**Setting the Stage:** Looking for its first eight-win season since 2008, the Black Hills State football team's final game of the season will involve beating a team they have never defeated, Colorado Mines. The Yellow Jackets carry the momentum of a 21-19 victory over Chadron State last week, the first victory against the region rival since 1986. The defense forced six turnovers in the game, including five interceptions to push the Yellow Jackets, who have 25 interceptions, on the brink of an RMAC record for team interceptions in a season at 26. Drew Hebel enters the game with the nation's lead with nine interceptions. Offensively, Phydell Paris has set three rushing records: single game, single season and career. Paris eclipsed the single season and career marks last week.

Last Meeting: Colorado Mines prevailed 62-22 last season after falling behind 27-3. The Yellow Jackets attempted a comeback late in the second quarter for a 27-16 score by the then No. 11 team in the nation pulled away behind 396 yards passing from Justin Dvorak. Ryan Hommel completed 20 passes for 34 yards and two touchdowns for the Yellow Jackets while Phydell Paris tallied 132 yards and a touchdown on the ground. He held an average of 8.3 yards per carry in the game.

**About Colorado Mines:** Colorado Mines rejoined the top-25 after defeating Adams State 42-7 last week. This week, the Orediggers look to share the RMAC Championship with Colorado Mesa and possibly CSU-Pueblo. CSM can achieve this with a victory. Against ASU, the RMAC's all-time leading passer Justin Dvorak threw for 336 yards and four touchdowns while Sam Seeton rushed for 102 yards. For the season, Dvorak has totaled 3,753 yards through the air with 43 touchdowns. Defensively, Chris Brockman leads the team with 71 tackles, including 10 for a loss. CSM has NCAA Division II's most potent offense, ranking No. 1 with 559.1 yards per game while Dvorak leads the nation in virtually every passing category.

**Series History:** The series only dates back to 2012 and four meetings, all won by Colorado Mines

**Coverage:** Yellow Jacket fans can catch Steve Ammerman on the call on The Eagle, 95.9/96.3 FM, or live online at MyEagleCountry.com. Ammerman is the voice of Yellow Jacket Athletics and can be heard on every football and men's/women's basketball game throughout the season.

**Temperature:** The five-day outlook shows sunny skies and a high of 69 degrees.

### **GENERAL NOTEBOOK**

**Looking for an Eighth Win:** The Yellow Jackets are in uncharted territory over the last decade at seven wins, which happened in 2007. The last time the Green and Gold had eight marked in the win column was 2006 when BHSU tallied an 8-3 record, won the Dakota Athletic Conference and went to the NAIA Playoffs before falling to Northwestern (lowa).

**30 Years in the Making:** Black Hills State claimed a 21-19 victory against Chadron State last weekend, the first win against the region rival since 1986. That dates back 15 meetings and when current Director of Athletics Jhett Albers was an Academic All-American for the Yellow Jacket football team.

**Rushing Record as a Junior:** Phydell Paris enters the 2016 finale as the Yellow Jackets all-time leading rusher for the first time. He has tallied 2,921 yards over his nearly three seasons of action and passed Jeff Englund against Chadron State for the personal accolade. Englund held the title at 2,835 yards after competing for the Green and Gold from 1988-1991. In the same game for Paris, he also set the single-season rushing mark, as he has 1,178 yards this year. He passed Tanner Ehrlich, who held the mark of 1,163 yards in 2008.

**Hebel Tops the Nation:** Drew Hebel leads the nation with his nine interceptions over ten games, an average of 0.9 interceptions per game. The sophomore has tied the school record for interceptions in a season and owns a pair of games where he has intercepted two passes. He also ranks highly in the nation with 1.6 passes defended per game, a number that leads the RMAC.

**Interceptions by the Bundle:** With five interceptions against Chadron State, the Yellow Jackets moved from second to first in the nation in total interceptions at 25. That number is the top interception mark in all of NCAA football across FCS, FBS, Division II and Division III. The Yellow Jackets have three games with four interceptions or more and own all three occurrences in the RMAC this year. The Green and Gold can tie the RMAC record for interceptions in a season with one more, or break it with two pickoffs against Colorado Mines.

**Don't Sack the Quarterback!:** Black Hills State ranks 10th in the nation with giving up less than a sack per game. The Yellow Jackets give up just 0.90 sacks per game, a number that also leads the conference.

