Toledo (8-2, 5-1 MAC) **vs. Bowling Green** (2-8, 2-4 MAC)

Sophomore Diontae Johnson became just the seventh Rocket to gain at least 1,000 receiving yards in a season.

The Battle of I-75 will take place for the 82nd time when Toledo travels to Bowling Green on Wednesday, Nov. 15 (8:00 p.m./ESPNU).

The Rockets (8-2, 5-1 MAC) are coming off a 38-10 defeat at Ohio on Nov. 8. Despite the loss, Toledo is still in control of its own destiny in its bid for the MAC West Division title. Wins over BGSU and Western Michigan on Nov. 24 would send UT to the MAC Championship Game for the first time since 2004.

Toledo has had the upper hand lately in the Battle of I-75, but Bowling Green still leads the all-time series, 39-38-4. Toledo has won seven straight games in the series, its last defeat coming at BG in 2009, the first year that second-year UT head coach Jason Candle began his career as an assistant with the Rockets.

Senior quarterback Logan Woodside threw for 263 yards and one touchdown in the Ohio loss. He now has 85 career touchdown passes, tying

Bruce Gradkowski (2002-05) as Toledo's all-time leader.

Bowling Green (2-8, 2-4 MAC) is coming off a 38-28 defeat at Buffalo on Nov. 7. The Falcons have not won at home yet this season, with their two wins coming at Miami and at Kent State. They are led by true freshman quarterback Jarret Doege, who has started the last four games. He completed 28-of-43 passes for 294 yards and three touchdowns in BG's loss at Buffalo.

Rocket Roundup

- Toledo (8-2, 5-1 MAC) is tied with Northern Ilinois for first place in the MAC West Division. UT holds the tie-breaker over NIU thanks to its 27-17 victory over the Huskies.
- Toledo can clinch its first trip to the MAC Championship title game since 2004 with wins over Bowling Green and Western Michigan (Nov. 24).
- Toledo trails the all-time series with Bowling Green, 39-38-4, but could tie it with a victory on Wednesday. The Rockets have won seven straight in the series, but four of those wins were by a touchdown or less. UT won at home last year, 42-35.
- The winner of the Toledo-BG game earns the right to keep the Battle of I-75 Trophy. Toledo won the trophy in 2011, the first year it was established, and has never had to relinquish it since. Though the trophy was officially awarded to UT in 2011, it was not completed in time for the game, so the first time the Rockets hoisted it after a victory was in 2012.
- Toledo leads the MAC in total offense (497.6) and passing offense (294.0).
- Sophomore wide receiver Diontae Johnson's 144-yard performance at Ohio gives him 1,003 yards this year, making him just the seventh Rocket to gain over 1,000 receiving yards in a season. Johnson, who has caught 23 passes for 480 yards in his last three games, is third in the MAC with 55 receptions.
- Senior Logan Woodside is Toledo's career passing yardage leader with 9,591 passing yards for his career, one spot ahead of Bruce Gradkowski (9,225 from 2002-05). He needs one TD pass to break Gradkowski's career record of 85.

ROCKET UPDATE

- Toledo (8-2, 5-1 MAC) is coming off a 38-10 loss at Ohio on Nov. 8. The Rockets are tied with Northern Illinois for first place in the MAC West Division.
- Toledo is bowl eligible for the eighth straight season.
- Toledo is 49-13 in MAC games since 2010, including 19-3 against East Division opponents.
- Toledo leads the MAC in total offense (497.6) and passing offense (294.0).
- Logan Woodside leads the MAC in passing yards (291.9), passing efficiency (167.9) and total offense (296.4).
- Jameson Vest leads the MAC in field goals made (19) and is second in field-goal percentage (86.4).
- •Diontae Johnson has caught 23 passes for 480 yards in his last three games. His 144-yard performance at Ohio gives him 1,003 yards this year, making him just the seventh Rocket to gain over 1,000 receiving yards in a season. Johnson is third in the MAC with 55 receptions.
- Johnson ranks in the top 10 nationally in all-purpose yards (4th-165.9), TD receptions (5th-9) and receiving yards (9th-100.3/game).

ROCKETS ON TV

The Toledo-Bowling Green game will be televised on ESPNU and will be streamed live on ESPN3. The announcers are Kevin Negandhi and Rocky Boiman.

TOLEDO-BOWLING GREEN SERIES

This will be the 82nd meeting between Toledo and Bowling Green, whose campuses are separated by a 20-mile stretch of I-75.

The Rockets trail the series with the Falcons, 39-38-4, but could tie it with a victory on Wednesday. The Rockets have won seven straight in the series, but four of those wins were by a touchdown or less. UT won at home last year, 42-35.

The "Battle of I-75" began in 1919, was halted from 1936 through 1947, then resumed as an annual affair since 1948.

The series was traditionally played in October until 2000 when it was moved to the end of the season to accommodate an ESPN broadcast. The contest stayed in that late November slot throughout the decade until 2011 when it was moved back to an October date. In 2012, the game was played on Sept. 15 in the Glass Bowl, the earliest date ever for the rivalry, and in 2013 it was played on Oct. 26 in Bowling Green. In 2014 and 2015 in was played in November. Last year it was played on Oct. 15 in the Glass Bowl.

BATTLE OF I-75 TROPHY

For the sixth time in the history of the Toledo-Bowling Green rivalry, the winner of the game will hoist the Battle of I-75 Trophy. The trophy was officially awarded to UT in 2011 following its 28-21 win, but the trophy was not completed in time for the game.

From 1980-2010, the trophy that traded hands between Toledo and Bowling Green was referred to as "The Peace Pipe." Beginning in 2011, the

schools retired the trophy out of respect to Native American culture, and began using the Battle of I-75 Trophy, a two-piece bronze and granite sculpture that is so heavy it was created with a separate base.

MAC WEST DIVISION RACE IN THE HOME STRETCH

Despite the loss at Ohio on Nov. 8, the Rockets still control their own destiny for the right to represent the West Division at the MAC Championship Game on Dec. 2. In fact, Toledo is the only West team to be in charge of its own fate.

UT and and Northern Illiniois are tied for first place in the West with identical 5-1 records, but Toledo hold the tie-breaker over the Huskies thanks to its 27-17 win over NIU on Nov. 2.

Western Michigan and Central Michigan are still alive with 4-2 league records.

LOST FUMBLE STREAK ENDS

When sophomore Art Thompkins lost a fumble on a first-quarter reception at Ohio on Nov. 8, it ended a remarkable streak for Rocket running backs.

Until then, Rocket running backs had not lost a fumble since Sept. 2, 2016 (Terry Swanson in the first half of the Arkansas State game), a streak of 21 consecutive games without a lost fumble. Overall, UT backs have not lost a fumble in 40 out the last 42 games going back to the 2014 season.

WOODSIDE NAMED FINALIST FOR NCAA SENIOR CLASS AWARD

Toledo senior quarterback Logan Woodside was named one of 10 national finalists for the NCAA Senior CLASS Award on Nov. 8.

To be eligible for the award, a student-athlete must be classified as an NCAA Division I FBS senior and have notable achievements in four areas of excellence: community, classroom, character and competition. Woodside's teammate, Cody Thompson, was also a nominee for the award. Toledo was one of only two teams in the country to have two nominees for the award.

Woodside graduated last spring with a 3.42 GPA in marketing and is currently pursuing his master's degree in recreation administration.

An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

The finalists were chosen by a selection committee from the list of 30 candidates announced in October. Nationwide fan voting begins immediately to help select the winner, and fans are encouraged to vote on the Senior CLASS Award website through Dec. 4. Fan votes will be combined with media and Division I head coaches' votes to determine the winner. The Senior CLASS Award winner will be announced during the football bowl season in early January.

