### FIRST AND 10

-Ohio is looking to get back to its winning ways after losing its second straight Mid-American Conference outing at Buffalo on Oct. 24.

-The game will be broadcast live on ESPN2 with Dave Lamont (PBP) and Desmond Howard (Color) calling the action.

-The game can also be heard on the Ohio Bobcats IMG radio network with Russ Eisenstein and Rob Cornelius calling the action. Pregame coverage on the network begins at 2:30 p.m. ET.

-This marks the 67th meeting between Ohio and Bowling Green in a series that dates back to 1945.

-Bowling Green holds a 39-25-2 overall record over the Bobcats. Bowling Green has won the last three meetings including a 49-0 win in Bowling Green on Nov. 12, 2013.

-Ohio's last win at Bowling Green and its last win in the series was on Nov. 16, 2011 when they picked up a 29-28 win over the Falcons.

-Ohio's final four games of the regular season will be broadcast nationally on the ESPN family of networks and will be mid-week games.

-Ohio returns home for its final two home games of the regular season hosting Kent State on Nov. 10 and Ball

State on Nov. 17.

-Ohio has been all about explosive plays this season logging 44 plays of 20 yards or more.

-Ohio has just one new coach on the sidelines this season, Anthony Perkins will coach the cornerbacks.

-Ohio returns 20 starters including 10 starters on offense, seven on defense and three specialists. They also return all five starters on the offensive line.

### QUOTE OF THE WEEK - HC FRANK SOLICH

"We're floundering here a little bit. We're not operating with precision on either side of the ball and that is a huge problem in terms of putting points on the board, outscoring people, keeping people from scoring. So it's certainly something that we need get to fixed and straightened out. They're down right now and obviously we have to fight our way back."

### FIVE TAKEAWAYS FROM BUFFALO...

-Ohio gave up its first touchdowns of the season to an opponent in the first quarter. Ohio is outscoring opponents 63-20 in the first quarter.

-This marked the fifth game this season Ohio scored on its opening offensive possession.

### EXPLOSIVE PLAYS

The Bobcats have been racking up explosive plays this season with 44 plays over 20 yards. The Bobcats have two plays of 60-yards plus and five over 50. RS freshman Running back Papi White leads the squad with nine 20-plus yard plays while RS sophomore wide receiver Brendan Cope leads the team with longest plays of the year. A 67-yard pass from Derrius Vick against Southeastern Louisiana and a 65-yard pass from JD Sprague against Idaho. White has the longest rush of the season, a 58-yarder against Southeastern Louisiana.

### GOING LONG

Redshirt senior placekicker Josiah Yazdani kicked a career long 50 yard field goal in their win over Miami. Yazdani also drained a 41-yarder. During his career, Yazdani is 84/84 on PAT attempts and 27/27 this season while also draining 5-7 field goal attempts.

### RETURN DEFENSE

Ohio currently ranks 9th in the NCAA in both punt and kick off return defense. Ohio leads the MAC in both categories are allowing 17.6 yards per return on kickoffs and 1.6 yards per return on punts. Ohio has given up a total of 18 yards on 11 punt returns this season.

### STRONG OPENING FRAME

Although the Bobcats gave up their first opening quarter touchdowns on the season, Ohio is still outscoring opponents 63-20 in the first quarter of its games this season. Yazdani and Patterson lead the Bobcats this season in individual scoring with 42 points each, followed by Smith who has 30.

### SCOUTING BOWLING GREEN

-Bowling Green currently sits atop the MAC East standings with a 4-0 record in MACtion and a 6-2 overall mark, having won their last five outings.

-Bowling Green sports nonconference wins over Maryland (48-27) and Purdue (35-28) with MAC wins over Buffalo (28-22), UMass (62-38), Akron (59-10) and Kent State (48-0).

-Bowling Green is averaging 595.2 yards per game of total offense with 434.1 yards coming through the air and 161.1 coming on the ground.

-The second quarter has been the biggest quarter for the Falcons as they are outscoring opponents 109-44 in the frame.

-RS senior quarterback Matt Johnson has started all eight games this season for the Falcons and is averaging 415.1 yards per game passing with a 177.0 passer efficiency.

-Johnson has gone 242-345 with 29 touchdowns and three picks. Completing 70.1 percent of his passes.

-RS senior running back Travis Greene leads the rushing attack averaging 5.3 yards per carry and 73.8 yards per game while scoring four touchdowns this season.

-Sophomore wide receiver Roger Lewis leads the receiving corps of the Falcons with 140.2 yards per game and 19.3 yards per reception. He has caught 58 passes this season scoring 11 touchdowns.