**Turnovers Gained:** Coach Reiners has stated that one of the goals each game is to win the turnover battle and the Yellow Jackets have done just that and lead the nation with 32 turnovers gained. They also rank sixth in NCAA Division II with a 1.4 turnover margin.

**Football and Smarts:** Three members of the Yellow Jacket football team were named RMAC First Team All-Academic this past week. Phydell Paris was named to the squad for the second-straight year while JJ Kilgore and Jess Edens earned the nod for the first time. Paris owns a 3.36 GPA in psychology while Kilgore has a 3.51 in business administration and Edens a 3.72 in elementary education.

Player of the Week (Volume 2): After spending five years in the RMAC without a single Player of the Week honor, the Yellow Jackets have earned a weekly honor two weeks in a row. Phydell Paris earned the RMAC honor in

Week 5 of the season. In Week 6, Travis Groves and Alberto Mastrovito each garnered the honor. Groves had 12 tackles and an interception in the victory over Colorado Mesa while Mastrovito scored 12 points in his first career game. Mastrovito went 2-of-2 on field goal attempts and 6-of-6 on PAT's.

**Player of the Week (Volume 1):** When Phydell Paris was named the RMAC Offensive Player of the Week, he became the first Yellow Jacket football player to snag the weekly honor from the conference. The Yellow Jackets last Player of the Week came on October 4, 2010, when Levi Milliken was named the Dakota Athletic Conference Special Teams Player of the Week.

**Records are Made to be Broken:** The Yellow Jackets set two school records in the 36-10 victory over New Mexico Highlands. Phydell Paris broke the single-game rushing record with 244 yards on 31 carries. Overall, the Yellow Jacket team broke the single-game record with 447 yards rushing. True freshman Payten Gilmore also tallied over 100 yards with 107 on the afternoon.

**Captains:** The Yellow Jacket captains, as chosen by their teammates, will have a familiar look as three of the four are repeats from 2015. Andrew Blaylock, Damon Goldhammer and Phydell Paris all earned the Captain nod for the second-straight year. JJ Kilgore joins the group as a fourth captain.

#### **OFFENSIVE NOTEBOOK**

- Phydell Paris ranks second in the RMAC and 11th in the nation with his 1,178 total yards and 130.9 yards per game average. Both marks rank second in the RMAC, behind the nation's leader in the category Austin Ekeler.
- The 217 yards receiving Shandon Jones had against Colorado Mesa ranks as the single-best receiving performance in 2016 in the RMAC.
- You would have to go back before 2004 to find the last time the Yellow Jackets accounted for more than 600 yards of to-



tal offense. The Yellow Jackets pushed the offense to 607 yards against New Mexico Highlands. Full single-game stats are unavailable prior to the 2004 season.

### **DEFENSIVE NOTEBOOK**

- After five interceptions at Chadron State last week, the Yellow Jacket football team has tallied 25 interceptions in 2016, setting a new team mark in the category. The former record was 20 interceptions in 1979.
- The Yellow Jacket defense ranks second in the RMAC with a pass defense efficiency of 114.3. The Yellow Jackets allow just 53.6 percent of passes to be completed as part of the efficiency and leads the league with 25 interceptions, a league lead by 10.
- With all the interceptions the Green and Gold have, it has gotten lost that Travis Groves ranks sixth in teh conference with 1.0 passes defended per game.
- The Yellow Jackets rank second in the conference with 22 sacks in 2016. That is a step up from 2015 when the Green and Gold tallied just nine sacks on the season.
- There have been three games of six turnovers caused in 2016 in the RMAC, and all three games were Yellow Jacket defensive plays.
- Black Hills State had a great start to the season by sacking th Adams State quarterback four times. That total is nearly half of the entire 2015 season where the defense got to the quarterback just nine times.

### SPECIAL TEAMS NOTEBOOK

- In his first career game, Alberto Mastrovito scored 12 points as the Yellow Jackets upset No. 13 Colorado Mesa. Mastrovito hit field goals of 25 and 40 yards and went 6-of-6 on point after touchdown attempts.
- Trey Fleming had a strong day at Fort Lewis, kicking a career-long 42-yard field goal and going 4-of-4 on PAT attempts. The wide receiver turned kicker/punter also punted three times for an average of 45.0 yards and a long of 57. If that wasn't enough, he also caught six passes for 107 yards.

