2016 BGSU FOOTBALL

SETTING THE SCENE

* Bowling Green, the defending Mid-American Conference champions, seeks their first win of the season when they open their home schedule on Saturday, Sept. 10 against the North Dakota Fighting Hawks

* The home game will begin the 50th anniversary season of Doyt Perry Stadium. "The Doyt" hosted its first game on Oct. 1, 1966, when the Falcons won a 13-0 decision from the University of Dayton.

* In 50 seasons of games at Doyt Perry Stadium, BGSU is 162-85-6. They are 16-6 at home in the last four seasons.

* The game against North Dakota marks the first time since 2014 that BGSU will play an FCS team. The Falcons played one every year from 2011-2014 and went 4-0 in those games with an average victory margin of 42 points.

BGSU VS. THE FCS

* From 2011-2014, BGSU faced an FCS team in every season, winning by an average of 51-9 and never by less than 40.

* BGSU scored at least 48 in each game and averaged 574 yards of offense per game and 7.8 per play during those contests.

* The Falcon defense also excelled, allowing an average of 144 passing yards in those games.

* James Knapke threw his first career pass in 2013 against FCS member Murray State. In that game, he was 4-for-4 with 71 yards and his first touchdown pass.

* The following season, Knapke's first career start came against FCS member VMI. He completed 22 of 31 passes for 237 yards and a touchdown, as BGSU beat the Keydets 48-7 for their first win under Dino Babers.

* Senior wide receiver Ronnie Moore had his first multi-catch game in 2013's 48-7 win over Murray State. He hauled in five balls for 63

yards, including his first career touchdown – a throw that was also James Knapke's first career touchdown pass.

REBOUNDED

* Although BGSU lost to Ohio State 77-10 Saturday, the Falcons can draw upon recent success after poor week one outings.

* In 2014, the Falcons lost 59-31 to Western Kentucky in the first game of the Dino Babers era. They followed with seven wins in their next nine games, all under James Knapke, and clinched a second straight East Division title.

* In 2015, Bowling Green lost 59-30 to Tennessee but responded by winning ten of the next 12. That included wins at Maryland (48-27) and Purdue (35-28), six straight wins to start the MAC season, and the MAC Championship game against Northern Illinois.

REPLACING THE BEARD

* In order to replicate the offensive statistics the Falcons put up a year ago, BGSU will need to find a replacement at quarterback for MAC Offensive Player of the Year Matt Johnson.

* That being said, there may not be a better replacement in the MAC than senior signal caller James Knapke. Knapke started the final 13 games of the 2014 season when Johnson sustained a season-ending injury in the opener.

* Knapke led Bowling Green to eight wins and an appearance in the MAC Championship game in 2014. He also did something Johnson never did -- lead the Falcons to a bowl game victory.

* Knapke earned the Bart Starr Award as MVP of the 2014 Camellia Bowl after passing for 368 yards and two touchdowns in the 33-28 win over South Alabama. His 78-yard touchdown pass with 1:04 to play put the Falcons ahead for good.

* Knapke holds three single-game school records as he led BGSU to a 45-42 victory over Indiana at Doyt Perry Stadium. His 46 completions and 73 passing attempts are both program highs, as was his 81 total plays. It was BGSU's first ever win over a Big Ten team in The Doyt.

* Knapke threw for a career-high 443 yards in a 47-42 win at UMass in 2014, the sixth-highest single-game total in program history.

* Among single-season records, Knapke ranks in the top 10 in program history with 483 passing attempts (fourth), 280 completions (seventh) and 3,173 passing yards (eighth).

ELIANO'S DEFENSE IS STOUT

* Defensive coordinator Perry Eliano inherits an opportunistic defense that returns six key starters in 2016.

* The Falcons ranked eighth in the country in 2015 with 20 interceptions and 13th in total turnovers forced with 27.

* Brandon Harris had a 63-yard interception return for a touchdown in week one against Ohio State and the Buckeyes also fumbled three times, though they recovered each of them.

