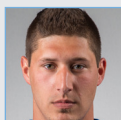

**STORYLINES**

- The Bulls are 6-10 all-time in Mid-American Conference openers, but have won five of the last eight.
- The Bulls have won seven of their last eight games against MAC opponents at UB Stadium.
- Bowling Green has won the last four meetings against the Bulls.
- UB's defense is allowing an average of 217 yards of total offense in the first half, compared to just 150 yards of total offense in the second half.
- Boise Ross leads the nation in passes defended with 12. He has two interceptions and 10 pass breakups. Ross already ranks 10th in school history for passes defended in a single season and is only four shy of the single-season school record.
- After having just two tackles in the opener against Albany, Brandon Berry has had 30 tackles over the last three games.
- Joe Licata's next touchdown pass will tie him with Ohio's Tyler Tettleton for 15th in MAC history.
- Since entering the starting lineup at the start of the 2014 season, Ron Willoughby has recorded a catch in 15 straight games.
- Anthonie Taylor's next 100-yard game will tie him with James Starks for third in school history in career 100-yard rushing games (12).
- Matt Weiser is coming off a game in which he had 10 receptions for 131 yards and a touchdown - the most catches and receiving yards ever by a UB tight end.
- UB Associate Head Coach Rob Ianello and Bowling Green head coach Dino Babers were on the same Arizona staff from 1995-2000.
- Joe Licata is 169 yards shy of passing Cliff Scott (1991-94) for second in school history in career passing yards.

Bulls Host Bowling Green for Homecoming

Saturday is homecoming and The University at Buffalo, The State University of New York football team will host Bowling Green at UB Stadium.

The Bulls are coming off a 24-21 loss to Nevada last Saturday. Joe Licata threw for 338 yards and two touchdowns. Matt Weiser and Rob Willoughby each had 10 catches in the game.

Bowling Green is coming off a 35-28 win at Purdue last Saturday. The Falcons are led by quarterback Matt Johnson who leads the nation in passing - averaging 440 yards per game.

Bowling Green leads the all-time series, 9-3. The Falcons won the last meeting, 36-35, at Doyt Perry Stadium last season.

None the Weiser

Matt Weiser had the best game by a tight end in school history against Nevada last Saturday. The senior tight end had a career-high 10 catches for 131 yards, including a 41-yard touchdown against the Wolf Pack. It was the most receptions and receiving yards by a tight end in school history. Chad Upshaw held the previous mark of eight receptions for 116 yards against Ohio in 2005.

Weiser ranks second on the team with 17 catches for 176 yards and a touchdown on the season. He already has two more receptions than all of last season.

Popular Targets

For the first time in school history, the Bulls had two different players record 10 catches in a game. Senior tight end Matt Weiser had 10 catches for 131 yards - both career highs. Senior wide receiver Ron Willoughby had 10 receptions for 122 yards against Nevada last Saturday.

Linebackers Lead the Defensive Attack

The Bulls defense has been led by a trio of linebackers this season. Okezie Alozie, Nick Gilbo and Brandon Berry are UB's top tacklers on the year and all three have been very consistent. Alozie has a team-high 33 tackles, Gilbo has 32 and Berry has 31. All three players set career highs against Nevada as Berry had 13, and Alozie and Gilbo had 12 apiece. Berry has been especially strong lately. After having just two tackles in the opener against Albany, the junior Detroit native has had 30 tackles over the last three games.

Like a Ross

Boise Ross started the 2014 campaign at wide receiver. He has since made the move to cornerback and it has paid dividends. In his first full season at corner, Ross has two interceptions and 10 pass breakups. He had a 39-yard pick six against Florida Atlantic on

September 19. The junior from Bethlehem, PA currently leads the nation in passes defended with 12.

Through only four games, he already ranks 10th in school history in single-season passes defended and is only four shy of the single-season record of 16 held by Dave Short (1990) and Najja Johnson (2011).

Not Your Average Joe

Senior quarterback Joe Licata has picked up where he left off to start the season. He has thrown four touchdown passes on the season. He is completing 65 percent of his passes, including a career-high 77 percent completion percentage in the opener against Albany.

