OPENING TIP

The University of Delaware men's basketball team heads to Lewisburg, Pa. for a 7 p.m. season opener at Bucknell.

The Fightin' Blue Hens enter a new era in Conference USA and welcome nine newcomers, including six transfers and three freshmen. Six returners from last year's squad are back, highlighted by **Cavan Reilly**.

Delaware's men's basketball program finished the 2024-25 season as close as it could get to a conference championship. The squad went on a four-game win streak to become the lowest seed (12) to advance to the quarterfinals, semifinals, and finals in CAA tournament history.

Bucknell finished 18-15 overall and 13-5 in the Patriot League in 2024-25 under head coach John Griffin III. The Bison beat Loyola (Md.) in the conference tournament quarterfinals, but fell to Navy in the semifinals.

A NEW ERA

After a nearly 18-month wait, the new era is finally here and the University of Delaware Fightin' Blue Hens are officially full members of Conference USA as of July 1, 2025. Fourteen of UD's 22 varsity programs will be housed in CUSA, with seven others joining as affiliate members in the Atlantic Sun (women's lacrosse, men's and women's swimming & diving), Atlantic 10 (men's lacrosse), Mid-American Conference (rowing), The Summit League (men's soccer), and Atlantic Hockey America (ice hockey). Field hockey will play an independent schedule this fall as the department continues to work diligently to finalize a new conference for the reigning CAA champions.

An athletic department built on history and tradition, Delaware brings an abundance of success to CUSA having won 10 national championships, 172 team conference titles, 282 individual conference crowns, 342 major conference awards, 2,655 all-league selections, and 543 all-americans.

UD student-athletes complement their athletic success with strong academic performances. During the 2024-25 academic year, the Blue Hens compiled a cumulative 3.41

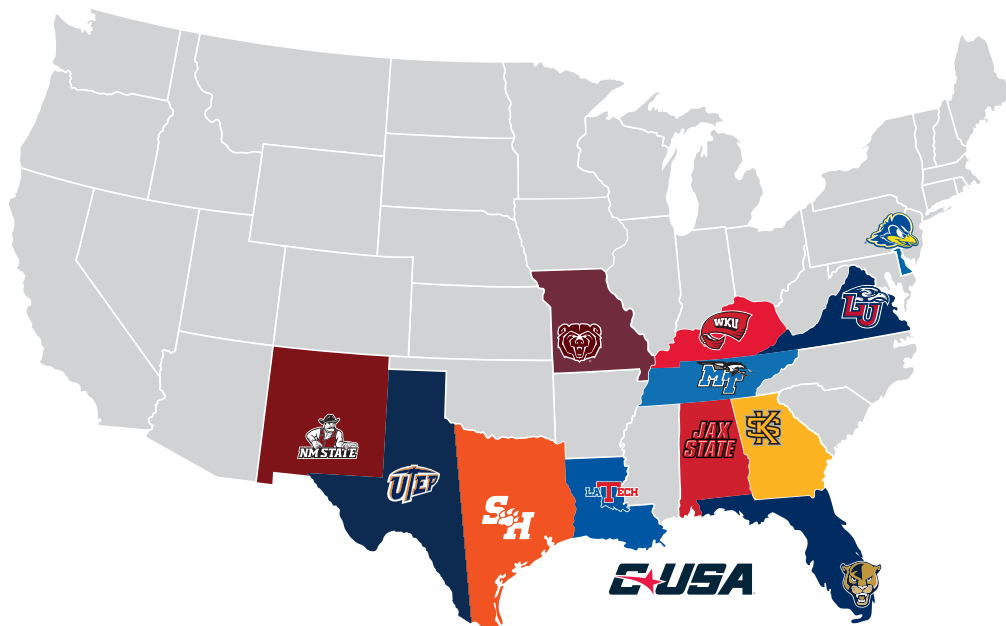
grade-point average—the highest in department history, excluding academic terms impacted by COVID-19. This marked the 11th-consecutive year and the 23rd-straight semester in which UD student-athletes have posted a 3.00 GPA or better.

The move will push the Delaware brand across the nation, spanning from the northeast down into Florida, and west as far as New Mexico. However, the reach won't stop there. At least five football games will hit the national scene on CBS Sports Network/ESPN family of networks, including a non-conference tilt on FOX against Colorado. Men's and women's basketball will also have the chance to play nationally televised games as part of CUSA's media rights agreement with CBS Sports Network and ESPN.

Speaking of reach, Delaware's initial announcements about joining Conference USA reached over two billion people according to social media analytics. Put that into perspective – just over one million people live in the state of Delaware. That means these announcements reached over 2,000 Delawares.