Toledo senior quarterback Logan Woodside has been named to the official 2017 watch lists for the Maxwell Award, the Davey O'Brien Award, the Manning Award and the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award.

The Maxwell Award, named in honor of Robert W. "Tiny" Maxwell, has been given to America's College Player of the Year since 1937. The Davey O'Brien Award honors the nation's top quarterback, as does the Manning Award.

Woodside is one of 10 national finalists for the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award. The award honors the top quarterback from all divisions for his accomplishments both on and off the field.

Woodside is also a nominee for the NCAA Senior CLASS Award, which honors the attributes of NCAA Division I senior student-athletes in four areas: community, classroom, character and competition.

Woodside shattered nearly every Toledo passing record in the books in 2016. He led the nation with 45 touchdown passes, 16 more than the previous best in Rocket history. He connected on 69.1 percent of his passes for 4,129 yards, an average of more than 317 yards per contest and another school record.

Cody Thompson has been nomi-

The Campbell Trophy, awarded by the National Football Foundation today, has recognized the best football scholar-athlete in the nation every year since 1990.

The Jason Witten Collegiate Man of the Year Award is presented annually to the Division I college football player who has demonstrated a record of leadership by exhibiting exceptional courage, integrity and sportsmanship both on and off the field.

The Wuerffel Trophy, known as "College Football's Premier Award for Community Service," is presented annually by the All Sports Association in Fort Walton Beach, Fla. The award is named after Danny Wuerffel, the 1996 Heisman Trophy winning quarterback from the University of Florida. It is awarded to the Football Bowl Subdivision player who best combines exemplary community service with athletic and academic achievement.

Thompson was a first-team All-MAC selection in 2016 who also earned Academic All-MAC honors. He is a marketing major with a 3.664 grade point average. He has volunteered for numerous community ac-

tivities and organizations, including the Toledo Boys and Girls Club, Ronald McDonald House, Cherry Street Mission, RockeThon for Mercy Children's Hospital, Kids Day at the Glass City Marathon, Rocket Foot-ball Victory Day, the Toledo Crash wheelchair football team, and many others.

SWANSON NAMED TO DOAK WALK-ER AWARD WATCH LIST

Senior running back Terry Swanson was named to the official watch list for the 2017 Doak Walker Award, which annually honors the nation's top running back.

NKANSAH NAMED TO OUTLAND TROPHY WATCH LIST

Senior offensive lineman Elijah Nkansah has been named to the official watch list for the Outland Trophy. The Outland Trophy is given annually to the nation's top interior lineman.

JACK LINCH NOMINATED FOR BURLSWORTH TROPHY FOR THIRD TIME

Senior linebacker Jack Linch is a nominee for the Burlsworth Trophy, which honors the nation's best player who began his career as a a walk-on. This is the third consecutive season that Linch has been nominated for the award. Linch was awarded a full scholarship this past spring.

13 GRADUATES ON 2017 ROSTER

The University of Toledo ranks fifth in the nation with 13 football players on its roster who have already received their bachelor's degrees, according to information released by the National Football Foundation.

Of the 13 Rockets with bachelor's degrees, nine are pursuing master's degrees, two are working toward a second bachelor's degree and two are undecided or waiting on their acceptance into a master's program.

ROCKETS PICKED TO WIN 2017 MAC CHAMPIONSHIP BY MEDIA AND COACHES

Toledo was picked to finish in first place in the Mid-American Conference's West Division in voting by members of the league's media contingent. Toledo also picked up 21 out of 24 votes to win the MAC Championship Game.

The Rockets received 22 first-place votes and a total of 142 points in the annual poll, 35 points ahead of second-place Western Michigan in the West Division. Ohio (31 points) was picked to repeat as MAC East Division champion, followed by Miami (129).

The league's coaches also picked the Rockets to win the MAC in a separate poll.

NEW FACES ON THE STAFF

Mike Bellamy and Hank Poteat have joined the Toledo coaching staff in 2017.

Bellamy, who will coach the wide receivers, comes to Toledo after spending last season at Mississippi State and the previous four campaigns at Illinois. Poteat was the cornerbacks coach at Kent State the past two seasons and will handle the same position for the Rockets.

Gradkowski, who wore the Midnight Blue and Gold for the Rockets from 2001-05, played 11 seasons in the NFL for Tampa Bay, Cleveland, Oakland, Cincinnati and Pittsburgh. He led the Rockets to the 2004 MAC Championship and two bowl appearances.

Also new to the Rocket Football Radio Network this year will be Mike Robinson, who will handle sideline coverage. Robinson is a former head coach at Bowsher High School in Toledo, and also served as an assistant coach at Central Catholic High School in Toledo when the Fighting Irish won two state championships.

Gradkowski and Robinson will be joining play-by-play announcer Brent Balbinot, who is in his second season as the voice of the Rockets.



Jason Candle has played a major part of the success of the University of Toledo football program since 2009, first as an assistant coach and then as head coach. Candle assumed the Rockets' head coaching role in December of 2015 following seven successful seasons as an assistant. He has since embarked on a quest to take an already outstanding program to even greater heights.

In his first full season as Toledo's leader in 2016, Candle led the Rockets to a 9-4 season and a berth in the Raycom Media Camellia Bowl. He and his staff followed that up with a 2017 recruiting class that was ranked No. 1 in the Mid-American Conference by every major recruiting service.

Prior to assuming the Rockets' helm, Candle had been serving as the program's associate head coach/offensive coordinator. But his status suddenly changed when on Dec. 2, 2015, UT Athletic Director Mike O'Brien chose him to become the 27th head football coach in the storied history of Toledo football.

Following his introductory news conference, Candle had less than three weeks to put together a coaching staff and prepare his team for the Marmot Boca Raton Bowl. Twenty days later, Candle and his team celebrated a 32-17 victory over No. 24 Temple in the rain of south Florida. The triumph capped a 10-2 season for the Rockets and gave Candle a head coaching debut to remember.

First Months on the Job

Candle's first two months on the job were a whirl-wind of activity. First, he had to prepare his team for a battle with a very strong Temple team in the Marmot Boca Raton Bowl. Despite being short-staffed, the Rockets were ready for the No. 24 Owls, holding them to just three points and 67 yards of offense in the first half. Toledo dominated the fourth quarter, too, outscoring Temple, 20-8, in the final 15 minutes to come away with a 32-17 victory.

Next on Candle's agenda was completing his coaching staff and signing the next generation of Rockets. Candle added eight assistants to the staff, as well as a strength and conditioning coach, a director of high school relations and a director of football operations. The newcomers helped Candle put the finishing touches on a recruiting class that was ranked second in the MAC by ESPN.com.

Firing Up the Rockets in 2016

Candle's first full season as head coach of the Rockets was filled with memorable highlights. Toledo won nine games and earned a berth into the Raycom Media Camellia Bowl, its sixth bowl berth in the previous seven years.

The 2016 Rockets featured one of the top offenses in the country, ranking in the top 10 in five offensive categories, including passing efficiency (second), third-down conversions (fifth), total offense (seventh) and passing offense (10th). Toledo set the school record with an average of 517.8 yards per game.