* The linebackers are destined to be the backbone of the defense. Trenton Greene, a second-team All-MAC performer a year ago, had 16 tackles against Ohio State, ranking sixth in the nation. His nine solo tackles are eighth.

* Linebacker Austin Valdez, a first-team all-conference player last year, had 10 tackles and a pass break-up.

* Defensive end Terrance Bush will provide leadership as a returning starter along the line, while Alfonso Mack will do the same in the secondary.

* Mack is a former walk-on who made such an impact on the Falcons that Mike Jinks' first decision as head coach was to award him a

scholarship on Dec. 10, 2015 in the initial team meeting. Mack led the team with six interceptions a year ago.

INTERCEPTION CONNECTION

* Bowling Green's defense picked off 20 passes and allowed only 19 touchdown passes during the 2015 season.

* Those 20 interceptions were tied with Oklahoma for eighth-most nationally.

* The Falcons were one of 21 teams to have more interceptions than touchdown passes allowed, but only three of those teams had more than BGSU's 20 picks.

BOWLING GREENE

* Redshirt senior linebacker Trenton Greene set a career high for tackles in Saturday's game at Ohio State.

* Greene hauled down Buckeyes on 16 occasions, beating his previous best of 12. He ranks sixth nationally in tackles, just three shy of the weekend-best 19 in a game.

* With nine solo tackles, Greene is eighth nationally in that category.

FIRST TIMERS

* Half of Bowling Green's 22 starters at Ohio State earned the distinction for the first time in their careers. The five first-time starters on offense include running backs Josh Cleveland and Donovan Wilson, wide receivers Scott Miller and Deric Phouthavong and offensive lineman J.J. Beggan. On defense, six players started for the first time, including defensive linemen Shannon Smith and David Konowalski, linebacker Brandon Harris, and defensive backs Antonio Sotolongo, Marcus Milton and Jamari Bozeman.

* Josh Cleveland, a transfer from Navarro College, carried six times for 31 yards at Ohio State. He led the team with a 5.2 yards per carry average.

* Redshirt freshman James Morgan saw his first career action at quarterback in the fourth quarter at Ohio State. He completed nine of ten passes for 65 yards. Seven of those completions went to true freshman wide receiver Marquis Zimmerman, who led BGSU in receptions and totaled 43 yards.

* Three other wide receivers caught their first passes for BGSU in the game at Ohio State. Janarvis Pough caught one ball for 17 yards,

while Deric Phouthavong hauled in one for 11 yards. Vanel Dossous also had one reception, which went for six yards.

TURNING THEM OVER

* The Falcons are one of just two teams, along with Michigan State, to have a +10-or-better turnover ratio in each of the last three seasons.

* So far in 2016, the Falcons are -2 after turning Ohio State over once in the opener, a 63-yard interception return for a touchdown.

* In 2015, BGSU picked off 20 passes and generated 27 total turnovers for a margin of +12.

* In 2014, they were fourth in the country with 17 forced fumbles, tied for fifth with 33 takeaways, and finished with a +10 margin.

* In 2013, the Falcons created 21 turnovers (13 interceptions, eight fumbles) and owned a +10 turnover margin.

BRANDON "PICK SIX" HARRIS

* Sophomore defensive back Brandon Harris began the 2016 season as well as you possibly can. On Ohio State's fourth play from scrimmage, Harris picked off a J.T. Barrett pass and weaved 63 yards for the first score of the season and a 7-0 lead.

* It was the first BGSU pick-six since Dernard Turner pulled the trick on Nov. 4, 2014. Ohio State had not allowed once since Oct. 25, 2014.

* The interception was the second of Harris' career; the other occurred on Nov. 4, 2015 against Ohio.

FROM QB TO ALL-MAC LINEBACKER

* Recruited as a quarterback, Austin Valdez has become one of the most dominant linebackers in the Mid-American Conference.

* Valdez posted 10 tackles in the season opener (five solo) against Ohio State, adding a pass break-up.

