SETTING THE SCENE

- · Bowling Green opens the home portion of the season by hosting the Kent State Golden Flashes on Tuesday. Nov. 10. The 88th meeting between the two will take place inside Doyt L. Perry Stadium and is scheduled for 7:30 PM on ESPN2.
- The all-time series between the Falcons and Golden Flashes currently resides at 60-21-6 in favor of Bowling Green. Kent State has won the previous two matchups, with last year's victory being a 62-20 score.
- Kent State is looking to start the season 2-0 for the first time since 1988.
- This is the first time since Sept. 8, 2001 that the Falcons have played a Mid-American Conference opponent for their first home game of the season, when they defeated Buffalo 35-0.
- The last time the Falcons hosted Kent State for their first home game of the season was back in 1972 (Oct. 14). The Falcons lost a tight one to the Golden Flashes, 14-10.
- Scot Loeffler followed up a 30+ point loss with a win twice in 2019 and will be looking to do it now for the third time in his career

A BGSU WIN WOULD...

- Move Scot Loeffler to 1-1 in his career against the Golden Flashes (and 4-11 overall)
- Improve BGSU's home record under Scot Loeffler to 4-3
- Clinch the Falcons' second consecutive 1-1 start after two games
- Extend the Falcons' all-time series lead to 61-21-6 over Kent State

BY THE NUMBERS

1,300

Tight end Quintin Morris enters the Kent State game with 1,300 career receiving yards, to go with 107 career receptions. He needs 41 more yards to move into the top 30 in school history.

After allowing no sacks at Toledo, Terry Malone's offensive line has allowed just 14 sacks in 13 games since the start of 2019. BGSU ranked ninth in the country in fewest sacks allowed a year ago.

60%

BGSU is the youngest team in the country in terms of percentage of freshmen on the roster. With 64-of-106 listed freshmen or RS freshmen, 60 percent of the roster is made up the youngest of players.

YEAR TWO FOR SCOT LOEFFLER AND HIS STAFF

- BGSU Director of Athletics Bob Moosbrugger named veteran Scot Loeffler as the 20th head coach in Bowling Green history on Nov. 28, 2018
- Although the 2019 season marked Loeffler's first as a head coach, the Ohio native brought a wealth of high-level college football experience with him to Bowling Green. Loeffler has served as the offensive coordinator at Boston College, Virginia Tech, Auburn and Temple. He has also coached at Florida, his alma mater Michigan, and Central Michigan -- as well as the Detroit Lions
- Loeffler has coached seven quarterbacks who went on to play in the NFL, including Tom Brady and Tim Tebow. His teams have qualified for 17 bowl games, including coaching for Michigan's 1997 Rose Bowl team that won the national championship.
- Loeffler will be bringing a level of consistency with his coaching staff in 2020 that is not always a guarantee within the MAC (BGSU had to hire a new head coach after winning the league in both 2013 and 2015), but can be a huge strength.
- Bowling Green has its same coordinators in back-to-back seasons for just the third time this decade. Brian VanGorder (defensive coordinator) and Terry Malone (offensive coordinator) are back after taking positive steps on their respective sides of the ball a season ago. Jacob Schoonover (special teams coordinator) also returns after BGSU's special terms were a big strength in 2019. Associate head coach Steve Morrison is entering year two with Loeffler at BGSU, as well. A vast majority of the remaining coaching staff members are also entering their second seasons at Bowling Green.

A LOOK BACK: KENT STATE DEFEATS FALCONS

- A year ago, Kent State defeated Bowling Green 62-20 in the MAC opener for both teams.
- Andrew Clair and Bryson Denley each scored touchdowns in the defeat
- Kent State built a 21-7 lead after one quarter and held a 24-7 advantage at the break. A 21-point third quarter for the Golden Flashes put the contest away.

