OPENING PASS

Delaware Fightin' Blue Hens field hockey returns home for the first time since September 28 to take on former Colonial Athletic Association foe Old Dominion University.

The Blue Hens took two straight to begin the month of October, before falling to No. 5 Wake Forest on October 12 by a score of 4-1.

Sarah Rigual and Linde van Leeuwen earned MPSF Weekly awards for their performances against the Demon Deacons.

Old Dominion is led by former Blue Hen, Sian Emslie. The reigining BIG EAST Player of the Week has seven goals and five assists on the year.

Suus Broers is projected in the cage for the Monarchs. The junior has started all 13 games, playing to a 6-7 record with a 1.71 goals against average.

The two squads have shared two common opponents thus far in 2025. They have both played Temple and William & Mary, ODU came out on top in both, while the Blue Hens split the two contests between the Tribe and Owls

The two squads have played 18 times, with ODU taking 13 of the matchups. The history between the Hens and Monarchs exists due to competing fairly often thanks to both teams affiliation with the CAA in the late 2000s

A NEW ERA

The University of Delaware field hockey program will be joining Mountain Pacific Sports Federation (MPSF) for the 2025 season, joining UC Davis as one of two founding members of the league's sponsorship, the organizations announced jointly on September 2. This will be the newest field hockey NCAA DI conference since the Northeast Conference formed in 1998.

A program with rich tradition and history, Delaware enters MPSF after claiming its 10th Coastal Athletic Association (CAA) Championship in the last 12 seasons in 2024. Overall, UD has won 16 league crowns since the program's inception in 1971. The Blue & Gold have appeared in 17 NCAA/AIAW Tournament appearances, highlighted by a NCAA National Championship in 2016.

"We are thrilled to give our studentathletes the chance to compete in a new conference and the opportunity to compete for a league title," Interim Director of Athletics Jordan Skolnick said. "We are thankful to MPSF. Commissioner Foti Mellis and cofounding member UC Davis for joining us in creating this opportunity for our student-athletes. Our field hockey program has been and will continue

to be one of our most nationally competitive teams at Delaware. Finding a path forward towards a conference has been critically important and creating a new conference gives us the ability to work towards once again being in a league with an automatic bid to the NCAA tournament."

Field hockey makes the record-setting 16th current intercollegiate olympic sport for the conference, exceeding the previous all-time high of 15 during the 2024-25 academic year. Field hockey is the seventh sport to be added to the MPSF in Commissioner Foti Mellis' tenure since the fall of 2021, four of which debuted last year. The conference champion will be decided by the winner of the championship contest between the two teams, hosted by UC Davis in November.

"We are excited to join the MPSF in the inaugural year of sponsoring field hockey." Delaware Head Field Hockey Coach Tara Zollinger said. "Alongside UC Davis, we are eager to compete and grow our conference while providing access to a conference championship for our deserving student-athletes."

Mountain Pacific Sports Federation, University of Delaware, and UC Davis

will work together to attempt to get to six members for the 2026 season, the minimum needed to qualify for an automatic bid to the NCAA tournament. The group hopes to attract teams from universities interested in starting field hockey programs, and from institutions who want their studentathletes to have a chance to compete for a conference championship and an automatic bid, as many conferences do not invite all member teams to compete in their conference tournament. MPSF plans to have all six teams compete in their conference tournament annually.

The MPSF Championship game against UC Davis will take place on November 8, and will be the first-ever matchup between the two schools.

On Tuesday, September 2, Delaware announced their new affiliation for field hockey to compete in the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation (MPSF). The Fightin' Blue Hens jointly founded the league with UC Davis, who they will face in a conference championship game on November 8, 2025. Mountain Pacific Sports Federation, University of Delaware, and UC Davis will work together to attempt to get to six members for the 2026 season.

new hen in the flock

Tara Zollinger was hired in March 2025 to be the seventh head coach in program history. She won three DII National Championships at Shippensburg, and made the semifinal game in all six of her NCAA Tournament appearances. Zollinger coached to a record of 118-25 (.825), producing 41 all-league players, and 23 All-Americans in her time with the Raiders.

both blankin' em

Both goalkeepers that the Blue Hens roster in 2025 have now picked up shutouts. This is the first time since 2018 that multiple goalies have shutout opponents in a season. Kristi Merashoff shut down Lock Haven, while Gabby Prentice held Kent State scoreless. The last duo to do this was Lizzie Gaebel and Sydney Rhodes. The latter of whom has assisted in goalie development as a volunteer assistant this season.

that's mine now, thanks

GK Kristi Merashoff, stopped her third penalty stroke of the season against Drexel on October 5.

alumni day

One of the promotions for Sunday's game is alumni day. All program alumni will be recognized at the game for their contributions to the field hockey program.

