QUICK SIX

- The Huskies avoided a three-game losing streak for the first time since losing four straight (2009-last three games and 2010- first game) by beating the Vulcans, 20-13.
- In the win over Cal, the Huskies rallied from 13 points down to get the win. The last time the Huskies trailed by 10 or more points and came back to win was in 2014 against this week's opponent Mercyhurst. Bloomsburg went on to win that game 38-22.
- Bloomsburg has won six of the last eight games it has played against California, but the Huskies biggest margin of victory in any game is just seven points.
- Tim Kelly has more career victories (31) than any other Super Region One quarterback and more starts (37) than any other PSAC player.
- Bloomsburg is aiming for its third straight PSAC East title this season. The Huskies have achieved that feat twice previously, winning four division titles in a row from 1994-97 and 2000-03.
- The Huskies intercepted Cal quarterback James Harris three times last week. In 2014 the Huskies had four games with three or more interceptions.

LAST WEEK

A 24-yard touchdown run by Lawrence Elliott Jr. with 2:40 to play lifted the Bloomsburg University Huskies to a 20-13, come-from-behind win over California (Pa) on Saturday afternoon. The Huskies trailed the Vulcans 13-0 late in the second quarter, but held the Vulcans scoreless over the final two plus quarters of the game.

The Mercyhurst University football team rallied from a 14-point second quarter deficit and then needed a missed field goal as time expired to defeat the visiting Golden Rams of West Chester University, 37-35, in a Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) East-West contest. The Lakers improved to 2-0 on the season.

SERIES HISTORY

This will be the just the sixth meeting between the two teams since Mercyhurst became a member of the PSAC. In four of the first five meetings the teams met at Mercyhurst. The only win for the Huskies at home in the series was in 2008 when the Huskies won 24-0.

ONE OF THE NATION'S BEST

The Huskies have been one of the most successful programs in not only the PSAC and the region but the nation over the past decade-plus. Since the beginning of the 2000 season, only three Division II teams have more victories than Bloomensburg's 143.

NUMBERS TO KNOW

► **10** - Points scored by the Huskies vs. Stonehill, the fewest scored by Bloomensburg in a season opener since 2009 when it scored 10 vs. Ashland (W, 10-7)

► **16** - The Huskies have recorded 16 straight winning seasons.

► **32-7** - This year's Huskies senior class has a 32-7 record over the past three years.

► **49** - The number of wins (in 59 games) that the Huskies have had a rusher gain at least 100 yards in a game that Bloomensburg has won.

► **10** - The number of receptions in two games this season for Chad Hoffman. Through two games last year Hoffman had just two catches.

► **.771** - BU has compiled a .771 overall winning percentage in 18 seasons with head coach Paul Darragh on staff.

► **1,000** - Bloomensburg has had a 1,000-yard rusher in 13 out of the last 15 seasons.

LAST YEAR'S MEETING

The Huskies rallied from an early 14-0 deficit to post a 38-22 win at Mercyhurst. The Huskies got 117 yards and two scores from Eddie Mateo in the game, but it was the strength of the defense and special teams which helped turn the tide of the game.

Bill LaBadie and DJ Robinson intercepted passes and returned them for scores with the day's final points coming from Lawrence Elliott Jr. who brought back a punt 70 yards for a TD which clinched the win.

MERCYHURST COACH

MARTY SCHAETZLE

Marty Schaetzle begins his 14th season at the helm of the Mercyhurst football program. Over his first 13 seasons, Schaetzle has guided the Lakers to a 69-74 overall record and a 50-61 mark in conference play. Since Mercyhurst joined the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) in 2008, which ended a 13-year affiliation with the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC), Schaetzle and the Lakers have gone 48-31 overall and 32-19 against western division foes.

Under Schaetzle, Mercyhurst has had four winning seasons over the last five years, including the program's best season in 2010. That year, the Lakers accumulated the most victories in program history (10), claimed their first-ever conference championship with a 56-37 win over Bloomensburg, earned their first-ever NCAA postseason tournament berth, and claimed their first-ever NCAA tournament win with a 28-14 victory over Bloomensburg. The season ended with a setback to #18 Shepherd in the NCAA Quarterfinals at Tullio Field in early December.

Schaetzle surpassed current Director of Athletics Joe Kimball as the longest tenured football coach in program history and his 71 wins are the most ever by a Mercyhurst football coach. Five years ago, Schaetzle broke a victories' tie with Kimball and Tony DeMeo, the program's first-ever coach, by capturing win #42 with a 28-14 win over Bloomensburg in the NCAA playoffs. For his efforts in 2010, Schaetzle was named PSAC Coach of the Year, Don Hansen Football Gazette co-Coach of the Year, and was a top five finalist for the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year. His 2010 squad was also named the Division II Lambert Meadowlands Team of the Year.