REVISITING LAST WEEK: TOLEDO

- Toledo won the Battle of I-75, taking advantage of BGSU miscues to build an early 21-0 lead and holding on 38-3.
- The Falcons had a botched snap on a punt and two first-quarter turnovers that gave Toledo good field position early and the Rockets took advantage.
- The BGSU defense allowed the Falcons to stay within striking distance after that early onslaught. After falling behind 21-0, BGSU held Toledo scoreless on its last five possessions of the half, including a turnover on downs and four

punts.

• Toledo gained just seven yards on its last three possessions of the first half, going three-and-out each time.

Q IS THE X FACTOR

- Coming off a second team All-MAC season in 2019, senior Quintin Morris enters his senior year as one of the most dynamic tight ends in college football.
- Morris, who has caught a pass in 25 straight games, led last year's Falcons with 55 receptions, 649 receiving yards and four touchdown catches. Morris had seven games in 2019 with at least four receptions and 50-plus receiving yards.
- The native of Richmond, Texas ranks 32nd all-time at Bowling Green with 1,300 receiving yards. He needs just 200 yards to become the 24th player in school history with 1,500 receiving yards.

WIDE RECEIVER PRODUCTION

- Six of Matt McDonald's eight completions against Toledo went to wide receivers, a welcome sight for Bowling Green fans.
- The Falcons did not have a receiving touchdown from a wide receiver in 2019 and has not had one since Tampa Bay Buccaneers' wideout Scotty Miller had a 63-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter against Buffalo on Nov. 23, 2018.
- Julian Ortega-Jones, specifically, had three catches for 61 yards, including a 42 yard reception on a reverse flea flicker that saw him come up two yards shy of breaking the wide receiver touchdown drought.
- The only wide receiver on the roster who has a receiving touchdown in his career is Noah Massey, who caught a TD in 2018. Before moving to tight end, Quintin Morris caught nine touchdowns as a wide receiver.

THREE-HEADED MONSTER AT RUNNING BACK?

- Redshirt junior Andrew Clair and redshirt senior Bryson Denley make up one of the Mid-American Conference's most versatile and explosive backfields. With the addition of power back Trevon Raymore, the Falcons have the pieces in place for an effective running game.
- All three backs had at least seven carries in the season-opener against Toledo. Trevon Raymore led the way with seven rushes for 41 yards.
- Sparked by a freshman season in 2017 that saw him rack up 1,184 all-purpose yards, Clair ranks 20th all-time in rushing yards at BGSU with 1,708 yards. Clair battled injuries in 2019, but still led the team by averaging 61 rushing yards per game. Clair, who ranked fifth in the nation in 2017 by averaging 4.5 yards after contact, leads all current Bowling Green players with 17 career touchdowns.
- Clair needs 292 more yards to become the 14th Falcon to reach 2,000 career rushing yards.
- Denley had a career year in 2019, as he led the Falcons with 1,224 all-purpose yards and

seven touchdowns. The Texan also led Bowling Green with 544 rushing yards and tied for the team lead with four rushing touchdowns. Showing his versatility, Denley placed third on the team in receiving yards (267) and second in catches (27).

RUSHING FOR THE CENTURY MARK

- Under Scot Loeffler, Bowling Green has rushed for at least 100 yards in 12-of-13 games, including a current streak of 11 in a row.
- Against Toledo, the Falcons ran for 139 yards as quarterback Matt McDonald and redshirt freshman Trevon Raymore each picked up 41 yards on the ground.
- BGSU went over 200 yards rushing twice last year, posting 240 yards in the 20-7 victory over Toledo and 326 yards in the win over Morgan State. The Falcons ran for at least 150 yards in each of their three victories.
- Bowling Green is 2-0 under Scot Loeffler when rushing for at least 200 yards.

