THE BLITZ

- The 25th-ranked North Dakota football team will look to bounce back from a season-opening loss with a visit to Bowling Green on Saturday. The tilt in the Buckeye State will be the fourth for the program on Ohio soil. Kickoff with the Falcons is set for 2:30 p.m. CT and will air live on the American Sports Network.
- The Falcons will be the only Football Subdivision opponent on UND's schedule in 2016. The Fighting Hawks are 1-7 all-time in games vs. FBS foes.
- It has been 67 years since UND played an Ohio-based program and the Fighting Hawks are still looking for their first win against one of those schools (0-3).
- UND will wrap up non-conference play with its home opener on Sept. 17 against South Dakota in the 51st Potato Bowl USA Game.

UND vs. THE FOOTBALL BOWL SUBDIVISION

- Bowling Green will be the ninth FBS opponent UND has faced since making the transition to the Division I level prior to the 2008 season.
- After losing its first seven contests to FBS programs, UND got off the schnide last season with a 24-13 victory at Wyoming in the season opener. The Cowboys were the fourth-straight Mountain West Conference school that the Fighting Hawks had played from the FBS.

UND vs. The MAC

- As for Mid-American Conference programs, UND has played three of the league's current membership, but only Northern Illinois at the DI level.
- The Fighting Hawks are 1-3 all-time against current MAC schools with their lone win coming against NIU in the 1965 Mineral Water Bowl (37-20; Excelsior Springs, Mo.). NIU snuck out a 23-17 victory in a 2010 matchup in Dekalb.
- Toledo beat UND twice at home when both schools were DII members back in 1939 (26-7) and 1949 (56-6).

LOOKING BACK: LATE SPECIAL TEAMS' TO LEADS SBU BY UND

Stony Brook used a late special teams' touchdown to edge North Dakota 13-9 in the season opener last Thursday on Long Island.

UND's defense yielded 221 yards of total offense to the Seawolves with only 67 of those came in the second half. Junior captains Connor O'Brien (career-high 11 tackles, two forced fumbles) and Cole Reyes (eight tackles, 2.0 TFLs, a sack, two fumble recoveries, one forced fumble, one safety) both put together big stat lines in the loss.

The only offensive score for SBU came on a fumble recovery late in the first half after O'Brien had knocked the ball loose on a 3rdand-goal play. SBU took its first lead of the game after blocking an Austin Dussold punt and running back the loose ball seven vards for a touchdown.

Sophomore running back John Santiago (16 carries, 51 yards, TD and two receptions for eight yards) was held in check for the most part as the UND offense only churned out 177 yards of total offense. Santiago provided the only offensive score of the game for UND with a 16-yard carry in the second quarter. His 17th career rushing touchdown put the visitors ahead 7-0.

NEW HELMET DESIGN



For the first time since the 1969 season, the North Dakota football helmets will be adorned with a new logo. The interlocking ND has been emblazoned on both sides of the helmets for the past 47 seasons, but will be replaced in 2016 by the athletic department's new Fighting Hawks logo. The new logo will appear on the right side of

the helmet, while the players' number will appear on the left side.

REYES COLLECTS BIG SKY WEEKLY HONOR

Junior safety Cole Reves collected the first Big Sky Defensive Player of the Week honor of his career on Monday. League officials named the Schaumburg, III., native the week one recipient after putting together an eye-popping stat line vs. Stony Brook. Reyes finished with eight tackles, 2.0 tackles for loss, a sack, two fumble recoveries and a forced fumble to go with a safety that put the Fighting Hawks ahead 9-7 in the third guarter.

GEORGES LOST FOR SEASON

Senior wide receiver Clive Georges was lost for the season on UND's opening possession of the second half at Stony Brook when the Arizona transfer injured his left leg on a play where he was fighting to get into the end zone. Georges was gang-tackled at the 2-yard line and ended up fumbling on the play. SBU took over possession, but the Seawolves were stuffed in the end zone on the ensuing play for a safety.