Conference USA is an NCAA Division I conference championing success in college athletics through dedicated leadership, dynamic partnership, and diverse membership. Founded in 1995 and based in Dallas, CUSA is home to nine schools: FIU, Jacksonville State, Liberty, Louisiana Tech, Middle Tennessee, New Mexico State, Sam Houston, UTEP, and WKU. Kennesaw State joined the league in 2024 and Delaware begins competition in 2025.

"Adding the University of Delaware is a tremendous opportunity for Conference USA as we strategically position ourselves for continued success," Conference USA Commissioner Judy MacLeod said. "We are excited to add the state's flagship university with its rich history in athletics and academics and look forward to our partnership with President Dennis Assanis, Director of Athletics Chrissi Rawak, and their leadership group."

GAME NOTES

season & road openers

UD is 58-61 all-time in season openers, including 6-3 under **Martin Ingelsby**. In road openers, the Hens are 35-84 all-time, 5-4 under Ingelsby.

tiebreaker time

This is the third-straight year the Hens are playing Bucknell in their season opener (1-1). Last season, the Hens fell to the Bison 85-73, and the year prior, UD won 78-57.

we go way back

Bucknell is Delaware's fourth most common opponent with 88 games.

new kids on the block

Ten of Delaware's 21 opponents this season are teams that UD has never played before. Eight of those 10 will be conference match-ups, meaning UD has only played three of the 11 current CUSA teams: LA Tech (1-0), Liberty (1-1), and Middle Tennessee (0-1).

majority rules

This year's roster is made up of nine newcomers and six returners, including three true freshmen and six transfers. The transfers are **Christian Bliss** (Virginia), **Jameel Brown** (Penn State/Temple), **Justyn Fernandez** (George Mason/Providence), **Bouna Kebe** (Independence CC/Gillette CC/Memphis), **Nnanna Njoku** (Villanova), and **Lance Piper** (South Carolina). The freshmen are **Mason Ellison**, **Alex Kazanecki** and **Jayden Taylor**.

UD will play each CUSA opponent twice, except FIU and WKU.

Cavan Reilly entered the transfer portal after the 2024-25 season, but decided to finish out his career as a Blue Hen.

his house(r)

Tyler Houser returns to the court after missing his junior year due to injury. It has been 603 days since he last played in a game.

the stars have aligned

Since 247Sports began composite recruiting rankings in 2003, only five top 150 high school players have played for Delaware. **Justyn Fernandez** (four-star) and **Nnanna Njoku** (four-star) of this year's roster are the fourth and fifth.

Adding **Christian Bliss** (three-star), marks the first time in program history, a roster will include three players that finished their high school careers as a top 175 recruit.

taylor-made

Freshman **Jayden Taylor** (0.8500) is the third-highest ranked 247Sports Composite Recruit to commit to Delaware out of high school since 2000. Only **Chyree Walker** (0.8614, Class of 2017) and **Marvin King-Davis** (0.8600, Class of 2011) rank ahead of Taylor. Two of the three best recruits since 2000 (Walker and Taylor) were recruited by Ingelsby.

one last ride

Brothers **Houston** and **Macon Emory** will play their final season of college basketball together this season. They are one of 16 sets of brothers to play on the same team in DI men's basketball.

comin' home

Graduate student **Nnanna Njoku** returns to his home state of Delaware after spending four years at Villanova.

Njoku is the first-ever Delaware men's basketball player to have been selected in a season's final release of the ESPN100 Recruiting Rankings. He was the 93rd ranked player in the 2021 ESPN100 list of high school recruits.

The four-year starter was named the 2021 Delaware Gatorade Player of the Year after tallying 20.8 points, 8.9 rebounds, and 1.9 blocks per game. His high school career included two DIAA State Championships in 2019 and 2021, both of which were played in the Bob Carpenter Center.

njoku vs. everyone

Jameel Brown and **Nnanna Njoku** played against each other on December 12, 2024 when Villanova beat Temple 94-65.

While at Providence **Justyn Fernandez** played against Villanova during Njoku's time there (75-73, Nova).

Njoku also played against UD in the NCAA Tournament on 3/18/22 (80-60, Nova).

age is but a number

The average age on the team is 21 years old.

90s baby

Bouna Kebe is one of eight current NCAA men's basketball players who were born in the 90s. He made the cut off by a week, as he was born on Christmas Eve in 1999.

it's all in the fam

Jayden Taylor's grandfather **Richard Hickman**, played basketball at UD from 1969-73, was named captain and MVP in 1972-73 and a freshman coach in 1973-74. His uncle, **Stan Waterman**, also played basketball at Delaware for one season in 1989.