McDONALD TO TRIGGER THE OFFENSE

- · Redshirt junior Matt McDonald made his longawaited Bowling Green debut against Toledo last week
- · McDonald began his career at Boston College. Scot Loeffler, BC's offensive coordinator at the time, recruited McDonald out of Mission Viejo High School in California in 2017. McDonald redshirted in 2017, played sparingly in 2018 and then followed Loeffler to BGSU in 2019.
- · At Mission Viejo High School, an injury in McDonald's junior season allowed his backup, JT Daniels, to take over the starting role. Daniels went on to high school All-American status, and then started as a true freshman at USC before moving on to Georgia.
- · McDonald won the starting job at BG coming out of preseason camp in 2019, but was denied immediate eligibility by the NCAA and was forced to sit out the entirety of the season due to transfer rules
- The 2020 season will mark McDonald's fourth in Loeffler's system. The 6-foot-3 gunslinger appeared in two games while at BC, going

a combined 7-for-8 for 118 yards and two touchdowns. His last collegiate appearance came in a win over Holy Cross on Sept. 8, 2018. On that day, McDonald went 5-for-6 for 107 yards and two touchdowns.

· While McDonald's debut in the Orange and Brown was a bit rocky, he did average 16.0 yards per completion, a mark that currently ranks fourth in the nation. He had three completions of at least 20 yards, including a 42-yarder to Julian Ortega-Jones.

SENIOR SPECIALISTS ALREADY SHINING

- Bowling Green's top-three specialists punter Matt Naranjo, kicker Nate Needham and long snapper James Carolan - all return for their senior seasons in 2020. Additionally, special teams coordinator Jacob Schoonover is back for his third season on staff
- Needham, who is nine points shy of 100 for his career, is now 6-for-10 on field goal attempts at BGSU, making his only attempt a week ago. He is also 21-of-23 on extra-point attempts.
- Naranjo currently ranks eighth all-time at BGSU, averaging 40.5 yards per punt. In six punts at Toledo to open the season, had a long of 58 yards and two inside the 20.
- Carolan has played in 36 games over four seasons for the Orange and Brown and has been a steady snapper for the Falcons during his career.

ANDERS IN THE MIDDLE

- Sophomore Darren Anders made the most of his first opportunity to shine in 2020.
- · After playing in 11 games as a true freshman a year ago (including one start), Anders truly had his first chance as a keystone figure defensively and he made the most of his chance.
- He led the Falcons with 11 tackles (picking up more than half of the 20 tackles he had a year ago) and also recovered an early third-quarter fumble that was forced by teammate Sy Dabney. Anders added a team-best 1.5 tackles for loss.
- · At 11.0 tackles per contest, Anders is tied for third in the MAC and is tenth nationally.

OLD MAN MOTES

- Redshirt senior tight end Presley Motes is the lone player on the 2020 Falcons to have already earned his undergraduate degree.
- Motes, who is also married and expecting a child, is a 2013 graduate of Thatcher High School before serving two years on a Mormon mission.
- Motes began at Bowling Green in 2018 after transferring from Eastern Arizona Community College. He played quarterback in high school as well as in his prior collegiate stops.

IN THE TRENCHES

- Bowling Green was one of the better teams in the country at protecting the quarterback in 2019 and also did a solid job of creating pressure.
- The offensive line ranked ninth in the nation in sacks allowed a year ago, giving up just 1.17 per contest (14 total allowed). Against Toledo, BGSU did not allow a sack and the Falcon offensive line has given up just 14 sacks in 13 games under offensive line coach Terry Malone.
- On the flip side, BGSU was fifth in the MAC in sacks created in 2019, recording an average of 2.00 per game (24 total).

THE YOUTH MOVEMENT...

- Bowling Green and head coach Scot Loeffler will field the youngest team in college football in 2020.
- Of the 106 total players on Bowling Green's roster, 64 of them or 60.4 percent are true freshmen or redshirt freshmen, the highest percentage of first-year players in the country.
- The Falcons have 43 true freshmen and 21 redshirt freshmen. In Loeffler's first season in 2019, the Falcons had 37 true freshmen and 10 redshirt freshmen

...AND THOSE FRESHMEN ARE PLAYING

- Redshirt freshman wide receiver Tyrone Broden was the only player with freshman eligibility to start at Toledo, but head coach Scot Loeffler freely used many first-year players throughout the game.
- In total, 20 freshmen saw game action at Toledo, including 13 true freshmen.
- No position group was impacted more by freshmen than the defensive line, where six firstyear players saw action. True freshmen Jordan Porter, Anthony Hawkins and Dontrez Brown,

joined redshirt freshmen Andrew Bench, Blaine Spires and Jevon Henderson.