Head coach Bubba Schweigert provided an update on Georges' status this past Friday, stating that the Arizona transfer remained in New York with athletic trainer Sean Degerstrom and would undergo surgery at a medical center there before returning home to Grand Forks at a yet-to-be determined date. Georges had three catches for 30 yards at the time of his injury. Unfortunately, it was the second-consecutive season Georges suffered an injury in the opener. He returned from a broken hand for the final five games of the 2015 campaign. Georges had 13 catches for 280 yards in seven career games for the Fighting Hawks.

THINGS TO KNOW

- · Junior captain Connor O'Brien was one of four FCS players to force a pair of fumbles in the first week of the season. He also registered a career-high 11 tackles in the loss at Stony Brook.
- · Co-captain Cole Reyes was the only FCS player to record a pair of fumble recoveries during week one.
- Sophomore **John Santiago's** 27.8 yard per kickoff return career average is second best among active FCS players trailing only Lorenzo James of Saint Francis (29.0). Santiago had four kickoff returns for 114 yards vs. Stony Brook (28.5 ypr).
- · Santiago had a streak of eight-consecutive 100-yard rushing games come to an end at Stony Brook, but his 125.8 yard per game average is still second-best among active FCS players. He rushed 16 times for 51 yards and a score vs. the Seawolves.
- After breaking UND's single-season all-purpose yardage record as a freshman with 2,159 yards, the Andover, Minn., native started 2016 with a 173-yard effort at Stony Brook. It was the thirdhighest total among Big Sky players last week and included a career-long 49-yard kickoff return.
- · Seniors Zach Arnell and Taj Rich returned to the field for the first time since having their junior seasons cut short due to injuries. Arnell started at strong safety and record four tackles, while Rich was credited with two tackles, including a solo stop against the Seawolves.

POLLING PLACE

After the season-opening loss to Stony Brook, North Dakota remained in the STATS FCS Top 25, but fell six spots to No. 25. The Fighting Hawks were No. 19 in the initial Hero Sports Media Poll, but are only receiving votes in this week's edition. The same is true for the FCS Coaches' Poll where UND was ranked No. 21 in the preseason poll, but fell outside of the top 25 this week.

STUDSRUD OVERCOMES SLOW START

After starting the game 6-for-17 through the air, junior quarterback **Keaton Studsrud** found his groove in the fourth quarter. He finished the stanza 7-for-8 and was 5-for-5 for 26 yards on UND's final drive. Unfortunately, the potential game-winning touchdown drive stalled at the SBU 24-yard line when the Seawolves stuffed UND on a fourth-and-1 play. Studsrud concluded the game 13for-25 for 114 yards.

2015), four against NDSU (Sept. 19; 2015) and 62 in the 2016 season opener at Stony Brook (Sept. 1). UND averaged 292.5 yards per game on the ground in Big Sky play last season.

SHIRTLESS IN STONY BROOK

Three true freshmen made their collegiate debuts at Stony Brook. Wide receivers **Travis Toivonen** and **Noah Wanzek** along with **Evan Holm** all saw action for the Fighting Hawks last Thursday. Toivonen was the only one to accumulate stats as he caught three passes for 33 yards in his debut. Wanzek also appeared at wide receiver, but was not targeted, while Holm saw action on special teams as a kick returner, but did not have an attempt.

Last season, head coach **Bubba Schweigert** played five true freshmen during the team's 7-4 season. That bunch included running backs Iwarri Smith, **Brady Oliveira** and **John Santiago** along with offensive tackle Elijah Grady and safety **Tanner Palmborg**. Smith and Grady are no longer with the program.

RUN STUFFERS

The North Dakota defense has been one of the stingiest defenses in the country against the run each of the past two seasons and the unit got off to another stellar start last at Stony Brook (Sept. 1). The Seawolves managed to gain just 62 yards on the ground (34 attempts, 1.8 ypc). UND was also credited with four sacks and 9.0 tackles for loss. Junior **Drew Greely**, who had his 2015 shortened by injury, led the team with 1.5 sacks against SBU. The 62-yard effort was only topped by 11 FCS schools in week one.

