led in 2015 by senior center **Matt Sparks**. Four games into his third season directing the line, Sparks owns 28 career starts, including 25 in the spot during the previous 28 games.

With Sparks'help in 2014, the Minutemen sported the top passing offense in the MAC (311.8 yards per game). The senior from Mililani, Hawai'i, took home preseason accolades for his work on the offensive line with 2015 Rimington Trophy and Outland Trophy watch list recognition.

LOTS OF STARTS SURROUNDING SPARKS

The UMass offensive line returns each of its starters from one year ago, including a pair of seniors (Josh Bruns and Matt Sparks) and three juniors (Fabian Hoeller, Tyrell Smith and Elijah Wilkinson). This experienced quintet combines for 98 starts on the line during their careers with the Maroon and White.

The left side of the line remained unchanged in 2014, with Hoeller and Smith appearing as starters at guard and tackle, respectively, in each of the 12 contests. Sparks was the starter at center in 10 of 12 games while Bruns filled the role in his short absence due to injury. Bruns held down the right guard spot in the opening six games of the season before switching to center for two appearances while Wilkinson anchored right tackle alongside Bruns.

Sparks stayed at center for the 2015 opener at Colorado while Hoeller, Smith and Wilkinson each stuck with their 2014 starting spots. **Michael Boland** started at right guard in place of Bruns during each of the four completed games in 2015 and now owns 16 career starts.

JETTE PROVIDES STEADY VETERAN PRESENCE

One game into his redshirt-senior season, **Randall Jette** owns 39 career starts in the University of Massachusetts football secondary over the previous three-plus campaigns. Jette, who lines up as a cornerback, has only missed one game during his active seasons (2012-present), the season finale at Ohio on Nov. 29, 2012. He is the most-tenured player on the team in terms of total starts, ahead of classmate Tajae Sharpe's 35.

JETTE ONE OF THE TOP CORNERS IN THE MAC

Randall Jette began his senior campaign as the most lauded member of the UMass secondary sporting a watch list spot for the Jim Thorpe Award and preseason first team all-MAC accolades from Phil Steele and AthlonSports. The Oak Bluffs, Mass., native owns 182 career tackles with 39 passes defended, seven interceptions, four fumble recoveries and three forced fumbles to his ledger.

Jette's 32 pass breakups ties him for third all-time in program history with Don Caparotti (1989-92). Jerard White (1996-99) is in first with 38 breakups, followed by Garrick Amos (1987-89) with 35.

In 2014, Jette finished with 18 passes defended, the third-highest total in the MAC. He recorded back-to-back interceptions against Boston College (Aug. 30) and Colorado (Sept. 6), which is a feat he also accomplished in 2012 when Jette did so against Akron (Nov. 10) and Buffalo (Nov. 17).

COLTON GOES FROM WALK-ON TO STARTER

Senior **Joe Colton** began his UMass playing days as a walk-on before he earned a scholarship following his freshman season due in part to his hard-hitting efforts and team-first mentality. He has grown into a prominent role in the secondary as a starter in 27 games over the previous three seasons, including all 12 at strong safety during 2014 and the first four games of 2015 in a hybrid linebacker/safety role.

Colton increased his work rate in each campaign with 49 tackles as a freshman (27 solo, 22 assists) before he posted 65 as a sophomore (36, 29) and 98 during his junior year (43, 55). He entered 2015 with his solo vs. assisted tackles breakdown even with 106 in each category and split his 32 stops in 2015 into 18 solo stops and 14 combined takedowns.

The native of Norwood, Mass., which is only about 10 miles away from Gillette Stadium, has provided 14.0 TFLs, defended 11 passes and forced a pair of fumbles while he contributes as a member of the UMass special teams unit as well.

DUDLEY-GILES DOES IT ALL IN DEFENSIVE SECONDARY

After starting at cornerback for his previous two years at UMass, **Trey Dudley-Giles** moved to free safety during preseason camp ahead of the 2014 season. After he earned the starting nod at the position in each of the opening eight games of the campaign, Dudley-Giles moved back to his familiar role of cornerback for the last four contests of 2014. He shifted positions again and started at strong safety against Colorado, Temple and No. 6 Notre Dame before being pushed into action at cornerback again versus FIU due to injuries.