The Rockets' 2016 roster housed a record nine players who were on the official watch lists for national awards. Twelve Rockets made All-MAC, including a league-high seven first-team selections. Junior quarterback Logan Woodside led the nation with 45 touchdown passes and was named a contender for the Heisman Trophy by the Heisman Trophy Trust. Senior tight end Michael Roberts led the nation's tight ends with 16 TD catches and was named first-team All-America by the Football Writers Association of America. Senior running back Kareem Hunt finished his career as UT's all-time leading rusher with 4,945 vards. Roberts and Hunt were chosen to play in the 2017 Senior Bowl, while offensive lineman Storm Norton and defensive tackle Treyvon Hester joined Roberts as selections for the East-West Shrine Game.

Last May, a record eight Rocket seniors were either selected in the 2017 NFL Draft, signed as free agents or invited to mini-camps. Three Rockets—Kareem Hunt, Michael Roberts and Treyvon Hester—were drafted, the most since the NFL went to its current sevenround format in 1994. Hunt, a running back, was a third-round pick of the Kansas City Chiefs. Roberts (tight end) was taken in the fourth round by Detroit while Hester (defensive tackle) was chosen by the Oakland Raiders in the seventh round.



Candle has coached 15 players who have played in the NFL. Three Rockets were selected in the 2017 NFL Draft.

Guiding the Rocket Offense as an Assistant

Under Candle's guidance as offensive coordinator, the Toledo offense was prolific. His final season as the OC in 2015 was no exception. The Rockets were 10-2 that year, and ranked third in the Mid-American Conference in scoring offense (35.0) and total offense (460.9 yards

per game). Four Rockets earned All-MAC honors on offense, including first-team honoree Storm Norton (OL). Junior running back Kareem Hunt came back from injuries to lead the MAC in rushing with 108.1

yards per game. Toledo led the MAC in rushing, averaging nearly 208 yards per contest, and ranked No. 2 in the nation in fewest sacks allowed (five).

In 2014, UT led the MAC in just about every major offensive category, including scoring offense (36.6), total offense (490.5) and rushing offense (256.4). The 2014 season culminated with a nine-touchdown outburst in a 63-44 victory over Arkansas State in the GoDaddy Bowl for the 9-4 Rockets.

Six Rockets earned All-MAC recognition on offense in 2014, with senior center Greg Mancz snagging secondteam All-America honors and the Vern Smith Leadership Award, given

annually to the top player in the MAC. Sophomore running back Kareem Hunt ranked 10th in the nation in rushing (1,631 yards) and second in yards per carry (7.96). Candle also skillfully guided the Rocket quarterbacks through a challenging season in which the top three signal-callers were all injured at the same time.

In 2013, the Rockets averaged 33.0 points and 447.3 yards of total offense per game. Toledo's running game was especially effective, ranking second in the Mid-American Conference with 240.6 yards per contest. In addition, seven players on the offensive side of the ball earned All-MAC honors, including two-time first-team running back David Fluellen.

In his debut as offensive coordinator in 2012, Candle helped guide the third-ranked offense in the MAC, as UT averaged 445.2 yards per game. The Rockets had five offensive players make the All-MAC team, propelling them to a 9-4 mark and a trip to the Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.

Making his Mark as Receivers Coach

As the receivers coach from 2009-11, Candle mentored one of the most decorated receivers in Rocket history, Eric Page. Page caught 306 passes in

his career, the most ever by a Division I-BCS receiver in three seasons. A three-time All-MAC player, Page broke virtually every UT receiving record and tied the MAC record for career receptions.

In 2011, the Rockets went 9-4 and won their first bowl game in six years, a 42-41 victory over Air Force in the Military Bowl. Sophomore wide receiver Bernard Reedy caught three touchdown passes and was named the game's MVP. Page caught a school-record 125 passes for the season and earned first-team All-MAC honors.

In 2010, the Rockets went 8-5 and made their first bowl appearance in five seasons. Page caught 99 passes and was a first-team All-MAC honoree at wide receiver, earning All-America honors as a kickoff returner, as well. In 2009, Candle coached the slot receivers and tight ends. He helped guide Page to an outstanding freshman season. Page led the nation in receptions (82) and yardage (1,159) by a freshman and was named first-team Freshman All-America by Phil Steele Magazine and the College Football News.

Academics

The tradition of academic excellence in the Toledo Football program will always be a top priority with

Candle. The Rockets have led the Mid-American Conference in the NCAA's Academic Progress Rate (APR) in each of the past four years, with an alltime high mark of 981 out of 1000 this past season.

APR measures the progress toward earning a degree for student-athletes. Toledo's high APR numbers translate into diplomas. Of the eight players who were in an NFL training camp in 2017, all eight earned their degrees. Thirteen players on the 2017 roster already have earned their bachelor's degrees, the third-highest number in the NCAA-FBS.



Six of Candle's 13 seasons as an assistant football coach were as a coordinator. He was just 27 years old when he was named offensive coordinator at Mount Union.

Coaching Origins at Mount Union

Candle joined the Rockets' staff in 2009 after spending both his playing and coaching career under head coach Larry Kehres at Mount Union. In Candle's six years as an assistant at Mount Union, the Purple Raiders went 83-4 and won NCAA Division III national championships in 2005, 2006 and 2008. The 2003 and 2007 teams lost in the national championship game.

A 2003 Mount Union graduate, Candle was an All-Ohio Athletic Conference first-team selection in 2001 as he led the team in receptions (41), yards receiving (778) and touchdowns (9). He was a key member of the 2000 and 2001 national championship teams and

finished his career with 57 grabs for 1,037 yards and 11 scores.

Candle, a native of Salem, Ohio, began his coaching career at Mount Union in 2003 as the receivers coach. In the 2004 and 2005 seasons, he worked with Campbell, who was the Purple Raiders' offensive coordinator at the time. Candle took over the post of offensive coordinator in 2007, and also assumed the duties as the program's recruiting coordinator.

In Candle's two seasons as offensive coordinator, the Purple Raiders went 29-1, winning the national championship in 2008 and finishing as runners-up in 2007. Mount Union offensive players earned nine All-American honors in Candle's two seasons running the offense. QB Greg Micheli was honored in 2008 with the Gagliardi Trophy, given annually to the best NCAA Division III player in the nation. Candle also helped guide two Purple Raider receivers to All-American status during his time as the receivers coach from 2003-08. One of those All-American receivers, Pierre Garcon, is a starting wide receiver for the Washington Redskins. The other was Cecil Shorts, a fourth-round draft pick of the Jacksonville Jaguars in 2011.

Candle and his wife Nicole have a daughter, Avery, who was born in May of 2017.

Recruiting

Toledo's 2017 stellar recruiting class was selected as the No. 1 class in the Mid-American Conference by every major recruiting service. That's nothing new for Candle, who has a long history of recruiting excellence.

Candle's first recruiting class in 2016 was rated No. 2 in the MAC by ESPN.com despite the fact that he assumed the head coaching job just two months before Signing Day. Even more impressive is the fact that all but two of Candle's assistant coaches were new to the program during the critical final two months of the recruiting season.

As an assistant coach, Candle was regularly mentioned among the nation's top recruiters. In 2010, he was named one of the top recruiters in the nation by Rivals.com. He was one of only nine coaches in the country from non-automatic BCS qualifying conferences to be named to the list and the only coach from the MAC. Candle also was named the Mid-American Conference "Recruiter of the Year" by Scout.com in both 2011 and 2012. Toledo's 2011 recruiting class was ranked No. 1 in the MAC by both Scout and Rivals. In 2014, Candle was named one of only two MAC assistants to be named among the top recruiters in the "Group of Five" conferences by Rivals.

GAME 1 - TOLEDO 47, ELON 13

Toledo, Ohio - Senior quarterback Logan Woodside threw for 314 yards and junior placekicker Jameson Vest kicked a career-best four field goals to lead Toledo to a 47-13 victory over Elon in the season opener for both teams at the Glass Bowl.