Licata enters his final season as the Bulls' signal caller. The local product already holds the school record for career touchdown passes with 66. He also ranks third in career passing yardage with 7,410. He is 1,338 yards shy of the school record of 8,748 yards held by Drew Willy (2005-08).

Licata has entered the top 20 in MAC history in career touchdown passes.

Coach Leipold has given his young players a chance to play this season. Against Nevada last week, seven true freshmen and eight redshirt-freshmen played in the game. Freshman Brandon Stanback started at safety, Cameron Lewis (CB), Charles Harris (DE), Justin Brandon (DT), Duke Hwang (DT), Brandon Smiley (WR) and Johnathan Hawkins (RB) also saw action in the game.

Historic Day for Defense

The UB defense had an historic day at Florida Atlantic on Sept. 19. For the first time ever, the defense scored three touchdowns. With the Bulls trailing 9-0 late in the first half, linebacker Travis Pitzonka scooped up a fumble and dashed 60 yards for a touchdown to cut the lead to 9-7 and changed the complexion of the game. Boise Ross added a 39-yard

pick six and **Brandon Crawford** scored an 11-yard touchdown on a fumble recovery. **Nick Gilbo** added a safety in the game. The Bulls forced five turnovers in the game (3 FF, 2 INTs).

It was the second time in school history a UB team returned two different fumbles for touchdowns. The first was against Ball State in the 2008 MAC Championship game. Since 1992, UB is the only team in the nation to have returned two fumbles for touchdowns in the same game on two different occasions.

Capitalizing in the Red Zone

The Bulls have made 13 trips into the redzone so far this season and have scored 12 times (92%). UB has scored 10 touchdowns and two field goals.

New Targets for Licata

A season ago, UB's tight ends caught a total of 25 passes. So far this season, tight ends Matt Weiser and Mason Schreck have combined for 24 receptions.

In the opener against Albany, Schreck had a career-high five catches for 62 yards. Weiser had his breakout game against Nevada last week with 10 catches for 131 yards - both career highs.

I'll Take That

The UB defense had two interceptions and nearly a third against Albany in the opener. **Nick Gilbo** had the first interception, late in the first half. **Boise Ross** had an interception early in the third quarter that the Bulls were able to turn into a touchdown just three plays later.

Against Florida Atlantic, Ross added another inter-

ception as did sophomore safety **Ryan Williamson**.

The team's four interceptions are twice as many as the Bulls had all of last season.

Martinez Ends Punt Return Drought

Jacob Martinez did something against Albany a UB punt return hadn't done since George W. Bush's first term, return a punt for a touchdown. Martinez returned a punt 86 yards to paydirt - the first punt returned for a touchdown since Andre Forde had an 83-yard punt return touchdown against Lehigh on Aug. 29, 2002. It was a span of 154 games and ended the longest drought in the FBS. Martinez was seven years old when Forde returned the last punt for a TD.

For his accomplishment, Martinez was named the Mid-American Conference East Division Special Teams Player of the Week.

Taylor Made

Anthone Taylor is coming off a season in which he rushed for 1,403 yards. It was the second-best single season effort in school history and he became just the third running back in UB's FBS era (since 1999) to go over 1,000 yards in a season. He joined Branden Oliver (now with the San Diego Chargers) and James Starks (now with the Green Bay Packers) as the other UB running backs to accomplish the feat. Against Penn State, Taylor eclipsed the 2,000-yard plateau for his career. He joined Oliver (4,049) and Starks (3,140) as just the third UB running back in the FBS era to rush for 2,000 yards in a career.

Last season, Taylor became the first running back in school history to post three 200-yard rushing games

in a single season as he rushed for 222 yards against Miami (OH), 219 yards against Bowling Green and 237 yards against UMass.

This season, he ranks third in the MAC in rushing, averaging 95.2 yards per game.

Willoughbeast

Ron Willoughby is coming off a breakout season for the Bulls. After registering only three catches as a sophomore in 2013, the senior wide receiver had 50 catches for 771 yards and nine touchdowns last season. For his efforts, the Ohio native earned third-team All-MAC accolades in 2014.

