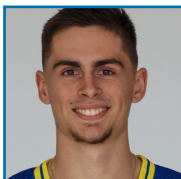

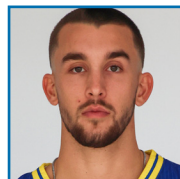

Advance notice of at least 24 hours is preferred, but every attempt will be made to accommodate all requests. No one will be available for interviews on game day, except for post game interviews.

COMMON CONNECTIONS

Both Delaware head coach **Martin Ingelsby** (Archbishop Carroll) and Bucknell head coach **John Griffin III** (St. Joe's Prep) played high school in the Philadelphia Catholic League.

Cavan Reilly and Bison Patrick O'Brien overlapped at Bishop O'Connell during the 2022 season.

Macon Emory and Bucknell's Matt Lange faced off last year as Emory's Perkiomen team beat Lange's Shipley School, 60-58.

Bucknell is the is the fourth most common opponent in program history with the teams having met 87 times. A bulk of those games came as foes in the East Coast Conference. The more common opponents are Drexel (170), Hofstra (103), and Towson (94).

LEAGUE OF THEIR OWN

Delaware is the only CAA school to open the season against a DI foe.

NOVEMBER SUCCESS

Under head coach **Martin Ingelsby**, Delaware is 35-16 in the month of November.

BLUE HENS IN SEASON AND HOME OPENERS

Delaware is 58-60 all-time in season openers, including 6-2 under head coach **Martin Ingelsby**. The Hens are 75-43 in home openers, including 24-8 in the Bob Carpenter Center. UD has won nine-straight home openers.

GOING OT

Delaware is 10-4 in overtime under **Martin Ingelsby**.

THAT '70S SHOW

Under head coach **Martin Ingelsby**, UD posts an 85-22 record when holding opponents under 70 points, including 46-7 the past four seasons, and 16-1 last season.

HOME SWEET HOME

UD posts a better record at home under **Martin Ingelsby** (68-41) compared to on the road (42-61).

CLOSE CALLS

Since 2016-17 the Hens are 48-27 in contests decided by five points or less, and 32-17 in one-score games.

1,021 DAYS

Junior **Gabe Moss** has gone 1,021 days between meaningful basketball games after going down with an injury in high school on Jan. 18, 2022 to the 2024-25 season opener on Nov. 4, 2024.

TRACKING WINS

With one more win, head coach **Martin Ingelsby** will tie **Monté Ross** for second all-time with 132 wins. Ingelsby needs 32 to tie **Steve Steinwedel** for most ever.

Delaware will be led this season by captains **Tahron Allen**, **Niels Lane**, and **Cavan Reilly**.

NEW YEAR, NEW SCHOOL

In the modern era of college athletics, Delaware continues to capitalize on acquiring players via the transfer portal. This year, the Hens welcome **Tahron Allen** (Wagner), **John Camden** (Virginia Tech), **Kevin Kogbara** (JUCO), **Trent Middleton Jr.** (Ball State), and **Erik Timko** (Jefferson).

FRESH FACES

The Blue & Gold added three true freshmen to the roster this season in **Macon Emory**, **Izaiah Pasha**, and walk-on **Alex McFadden**.

STAFF CHANGES

Delaware welcomed **Christian Nunez** (assistant coach/director of player development) to the staff, while seeing **Danny O'Connor** (assistant coach) and **Stephen Galgano** (director of operations) getting promotions. Nunez joins the crew after serving as an assistant coach at Saint Louis.

ERIK THE ELITE SCORER

Erik Timko comes to the 302 after spending three seasons at Jefferson. He left the Rams as their eighth leading scorer in program history (1,792) and eighth on Jefferson's career three-point field goals made list (238), with all seven players ahead of him having been there for four seasons.

BROTHERS ON AND OFF THE FLOOR

Houston and **Macon Emory** are one of 17 sets of brothers to play on the same team this season.

CONFERENCE FAMILY(ARITY)

Houston and **Macon Emory** are two of five players in the country to have a parent play for a conference opponent. Both their parents, Andrew and Rebecca (Dayvault), played basketball at William & Mary.

BCC LEGEND

Brandon Baffone joined the Hens as a walk-on out of nearby Salesianum last season. Baffone's dad, Brandon, hit the game-winning three pointer in the first-ever high school game played in the Bob Carpenter Center to lift Salesianum over Sanford in the state semifinal in March 1993.

HALL OF FAME TIPOFF

UD will play in the 2024 Naismith Basketball Hall of Fame Tip Off at Mohegan Sun Arena in Uncasville, Connecticut with games against Vermont and Yale.

TOUGH SCHEDULE

Delaware will play 15 games this season against opponents who won at least 20 games last year - Bryant, Yale, Vermont, Duquesne, and St. John's and CAA games against Charleston, Stony Brook, Drexel (2x), Hofstra (2x), and UNCW (2x).