While Toledo's offense racked up 553 yards of total offense, it was the Rockets' defense that dominated much of the action, limiting the Phoenix to just 175 yards of total offense. Elon gained just 65 yards in the first half and failed to complete a pass in five attempts. In fact, the Phoenix did not complete their first pass until the 11:06 mark of the third quarter and finished the night completing 3-of-14 passes for 47 yards.

Woodside's main targets were senior Cody Thompson and sophomore Diontae Johnson. Thompson caught five passes for 112 yards. Johnson, who missed all of last year with an injury, caught four passes for 102 yards. He also returned a kickoff for a touchdown.

The rushing attack was led by senior Terry Swanson, who rushed for a pair of touchdowns. Redshirt freshman Shakif Seymour (102 yards, one TD) and sophomore Art Thompkins (99 yards).

Toledo used four field goals by Vest to build a 19-7 halftime lead. After forcing a punt on Elon's opening drive, Toledo drove 40 yards in eight plays before settling for a 28-yard field goal. Following a three-and-out by the Phoenix, Woodside went to the air, hitting Diontae Johnson over the middle that went 69 yards down to the Elon one-yard line. Swanson took it in from there on the next play to make the score 10-0 with 8:39 to play.

After Toledo's defense stopped Elon on downs, Vest made it 13-0 with a 27-yard field goal with 3:57 to play in the opening quarter. Vest struck again early in the second quarter, connecting on a 32-yarder to make it 16-0 with 12:23 left in the half.

Elon finally got on the board after recovering a fumbled punt on the UT 37-yard line. Six plays later, Brelynd Cyphers rambled in from nine yards out to cut the lead to 16-7 with 4:33 to play. Vest made it 19-7 with his career-best fourth field goal, this one from 21 yards out with less than a minute to play in the half.

Toledo struck quickly in the second half as Diontae Johnson returned the opening kickoff 99 yards to make the score 26-7. The lead grew to 40-7 on a pair of third-quarter TD runs by Swanson and sophomore Reggie Gilliam, who scored on the very first rushing attempt of his career. Elon trimmed the lead to 40-13, on a one-yard run by Malcolm Summers with 9:47 remaining. Seymour scored the game's final touchdown with 49 seconds left.

GAME 2 - TOLEDO 37, NEVADA 24

Reno, Nev. – Senior quarterback Logan Woodside threw for 232 yards and two touchdowns, while senior wide receiver Cody Thompson caught a career-high eight passes for 101 yards to lead Toledo to a 37-24 victory over Nevada in Reno. Senior running back Terry Swanson ran for 101 yards added two touchdowns to the cause.

Toledo (2-0) outgained the Wolfpack (0-2) in total yards, 426-386, and never trailed in the contest. The Rockets, who led by as many as 17 points in both halves, also forced two key turnovers in the second half.

Toledo got on the board on its first possession, taking a 3-0 lead on a 25-yard field goal by Jameson Vest. Moments later, Nevada tied the score on a 47-yarder by Spencer Pettit. Following a short punt out of bounds by the Wolf Pack, Toledo drove 50 yards in eight plays, culminated by a 12-yard TD catch by Diontae Johnson from Woodside to make the score 10-3 with 3:21 to play in the opening quarter.

Toledo missed a chance to extend the lead on the first play of the second quarter when fullback Reggie Gilliam was stopped on fourth-and-one at the goal line. However, the Rocket defense forced a punt, giving Toledo the ball back on the UN 34-yard line. Five plays later, Terry Swanson ran it in from three yards out to extend the UT lead to 17-3 with 10:59 to play in the half. Vest knocked home his second field goal of the half with 5:17 to play to give UT a comfortable 20-3 lead.

Nevada scored its first touchdown of the game with 52 seconds left in the first half, a 19-yard pass from Ty Gangi to Daiyan Henley to cut the UT lead to 20-10.

The Rockets gobbled up over six minutes of the clock to start the second half, a 13-play, 75-yard drive that was finished off by Swanson from one yard out to make the score 27-10. Nevada answered the call with a six-play, 75-yard drive that took just 1:30. Gangi ran it in from one-yard out to trim the lead to 27-17.

Toledo made it 34-17 on an eight-yard pass from Woodside to Cody Thompson with 3:45 left in the third quarter. But once again, Nevada answered, this time on a 75-yard bomb from Gangi to McLane Mannix on the very next play from scrimmage.

The Rockets missed a chance to grow the lead when Vest's 31-yard field goal went wide left. But Toledo avoided damage on Nevada's ensuing possession when Tuzar Skipper forced a fumble on a pass attempt by Gangi that was recovered by Nate Childress. Toledo wasn't able to convert on the turnover, but the Rocket defense forced another turnover on Nevada's next possession. Junior defensive end Olasunkanmi Adeniyi hit Gangi's arm on a pass attempt that was picked off by senior linebacker Ja'Wuan Woodley on the UN 36-yard line. Toledo settled for a field goal that made the score, 37-24 with 4:31 to play.

On the ensuing drive, the Wolf Pack marched all the way down to the Toledo 18-yard line, trying to make it a one-score game. But the Rockets' defense held, and on fourth-and-two, Gangi's pass attempt fell incomplete, sealing the victory and a 2-0 start to the season for Toledo

GAME 3 - TOLEDO 54, TULSA 51

Toledo, Ohio – On a night in which the University of Toledo honored some of the greatest players in its 100-year history, the Rockets and senior quarterback Logan Woodside came through with a performance worthy of the ages.

Woodside threw for 458 yards and a school-record tying six touchdowns as the Rockets rallied from a 21-point deficit to defeat Tulsa, 54-51, before 24,239 joyous fans at the Glass Bowl Saturday night. The third-biggest comeback in the 100-year history of the program was not completed until junior placekicker Jameson Vest booted a 33-yard field goal with no time on the clock.

The Rockets (3-0) trailed 28-7 in the first half, fought their way back into the game in the third quarter, then outlasted the Golden Hurricane (1-2) down the stretch. After Tulsa knotted the score at 51-51 with 2:47 to play, Woodside drove the Rockets 59 yards in eight plays, setting up Vest's heroics. Tulsa called a pair of timeouts to ice UT's kicker, but Vest calmly split the uprights, igniting a wild celebration on the field and in the stands.

Senior wide receiver Cody Thompson set career highs in both receptions (9) and receiving yards (178). He also caught three of Woodside's six TD throws, including a miraculous one-armed grab in the third quarter that gave Toledo its first lead of the game, 34-31. Toledo's total of 679 yards of total offense ranks fourth all-time. The two teams combined for 105 points and 1227 yards.

Tulsa opened the scoring with an 18-play drive that soaked up 5:26 on the clock. Chad President finished of the drive with an eight-yard TD run. Toledo struck back on the very next play, tying the score on a 60-yard completion from Woodside to Danzel McKinley-Lewis. Tulsa answered, this time scoring quickly on 63-yard bolt from Sharmari Brooks to make the score, 14-7.

Tulsa's defense put the next score on the board when linebacker Craig Suits stepped in front of a Woodside pass and took it 37 yards the other way to make it 21-7. The Golden Hurricane extended the lead to three touchdowns when Brooks scored again, this time from eight yards out to cap a five-play, 58-yard drive. The Rockets gained some momentum going into the locker room when Woodside connected with Cody Thompson on a 26-yard TD strike with just 28 seconds left.