* Just a sophomore in 2015, Valdez totaled 144 tackles, more than anyone else in the conference, and averaged 10.3 per game.

* As a first-team All-MAC linebacker, he tied for the team lead with 11 tackles for loss, including a sack. He also posted two interceptions and five pass break-ups.

* Valdez was a huge factor in BGSU's MAC title game win over Northern Illinois, as he recorded 13 tackles (1.5 for loss).

PILING UP THE YARDS

* BGSU's offense owns eye-popping numbers that are among the best in the Football Bowl Subdivision over the past two seasons.

* The Falcons' 546.8 yards per game in 2015 was fourth nationally.

* The team averaged 489.9 yards per game between the 2014 and 2015 seasons, 11th in the country.

* In total yards gained, BGSU was third in 2015 and fifth in the last two seasons combined.

TOUCHDOWNS ARE GOOD TOO

* Only one team scored more than BGSU's 82 touchdowns in 2015.

* The team's 591 points last season were third nationally, and they are tied for tenth in both touchdowns and points scored over the past two seasons.

* Clearly, Matt Johnson's BGSU-record 47 touchdown passes boosted that total, but the BGSU running game did its part, as it contributed 34 scoring runs. That mark was tied for 14th in the FBS.

GIANT KILLERS

* Bowling Green's 48-27 win at Maryland and 35-28 win at Purdue represented the only pair of true road wins by one Group of Five team over Power Five teams in 2015.

* BGSU was one of five Group of Five teams (Boise State, Houston, Memphis, Toledo) to win multiple games over Power Five teams in 2015. Of those teams, they averaged the second-most points (41.5). They were tops among the four teams in average for completions (39.5), attempts (57), passing yards (446.5), passing touchdowns (3.5), total plays (98.5), total yards

* The Falcons' 48-27 win at Maryland was arguably the most impressive Group of Five road win over a Power Five team in 2015. BGSU scored 42 second-half points, including 28 in the fourth quarter. The team amassed 691 yards and seven offensive touchdowns, and quarterback Matt Johnson threw for 491 yards and six touchdowns. The yardage and touchdown numbers were the most in any Group of Five win over a Power Five team all season.

* Bowling Green faced three Power Five opponents in 2015. The Falcons scored at least 30 points and cruised to at least 539 yards of offense in each game. In those contests, Matt Johnson passed for 1,325 yards, nine touchdowns and just two interceptions.

THE JINKS IMPACT

* New Bowling Green head coach Mike Jinks' previous job was running backs coach for Texas Tech. His tutelage created a monster in the Texas Tech backfield.

* After scoring just eight rushing touchdowns as a team in 2014, the Red Raiders scored 34 in 2015 – an improvement of 26, more than any other FBS school.

* That led to a 14.6 points-per-game improvement for Texas Tech, as they improved from 52nd to second nationally in that category.

* The team ran for 651 more yards in 2015,

TEXAS TECH WENT TO WASHINGTON

* The Mike Jinks-led improvement in the Texas Tech running game in 2015 was headed by Deandre Washington.

* Last season, Washington improved by 23 yards per game en route to a season total of 1,492 yards. He ran for 6.4 yards per carry and scored an impressive 14 touchdowns. He piled up 144.38 all-purpose yards per game and ranked second in the Big 12. He also ranked second in rushing yards and rushing touchdowns.

OVERSHADOWED, NOT UNDERVALUED

* Bowling Green senior running back Fred Coppet has quietly positioned himself to become one of the Falcons' most prolific career rushers.

* After seasons of 764 and 825 yards, he now has 1,841 in his career.

* Coppet would move into the top ten with 297 yards and needs only 724 to secure fifth place on BGSU's career rushing yards list.

BG IN HEAD COACH DEBUTS

* Mike Jinks is the 19th head coach in Bowling Green history. Beginning with Doyt Perry in 1955, the debut seasons of the last ten have been very successful.

