- · Mutts scored the most points in a Blue Hen debut since Keith Davis scored 24 vs. Delaware State on Nov. 22, 1996.
- · Ryan Allen added 21 points and tied his career-high by knocking down six three-pointers. Allen connected on his first five threepoint attempts, and finished with six treys for the fifth time in his
- · Kevin Anderson handed out a career-high nine assists while the Blue Hens' 25 assists were the most since UD dished out 26 vs. William & Mary on Feb. 1, 2003.
- · Collin Goss scored a career-high 13 points while adding six rebounds and a career-best four assists.
- · Redshirt freshman Aleks Novakovich scored 11 points and grabbed five rebounds in his Blue Hen debut while freshman Ebby Asamoah added 10 points, four rebounds and three assists.
- · Nate Darling, who missed the opener with a lower right leg injury, is questionable for tonight's game.

DELAWARE VS. OAKLAND

Tonight's game is the first ever meeting between Delaware and Oakland.

DELAWARE VS. HORIZON LEAGUE

Delaware is winless in six games vs. Horizon League opponents. The Blue Hens fell to Detroit Mercy in 1957, 1958 and 1970, and to Cleveland State during the 2005-06 and 2006-07 seasons.

Martin Ingelsby is 0-1 vs. Horizon League opponents, as the Blue Hens fell to Northern Kentucky, 74-53, on Nov. 19, 2016 at the Miami (Ohio) Tournament.

DARLING OUESTIONABLE WITH LEG INJURY

Nate Darling did not play in Tuesday's season opener vs. Bridgewater with a lower right leg injury. He is questionable for tonight's game vs. Oakland.

LAST TIME OUT

Justyn Mutts posted a double-double with gamehighs of 23 points and 13 rebounds while Ryan Allen added 21 points as the Blue Hens rolled to a 97-51 season opening win over Bridgewater College Tuesday night at the Bob Carpenter Center.

Mutts finished 9 of 12 from the field in his UD debut, while Allen drilled six three-pointers in the rout. Collin Goss contributed a career-high 13 points to go with six boards, while Aleks Novakovich scored 11 points and Ebby Asamoah chipped in 10 during their Blue Hen debuts. Kevin Anderson narrowly missed a double-double with nine points and a career-best nine assists on the night.

Delaware shot 58.2 percent from the field, knocked down 13 three-pointers, handed out 25 assists and enjoyed a 44-25 rebounding advantage during the dominating victory. The Blue Hens also held a 52-10 margin in points in the paint and a 20-0 edge in second chance points.

The Blue Hens, who never trailed in the game, held an eight-point lead seven minutes into the contest before exploding for a 15-point run, going up 38-15 on an Allen triple at the 6:58 mark. The margin grew to as much as 31 in the opening half before UD settled for a 55-26 lead at the break.

Delaware took its largest lead of the night at 90-37 on a three-pointer by Asamoah with seven minutes to play.

QUITE AN OPENING NIGHT

Delaware rolled to a 97-51 victory over Bridgewater on Tuesday, scoring its fifth most points in a season opener and the most since a 100-58 win over Washington College on Nov. 27, 1995.

The 46-point margin of victory is tied for the ninth highest in school history, and the highest in a season opener. Delaware posted its largest margin of victory since a 102-55 win over New Hampshire on Jan. 27, 2000.

MUTTS SHINES IN BLUE HEN DEBUT

Justyn Mutts exploded for game-highs of 23 points and 13 rebounds vs. Bridgewater during his Blue Hen debut.

Mutts is the first Blue Hen to post a double-double

in his UD debut since Ajmal Basit vs. Temple on Nov. 13, 2000. He scored the most points in a Blue Hen debut since Keith Davis scored 24 vs. Delaware State on Nov. 22, 1996.

ALLEN HOT FROM DEEP

Ryan Allen scored 21 points vs. Bridgewater, and tied his career-high by knocking down six three-pointers. Allen connected on his first five attempts from behind the arc during the win, and finished with six treys for the fifth time in his career.

Allen has appeared in just 53 games during his Blue Hen career, but already ranks ninth in school history with 153 three-pointers made. He has hit a three-pointer in all but two of his appearances for Delaware.

Allen connected on 86 three-pointers during his rookie season, tying the UD single season mark also held by John Gordon in 1998-99.

Allen hit a three-pointer in the first 29 games of his career, the second longest streak in school history. Peca Arsic drained a triple in 36 consecutive games from 1994-96.

NOVAKOVICH, ASAMOAH PRODUCE IN UD DEBUTS

Redshirt freshman Aleks Novakovich scored 11 points and grabbed five rebounds in his Blue Hen debut while freshman Ebby Asamoah added 10 points, four rebounds and three assists.