During the previous two seasons, the Fighting Hawks led the Big Sky in run defense and also ranked fifth in the FCS in 2014 (102.5 ypg) and sixth in 2015 (100.3 ypg). The unit's best effort in 2014 was in the season finale against Northern Colorado when it yielded only 18 rushing yards on 20 attempts to the Bears. In 2015, UND's best effort was in the season-opening win at Wyoming. The Cowboys mustered only 29 yards on 19 carries as the Fighting Hawks beat an FBS opponent for the first team.

PRESEASON PUB

Besides appearing in a trio of preseason national polls, the North Dakota football team also had some of its players receive preseason accolades from various media outlets. Sophomore running back **John Santiago** was a unanimous pick for the All-Big Sky preseason team and was joined on that squad by junior safety **Cole Reyes**. Santiago also earned a spot on the STATS Preseason All-America First Team as an all-purpose player and landed on a pair of a national watch lists (STATS Offensive Player of the Year and College Football Performance Awards Performer of the Year).

For the first time in its DI history, UND opened the season ranked in the STATS FCS Poll (No. 19), the FCS Coaches' Poll (No. 21) and the Hero Sports FCS Media Poll (No. 19).

CAPTAINS

UND has four new captains for the 2016 season after the team voted earlier this summer for the quartet of tight end **Luke Mathewson**, inside linebacker **Connor O'Brien**, safety **Cole Reyes** and quarterback **Keaton Studsrud** to handle those responsibilities. Mathewson, the lone senior among the foursome, will be joined in his captaincy by three juniors.

Holm and Hunt also played rugby together in high school and Holm played for the U.S.A. High School All-America Rugby Team in France and Belgium this past spring. Rounding out the sets of high school teammates are true freshmen **Jordan Canady** (DB) and **Jake Rastas** (ILB), who played prep football together at Eisenhower High School in New Berlin, Wis.

NEW ROLES

Plavers

John Santiago

There were 37 players remaining on the 2016 roster that were part of UND's 13-3 win over Stony Brook in 2014. That was head coach **Bubba Schweigert's** first season as the head coach. Two of the key contributors on offense that day will be working at new positions in 2016. Senior **Joe Mollberg** started the 2014 game at quarterback and one of his two completions in the victory was a 68-yarder to Dev Ferguson. Mollberg suited up at tight end against the Seawolves (Sept. 1) after making the position change during the spring. Junior **Kyle Norberg** began the 2014 season at inside linebacker, but after injuries depleted the running back corps, he made his first career start against Stony Brook. He finished with 27 carries for 69 yards. Norberg had one catch for five yards this time against Stony Brook as the team's starting fullback.

IMMEDIATE COE-TRIBUTOR

One of the big questions entering the 2016 season was where would UND turn to replace the three All-Big Sky performers that graduated from the offensive line. At guard, the answer was the lockerroom where **Dan Bell** and **Demon Taylor** both made their first career starts against Stony Brook at right and left guard, respectively. As for center, the trek was a little further for offensive

line coach **Luke Knauf**, who returned to the Land of Enchantment to find his starter. The former Western New Mexico offensive coordiantor plucked graduate transfer **Michael Coe** from his former team to man the middle of UND's line this season.

Coe, who graduated after four years at WNM with a degree in criminal justice, will pursue his master's in higher edcuation at UND while playing his final collegiate season for his former line coach. The 6-3, 300-pounder started 32 consecutive games for the Mustangs from 2012-14 before redshirting last season. As a junior in 2014, Coe earned All-Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference first team honors. He was a second team All-RMAC selection as a sophomore and third team selection as a freshman. Both tackles Knauf used against the Seawolves had starting experience coming into the opener. Junior **A.J. Stockwell** made his 12th-consecutive start at left tackle, while classmate **Mat Cox** made his fourth career start at right tackle.