2016 BGSU FOOTBALL

* The Falcons are 75-39-2 (.655) in the first season of their last ten head coaches, and that mark is even better for the last five (45-20).

* Jinks will make his home debut on Saturday. The last ten first-time BGSU coaches are 9-1 in their first home games. Looking ahead, they are also 8-1-1 in first MAC games and 7-2-1 in first Toledo games.

THE MORE THINGS CHANGE...

* While Bowling Green opens 2016 with its third head coach in four years, the Falcons will have new offensive and defensive coordinators for the fourth consecutive season.

* BGSU is the only school in the country that has had new offensive and defensive coordinators in each of the past four years.

* Including co-coordinators, BGSU has had seven offensive coordinators in the past four years.

YOUTH IS SERVED

* There's a lot of experience on the Bowling Green football team but youth still runs deep for the Falcons.

* BGSU has just 16 seniors, redshirt seniors or grad transfers, tied for 19th fewest in the country.

* Even better, the Falcons have only seven seniors, redshirt seniors or grad transfers on offense, tied for the 15th fewest nationally.

SUPER SUDER

* Kicker Jake Suder saw his first career action against Ohio State and was a perfect 2-for-2 on kicks.

* He drilled an extra point attempt to give BGSU a 7-0 lead in the first quarter, then punched through a 33-yard field goal in the second quarter.

* Suder was the only MAC kicker to post a perfect day on field goals, given at least one attempt.

ROAD WARRIORS

* Bowling Green went 6-0 in true road games a year ago and won a total of seven games (including the MAC Championship) away from Doyt Perry Stadium.

* BGSU was the only team in the country to win six road games in 2015.

* The Falcons' six road wins tied the 1985 team for the most in a season in school history. The seven wins outside of Bowling Green, Ohio are a program record.

SENIORS LOOKING FOR MORE

* Bowling Green's senior class is in position to go down in history as one of the best in school

history. With 28 wins over the past 3+ years, BGSU needs nine wins to tie the program record for victories in a four-year span.

* The 2015 senior class won 36 games, tied for second-most in school history. Only the 2004 class won more with 37 wins. The program also won 36 games from 1991-94.

* Considering many student-athletes redshirt, Bowling Green's trend over five years has potential to be even more impressive. The Falcons need just seven wins to tie the program record for victories over a five-year span.

* The 2005 senior class won a school record 43 games in five years, while the 1994, 1995 and 2015 seniors won 41. The 1963 and 1964 classes each won 40. This year's group has 36 wins (and counting) in their first four years.

RETURNING ALL-MAC PLAYERS

* Bowling Green returns five players who were recognized as all-conference a year ago.

* Linebacker Austin Valdez and punter Joseph Davidson were named to the first team, while offensive lineman Jacob Bennett and linebacker Trent Greene were on the second team. Wide receiver Ronnie Moore was named to the third team.

DAVIDSON ALSO AN ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICAN

* Joseph Davidson is one of the top punters in the country, but he has also been recognized as one of the brightest minds in college football.

* Davidson was named to the 2015 Academic All-America Division I football team as selected by the College Sports Information Director of America (CoSIDA).

* Of the 52 players named to the Academic All-America team, he was one of just seven to hold a grade point average of 3.95 or higher. He is a mathematics major.

MAC CHAMPS AGAIN

* BGSU won its 12th Mid-American Conference Championship in 2015, defeating Northern Illinois 34-14 at Ford Field.

* It was the fourth time that Bowling Green played in the MAC Championship and third consecutive year. BGSU is 2-2 all-time in MAC title games.

* BGSU has played four games at Ford Field in the past three years, three times in the MAC Championship Game and once in the 2013 Little Caesar's Pizza Bowl.

* Davidson's 44.1 yard per punt average in his career is currently the highest in school history. Chris Shale (1988-90) averaged 43.1 yards per punt to rank second.

THE BEASTS OF THE EAST

* Bowling Green went 5-0 against MAC East Division opponents a year ago and has now gone undefeated against divisional foes for three consecutive seasons.