- Staying on the defensive side of the ball, linebackers JB Brown, Brock Horne and James Miller all saw action, as well as defensive backs Marcus Sheppard, Myles Williamson and Patrick Day.
- On the offensive line, four true freshmen gained their first collegiate experience. Jeremiah Banks-Wall, Alex Wollschlaeger, Joey Carroll and Jalen Grant all played at Toledo.
- Four freshmen impacted the Falcons at the skill positions. True freshmen wide receivers Javonte Kinsey and Jhaylin Embry joined true freshman running back Terion Stewart. Redshirt freshman Trevon Raymore tied for the team lead in rushing yards.

INEXPERIENCE STARTING

- Eight Falcons made their first career starts last week at Toledo, including five on offense.
- Quarterback Matt McDonald not only earned his first start, but also served as team captain.
 He was joined by first-time starters Tyrone Broden, Presley Motes, Cameron State and Joe Ware on offense.
- Defensively, Diata Burns and Sy Dabney made their first starts in the back end, while Jordan Murphy picked up his starting nod along the defensive line.

THE 200-TACKLE MAN

- With eight tackles at Toledo, Kholbe Coleman went over 200 for his career and enters the Kent State game with 202.
- Coleman was a third-team All-MAC linebacker a year ago, recording 103 tackles, 4.5 for loss.
- Two years ago, Coleman added 70 tackles for the Falcons.
- With a 0.5 tackle for loss at Toledo, Coleman now has 8.5 for his career. He also has three career forced fumbles and four fumble recoveries.

PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE

- Seven Falcons were named to at least one preseason All-MAC team by the three major national preview publications – Athlon Sports, Street & Smith's, and Phil Steele's College Football Preview.
- Tight end Quintin Morris was recognized as a preseason first team All-MAC player by Athlon and Street & Smith's. Morris earned a spot on

 Jake Rogers (punt return) and Isaiah Johnson-Mack (linebacker) earned preseason fourth team All-MAC honors by Phil Steele. Punter Matt Naranjo was honored by both Athlon (third team) and Phil Steele (fourth team).
- Linebacker Kholbe Coleman was tabbed as a second team All-MAC performer by Athlon.
 Coleman led the Falcons in 2019 with 103 tackles

DIFFERENT FLAVOR OF #MACTION

- The Mid-American Conference will play a 6-game schedule in 2020. Each of the 12 MAC institutions will play six conference games and zero non-conference games. The MAC Championship Game will take place at Ford Field in Detroit on Dec. 19.
- The season started Nov. 4 with all 12 schools playing a cross-divisional opponent. The final five weeks of the season will feature divisional games only.
- Additionally, the first three weeks of the season will all take place during mid-week dates, showcasing games during the popular midweek #MACtion window. The final three weeks of the season will be played on Saturdays.

COPPES CARES FOR FALCONS

- Bowling Green is one of a handful of schools who has a female as the primary care provider for the football program
- Coppes is in her seventh year at BGSU and her fifth as a full-time staff member. She earned her master's degree from BGSU in 2016 and her undergraduate degree from Ohio State in 2014.
- Only UMass, Georgia Southern, Troy, Kansas State, Western Kentucky, Western Michigan, Houston, Michigan State, Iowa, Virginia and UCF also employ a female in the role.

HEAD COACH SCOT LOEFFLER



Scot Loeffler begins his second season as the head coach at Bowling Green State University in 2020. The 20th head coach of the Bowling Green football program, Loeffler came to BGSU after serving as Deputy Head Coach and Offensive Coordinator at Boston College.