Toledo took the ball to start the second half and quickly cut the lead to 28-21 on a 49-yard TD sprint by Swanson. Tulsa followed with a nice drive that stalled on the eight-yard line, forcing the Hurricane to settle for field goal. Ten seconds later, Woodside and Thompson hooked up again, this time on an 81-yard bomb to cut the lead to 31-28 with 8:55 to play in the third quarter.

The Rockets took their first lead of the game on an acrobatic one-armed touchdown catch by Thompson, his third scoring grab of the night. Woodside led Thompson into the corner of the end zone from 15 yards out, and Thompson leaped and pulled it in with one arm. The extra point attempt with mishandled, giving UT a 34-31 lead.

Tulsa came back with a seven-play, 75-yard drive that was capped off by a one-yard plunge by D'Angelo Brewer. After Nate Childress blocked the extra point, Josh Teachey grabbed the deflected ball in the end zone and weaved his way more than 100 yards the other way for two points, making the score 37-36 in favor of Tulsa.

The fourth quarter opened with a UT punt, followed by another touchdown for the Golden Hurricane. President broke through the right side for a 39-yard score, extending the Tulsa lead to 44-36 with 12:07 left to play.

Woodside hit Diontae Johnson with a 49-yard strike down the sideline, then followed with a connection to Jordan Fisher for the two-point conversion to tie the score 44-44. Following a rare three-and-out by Tulsa, Woodside hit Johnson again, this time on a 74-yard bomb to give Toledo a 51-44 lead with eight minutes left. The Golden Hurricane tied it up on a 14-play drive that culminated with a one-yard TD by Brooks, setting up Toledo's final game-winning drive.

GAME 4 - NO. 14 MIAMI (FLA.) 52, TOLEDO 30

Miami Gardens, Fla. – Senior quarterback Logan Woodside threw for 342 yards but it wasn't enough for the Toledo Rockets in their upset bid over No. 14 Miami at Hard Rock Stadium in Miami Gardens. Toledo (3-1) led at the half, 16-10, but the Hurricanes (2-0) controlled the final 30 minutes on their way to a 52-30 victory.

Woodside completed at least five passes to four different receivers, led by sophomore Diontae Johnson, who had a career-high eight receptions and 66 yards, and senior Cody Thompson, who pulled in five catches for 114 yards. Johnson also tied his career-high with a pair of touchdown receptions. Senior Terry Swanson led the rushing attack with 79 yards. Toledo outgained Miami in total yards at the half, 296-190, but the Hurricanes outdistanced UT in the second half, 397-133. Junior quarterback Malik Rozier threw for 333 yards and three TDs while running for another to lead Miami. Junior Mark Walton added 204 yards rushing and one touchdown.

Miami jumped out to a 10-0 lead in the first quarter, scoring on its first possession on a 44-yard TD run by Walton. After a three-and-out by Toledo, Walton struck again, bolting 82 yards to the UT three-yard line. However, the Rocket defense stopped three running attempts by the Hurricanes, forcing them to settle for a 19-yard field goal.

Toledo dominated the rest of the half, outscoring Miami 16-0 in the second quarter. The Rockets got on the board early in the second quarter on a 24-yard field by junior Jameson Vest. The score was set up by a 38-yard completion from Woodside to Thompson that went to the UM two-yard line. Vest cut the lead to 10-6 by connecting a 49-yard field goal, tying his career long, with 7:48 to play in the half.

The Rockets took the lead, 13-10, on their first touchdown of the game, a 37-yard completion from Woodside to Jon'Vea Johnson with 3:30 left in the half. Toledo stopped Miami on its next possession, then drove down to the Miami 20-yard line with three seconds left. Vest's field goal attempt was wide left but Miami was flagged for off-sides, giving the Georgia native another change. This time he converted from 32 yards out, boosting UT to 16-10 halftime edge.

Miami regained the lead, 17-16, on an eight play, 91-yard drive on its second possession of the second half. Travis Homer finished the drive with a 12-yard run into the end zone. Following a UT punt, Miami scored again, this time on a 10-yard TD pass from Malik Rozier to Dayall Harris. The score was set up by a 55-yard reception by Braxton Berrios that went down to the UT 14-yard line.

Miami got the ball right back on a Woodside fumble late in the third quarter that was recovered by the Hurricanes on the UT 21-yard line. Two plays later, Rozier hit Berrios for a 19-yard score to extend the UM lead to 31-16 with 14:53 left in the fourth quarter. Moments later, Rozier hit Christopher Herndon on a two-yard scoring pass to up the margin to 38-16.

The Rockets did not give up, however, as Woodside then drove the offense 77 yards in six plays, connecting with Diontae Johnson on a six-yard scoring strike with 9:21 left. A two-point conversion pass from Woodside to Art Thompkins came up just short, making the score 38-22 in favor of Miami. Moments later, sophomore safety Jordan Williams picked off a Rozier pass and returned it to the eight-yard line. On the next play, Woodside hit Diontae Johnson for touchdown along the right side of the end zone. Woodside hit Johnson again for the two-point conversion to make it a one-score game, 38-30, with 7:37 left.

But the Hurricanes answered, driving 75 yards in five plays, capped by a 23-yard TD run by Rozier, to make the score 45-30. Miami would find the end zone one more time before the clock hit zeroes with a 15-yard run by Homer, bringing the final score to 52-30.

ROCKET ROUNDUP:

Senior wide receiver Cody Thompson has now caught a pass in 29 consecutive games. He racked up 114 yards, giving him his 14th-career 100-yard receiving game. Thompson passed Steve Odom (2003-06, 2,631 yards) on Toledo's all-time career receiving yards list. He now has 2,633 receiving yards...Senior quarterback Logan Woodside threw for 342 yards, the 13th 300 yard passing game of his career. He attempted a career-high 48 passes, the third time in his career he's thrown at least 40 passes in a game. His previous career high was 46 (Oct. 27, 2016 vs. Ohio)...Jameson Vest was threefor-three on field goal attempts and for the third time this season he made at least three field goals in a game...Vest nailed a 49-yard field goal in the second quarter, tying his career long (Nov. 16, 2016 vs. Ball State)...Sophomore wide receiver Diontae Johnson hauled in eight receptions, setting a new career high for the second game in a row. He also tied his career-best with two touchdown receptions...Also setting a new career-best total for receptions was sophomore Danzel McKinley-Lewis, who had five catches... The successful two-point conversion attempt in the fourth quarter was the first of the season for the Rockets and their first since Oct. 15, 2016 against Bowling Green.

GAME 5 - EMU 15, TOLEDO 20

Toledo, Ohio – Senior quarterback Logan Woodside threw for 289 yards and sophomore safety Kahlil Robinson intercepted two passes to lead Toledo to a hard-fought 20-15 victory over Eastern Michigan in UT's Homecoming game at the Glass Bowl.

Robinson, starting in his first game as a collegian, picked off his second pass at the UT 31-yard line with 55 seconds left in the game to snuff out a last-minute Eagle rally and clinch the Rocket victory.

Woodside completed 23-of-34 passes on the day. His top target was sophomore Diontae Johnson, who caught eight passes for 97 yards. Sophomore Art Thompkins, starting in place of the injured Terry Swanson, led the rushing attack with 94 yards on 15 carries. The Rockets out-gained Eastern Michigan, 419-326, holding the Eagles to just 73 yards rushing on 23 attempts

Toledo's leading receiver, senior Cody Thompson, was injured early in the game and never returned. Head coach Jason Candle said after the game that Thompson suffered a leg injury and likely is lost for the season.

Toledo (4-1, 1-0 MAC) got on the board first on its first possession on a 27-yard field goal by Jameson Vest. But it was a costly drive, as Thompson was injured following a 32-yard pass completion. Both teams missed field goals on the next two drives, EMU from 50 yards and the Rockets from 21 yards out on a fumbled snap.