-On the defensive side, Bowling Green is giving up 419.5 yards per game to its opponents including 147.8 on the ground and 271.8 through the air.

-RS sophomore linebacker Austin Valdez leads the team with 74 total tackles including 35 solo hits.

-Senior defensive lineman Zach Colvin leads the squad with 6.5 sacks for 26 yards lost.

-The Bobcats are averaging 378.9 yards per game of total offense including 256.6 yards through the air and 131.2 on the ground.

-RS senior quarterback Derrius Vick leads the Bobcats passing game with a 135.45 passer efficiency, averaging 206.8 yards per game. Vick has gone 140-219 with nine touchdowns and six picks.

-Junior Sebastian Smith leads the team with 40 catches this season averaging 12.4 yards per reception and 61.8 yards per game. Smith has five touchdowns on the season.

-Senior running back Daz Patterson leads the squad with 78 carries this season, averaging 4.3 yards per and 41.9 yards per game. Patterson has seven touchdowns this season.

-Defensively, Ohio is giving up 370.2 yards per game to opponents and has forced 14 turnovers.

-RS junior linebacker Blair Brown leads the Bobcats with 57 tackles this season and 32 solo hits. He has 4.5 tackles for 10 yards lost.

- Despite the loss to Bowling Green, Ohio head coach Frank Solich has a 26-14 record in the month of October.
- Today's 24,311 fans are eighth all-time in Peden Stadium history.
- Ohio is now 1-2 in the MAC and returns home next Saturday (Oct. 18) against Akron.

### OFFENSIVE NOTES

- The offense tallied a school-record 110 plays. The previous record was 104 plays in a game in 1968.
- The record was just five shy of an NCAA record of 115 plays.
- Redshirt sophomore quarterbacks JD Sprague and redshirt sophomore quarterback Greg Windham combined for 64 total pass attempts, which ranks second in Ohio history.
- Sprague tallied a career-high 325 passing yards, a career-high 27 completions and a career-high 56 attempts.
- The last time a quarterback had 300-349 passing yards was in 2013 against Miami when Tyler Tettleton threw for 306 yards.

- Freshman wide receiver Robbie Walker's 14-yard reception in the third quarter was his longest of the season.
- Reid's 34-yard reception in the third quarter was his longest of the season.
- Senior running back Tim Edmond tallied his second-career touchdown on a two-yard run in the fourth quarter.
- It was his second touchdown in as many games.
- Graduate wide receiver Aaron Bradley caught his first two passes as a Bobcat, one for 24 yards and another for 12.

Head Coach Frank Solich has continued a storybook turnaround during his tenure at Ohio University. Now in his 11th season (17th overall), the Bobcats have been bowl-eligible in eight of the last 10 years, having won 68 games since 2006 - the most among any team in the Mid-American Conference East Division - and have had student-athletes selected in the NFL Draft in five of the past seven seasons.

This past season, Solich led the Bobcats to their sixth-straight season of bowl eligibility, finishing 6-6 overall and 3-3 in the MAC. The Bobcats also earned their second-straight battle of the Bricks victory, scoring 24 unanswered points to down the RedHawks as time expired.

the 2014 season saw A.J. Ouellette, a walk-on freshman, step up and earn a starting spot at the runningback position. Ouellette rushed for 785 yards and scored seven touchdowns on the ground. He also recorded 133 receiving yards and scored three touchdowns from the air.

At the end of the season, four Bobcats earned spots on the All-MAC team, including Punt return specialist Daz Patterson, offensive lineman Lucas Powell, outside linebacker Jovon Johnson and down lineman Tarell Basham.

The 2014 season also saw Mitch Bonnstetter, Aaron Bradley, Dorian Brown, Chase Cochran, Cody Grilliot, Davon Henry, Josh Kristoff, Kurt Laseak, Troy Mangan, Quentin Poling, Kendrick Smith, Mike Terpin and Josiah Yazdani earn spots on the Academic All-MAC team.

In 2013, Solich guided the Bobcats to their fifth-consecutive bowl appearance. In addition, Ohio picked up its third straight win in its Battle of the Bell rivalry over Marshall, which would go on to

play in the 2013 Conference USA Championship game.

Under Solich's leadership in 2013, the Bobcats scored 336 points, which currently ranks eighth on Ohio's all-time Top 10 list. Defensively, Ohio held five of its opponents to fewer than 300 yards of total offense. The Bobcat defensive unit also tallied 34 sacks, which is currently tied for second all-time in a single season.