DROP DOWNS

The 2016 roster will have a trio of players on it that have played at the Football Bowl Subdivision level. The newest member of that threesome is wide receiver **De'mun Mercer**, who played his first two collegiate seasons at Texas State where he caught 28 passes for 289 yards and four touchdowns during his career for the Bobcats. Running back **Oscar Nevermann** and wide receiver **Clive Georges** (out for the season) are both going through their second seasons with the program. Nevermann joined the program in the spring of 2015, but had to sit out last season after Wyoming did not grant his release. The Stockholm, Sweden native played linebacker for the Cowboys, but will have two seasons at running back. He appeared on special teams for the Fighting Hawks in the season opener and made two tackles during his UND debut.

REARVIEW MIRROR

- UND wrapped up the 2015 season with an impressive 45-21 win at Cal Poly to finish with a 7-4 overall record and a 5-3 mark in the Big Sky. The seven wins were a two-game improvement from head coach **Bubba Schweigert's** first season and the Fighting Hawks capped the season with the first three-game winning streak of his tenure.
- With those 45 points against the Mustangs, UND averaged 44.7 ppg during its season-closing, three-game win streak. In the previous five Big Sky games, the Fighting Hawks averaged just 24.2 ppg. The defense also limited the league's second-highest scoring offense to just 21 points, which was 20 points below Cal Poly's season average.
- UND placed 11 players on the 2015 All-Big Sky teams with the trio of running back **John Santiago**, linebacker **Will Ratelle** and offensive guard **Sean Meehan** all landing on the first team. Santiago was one of three unanimous choices in the league and was named the Co-Big Sky Freshman of the Year. The individual honor is the first for UND in four years as a Big Sky member.
- Six more UND players were named to the second team, while defensive end **Brandon Dranka** collected third-team honors and defensive end **Noah Johnson** was an honorable-mention selection. The six Fighting Hawks dotting the second team were senior offensive linemen **Brandon Anderson** and **Colton Boas**, senior fullback **Zach Adler**, outside linebacker **Brian Labat**, safety **Cole Reyes** and now-departed punter Mitch Meindel.
- Also for the first time at the DI level, UND had multiple players earn All-America honors as Meehan was named to the American Football Coaches Association first team and Santiago collected Associated Press and STATS second team accolades.
- Quarterback Keaton Studsrud led UND to a 7-2 record last sea-

son in games he played the majority of the snaps. He started eight of those contests and the Fighting Hawks were 4-1 when he went down with an injury in the third quarter of the Idaho State game (Oct. 10). The loss to the Bengals started a season-long, three-game slide that was snapped when Studsrud returned for the 44-38 victory over No. 19 Montana State.

- Studsrud finished the season 99-for-165 for 1,262 yards and 12 touchdowns. He completed 60 percent of his passes on the year. During UND's three-game winning streak to close the season, the St. Louis Park, Minn. native went 36-for-45 (80 percent) for 517 yards and five touchdowns
- Studsrud's 107-yard rushing output in the 19-17 win at No. 16 Portland State was the first 100-yard game by a UND quarterback since Kelby Klosterman rushed for 100 yards in a win at St. Cloud State in 2003.

HOME FIELD SUCCESS

Last season's 45-14 win over Northern Colorado (Nov. 14) in the home finale pushed UND's record to 4-1 at the Alerus Center in 2015. That 4-1 mark bumped the program's overall record in the building to 76-22. UND is 8-3 at home under third-year head coach **Bubba Schweigert**.

GROUND ATTACK

UND compiled 2,645 yards on the ground in 2015, setting the program's Division I record for most rushing yards in a season and cracking the 2,000-yard rushing mark for just the 15th time in school history. The total finished as the third-highest in program history. The 1975 team holds the single-season record with 3,100 rushing yards, which was set in just 10 games.

LARGE WIN

UND's 31-point spread over the Bears was the program's largest margin of victory in a conference game at the Division I level (since 2008), trumping its 35-13 win at Sacramento State in the team's Big Sky debut in 2012.

STAFF REUNION

Head coach **Bubba Schweigert** has made only one change and one addition to his coaching staff since taking over the program in 2014. The addition was moving **Carl Reinholz** to a full-time position in 2015. The one change he made was more of a trade as former defensive backs coach Marty Rodgers returned to his alma mater at Southern Illiinois this past January, while **Travis Stepps** left the SIU staff to rejoin Schweigert in Grand Forks. The two had worked together in Carbondale while Schweigert was the defensive coordinator for the Salukis.