DUDLEY-GILES AMONG KICK RETURN YARDAGE BESTS

With 986 career kick return yards, **Trey Dudley-Giles** ranks eighth all-time at UMass. He needs just 23 yards to pass Jesse Julmiste (1,009 yards) for seventh on the list. Dudley-Giles accrued 669 of those yards on kick returns in 2013 for an average of 22.3 yards per attempt. He added 269 more yards on only eight returns last season (33.6 ypr).

LONG DRIVES LEAD TO MINUTEMAN POINTS

Conversions for the Minutemen come through long drives in 2015, a trend that continued from the 2014 season. Each of Massachusetts football's opening 10 scoring drives in 2015 exceeded 50 yards in length. UMass compiled 56- and 79-yard touchdown drives at Colorado in the season-opener before their four scoring series against Temple measured 56, 58, 59 and 61 yards in length. The squad added conversions on 50, 75, 77 and 78-yard ventures at No. 6 Notre Dame.

The Minutemen added 71- and 63-yard touchdown drives of a combined six plays in length (22.3 yards per play) before UMass had its shortest scoring drive of the year on its 13th conversion when Logan Laurent capped a 39-yard series with his 48 yard field goal versus the Panthers.

UMass added on more long drive (62 yards) against Florida International, which gave them 13 scoring drives of 50 or more yards in a possible 14 conversions.

Of UMass' 49 scoring drives during the 2014 campaign, 40 were at least 50 yards in length.

MINUTEMAN DEBUTS

Nineteen current Minutemen played in their first game with the Maroon and White over the opening four contests, including Jarell Addo, Kelton Brackett, Mike Caggiano, Ross Comis, Sharif Custis, Michael Dowe, Jr., Jordin Hamilton, Andy Isabella, Dan Jonah, Jake Largay, Connor Lemieux, Sekai Lindsay, Lee Moses, James Oliphant, Joe Previte, Jeremy Rodriguez, Charan Singh, Andrew Verboys and Marquis Young.

Brackett (UAB) has previous NCAA Division I FBS experience while Hamilton previously played one year at Scottsdale Community College. The list breaks down to six true-freshmen, seven redshirt-freshmen, one sophomore, two redshirt-sophomores, one redshirt-junior, one senior and one redshirt-senior.

THE QUARTERBACK GURU

Two of the most successful quarterbacks in program history played for **Mark Whipple** during his first tenure at UMass while two highly successful NFL QBs played for him during his time with the Pittsburgh Steelers and Philadelphia Eagles as Whipple guided **Ben Roethlisberger** and also worked with **Donovan McNabb**.

Todd Bankhead led the team from 1998-99 and finished his career with 7,018 passing yards, the second-most for a career in program history. **Jeff Krohn** suited up for Whipple from 2002-03 when he threw for 4,993 yards. Bankhead had 51 career touchdowns, while Krohn produced 44, which rank second and third on the program's all-time top 10 list, respectively. **Blake Frohnapfel** added his name to the list of successful QBs coached by Whipple after he put up 3,345 yards and 23 touchdowns in his first year as a college starter in 2014.

UMass plays three contests at McGuirk Stadium on campus this season. The 2015 campaign will feature the Kent State game as Homecoming on Oct. 17 after FIU visited two weeks prior. UMass will also host Miami (Ohio) in the regular season finale for Senior Day on Nov. 21.

FROH KNOWS WATCH LISTS

Second year graduate student quarterback **Blake Frohnapfel** appears on four watch lists at the beginning the 2015 season. His watch list accolades include the Dave O'Brien Award, which is given to the top quarterback across college football by the Davey O'Brien Foundation. He is also up for the Manning Award, handed out by the Allstate Sugar Bowl to the top quarterback in NCAA football.

Frohnapfel appears on the Wuerffel Trophy Watch List, which highlights a combination of community service, athletic success and academic achievement. He is also eligible for the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, which is presented annually at the end of each season to the nation's top college quarterback based on character, citizenship, scholastic achievement, leadership qualities and athletic accomplishments. The Stafford, Va., native also appears among the semifinalists for the William V. Campbell Award recognizing academics, community service and athletic accomplishment.

On top of his watch list candidacies, Frohnapfel earned Phil Steele Preseason All-MAC First Team and AthlonSports Preseason All-MAC First Team at quarterback and is also up for the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team and Lowe's Senior CLASS Award. Three games into his second year as the starting quarterback at UMass, Frohnapfel averages 283.7 passing yards per game with four touchdowns thrown.