Following the year, Ohio earned six slots on the 2013 MAC All-Conference with Devin Bass (kick returner) and Travis Carrie (punt returner) both earning spots on the All-MAC First Team.

In 2012, Solich directed Ohio to its best start to a season since the 1968 campaign as the Bobcats opened the year 7-0. The Bobcats' 7-0 start included a thrilling 24-14 victory over Penn State in front of a nationally-televised audience.

After opening the year 7-0, Ohio earned a spot in all three major college football polls for the first time in school history - Associated Press, USA Today and the Bowl Championship Series standings.

Following the 2012 campaign, Ohio placed six individuals on the 2012 MAC All-Conference teams and earned a bid to the 2012 Advocate V100 Independence Bowl to punch its ticket to a fourth-consecutive bowl trip.

In the Independence Bowl, Ohio did not disappoint as it defeated Louisiana-Monroe 45-14 to pick up its second-straight bowl victory. The Bobcats also set or tied 11 bowl records in the win, including the mark for total yards as they finished with 556.

The 2012 season also saw the emergence of running back Beau Blankenship. In his first season as a starter, Blankenship set the single season rushing record of 1,604 yards under Solich's watch. He also rushed for 15 touchdowns as he averaged just over five yards per carry.

In his seven previous seasons as Ohio's head coach, Solich guided the Bobcats to an impressive 50-40 record. In 2011, Solich led the Bobcats to their first-ever bowl win as Ohio defeated Utah State 24-23 in the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl to finish the year 10-4.

Ohio's win over the Aggies gave the Bobcats their first 10-win season since 1968. The Bobcats' 10 wins were also the most among division I-A teams from the state of Ohio. The Bobcats four losses came by a combined total of just 19 points (4.75 points per game).

Solich's 2011 Bobcat squad set 47 school records, won six of the team's last seven games and had a league-best 11 players on the MAC All-Conference teams. In addition, Solich picked up his 100th career victory following a convincing 30-3 victory over Gardner-Webb on Sept. 10.

Among the 11 players selected All-MAC, place kicker Matt Weller was named Special Teams Player of the Year, offensive lineman Joe Flading was named First Team and quarterback Tyler Tettleton became the first Ohio signal-caller to be named all-league since 1985. Under Solich's watchful eye, Tettleton re-wrote Ohio's single season record book as he set 12 records and became the first quarterback in school history to pass for 3,000 yards in one year, while in the process throwing a

program-best 28 touchdowns.

The 2011 campaign also saw Ohio defeat arch-rival Miami for the sixth-consecutive season - the program's longest winning streak since it won six straight from 1937-1942. Since Solich took over in 2005, Ohio has only suffered two losses to Miami.

In 2010, the Bobcats went to the New Orleans Bowl, making the program's fifth bowl appearance and third in the past five seasons.

Following the season, seven student-athletes were named All-MAC and quarterback Boo Jackson finished his career as Ohio's career leader in completion percentage (.604), pass efficiency (136.3), total offense per play (6.18), passing yards per attempt (7.7) and touchdown passes (38). He also finished the season with 26 total touchdowns, 48 in his career, which is fourth all-time. He also accumulated 18 passing touchdowns in 2010 (fourth all-time on the single-season list).

The 2009 season was equally successful as the senior class compiled 28 victories during its four years on campus. In addition, Ohio boasted a school-record 12 All-MAC selections with four capturing All-America honors en route to a second MAC East title in the squad's last four years. Solich was named the conference coach of the year by Phil Steele.

Following back-to-back seasons of bowl eligibility, the Bobcats followed it up with an offensive outburst that rewrote many of Ohio's all-time team and individual records in Frank Solich's fourth year at the helm. In 2008, the Bobcats' aerial attack set three school single-season passing records, including passing yards, passing yards per game and touchdown passes all of which stood until the conclusion of the 2011 season.

Overall, Ohio also totaled 4,337 yards of total offense, which at the time was the third-highest total in school history. Following the year, six players garnered All-MAC recognition, while in the classroom, five picked up Academic All-MAC awards.

Perhaps the best individual honor under Solich came with safety Mike Mitchell being drafted by the Oakland Raiders in the second round of the NFL Draft (47th overall), becoming the highest drafted Bobcat since 1948 and the highest under Solich.

With Solich as coach in 2007, Calvin McRae became the first Ohio player in history to rush for 1,000 yards in three consecutive seasons. Other players achieved success for the offense as well, with tight end Andrew Mooney setting the single-season Bobcat touchdown reception record and quarterback Brad Bower tying the career record for most yards per pass.