* Since the start of the 2012 season, Bowling Green has a combined record of 21-1 against the MAC East.

* More impressively, BGSU has won 17 straight games against MAC East opponents dating back to a 2012 win over Buffalo in the regular season finale.

* With that success has come championships as the Falcons have won three straight MAC East titles.

MOORE RONNIE

* Ronnie Moore continued the 2016 season with a reception in his 31st straight game -- every contest since the 2013 MAC Championship Game.

* Moore had 72 catches for 951 yards a year ago, but there is potential for those numbers to look rather pedestrian by the end of the 2016 season.

* Of the Falcons top six in receptions a year ago, only Moore returns. Those five combined for 280 receptions.

* Moore already ranks 11th in program history with 2,233 career receiving yards. He needs just 35 more yards to climb into the top 10 all-time and 1,217 to catch Charles Sharon (2002-05) atop the all-time leaderboard with 3,450 receiving yards.

* Moore now has 161 career receptions and

resides in tenth place in BGSU history. With 29 more catches this year, he would move into fifth place all-time, and he needs just 72 for second place, behind only NCAA record-breaker Freddie Barnes.

* Moore also needs just seven touchdowns to move into BGSU's all-time top five.

* As a freshman in 2013, Moore's 19.5 yards per reception was the fourth-highest single-season average in program history.

WATCH LISTERS

* Redshirt junior Austin Valdez was named to the Bednarik Award Watch List, given to the college defensive player of the year, as well as the Butkus Award Watch List, given to the nation's best linebacker.

* Redshirt junior Tim McAuliffe was recognized on the Rimington Award Watch List, presented to the best center in college football.

* Redshirt junior Joseph Davidson was named to the Ray Guy Award Watch List, given to the nation's best punter.

* Senior Ronnie Moore was named to the Biletnikoff Award Watch List, presented to the outstanding receiver in college football.

FALCONS IN THE NFL

* National Football League teams have finalized their initial 53-man rosters for the 2016 season, and several Bowling Green football alumni will start the season on active lists.

* Center Kory Lichtensteiger will continue to play for the Washington Redskins in his ninth NFL season.

* Linebacker Gabe Martin will enter his second season with the Arizona Cardinals, as will cornerback Jude Adjei-Barimah with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers.

* Undrafted free agent wide receiver Roger Lewis will play his rookie campaign for the New York Giants.

* On Sept. 1, Lewis caught his first NFL touchdown in the Giants' final preseason game against New England. Later that night, Martin

intercepted Denver Broncos' rookie quarterback Paxton Lynch and returned it for a Cardinals' touchdown.

FUTURE SCHEDULES

* During the offseason, BGSU announced an agreement with Northwestern to play a game on Sept. 16, 2017. That announcement completed the program's 2017 non-conference slate.

* BGSU also announced a contest at Georgia Tech on Sept. 29, 2018. Three of the Falcons' non-conference games for that season have now been announced as BGSU will play at Oregon and will host Maryland.

* BGSU recently announced that the team will play a game at Tennessee on Sept. 4, 2021. The Falcons just played Tennessee a year ago, a 59-30 defeat to open the season.

On Dec. 9, 2015, BGSU announced that it had tabbed Texas Tech Associate Head Coach Mike Jinks to lead the defending Mid-American Conference Champion football program. Jinks, who also coached running backs for the Red Raiders, became the 19th head coach in program history.

Jinks, who came to BGSU after spending the 2015 season as Associate Head Coach, had coached the Red Raiders' running backs for the past three seasons. Prior to his time at Texas Tech, he was a National Coach of the Year finalist while winning the 2010 Texas State Championship and compiling a record of 43-4 in his final three seasons at San Antonio

powerhouse, Steele High School.