trailblazers

In the first season MPSF Field Hockey action, the Blue Hens have had four different players earn Player of the Week awards. Iris **Bekker** repeated as the Defensive Player of the Week for the first two weeks it was awarded. while **Kate Fiest** earned the laurel on offense in week two. Alexa **Michielsen** picked up the honor in the first and third week of action. Kristi Merashoff picked up three consecutive weekly honors. For the week of October 13, Sarah Rigual and Linde van Leeuwen earned the nod from the conference.

back to the roots

Between the two teams meeting on Sunday, they have multiple connections, tracing players back to previous stops. **Kate Fiest** and the Monarchs' Sydney Holbrook graduated in 2023 from Tabb High School in Yorktown, Va. Old Dominion's Sian Emslie played two seasons at UD before transferring to Norfolk. Former Delaware assistant coach, Jason Klinkradt, now serves in the same capacity for the Monarchs.

B Linde van Leeuwen (Bryant), M/F Ashlee Bucksar (Liberty), M/F Alexa Michielsen (Shippensburg), and GK Kristi Merashoff (Northeastern) all join the squad after spending the 2024 season at another institution. B Iris Bekker returns for her second season after transferring in from Kent State.

bringing some friends along

Head coach **Tara Zollinger** brought her assistant coach from Shippensburg in **Ally Mooney** to the 302 to coach the goalkeepers. Mooney played for Zollinger from 2017–18, where the pair won two national championships. Graduate M/F **Alexa Michielsen** joined the Fightin' Blue Hens after three seasons at Shippensburg, where she played in 40 games, scoring 10 goals. She earned All–PSAC Third Team honors and was the 2024 PSAC Field Hockey Tournament MVP.

family ties

Delaware field hockey has become a family affair over the years. Many sisters and mother-daughter pairs have suited up in the blue & gold over the programs 55 seasons. The Blue Hens have four such duos across the 2025 roster.

M **Tetje Williamson** is the daughter of **Kelly Cawley** '99, a Delaware Athletics Hall of Famer who ranks second in all-time points.

M Emma Miller is the sister of Grace Miller, a 2022 graduate who played in 71 games, earning all-conference second team honors her senior year.

M Sarah Rigual's sister, Morgan Rigual, made 68 appearances for Delaware. She graduated in 2023, assisting the Blue Hens to the NCAA Tournament three times.

Volunteer Assistant Coach **Sydney Rhodes-James** and her twin sister, **Sabrina**, shared the field in 2016 and 2017, winning an NCAA Championship in Sydney's freshman season.

elite company

Tara Zollinger currently holds the sixth-highest active winning percentage in the NCAA of a coach in their second year or higher (.795), and is fourth amongst the highest amongst active coaches who have coached at least 100 games (Brooke Good - DIII Messiah University, Sharon Pflueger - DIII TCNJ, Dawn Chamberlain - DIII Salisbury University).

HEAD COACH TARA ZOLLINGER

Three-time Division II national championship winning head coach Tara Zollinger enters her first season as the head coach for Delaware field hockey after her hire in March of 2025.

"Tara has a proven track record of winning and competing at the highest levels," Skolnick said. "We are excited to welcome her, her husband Eyoel, and children Isra and Elias to the Blue Hen family. It was clear that she is committed to providing a great student-athlete experience and has a strong vision for player development. We are all looking forward to seeing Tara continue the rich history of success of our field hockey program."

Zollinger comes to Newark after spending the previous eight seasons (2017–24) as the head coach at DII Shippensburg in Pennsylvania where she won national championships in 2017, 2018, and 2021. She also led the Raiders to the 2022 national title game and semifinal appearances in 2023 and 2024.

A Jeannette, Pennsylvania native, Zollinger boasts a 118-25 career record, including 59-8 in conference play, and 10-3 in NCAA Tournaments. She has directed four National Field Hockey Coaches Association (NFHCA) Regional Coaching Staffs of the Year, and a trio of NFHCA National Coaching Staffs of the Year.

Over the course of her eight seasons in Shippensburg, Zollinger has produced 41 all-league players, and 23 All-Americans. She's claimed four regular season Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) titles and a pair of conference tournament titles.

Prior to taking the reins for the Raiders, she spent four seasons (2013–16) as an assistant coach at Syracuse where she worked for former Blue Hen and UD Athletics Hall of Fame inductee (2005) Ange Bradley. She helped Bradley and the Orange to a national championship, ACC regular season title, and both NFHCA regional and national coaching staff of the year awards.

At Syracuse, Zollinger was a part of one the school's most successful seasons. She helped instruct a 2015 team that posted a perfect 16-0 regular-season record – the first team in 25 seasons to achieve the feat. The No. 1-ranked Orange also

swept the 2015 ACC postseason awards, becoming the first team to do so since North Carolina in 1994.