In 2006, Solich guided Ohio to its first MAC East Division championship, the program's first MAC title of any kind since 1968, earning the Bobcats a spot in the GMAC Bowl, which marked the Bobcats' first bowl game since that same 1968 season.

Following the year, Solich was rewarded with MAC Coach of the Year honors, marking the third time in eight seasons in which he had won his league's coach of the year award. Ohio's five-win improvement from 2005 (4-7) to 2006 (9-5) tied for the sixth-best turnaround in the nation.

In his first three seasons, Solich guided the Bobcats to 19 victories in his first three campaigns after the squad had won 11 games in the previous four seasons. Since his arrival, Solich has coached 63 All-MAC players.

His players have also gained national recognition. At the conclusion of the 2011 season, Joe Flading earned SI.com All-America honors. In 2009, LaVon Brazill and Noah Keller were named to various All-America teams, while Matt Weller and Gerald Moore were tabbed as Freshman All-Americans. In 2005, Dion Byrum became Ohio's first non-special teams All-American since 1968, and three rookies have been honored on The Sporting News Freshman All-America squads.

Ohio has also seen an increase of national television exposure since Solich's arrival in 2005 and has also seen an increased level of exposure in the media as it was featured in *Sports Illustrated*, *USA Today*, *The New York Times* and *Boston Globe*.

Since Solich arrived in Athens, Bobcat players have been named to watch lists for such prestigious honors as the Maxwell Award, the Butkus Award, the Lombardi Trophy, the Lott Trophy, the Davey O'Brien Award, Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, Manning Award, the Biletnikoff Award and the

Nagurski Trophy. Byrum was a semifinalist for the Jim Thorpe Award, presented to the nation's top defensive back, in 2005.

Off the field, Solich is equally proud of his player's accomplishments in the classroom. In the past four seasons, the Bobcats have had 31 Academic All-MAC selections. He has also had two seasons where an Ohio player has been named a semifinalist for the Draddy Trophy, one of the most prestigious academic honors in college football. Academic success is nothing new for Solich's teams. While head coach at Nebraska, almost 90 percent of his student-athletes earned their degree. Seven times Huskers earned first-team CoSIDA Academic All-America honors and on four other occasions, second-team honors were bestowed.

Solich was named the Bobcats' head coach on Dec. 17, 2004. In short order he assembled a talented and tested coaching staff, coordinated recruiting efforts to assure a steady stream of outstanding student-athletes to the program, supervised a highly productive off-season weight program producing dozens of personal bests and concluded all-business spring drills introducing his players to tried and true offensive and defensive schemes.

Solich's arrival brought a renewed enthusiasm to the Bobcat football program. Ohio used that spark to begin a massive renovation of Peden Tower to better serve its student-athletes.

The momentum carried over into Solich's first season on the sidelines at Peden Stadium. Solich's first win at Ohio came against defending Big East champion Pittsburgh in his home debut. Dion Byrum's two interception returns for touchdown on national television in an overtime victory put the Bobcats on the national stage. The win was one of only two victories for MAC teams against BCS-conference opponents during that season.

Solich arrived in Athens after six seasons as the head coach at the University of Nebraska. Solich spent nearly 30 years as part of the Nebraska program as a player, assistant coach and head coach. A Big 12 Coach of the Year in 1999 and 2001, Solich produced nine-win seasons in five of his six years as head coach of the Huskers. In 1999, 2000 and 2001, he generated 12, 10 and 11 win seasons, respectively. He also generated six-consecutive bowl appearances including a 2001 run at the national championship against Miami in the Rose Bowl.

Under Solich's leadership, Nebraska spent 54 consecutive weeks in the Associated Press Top 10. In his first five seasons as Husker head coach, Solich won 49 games, more than both his storied predecessors, Bob Devaney and Dr. Tom Osborne, in their first five years at Nebraska.

Moving on from Nebraska following a 2003 season in which his Huskers went 10-3, Solich was nevertheless determined to stay as close as possible to the college game until just the right opportunity came along. In a unique professional development opportunity all too often ignored by colleagues, Solich chose to travel the college and professional ranks to update his knowledge of the game, broaden his perspectives on its nuances and challenges and ready himself for the next great challenge.

Stepping back from the sideline included wide-ranging visits to some of Division I-A's top programs as well and the schedule included much more than a courtesy call. His ambitious fact-finding odyssey included stops at Oklahoma, Texas, Wisconsin, Miami and Southern California.

