The Opening Kick

- The Flashes take their five-game winning streak on the road to Bowling Green to take on BG in the Battle for the Anniversary Award
- The Flashes ran their win streak to five with a 27-23 backand-forth victory over Eastern Michigan last Wednesday
- Dustin Crum went 21-for-29 for 219 yards and two touchdowns through the air, the senior added a third on the ground
- Tight End Mark Williams picked a great time for his first career touchdown. Williams was wide open on a nine-yard out route and hauled in the game winning score in the fourth quarter on Wednesday night
- Kent State recorded four sacks against EMU last Wednesday.
 That is the second-straight game the Flashes have recorded four or more sacks.
- The Golden Flashes run defense was stout against EMU, holding the Eagles to just 61 net rushing yards. That's the first time the Flashes have held an opponent under 100 yards rushing since the Akron game last season. The 61 rushing yards allowed are the fewest since Delaware State was credited with -38 yards rushing in 2015.
- **Xavier Williams** is back after a record-setting 2019. Williams had the fastest two touchdowns in the FBS last season against Buffalo. Williams scored on an eight-yard rush and 42-yard screen pass just 28 seconds apart from one another, sparking the comeback win over the Bulls. Williams had a 33-yard rushing touchdown in the win over EMU, making it five straight games with a rushing TD for Williams.
- The victory over EMU marked the fifth-straight win for the Flashes, dating back to last season. That is the longest win streak since they ran off 10-straight wins in the 2012 season.

TEAM COMPARISON (2019)

The Coaches

At 34 years of age, **Sean Lewis** remains the youngest head coach in the FBS and is in his third season with the Golden Flashes. Lewis engineered a five-win improvment from year one to year two, closing the 2019 season on a four-game win streak. Capping the streak was a 51-41 victory over Utah State in the Tropical Smoothie Cafe Frisco Bowl. It was the first bowl win in school history and the second time the team topped 50 points. Under Lewis, the team has gone from 12.7 points per game in the year before Lewis took over to over 29 points per game last season. Prior to Kent State, Lewis spent six years under Dino Babers at three different schools, most recently spending two seasons as co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Syracuse. The Orange proved to be a program on the rise with a victory over then defending national champion Clemson. Lewis served in the same position for two seasons at Bowling Green, helping the Falcons to a MAC title and two bowl appearances. Lewis also coached at Eastern Illinois, Akron and Nebraksa Omaha.

Scott Loeffler returns as the Falcons' head coach in 2020 and it will be his second season in Bowling Green. Loeffler came to BG from BC, where he served as Boston College's deputy head coach and offensive coordinator. Prior to BC, Loeffler was the offensive coordinator at Virginia Tech, Auburn and Temple. Loeffler is a native of nearby Barberton, Ohio and is a 1998 graduate of Michigan.

Series History

Bowling Green owns a 61-20-1 all-time lead in the series that dates back to 1920. The teams play for the Anniversary Award, celebrating both schools' founding in 1910. The Award has been given out since 1985, the 75th anniversary of each school. Kent State is looking to match its longest win streak in the series at three games, which would tie the 2010-12 run for the Golden Flashes.

Players to WatchFor Kent State, the Flashes return senior signal caller **Dustin Crum**. This will be the first full season for Crum as QB1, having taken over the starting job in week two of the 2019 season. Crum responded by completing nearly 70 percent of his passes, threw for over 2600 yards and posted a 20:2 touchdown to interception ratio. The Grafton, Ohio native also led the team with 707 yards rushing. Crum posted 289 passing and a career-high 147 yards rushing in a MVP performance in the Tropical Smoothie Cafe Frisco Bowl.

The Golden Flashes have Walter Camp pre-season All-American in junior kicker Matthew Trickett. The reigning Mid-American Conference Special Teams Player of the Year hit on 29-of-34 field goals last year, tying him for the top spot in the FBS. Trickett hit two "walk-off" field goals last year to defeat Kennesaw State and Buffalo and hit four or more field goals in a game three times.

