2016 BGSU FOOTBALL

SETTING THE SCENE

* Bowling Green, the defending Mid-American Conference champions, squares off with the Miami RedHawks at 12:00 p.m. Saturday at Doyt Perry Stadium in Bowling Green, Ohio. The Falcons will face their rivals to the south for the first time since 2013.

* This will be BGSU's 71st game against the RedHawks. Miami leads the all-time series, 42-23-5. However, the Falcons have won four of the last five meetings.

* The Falcons have won those four games by an average score of 39-13, including a 37-12 victory in the last meeting in Bowling Green on Oct. 13, 2012.

* The Falcons are 1-6 this season and 0-3 in MAC play, but those three losses have been by one possession each and a combined 16 points. BGSU dropped a 28-25 decision to Eastern Michigan in the MAC opener, then fell by just six points (30-24) at Ohio. Last weekend, Toledo scored with 18 seconds left to earn a 42-35 win over BGSU.

* The RedHawks are also 1-6 but are 1-2 in the MAC, following their 18-14 victory over Kent State last weekend. In their first two MAC games, Miami lost 17-7 against Ohio in Oxford and 35-13 at Akron.

* Miami (334.7 yards/game) leads the MAC in total defense and is second (177.0 yards/game) in passing defense.

* BGSU has won 27 of their last 38 games against MAC opponents, including two of the last three MAC championships.

THE 2,000 YARD MAN

* Bowling Green senior running back Fred Coppet has quietly positioned himself to become one of the Falcons' most prolific career rushers. * Coppet rushed 17 times for 104 yards at Toledo. It was his third 100-yard rushing perfor-

mance this season and seventh of his career. He now has 555 yards this season and is on pace for 1,110, which would shatter his single-season high for rushing yards (825). Coppet has already set new highs for rushing yards (141) and touchdowns (2) in a game.

* Coppet has 2,358 career rushing yards and passed LeRoy Smith and Bryant Jones into seventh place on BGSU's all-time rushing yards list. He needs 115 to tie Josh Harris for sixth and 206 to tie Fred Durig for fifth.

* Coppet's second quarter rushing touchdown against Ohio was his third this season, all in the last three games, and the 14th of his career.

DAVIDSON AN ALL-AMERICAN?

* Punter Joseph Davidson ranks fourth nationally in yards per punt (47.5) and third in net punting average (44.7).

* Davidson booted a career-best 82-yarder at Toledo, which is tied for the longest punt in the NCAA this year. His 59.7 yard per punt average against Ohio is the best in the country for a single game this year.

* In fact, Davidson has posted six 60+-yard punts in the past four weeks. He has at least one in six of seven games in 2016 and each of the last five.

* Davidson's 82-yard punt at Toledo is now his career-long and is the second-longest punt in BGSU history.

* Davidson has boomed 15 of his 42 punts in 2016 for 50 or more yards, and 16 of them have pinned opponents inside their own 20. The latter includes four of seven punts against Toledo.

* Davidson holds two single-season school records and a single-game school record, while also sitting in first all-time in career punting average.

* Davidson set school records by punting 82 times in 2014 for 3,497 yards. His 46.0 yards per punt average in 2015 is second-best in school history, and his 42.6 yards in 2014 is seventh.

* In a 2014 game against Ball State, Davidson averaged a school-record 60.5 yards per punt, including a career-best 78-yarder.

* In 2016, Davidson is getting even better. He has 42 punts for 1,993 yards and a 47.5 average. That average ranks fourth nationally and leads the MAC. His career mark is now 44.8, the highest in school history, and his 7,973 career punting yards have passed Greg Johnson and

Cris Shale for fourth on BGSU's all-time list. He needs 93 yards to tie Andy Pollock for third.

* Against Ohio, Davidson had one of the best games of his career. He averaged 59.7 yards on three punts, including a career-long 79 yarder that is tied for fourth-longest in BGSU history. Another went 55 yards, and two of his punts were downed inside Ohio's 20.

DAVIDSON ALSO AN ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICAN

* Joseph Davidson is one of the top punters in the country, but he has also been recognized as one of the brightest minds in college football.

* Davidson was named to the 2015 Academic All-America Division I football team as selected by the College Sports Information Director of America (CoSIDA).

* Of the 52 players named to the Academic All-America team, he was one of just seven to hold a grade point average of 3.95 or higher. He is a mathematics major.

2016 BGSU FOOTBALL

MAC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

* Punter Joseph Davidson was named the MAC East Division Special Teams Player of the Week Oct. 17 -- his second straight week earning the award.

* Davidson had an 82-yard punt, the longest in the NCAA this year, and ran 24 yards for a first down on a fake punt in the fourth quarter that sparked the team's comeback.

* Redshirt freshman quarterback James Morgan was named the MAC East Division Offensive Player of the Week Oct. 17.