Eastern Michigan (2-3, 0-2 MAC) took the lead on the next to final play of the first quarter on an 11-yard pass from Brogan Roback to Johnnie Niupalau. The score capped a seven-play, 80-yard drive. The extra point was no good, giving the Eagles a 6-3 edge.

Toledo had a chance to tie the score midway through the second quarter, but Vest's 35-yard attempt sailed wide left. The Rockets broke through on their next possession, however. Woodside drove the offense 52 yards in eight plays, capped by a one-yard touchdown run by redshirt freshman Shakif Seymour on fourth down that gave UT a 10-6 edge going into the locker room.

Toledo extended the lead to 17-6 midway through the third quarter on an 18-yard touchdown run by sophomore Art Thompkins. The score came after UT failed to punch the ball into the end zone on fourth-and-goal from the one-yard line. A short punt and a penalty by EMU that gave UT the ball on Eastern's 18-yard line, and Thompkins scored on the next play.

The Eagles trimmed the lead to 17-9 on a 46-yard field goal by Paulie Fricano with 6:08 left in the third quarter. Later in the fourth quarter, EMU struck again when Roback hit Antoine Porter for a 12-yard TD. It appeared that the Eagles tied the contest with a two-point conversion but a video review revealed that Porter's foot was out of bounds on his catch in the back of the end zone.

Vest's second field goal of the day, a 20-yarder, moved Toledo's lead to 20-15 with 2:58 to play. In EMU's final drive, Roback completed a pass on fourth-and-nine for a first down to the UT 37-yard line with a little more than one minute left in the game. A holding call moved the ball back to the 47-yard line, then Robinson finished off the victory with his interception.

ROCKET ROUNDUP:

Toledo has now won 11 straight games against Eastern Michigan and 17 of the last 18 meetings. UT is now 61-27 in Homecoming games and 5-1 when it plays EMU on this day... Woodside finished with 289 passing yards, becoming the third player in school history to eclipse 8,000 career passing yards...Woodside moved into second place all-time in Toledo history in career passing yards, passing Terrance Owens (8,203 yards, 2010-13). He now has 8,267 passing yards in his career... Thompson caught one pass for 32 yards, his 30th consecutive game with a reception. He left the game in the first quarter after suffering what is likely a season-ending leg injury according to Head Coach Jason Candle in the post-game press conference... On back-to-back plays in the second quarter sophomore Rhett Blackman made his first career reception and freshman running back Nevone Mc-Crimmon had his first career carry... Diontae Johnson caught at least four passes for the fifth straight game. He finished the game with a career-high tying eight receptions and 97 yards. Woodside completed a pass of at least 20 yards to four different receivers for this first time this season: Thompson (32 yards), Diontae Johnson (31 yards), Jon'Vea Johnson (23 yards), and McKinley-Lewis (22 yards)...Robinson had two interceptions in his first collegiate start, including one in the final minute to clinch the victory. It was Robinson's first-career multi-interception game. The last time a Rocket picked off two passes in a game was Cheatham Norrils at Bowling Green on Nov. 17, 2015...Junior defensive lineman Reggie Howard recorded his first two tackles for loss of his career...Seymour ran the ball a career-high 17 times, topping his previous career-high of 14 (Sept. 9)...Thompkins tied his career high with 15 carries and scored his first touchdown of the season.

GAME 6 - CMU 10, TOLEDO 30

Mount Pleasant, Mich. – Senior running back Terry Swanson rushed for a season-high 145 yards and two touchdowns as Toledo dominated Central Michigan, 30-10, on a rainy afternoon in Mount Pleasant.

A driving rain limited the passing games for both teams, forcing both teams to lean on the running game. Toledo was able to sustain a consistent attack on the ground despite missing three starters on the offensive line, while the Rocket defense bottled up the CMU runners and forced Chippewa quarterback Shane Morris into a sub-par performance. Central was held to just 244 yards of total offense, including just 49 yards and two first downs in the first half. Morris was 17-of-37 for 182 yards and two interceptions. CMU gained just 62 yards in 21 attempts on the ground, an average of 2.9 yards per carry.

Toledo (5-1, 2-0 MAC) gained 399 yards of total offense. Senior quarterback Logan Woodside managed the game well, completing 10-of-18 passes for 89 yards, as UT leaned on the running game more than at any time this season. Redshirt freshman Shakif Seymour added a career-best 119 rushing yards, all in the fourth quarter.

The game started with a light rain but by the middle of the first quarter the conditions worsened, with a hard rain and gusty winds making it challenging for the offenses.

Toledo got on the board first on a 48-yard touchdown run by Swanson on a fourth-and-one call midway through the first quarter. The teams then exchanged empty possessions until Jameson Vest connected o na 41-yard field goal to give Toledo a 10-0 lead with 8:49 to play in the half.

Swanson came through again on fourth down late in the first half, scoring from 22 yards out on fourth-and-two to make it 17-0 with 1:19 left before intermission.

Central Michigan (3-4, 1-2 MAC) got on the board with a 23-yard field goal by Michael Armstrong with 27 seconds left in the third quarter. But the Rockets put the game safely in the win column by responding with an eight-play, 87-yard drive that was finished off by a five-yard run by Woodside. The extra-point attempt hit the upright, making the score 23-3. Seymour had a 39-yard run in the drive,

Moments later, redshirt freshman Justin Clark picked off a pass, setting up an eight-yard TD run by Seymour. CMU scored on a 26-yard pass from Morris to Shane Conklin with a minute to play to close out the scoring.

ROCKET ROUNDUP:

Toledo has now won eight straight meetings against Central Michigan and the last four in Mount Pleasant. UT is now 25-18-3 all-time against the Chippewas and the 10 points are the fewest by CMU against Toledo since a 41-0 Rocket victory in 2000...For the fourth straight season, the Rockets start off 2-0 in conference play...The Toledo ground game accounted for 310 yards on Saturday, the most since Jan. 4, 2015 against Arkansas State in the GoDaddy.com Bowl...Terry Swanson finished with a season-high 145 rushing yards and two touchdowns, the 14th 100-yard rushing performance of his career. He's now in sole possession of fifth place in school history in career 100-yard rushing games, passing David Fluellen (2010-13)... Swanson also moved up on the career rushing yards list, passing Casey McBeth (1991-94) and moving into seventh place. He now has 2,738 career rushing yards. He had 118 yards on 18 carries in the first half...Shakif Seymour ran the ball 15 times for a career-high 119 yards and a touchdown, all in the fourth quarter. The last time a Rocket had 100-plus rushing yards in a single quarter was Swanson (Oct. 10, 2015)...Three different players had runs of at least 39 yards: Seymour and Art Thompkins each had a 39yard run and Swanson had a 48-yard touchdown run...Tight End Drew Rosi made his first career catch in the second quarter. Last weekend against Eastern Michigan he made his first career appearance in a game for the Rockets...Jack Linch recorded his first career interception in the second quarter, the sixth interception forced by the Toledo defense this season... Justin Clark also registered his first career interception. The two picks from the UT defense marked the second straight game with multiple interceptions...Senior walk-on Liam Allen made the first catch of his career in the fourth quarter...Logan Woodside scampered nine yards for his first rushing TD of the season and fourth of his career in the fourth quarter...Toledo held Central Michigan to 49 yards of total offense in the first half and led in time of possession 21:01-8:59...Toledo held CMU to 244 yards of total offense, the fewest since the season opener vs. Elon (175).