BILETNIKOFF AWARD COMMITTEE TABS SHARPE TO WATCH LIST

Senior wide receiver **Tajae Sharpe** began his final year with the Maroon and White as one of 48 candidates for the 2015 Fred Biletnikoff Award. The Biletnikoff Award honors the top receiver, regardless of position, across college football. Sharpe earned the nod after he produced 1,281 yards over 85 receptions (15.1 ypc) with seven touchdowns as a junior in 2014, when he was a midseason addition to the Biletnikoff Award Watch List.

Sharpe is a part of the quintet of Minutemen on the Phil Steele Preseason All-MAC First Team and AthlonSports Preseason All-MAC First Team as well. He is first all-time in the UMass record book in career receptions (211) and receptions per game (5.41), second with 2,703 receiving yards and tied for 10th in touchdown receptions (12) through four games of 2015.

SPARKS UP FOR RIMINGTON, OUTLAND TROPHIES

Previously lauded for his work in the classroom, senior center **Matt Sparks** added athletic accolades in the form of spots on the Rimington Trophy and Outland Trophy watch lists. The Rimington is given to the top college center while the Outland is awarded to the top interior lineman, offensive or defensive. Sparks started 10 games at center in 2014 and helped the UMass attack put up 27.3 points and 421.1 yards per game as one of the top offenses in the MAC.

SANTOS-KNOX LAUDED AT LINEBACKER

Inside linebacker **Jovan Santos-Knox** appears on the 2015 watch lists for the Chuck Bednarik, Bronko Nagurski and Rotary Lombardi awards following his 143-tackle season as a junior one year ago. The Maxwell Football Club bestows the Bednarik Award upon the top defensive player nationally while the Charlotte Touchdown Club hands out he Nagurski Award based on the same criteria. The Rotary Lombardi Award recognizes the top lineman, offensive or defensive.

Like **Blake Frohnapfel**, Santos-Knox is also on the Phil Steele Preseason All-MAC First Team and AthlonSports Preseason All-MAC First Team listings.

JETTE RECOGNIZED AMONG JIM THORPE AWARD CANDIDATES

Randall Jette started 2015 on the watch list for the Jim Thorpe Award, taken home by the top defensive back nationally. One year ago, Jette anchored the UMass secondary with 67 tackles, 18 passes defended and four interceptions with one fumble forced and another recovered. He owns 32 career pass breakups, tied for third all-time among Minutemen while his 2014 passes defended total (18) tied him for third-most in the nation among NCAA Division I FBS competitors.

Phil Steele and AthlonSports lauded Jette on their respective all-MAC first teams alongside fellow Minutemen **Blake Frohnapfel, Jovan Santos-Knox, Tajae Sharpe** and **Matt Sparks**.

MINUTEMEN TO APPEAR ON NATIONAL TELEVISION

UMass football played its opening two road games on national television channels. The Maroon and White faced Colorado in Boulder, Colo., on the Pac-12 Network and was on NBC at Notre Dame for a 3:30 p.m. contest.

In between the Colorado and Notre Dame games, UMass hosted Temple at Gillette Stadium on Sept. 19 for an ESPN3 broadcast. UMass-Florida International (Oct. 3) was available through the ESPN3 platform while Homecoming against Kent State at McGuirk Stadium on Oct. 17 will be televised on a to-be-determined channel.

FORMER MINUTEMEN IN THE NFL

UMass is well represent in the NFL on Sundays with the most prominent alumnus remaining **Victor Cruz**, whose improbable story and highlight reel season in 2011 captured America's attention. Cruz helped the New York Giants to a Super Bowl win while setting a franchise record for receiving yardage in a season. Along with the publicity he

garnered for his signature 'Salsa Dance' as a touchdown celebration, Cruz also wrote a book during the off-season, which became a best-seller.

Lining up opposite from Cruz in the 2012 Super Bowl was **James Ihedigbo** with the New England Patriots. Ihedigbo previously played three years with the New York Jets alongside **Vladimir Ducasse** and is now with the Detroit Lions after Ihedigbo helped the Baltimore Ravens win Super Bowl XLVII in 2013, which marked the second consecutive year that UMass had an alum hoist the Lombardi Trophy.

Ducasse was drafted in the second round of the 2010 NFL Draft and is entering his sixth season in the NFL and first with the Chicago Bears after four years playing for the Jets and one with the Minnesota Vikings. The latest Minuteman to be drafted into the NFL elite was tight end **Rob Blanchflower**, who was chosen by the Pittsburgh Steelers in the seventh round of the 2014 draft.