* Morgan was 25-of-38 for 335 yards and five touchdown passes against Toledo. All of those numbers were career-highs and he became the first freshman in BGSU history to throw for 250+ yards in three straight games.

* Davidson booted a career-best 79-yarder at Ohio to earn MAC East Special Teams Player of the Week honors Oct. 10. His 59.7 yard per punt average in that game is the best in the country for a single game this year.

FALCON FASTER

* Bowling Green is living up to its "Falcon Faster" mantra in 2016. The Falcons are 16th nationally, and second in the Mid-American Conference, with 79.3 plays per game.

FOURTH DOWN? GO FOR IT!

* There's no doubt that head coach Mike Jinks is aggressive. In just seven games, BGSU has left the offense on the field on fourth down 30 times. That number leads the FBS. In fact, it's 50 percent more than any other team. Tulane ranks second in fourth-down attempts with only 20.

* So far in 2016, Jinks has chosen to go for it on fourth down 38.5 percent of the time (30 of 78).

* The Falcons are successful far more often than not on fourth down. Their 19 conversions (.633) lead the country; Houston is second in that category with 13.

PINNING THEM DEEP

* BGSU's kickoff coverage unit has become one of the nation's best in 2016.

* The team has allowed just 331 yards on 19 kickoff returns for an average of 17.42. That number ranks 19th in FBS and second in the MAC.

* By comparison, Bowling Green allowed 21.18

yards per kick return in 2015 to rank eighth in the MAC.

MORGAN NOT PLAYING LIKE A FROSH

* Redshirt freshman James Morgan took over as the starting quarterback in week five. In week seven against arch-rival Toledo, Morgan had his coming-out party.

* Morgan threw for 335 yards and five touchdowns against the Rockets, including 166 yards and three scores in the fourth quarter. Those are the most passing yards for a BGSU quarterback since Matt Johnson against Ohio in Nov. 2015 and the most passing TDs since Johnson at Kent State in Oct. 2015.

* Morgan's yards, touchdowns and completions (25) against Toledo were single-game career highs.

* Morgan now has 1,041 yards and eight touchdown throws in 2016. He has already equaled Matt Schilz's freshman touchdown total in 2010 and is nearly halfway to Schilz's yardage total from that season despite only three starts. Schilz started ten games in 2010.

* While that 2010 team led by a redshirt freshman quarterback won just two games, it set the foundation for a three-victory improvement in each of the next two seasons under Schilz.

* Even though he has started fewer than half of BGSU's seven games, Morgan is already fifth in the MAC in touchdown passes and ninth in passing yards.

* Including efforts of 250 and 253 yards, Morgan has thrown for 250+ in each of the last three games. He is the first freshman quarterback in BGSU history with three straight 250+ yard games.

ELEMENTARY MY DEAR WATSON

* Will Watson returned to the field against Toledo, making his first appearance since the 2014 Raycom Media Camellia Bowl.

* Watson served on defense as well as on the team's punt and kick return units.

* Watson had five tackles and five kickoff returns for 101 yards, including a long of 31.

* His 101 all-purpose yards already ranks ninth on the team in just one game.

THE RUNNING GAME IMPACT

* New Bowling Green head coach Mike Jinks' previous job was running backs coach for Texas Tech. His tutelage created a monster in the Texas Tech backfield.

* After scoring just eight rushing touchdowns as a team in 2014, the Red Raiders scored 34 in 2015 -- an improvement of 26, more than any other FBS school.

* That led to a 14.6 points-per-game improvement for Texas Tech, as they improved from 52nd to second nationally in that category.

* BGSU graduated Travis Greene, its all-time

rushing leader, after the 2015 season. Since the end of the season, Matt Domer and Charles Lamar -- both of whom were expected to contribute in the running game -- went down to season-ending injuries.

* Despite all those losses, the Falcons could average 150 yards per game on the ground for the fifth straight year. They are currently at 148.4 per contest.

* BGSU has averaged 176.4 yards per rushing in the past five games. Fred Coppet leads the team with 555 yards on the ground, while Josh Cleveland averages a robust 6.1 yards per carry.

MILLER TIME

* Wide receiver Scott Miller continues to excel as BGSU's most prolific receiver.

* At Toledo, Miller had his third huge receiving game of the season. He posted eight catches for 149 yards and three touchdowns. The catch and yardage totals are his second highest in a game this season, and the three touchdowns tie the mark he set against North Dakota.

* Miller is now 13th nationally with seven receiving touchdowns. He is one of only four players with multiple games of three touchdown catches.

* Miller hauled in six passes for 56 yards on Oct. 8 against Ohio. The last catch was a spectacular 37-yard touchdown off a ricochet on a

4th-and-27 play, which brought BGSU within six points.

