HEN TRACKS

✦ The Blue Hens enter the weekend ranked No. 6 in the STATS Perform FCS Top 25 Poll and No. 7 in the AFCA Coaches' FCS Top 25 Poll.

✦ Delaware was voted to finish second in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) Preseason Poll by the head coaches and media. The Blue Hens led the CAA with eight preseason all-conference selections.

✦ Delaware opened the fall with a CAA conference game for the second straight season. In its second consecutive season playing Maine in its season opener, the Blue Hens captured a 34-24 victory to start their fall campaign 1-0 and extend its CAA win streak to five games.

✦ Saturday marks the second non-conference game of the season for the Blue Hens. UD beat Saint Francis, 27-10 on Sept. 11, and will host Dixie State on Oct. 30.

✦ The Blue Hens were a perfect 3-0 at home last season. Delaware holds a five-game win streak at Delaware Stadium dating back to Nov. 16, 2019. Delaware is on a one-game win streak for away games dating back to Sept. 2, 2021.

✦ Gene Coleman II and Thyrick Pitts became the first duo since 2009 to record 100-plus receiving yards in the same game. Coleman caught five passes for 120 yards and Pitts had five receptions for 116 yards. Both registered one touchdown each.

✦ The Blue Hens will have six captains for the 2021 season. Returning as captains from last season are graduate students Frank Burton III and Dejoun Lee, along with redshirt senior Nolan Henderson and senior Kedrick Whitehead. Added to the captains mix for this season is the addition of graduate student David Kroll, fifth-year players Gene Coleman II and Nijuel Hill.

DELAWARE VERSUS THE FBS

FLASHBACK: The last time Delaware defeated an FBS team was in 2007 when it defeated Navy 59-52. Delaware's 2007 season started with Omar Cuff setting an FCS record with seven touchdowns in the first-ever Colonial Athletic Association football game, and ended with an appearance in the national championship. Along the way, future Super Bowl MVP quarterback Joe Flacco and the Blue Hens would collect wins and signature moments. With 581 yards of total offense from the Blue Hens, and four touchdowns apiece from Flacco and Cuff, Delaware's balanced and dangerous offense was on full display in Annapolis, Md., that day. Flacco, who completed 30 of 41 passes for 434 yards, especially put in a performance that cemented him as a bona fide first round NFL Draft prospect.

PASS AND CATCH

Nolan Henderson registered a career-long touchdown pass of 66 yards to Thyrick Pitts at Maine in the season opener. Henderson tied his career-long touchdown pass of 55 yards in the first quarter when he connected with Gene Coleman II.

DYNAMIC DUO

Keep an eye out on wide receivers Gene Coleman II and Thyrick Pitts. The two wideouts make their fair share of receptions and make them count in the process. After Week 1, Coleman and Pitts rank No. 1 and No. 2 respectively, on the CAA receiving yards chart.

Delaware is 4-for-4 in made field goals this season. Ryan Coe has made attempts of 33, 20, 36, 26 (in that order) this season.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE

The Blue Hens have won their last four home games this season dating back to Nov. 16, 2019. Delaware is 2-0 at Raymond Field during the 2021 fall campaign.

ROCCO REWIND

Danny Rocco became Delaware's first CAA Coach of the Year this past spring. He was also selected as the AFCA Region 1 Coach of the Year and a finished third for the Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award. It was Rocco's fifth conference coach of the year honor after winning his seventh career conference championship and first at Delaware.

IN-STATE QBS

Quarterback Nolan Henderson is just the third Delaware native (Smyrna High School) in the past 28 seasons to start for the Blue Hens, joining Sam Postlethwait (2001) and Dale Fry (1993).

CREATING CHANGE

Partnering with the rest of the conference, Delaware is proud to be a part of the CAA Family - United for Change Executive Committee. Offensive lineman James Prince III joins Delaware women's basketball head coach Natasha Adair as the two Blue Hen representatives.

Delaware has also created its own Student-Athlete Diversity, Equity and Inclusion Committee where graduate student running back Dejoun Lee is Co-Chair.

BROTHERLY LOVE

Delaware has four sets of brothers on its 2021 fall roster. Frank and Riah Burton, Christian and Christopher Pierce, Liam and Dillon Trainer, and Braden and Fintan Brose.

BATTLE TESTED

The Blue Hens return all but one starter across the offense, defense, and special teams.

THE BATTLE OF THE BLUE

This year's Battle of the Blue takes place on Nov. 20. During the spring, Delaware snapped an eight-game drought in the rivalry with a 27-20 win at then No. 10 Villanova to earn a CAA title and FCS Playoff bid.

ROYAL COMPANY

The University of Delaware is one of just three institutions with an alumnus elected President (Biden), a Super Bowl MVP (Flacco), and an NFL MVP (Gannon), along with Stanford and Michigan.

Delaware is one of eight FCS programs with 700 all-time victories. A total of just 39 Division I schools have surpassed 700 all-time wins and Delaware did it in style when it defeated Maine in three overtimes in 2019.

PRESEASON CAA POLLS

Delaware, who finished last season ranked No. 4 with a 7-1 overall record and an FCS semifinal playoff appearance, received seven first-place votes for a total of 222 points for a predicted second-place finish in the CAA preseason poll by the head coaches and media. The Blue Hens are the reigning CAA Champions.

PRESEASON ALL-CAA HONORS

The defending conference champions recorded a league-high eight preseason all-conference honors. Reigning

conference offensive player of the year running back Dejour Lee, All-American offensive lineman David Kroll, quarterback Nolan Henderson, and wide receiver Thyrick Pitts all received preseason accolades. All-American safety Kedrick Whitehead, cornerback Nijuel Hill, linebacker Johnny Buchanan, and defensive lineman Chase McGowan all earned honors for the defense. Wide receiver Gene Coleman II and tight end Bryce De Maille received honorable mention recognition.