Waterman was also **Nnanna Njoku's** high school coach at the Sanford School.

bcc legend

Brandon Baffone joined the Hens as a walk-on out of nearby Salesianum in the 2023-24 season. Baffone's dad, Brandon, hit the game-winning three pointer in the first-ever high school game played in the Bob Carpenter Center to lift Salesianum over Sanford in the state semifinal in March 1993.

full circle moment

The first basketball game that walk-on **Alex McFadden** ever attended was at UD.

from the bob to the big stage

In his time in Newark, Ingelsby and his staff have recruited and coached nine Blue Hens to the pros, including Delaware's first-ever NBA player, **Nate Darling**. The remaining eight are **Jameer Nelson Jr.**, **Andrew Carr**, **Ryan Allen**, **Kevin Anderson**, **Nate Darling**, **Jyare Davis**, **Dylan Painter**, and **Gianmarco Arletti**.

move over, martin

Usually a DI head basketball coach is the most famous in their family. That may not be the case for **Martin Ingelsby**. His brother, Brad, wrote and created the HBO hit *Mare of Easttown*, which is based in a Philadelphia suburb, similar to where the brothers grew up. The series received 16 nominations at the 73rd Primetime Emmy Awards and won four. Brad has another show, *Task*, that is currently airing on HBO Max.

Their father, Tom, was a standout guard at Villanova from 1970-73 and served as his son's head coach at Archbishop Carroll. Tom led Villanova to the 1971 NCAA championship game and played for the Atlanta Hawks during the 1973-74 season and for the Spirits of St. Louis in the ABA the following year.

the end of the caa era

The Fightin' Blue Hens ended their time in the CAA on a high note, becoming the first team in CAA history to win four-straight games in the conference tournament. UD was also the lowest seed to advance to the quarterfinals, semifinals, and finals in tournament history. Delaware became the second double-digit seed to reach the semis, joining the 2002 Hofstra Pride.

Head coach **Martin Ingelsby** left the conference tied for the fifth-most wins in CAA Tournament history with Lefty Driesell and Blaine Taylor at 13.

Delaware also became one of two teams in the CAA with five rookies of the year. Four of which came out of the Ingelsby era, making him the only coach in the CAA with as many ROTY.

HEAD COACH MARTIN INGELSBY

Martin Ingelsby enters his 10th season as the University of Delaware's men's basketball head coach in 2025-26.

During the summer of 2022, Ingelsby signed an extension that will keep him in Newark through the 2028-29 season. This was his second extension since signing his original contract in 2016.

Ingelsby and co. returned Delaware basketball to a place it has only been six times in program history with the CAA Championship title and NCAA Tournament First Round appearance in 2022. It marked the Blue Hens' first conference crown since the 2014 season.

In his time in Newark, Ingelsby and his staff have recruited and coached six Blue Hens to the pros, including Delaware's first-ever NBA player, Nate Darling.

Also under his leadership, the Blue Hens have garnered four CAA Rookie of the Year awards, 23 All-CAA honors, and six All-District nods.

In the 2024-25 season, Ingelsby led the Hens to the conference championship game, while becoming the first team in CAA history to win four games in the conference tournament. UD was also the lowest seed to advance to the quarterfinals, semifinals, and finals in tournament history. Delaware became only the second double-digit seed to reach the semis, joining the 2002 Hofstra Pride. Ingelsby left the conference tied for the fifth-most wins in CAA Tournament history with Lefty Driesell and Blaine Taylor at 13, as UD enters Conference USA for the 2025-26 campaign. This was Ingelsby fourth rookie of the year in eight eligible seasons.

During the 2021-22 campaign, Delaware posted a 22-13 record, the ninth 20+ win season ever. The 22 wins tied Ingelsby's season-best from the 2019-20 year. For the third time under Ingelsby, a Blue Hen was dubbed the league's Rookie of the Year as Jyare Davis garnered the award with 9.7 points and 4.2 rebounds per game. Davis was also the CAA

Tournament's Most Outstanding Player and was joined by teammates Kevin Anderson and Andrew Carr on the all-tournament team. Jameer Nelson Jr. rounded out the Hens' postseason CAA award winners as an All-CAA Second Team selection. Despite missing out on any CAA awards, Dylan Painter was tabbed to the NABC Second Team All-District.

Ingelsby led a steady improvement for the Blue Hens, as UD was one of just three Division I schools to increase its win total in four consecutive years from 2016-20.

In 2019-20 Ingelsby led UD to even greater heights as the Blue Hens finished 22-11, posting a five-win improvement and recording the eighth 20-win season in program history. Delaware set a program record by winning its first nine games, earning a vote in the Associated Press Top 25 poll for the first time in two decades. The Blue Hens tied for fourth place in the CAA and defeated Charleston in the quarterfinals to advance to the semifinals for the second consecutive year.