* On Oct. 3 against Eastern Michigan, Miller set a new career high with 11 receptions. His 148 receiving yards were the second-highest of his career, falling just 13 short of his total against North Dakota.

* In that Sept. 10 contest against UND, Miller earned five catches for 161 yards and his first three career touchdowns. He totaled 235 all-purpose yards in that game, the most by a Falcon since Roger Lewis had 261 in 2015 against Memphis. His 71-yard touchdown catch against the Fighting Hawks remains BGSU's longest play in 2016.

* Miller's season receiving totals are now 47 catches for 620 yards and seven touchdowns. His 6.7 receptions per game are second in the MAC and 17th in FBS, while his receiving yards are fourth in the MAC and 19th in FBS.

* Miller's 149 all-purpose yards at Toledo give him 921 in 2016. He averages 131.6 per game and ranks second in the MAC and 30th nationally in that area.

BOWLING GREENE

* Redshirt senior linebacker Trenton Greene set a career high with 16 tackles at Ohio State. He added nine more against North Dakota and 11 versus MTSU. Most recently, Greene had 10 against EMU and six at both Ohio and Toledo.

2016 BGSU FOOTBALL

* Greene currently averages 9.4 tackles per game and ranks 30th nationally in that category and fourth in the MAC. With 32 solo tackles, Greene is tied for tenth in the MAC.

* In the first quarter against EMU, Greene made a spectacular diving interception. It was the first pick of his career, and the short field he provided allowed BGSU to drive for the first touchdown of the game.

THE MORE THINGS CHANGE...

* While Bowling Green plays the 2016 season with its third head coach in four years, the Falcons have new offensive and defensive coordinators for the fourth consecutive season.

* BGSU is the only school in the country that has had new offensive and defensive coordinators in each of the past four years.

* Including co-coordinators, BGSU has had seven offensive coordinators in the past four years.

MAC CHAMPS AGAIN

* BGSU won its 12th Mid-American Conference Championship in 2015, defeating Northern Illinois 34-14 at Ford Field.

* It was the fourth time that Bowling Green played in the MAC Championship and third consecutive year. BGSU is 2-2 all-time in MAC title games.

* BGSU has played four games at Ford Field in the past three years, three times in the MAC Championship Game and once in the 2013 Little Caesar's Pizza Bowl.

FIRST TIME STARTERS

* Half of Bowling Green's 22 starters at Ohio State earned the distinction for the first time in their careers. The five first-time starters on offense include running backs Josh Cleveland and Donovan Wilson, wide receivers Scott Miller and Deric Phouthavong and offensive lineman J.J. Beggan. On defense, six players started for the first time, including defensive linemen Shannon Smith and David Konowalski, linebacker Brandon Harris, and defensive backs Antonio Sotolongo, Marcus Milton and Jamari Bozeman.

* Redshirt freshman Janarvis Pough became the 12th first-time starter of the season for BGSU when he earned a start against North Dakota.

* Four more players made their first starts against MTSU. Hunter Folkertsma started at wide receiver, while Nilijah Ballew started at linebacker, Cameron Jeffries at cornerback, and Tavaurus Wade at safety.

* In the game at Memphis, true freshman Lorenzo Taborn started at left guard.

* Three more players earned their first career start against Eastern Michigan. On defense, Robert Jackson and Jerry McBride earned their first starts, while James Morgan had his first start at quarterback.

* At Ohio, BGSU began the game in a five-wide-out set, allowing Marquis Zimmerman and Vanel Doussos to earn their first career starts. Those bring the season total to 22 first-time starters for BGSU in 2016.

* True freshman Tyrik Jones became the 23rd first-time starter for BGSU at 2016 when he earned the honor at Toledo. He celebrated with a team-high nine tackles and his first two career sacks.

* Of the 23 first-time starters, five are true

freshman, three are redshirt freshmen, eight are sophomores (six true sophomores), six are juniors (three true juniors) and one is a redshirt senior.

INTERCEPTION CONNECTION

* BGSU has picked off five passes in 2016, and the Falcons were just one yard shy of returning the first two for touchdowns.

* Brandon Harris had a 63-yard interception return for a touchdown against Ohio State. He hauled in his second interception against Ohio

and returned it 13 yards. His two interceptions and 76 return yards are both second in the MAC. His pick-six is also second-longest in the MAC this season.

* Alfonso Mack returned an interception 47 yards to the one-yard line against Middle Tennessee.

* Trenton Greene made a diving interception against EMU in the first quarter that gave the Falcons a short field and led to the first touchdown of the game.

* Against Toledo, Antonio Sotolongo picked off his first career pass and returned it seven yards. The turnover, on BGSU's side of the field, helped the Falcons stay in the game during the fourth quarter.

* BGSU's 130 yards on interception returns are third in the MAC, but their 26.0 per-pick average is second only to Western Michigan's 26.9.