HIGH SCHOOL CONNECTIONS

The Blue Hens roster boasts a number of high school connections. Head coach **Martin Ingelsby** and associate head coach **Bill Phillips** played together at Archbishop Carroll. Virginia Tech transfer **John Camden** spent the first three years of his high school career at Archbishop Carroll as well.

Houston Emory and **Kobe Jerome Emory** played with newcomer **Macon Emory** at the Blue Ridge School.

HENS ON TV

Delaware is set to play two regular season games on national TV when it takes on Yale (ESPN) and St. John's (FS1).

MOVIN' ON UP

On November 28, 2023 Delaware announced it would be moving to Conference USA effective July 1, 2025. This will push Delaware football to the FBS level.

AMONG THE BEST

Martin Ingelsby became the third coach in program history to reach the 100-win plateau in 2022-23. He passed his former coach and mentor, Mike Brey, who had 99 as the head coach at UD.

STAYING PUT

Head coach **Martin Ingelsby** signed an extension last summer that places him under contract through the 2028-29 season.

BIRDS OF A FEATHER

With over 1,100 schools across three divisions in the NCAA, the Blue Hens are one of two institutions with the nickname in the hen family. Pomona-Pitzer, a division III institution, is nicknamed the Sagehens. Both South Carolina and Jacksonville State have the nickname Gamecocks and Coastal Carolina is the Chanticleers, which both fall in the rooster family.

FAMILY TIES

Usually a DI head basketball coach is the most famous in their family. That may not be the case for **Martin Ingelsby**. His brother, Brad, wrote and created the HBO hit *Mare of Easttown*, which is based in a Philadelphia suburb, similar to where the brother grew up. The series received 16 nominations at the 73rd Primetime Emmy Awards and won four. Their father, Tom, was a standout guard at Villanova from 1970-73 and served as his son's head coach at Archbishop Carroll. Tom led Villanova to the 1971 NCAA championship game and played for the Atlanta Hawks during the 1973-74 season and for the Spirits of St. Louis in the ABA the following year.

BLUE HENS ON THE AIRWAVES

For the 21st-straight season, Delaware men's basketball games will be carried on FM radio. All games can be heard on 94.7 WDSD. **Scott Klatzkin** (play-by-play) and **Bill Harman** (analyst) will be on the call.

A NEW ERA

The University of Delaware has accepted an invitation to join Conference USA as a full-league member effective July 1, 2025, as both organizations announced jointly on Tuesday, November 28.

"UD ranks among the nation's leading public research institutions and is recognized nationally for delivering exceptional professional outcomes for our students," University of Delaware President Dennis Assanis said. "Joining Conference USA will present opportunities to not only broaden exposure of our athletics programs, but also enhance awareness and visibility of our excellent academic offerings, our ground-breaking research initiatives and our enduring impact on our community and the world."

The Blue Hens will compete in Conference USA in baseball, men's and women's basketball, cross country, football, men's and women's golf, women's soccer, softball, men's and women's tennis, track & field, and volleyball. More information will become available in the coming months about where the other seven programs will compete in the future.

"The opportunity to join Conference USA is a very proud moment for our entire university," Director of Athletics, Community, and Campus Recreation Chrissi Rawak said. "With this step forward, we will continue to offer an incredible student-athlete experience and elevate the visibility of all that is remarkable about UD. We couldn't be more excited for the entire state of Delaware and how this will bring the 302 together."

All UD varsity programs will remain in the Coastal Athletic Association (CAA) through the 2024-2025 season, with all sports except football maintaining eligibility to compete for conference championships and NCAA postseason play.

"Thanks to our recently opened Whitney Athletic Center and improvements to Delaware Stadium and other facilities, we are confident that we have the infrastructure in place at UD to compete with the very best in college

football and simultaneously witness the growth of our other intercollegiate programs in the department," Rawak said. "UD Athletics continues to ascend, and Blue Hen football is prepared to take the next step and lead the way."