ANDERSON SETS CAREER-HIGH IN ASSISTS

Kevin Anderson handed out a career-high nine assists in the win over Bridgewater, including eight in the first half. Anderson also scored nine points and made three steals on the night.

Delaware dished out 25 assists during the victory, the program's most since handing out 26 vs. William & Mary on Feb. 1, 2003.

SENIORS CONTRIBUTE IN SEASON OPENING WIN

Redshirt senior Collin Goss scored a career-high 13 points on 6 of 9 shooting vs. Bridgewater, while ranking second on the team with six rebounds and handing out a career-best four assists.

Fellow senior Jacob Cushing was also in the starting lineup, finishing with eight points and four rebounds.

HENS HIT THEIR MARK VS. BRIDGEWATER

Delaware went 22 of 33 from the floor in the opening half vs. Bridgewater for a 66.7 field goal percentage, before shooting 50.0 percent in the second half.

The Blue Hens' 58.2 shooting percentage for the game is the program's highest since UD shot 58.6 percent in a 96-76 win over UNCW on Jan. 7, 2018.

BLUE HENS FEATURE OLDER STARTING LINEUP

Delaware started a veteran starting lineup during the season opener vs. Bridgewater. Collin Goss is 23 years old while Ryan Allen, Kevin Anderson and Jacob Cushing are each 21. Justyn Mutts will turn 21 on Jan. 4.

BLUE HENS FACE PENN STATE IN CHARITY EXHIBITION

Delaware played a charity exhibition game at Penn State on Oct. 27 to benefit Louisiana Tech University and the Ruston, La. community following tornadoes that damaged the area in April.

Nate Darling scored a game-high 25 points, and had 19 of UD's 23 points in the first half Kevin Anderson. added seven points. Aleks Novakovich scored six. Collin. Goss had five, and Justyn Mutts chipped in four. Goss, Anderson and Darling all tied for the team lead with five rebounds

HENS LOOKING TO CONTINUE SUCCESS UNDER INGELSBY

Delaware has increased its win total during all three years under head coach Martin Ingelsby. The Blue Hens won just seven games in 2015-16 prior to Ingelsby's arrival, but won 13 games during his first season. They then won 14 games in 2017-18, before finishing 17-16 a vear ago.

Last season Delaware finished fifth in the CAA standings, posting its highest win total and highest CAA finish since 2013-14. The Blue Hens also advanced to the CAA Tournament Semifinals for the first time in five years after erasing a 14-point halftime deficit in the 85-79 win over William & Mary in the quarterfinals, the largest halftime comeback in CAA Tournament his-

INGELSBY SIGNS CONTRACT EXTENSION

Head coach Martin Ingelsby is entering his fourth year leading the Blue Hens. On June 20, he signed a two-year contract extension through the 2023-24 season.

ALLEN, ANDERSON RETURN IN UD BACKCOURT

Delaware returns two starters in junior shooting guard Ryan Allen and junior point guard Kevin Ander-

Allen a CAA Preseason Second Team selection, led the Blue Hens by averaging 16.0 points per game and ranked second on the team with 61 three-pointers a year ago. He appeared in 22 games while making 19 starts after missing the first 11 contests with a foot injury. Allen averaged 36 minutes per game, and scored a career-high 30 points in the double-overtime win at Towson

Anderson appeared in 29 games while making 26 starts last season, averaging 10.7 points and 4.2 rebounds in 35.0 minutes per contest. He led the Blue Hens with 83 assists and tied for the team lead with 33 steals. Anderson ranked seventh in the CAA with 3.8 assists per game and 10th with a 1.3 assist/turnover ratio.

DARLING, MUTTS ELIGIBLE AFTER REDSHIRTING LAST SEASON

Nate Darling and Justyn Mutts are eligible for the Blue Hens after sitting out last season per NCAA transfer regulations after transferring to Delaware during the summer of 2018.

Darling, who transferred from UAB, has two years of eligibility while Mutts, who transferred from High Point, has three years.

Darling appeared in all 33 games while starting all but one in 2017-18 for the Blazers, leading the team with 61 three-pointers and shooting a team-high 40.9 percent from behind the arc. He ranked fourth on the squad with a 10.1 scoring average, while his 90 assists ranked third. Darling reached double figures in 17 games, including a career-high 23 points during UAB's win over Western Kentucky when he finished 6 of 6 from beyond the arc.

Mutts appeared in 28 games while starting 18 at High Point during his lone season with the Panthers, when he earned Big South All-Freshman Team honors. Mutts ranked fourth on the team with a 6.0 scoring average while leading the squad with 32 blocks.