* Bowling Green's defense picked off 20 passes and allowed only 19 touchdown passes during the 2015 season. Those 20 interceptions were tied with Oklahoma for eighth-most nationally.

BRANDON "PICK SIX" HARRIS

* Against Ohio State, Brandon Harris picked off a J.T. Barrett pass on OSU's fourth play from scrimmage and weaved 63 yards for the first score of the season and a 7-0 lead. It is the MAC's second-longest pick-six of the season.

* It was the first BGSU pick-six since Darnard Turner pulled the trick on Nov. 4, 2014. Ohio State had not allowed once since Oct. 25, 2014.

* Harris picked off his second pass of the season against Ohio and returned it 13 yards, coming up just six yards shy of his second pick six. His two interceptions are tied for second in the MAC, and his 76 return yards are second in the league.

* The interceptions give Harris three in his career; the other occurred on Nov. 4, 2015, also against Ohio.

* Against North Dakota, Harris hauled down seven Fighting Hawks and was credited with his first career sack. He followed that by collecting his first pass break-up against Middle Tennessee.

* Harris tied for the team lead with nine tackles

(six solo) at Toledo. He's now tied for fourth on the team with 33.

FROM QB TO ALL-MAC LINEBACKER

* Recruited as a quarterback, Austin Valdez has become one of the most dominant linebackers in the Mid-American Conference.

* Valdez earned eight tackles against Toledo, including one for loss, his first TFL of the season.

* Valdez posted 10 tackles in the season opener (five solo) against Ohio State, adding a pass break-up.

* He earned 10 more tackles (two solo) against North Dakota.

* Just a sophomore in 2015, Valdez totaled 144 tackles, more than anyone else in the conference, and averaged 10.3 per game.

* As a first-team All-MAC linebacker, he tied for the team lead with 11 tackles for loss, including a sack. He also posted two interceptions and five pass break-ups.

* Valdez was a huge factor in BGSU's MAC title game win over Northern Illinois, as he recorded 13 tackles (1.5 for loss).

MOORE RONNIE

* Ronnie Moore continued the 2016 season against Toledo with three catches for 36 yards. He now has a reception in 37 straight games -- every contest since the 2013 MAC Championship Game. It is tied for the second-longest catch streak in BGSU history (Mark Szlachcic, Stan Hunter).

* Moore had 72 catches for 951 yards a year ago, but there is potential for those numbers to look rather pedestrian by the end of the 2016 season.

* Of the Falcons top six in receptions a year ago, only Moore returned. Those five combined for 280 receptions.

* Moore passed Mark Szlachcic for seventh place in program history with 2,448 career receiving yards and needs just 53 more to tie Ronald Heard for sixth place all-time and 189 to tie Roger Lewis for fifth. He needs 1,002 to

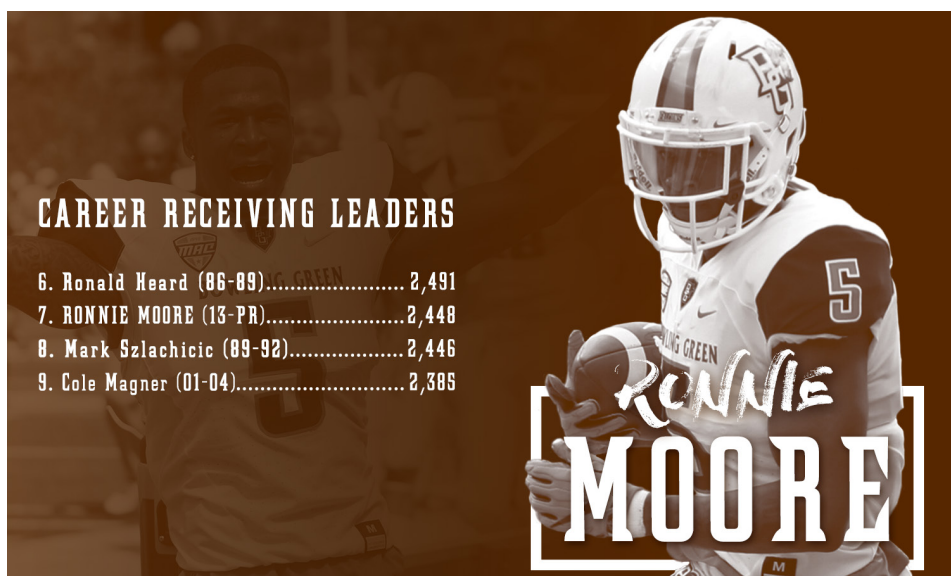

catch Charles Sharon (2002-05) atop the all-time leaderboard with 3,450 receiving yards.

* In addition, Moore is currently 12th on the FBS active career receiving yards list.

