QUICK HITS

- This is Head Coach Kyle Borshoff's seventh season at the helm. He was previously an assistant coach at BU from 2014-16, and prior to Binghamton, he was an assistant head coach at American University from 2011-15.
- This year is the 55th year of wrestling at Binghamton, and 23rd as a Division I program.
- Binghamton started as a Division III program in 1969 and elevated to Division II in 1998 and Division I in 2001.
- Program has a strong alumni following, headed by Hollywood actor and former Binghamton wrestler Billy Baldwin '85.
- Binghamton has produced 59 NCAA qualifiers since joining Division I in 2001, including four in 2024.
- The Bearcats have crowned six All-Americans since 2009. Lou DePrez, one of Binghamton's national qualifiers for 2024, has earned All-American honors twice in his career (2020-21).
- Brevin Cassella, Cory Day, and Jacob Nolan, who are all in the 2024 NCAA Wrestling Championships, each qualified for the 2023 tournament. Nolan won two matches in the consolations, as Binghamton finished the event tied for 50th.

Seventh Season as Head Coach at BU (American '10)

Kyle Borshoff was announced as head coach in December 2017.

He is in his ninth season with the Bearcats, his seventh as head coach.

In 2023-24, Borshoff led Binghamton to one of its most successful seasons in recent memory. With an overall record of 9-4 and an EIWA record of 7-3, Binghamton won its most overall and dual matches since 2018-19 (10-3, 8-2 EIWA). Among the highlights for the season was the program's first win over a top 20 team in Division I, when the Bearcats defeated #18 Navy 18-17 on Jan. 21. He also led the Bearcats to a 21-15 win at Northwestern on Feb. 16, the program's first victory over a Big Ten opponent since 2017. During the season, the Bearcats had a wrestler named Wrestler of the Week by the EIWA four times, receiving the honor three weeks in a row from Feb. 13-26.

In his seven seasons as head coach in Vestal, Borshoff has guided the Bearcats to 46 wins, tied for third-most in program history. Under Borshoff's watch, Lou DePrez has won three individual EIWA championships while becoming the first two-time Division I All-American in program history. In total, Binghamton has had 19 qualifiers for the NCAA Wrestling Championships with Borshoff at the helm.

Before arriving at Binghamton in 2015, Borshoff was on the staff at American University for five years, serving as head assistant coach for the final four seasons (2011-2015). There, he helped the Eagles produce five All-Americans and 13 Academic All-Americans. American finished in the top-20 at the NCAA Championship two times in his five years, including a fifth-place showing in 2010.

His leadership in the academics realm helped American earn the second-highest wrestling GPA in the nation.

Borshoff also served as head coach of the Maryland high school national team, where he trained and coached 36 All-Americans and two national champions.

In his elite collegiate wrestling career at American, Borshoff was a three-time NCAA qualifier and a two-time All-American (2009, 2010). He was a four-time EIWA placewinner and went on to become a three-time World Team Trials qualifier.

He earned his bachelor's degree in business administration: real estate finance from American in 2010. He also received his master's degree in health promotion management in 2015.

A native of Pittsford, N.Y., a suburb of Rochester, Borshoff is the son of Binghamton Hall of Fame member Tim Borshoff '76.



ASSISTANT COACH CODY REED

Cody Reed is in his first season of his second stint as an assistant coach of the Binghamton wrestling team. He previously served as a graduate assistant coach for the Bearcats during the 2015-16 season.

Reed, who is from Walton, N.Y., competed for the Bearcats from 2009-14. In his last three seasons, he qualified for the NCAA Wrestling Championships. In 2014, he made it to the quarterfinals at 197 lbs. In 2012, Reed also upset No. 4 seed Christian Boley of Maryland in the first round of the tournament.

Throughout his collegiate career, Reed compiled a record of 94-62. 42 of those wins came in duals. In 2013, he won the Coastal Athletic Association championship at 184 lbs. He also reached the finals in the 2014 EIWA Championships at 197 lbs.

Reed also enjoyed a decorated wrestling career at Walton High School. He won 141 matches during his career. Additionally, he placed sixth in the 2009 NYSPHSAA Wrestling Championships at 171 lbs.

Reed lives in Binghamton with his wife Rachel and daughter Adalyn.



ASSISTANT COACH ANTHONY SOBOTKER

Anthony Sobotker is in his first season as an assistant coach of the Binghamton wrestling team.

A native of North Babylon, N.Y., Sobotker wrestled at Binghamton from 2020-23. In that span, he won 23 matches for the Bearcats. Among his highlights was when he finished seventh at the EIWA Championships in 2021. The following season, Sobotker pinned 11 opponents to rank among the leaders in the country in that category. He would finish seventh at the Cliff Keen Las Vegas Wrestling Invitational in December of 2021, and go on to lead the Bearcats in team points that season with 50.

Before Binghamton, Sobotker wrestled at Nassau Community College. In two seasons, Sobotker won 61 of his 70 matches. He took home the 2020 NJCAA Wrestling Eastern A District Championship while being named an honorable mention All-American.

Sobotker also enjoyed success at North Babylon High School. He compiled 168 wins throughout his high school career. On the state level, Sobotker finished second his senior year and third his junior year. Additionally, he made the league finals four times and was a League 5 champion twice. Sobotker was also selected to the All Long Island Second Team in 2018 and won the Suffolk County Rohan Murphy Inspirational Wrestler of the Year award as a junior.

Aside from coaching, Sobotker is pursuing his master's degree in public administration at Binghamton.