In 2013, UMass had seven players on NFL active rosters, which was an all-time high. The previous high mark for UMass products in the pros came in 1968, when UMass had five players combined between the NFL and AFL, prior to the leagues' merger in 1970. That year, tight end **Milt Morin** played for the Cleveland Browns, quarterback **Greg Landry** was a first-round draft pick of the Detroit Lions, quarterback **John McCormick** played for the Denver Broncos and halfback **Terry Swanson** and lineman **Ed Toner** suited up for the then-Boston Patriots.

A LOOK BACK AT THE UMASS FOOTBALL 2014 SEASON...

UPGRADING MCGUIRK STADIUM

As part of the transition plan to the FBS, McGuirk Stadium in Amherst went through an extensive construction project over the last two years. With groundbreaking during April 2013, the two main additions included the UMass Football Performance Center and the Martin and Richard Jacobson Press & Skybox Complex.

The Football Performance Center contains coach, operations and academic staff offices, locker rooms, meeting rooms, a film room theatre, athletic training facilities, a video suite and a strength & conditioning area. This marks the first time in the modern era that all support services for the program are housed in one complex. The Martin And Richard Jacobson Press & Skybox Complex offers the first upgrade to the media center of McGuirk Stadium in a half-century. The complex also offers viewing opportunities for dignitaries and fans alike.

In addition to the Football Performance Center and the Martin & Richard Jacobson Press & Skybox Complex, the Minutemen switched sidelines in anticipation of their return to on-campus competition in 2014. The home sideline is now one the East side of the stadium, opposite the press box, in an effort to promote the team and show the home fan section when on national television broadcast.

JUST FROH-ING THESE OUT THERE

To put **Blake Frohnapfel's** banner 2014 year into perspective, he became the fastest UMass quarterback to reach 2,000 yards passing in program history in his first seven games. No other quarterback was able to hit that mark in their first seven games played, including some of the Minutemen's greatest - **Liam Coen**, **Todd Bankhead** and **Jeff Krohn**.

Frohnapfel finished the 2014 season among the top statistical quarterbacks in the NCAA. He ranked fourth nationally in passing yards per game (334.5), 10th in passing yards (3,345), 18th in yards per completion (13.88) and tied for 22nd in passing TDs (23). He led the MAC in passing yards and passing yards per game, and was tied for second in passing touchdowns despite missing the final two weeks of the season due to injury.

He was named the MAC East Offensive Player of the Week after his 589-yard, five-touchdown performance against Bowling Green. The 589 yards passing were a UMass and MAC record for most passing yards in a single game. The five touchdowns tied the UMass record as well. Frohnapfel completed 36 passes during play against BGSU – also a program record for a game – while his 61 attempts ranks No. 2 overall. The previous yardage thrown high mark was 450, set by Kyle Havens in 2010. Frohnapfel's 570 yards of total offense also counts as an individual program record for a one game.

The 589 yards passing were the 20th-best single-game performance by a quarterback in the history of the NCAA. Since 2004, only 10 times has an FBS quarterback thrown for 569 yards or more in a single game (thank you Western Kentucky University for this information).

Throughout the year, Frohnapfel worked his way into the UMass football record book during his banner 2014 season and finished near the top of several single-season top-10 lists, including:

PASS OFFENSE ONE OF NCAA'S BEST

UMass put up extraordinary numbers through the air in 2014, which resulted in the Minutemen being ranked as one of the top passing games in the country. Massachusetts finished the season ranked 10th overall nationally and first in the MAC for passing offense (311.8 yards/game). The Minutemen also stood 21st in NCAA FBS for passing yards per completion and second in the MAC (13.91 yards/completion).

MOVING UP THE MAC RANKINGS

Throughout 2014, UMass steadily improved in the Mid-American Conference statistical rankings as the Minutemen were among the top seven teams in 11 different categories.

SPARKS AND HOELLER MAKE THE GRADE

Offensive linemen **Matt Sparks** and **Fabian Hoeller** were named to the Capital One Academic All-District I Football Team during the 2014 season. The duo was part of 11 players from the Mid-American Conference to earn the honor. Sparks, a native of Hawai'i, is a civil engineering major, while Hoeller, who hails from Germany, is a micro-biology major. Both also earned MAC All-Academic Team laurels in 2014 while Sparks took home MAC Distinguished Scholar alongside **Blake Frohnapfel**.