* Moore now has 181 career receptions and sole possession of eighth place in BGSU history. His next reception will tie Szlachcic and Corey Partridge for sixth place. He needs eight to tie Ryan Burbrink for fifth. Moore is 51 catches away from second place, behind only NCAA record-breaker Freddie Barnes.

* Moore also needs just six receiving touchdowns to move into a tie for fifth on BGSU's all-time list.

* As a freshman in 2013, Moore's 19.5 yards per reception was the fourth-highest single-season average in program history.

* Against North Dakota, Moore scored the fourth rushing touchdown of his career. He now has 22 total career scores and needs only four more to tie for ninth in BGSU history.

* Moore's consecutive games streak with at least one catch is the eighth-longest active streak in FBS through games of Oct. 15. Here is the updated active catch streak list:

RAY GUY PUNTER OF THE WEEK

* Punter Joseph Davidson was named the Ray Guy Award National Punter of the Week on Sept. 26 after averaging 47.4 yards per punt against Memphis.

* Davidson landed five of his eight punts inside the 20, booted a 68-yarder and a 60-yarder, and had his final punt of the night downed at the one.

RUNNING TO PAYDIRT

* Bowling Green's 304 rushing yards against Middle Tennessee were the most by the team since totaling 337 at Ball State on Nov. 24, 2015.

* The team's 61 rushing attempts were the most in one game by the Falcons in 18 years. BGSU ran the ball 77 times against Northern Illinois on Nov. 21, 1998.

CLEVELAND ROCKS

* Josh Cleveland continues to excel in his role as complement to Fred Coppet. In two games since returning from injury, Cleveland has 18 carries for 127 yards, including 11 for 62 at Toledo.

* Against Ohio, Cleveland carried seven times for 65 yards, including a 38-yard run that set up a BGSU touchdown.

* Cleveland now has 377 yards, 6.1 per carry and 62.8 per game. He ranks 29th in FBS and leads the MAC in yards per carry, and he's 12th in the league in total rushing yards.

* He carried the ball six times for 31 yards against Ohio State, then 11 for 44 against North Dakota.

* His coming-out party was against MTSU. Cleveland hauled the rock 18 times for 153 yards and his first career touchdown. Cleveland is the first BGSU player to rush for more than 150 in his first career 100-yard game since Willie Geter ran for 203 against Kent State in 2007.

YOUTH IS SERVED

* There's a lot of experience on the Bowling Green football team but youth still runs deep for the Falcons.

* BGSU has just 16 seniors, redshirt seniors or grad transfers, tied for 19th fewest in the country.

* Even better, the Falcons have only seven seniors, redshirt seniors or grad transfers on offense, tied for the 15th fewest nationally.

* Twenty Falcons have made their first career starts through the first seven games of 2016.

KNAPKE CAN

* Against North Dakota on Sept. 10, Knapke had his sixth career 300-yard passing game with 315. He also equaled his career-high with three touchdown passes. He now owns a 9-7 career record, including BGSU's last two one-point victories.

* Knapke led Bowling Green to eight wins and an appearance in the MAC Championship game in 2014. He also did something Johnson never did -- lead the Falcons to a bowl game victory.

* Knapke earned the Bart Starr Award as MVP of the 2014 Camellia Bowl after passing for 368 yards and two touchdowns in the 33-28 win over South Alabama. His 78-yard touchdown pass with 1:04 to play put the Falcons ahead for good.

* Knapke holds three single-game school records as he led BGSU to a 45-42 victory over Indiana at Doyt Perry Stadium. His 46 completions and 73 passing attempts are both program highs, as was his 81 total plays. It was BGSU's first ever win over a Big Ten team in The Doyt.

* Knapke threw for a career-high 443 yards in a 47-42 win at UMass in 2014, the sixth-highest single-game total in program history.

* Among single-season records, Knapke ranks in the top 10 in program history with 483 passing attempts (fourth), 280 completions (seventh) and 3,173 passing yards (eighth).

FALCONS IN THE NFL

* Several Bowling Green football alumni started the 2016 NFL season on active rosters.

* Center Kory Lichtensteiger will continue to play for the Washington Redskins in his ninth NFL season.

* Linebacker Gabe Martin will enter his second season with the Arizona Cardinals, as will cornerback Jude Adjei-Barimah with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

* Undrafted free agent wide receiver Roger Lewis will play his rookie campaign for the New York Giants.

* On Oct. 16, Roger Lewis caught his first career

NFL pass. It went for a 24-yard touchdown in the Giants' 27-23 victory over the Baltimore Ravens. It served as the 300th touchdown pass in quarterback Eli Manning's career.

* Lewis' score is the first touchdown reception for a former BGSU player in a regular season NFL game since P.J. Pope caught a scoring pass from Jay Cutler on Dec. 14, 2008 in Denver's 30-10 loss at Carolina.

