

Meet our coaches...



Head Football Coach Quarterbacks and Receivers Coach DEWEY LUSK

Dewey Lusk enters his sixth season with the Bluefield Rams as the 10th head coach in Bluefield University history and the third since the program was reinstituted in 2012. In his first year as Head Coach, Lusk led the Rams to a 6-5 record, the most wins since the program was reinstituded in 2012. In the previous five seasons, the Rams were 5-50. The six wins were more than all seasons 2012-16 combined!

Lusk brings over 35 years of coaching experience to the Rams coaching staff. He was the head

coach at UVa-Wise where he helped guide the Highland Cavaliers in the transition from a NAIA program to a NCAA Division II school. Prior to becoming the head coach, he was associate head coach and offensive coordinator from 2005-2010. During his stint as the offensive coordinator, Lusk helped UVa-Wise become one of the most vaunted offensive juggernauts in NAIA football and in 2007 won a share of the Mid-South East Conference Championship. In 2008 the Cavalier offense finished fourth in the NAIA in scoring offense (41.4 ppg) while finishing second in the nation in pass efficiency (174.9) and total offense (477.5 yds/gm). Former Arena Football League Player of the Year quaterback, Randy Hippeard, highlighted the offensive attack and became the first UVa-Wise quarterback to lead the nation in total offense and passing yards in 2008.

A graduate of Emory & Henry, Lusk served his alma mater as offensive coordinator in addition to head baseball coach from 1991-2005. As offensive coordinator, Lusk led the Wasps to eight ODAC championships (1990, 1992, 1994, 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998 and 2000), three NCAA Division III playoff bids and two undefeated regular seasons. Lusk also coached the college's first Dudley Award winner which is given annually to Virginia's top college collegiate football player. On the diamond he led the Wasps to more victories than any other coach in Emory & Henry history and was named ODAC Coach of the Year in 1998. Lusk earned his master's degree from Gardner-Webb University where he served as the wide receiver's coach and athletic recruiter. He helped the Running Bulldogs win the 1987 South Atlantic Conference Championship and earn a NAIA playoff bid.

A native of Christiansburg, VA, and a graduate of Christiansburg High School (1981), Lusk is married to the former Mily Dover of Shelby, NC, and is father of a son, Gil, age 30 and a daughter, Landi, age 28.





Associate Head Football Coach Defensive Coordinator/Linebackers DINO KAKLIS

Dino Kaklis begins his sixth season at Bluefield University as Defensive Coodinator. In 2018, the unit produced the school's first NAIA All-American linebacker, DaMarcus Wimbush.

Before coming to Bluefield, Kaklis was the outside linebackers coach at North Carolina A&T and spent two seasons at UVa-Wise as defensive coordinator and assistant head coach.

Kaklis began his coaching career at Bishop Verot Catholic High School in Fort Myers, FL. He spent three seasons (1996-1998) as their co-defensive coordinator. He spent the next season (1999) as the defensive coordinator at Maine Maritime Academy. Over the next two seasons (2000-2001), Kaklis was the assistant football coach at Saint Francis University (PA).

In 2002, Kaklis was named head coach at Bethel University where he was named Mid-South Conference West Division Coach of the Year four times and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year for NAIA in 2006 and 2007. In 2006, Kaklis was named the NAIA Sportexe Coach of the Year. He left as Bethel's all-time leader in wins (60) which included a 2011 playoff berth. Kaklis spent two seasons (2012-2013) at Eastern Illinois as the defensive line coach.

Kaklis was a four-year letterman at Purdue. He graduated from the university with a degree in movement and sports science in 1996 before obtaining a master's degree in education from Bethel University in 2003.

He is married to Nicole Chicklo-Kaklis and has two daughters, Isabella and Gabriella.





Offensive Coordinator/Offensive Line MICHAEL KETCHUM

Michael Ketchum starts his fifth season as the Offensive Coordinator for the Rams. He comes to Bluefield from Hampton University where in 2017 he was Defensive Coordinator. Ketchum's defense finished third in the MEAC in scoring defense and 10th in the nation. In 2021 Ketchum was named the Appalachian Division of the Mid-South Conference Assistant Coach of the Year, serving as the offensive coordinator for a Bluefield unit that averaged 38.9 points, threw for 3,819 yards (second-best in the NAIA) and 44 touchdowns (most in the country).