In 2018-19 the Blue Hens finished 17-16 and were fifth in the CAA standings, posting their highest win total and highest CAA finish in five years. Delaware erased a 14-point halftime deficit in the 85-79 win over William & Mary in the CAA quarterfinals, the largest halftime comeback in CAA Tournament history.

After spending the previous 13 seasons on the Notre Dame coaching staff from 2003-16, Ingelsby led the Blue Hens to 13 victories during his first year in Newark, including a win over Hofstra in the CAA Tournament. During his second year, Delaware won 14 games and earned a CAA Tournament victory for the second consecutive year by defeating Elon in the first round.

Ingelsby, the 24th head coach in UD men's basketball history, is a native of Berwyn, Pa., and was a standout point guard for Notre Dame from 1997-2001. He began his coaching career as an

assistant at Wagner College during the 2002-03 campaign before returning to his alma mater as Notre Dame's coordinator of basketball operations. He spent six seasons in that position before being promoted to assistant coach in July 2009, a position he held for seven years. During his tenure in South Bend, Ingelsby helped lead the Irish to eight NCAA Tournament appearances.

While in South Bend Ingelsby primarily worked with the Notre Dame guards and played an integral role in elevating the program's national recruiting efforts. The Fighting Irish reaped the benefits of that recruiting success over his final two seasons as Notre Dame advanced to the NCAA Tournament's Elite Eight in both 2015 and 2016.

The Fighting Irish enjoyed a magical 2014-15 campaign as Notre Dame won the Atlantic Coast Conference Tournament title, made its first Elite Eight appearance since 1979, and posted the second 30-win season in school history by finishing with a 32-6 mark.

Despite losing Jerian Grant and Pat Connaughton to the NBA, Notre Dame followed with another outstanding campaign in 2015-16, advancing to the ACC Tournament Semifinals before making its second straight Elite Eight appearance.

Ingelsby helped mentor Grant, a first team consensus All-American and unanimous first team All-ACC pick in 2015 before getting selected by the New York Knicks with the 19th pick in the 2015 NBA Draft. He also worked extensively with Connaughton, who played in a school-record 139 games and was the 41st pick in the 2015 NBA Draft by the Brooklyn Nets. That season marked the first time since 1992 that two Notre Dame players were selected in the same year of the NBA Draft.

Under Ingelsby's tutelage, Irish point guard Demetrius Jackson enjoyed an outstanding season in 2015-16, earning second team All-ACC and NCAA East Regional All-Tournament Team accolades.

Ingelsby helped lead Notre Dame to a school-record seven consecutive 20-win seasons from 2006-13, while the Irish posted 97 victories from 2009-13, the most wins in a four-year period in school history. During Ingelsby's 13 seasons at his alma mater, Irish teams went 290-146 (.665) and the program posted a 168-76 record with six NCAA Tournament appearances in seven

years once he assumed assistant coaching duties.

Ingelsby was Notre Dame's starting point guard during three of his four seasons in South Bend. As a senior in 2000-01, he averaged 8.2 points and a team-high 6.4 assists as a starter in all 30 games. A team captain during his senior year, he guided the Irish to a 20-10 overall record and the Big East's West Division championship, the school's first-ever conference title. Additionally, Notre Dame advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament after earning a berth in the field for the first time in more than a decade in Mike Brey's first season.

Ingelsby also started for the Irish as a freshman and sophomore and led the team in assists during three of his four seasons. He handed out a team-high 150 assists as a freshman and earned a spot on the 1998 Big East All-Rookie Team.

A two-time member of the Big East Academic All-Star Team, Ingelsby was the recipient of the Notre Dame Club of St. Joseph Valley Rockne Student-Athlete Award during his senior season. He graduated from the Mendoza College of Business with a bachelor's degree in marketing in May 2001.

Ingelsby enjoyed an outstanding career at Archbishop Carroll High School in suburban Philadelphia where he finished as the school's all-time leading scorer with 1,425 points and led his teams to an 80-12 record during his three years on the varsity squad.

Following his senior year in 1997, he won the prestigious Markward Award, given annually to the top high school player in the Philadelphia area, and was the Gatorade Player of the Year for Philadelphia while also earning All-Catholic League honors three times. Ingelsby was also named South Catholic League MVP as a senior and was a McDonald's All-America honorable mention selection.

Ingelsby's father, Tom, was a standout guard at Villanova from 1970-73 and served as his son's head coach at Archbishop Carroll. Tom led Villanova to the 1971 NCAA championship game and played for the Atlanta Hawks during the 1973-74 season and for the Spirits of St. Louis in the ABA the following year.

Ingelsby and his wife, Colleen, are the parents of twins Will and Kate, and sons Jack and Ben.