CLIMBING THE RANKS

After a spring season that saw Delaware advance to the semifinals of the FCS Playoffs, the Blue Hens racked up several preseason honors. Delaware football added to their preseason resume with a No. 5 placing in the AFCA FCS Coaches' Top 25 Poll. In the Stats Perform and HERO Sports preseason polls, the Blue Hens were ranked No. 5 and No. 6, respectively.

ALL-AMERICANS

A trio of Delaware football players were named to the 2021 Stats Perform FCS Preseason All-America Team. Offensive lineman David Kroll, a 2021 spring All-America honoree, was the lone Blue Hen named to the first team. Reigning CAA Offensive Player of the Year running back Dejour Lee and All-American defensive back junior Kedrick Whitehead earned 2nd team honors.

WATCH OUT

Running back Dejour Lee is one of 35 student-athletes named to the 2021 Walter Payton Award watch list. The award is presented annually by Stats Perform to the top offensive player in the NCAA Division I Football Championship Subdivision.

Lee was a finalist for the top offensive honor last season after having a spectacular spring campaign. The graduate student won CAA Offensive Player of the Year honors and Stats Perform and AP Second Team All-American accolades in the spring.

THE HeNFL

Active NFL players from Delaware are: Joe Flacco (Eagles), Troy Reeder (Rams), Bilal Nichols (Bears), Nasir Adderley (Chargers), Nick Boyle (Ravens), and Zach Kerr (49ers).

Currently, there are six active players, one head coach, three assistant coaches, a general manager, and one scout from Delaware in the league.

GAME-CHANGING FACILITIES

With phase one of the Delaware Stadium renovation project complete, the Blue Hens hold one of the finest facilities in all of Division I football, FBS included. The new Whitney Athletic Center holds a state-of-the-art weight room, nutrition center, academic center, athletic training center and much more. The building provides next-level resources for all Delaware student-athletes.

HEAD COACH DANNY ROCCO

FIFTH SEASON
WAKE FOREST, 1984

The reigning CAA Football Coach of the Year, Danny Rocco, enters his fifth season as the head coach of the University of Delaware football program.

Delaware Director of Athletics and Recreation Services Chrissi Rawak announced on Dec. 14, 2016, that Rocco, who enjoyed outstanding success at NCAA Division I FCS members Liberty University and University of Richmond, had been selected to lead the Blue Hens as its 23rd head football coach and sixth head coach since 1940.

A 30-plus year veteran, including the last 15 as a head coach at the NCAA Division I FCS level, Rocco has found nothing but success. Rocco has seven conference championships, five NCAA FCS Playoff appearances, and three 10-win seasons under his belt. In his first four seasons at Delaware, winning the CAA Championship and CAA Coach of the Year honors in 2020-21.

Rocco has guided Delaware back to the FCS Playoffs in two of the last three seasons, including a national semifinal appearance in 2020-21. The Blue Hens rattled off a 5-0 league mark to win the CAA Championship, hosted their first FCS Playoff game since 2010, and finished the season ranked No. 5 in the FCS. Delaware posted record-setting numbers on both sides of the ball, including running back Dejoun Lee being named the CAA Offensive Player of the Year and a Walter Payton Award finalist. The defensive unit ranked third nationally in scoring defense and fourth in total defense.

Rocco became a finalist for both the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year award and the AFCA Coach of the Year, winning AFCA Region 1 Coach of the Year honors.

Under his tutelage in 2018, the Blue Hens returned to the FCS Playoffs for the first time since 2010 after a 7-5 mark, including two wins over opponents ranked in the top-10. The team finished inside the top-25, ranking No. 23 in the AFCA Coaches' Poll and No. 24 in the Stats Perform FCS Top 25. In his first two seasons with the Blue Hens, Rocco led Delaware to back-to-back seven-win seasons, a feat that hadn't happened in Newark in seven years.

In his 15 seasons as a head coach, Rocco has posted just one losing season and owns a career record of 116-59 (.662).

During his 15 seasons as a head coach (five at Richmond, six at Liberty, four at Delaware), he has been a National Coach of the Year Finalist six times and has won seven conference championships and five conference Coach of the Year honors.

He has coached 183 all-conference honorees and 40 student-athletes who garnered All-American honors, 10 of which were Blue Hens including NFL talents Bilal Nichols, Nasir Adderley, and Troy Reeder.

Sixteen different players under Rocco's tutelage have gone on to earn NFL contracts and his teams have finished in the final FCS Top 25 poll in nine of the past 13 seasons, including finishing No. 3 in 2015 and No. 5 in 2020-21.

Rocco became only the third man in Colonial Athletic Association Football (formerly Yankee Conference and Atlantic 10 Conference) history to serve as head coach at two different institutions. Jim Reid coached at former CAA member Massachusetts in 1986-91 before moving on to serve as head coach at Richmond in 1995-2003. Current University of Arizona defensive coordinator Don Brown was head coach at Northeastern in 2000-03 before moving over to UMass in 2004-08.

Be his departure in 2003. Frank, and his brother, Dave, are both currently coaching at the high school level in Virginia.

In January of 2016, Rocco was elected to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees.

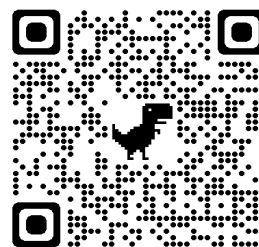
Rocco is married to the former Julie Mills and they are the parents of two children, David and Amy. David currently serves as the offensive coordinator at Western Illinois University.