Ketchum was head coach at his alma mater, Guilford College, from 1991-2004. He won the school's only conference championship and was twice named Conference Coach of the Year. From 1996-2002 he also served as Guilford's Director of Athletics. Prior to those positions, Ketchum was Guilford's defensive coordinator for three seasons, while also serving as strength and conditioning coach and recruiting coordinator. His first collegiate coaching job was at Carson-Newman where he served as offensive line coach from 1985-86, and defensive line coach in 1987. While at Carson-Newman, the school won the 1986 national championship and was the national runner-up in 1987.

From 1983-84 Ketchum served as a graduate assistant for the University of Florida Gators where he received a master's degree in education. He coached the team's offensive line and tight ends, and was part of the 1983 team that won the SEC championship and the Gator Bowl.

Ketchum is a native of Greensboro, NC. He and his wife, Belinda, have two children, Lilly and Matt.

Defensive Line
ROD HOWARD

Rod Howard, a Memphis native, begins his sixth year at Bluefield University as Defensive Line Coach. His coaching experience includes volunteering at the University of Mississippi under the special teams coordinator/linebackers coach; George Washington Carver High School, defensive line; and Melrose High School, defensive line. Howard attended Harding University and Lambuth University before concluding his playing career at the University of Memphis where he lettered and received his bachelor's degree. His accalades as a coach include: Coached a player who

finished 3rd in the conference (2021) in tackles for loss; coached the Armed Forces Merit Award Winner; facilitated the first shut out in school history vs Edward Waters (2017); first wins in school history vs Cumberland KY (2017), Point University (2017), Union College (2017), St. Andrews (2017), Warner U (2017), Cumberland TN (2018), Allen University (2018), Kentucky Christian (2018), Emory & Henry (2021) and Thomas More University (2022).



Defensive Backs
DEVON JACKSON

Devon Jackson returns to Bluefield University and is in his third season with Bluefield. Jackson was a four-year letterman for Bluefield University, graduating in 2019. During his career at BU he was a three-time Mid-South Conference Player of the Week, named to the Mid-South Conference Appalachian Division All-Conference Team, and the NCCAA All-American Team.



Offensive Assistant BRYAN CARR

Bryan Carr is in his first season as an offensive assistant for the Rams. Carr graduated from Concord University where he played tight end from 2011-12. He begin his career at West Virginia Wesleyan College and later transferred to Concord University. He coached offensive line at Concord University from 2013-15. He currently is a firefighter and EMT for the City of Bluefield, West Virginia.



Running Backs GIL LUSK

Lusk, or "Coach Gil" as he is affectionately called, began his coaching career in the spring of 2011 while still playing football at UVa-Wise. As a standout varsity catcher at Powell Valley High School, the two-time All-District LPD and two-time 2nd Team All-Region D catcher was named head junior varsity baseball coach, and assistant varsity baseball coach at Appalachia High School. His primary focus was the pitchers and catchers on the varsity team, and he also called every pitch thrown that year. While coaching, Lusk continued his studies at UVa-Wise

while also playing football. Lusk played as a special teamer his first two seasons but would eventually become a starting slot receiver during the final two years of his playing campaign. He earned academic honors at both the NAIA and NCAA levels. He was two-time Academic All-Conference in both the Mid-South and the Mountain East Conference(s) (four total), as well as two-time Academic All-American in both the NAIA and NCAA Division II (four total). Coach Gil also received The Mountain East Athletic Director's Award twice, along with the Charlie Price Award; given annually to the senior football player who displays hustle, commitment, character, and spirited teamwork. He graduated from UVa-Wise in 2015, Cum Laude, with a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration. After a brief stint in sales, Lusk returned to the gridiron in 2017 to coach alongside his father, head coach Dewey Lusk, at Bluefield University. Originally hired on as a volunteer, Coach Gil has now been a full-time employee of the school for over four years. In that time span he has coached wide receivers and is now working as the running backs' coach. Lusk recently received his master's degree in Business Administration from Bluefield University.



Special Teams
PHILLIP DUNFORD

Dunford is in his third season with the Bluefield University. A 1993 graduate of Big Creek High School, he was a three-year member of the All-Area Team and a WV All-State selection at defensive end as a senior. At Concord University he was Special Teams Player of the Week six times, Special Teams Player of the Year twice, and Special Teams captain. He was also a member of the baseball team where he was a two-year WVIAC All-Conference player. He was bullpen catcher for the Bristol White Sox and Princeton Devil Rays. He has three children Adyn, Brandon and Kimber.






Winning and creating a culture of athletic success takes time and money. Our Athletics staff is committed to developing players with strong Christian character. But, we need your help.