This season, Willoughby leads the team in receiving with 22 catches for 269 yards and a touchdown. He had eight catches for 80 yards and a score at Penn State and a career-best 10 catches for 122 yards against Nevada last week.

Tyler Grassman Named a Semifinalist for the 2015 Campbell Trophy

Senior punter **Tyler Grassman** has been named a semifinalist for the 2015 William V. Campbell Trophy. Considered by many to be the "Academic Heisman," the Campbell Trophy recognizes an individual as the absolute best football scholar-athlete in the nation.

A business administration major with a 3.80 grade point average, Grassman is a two-time Academic All-MAC selection and was a 2014 Capital One Academic All-District Football Team selection.

Bulls Get a Pair of Blazers That Fit

The UB football team gained a pair of new players from the University of Alabama Birmingham after the Blazers dropped the program following the 2014 season. Sophomore **Collin Lisa** is a wide receiver who played in two games as a true freshman at UAB. Redshirt-freshman **Jordan Collier** is a safety who redshirted as a freshman last season for the Blazers.

Center of Attention

Over the last three seasons, former Bull Trevor Sales started every game at center for the Bulls. He was the only center **Joe Licata** ever worked with. However, this season the Bulls will have a new player snapping the ball. Redshirt-freshman **James O'Hagan** is the starting center for the Bulls.

Max Returns

Junior **Max Perisse** has emerged as one of the top players on UB's defensive front and is a projected starter for the upcoming season. However, it is not only his progress on the field that is making headlines, but his selfless acts off the field as well.

While working out at the Sports Performance Park at the Eastern Hills Mall, he found an unmarked envelope with \$2,500 in the parking lot. The envelope belonged to WBBZ host John Di Scullo.

Instead of keeping the money, Perisse looked for the rightful owner, and with help from his trainer, was able to return the envelope.

Bowling Green scored the go-ahead touchdown with 2:19 left in the game to hand the University at Buffalo football team a heartbreaking, 36-35, loss at Doyt Perry Stadium on Saturday.

Junior running back Anthon Taylor had another huge game, finishing with 219 yards rushing and three touchdowns. He became the first player in school history with consecutive 200-yard rushing performances. Taylor ran for 222 yards and three touchdowns against Miami (OH) last week.

The Bulls (3-3, 1-1 MAC) got off to a great start as they took the opening kickoff 75 yards on 15 plays, capped by a quarterback sneak by Joe Licata. The drive took over nine minutes off the clock. Bowling Green (4-2, 2-0 MAC) answered with a 75-yard drive of its own to tie the game at 7. A Bowling Green field goal gave the Falcons a 10-7 lead with 13:56 left in the second quarter.

The Bulls took the lead when Licata found Willoughby for a 16-yard touchdown, capping a five-play, 70-yard drive and giving the Bulls a 14-10 lead. The Falcons answered on their next possession with a 1-yard touchdown to retake the lead, 17-14, with 8:52 left in the half.

Taylor scored on an eight-yard touchdown run to put the Bulls back ahead on their next drive. UB capitalized on a Brandon Crawford sack and forced fumble when Taylor hit paydirt again, this time from one-yard out, to give the Bulls a 28-17 lead late in the half. Bowling Green capped the first-half scoring with a field goal to cut the UB lead to 28-20 at the half.

The Falcons scored on their first possession of the season half to cut the lead to 28-27 and then added a field goal on their next possession to take a 30-28 lead with 8:07 left in the third quarter.

Dalton Barksdale blocked a Bowling Green field goal attempt and the Bulls capitalized by driving 69 yards and taking a 35-30 lead on a Taylor 12-yard touchdown run.

After the UB defense stepped up and forced a Bowling Green punt, the Bulls marched down the field in hopes of the sealing the victory. UB was able to drive the ball down to the Bowling Green 16-yard line with a little over three minutes left. However Patrick Clarke's 33-yard field goal was pulled wide right, giving life to the Falcons.