The Falcons will have a number of new playmakers in 2020, perhaps none more important than Matt McDonald. The redshirt junior quarterback came over from Boston College with Coach Loeffler. McDonald played two season on Chestnut Hill and completed seven-of-eight passes and two touchdowns. He was a standout at Mission Viejo high school in California, rolling up a 39:6 touchdown-to-interception ratio. McDonald completed just 8-of-30 passes against Toledo in week one, but proved to be a dual-threat, rushing for over 14 yards a carry against the Rockets.

Closing Strong

Kent State was the only FBS team to win their final three regular-season games in order to gain bowl eligibility in 2019. The three-game streak started in the most improbable of fashions. The Flashes trailed Buffalo 27-6 with under eight minutes to go. Three touchdowns sandwiched between a recovered on-side kick and blocked punt, tied the game at 27. Matthew Trickett hit a walk-off 42-yard field goal to mark the largest fourth-quarter comeback in the FBS in 2019.

Breaking Through

The 51-41 victory in the Tropical Smoothie Cafe Frisco Bowl was the first bowl victory in school history. In 97 previous seasons, the Flashes were 0-3 prior to last year's victory. The Flashes lost to Delaware in the 1954 Refigerator Bowl in Evansville, Indiana, lost to the University of Tampa in the 1972 Tangerine (now Citrus) Bowl and to Arkansas State in the 2012 GoDaddy Bowl.

Steve Harvey Scholarship

Kent State linebacker Anthony Morris (#51) is one of the recipients of the Steve and Marjorie Harvey Foundation Scholarship. Morris, a Cleveland Glenville High School graduate, like Harvey, appeared on Harvey's talk show, "Steve" in June of 2019 to accept the scholarship. Harvey attended Kent State University before going on to a career in comedy, tv and film. He is best known for being the current host of Family Feud.

Playing at the Next Level

Kalil Morris was the most recent Golden Flash to appear in an NFL camp with the Baltimore Ravens. Prior to the 2018 NFL season, recent Kent State graduates Jon Cunningham (Falcons), Nate Holley (Rams) and Nick Holley (Rams) joined training camps. In 2017, NFL regular season rosters included **Roosevelt Nix** and **James Harrison** of the Pittsburgh Steelers. Nix converted from defensive line to fullback and made his first Pro Bowl, while Harrison is a former NFL Defensive Player of the Year. Also making a position switch was going from quarterback to receiver was Julian Edelman, who helped the New England Patriots win a Super Bowl. Edelman is now a three-time Super Bowl Champion after being named Super Bowl XLIII MVP and leading the Patriots to a win over the Los Angeles Rams. Josh Kline (Free Agent) and Brian Winters (Bills) made up the left side of Kent State's offensive in 2011 and 2012. Antonio Gates (Chargers) played only a spring season of football at Kent State, but was a standout basketball player.

Nate Holley was just named the CFL's Most Outstanding Rookie for the Calgary Stampeders. He signed with the Miami Dolphins practice squad before the 2020 season. Rico Murray (Hamilton) is also currently playing in the CFL. In the spring, 2020 graduate Theo Majette signed a CFL deal with Calgary as well. Holley parlayed his strong season in the CFL into a deal with the Miami Dolphins for the 2020 season.

FlashFAST

Kent State employs what is called a FlashFAST style of play, referring to their up-tempo offense and attacking defense. Additionally, FlashFAST is the overall mantra of the team with **FAST standing for Fun, Accountable, Smart and Tough**

FlashFAST Pace

In 2019, the Flashes ran an average of 70 plays per game. Averaging about 27 minutes of possession per game, that was a play every 23 seconds in 2019. The trend continued in week one, running 75 plays in 30 minutes of possession. This included the slowed down final drive where the Flashes ran just 10 plays in the final 5:13.

A Golden Standard

Kent State head coach Sean Lewis reserves the single digits for players that have met the "golden standards" of the team, both on and off the field. This season, **KJ Sherald** is the lone hold over from last season, earning the number 5 prior to the Ball State game. Quarterback **Dustin Crum** (was 14, now 7, place kicker **Matthew Trickett** (was 95, now 2) and defensive end **Zayin West** (was 97, now 0) are the new single digit players. Players have the ability to earn and lose their single digit over the course of a season.