GAME 7 - AKRON 21, TOLEDO 48

Toledo, Ohio – Senior quarterback Logan Woodside threw for 304 yards and five touchdowns, including three in the first quarter, to lead Toledo to a 48-21 victory over Akron.

Woodside, who completed 17-of-24 passes, hit 10 different receivers on the day. Junior Jon'Vea Johnson led the way with five catches and two scores. Senior Terry Swanson led the ground attack with 123 yards on 20 carries.

Toledo's defense held Akron to just 333 yards of total offense, including just 119 in the first half when Toledo held a 24-7 lead. The Zips, who had just 42 yards rushing on 24 attempts, never got any closer as the Rockets scored two more times in the third quarter to take an insurmountable 38-7 lead. Sophomore safety Kahlil Robinson led Toledo with nine tackles. Junior defensive end Olasunkanmi Adeniyi had four tackles, a tackle for loss and two OB hurries.

Toledo (6-1, 3-0 MAC) took the opening kickoff and drove 60 yards in seven plays, capped by a terrific 24-yard touchdown catch by Jon'Vea Johnson. Johnson leaped and pulled the ball away from an Akron defender in the back of the end zone to give Toledo a 7-0 lead.

The Rockets' next drive was thwarted when Woodside's pass deflected off a receiver's hands and into the arms of Akron's Ulysees Gilbert, who returned the interception 14 yards to the UA 29-yard line. But moments later, Woodside struck again, hitting sophomore Desmond Phillips down the sideline for a 40-yard touchdown. It was the first TD reception of Phillips' young career, and increased the margin to 14-0 with 3:12 left in the first quarter.

Toledo's defense got the ball right back on a diving interception by redshirt freshman Justin Clark on the Akron 36-yard line. Three plays later, Woodside hit sophomore Danzel McKinley-Lewis for a 13-yard score.

Akron (4-4, 3-1 MAC) trimmed the lead to 21-7 on the first play of the second quarter, a 25-yard flea-flicker from Thomas Woodson to Kobie Booker. The Rockets answered with a 40-yard field goal by Jameson Vest to make the score 24-7 with 10:23 left in the first half. Akron missed a chance to cut into the lead when Tom O'Leary missed a 40-yard field goal with 58 seconds left. Vest missed a 55-yard field goal attempt on the last play of the half.

Toledo pit the game away in the third quarter when Woodside hit Jon'Vean Johnson and Diontae Johnson for 25- and 11-yard touchdowns, respectively. Akron scored twice in the fourth quarter to narrow the margin. Redshirt freshman Shakif Seymour rounded out the scoring for the Rockets with a 15-yard TD run with 1:40 left in the contest.

ROCKET ROUNDUP:

Toledo improves to 11-9 all-time against Akron after Saturday's win. The Rockets are now 6-1 on the year and are now bowl eligible...Logan Woodside threw five touchdown passes, the fourth time in his career he has had at least five touchdown passes, the most in school history...Woodside also recorded the 14th 300-yard passing game of his career. He finished with 304 passing yards...Terry Swanson finished with 123 rushing yards, his 11th 100-yard rushing game of his career. GAME 8 - TOLEDO 58, BALL STATE 17

Muncie, Ind. – Sophomore wide receiver Diontae Johnson scored three touchdowns and senior quarterback Logan Woodside threw for 267 yards and three scores as Toledo rolled to a 58-17 victory.

It was the most points for the Rockets since a 63-20 victory over Eastern Michigan on Oct. 17, 2015.

Johnson caught TD passes of 88 and 67 yards, adding a score on an 87-yard punt return. He had a career-high 170 yards receiving on just four receptions. Woodside also connected on a 35-yard TD pass to sophomore Desmond Phillips. His 27 yards came on just eight completions, an average of 33.4 yards per completion. Senior Terry Swanson led the ground attack with 105 yards and one touchdown, while redshirt freshmen Shakif Seymour (69 yards and two scores) and Nevone McCrimmon (73 yards) carried the load in the second half. For the game, Toledo piled up 602 yards of total offense in just 52 plays, 267 in the air and 335 on the ground, for an average of 11.6 yards per play.

Toledo's defense contained the Cardinals throughout most of the game, holding BSU to 309 total yards. Junior defensive end Olasunkanmi Adeniyi dominated the line, tying his career high with three tackles for loss.

The victory moves to Toledo to 7-1 on the season, 4-0 in Mid-American Conference play. It also sets up as showdown with West Division rival Northern Illinois in the Glass Bowl next Thursday. Ball State falls to 2-6, 0-4 in league play.

Toledo opéned the scoring on a 32-yard field goal by Jameson Vest, but the lead didn't last long. Ball State took advantage of excellent field position following a Toledo punt, scoring on a 41-yard run by Malik Dunner to give the Cardinals a 7-3 lead with three minutes left in the first quarter.

The Rockets struck back in the second period, however, scoring two touchdowns in a span of less than three minutes. Swanson zipped up the middle for a 71-yard touchdown run and sophomore Desmond Phillips snagged a 35-yard Woodside pass to make the score 17-7 with 8:20 to play in the first half. Two possessions later, Diontae Johnson came back on Woodside pass, then cruised down the sidelines for a 67-yard score to give Toledo a 24-7 edge. Ball State kicked a 43-yard field goal on the final play of the half to reduce the margin to 24-10 at the break.

Woodside came out firing in the second half, hitting Diontae Johnson for an 88-yard score on UT's first play from scrimmage. Johnson tipped the ball away from the defender at midfield, pulled it in, then motored to the end zone to extend the lead to 30-10. After a three-and-out by the Cardinals, Johnson struck again, returning a punt 87 yards for the score and piling up a comfortable 37-10 lead. Moments later, redshirt freshman Shakif Seymour put the game away with touchdown runs of one and 63 yards to give the Rockets an insurmountable 51-10 margin with 3:55 left in the third quarter.

Ball State took advantage of a fumbled Rocket punt late in the third quarter to score its second touchdown of the game. The Cardinals recovered on the UT four-yard line, and cashed in a on a four-yard run on fourth down by quarterback Drew Plitt.

Redshirt freshman Nevone McCrimmon set up Toledo's next touchdown on a 73-yard run to the Ball State two-yard line. Senior quarterback Michael Julian finished it off with a two-yard TD run, the first rushing touchdown of his career, to complete the scoring.

GAME 9 - TOLEDO 27, NIU 17

Toledo, Ohio – Senior quarterback Logan Woodside threw for 361 yards as the Toledo Rockets overcame a determined Northern Illinois squad, 27-17, in a critical Mid-American Conference battle. With the victory, Toledo (8-1, 5-0 MAC) claims sole possession of first place in the MAC's West Division, one game ahead of NIU (6-3, 4-1 MAC), a team that had knocked UT out of the MAC title race numerous times in the past decade.

Woodside completed 23-of-31 passes on his way to setting the Toledo record for career passing yards. He ended the day with 9,288 career passing yards, 62 more than previous record-holder Bruce Gradkowski (9,225 from 2002-05)

Senior Terry Swanson reached a milestone of his own, becoming the seventh Rocket to rush for more than 3,000 yards in his career. Swanson was a workhorse, running the ball a career-best 29 times for 116 yards and three touchdowns, also a career high. He now has 3,082 yards in his four-year career.

Toledo trailed early in the third quarter, 14-10, but outscored the Huskies 17-3 the rest of the way. Swanson scored twice in the third quarter to give UT a 24-14 edge heading into the final quarter. The Rockets' defense stepped up when it needed to, forcing NIU into a 47-yard field-goal attempt that missed with 3:46 to play that sealed the Huskies' fate. Senior cornerback Trevon Mathis snagged a pair of interceptions for the first time in his career, while senior defensive end Olasunkanmi Adeniyi had a career-high 10 tackles and one sack.