Coming from his native Cleveland to Lincoln back in 1962, he was recruited to play fullback for the Cornhuskers as a part of Bob Devaney's first class of freshmen. During his time in the Husker program, Nebraska went 9-2, 10-1, 9-2 and 10-1. He earned All-Big Eight honors in 1965 and was the first Husker to rush for 200 yards in a game. His place in the Nebraska tradition was formalized with his induction into the Nebraska Football Hall of Fame in 1992.

While his accomplishments as a player were impressive, his work as a gifted teacher and assistant coach perhaps had as much to do with his arrival in the shrine as anything. Nine of the 15 seasons he served as running backs coach, Nebraska led the nation in rushing. He recruited and coached 1983 Heisman winner Mike Rozier and produced at least one all-conference running back in thirteen of the fifteen years he mentored that position. As a head coach, Solich mentored Eric Crouch to the 2001 Heisman Trophy.

## GAME 1 - IDAHO 28, OHIO 45 | SEPT. 3, 2015

### Kibbie Dome | Moscow, Idaho | 11,587

#### THE SHORT STORY

The Ohio football team kicked off the 2015 season in a big way, defeating Idaho 45-28 on Thursday night inside the Kibbie Dome. Redshirt senior quarterback Derrius Vick led the Bobcats in the air with 192 passing yards, while senior running back Daz Patterson's 85 yards on the ground and redshirt sophomore Brendan Cope finishing with 129 receiving yards.

#### HOW WE GOT HERE:

- The Bobcats got off to a fast start, taking an early 7-0 and would not trail at any moment during the game.
- The Bobcats entered the half leading 28-13.
- Vick completed the first half 6-for-9 with 124 passing yards and two passing touchdowns.
- In the first half, redshirt senior linebacker Jovon Johnson had an interception returned for 29 yards and a touchdown, one tackle and one sack.
- Sophomore linebacker Quentin Poling led the Bobcats in the first half with 11 tackles, all of them solo and a new career high.
- As a team, Ohio had 216 passing yards and 81 rushing yards.
- The Bobcats added three points in the third quarter when redshirt senior Joshua Yazdani hit a 37-yard field goal to put the Bobcats up 31-13.
- To start the fourth quarter, Idaho drove down the field, scoring on a one-yard rush, making the score 31-20 with 11:51 left in the game.
- The Bobcats immediately marched down the field, led by Patterson who had 52 yards on seven carries on the drive, including the one-yard rushing touchdown, putting Ohio up 38-20.
- Idaho responded on a Deon Watson five-yard pass from Linehan and then the two connected again on a two-point conversion, making the score 38-28.
- With 42-seconds left in the game, freshman running back Maleek Irons rushed for a 17-yard touchdown, sealing the Bobcats' 45-28 victory.
- Vick finished the game 13-for-16 for 192 yards and two touchdowns. On the ground he had nine rushes for 34 yards.
- Cope finished the game with four receptions for 129 yards and one touchdown. Cope's longest reception was for 50 yards.
- Patterson finished with 84 rushes on 13 carries and one touchdown.
- Poling finished the game with 12 unassisted tackles, a career high and two sacks.
- Reid finished with 64 yards on four receptions and a touchdown.
- As a team, Ohio had 205 rushing yards and two touchdowns on the ground.
- In the air, the Bobcats recorded 284 yards and three touchdowns.
- Yazdani was 1-for-2 on field goal attempts, hitting a 37 yarder in the third quarter and missing a 31-yarder as time expired in the third quarter.

#### THE SHORT STORY

The Ohio football team emerged victorious in "The Battle for the Bell," defeating Marshall at Peden Stadium. The Bobcat defense held Marshall to 241 yards of offense while forcing four turnovers to give Ohio a 4-3 advantage in its last seven meetings with the Herd.