Beard Gang

As part of the Fun in FlashFAST, a number of coaches, players, sports performance coaches and athletic trainers are participating in a Beard Gang challenge. Mustaches can be trimmed, but participants must let their beards grow for the entire season.

Honoring #54 Jason Bitsko

On Aug. 20, 2014 during a preseason practice, Kent State's football team received tragic news of the unexpected overnight death of **Jason Bitsko**. The fourth-year junior was slated to be the team's center after starting 12 games at right tackle in 2013. Bitsko had become a team leader, mentor and friend to many both on and off the field. In Bitsko's honor, the number 54 is now worn by a select offensive lineman every season. In 2018 and 19, Nate Warnock was chosen by teammates and coaches to wear the jersey. In previous years, it was worn by Reno Reda, Stefano Millin and Nathan Puthoff. In 2014, 54 was displayed on one side of every player's helmet throughout the year. This season, the team voted that Nate Monnin will wear 54 for the 2020 season.

The "James Gang" Coaching Tree

Two players from **Don James**' 1972 squad (he himself a member of the College Football Hall of Fame) have gone on to find great coaching success of their own. Current Alabama head coach **Nick Saban** (defensive back, 1970-73) won a national championship with LSU in 2003 and five more with Alabama, while **Gary Pinkel** (tight end, 1971-73) directed Missouri to a school-record 12 victories in 2007, finishing the season fourth in the final Associated Press poll after being ranked No. 1 earlier in the year, and is on this year's ballot for the College Football Hall of Fame. Dan Dorazio, who was a student assistant under James, has coached for over 40 years in the CFL, and Dom Capers (graduate assistant, 1972-74) who recently retired as Green Bay Packers defensive coordinator, also worked under James.

Furthermore, Bob Stoops – who led Oklahoma to the 2000 national title – got his full-time coaching start as an assistant at Kent State in 1988. In addition to College Football Hall of Fame inductee **Lou Holtz**, the list also includes former head coach Glen Mason (1986-87), who went on to find success at Minnesota, Long-time NFL coordinator Dean Pees served as the Kent State head coach from 1998 to 2003 before leaving to start that lengthy NFL tenure.

Trick Trick BOOM

Junior kicker Matthew Trickett has been a steady force for the Golden Flashes. As a sophomore, he tied for the FBS lead with 29 made field goals and 34 field goal attemps. He also hit on all 39 of his extra points and was named the MAC Special Teams Player of the Year as a result. This season, Trickett was named to the Walter Camp Foundation's pre-season All-America list and was named first team All-MAC by Athlon Sports.

Refusing to CRUM-ble

Kent State quarterback Dustin Crum is looking to build off a stellar 2019 campaign. After taking over as QB1 in week two, Crum went on to lead the MAC in passing in conference games, averaging over 240 yards per contest. Crum added another 60 yards rushing per game, putting him atop the conference with 300 yard of total offense per game. Crum also had a TD to INT ratio of 20:2 last year, leading to an overall efficiency rating of 159.7, good for 11th in the FBS.

ESPN took notice, ranking Crum at #8 on the top returning quarterbacks for 2020, the highest among the "group of five" quarterbacks. ESPN notes Crum's decision making as big reason why, only .7% of his throws were considered "turnover-worthy", the lowest mark in the FBS.

In week one against the Eagles, crum was 21-for-29 (73%) for 219 yards and two touchdowns. He did throw an interception, ending a streak of 105 passed without an interception.

Sharing is Caring

The Flashes split 43 carries amongst four players against the Eagles in week one, rushing for 212 yards in the win. Getting the bulk of the carries were Bryan Bradford and Marquez Cooper, who were each making their Golden Flashes' debut. The duo combined for 28 carries and 144 yards.

Now THAT'S Flash Fast

Last season versus Buffalo, Kent State running back Xavier Williams scored twice in 27 game seconds, the quickest two scores by a player in 2019. Williams scored on an eight-yard run, then after an on-side kick recovery, scored off a 42-yard screen pass. It is an appropriate accolade for Williams, who also moonlights as a sprinter on the Kent State track team.

X Gonna Give it to Ya

Xavier Williams continued an impressive streak against Eastern Michigan, scoring on a 33-yard run. That makes five-straight games with a touchdown for Williams. The Flashes are 5-0 in their last five games.