SCORING INCREASES UNDER WHIPPLE

Throughout the 2014 season, the UMass offense drastically improved under head coach **Mark Whipple** and his pro-style approach. The Minutemen scored 45 offensive touchdowns in those games compared to a total of 14 during 2013 and 17 in all of 2012. UMass had 16 rushing scores with 27 more through the air in 2014 compared to just five rushing and nine passing in 2013 and eight rushing and nine passing in 2012.

The 123 combined points scored in the Bowling Green, Miami (Ohio), and Kent State games marked just the third time in 132 years of football at UMass that the Minutemen put up 40 or more points in three consecutive games. UMass had 135 points during those three contests in 1972 and 131 points over the three-game span in the 1963 season. UMass has never had four straight games with 40 or more points after falling just short of the 40-point mark in the 36-14 win over Eastern Michigan.

UMASS ONE OF TWO TEAMS TO FACE FOUR POWER-FIVE SCHOOLS

A breakdown of every FBS program's schedule revealed that UMass was one only two programs to face a quartet of Power-5 conference schools for its 2014 non-conference schedule. UMass faced Boston College (ACC), Colorado (Pac-12), Vanderbilt (SEC) and Penn State (Big Ten) in order. Louisiana-Monroe was the other school to face the same number of Power-5 schools during 2014 with games against Wake Forest (ACC), LSU (SEC), Kentucky (SEC) and Texas A&M (SEC) on its non-conference slate.

MINUTEFANS HELP UMASS BREAK ALL-TIME ATTENDANCE MARK

With an average of 15,830 fans per each of the six home games last season, UMass reset its attendance record. The previous high mark was 14,684, recorded in 1999 at McGuirk Stadium the year after UMass won the NCAA I-AA National Championship Game.

The 2014 University of Massachusetts football season-opener against Boston College drew 30,479 fans to Gillette Stadium on Aug. 30. That mark set a program record for a home game and was the second-largest crowd for a UMass football game at Gillette Stadium. In 2010, there were 32,848 fans on-site for the first-ever college football game hosted by the stadium - the Colonial Clash between UMass and New Hampshire. UNH was designated as the home team for that contest.

The 2013 attendance average (15,830) was more than 30 percent higher than the year prior (10,901), which was UMass' first season at the FBS level and first year playing games at Gillette Stadium.

BOULDER, Colo. - Despite an 11-catch, 138-yard day from **Tajae Sharpe**, UMass dropped its 2015 season-opener, 48-14. **Marken Michel** added 60 yards and a touchdown through the air on four receptions while **Marquis Young** debuted with 62 yards over seven carries (8.9 per attempt) and **Khary Bailey-Smith** led the defense with 12 tackles.

The ground game spurred on Colorado's offense as the Buffaloes recorded 390 rushing yards over 59 attempts, an average of 6.6 per carry. Five of Colorado's six total touchdowns were rushing scores, including two from Christian Powell and one each by Michael Adkins, Phillip Lindsay and Sefo Liufao, who went 15-of-24 for 168 yards passing and one touchdown

The offensive fireworks were on display from both sides during the opening half and Colorado entered the break ahead, 31-14, after the Buffaloes offset Sharpe's eight-reception, 123-yard opening half with their balanced run game.

The sides traded touchdowns into the second quarter before Colorado created its halftime advantage with the final 17 points before the break. Liufau ran it in from seven yards out for the 14-7 Buffaloes lead, which was negated on the next Maroon and White drive. After they started at their own 21 yard line, the Minutemen marched 79 yards down the field and evened the score at 14-14. Frohnapfel closed the scoring series with an 18-yard pass to Michel, free in the endzone between two Colorado defenders, and UMass drew equal with Colorado with 12:22 left in the second quarter.

However, the Buffaloes notched the remaining 17 points in the quarter as Michael Adkins and Phillip Lindsay scored one rushing touchdown apiece, separated by a Diego Gonzalez 31-yard field goal. Their offense continued to click into the third quarter as the home side posted another 17-point quarter to put the game out of reach.

FOXBORO, Mass. - Despite a late touchdown reception by Jamal Wilson and 393 yards through the air from Blake Frohnapfel, the University of Massachusetts football program dropped its home opener to Temple, 25-23 at Gillette Stadium. Tajae Sharpe reset the program's all-time career receptions record with the final of his 11 catches against the Owls. Sharpe now owns 188 career receptions, one more than the previous record-holder, Adrian Zullo.