#### HOW WE GOT HERE

- Ohio opened the scoring with a six play, 62 yard drive which was culminated on a 33-yard touchdown run by senior Daz Patterson.
- Patterson led the Bobcats with 58 yards on the ground on six carries in the first half
- Redshirt senior quarterback Derrius Vick was intercepted by Marshall cornerback Taj Letman in the first quarter to halt Ohio's third drive.
- Vick played the first quarter, going 4-for-7 for 29 yards and one interception.
- After the teams traded punts, Marshall found its way onto the scoreboard with a 73-yard touchdown scamper by running back Devon Johnson at the 10:07 mark of the second quarter.
- In the second quarter, redshirt senior cornerback Ian Wells intercepted Marshall quarterback Michael Birdsong, which set Ohio up at the Marshall 47 yard line.
- The Bobcats capitalized on the interception with redshirt junior quarterback JD Sprague connecting with redshirt junior wide receiver Sebastian Smith for a 37-yard touchdown pass.
- Redshirt junior quarterback JD Sprague played the second quarter, going 6-for-12 with 85 yards and one passing touchdown
- Smith was Ohio's leading receiver in the first, grabbing four balls for 63 yards and a touchdown.
- Sophomore linebacker Quentin Poling recorded Ohio's lone sack of the first half
- Redshirt sophomore linebacker Chad Moore led the Bobcats with 3.5 tackles in the first half.
- As a team, Ohio had 114 passing yards and 148 rushing yards in the first half for a total of 262 yards
- Marshall accumulated 56 yards through the air and 114 on the ground, totaling 170 yards in the opening 30 minutes.
- The Herd opened the second half with a drive to the Ohio 10, but redshirt sophomore linebacker Travis Daugherty stripped Birdsong and junior defensive tackle Casey Sayles recovered the ball at the Ohio 21.
- After three-and-outs by both team, White muffed a punt that was recovered at the Ohio 16.
- Marshall would settle for a 33-yard field goal with 3:44 left in the third quarter.
- Poling stripped Johnson at the Ohio 45 and the fumble was recovered by redshirt senior Nathan Carpenter.
- A 15 play, 85-yard drive that ate 5:53 of the clock and featured a fourth down conversion, was culminated by a 1-yard touchdown run by sophomore running back A.J. Ouellette.
- Carpenter intercepted Birdsong on Marshall's final drive for his second turnover of the game.
- Ouellette would lead the Bobcats with 80 yards on 21 carries.
- Johnson led all rushers with 170 yards on 21 rushes.
- Smith had a game-high 86 yards on six receptions.
- Ohio outgained the Herd by a 363-241 margin.
- Ohio outrushed Marshall 229-157.
- The Bobcats also outgained Marshall through the air 134-84.
- The Bobcats won the turnover battle 4-2.

## GAME 3 - OHIO 35, SE LOUISIANA 14 | SEPT. 19, 2015

### Peden Stadium | Athens, Ohio | 22,985

#### THE SHORT STORY:

On a rain-soaked, lightning-filled afternoon at Peden Stadium, redshirt freshman Papi White had 132 total yards and scored his first two touchdowns as a Bobcat as Ohio defeated Southeastern Louisiana 35-14 on Saturday (September 19).

#### HOW WE GOT HERE:

- Ohio had what appeared to be a 53-yard touchdown pass with redshirt senior quarterback Derrius Vick connecting with redshirt sophomore receiver Brendan Cope, but an illegal formation penalty negated the score.
- On Southeastern Louisiana's first drive, a fumble recovered by redshirt junior defensive end Kurt Laseak gave Ohio the ball at the Lions' 38.
- Vick was intercepted on the following drive, setting up the Lions at their own 15.
- Ohio opened the scoring in with a two-play, 56-yard drive that ended with a three-yard touchdown run by senior running back Daz Patterson at the 6:57 mark of the first quarter.
- After a pair of 30-plus yards to redshirt junior receiver Sebastian Smith and redshirt senior tight end Keith Heitzman, Ohio put another touchdown on the board with a 10-yard run by redshirt freshman Papi White with 9:40 remaining in the second quarter.
- On Ohio's following drive, Vick connected with Smith for his first passing touchdown of the game as Smith hauled in a 31-yard score, giving the Bobcats a 21-0 lead with 2:47 left in the second quarter.
- Vick went 12-for-18 for 192 yards for one touchdown and one interception in the first half.
- In the first half, Heitzman led the Bobcats with three receptions for 76 yards while Smith also added three catches for 72 yards.
- Ohio outgained Southeastern Louisiana by a 202-100 in the first half.
- The Bobcats forced a fumble at their own one yard line to keep Southeastern Louisiana off the scoreboard at the 10:46 mark of the third quarter.
- The Lions would get on the board with a 10-yard touchdown pass by Isom to receiver Jeff Smiley at the 4:15 mark of the third quarter, cutting Ohio's lead to 21-7.
- Southeastern Louisiana hit on a 38-yard touchdown pass as Isom found receiver Dylan Bossier for the touchdown with 11:01 left in the game.
- On the first play of Ohio's next drive, White broke a 58-yard run to bump the Bobcats' lead back to 28-14.
- After a lightning delay, Ohio struck quickly with a 68-yard touchdown pass from Vick to Cope at the 6:21 mark of the fourth quarter.
- Vick recorded a game-high 327 yards on 17-of-26 passing, throwing two touchdowns and one interception.
- White rushed for a game-high 66 yards on four carries with two touchdowns along with two receptions for 50 yards.
- Cope gained a game-high 101 yards receiving with one touchdown.
- Isom led the Lions in both passing yards and rushing yards, totaling 161 yards through the air and 65 on the ground.
- Redshirt junior Blair Brown led all players with 11 tackles.