It took Bowling Green just four plays to go 80 yards and score the go-ahead touchdown on a four-yard touchdown run.

Devin Campbell was able to return the ensuing kickoff to the Bowling Green 48-yard line with 2:11 on the clock. However, the Bulls went four-and-out and lost by one point.

"There are no words to describe how we are feeling in

that locker room right now," head coach Jeff Quinn said after the loss. "The positives were that we ran the ball well. In that first drive of the game, we set the tone. In the second half, we weren't able to get the ball moving as effectively from an offensive standpoint. There are always going to be a few things - blocks, a few miscues here and there, maybe a few missed tackles, No excuses. We had a chance and we weren't able to complete the mission."

Licata finished the game 16-of-24 for 134 yards and a touchdown in blustery, cool conditions. Willoughby had four catches for 34 yards and Marcus McGill had three grabs for 41 yards to lead the receivers.

Lee Skinner had a season-high 11 tackles to lead the UB defense. Adam Redden and Whitney Sherry each added eight stops. Boise Ross posted the Bulls' first interception of the season to go along with five tackles. The UB defense forced three turnovers on the afternoon.

HEAD COACH LANCE LEIPOLD

Lance Leipold was named the 25th head coach in the history of the State University of New York, Buffalo football program on December 1, 2014.

Leipold comes to UB from Wisconsin-Whitewater where he compiled an astounding 109-6 record and won six Division III National Championships over his eight seasons. A six-time National Coach of the Year, Leipold

reached 100 career victories faster than any other coach in NCAA history – at any level.

“We’re excited to have Coach Leipold here in UB Blue,” White stated. “In our conversations it became obvious to me that this is a man of character. This is someone that is going to continue the tradition that we already have of recruiting high-character kids, student-first student-athletes. In short, he does it the right way.”

Leipold has gathered multiple honors from as many as five football-related organizations. He earned his sixth American Football Coaches Association Division III Coach of the Year award in 2014. He has won the award more times than any active coach at any level. He passed the late Joe Paterno, who was a five-time recipient of the award.

In his first season as head coach at Whitewater, The Warhawks went 14-1 and won the national title. He led the Warhawks back to the national championship game in 2008, but they lost to Mount Union, 31-26. Wisconsin-Whitewater went 15-0, winning the national championship in 2009, 2010 and 2011 and won 46 straight games over that span. Following a 7-3 season in 2012, UWW went a perfect 15-0 and won the national championship in 2013 and followed with another perfect 15-0 season and a national title in 2014.

“I’d like to thank Dr. Tripathi and Danny White for this outstanding opportunity to be the 25th head football coach at New York’s university,” said Leipold. “This is an unbelievable opportunity. It’s ready to take off. It’s going to take work, it’s going to take commitment, and that’s what makes athletics, especially football, so competing. It’s the ultimate team game and I’m glad to be apart of this team.”

In Division III, where athletic scholarships aren’t a part of the game, Leipold was able to recruit top-notch talent to the campus in southeastern Wisconsin. During his tenure, running back Justin Beaver earned the Gagliardi Trophy as the top player in Division III. Brent Allen earned the Division III Rimington Award as the top center. Jeff Schebler was the first recipient of the Fred Mitchell Award, given to the top placekicker in Division II or III. Tailback Levell Coppage earned D3football.com Offensive Player of the Year accolades, and Cole Klotz was selected D3football.com Defensive Player of the Year. Defensive back Jared Kiesow was named an NCAA Elite 88 Award winner. The Warhawks have piled up 56 All-America honors under Leipold’s tutelage.

A native of Jefferson, WI, Leipold began his coaching career at Wisconsin-Whitewater in 1987 as a quarterbacks coach and then wide receivers coach. He moved to the University of Wisconsin from 1991-93 as a graduate assistant and helped the Badgers to a Big Ten title and a Rose Bowl appearance in 1993.

As an assistant coach at Division II Nebraska-Omaha from 1994-2000,

Leipold helped turn the Mavericks from a 1-10 team in 1994 into three-time North Central Conference champions during his tenure. After being promoted to offensive coordinator in 2000, he moved on to the University of Nebraska, where he served for three seasons under current Ohio head coach Frank Solich. He was on the same staff as former UB head coach Turner Gill. The Cornhuskers competed in the national championship game in 2001 and earned bowl bids in 2002 and 2003.