The Real McKoy

Isaiah McKoy caught eight touchdown passes last season, all of them were plays of 21 yards or longer. A true "home run" threat, McKoy had five touchdowns of at least 40 yards. McKoy and Dustin Crum hooked up for a 78-yard touchdown strike in the first quarter of the Tropical Smoothie Cafe Frisco Bowl. McKoy earned first team All-MAC in Athlon Sports' pre-season rankings.

McKoy and Crum picked up where they left off against EMU. McKoy hauled in a 26-yard touchdown pass in the victory. McKoy brought in eight passes for 104 yards, his fifth 100 yard game of his career. The Flashes are 4-1 in those games, including winning the last four.

Sams' Club

Offensive lineman Julian Sams has gotten the start in every one of his 25 collegiate games. He is the leading returner on an offensive line that brings back four players that started at least four games last season and three players who started all 12 games. Sams, a junior out of Bealeton, Virginia was also a strong high-school wrestler, finishing as a state runner-up as a senior.

In Road Openers

The Golden Flashes will look to win their second-straight MAC road opener, having defeated Akron last season 26-3. The last time that Kent State won a true road opener was in week one of the 2007 season, defeating Iowa State 23-14 in Ames.

Moving the Chains

Kent State converted their third downs at a nearly 50 percent in MAC play. The Golden Flashes kept that trend up in their bowl game, converting on 7-of-15 (47 percent) of their third-down opportunities. As a result, the Flashes finished the season cashing in on 44 percent of their third downs. In week one against the Eagles, the Flashes Kent State converted 6-of-14 (43%), staying on track with last year's trend.

On the Rise

After a strong end to the 2019 season, people are starting to take notice. Athlon Sports listed the Golden Flashes as one of their "Teams on the Rise" for the 2020 season. A big reason for that was the strides the offense made last season. In the first year of the FlashFAST era, the Flashes averaged just over 5 yards a play, in year two, that number jumped nearly a whole yard to 5.83 yards per play. With a whole offseason as QB 1, Dustin Crum and the offense look to take an even bigger leap in 2020.

Same Place, New Face

The Golden Flashes will welcome in a number of new players to the 2020 squad, including a number of transfers. Here is who to watch for:

Tony Butler (Formerly at Nebraska)

The Lakewood, Ohio native comes home for his graduate transfer season. Butler played primarily on special teams for the Cornhuskers, but will look to make an impact in the defensive backfield for Kent State.

C.J. Holmes (Formerly at Penn State and Notre Dame) Holmes started his career at Notre Dame as a running back before moving on to Penn State. There, Holmes moved to safety and played on special teams and impressed on scout team. He graduated with a degree in African-American Studies from Penn State and will be eligible in 2020 with two years remain-

Returning Production

The Golden Flashes are bringing back 68 percent of their offensive production from 2019, according to ESPN's SP+ rankings. That mark is good for sixth in the Mid-American Conference. The Golden Flashes bring back their leading passer and rusher (Dustin Crum) as well as their leading receiver (Isaiah McKoy).

One to Remember

Kent State's comeback against Buffalo was one for the ages. Down 27-6 with about eight minutes remaining, the Flashes stormed back. The Flashes ripped off the following: touchdown, onside kick, touchdown, blocked punt, touchdown (on fourth down) to tie the game at 27 (with 4:52 remaining). The Golden Flashes forced another Buffalo punt, setting up a Matthew Trickett "walk-off" 44-yard field goal. The win launched a fourgame win streak to end the season. ESPN rated the game the #18 game of 2019.

Longest Standing Rivalries

this week, by far the longest-standing matchup in program history. The next closest rivalries are Ohio (73rd meeting in 2020), Miami (68th), and Akron (63rd). The most-meetings between Kent State and a non-Mid-American Conference opponent are Baldwin-Wallace (23 meetings, haven't played since 1960) and Louisville (18).

It's Been a While

Kent State has not been 1-0 since a opening week victory in 2013. It's been even longer since the Flashes started 2-0, for that you have to go back to 1988 when the Flashes defeated a pair of local rivals in Youngstown State and Akron.