REDSHIRT FRESHMAN NOVAKOVICH ELIGIBLE FOR BLUE HENS

Forward Aleks Novakovich is also eligible for Delaware after sitting out last season as a redshirt.

Novakovich, a 6-9 forward from Hobart, Ind., was a first team All-Conference selection at Hobart High School. Novakovich averaged 11.1 points and 7.7 rebounds as a senior at Hobart, before spending the 2017-18 season at Don Bosco Prep.

FRESHMEN MCCOY. ASAMOAH JOIN BLUE HENS

Freshmen Johnny McCoy and Ebby Asamoah will be making their Blue Hen debuts. McCov was the 2018 Hockomock League MVP as a senior at Mansfield (Mass.) High School, before spending a prep year at Tilton School (N.H.). Asamoah was a first team All-State and All-Metro selection a year ago at Magruder High School (Md.).

PAINTER ELIGIBLE FOLLOWING FALL SEMESTER

Dylan Painter, who transferred to Delaware from Villanova following the 2018 fall semester, will be eliaible for the Blue Hens after the 2019 fall semester. He has one and a half years of eligibility with UD.

Painter appeared in the first two game of last season for the Wildcats, and started the season opener vs. Morgan State. He tallied five points and five rebounds in those two contests.

Painter appeared in 23 games as a freshman in 2016-17, posting 20 points and 31 rebounds. He then sat out the 2017-18 campaign as a redshirt when Villanova went on to win the national championship.

GARDNER TO SIT OUT SEASON AS REDSHIRT

Junior guard Reggie Gardner will sit out this season after transferring to Delaware from North Carolina Central during the summer.

Gardner appeared in 33 games for the Eagles last year, averaging 5.8 points per game. He was a second team All-MEAC selection in 2017-18, when he started all 35 games and averaged 10.8 points per outing.

WHAT'S LOST

Delaware lost three starters from last year's squad in graduating seniors Eric Carter and Darian Bryant along with freshman Ithiel Horton

Carter, a second team All-CAA and All-District selection last year, ended his career ranked third in UD history with a 55.7 field goal percentage, sixth with 818 rebounds and 27 double-doubles, and 28th with 1,087

Bryant was the only Blue Hen to start all 33 games

BLUE HENS IN THE BAHAMAS

Delaware took its first ever summer foreign trip on August 5-11 when the Blue Hens traveled to Nassau for three games in the Bahamas. UD won two of three games against local teams in Nassau.

ROOKIE SUCCESS

Delaware has featured a pair of CAA Rookies of the Year recruited by Martin Ingelsby, while the Blue Hens are the only school to feature a CAA All-Rookie Team member during each of Ingelsby's three seasons.

Ryan Daly was named CAA Rookie of the Year, in 2016–17, Ryan Allen won the award in 2017–18, and Ithiel Horton was named to the All-Rookie squad last year.

Delaware won 16 CAA Rookie of the Week awards during the last three years, by far the most in the league (Drexel was second with nine winners).

MARTIN INGELSBY

HEAD COACH 4TH SEASON NOTRE DAME '01



Martin Ingelsby is currently in his fourth season as University of Delaware men's basketball head coach during the 2019-20 season.

On June 20, Ingelsby signed a two-year extension through the 2023-24 season.

After spending the previous 13 years on the Notre Dame coaching staff from 2003-16, Ingelsby led the Blue Hens to 13 victories during his first season in Newark, including a win over Hofstra in the CAA Tournament.

During his second year Delaware won 14 games, and earned a CAA Tournament victory for the second consecutive year by defeating Elon in the first round.

Last season the Blue Hens finished 17-16 and were fifth in the CAA standings, posting their highest win total and highest CAA finish in five years. UD increased its win total for the third straight season, and advanced to the CAA Tournament Semifinals for the first since since 2013-14. Delaware erased a 14-point halftime deficit in the 85-79 win over William & Mary in the quarterfinals, the largest halftime comeback in CAA Tournament history.

A Blue Hen earned the CAA Rookie of the Year award in both of Ingelsby's first two years, while Delaware is the only CAA school to earn an All-Rookie Team selection in each of the last three seasons.

Ingelsby, the 24th head coach in UD men's basketball history, is a native of Berwyn, Pa., and was a standout point guard for Notre Dame from 1997-2001. He began his coaching career as an assistant at Wagner College during the 2002-03 campaign before returning to his alma mater as Notre Dame's coordinator of basketball operations. He spent six seasons in that position before being promoted to assistant coach in July 2009, a position he held for seven years. During his tenure in South Bend, Ingelsby, 39, helped lead the Irish to eight NCAA Tournament appearances.