HUSKIES PICKED FIRST IN PSAC EAST PRESEASON POLL

► The Bloomsburg University football team has been chosen as the favorites in the 2015 Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) Eastern Division Preseason Coaches Poll released in August. Bloomsburg is coming off a 2014 season that saw the Huskies finish 11-2 overall, winning the PSAC East and reaching the national quarterfinals of the NCAA Division II Playoffs.

CAPTAINS NAMED

The Bloomsburg University football team has named its captains for the 2015 season with Tim Kelly (Camp Hill/Cedar Cliff) and Ryan Geiger (Southampton/La Salle) again taking captaincy along with Gary Postell (Philadelphia/Bishop McDevitt) and Donovan Morris (Philadelphia/George Washington).

It will mark the second season for Kelly and Geiger as captains while Morris and Postell have been elected to the positions for the first time. A three-year starter at quarterback, Kelly has led the Huskies to a 30-6 record in 36 starts. He also ranks fourth all-time in Huskies career passing yards with 5,955 and is fourth in touchdown passes with 50.

Geiger was named first team All-PSAC East and first team Daktronics All-Super Region 1 after moving to center from guard this past season.

Postell has earned all-conference honors the past two seasons including a first team nod in 2014. He has accumulated 161 career tackles with four forced fumbles in three seasons as a starter at cornerback.

Morris earned a spot on the All-PSAC East Second Team last year after starting all 13 games at safety and finishing with 65 tackles, 10 pass deflections and a team-high five interceptions.

FROM THE ARCHIVES

Over the 22 seasons since 1994, the Huskies have lost the first game of the year nine times. Their record in game two in those seasons is now 6-3. The only three years they lost their first two games were 1994, 1998, and 2000, and in each case won the third game. They have not lost three straight to begin a season since 1992, the year before the coach Danny Hale became head coach.

With the victory against California, over that same 22-year period Bloomsburg has a record of 12-10 in its first road game of the season, including wins in the last five. The victory also continued the team's outstanding record during the past 16 seasons since 1999 versus the PSAC West, now 46-15, including a 24-5 record at home as the Huskies prepare to face Mercyhurst.

WETTY NAMED PSAC EAST DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Joe Wetty (Downingtown/Downingtown East) has been named the PSAC (Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference) Eastern Division Defensive Player of the Week for week two of the 2015 season.

Wetty helped the Huskies rally from a 13-0 deficit to post a 20-13 win. The redshirt junior made six tackles on the day, five of them solo, including three sacks for 22 yards in losses. Two of his three sacks came in the fourth quarter. One was a three-yard loss on fourth down which ended a drive. The second was on Cal's last possession for a 12-yard loss which pushed the Vulcans back deep in their own territory.

A TALE OF TWO HALVES VERSUS CALIFORNIA

After allowing 243 yards of total offense to the Vulcans in the first half of their game on Saturday, the Huskies defense stepped up and made a big turnaround in the second half. Bloomsburg gave up just 115 yards of total offense and no points to Cal in the second 30 minutes. Cal had 12 first half first downs and just five in the second half. In time of possession the Vulcans totalled just 8:10 in the second half.

BIG DAY FOR ELLIOTT JR. AGAINST CAL

It was a big day for Lawrence Elliott Jr who rushed for a career-high 166 yards and one score against Cal. Elliott, who had just 28 yards in the Huskies opener versus Stonehill, had 70 yards at the half, including a 53-yard run to set up a field goal. In the second half he gained 96 yards and scored the game winner TD on a 24-yard run with 2:40 to play.

Senior quarterback Tim Kelly has been tremendously successful over his first three years as the starter, posting a 31-7 career record with his 30 victories being the most among active Super Region One quarterbacks. He continues to climb up in the Huskies record books – as he ranks fourth all-time in BU history with 6,204 yards passing. His 51 career touchdown passes are also fourth in school history with Glen McNamee's 57 next in line.

COMEBACK KIDS

The last four times the Huskies have dropped their season opening game the team has gone on to have a successful season. In 2010 the team went 10-3 reaching the NCAA playoffs; while in 2006 the Huskies posted a mark of 12-2 and reached the NCAA semifinals. In 2002 the team rebounded by going 8-2. In 2000 the Huskies started 0-2, but came back and reached the NCAA title game, while in 1999 the Huskies put up a mark of 7-4.

SEEKING A THREE-PEAT

Bloomsburg has won the PSAC East title in each of the past two years and will look to win the division for a third consecutive year this fall. The Huskies have accomplished that feat multiple times, winning four division championships in a row from 1994-97 and again from 2000-03. The 2013 and 2014 seasons represent the fifth time that the program has won the East in back-to-back seasons – 1984-85; 1994-97; 2000-03; 2005-06; 2013-14.