NICKNAME HISTORY

The University of North Dakota boasts a proud history of varsity athletics nicknames. UND's first official athletics nickname was the "Flickertails," although its origin remains somewhat a mystery. The nickname made its first public appearance in a Grand Forks Herald account of UND's football loss to Minnesota on Oct. 8, 1904, 15 years after UND's first athletics contest was played. According to Lee Bohnet's A Century of UND Sports, "The author was not identified, but there is strong evidence the nickname was coined by a Minneapolis sportswriter who may have covered the game for the Herald. The writer lauded the fighting spirit of the North Dakota players."

In 1911, UND's student body officially adopted "Flickertails" as its athletics nickname. UND would remain known as the "Flickertails" (as well, unofficially, as the "Nodaks") for a third of a century, establishing an early athletics history.

In the fall of 1930, the university adopted the nickname "Sioux" for its varsity teams following a successful renaming campaign by the Dakota Student, UND's student newspaper. The word "Fighting" was later added, and UND would be known as the "Fighting Sioux" until the summer of 2012.

The university utilized several "Fighting Sioux" logos throughout the decades, perhaps most notably the green geometric logo introduced in 1976 and the most recent full-color logo was unveiled in 1999. The former was designed by an artist at the UND News Bureau, while the latter was created by noted Native American artist and UND alum Bennett Brien.

The University of North Dakota officially retired its longtime "Fighting Sioux" nickname and logo prior to the 2012-13 athletics season.

UND's varsity athletics teams operated without an official nickname, while the university continued the process of adopting the third official nickname in school history last fall. During that time, the university's varsity athletics teams will continue to be referred to as "the University of North Dakota," "North Dakota," or "UND."

Former President Dr. Robert Kelley announced in mid-November that "Fighting Hawks" would be the University's new moniker and the UND football team played under that nickname in its 2015 season finale at Cal Poly — a 45-21 victory over the Mustangs.



OPPONENT PREVIEW: BOWLING GREEN

Bowling Green is under the direction of first-year head coach Mike Jinks, who arrived in Ohio following a three-year stint as an assistant coach at Texas Tech. In his last year at Lubbock, Jinks was the Associate Head Coach and also coached the running backs.

The reigning Mid-American Conference champions are coming off a 10-4 season that saw them beat Northern Illinois 34-14 in the MAC Championship game before falling 58-27 to Georgia Southern in the GoDaddy Bowl in Mobile, Ala. The Falcons' previous head coach, Dino Babers, left the program to take control at Syracuse following last season.

The Falcons had their hands full in the team's season opener at No. 6 Ohio State last Saturday, falling to the Buckeyes 77-10. BGSU opened the scoring with a 63-yard interception return for a touchdown by Brandon Harris, but were outscored 77-3 after that.

Senior **James Knapke** returned to his starting post at quarterback for the opener after serving in a back-up role in 2015. He started all 14 games in 2014 and was the Bart Starr MVP in the team's 2014 Camellia Bowl win over South Alabama (25-for-39; 368 yards and two TDs). Knapke struggled in his return, however, completing just 12-of-33 passes for 110 yards and two interceptions. **James Morgan** went 9-for-10 in relief for 65 yards and his only incompletion turned into an OSU interception.

Senior **Fred Coppet** rushed for 825 yards in 14 games a season ago and is the team's leading returning rusher. BGSU averaged 42.2 points per game (sixth-highest in FBS in 2015), while throwing for 366.8 yards per game (also sixth-highest). The team's 546.8 ypg of total offense was fourth-best.

Defensively, Ohio State racked up a program-record 776 total yards of offense in the opener against the Falcons. A season ago, the unit yielded 28.9 ppg and 418.2 yards of total offense per game.

Junior linebacker **Austin Valdez** returns to lead the unit after registering 144 tackles in 2015. That was good for 10th-highest in the FBS. He had 10 stops in the opener against the Buckeyes, while linebacker mate Trenton Greene logged a career-high 16 tackles in the contest.