## GAME 4 - MINNESOTA 27, OHIO 24 | SEPT. 26, 2015

### TCF BANK STADIUM | Minneapolis, Minn. | 53,917

#### THE SHORT STORY:

Ohio scored more points on Minnesota than any team this season while redshirt senior Derrius Vick threw for two touchdowns, but Ohio came up just short of an upset of Big Ten foe Minnesota, falling 27-24 to the Gophers on Saturday (September 26) at TCF Bank Stadium in Minneapolis.

#### HOW WE GOT HERE:

- After a three-and out on the first drive, a pair of 30-plus yard receptions, with the ladder a 39-yard touchdown reception by redshirt freshman running back Papi White to open the scoring. It was his third touchdown of the season and second by way of a reception.
- Minnesota equalized the score on a 40-yard touchdown run by running back Shannon Brooks on the second play of the second quarter.
- After converting on a fourth down earlier in the drive, Vick threw his second touchdown of the day with a 10-yard completion to redshirt junior receiver Sebastian Smith to give Ohio a 14-7 lead at the 7:46 mark of the second quarter.
- The Gophers marched right back down the field to tie the game, with the drive culminated by a 1-yard sneak by Minnesota quarterback Mitch Leidner with 3:20 left in the second quarter.
- Vick went 11-of-15 for 153 yards and two touchdowns in the first half.
- Smith led all receivers with 56 yards on three receptions.
- Redshirt senior safety Devin Jones led the Bobcats with five first-half tackles.
- Ohio outgained Minnesota 153-113 in the opening half.
- The Gophers opened the scoring in the second half with a 49-yard field goal by kicker Ryan Santoso at the 11:25 mark of the third quarter. It was the first deficit Ohio faced all season.
- After a fumble on a punt return forced by redshirt sophomore Cody Grilliot and scooped up by Heitzman.
- Sophomore running back AJ Ouellette then took a handoff and rushed in from 11 yards out to give Ohio a 21-17 lead with 14:39 left in the fourth quarter.
- Senior running back Daz Patterson returned the ensuing kickoff 56 yards to give Ohio the ball at Minnesota's 43 with 30 seconds left in the game.
- A Hail-Mary attempt by Vick as time expired was deflected by Minnesota defenders.

#### THE SHORT STORY:

Ohio (4-1, 1-0 MAC) held the Zips (2-3, 0-1 MAC) out of the endzone for four quarters as the Bobcats opened Mid-American Conference play with a 14-12 victory at InfoCision Stadium in Akron on Saturday (October 3).

#### THE SHORT STORY:

In front of a packed crowd on a picturesque Saturday afternoon on homecoming weekend, Ohio (5-1, 2-0 MAC) forced four turnovers and held Miami (1-5, 0-2 MAC) out of the endzone in a 27-3 victory on Saturday (Oct. 10) at Peden Stadium.

#### HOW WE GOT HERE:

- Ohio opened the scoring with a 2-yard touchdown run by senior running back Daz Patterson at the 10:14 mark of the first quarter. It marked the second straight week and fourth time this season Ohio has scored on their opening drive.
- The Bobcats limited the RedHawks to 35 yards in the first quarter.
- Ohio added to its lead when redshirt senior quarterback Derrius Vick completed a six-yard slant over the middle for a touchdown with 9:43 left in the second quarter.
- Miami found its way onto the scoreboard with a 34-yard field goal by kicker Caleb Patterson at the 6:30 mark of the second quarter.
- Ohio closed the half with a 50-yard field goal by redshirt senior kicker Josiah Yazdani to give the Bobcats a 17-3 advantage at the half.
- The Bobcats outgained Miami 267-106 in the first half.
- Vick was 17-of-26 for 206 yards and one touchdown in the opening half.
- Sebastian Smith led all receivers in the first half with 77 yards on 7 receptions.
- On the second play of the third quarter, redshirt sophomore linebacker Quentin Poling intercepted a pass and brought it back 25 yards for a touchdown.
- After gaining possession on an interception by redshirt senior linebacker Jovon Johnson, Yazdani booted through his second field goal of the day, this time from 41 yards out as the Bobcats led 27-3 with 10:33 left in the third quarter.
- Ohio recorded four interceptions on the afternoon.
- The Bobcats added another score with 1:33 left in the game as redshirt freshman Maleek Irons punched the ball in from one yard out.
- For the game, Ohio outgained Miami 428-253.
- Ohio outrushed Miami 150-87.
- Vick finished the game going 21-for-33 for 243 yards with one touchdown and one interception.
- Smith grabbed nine receptions for 91 yards to lead all receivers.