Toledo scored on its opening possession of the game on an eight-play, 81-yard drive. Swanson finished it off with a four-yard TD run. The Huskies answered later in the quarter on one-yard run by Tre Harbison that capped a 70-yard NIU drive.

The Rockets missed an excellent chance to score in the second quarter when a 10-yard TD run by Woodside was reviewed and ruled a fumble before he crossed the goal line. The Rockets began on the drive on their own one-yard line but turned the field around on an 89-yard catch and run by Diontae Johnson. Johnson ended his day with a career-high 10 receptions for 166 yards.

Toledo took a 10-7 lead into the locker room following a 22-yard field goal by Jameson Vest.

The Huskies marched down the field quickly on their first possession of the second half, ignited by chunk runs of 29, 14 and 19 before Childers finished off the seven-play, 80-yard drive with a one-yard run to give NIU its first lead, 14-10. The Rockets immediately answered with 13-yard touchdown run by Swanson to re-take the lead with 8:55 left in the third quarter. Less than four minutes later, Toledo extended the lead to 24-14 on a one-yard dive by Swanson. The big play on the drive was a 31-yard completion from Woodside to senior Darryl Richards that pushed him past Bruce Gradkowski to become Toledo's career passing yardage leader.

Northern came up with a big play on special teams that brought them to within a touchdown. Jackson Abresch blocked Bailey Flint's punt attempt deep in Toledo territory, recovering the ball on the UT 11-yard line. However, Toledo's defense came up big and forced NIU to settle for a 25-yard field goal, making the score 24-17.

Toledo answered once again with a 34-yard field goal by Vest with 8:58 left to play to up the Rocket lead to 27-17. Northern's fate was sealed when its ensuing drive stalled, forcing a 47-yard field-goal attempt that sailed wide right with 3:46 to play. UT ate up most the clock on its final possession before punting it away with 1:28 left.

ROCKET ROUNDUP:

Toledo is now 8-1, 5-0 in MAC play, giving the Rockets sole possession of first place in the MAC West Division...Toledo moves to 31-14 all-time vs. Northern Illinois. It was the first UT victory over the Huskies in the Glass Bowl since 2009, a streak of three straight home losses...Toledo outgained NIU, 527-430, including a 361-245 edge in passing yards...Senior Logan Woodside completed 23-of-31 passes for 361 yards, giving him 9,288 yards for his career and making him Toledo's career passing yardage leader. Woodside broke the record of 9,225 yards set by Bruce Gradkowski (2002-05). It was the fifth-most yards Woodside has thrown for in a single game in his Rocket career...Senior Terry Swanson rushed for 116 yards, giving him 3,082 for his career, just the seventh Rocket to crack the 3,000-yard barrier. Swanson ranks seventh on Toledo's all-time list...Swanson also set career high in rushing attempts (29) and touchdowns (3)...Sophomore Diontae Johnson set a career high with 10 receptions for 166 yards. It is the fourth time that Johnson has gone over 100 yards receiving this season...Sophomore tight end Jordan Fisher caught a career best six passes for 102 yards...Junior defensive end Olasunkanmi Ademiyi recorded a career-high 10 tackles...Senior cornerback Trevon Mathis picked off two passes. Before tonight, he had three interceptions in his entire career.

GAME 10 - OHIO 38, TOLEDO 10

Athens, Ohio – Senior quarterback Logan Woodside threw for 263 yards, but Toledo could not stop Ohio's running attack in a 38-10 defeat.

The Bobcats rushed for 393 yards and four touchdowns, averaging 7.0 yards per carry. Toledo also was hurt by two turnovers in the first half that stopped potential scoring drives.

It was the first conference loss of the season for Toledo (8-2, 5-1 MAC), which still holds first place in the West Division of the Mid-American Conference, a half-game ahead of Northern Illinois. Ohio, leaders of the East Division, moves to 8-2, 5-1 in MAC play.

Woodside completed 24-of-35 passes and 263 yards and a touchdown, but was sacked four times. Toledo's running game was limited to just 53 yards rushing. Redshirt freshman Shakif Seymour led UT with 77 yards on 11 carries. Sophomore Diontae Johnson led UT receivers with nine receptions for 144 yards and the Rockets' lone touchdown

Toledo moved quickly down the field on its first drive, but came up empty after Art Thompkins fumbled on the OU eight-yard line following a 10-yard reception. Ohio then returned the favor, losing a fumble deep in Toledo territory. However, the Bobcats broke into the scoring column on its next drive. Ohio took advantage of a short field, driving 49 yards in six plays. A.J. Oullette carried the ball four times on the drive, the last a six-yarder into the end zone to give the Bobcats a 7-0 lead.

Neither team could sustain a drive through most of the remainder of the first half. Ohio had a good drive thwarted when Jack Linch forced a fumble that was recovered by Ja'Wuan Woodley at the UT 21-yard line. Toledo pounced on the opportunity, with Seymour rushing for 36 yards to the OU 40-yard line and Diontae Johnson pulling down a 34-yard TD pass from Woodside to tie the score.

Toledo missed another opportunity late in the first half due to a turnover. Diontae Johnson fumbled after a nine-yard reception, with Ohio's Javon Hagen recovering the ball on the OU 30-yard line and returning it 34 yards to the UT's 30. The Rocket defense held fast, however, keeping Ohio to a 44-yard field goal with 11 seconds left to give the Bobcats a 10-7 halftime lead.

Ohio picked up where it left off in the third quarter, scoring on its first two drives. Quarterback Nathan Rourke capped a nine-play, 73-yard drive with an eight-yard TD run. After a three-and-out by Toledo, Dorian Brown broke up the middle for 62 yards and a touchdown to make it 24-7 with 8:03 to play in the third.

Toledo trimmed the lead to 24-10 on a 38-yard field goal by Vest. But Ohio answered with a 12-play scoring drive that ate up 6:38 of the clock. Rourke hit Brendan Cope across the middle for a 12-yard TD that gave the Bobcats a commanding 31-10 lead. Toledo was stopped on downs on its next possession, and Ohio marched into the end zone once again to take a 38-10 lead. Dorian Brown's one-yard touchdown run was the fourth of the night for Ohio. The Rockets would have one more drive on the night, advancing up to the Ohio 13-yard line, but they were once again stopped on downs. The Bobcats ran the ball seven times to drain the clock and end the game.

The Toledo defense has now forced 11 interceptions this season...Diontae Johnson finished with nine receptions for 144 yards and one touchdown, his fifth 100yard receiving performance of the season...Johnson also moved into a tie for sixth place all-time in single-season receiving touchdowns and eclipsed 1,000 receiving yards this season, the 11th 1,000-yard receiving season in school history...For the first time since Sept. 2, 2016, a streak of 21 games, a Toledo running back lost a fumble. Art Thompkins lost a fumble in the first quarter following a 10-yard reception. UT running backs had accumulated 781 touches between lost fumbles...For the second time this season, Shakif Seymour led UT in rushing (Aug. 31 vs. Elon, 102 yards on 11 carries). He had 77 yards on 11 carries against the Bobcats...Olasunkanmi Adeniyi recorded 10 tackles, tying his career-high total that he set last week against Northern Illinois...Kahlil Robinson also tied his career-high in tackles, tallying nine against Ohio...This was Toledo's sixth game this season forcing multiple turnovers. The Rockets recovered two fumbles and had one interception.