He returned to Nebraska-Omaha to serve as associate head coach and offensive coordinator from 2004-06. The Mavericks finished 8-3 and won the conference championship each of his three seasons.

Leipold is a 1987 graduate of Wisconsin-Whitewater where he was a stand-out quarterback for the Warhawks. He ranks second in school history in career pass attempts (647), fourth in yards (4,277), sixth in completions (303) and tied for 10th with 27 touchdowns. He was inducted into the Whitewater Hall of Fame in 2003.

“This morning I had the chance to meet with the team. What an impressive group of young men,” said Leipold. “To see the looks on their faces, I know they’re hungry and ready to get to work, and I’m equally as excited.”

Leipold and his wife, Kelly, have a daughter, Lindsey, and a son, Landon.

UNIVERSITY PARK, PA - As Christian Hackenberg walked off the field Saturday, his blue jersey and white pants were nearly as clean as when he walked out of the tunnel four hours earlier.

It was a welcome sight for the Penn State junior quarterback's teammates, coaches and Penn State fans who watched as Hackenberg was sacked 10 times the week before. But a reshuffled offensive line with kept Buffalo pass rushers off Hackenberg and Penn State's offense slowly built momentum to outlast Buffalo 27-14.

True freshmen Brandon Polk and Saquon Barkley each ran for touchdowns for Penn State (1-1). Hackenberg completed 14 of 27 passes for 128 yards and a touchdown and Joey Julius kicked a pair of field goals in the 27-14 win.

Buffalo quarterback Joe Licata tossed touchdown passes to Ron Willoughby and Marcus McGill.

But the Bulls struggled to move the ball into the red zone for most of the afternoon. Buffalo (1-1) punted nine times, turned the ball over on downs once and Licata was intercepted by defensive end Carl Nassib in the second quarter.

Nassib led Penn State's defense with three sacks while tackle Austin Johnson led the Nittany Lions with nine tackles.

After the teams traded futile opening possessions, Bulls kicker Adam Mitcheson missed a 47-yard field goal that would've given the Bulls a first-quarter lead.

Penn State took a lead it would never relinquish and got help from its special teams to do so.

Redshirt freshman DeAndre Thompkins returned a second-quarter punt 58 yards to set Penn State's offense up in the red zone. Two plays later, Polk took a sweep around the left side of Buffalo's defense untouched for a 22-yard score.

Joey Julius added a 22-yard field goal in the second quarter and the Nittany Lions led 10-0 at halftime. The Bulls used their second possession of the second half to go 78 yards with 11 plays. The drive ended when Licata hit Willoughby in the corner of the end zone and the Bulls' receiver fought off tight coverage from Christian Campbell to secure the catch.

Penn State responded with a 12-play scoring drive but had to settle for a 21-yard field goal from Julius after sophomore tight end Mike Gesicki dropped two would-be touchdown passes -- one at the goal line. Julius' kick gave Penn State a 13-7 lead.

It was the first of three consecutive scoring drives for the Nittany Lions. Barkley ripped off a 33-yard run then hurdled a Buffalo defender en route to a 17-yard gain to set up Hackenberg's 5-yard touchdown pass to DaeSean Hamilton that gave Penn State a 20-7 lead. Hackenberg hit Chris Godwin for a 38-yard gain down the sideline before Barkley plunged in from nine yards out to cap Penn State's scoring.

Penn State's reshuffled offensive line -- Andrew Nelson moved to left tackle, Brendan Mahon moved to right tackle from left guard and Derek Dowrey started at left guard -- gave Hackenberg time to take the deep shot. Hackenberg had no such time in the season opener wherein Penn State threw deep just once.

But Penn State lost Nelson to an unspecified injury in the first half. Nelson was helped off the field and did not return. Palmer took his spot in the lineup.

Licata hit McGill from 10 yards out with less than five minutes to play.