FUTURE SCHEDULES

* During the offseason, BGSU announced an agreement with Northwestern to play a game on Sept. 16, 2017. That announcement completed the program's 2017 non-conference slate.

* BGSU also announced a contest at Georgia Tech on Sept. 29, 2018. Most recently, Bowling Green announced that it will host Eastern Kentucky on Sept. 15, 2018 to complete the non-conference schedule for that season. The Falcons will open the season Sept. 1 at Oregon and will host Maryland the next week.

* BGSU recently announced that the team will play a game at Tennessee on Sept. 4, 2021. The Falcons just played Tennessee a year ago, a 59-30 defeat to open the season.

* On Thursday, Sept. 29, Bowling Green announced that it would play a game at Notre Dame on Oct. 5, 2019. It is currently scheduled to be Notre Dame's fifth game ever against a current MAC school.

* On Friday, Oct. 7, BGSU announced only the third and fourth games ever for the Falcons against Pac 12 schools. Bowling Green will travel to the Rose Bowl to tackle the UCLA Bruins on Sept. 3, 2022, then will head to Tempe, Ariz. on Sept. 5, 2026 for a date with the Arizona State Sun Devils. BGSU has not faced a Pac 12 school since playing at Washington and Arizona in the 1986 and 1987 seasons.

On Dec. 9, 2015, BGSU announced that it had tabbed Texas Tech Associate Head Coach Mike Jinks to lead the defending Mid-American Conference Champion football program. Jinks, who also coached running backs for the Red Raiders, became the 19th head coach in program history.

Jinks, who came to BGSU after spending the 2015 season as Associate Head Coach, had coached the Red Raiders' running backs for the past three seasons. Prior to his time at Texas Tech, he was a National Coach of the Year finalist while winning the 2010 Texas State Championship and compiling a record of 43-4 in his final three seasons at San Antonio powerhouse, Steele High School.

Known for their prolific offense, Texas Tech saw great success with Jinks in 2015. The Red Raiders owned the second-best offense in the country, totaling 7,134 yards in 12 games (594.5 yards per game). TTU also had the second-best passing offense. The Red Raiders averaged 46.6 points per game (second in FBS) and had 33 touchdown drives under two minutes. Texas Tech also ranked inside the top five nationally for third-down conversions (.519), first downs offense (346), and plays run (1,002).

Under Jinks, Texas Tech saw incredible success in the running game. In just his second season, Jinks tutored DeAndre Washington, who became the first Red Raiders' running back since Ricky Williams in 1998 to surpass 1,000 yards rushing in a single season. Washington finished the season with 1,103 rushing yards and was named second team All-Big 12.

In 2015, Washington turned into the Big 12 Conference's most prolific rusher under Jinks, totaling a league-best 1,455 yards on the ground and 14 touchdowns. Washington was second in the Big 12 in all-purpose yards (146.6 yards per game) behind only teammate Jakeem Grant (180.6 yards per game). The Texas Tech rushing attack averaged 204.8 yards per game and tallied 34 rushing touchdowns.

Jinks joined the Texas Tech program after a highly successful tenure at Steele High School in Cibolo, Texas – a suburb of San Antonio. Jinks was the first head coach at Steele when the school opened its doors in 2005, and it didn't take long for him to mold the program into a state powerhouse. While at Steele, Jinks compiled a 76-18 record overall, including an impressive 43-4 mark in his final three seasons. He led the Knights to the 2010 Class 5A Division II State Championship and to the state finals again in 2011.

His highly successful career at Steele led him to receiving the honor of coaching the West Team in the U.S. Army All-American Bowl in January 2013. He was also a finalist for the Xenith National High School Coach of the Year Award. While at Steele, Jinks coached former Texas Longhorn, and All-American running back, Malcolm Brown.

Prior to becoming the head coach in Cibolo, Jinks was the head coach at Burbank High School for a season. Prior to that, he had a highly successful career as a high school assistant coach and offensive coordinator at five different schools. Jinks' coaching career began in 1995 as the quarterbacks coach at Eillison High School. In 1998, Jinks then became the quarterbacks coach at his alma mater, Judson High School. Following that, he served as offensive coordinator at David Crockett High School, Galena Park High School and Robert E. Lee High School, all prior to his first head coaching position.

Jinks is a graduate of Angelo State University where he earned his degree in kinesiology. He and his wife Meredith have three children – Jaden, Madison and Tristan.

WEEK ONE

COLUMBUS, Ohio – The Bowling Green State University football team took an early 7-0 lead but Ohio State rallied to defeat the Falcons 77-10 in front of 107,193 fans at Ohio Stadium to open the 2016 season.

BGSU received the opening kickoff and went three-and-out. After a Joe Davidson punt, Ohio State began their initial series on their own 42 yard line. Four plays later, the Falcons were on the board.