Bubba Schweigert wrapped up his second season with the first three-game winning streak of his UND head-coaching tenure. Those three victories gave his 2015 squad a 7-4 overall record and 5-3 mark in Big Sky play, which were both two-game improvements from his first season back in Grand Forks.

Schweigert's defense led the Big Sky in rushing defense for the second straight season under his watch and the offense improved immensely thanks in large part to the record-breaking production of true freshman running back John Santiago.

After a 4-3 start that included the program's first victory over an FBS opponent (24-13 win at Wyoming) and first DI victory over a ranked opponent on the road (19-17 win at No. 16 Portland State), the Fighting Hawks would close the campaign on a three-game winning streak to post the program's first seven-win season since 2011.

Santiago was named the Co-Big Sky Freshman of the Year and collected All-America honors from the Associated Press and STATS, Inc. He was also a unanimous All-Big Sky first team performer and was joined on that team by senior linebacker Will Ratelle and offensive lineman Sean Meehan, who was also named to the AFCA All-America Team.

Eight more Fighting Hawks would garner all-league honors in 2015 as the defense once again ranked among the tops in the Big Sky, ranking first in rush defense and second in total defense.

In the classroom, 17 UND football players were named to the All-Big Sky Academic Team, breaking the previous year's record by one.

In his first season back at UND, Schweigert's 2014 squad won five games overall, which was a two-game improvement from the previous season. The campaign was highlighted by a 30-28 upset of No. 22 Northern Arizona in the final home game of the season at the Alerus Center.

UND took the positive vibes from a victory that knocked NAU out of the FSC playoff hunt to Greely, Colo., the next Saturday where the team closed out the season with its first Big Sky road win of the season — a 33-14 defeat of Northern Colorado.

The defensive-minded head coach still works with the team's cornerbacks and they were part of a unit that led the Big Sky in total defense and rush defense in 2014. Two newcomers earned All-Big Sky Conference honors (KR Alex Tillman and PK Reid Taubenheim) and seven more players were named honorable mention in Schweigert's first season.

There were also 16 UND football players named to the All-Big Sky Academic team, which tied a program record for individuals honored in one season.

The Zeeland, N.D., native returned to Grand Forks after 10 years away from a program that he helped lead to the 2001 NCAA Division II national title as defensive coordinator.

On Dec 28, 2013, Schweigert was introduced as the head coach at the University of North Dakota during a press conference in front of a standing-room only crowd at the Alerus Center.


Prior to his return to UND, Schweigert was the defensive coordinator at Southern Illinois for the previous six seasons (2008-13) and served as associate head coach for the last five of that stretch. His 2010 defense led the Missouri Valley in total defense and his unit finished in the top half of the league in four of his six campaigns at SIU.

In his six seasons at SIU, Schweigert coached three first team All-Americans and 20 all-conference selections (10 first team, six second team, four honorable mentions). His defensive standouts have included linebacker and 2012 graduate Jayson DiManche, currently playing for Cincinnati Bengals, and cornerback Korey Lindsey, a three-time All-American and a 2011 draft pick of the Bengals. In 2013, SIU linebacker Bryan Presume earned first team All-MVFC honors after ranking third in the league with 104 tackles. His 55 solo stops were tops in the conference.

"It is truly an honor and a privilege to serve the University of North Dakota as its head football coach," said Schweigert at the time of his hiring. "I am looking forward to hiring a staff and building a program that will represent UND in a first-class manner, both on and off the field. We will put forth great effort to facilitate positive relations with fans, alumni, the community and the student body. We look forward to playing exciting championship football in front of thousands of loyal fans as we strive to win the Big Sky Conference championship and, ultimately, reach the pinnacle of FCS football."

Prior to arriving at SIU, Schweigert took on his first head coaching job at the collegiate level, leading the Division II program at Minnesota Duluth from 2004-07. He guided the Bulldogs to a 22-21 overall record during his tenure, including the program's first North Central Conference title in 2005. The NCAA playoff berth that season was the program's second in four seasons. That same season, Schweigert was also named the D2football.com

Northwest Region Coach of the Year and the AFCA Division II Coach of the Year for Region 5.