## **Around the RMAC**

- David Tann (CMU/RB) rushed for a career-high 272 yards against New Mexico Highlands this past week. He helped the Mavericks break the RMAC record for single-game rushing yards with 708 yards. He added four touchdowns to his day, part of an RMAC record 10 rushing touchdowns.
- Brandon Payer (LB/CSUP) was a key contributer in CSU-Pueblo's 10-7 victory over Western State. He accounted for 12 tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss and two pass break-ups in the win. The Thunder-Wolves defense allowed just 66 yards in the second half and only 58 rushing yards the entire game.
- Joseph Cavale (K/FLC) accounted for nine points in Fort Lewis' 52-52 overtime win over South Dakota Mines. He was a perfect six for six on PAT's and hit his lone field goal attempt of the game from 30 yards. Handling the punting duties as well, Cavale averaged 50 yards on two punts.

# John Reiners Head Coach • Fifth Season Career record: 17-37

ohn Reiners is in his fifth year as head coach of the Black Hills State University football team, earning the distinction of the 28th head coach in school history after spending three years (2009-2011) as the offensive and recruiting coordinator.

2015 saw Reiners coach the first 1,000-yard rusher in the NCAA-era at BHSU as Phydell Paris tallied 1,066 yards. Andrew Blaylock earned Honorable Mention All-RMAC on the offensive line while Paris and Cody Okray were named First Team All-Academic from the RMAC.

The 2014 season saw the Yellow Jackets have three members named RMAC All-Conference including second team selection Luke Whalen. Ward Anderson and Trent Boner each garnered honorable mention nods. During the season, the Green and Gold posted 4,766 yards of total offense, a school record. Against rival South Dakota Mines, the Yellow Jackets posted five passing touchdowns from Ward Anderson, ranking third-all time along with Anthony Eborieme receiving 194 yards, also third all-time.

The 2013 season saw the Yellow Jackets go 3-8 (3-6 RMAC) after closing the season with wins at Fort Lewis and at home against Western State. The final game of the season, against Western State, was a shootout with the Yellow Jackets putting up a season-high 50 points with 476 yards of total offense.

The offensive line was impressive, allowing the second-fewest sacks in the league at just 17 and the lowest amount of yards lost per sack. The Yellow Jackets also committed the least amount of penalties in the RMAC.

In his first season (2012) as the Jackets' head coach, Reiners led the team to a 4-7 (3-6 RMAC) record at season's end after closing out the season with a three-game win streak where Reiners' squad averaged 31.3 points per game and gave up a mere 10.3 points per game defensively on the way to outscoring their opponents 94-31 in that stretch. Under Reiners' watch, the Jackets were the least penalized team in the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference in 2012 and his BHSU team raised their GPA by one-half percent.

In his first season as offensive coordinator, the Yellow Jackets led the Dakota Athletic Conference in rushing and in the last two years of the DAC, he coached eight first-team All-Conference selections and nine second-team All-Conference selections.

While serving as an assistant coach at Chadron State for 14 years, Reiners was the head track and field coach for 11 seasons. Under his guidance, the Eagles set 60 new school records and earned All-American honors 34 times. His track & field teams had the highest GPA among all NCAA Division II teams (3.35 men) in 2007, according to the U.S Track and Field Coaches Association.

At CSC, he was very active on the academic side of things as he spent the first three years as an Academic Coordinator with the Academic Gameplan Program (AGP), a program that promoted and guided student-athletes to successful academic work.

Standouts that Reiners coached at CSC include current San Diego Charger and Harlon Hill Award winner in the 2006-07 season, Danny Woodhead, from 2004-07. He also coached tight-end Jess Clarke in 1999.


Reiners is a graduate of Republican Valley High School at Indianola, Neb., where he was a football standout and won the Class C 800 meter run at the Nebraska State High School Track & Field Meet as a senior with a time of 1:56.69. Reiners earned one letter in track at Chadron State as a freshman before focusing on football full-time. He went on to letter four years in football for the Eagles as wide receiver. Reiners earned a bachelor's and a master's degree from CSC in 1995 and 1997, respectively.

John is married to the former Jennifer Vasey, a native of Laramie, Wyoming, who is one of Chadron State's all-time great volleyball players and was inducted to the CSC Hall of Fame in 2010. Together they have one son Dylan and three daughters Ashtyn, Addi, and Kali.