GEIGER NAMED PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN

Senior center Ryan Geiger was tabbed a preseason All-American by The Sporting News. Geiger, a captain for the second year in a row, has started every game over the past two seasons. He moved to center last year from left guard and was named All-PSAC East as well as First Team Daktronics All-Super Region 1. Geiger helped the Huskies to over 223 yards per game on the ground in 2014 while he and his offensive line mates surrendered a PSAC-low six sacks.

GETTING DEFENSIVE

The Huskies have allowed 14 points or less in 15 of the 27 games in the head coaching tenure of Paul Darragh.

ROAD SUCCESS

The Huskies have not been afraid of travel in recent years, posting a 29-9 record away from home since 2009 (.757).

SCORE FIRST AND WIN

Bloomsburg has never lost when scoring first under head coach Paul Darragh - the Huskies are 14-0 when scoring first during the Darragh Era.

PUTTING UP THE POINTS

The Huskies are 111-3 when scoring 40 points all-time. Bloomsburg tied the school record of seven games with 40+points in 2013 (2005, 2007, 2012, 2013).

CLOSING THE DEAL

The Huskies are 19-0 under head coach Paul Darragh when leading at halftime and 20-0 when leading after three quarters.

HUSKIES IN THE NFL

BloomSBurg currently has three players on NFL rosters.

Jahri Evans ('06) continues to be a stalwart at right tackle for the New Orleans Saints, again serving as a starter in front of quarterback Drew Brees. Evans, a fourth round pick of the Saints in 2006, is a six-time Pro Bowl selection and considered one of the NFL's best at his position. In 2011 he was named as one of the 100 Greatest Players in the NFL and won a Super Bowl ring with the Saints in 2009.

Defensive end Larry Webster became the second-highest NFL Draft pick in school history this past May when he was selected in the fourth round (136th overall) by the Detroit Lions in 2014. He had 13.5 sacks in 2012 and 12.5 in 2013 for the Huskies. Webster was signed to the Lions practice squad after being waived at the end of preseason.

Matt Feiler, who like Webster was an All-American for the Huskies in 2013, was signed as a free agent following the draft by the Houston Texans. Feiler, an offensive tackle, was waived by the Texans at the end of the preseason, but was signed to the Pittsburgh Steelers practice squad.

Paul Darragh

HEAD COACH • THIRD SEASON

Paul Darragh was named head coach of Bloomsburg University on Dec. 6, 2013 after being appointed as interim head coach in February 2013. Overall he will be starting his 19th season with the Huskies in 2015 and third as head coach.

The first two seasons of the Darragh Era will go down as two of the strongest in Huskies history. Darragh has posted a 21-4 overall record, back-to-back PSAC East titles, two NCAA Playoff berths and an overall PSAC Championship while being named PSAC East Coach of the Year in both 2013 and 2014. He also became the fastest Huskies head coach to reach 20 victories.

The 2014 edition of the Huskies won their first 10 games on the way to an 11-2 record, again clinching the PSAC East crown and the No. 2 seed in the Super Region One Playoff bracket. Bloomsburg then reached the Regional Championship Game with a second round playoff win over Virginia State to remain as one of the final eight teams in the nation left playing. Darragh guided a team that excelled on both sides of the ball - the offense recorded over 220 yards of rushing and nearly 34 points per game. Defensively, Bloomsburg ranked first in the PSAC and sixth in the nation in scoring defense while surrendering just 15.4 points per game. The Huskies also led Division II in turnovers generated, recording a school record 43 and led the country in turnover margin at +30. A PSAC-best 14 players were named All-Conference following the year including senior middle linebacker Justin Shirk who earned PSAC East and Daktronics Super Region One Defensive Player of the Year honors.

During the 2013 season Darragh led the Huskies to a 10-2 record, a PSAC championship and a berth in the NCAA Playoffs as part of the best season for any first-year head coach in Bloomsburg history. He was named the PSAC Eastern Division Coach of the Year. The Huskies took home numerous awards following the season including having four All-Americans and the 2013 Harlon Hill Award winner in running back Franklyn Quiteh. Darragh also coached All-American defensive end Larry Webster who was selected in the fourth round of the NFL Draft by the Detroit Lions as well as offensive lineman Matt Feiler who was signed to the practice squad of the Houston Texans.

Darragh previously served as the Huskies' defensive coordinator for 16 years under legendary head coach Danny Hale. Under Darragh's leadership the Huskies' defense has ranked in the top-half of the PSAC in total defense seven of his last 11 seasons in the role, including back-to-back second place finishes in 2000 and 2001 and a second place in 2009. The Huskies have also ranked among the best in the PSAC in run defense finishing first or second five times, including second in two of the last four seasons.

The 2009 Huskies finished third nationally in scoring defense (13.36/game), pacing the PSAC. BU also led the conference in sacks, ranking 14th nationally (3.09 per game). In 2010 the Huskies were eighth in Division II in rushing defense (85.38 yards per game). Overall under Darragh's leadership, the Bloomsburg defense finished in the top-15 in NCAA Division II six times since the 2000 season.