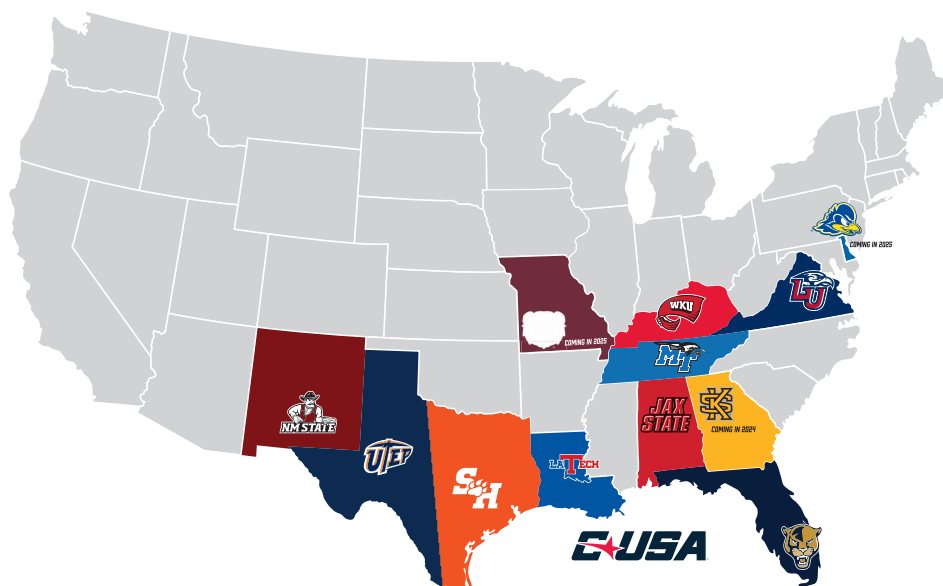
Delaware has posted its two best LEARFIELD Directors' Cup finishes since 1998 over the past two seasons, ranking 104th and 114th, respectively, with the 2021-22 ranking leading the CAA.

Last season alone, Delaware had five conference championships, a pair of NCAA victories, and two individual NCAA qualifiers. Other notable national accolades include regularly ranked football and men's lacrosse programs, and doubles pair in women's tennis. Nine Blue Hens garnered All-American honors in 2022-23, with six national player of the week awards.

Historically, the Blue & Gold have shown competitive excellence in all walks of athletics. The Hens boast an impressive 529 All-Americans, 137 conference titles, and 10 national championships in the University's storied history.

Conference USA is an NCAA Division I conference championing success in college athletics through dedicated leadership, dynamic partnership, and diverse membership. Founded in 1995 and based in Dallas, CUSA is home to nine schools: FIU, Jacksonville State, Liberty, Louisiana Tech, Middle Tennessee, New Mexico State, Sam Houston, UTEP, and WKU. Kennesaw State joins the league in 2024 and Delaware begins competition in 2025.

"Adding the University of Delaware is a tremendous opportunity for Conference USA as we strategically position ourselves for continued success," Conference USA Commissioner Judy MacLeod said. "We are excited to add the state's flagship university with its rich history in athletics and academics and look forward to our partnership with President Dennis Assanis, Director of Athletics Chrissi Rawak, and their leadership group."

Martin INGELSBY

HEAD COACH | 9TH SEASON | NOTRE DAME '01

Martin Ingelsby enters his ninth season as the University of Delaware's men's basketball head coach in 2024-25.

During the summer of 2022, Ingelsby signed an extension that will keep him in Newark through the 2028-29 season. This was his second extension since signing his original contract in 2016.

Ingelsby and co. returned Delaware basketball to a place it has only been six times in program history with the CAA Championship title and NCAA Tournament First Round appearance in 2022. It marked the Blue Hens' first conference crown since the 2014 season.

In his time in Newark, Ingelsby and his staff have recruited and coached six Blue Hens to the pros, including Delaware's first-ever NBA player, Nate Darling.

Also under his leadership, the Blue Hens have garnered three CAA Rookie of the Year awards, 21 All-CAA honors, and six All-District nods.

During the 2021-22 campaign, Delaware posted a 22-13 record, the ninth 20+ win season ever. The 22 wins tied Ingelsby's season-best from the 2019-20 year. For the third time under Ingelsby, a Blue Hen was dubbed the league's Rookie of the Year as Jyare Davis garnered the award with 9.7 points and 4.2 rebounds per game. Davis was also the CAA Tournament's Most Outstanding Player and was joined by teammates Kevin Anderson and Andrew Carr on the all-tournament team. Jameer Nelson Jr. rounded out the Hens' postseason CAA award winners as an All-CAA Second Team selection. Despite missing out on any CAA awards, Dylan Painter was tabbed to the NABC Second Team All-District.

Ingelsby led a steady improvement for the Blue Hens, as UD was one of just three Division I schools to increase its win total in four consecutive years from 2016-20.

In 2019-20 Ingelsby led UD to even greater heights as the Blue Hens finished 22-11, posting a five-win improvement and recording the eighth 20-win season in program history. Delaware set a program record by winning its first nine games, earning a vote in the Associated Press Top 25 poll for the first time in two decades. The Blue Hens tied for fourth place in

the CAA and defeated Charleston in the quarterfinals to advance to the semifinals for the second consecutive year.

In 2018-19 the Blue Hens finished 17-16 and were fifth in the CAA standings, posting their highest win total and highest CAA finish in five years. Delaware erased a 14-point halftime deficit in the 85-79 win over William & Mary in the CAA quarterfinals, the largest halftime comeback in CAA Tournament history.