In his first season at Bowling Green, the Falcons built a foundation for success. Although BGSU went just 3-9 overall and 2-6 in MAC play, the program began to turn the corner in many ways. Most notably, the Falcons defeated rival Toledo 20-7 to end a nine-game losing streak in the Battle of I-75.

In BGSU's three victories (over Toledo, Akron and Morgan State), the Falcons outscored their opponents 101-16, highlighting explosive offensive performances and stifling defensive efforts. Bowling Green held Morgan State to just 70 yards of offense and Akron to 100 yards. BGSU gave up just one touchdown in those three victories.

Loeffler has coached seven quarterbacks who went on to play in the NFL – Tom Brady, Tim Tebow, Brian Griese, Chad Henne, Drew Henson, John Navarre and Logan Thomas. He has also directed a potent rushing attack at Boston College behind AJ Dillon, who ranked 13th nationally in rushing yards per game in 2018. Dillon was the ACC Rookie of the Year in 2017 and the nation's second-leading rusher among freshmen.

In 2018, Boston College scored 40+ points in four of its first five games, including an average of 52.7 points in consecutive wins over Massachusetts, Holy Cross and Wake Forest. The Eagles then defeated Temple 45-35 and Louisville 38-20. The team ended the regular season at 7-5 overall.

In 2017, Loeffler's offense posted 35+ points in three consecutive games for the first time in 15 years at Boston College. The team scored 40+ points in consecutive conference games for the first time in the program's Big East and ACC history. The rushing offense climbed from 96th to 25th in the country and the Eagles were one of the faster teams in the nation, ranking 18th nationally in total plays.

Prior to his tenure at Boston College, Loeffler served as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Frank Beamer at Virginia Tech from 2013-15. He mentored Logan Thomas, who finished his collegiate career by breaking career records for passing yards, attempts, touchdown passes and rushing touchdowns by a quarterback. He oversaw a trio of wide receivers who became the first group in Virginia Tech history to each record 40 or more receptions in a season.

As the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Auburn in 2012, Loeffler mentored Tre Mason, a 1000-yard rusher who became the first non-quarterback to lead Auburn in total offense since Bo Jackson in 1985.

Loeffler guided Temple to the seventh-best rushing average in the nation as offensive coordinator in 2011 and running back Bernard Pierce ranked sixth nationally, including 107 yards on the ground in Doyt L. Perry Stadium in a 13-10 BGSU victory. That team went on to win the program's first bowl game since 1979.

Prior to his time at Temple, he was quarterbacks coach at Florida under former BGSU head coach Urban Meyer, helping the unit to the best pass efficiency in the nation in 2009. He guided Tebow in his final season in Gainesville as he passed for 2,895 yards and 21 touchdowns. Tebow graduated from Florida with five NCAA, 14 SEC and 28 school record.

In 2008, Loeffler worked with the Detroit Lions' quarterbacks, following his tenure at Michigan. From 2002-07, he coached quarterbacks for the Wolverines. Chad Henne became the first true freshman quarterback to lead his team to a Big Ten title and start in a BCS game, while John Navarre became Michigan's first All-Big Ten first team quarterback since 1997.

Along with his time at Temple, Loeffler has familiarity in the Mid-American Conference as he was Central Michigan's quarterbacks coach from 2000-01. Prior to that, he was a graduate assistant and student assistant at Michigan, working with Brady and Griese. He was part of the Wolverines' undefeated national championship season in 1997.

A native of Barberton, Ohio and Barberton High School, Loeffler played quarterback at Michigan from 1993-96. A 1998 graduate of Michigan, Loeffler earned his undergraduate degree in history with a minor in political science.

Loeffler is married to Amie, who holds an undergraduate degree in chemistry from Bowling Green in 1999 and a graduate degree in chemistry in 2005. The couple has three children – Luke, Alexis and Mary Elizabeth.