A two-time PSAC Coach of the Year, Zollinger also serves as a coach with USA Field Hockey. She's held a number of roles including nexus coach (2021-25), supplemental coach for the women's U21 team (2024), high performance midatlantic region coach (2017-19), talent selection (2013-15, 2018, 2021-24), U14 futures national championship coach (2016-17), futures head coach and director (2014-17), and futures assistant coach (2010-14).

On the national level, Zollinger served a two-year term (2017-18 and 2018-19) as the field hockey representative on the coaches' council for WeCOACH (formerly Alliance of Women Coaches). She was one of 15 coaches from across the country spanning all three NCAA divisions that served on the council, serving as an ambassador in coaching communities and networks. At the completion of her term, Zollinger graduated from WeCOACH Academy 2.0.

She played college field hockey for former Blue Hen and UD Athletics Hall of Famer (1998) Missy Meharg at Maryland. For the Terps, Zollinger was an attacker who won two NCAA Championships (2010, 2011) and two ACC Championships (2009, 2010) – reaching the Final Four in all four of her collegiate seasons. She received Maryland's Kateri Simon Award in 2012, recognizing an athlete that persevered in times of adversity and displayed courage while bringing positive energy to all team sessions.

Zollinger earned her undergraduate degree in sociology in 2013 and was an active member of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC). She was also a development assistant with the University of Maryland Terrapin Club, coordinating and organizing member and donor events.

She also holds two master's degrees in sport administration (2019) and sport and exercise psychology (2018) from Lock Haven

Zollinger and her husband Eyoel have two children - Isra and Elias.

ALLY MOONEYASSISTANT COACH

Mooney enters her first season as an assistant coach with Delaware field hockey in 2025 after being hired in April of 2025.

Mooney comes to Newark after spending the previous three seasons under Zollinger at DII Shippensburg, where she served as the program's defensive coordinator. She led a unit that sat atop the nation in goals against average (0.80) and scoring margin (+2.71), while sitting third in shutouts per game (0.48).

In charge of the Raider goalkeepers, Mooney oversaw the emergence of the NCAA Division II leader in save percentage (.821) and helped guide the Raiders to the PSAC Championship game and the NCAA Division II Semifinals during the 2023 season.

Mooney joined the coaching staff at her alma mater in 2022, and helped guide the Raiders to their second-consecutive NCAA Division II National Championship Game appearance.

Mooney returned to Shippensburg after spending three seasons as an assistant coach at Appalachian State University, contributing to numerous accomplishments with the Mountaineers.

As a student-athlete at Shippensburg, Mooney was a starting goalkeeper who helped the Raiders win three consecutive NCAA Division II National Championships from 2016-18. She registered a 68-16 record and had an .816 save percentage, recording 24 shutouts between the posts and allowing less than a goal per game over the course of her career.

Mooney was a two-time team captain and earned multiple awards during her collegiate career. Along with three national championships, Mooney was named an NFHCA All-American in 2014 and 2016. As a freshman, she earned a spot on the Synapse Sports All-Rookie Team after allowing just 0.76 goals per game

A native of Spring City, Pa., Mooney earned a bachelor's degree in exercise science with a minor in coaching in December 2018 and her master's degree from Shippensburg in 2023 in organizational development and leadership with a concentration in business.



DEVIN KINZELASSISTANT COACH

Kinzel will begin her first campaign as an assistant coach with the Delaware field hockey program in the 2025 season.

Kinzel spent four seasons on the Temple University field hockey team and assumed a role as a volunteer assistant with her alma mater beginning in January of 2025.

During her playing career, she was a team captain her senior season and earned All-BIG EAST Second Team honors while helping the Owls achieve their furthest postseason run since 2015.

Her stint as a coach with her former team allowed her to assist with team management and game preparation, as well as mentoring players while encouraging academic and athletic success



SYDNEY RHODES-JAMES VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT COACH

Rhodes-James joins the Delaware field hockey staff for her first season as a volunteer assistant coach in 2025.

Rhodes-James returns to Newark after graduating in 2019 and making multiple coaching stops along the way.

The Delaware alum was a five-year goalie for the Blue Hens, who made 50 appearances, including nine during the Hen's run to capturing the 2016 NCAA Division I Championship. She graduated in 2019 with a bachelor's degree in health behavior science from Delaware's College of Health Sciences.

Rhodes-James started her coaching experience working with Harford Hockey Organization (H20) in Harford County, Md., in 2014, a position she held through 2021.

Her collegiate coaching experience includes time as an assistant coach with the University of Pennsylvania, where she spent four seasons from 2021-24 with a specialized focus in coaching the goalkeepers and organizing team logistics.

During that time, Penn was able to have a goalie earn First Team All-Ivy League under Rhodes-James' tutelage.

After leaving Philadelphia, Rhodes-James reconnected with H20 in January 2025, becoming the program's co-director, head coach, and head goalkeepers coach for players aged 10-19.