"I really believe this is a great fit for me," Ingelsby said at the time of his hiring. "Coming from Notre Dame, to have the opportunity to be the head coach at a place like the University of Delaware is something I could not pass up. This is a great academic institution and a great community and we will be able to recruit young men who will excel in the classroom and on the basketball court.? We want to win and we want to win the right way. It all starts with high character and highly competitive kids who will represent this basketball program and this University in a first-class manner on and off the basketball court. I can't wait to get started.

"We want to dream big dreams and talk about winning CAA championships and getting into the NCAA Tournament. There is a process that goes into place in building a basketball program and we will work hard to get there. Together, with the student body, faculty, alumni, community and fans, we can accomplish great things."

"I am incredibly excited for our student-athletes, our university and all of Blue Hen Nation to welcome Coach Ingelsby," said University of Delaware Director of Athletics and Recreation Services Chrissi Rawak. "Martin demands excellence in all that he does and has a keen focus on getting young men to go beyond their limits academically, athletically, and in the community. He will have an immediate impact not only on our basketball program, but on our entire department."

While in South Bend Ingelsby primarily worked with the Notre Dame guards and played an integral role in elevating the program's national recruiting efforts. The Fighting Irish reaped the benefits of that recruiting success over his final two seasons as Notre Dame advanced to the NCAA Tournament's Elite Eight in both 2015 and 2016.

The Fighting Irish enjoyed a magical 2014-15 campaign as Notre Dame won the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament title, made its first Elite Eight appearance since 1979, and posted the second 30-win season in school history by finishing with a 32-6 mark.

Despite losing Jerian Grant and Pat Connaughton to the NBA, Notre Dame followed with another outstanding campaign in 2015-16, advancing to the ACC Tournament Semifinals before making its second straight Elite Eight appearance.

Ingelsby helped mentor Grant, a first team consensus All-American and unanimous first team All-ACC pick in 2015 before getting selected by the New York Knicks with the 19th pick in the 2015 NBA Draft. He also worked extensively with Connaughton, who played in a school-record 139 games and was the 41st pick in the 2015 NBA

Draft by the Brooklyn Nets. That season marked the first time since 1992 that two Notre Dame players were selected in the same year of the NBA Draft.

Under Ingelsby's tutelage, Irish point guard Demetrius Jackson enjoyed an outstanding season in 2015-16, earning second team All-ACC and NCAA East Regional All-Tournament Team accolades.

Ingelsby helped lead Notre Dame to a school-record seven consecutive 20-win seasons from 2006-13, while the Irish posted 97 victories from 2009-13, the most wins in a four-year period in school history. During Ingelsby's 13 seasons at his alma mater, Irish teams went 290-146 (.665) and the program posted a 168-76 record with six NCAA Tournament appearances in seven years once he assumed assistant coaching duties.

During Ingelsby's lone season at Wagner in 2002–03, he was part of the most successful season in school history as the Seahawks finished 21–11, won both the Northeast Conference regular season and tournament tiles, and earned the school's first-ever berth in the NCAA Tournament.

Ingelsby was Notre Dame's starting point guard during three of his four seasons in South Bend. As a senior in 2000-01 he averaged 8.2 points and a team-high 6.4 assists as a starter in all 30 games. A team captain during his senior year, he guided the Irish to a 20-10 overall record and the Big East's West Division championship, the school's first ever conference title. Additionally, Notre Dame advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament after earning a berth in the field for the first time in more than a decade in Mike Brey's first season.

Ingelsby also started for the Irish as a freshman and sophomore, and led the team in assists during three of his four seasons. He handed out a team-high 150 assists as a freshman and earned a spot on the 1998 Big East All-Rookie Team.

A two-time member of the Big East Academic All-Star Team, Ingelsby was the recipient of the Notre Dame Club of St. Joseph Valley Rockne Student-Athlete Award during his senior season. He graduated from the Mendoza College of Business with a bachelor's degree in marketing in May, 2001.

Ingelsby enjoyed an outstanding career at Archbishop Carroll High School in suburban Philadelphia where he finished as the school's all-time leading scorer with 1,425 points and led his teams to an 80-12 record during his three years on the varsity squad.

Following his senior year in 1997, he won the prestigious Markward Award, given annually to the top high school player in the Philadelphia area, and was the Gatorade Player of the Year for Philadelphia while also earning All-Catholic League honors three times. Ingelsby was also named South Catholic League MVP as a senior and was a McDonald's All-America honorable mention selection.

Ingelsby's father, Tom, was a standout guard at Villanova from 1970-73 and served as his son's head coach at Archbishop Carroll. Tom led Villanova to the 1971 NCAA championship game and played for the Atlanta Hawks during the 1973-74 season and for the Spirits of St. Louis in the ABA the following year.

Ingelsby and his wife, Colleen, are the parents of twins Will and Kate, and sons Jack and Ben.