Sharpe led both sides with 156 receiving yards while teammate Rodney Mills followed with a personal-best 104 more over five receptions, including a pair of touchdown grabs. Frohnapfel finished 29-of-55 with three TDs and one

Trailing 20-17 with two minutes, 45 seconds remaining in the fourth quarter, the UMass offense compiled an eightplay, 59-yard drive that ended in Wilson's touchdown.

Frohnapfel and Mills connected on a pair of first down receptions covering 18 and 16 yards, respectively, which moved the ball to the Owls' 17 yard line. Three plays later, Wilson outmaneuvered the Temple defense en route to his first career receiving touchdown.

However, Temple responded with a blocked point-after-touchdown (PAT) and returned it for a two-point PAT conversion on the other end that turned the game into a one-point UMass lead, 23-22.

The Owls received possession following their two-point conversion and marched down the field in 74 seconds to set up Austin Jones for a 32-yard field goal attempt. Jones sent his third field goal of the game down the middle for the 25-23 winning margin.

NOTRE DAME, Ind. - University of Massachusetts football freshman running back Marquis Young ran for 103 yards on only five carries, but it was not enough for the Minutemen as UMass faltered at No. 6 Notre Dame, 62-27. With Young leading the way, the Maroon and White ground attack averaged 5.1 yards per attempt on 29 rushes. In addition to Young's afternoon, Jamal Wilson added 51 yards rushing over seven carries (7.3 per attempt).

The offensive line opened up holes in the middle of the Notre Dame defense for the running back committee to put in three touchdowns by a trio of Minutemen during the opening half. Sekai Lindsay, Wilson and Young each scored once as the Maroon and White stayed close with the Irish and entered the half down, 35-20.

Young sprang free for an 83-yard scamper on the final play from scrimmage in the first quarter while Lindsay and Wilson converted from the red zone on one-yard runs up the middle as the ground game kept the contest within reach early on. Shakur Nesmith added his best performance as a Minuteman with 88 yards over three receptions, one for a touchdown, while Tajae Sharpe continued to be the top target for Blake Frohnapfel with an eight-catch, 83-yard afternoon against the Irish defense.

Notre Dame's offense kept up its pace following the break and scored 20 points during the third frame to push ahead, 55-20 by the start of the fourth quarter. The Irish tacked on a fourth quarter TD that bumped their lead to 62-20 before Comis connected with Nesmith on a corner route for the 62-27 final score.

AMHERST, Mass. - University of Massachusetts football outpaced FIU, 24-14, as the Maroon and White defense limited FIU to 188 yards of total offense and Tajae Sharpe secured a single-game program record 15 receptions covering 159 yards receiving with one touchdown. Blake Frohnapfel finished 32-for-42 with 363 yards passing and three touchdowns as he completed 76.2 percent of his passes against the FIU defense without tossing an interception. In addition to Sharpe, Marken Michel eclipsed 100 yards receiving with a career-high 113 over seven receptions (16.1 per catch), including two for touchdowns.

Joe Colton and John Robinson-Woodgett led the team's defensive effort, which kept FIU to just 3.0 yards per play. Robinson-Woodgett had a team-high and personal-best nine tackles, including a nine-yard sack while Colton added eight stops, including a pair of TFLs for six yards lost.

After they went up 14-0 nearing the end of the second quarter, UMass had to hold off FIU's rally attempt the remainder of the way and the Panthers brought the game as close as 17-14. Defensive stops kept both sides off the board at the start of the fourth quarter until Frohnapfel targeted Michel for the final UMass conversion. Michel capped an eight-play, 62-yard drive with a five-yard TD for his first collegiate multi-touchdown performance that pushed the lead to 24-14.

The UMass defense stopped FIU on its ensuing drive. **Kelton Brackett** stuffed Julian Williams five yards short of the down markers with a solo tackle on third-and-seven before **Kassan Messiah** and **Trey Seals** combined for a fourth down tackle of Alex Gardner that ended the Panthers' drive.

The offense took to the field and secured the victory with a game-ending 10-play drive that covered the final 5:16 of regulation. Facing fourth-and-five from the FIU 15 and in need of a conversion, Frohnapfel went to Sharpe seven yards out, which earned the Minutemen a new set of downs to run out the clock on their first win of the season.