Known for their prolific offense, Texas Tech saw great success with Jinks in 2015. The Red Raiders owned the second-best offense in the country, totaling 7,134 yards in 12 games (594.5 yards per game). TTU also had the second-best passing offense. The Red Raiders averaged 46.6 points per game (second in FBS) and had 33 touchdown drives under two minutes. Texas Tech also ranked inside the top five nationally for third-down conversions (.519), first downs offense (346), and plays run (1,002).

Under Jinks, Texas Tech saw incredible success in the running game. In just his second season, Jinks tutored DeAndre Washington, who became the first Red Raiders' running back since Ricky Williams in 1998 to surpass 1,000 yards rushing in a single season. Washington finished the season with 1,103 rushing yards and was named second team All-Big 12.

In 2015, Washington turned into the Big 12 Conference's most prolific rusher under Jinks, totaling a league-best 1,455 yards on the ground and 14 touchdowns. Washington was second in the Big 12 in all-purpose yards (146.6 yards per game) behind only teammate Jakeem Grant (180.6 yards per game). The Texas Tech rushing attack averaged 204.8 yards per game and tallied 34 rushing touchdowns.

Jinks joined the Texas Tech program after a highly successful tenure at Steele High School in Cibolo, Texas – a suburb of San Antonio. Jinks was the first head coach at Steele when the school opened its doors in 2005, and it didn't take long for him to mold the program into a state powerhouse. While at Steele, Jinks compiled a 76-18 record overall, including an impressive 43-4 mark in his final three seasons. He led the Knights to the 2010 Class 5A Division II State Championship and to the state finals again in 2011.

His highly successful career at Steele led him to receiving the honor of coaching the West Team in the U.S. Army All-American Bowl in January 2013. He was also a finalist for the Xenith National High School Coach of the Year Award. While at Steele, Jinks coached former Texas Longhorn, and All-American running back, Malcolm Brown.

Prior to becoming the head coach in Cibolo, Jinks was the head coach at Burbank High School for a season. Prior to that, he had a highly successful career as a high school assistant coach and offensive coordinator at five different schools. Jinks' coaching career began in 1995 as the quarterbacks coach at Eillison High School. In 1998, Jinks then became the quarterbacks coach at his alma mater, Judson High School. Following that, he served as offensive coordinator at David Crockett High School, Galena Park High School and Robert E. Lee High School, all prior to his first head coaching position

Jinks is a graduate of Angelo State University where he earned his degree in kinesiology. He and his wife Meredith have three children – Jaden, Madison and Tristan.

WEEK ONE

COLUMBUS, Ohio – The Bowling Green State University football team took an early 7-0 lead but Ohio State rallied to defeat the Falcons 77-10 in front of 107,193 fans at Ohio Stadium to open the 2016 season.

BGSU received the opening kickoff and went three-and-out. After a Joe Davidson punt, Ohio State began their initial series on their own 42 yard line. Four plays later, the Falcons were on the board.

Facing 2nd-and-5 at the BGSU 41, J.T. Barrett rolled left and threw into the flat, where Brandon Harris was occupying space. Harris grabbed the ball out of the air at the 37 and weaved his way 63 yards for a touchdown. It was the first pick-six for Bowling Green since Dernard Turner on Nov. 4, 2014. OSU had not allowed a pick-six since October 2014.

Jake Suder came on for a successful extra point, the first point of his career, and the Falcons led 7-0 just 2:41 into the game.

By the time the first quarter ended, Ohio State led 21-7 and then added 14 points in the second quarter to take a 35-10 lead into halftime.

Starting quarterback James Knapke completed 12 balls for 110 yards before giving way to redshirt freshman James Morgan in the fourth quarter. Morgan completed nine of ten passes for 65 yards. Seven of those nine completions were to true freshman Marquis Zimmerman. Zimmerman led the Falcons with those seven catches in his first career game. Ronnie Moore led the team with 45 receiving yards.

In the backfield, Josh Cleveland's first six BGSU carries went for 31 yards, as he led the team with a 5.2 yards per carry average. Coppet's 28-yard jaunt led to a team-high 38 yards on 12 carries.