Facing 2nd-and-5 at the BGSU 41, J.T. Barrett rolled left and threw into the flat, where Brandon Harris was occupying space. Harris grabbed the ball out of the air at the 37 and weaved his way 63 yards for a touchdown. It was the first pick-six for Bowling Green since Dernard Turner on Nov. 4, 2014. OSU had not allowed a pick-six since October 2014.

Jake Suder came on for a successful extra point, the first point of his career, and the Falcons led 7-0 just 2:41 into the game.

By the time the first quarter ended, Ohio State led 21-7 and then added 14 points in the second quarter to take a 35-10 lead into halftime.

Starting quarterback James Knapke completed 12 balls for 110 yards before giving way to redshirt freshman James Morgan in the fourth quarter. Morgan completed nine of ten passes for 65 yards. Seven of those nine completions were to true freshman Marquis Zimmerman. Zimmerman led the Falcons with those seven catches in his first career game. Ronnie Moore led the team with 45 receiving yards.

In the backfield, Josh Cleveland's first six BGSU carries went for 31 yards, as he led the team with a 5.2 yards per carry average. Coppet's 28-yard jaunt led to a team-high 38 yards on 12 carries.

WEEK TWO

BOWLING GREEN, Ohio – The Bowling Green State University football team opened the 50th anniversary season of Doyt Perry Stadium with an exciting 27-26 win over the University of North Dakota on Saturday, Sept. 10. The Falcons benefitted from three touchdown receptions from Scott Miller but had to tip away a two-point conversion attempt in the final seconds to preserve the victory.

Miller finished the contest with five catches for 161 yards and three touchdowns. The scores were the first three of his career, and the yardage total nearly tripled his previous career total. His 71-yard reception is the longest play of the season to date for BGSU.

Moore scored BGSU's other touchdown on the fourth rushing score of his career. He also hauled in three passes for 39 yards. He has receptions in 32 consecutive games, and the 39 yards gives him 2,272. That total moves him into tenth place on BGSU's career reception yards list.

Janarvis Pough had four catches for 51 yards, while Deric Phouthavong added five for 41. All of those totals are career highs. Knapke fed his receivers to the tune of 23-of-40 for 315 yards, three touchdowns and two interceptions. The three scoring passes ties Knapke's career high.

Antonyo Sotolongo and Austin Valdez led BGSU's defense with ten tackles; the total for Sotolongo was a career high and gives him 19 for the season, while Valdez has 20. Trent Greene added nine for a team-leading season total of 25. Gus Schwieterman had two sacks, and Brandon Harris added another. Those were the first career sacks for both players.

Overall, BGSU outgained North Dakota 417-383 and 327-219 through the air. They also allowed just 3.8 yards per carry despite 43 attempts by UND. The Falcon defense limited the Fighting Hawks to just 4-for-17 on third down attempts.

WEEK THREE

BGSU led through much of the first half but ultimately fell to the Middle Tennessee Blue Raiders 41-21 Saturday at Doyt Perry Stadium. MTSU scored three touchdowns in the span of 2:01 surrounding halftime, and inclement weather limited offensive production in the second half, as the Falcons failed to score in the final 30 minutes.

Josh Cleveland rushed for 153 yards on 18 rushes and Fred Coppet added 117 yards on 27 carries. The Falcons ran for 304 yards on the ground in a driving rainpour.

Alfonso Mack made his first interception of the season and seventh of his career as the Falcons went ahead 21-14 just 1:46 into the second quarter. The rest of the game, however, belonged to the Blue Raiders.

BGSU ran 93 plays for 433 yards. Of those, 61 plays for 304 yards came on the ground. That is the most rushing yards for Bowling Green since Nov. 24, 2015 at Ball State. It is the first time BGSU has rushed the ball at least 60 times since 2014 against Kent State.

Cleveland's 18 carries and 153 yards were both career highs, and he posted his first career touchdown. Donovan Wilson also set career bests for carries (10) and yards (36). His two scores were his first since last October against Akron, and they tie for his most in a single game. Coppet's 27 carries were 13 more than his previous high, and his 117 yards were the second most in his career. It is his fifth career 100-yard game.

Defensively, Trent Greene had 11 more tackles and now owns 36 for the season. He was fifth nationally with 12.5 per game entering the contest. Alfonso Mack's interception is his first of the season and seventh of his career. Gus Schwieterman added a sack; he now has three in the last two games.

Four players (Hunter Folkertsma, Cameron Jefferies, Nilijah Ballew and Tavaurus Wade) all made their first starts for the Falcons today.

Memphis got off to a quick start, as the Tigers covered 66 yards on seven plays for an opening-drive touchdown. The Falcons countered, however, with a field goal to pull within four points at 7-3.