After spending the previous 13 seasons on the Notre Dame coaching staff from 2003-16, Ingelsby led the Blue Hens to 13 victories during his first year in Newark, including a win over Hofstra in the CAA Tournament. During his second year, Delaware won 14 games and earned a CAA Tournament victory for the second consecutive year by defeating Elon in the first round.

Ingelsby, the 24th head coach in UD men's basketball history, is a native of Berwyn, Pa., and was a standout point guard for Notre Dame from 1997-2001. He began his coaching career as an assistant at Wagner College during the 2002-03 campaign before returning to his alma mater as Notre Dame's coordinator of basketball operations. He spent six seasons in that position before being promoted to assistant coach in July 2009, a position he held for seven years. During his tenure in South Bend, Ingelsby helped lead the Irish to eight NCAA Tournament appearances.

While in South Bend Ingelsby primarily worked with the Notre Dame guards and played an integral role in elevating the program's national recruiting efforts. The Fighting Irish reaped the benefits of that recruiting success over his final two seasons as Notre Dame advanced to the NCAA Tournament's Elite Eight in both 2015 and 2016.

The Fighting Irish enjoyed a magical 2014-15 campaign as Notre Dame won the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament title, made its first Elite Eight appearance since 1979, and posted the second 30-win season in school history by finishing with a 32-6 mark.

Despite losing Jerian Grant and Pat Connaughton to the NBA, Notre Dame followed with another outstanding

campaign in 2015-16, advancing to the ACC Tournament Semifinals before making its second straight Elite Eight appearance.

Ingelsby helped mentor Grant, a first team consensus All-American and unanimous first team All-ACC pick in 2015 before getting selected by the New York Knicks with the 19th pick in the 2015 NBA Draft. He also worked extensively with Connaughton, who played in a school-record 139 games and was the 41st pick in the 2015 NBA Draft by the Brooklyn Nets. That season marked the first time since 1992 that two Notre Dame players were selected in the same year of the NBA Draft.

Under Ingelsby's tutelage, Irish point guard Demetrius Jackson enjoyed an outstanding season in 2015-16, earning second team All-ACC and NCAA East Regional All-Tournament Team accolades.

Ingelsby helped lead Notre Dame to a school-record seven consecutive 20-win seasons from 2006-13, while the Irish posted 97 victories from 2009-13, the most wins in a four-year period in school history. During Ingelsby's 13 seasons at his alma mater, Irish teams went 290-146 (.665) and the program posted a 168-76 record with six NCAA Tournament appearances in seven years once he assumed assistant coaching duties.

Ingelsby was Notre Dame's starting point guard during three of his four seasons in South Bend. As a senior in 2000-01, he averaged 8.2 points and a team-high 6.4 assists as a starter in all 30 games. A team captain during his senior year, he guided the Irish to a 20-10 overall record and the Big East's West Division championship, the school's first-ever conference title. Additionally, Notre Dame advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament after earning a berth in the field for the first time in more than a decade in Mike Brey's first season.

Ingelsby also started for the Irish as a freshman and sophomore and led the team in assists during three of his four seasons. He handed out a team-high 150 assists as a freshman and earned a spot on the 1998 Big East All-Rookie Team.

A two-time member of the Big East Academic All-Star Team, Ingelsby was

the recipient of the Notre Dame Club of St. Joseph Valley Rockne Student-Athlete Award during his senior season. He graduated from the Mendoza College of Business with a bachelor's degree in marketing in May 2001.

Ingelsby enjoyed an outstanding career at Archbishop Carroll High School in suburban Philadelphia where he finished as the school's all-time leading scorer with 1,425 points and led his teams to an 80-12 record during his three years on the varsity squad.

Following his senior year in 1997, he won the prestigious Markward Award, given annually to the top high school player in the Philadelphia area, and was the Gatorade Player of the Year for Philadelphia while also earning All-Catholic League honors three times. Ingelsby was also named South Catholic League MVP as a senior and was a McDonald's All-America honorable mention selection.

Ingelsby's father, Tom, was a standout guard at Villanova from 1970-73 and served as his son's head coach at Archbishop Carroll. Tom led Villanova to the 1971 NCAA championship game and played for the Atlanta Hawks during the 1973-74 season and for the Spirits of St. Louis in the ABA the following year.

Ingelsby and his wife, Colleen, are the parents of twins Will and Ben.






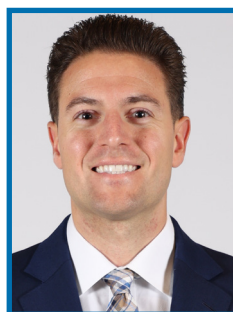