HEAD COACH MARK WHIPPLE

EIGHTH SEASON AT MASSACHUSETTS // 18TH AS COLLEGIATE HEAD COACH // BROWN 1979

Mark Whipple, the architect of one of the University of Massachusetts football program's most successful eras, was named the team's head coach on Jan. 14, 2014 for his second stint in Amherst. He was previously at the helm of the Minuteman program from 1998-2003 when he led the Minutemen to the NCAA I-AA National Championship in his first season while making two additional postseason appearances in the following five years.

Whipple is the second head coach of the program during the Football Bowl Subdivision at UMass. He is the fourth of the Minutemen's 29 all-time coaches to serve multiple tenures.

A 30-year coaching veteran of the collegiate and professional levels, Whipple is widely regarded for his prowess as an offensive coordinator and his ability to develop quarterbacks. He helped Ben Roethlisberger of the NFL's Pittsburgh Steelers win a Super Bowl in his second year, built the University of Miami's 2009 and 2010 offenses into two of its best all-time and his teams set 40 offensive records while at UMass.

Whipple brings more than 15 years of experience as a head coach with a 124-68 overall record, including a 52-35 mark at UMass. His coaching resume includes a National Coach of the Year award (1998), a Brown Athletic Hall of Fame induction (1996), an NFL Super Bowl Championship (2006) and a pair of collegiate bowl game appearances (2009, 2010).

Whipple last coached with the Cleveland Browns from 2011-12 where he served as quarterbacks coach. He worked with second-year quarterback Colt McCoy (2011) and rookie Brandon Weeden (2012) within the Browns' West Coast offensive scheme.

His most recent collegiate stop was at the University of Miami as the assistant head coach, offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach during the 2009-10 seasons. During his time in Coral Gables, he guided the explosive Hurricane offense during two of their best statistical seasons in program history. Both years featured total yardage in excess of 5,000 yards with 2010's total of 5,483 standing as the third-most in program history.

In 2009, Whipple led Miami to its best offensive season since the national-title contending 2002 team. The Hurricanes put up 5,199 yards of offense becoming just the eighth team in school history to eclipse the 5,000-yard mark in total yards gained. Under Whipple's tutelage, quarterback Jacory Harris totaled the second-most pass completions (249), fourth-most passing yards (3,352) and sixth-most touchdowns (24) in a single season at Miami.

The 2010 Miami squad posted the fourth-best total rushing yardage in program history with 2,372 on the ground. Damien Berry led a stable of tailbacks with 899 yards and five touchdowns. The group overall averaged 182.5 yards on the ground per game with an average of 4.8 per carry.

Whipple spent the 2008 season as an offensive assistant coach with the Philadelphia Eagles, helping the team to an appearance in the NFC Championship game. Before joining the Eagles, he served as the quarterbacks coach of the Pittsburgh Steelers from 2004-06 where he was instrumental in the development of Roethlisberger, who became the youngest starting quarterback to win a Super Bowl as a rookie. In 2004, Roethlisberger became the first NFL quarterback to finish a season undefeated with a 13-0 record in games he started.

Prior to his move to the NFL, Whipple spent 16 years as a collegiate head coach. In addition to his time at UMass, Whipple also led the Brown and New Haven programs.

At every stop in his college coaching career, the trademark of a Whipple team was a high-powered offense. His UMass teams rewrote the program's record book, setting more than 40 team records. In 1998, his national championship team posted school records in points scored (524), touchdowns (73), total yards (7,074), passing yards (4,050), completions (306) and first downs (354).

While at UMass, he posted a 49-26 (.653) record in six years (1998-2003), leading the Minutemen to a Division I-AA National Championship in his first season with the team in 1998. He also won three Atlantic 10 Conference Championships. He was named the American Football Coaches Association's GTE Division I-AA National Coach of the Year, while also receiving National Coach of the Year honors from Don Hansen's Football Gazette and finished runner-up for the Eddie Robinson Award, presented by The Sports Network.

In addition, Whipple was named the Scotty Whitelaw Division I-AA Coach of the Year by the New York Metropolitan Football Writers Association, and earned AFCA/GTE Region I Coach of the Year honors. In 2003, he earned Atlantic 10 Coach of the Year honors. He was selected as the New England Coach of the Year by the New England Football Writers and the Gridiron Club of Greater Boston in both 1998 and 2003. He posted five winning seasons in only six years as head coach with 17 different players earning All-America honors.