James Knapke, who finished the game 8-of-15 for 82 yards, connected with Marquis Zimmerman for a 40-yard completion. The reception for Zimmerman was a career long. The play helped set up a 30-yard Jake Suder field goal.

The Falcons then forced a stop on the Tigers' ensuing drive, but on Bowling Green's next possession, a Knapke pass tipped off a receiver's hands on the first play of the drive, and went the other way for a 28-yard interception return to the end zone.

The Orange and Brown charged down to the Memphis 46 following the interception, but the Tigers forced a stop and quickly went up by a score of 21-3 with a touchdown drive.

Another tipped ball turned interception set up a fourth Tiger touchdown, and Memphis went on to seize control of the game from there, and moved to 3-0 on the season with the victory.

Morgan completed 17-of-34 passes for 126 yards. Zimmerman had a career day for the Orange and Brown, as he hauled in four passes for 75 yards.

WEEK FIVE

BGSU dropped a hard-fought 28-25 decision to the Eastern Michigan Eagles on Oct. 1 at Doyt L. Perry Stadium. The game served as the Mid-American Conference opener for both teams. It was also BGSU's homecoming game and was played on the 50th anniversary of the first game at Perry Stadium.

Fred Coppet set a single-game high in rushing yards and scored twice, Trenton Greene pulled down his first career interception, and Donovan Wilson caught his first career touchdown pass. Redshirt freshman James Morgan also made his first career start at quarterback in the losing effort.

Down 21-10 early in the fourth quarter, BGSU marched 75 yards in ten plays to pull within one score. Coppet started the drive with a 41 yard run, then carried five more times, including a two-yard touchdown run to cut the deficit to 21-17.

EMU took the kickoff and again drove 75 yards for a score. The final play was a 40-yard touchdown pass from Roback to Sergio Bailey. BGSU defensive back Alfonso Mack had his hands on the ball first, but Bailey managed to take the ball away to give the Eagles a 28-17 lead.

The Falcons would not give up and scored once again with 5:16 to play. Coppet again ended a lengthy 82-yard drive with a two-yard run. Morgan threw to Scott Miller for the two-point conversion, and BGSU was within a field goal at 28-25.

BGSU posted 456 total yards, including 206 on the ground and 250 through the air. It is the most total offense in a game this season for the Falcons and is also the first game with 200 or more yards rushing and passing in the same contest.

Coppet rushed 25 times for 141 yards to earn his sixth career 100-yard game and his career single-game high in rushing yards. He also moves into ninth place on BGSU's all-time rushing list with 2,388 yards.

WEEK SIX

BGSU fought valiantly but saw its 17-game winning streak against the Mid-American Conference Eastern Division come to an end with a 30-24 loss at Ohio. James Morgan threw two touchdown passes, and Fred Coppet ran in another in BGSU's first defeat at Peden Stadium in six years.

Bowling Green posted 367 yards of offense, including a career-high 253 yards passing from Morgan. The defense allowed a season-best 388 yards and 203 passing yards.

Fred Coppet finished with 66 yards and a touchdown, while Cleveland added 65 yards on the ground. Miller had 106 all-purpose yards and a touchdown, and Redding posted 54 yards and a score on a career-high six catches.

Ronnie Moore's three catches gave him a 36-game streak with at least one catch, third-most in BGSU history and the eighth-longest active streak in FBS. His 76 receiving yards moved him into eighth place on the Falcons' all-time list.

Redshirt freshman James Morgan threw five touchdown passes in a stirring comeback attempt, but BGSU ultimately fell to the Toledo Rockets 42-35 Saturday afternoon.

Against the Rockets, Morgan threw 38 times and completed 25 for 335 yards, five touchdowns, and one interception. His completion, yardage and touchdown totals were all career-bests.

Morgan threw for more yards than any BGSU quarterback since Matt Johnson last November against Ohio and more touchdowns than any since Johnson last October at Kent State. In three games as starter, he has 838 yards passing and an 8-to-5 touchdown-to-interception ratio.

Sophomore wide receiver Scott Miller was the primary beneficiary of Morgan's success. Miller posted eight catches for 149 yards and three touchdowns. The catches and yards were the second most of his season and career, and the three scores equaled Miller's total from the Falcons' win over North Dakota.

Miller caught scoring throws of 10, 15, and 57 yards. He now has seven touchdown receptions in 2016. It was his third 100-yard receiving game of the season and his fifth effort with 100 or more all-purpose yards.

Morgan threw two touchdowns in the final seven minutes of the game. The first was a 20-yard strike to freshman Marquis Zimmerman, then after a quick Toledo three-and-out, Teo Redding toe-tapped in the end zone for an 18-yard scoring reception and a 35-35 tie.

Toledo capped the game with a 66-yard touchdown march that ended with a three-yard run from Kareem Hunt with 18 seconds to play. That was the final salvo in the Rockets' 42-35 win.