#### THE SHORT STORY:

Ohio (5-2, 2-1 MAC) couldn't contain a potent Western Michigan (3-3, 2-0 MAC) offense as the Broncos defeated the Bobcats 49-14 on Saturday (Oct. 17) at Peden Stadium.

#### HOW WE GOT HERE:

- Neither team crossed midfield until a run by senior Daz Patterson with 7:13 left in the first half.
- Western Michigan opened the scoring with a seven-yard connection between quarterback Zach Terrell and wide receiver Daniel Braverman, giving the Broncos a 7-0 lead at the 3:33 mark of the second quarter.
- The Broncos added to their lead as Terrell found Braverman for the second time in as many drives on a 27-yard touchdown pass to give Western Michigan a 14-0 advantage with 1:31 remaining in the first quarter.
- Ohio answered the following possession, driving 73 yards on eight plays to make the score 14-7 with 17 seconds left in the half. The score came by way of a 35-yard touchdown pass by senior quarterback Derrius Vick to redshirt junior wide receiver Sebastian Smith.
- The Bobcats outgained Western Michigan 157-126 in the first half.
- Vick was 16-for-26 for 132 yards and one touchdown in the first half.
- Redshirt junior linebacker Blair Brown and redshirt senior linebacker Jovon Johnson led the Bobcats with five tackles each in the opening half.
- Western Michigan increased their lead to 35-7 by the end of the third quarter, with touchdown runs by running backs Jarvion Franklin and Jamauri Bogan along with a 4-yard scamper by Terrell.
- The Broncos added another score on a 25-yard connection between Terrell and wide receiver Corey Davis to give Western Michigan a 42-7 advantage with 12:23 left in the game.
- Patterson ran in a touchdown from 2-yards out to make the score 42-14 at the 8:28 mark of the fourth quarter.
- Western Michigan running back LaVante Bellamy scored on a 56-yard touchdown rush for the game's final score with 4:33 remaining in the contest.
- Bellamy led all players for the game with 149 yards on nine carries with one touchdown.
- Redshirt junior wide receiver Jordan Reid accrued a game-high 109 yards on seven receptions.
- Ohio was outgained 567-354.

#### BIG PLAYS:

- On third and six from the Western Michigan 43, Vick escaped pressure and found A.J. Ouellette on a check down and he scampered eight yards for a first down to preserve the final drive of the half.
- The following play, Vick, who was hit as he threw, found Smith, who was interfered with in the endzone, from 35 yards to cut the Bronco lead to 14-7 right before halftime.
- Redshirt junior quarterback Greg Windham hit Smith for a 24-yard gain and picked up a pair of 11-yard runs on a drive that was culminated on a two-yard touchdown run by Patterson.

**THE SHORT STORY:** Despite outgaining the Buffalo (3-4, 1-2 MAC), Ohio (5-3, 2-2 MAC) couldn't overcome four turnovers as the Bobcats fell to the Bulls by a 41-17 margin Saturday (Oct. 24) at UB Stadium.

#### HOW WE GOT HERE:

- Ohio opened the game with a brisk 75-yard drive that culminated on a 6-yard run by senior running back Daz Patterson. Redshirt senior quarterback Derrius Vick was 5-for-5 for 67 yards on the opening possession.
- Buffalo tied the contest on Ohio's next drive, as free safety Ryan Williamson intercepted a tipped pass and ran it 15 yards into the Ohio endzone.
- The Bulls took a 14-7 lead on a four-yard run by running back Jordan Johnson with 2:20 remaining in the first quarter.
- Redshirt senior kicker Josiah Yazdani kicked a 24-yard field goal to bring the Bobcats within four points with 12:44 left in the second quarter.

- Redshirt sophomore wide receiver Brendan Cope hauled in three catches on a drive that produced a 24-yard field goal by Yazdani.
- Redshirt senior cornerback Ian Wells blocked a 31-yard field goal attempt by Mitcheson in the third quarter.
- On the drive that ended with the one-yard touchdown run by Irons, Vick completed a 19-yard pass to Smith, a 28-yard pass to Reid and a 20-yard pass to redshirt senior tight end Keith Heitzman.