Schweigert was elevated to defensive coordinator at UND prior to the 1997 season and left for Duluth after the 2003 UND team finished as national runner-up. Schweigert was named the American Football Coaches Association Division II Assistant Coach of the Year in 2000.

In his seven seasons as UND's defensive coordinator, Schweigert's defensive players earned 14 All-America honors and 23 first-team All-NCC accolades. His 2001 defense yielded just 191.4 yards of offense and 50.3 rushing yards per game, while limiting opponents to 12.5 points per game on the way to the program's first national championship.

Schweigert began his coaching career at his alma mater, now the University of Jamestown, from 1985-1988. He earned a bachelor's degree in business administration from Jamestown and a master's degree from UND. In 2002, he was honored with Jamestown's Rollie Greeno Award

GAME ONE AT STONY BROOK

STONY BROOK, N.Y. -- STONY BROOK, N.Y. -- In a game dominated by both defenses, it was a fourth-quarter special teams' touchdown that led Stony Brook to a 13-9 upset of No. 19 North Dakota Thursday at LaValle Stadium.

Redshirt freshman Gavin Heslop came up with the big play as he broke through UND's protection and blocked Austin Dussold's punt that was scooped up by Kye Morgan and returned seven yards for the go-ahead score

A failed two-point conversion left the Fighting Hawks down by four and 8:47 to work with on the clock. The UND offense answered with its most sustained drive of the contest, but the 12-play, 53-yard effort stalled at the SBU 24-yard line when Brady Oliveira was stopped short of the first down on a 4th-and-1 rush.

With only 2:14 to run off the clock and UND with only one timeout remaining, SBU needed just one first down to seal the win and the Seawolves' got that on a second-down carry by Stacey Bedell.

The teams combined for only 398 yards of total offense and both lost two fumbles in a contest that saw each team hold the ball for nearly 30 minutes. The Seawolves held a slight edge with 221 yards of total offense, but mustered only 67 in the second half.

UND was held to only 43 first-half yards, but a 16-yard rushing score by sophomore John Santiago put the visitors ahead 7-0 early in the second quarter. SBU would square the game after converting UND's first turnover into a touchdown that nearly did not happen.

Tight end Cal Daniels was credited with the touchdown after he raced to the corner of the end zone where he fell on the loose ball that was coughed up by Jordan Gowins trying to get in from the 3-yard line on a 3rd-and-goal for the Seawolves.

Junior captain Connor O'Brien forced the fumble and led UND with a career-high 11 total tackles, but the star of the night for UND's defense was fellow captain Cole Reyes. The hard-hitting safety had eight tackles, recovered two fumbles, had a sack and forced a fumble, but his biggest play of the game came early in the third quarter.

After Clive Georges fumbled at the SBU 2-yard line after fighting for extra yardage on UND's opening drive of the half, Reyes darted through the line of scrimmage and tripped up Bedell in the end zone for a safety to put UND up 9-7.

The Schaumburg, III., native missed the fourth quarter with an injury, but the Fighting Hawks yielded only one first down in those final 15 minutes. UND would cling to that lead as the teams exchanged four punts before Morgan recovered the last one by Dussold and raced in untouched for his second career blocked-punt recovery for a touchdown.

In the first half, Stony Brook took the opening possession down to the UND 20-yard line, but Przemyslaw Popek missed on a 37-yard field goal attempt.

The Seawolves were controlling field position until a botched hand off on a 3rd-and-1 play resulted in Reyes' first fumble recovery late in the first quarter. UND took over near midfield, but the SBU defense held the visitors to their third-consecutive, three-and-out to start the game.

After forcing its own three-and-out, the UND offense would finally get going. Junior quarterback Keaton Studsrud completed a 3rd-and-five to start the second quarter and Santiago would make a few Seawolves miss before getting to pay dirt from 16 yards out on the next play. The sophomore All-American got loose after being held to only three yards on five carries in the first quarter. He finished with 16 carries for 51 yards.