Taking over a program which finished 2-9 in 1997 and having had won just 19 games in the previous four seasons before his arrival, Whipple brought unparalleled success to the Minutemen under his leadership. Consider that in Whipple's six seasons on the sideline, UMass football captured a national title, won three conference championships, made consecutive NCAA I-AA playoff appearances for the first time ever and had three NCAA berths overall.

Introduced as the 26th coach in UMass history by then-athletic director Bob Marcum on Dec. 16, 1997, Whipple-coached teams posted a .500-or-better record 14 times. No UMass football coach reached the 20-win plateau faster than Whipple, who also owns five of the school's 11 all-time postseason victories.

In Whipple's rookie season at UMass, the Minutemen won a then school-record 12 games (broken by the 2006 NCAA national runner-up team) en route to the 1998 NCAA Division I-AA championship. UMass posted a record six victories over ranked opponents in 1998, including a 55-43 triumph over top-ranked and previously unbeaten Georgia Southern in the NCAA Championship game.

The Minutemen followed up Whipple's first campaign with another outstanding season in 1999. Armed with a lofty preseason ranking, UMass rebounded from a 1-3 start to post a 9-4 record and advance to the quarterfinals of the NCAA playoffs. Along the way, UMass tied the all-time school record for consecutive victories with eight, and also claimed a share of the 18th Atlantic 10 title in school history.

In 2000, UMass struggled with injuries to key players throughout the season, but was still able to post an overall record of 7-4, with three of the losses coming against teams which advanced to the Division I-AA playoffs. It marked the first time UMass had strung together three-straight winning seasons since a five-year run from 1977-1981. In addition, the Minutemen finished in third place in the Atlantic 10 with a 5-3 league mark, and handed Whipple his 100th career win with UMass' 29-21 season-ending victory at Rhode Island.

A young and inexperienced team was hit hard by injuries in 2001, finishing 3-8, but Whipple's 2002 Minutemen rebounded to post an overall record of 8-4. UMass tied for third place in the Atlantic 10 with a 6-3 mark in conference games, while downing two teams ranked in the top five in the nation (No. 2 Maine and No. 4 Villanova).

Whipple came to UMass following a four-year stint at his alma mater, Brown University. During his four years with the Bears (1994-97), Whipple compiled a 24-16 (.600) overall record without a losing season. His teams won more games in four years than the previous eight seasons at Brown combined.

Whipple led Brown to a 7-3 mark and a second-place finish in the lvy League in his first season in 1994, posting the school's best record and first winning season since 1987. His squad capped the year with four consecutive victories, marking the first time since 1980 that Brown had accomplished that feat.

In 1995, the Brown offense set several single season school records, including most points (282), total offense (4,165 yards), passing offense (2,502 yards) and first downs (227). His 1996 team came within a play of the lvy League title. Battling Dartmouth to the final minute of the game in the ninth week of the season, the Bears fell to the undefeated Big Green by three points. For the second straight year, Whipple's passing offense set a new school mark with 2,628 yards.

In 1997, his squad set Ivy League and school records for total offense (474.3 yards per game) and Brown records for single season first downs (233), passing yards (317.9 yards per game) and single game total offense (629 yards vs. Yale).

Before his tenure at Brown, Whipple spent six years at the University of New Haven (1988-93), where he posted an impressive 48-17 (.738) overall record as head coach and offensive coordinator, including two straight NCAA Division II playoff appearances in 1992 and 1993. The Chargers were ranked in the top 20 nationally in five of his six seasons at New Haven.

In 1992, he led the Chargers to a 12-1 mark, advancing to the NCAA semifinals and finishing with a No. 5 ranking nationally. The squad led all NCAA divisions in scoring offense (50.5 points per game) and total offense (587.7 yards per game).

Whipple guided the 1993 squad to a second-straight undefeated regular season (10-0) and a No. 2 national ranking, before falling in the NCAA quarterfinals. That team was named Sports Illustrated's "Best Offense in College Football", averaging 52.5 points and 557.6 yards of total offense per game.

Prior to his stint at New Haven, Whipple served as the offensive coordinator at the University of New Hampshire for two years. He was also a member of the coaching staff for the USFL's Arizona Wranglers under George Allen, assisting with the quarterbacks. Whipple was an assistant
