OPENING KICK

For the first time in over two decades, the University of Delaware women's soccer team takes on Navy in a non-conference matchup.

UD is looking for its first win against Navy in program history. Its record is 0-3 in its previous matchups.

The Fightin' Blue Hens enter the game with a 3-0 overall record, the best start to a season under Head Coach **Kelly Lawrence**. The last time the Blue Hens started 3-0 was in 2006.

Last time out, the Blue Hens defeated George Mason by a score of 2-0. **Lilli Lubic** opened the game with a goal in the 24th minute. **Brooke Vogel** scored a late game goal in the 82nd minute to secure the win.

Maggie Groh leads the Blue Hens in goals (3), assists (3) and points (9). She has registered a point in all three games of the season.

Navy enters the game with a 3-0 record on the season after it defeated Wofford by a score of 1-0 on Thursday at home.

A NEW ERA

After a nearly 18-month wait, the new era is finally here and the University of Delaware Fightin' Blue Hens are officially full members of Conference USA as of July 1, 2025. Fourteen of UD's 22 varsity programs will be housed in CUSA, with seven others joining as affiliate members in the Atlantic Sun (women's lacrosse, men's and women's swimming & diving), Atlantic 10 (men's lacrosse), Mid-American Conference (rowing), The Summit League (men's soccer), and Atlantic Hockey America (ice hockey). Field hockey will play an independent schedule this fall as the department continues to work diligently to finalize a new conference for the reigning CAA champions.

An athletic department built on history and tradition, Delaware brings an abundance of success to CUSA having won 10 national championships, 172 team conference titles, 282 individual conference crowns, 342 major conference awards, 2,655 all-league selections, and 543 all-americans.

UD student-athletes complement their athletic success with strong academic performances. During the 2024-25 academic year, the Blue Hens compiled a

cumulative 3.41 grade-point average—the highest in department history, excluding academic terms impacted by COVID-19. This marked the 11th-consecutive year and the 23rd-straight semester in which UD student-athletes have posted a 3.00 GPA or better.

The move will push the Delaware brand across the nation, spanning from the northeast down into Florida, and west as far as New Mexico. However, the reach won't stop there. At least five football games will hit the national scene on CBS Sports Network/ESPN family of networks, including a non-conference tilt on FOX against Colorado. Men's and women's basketball will also have the chance to play nationally televised games as part of CUSA's media rights agreement with CBS Sports Network and ESPN.

Speaking of reach, Delaware's initial announcements about joining Conference USA reached over two billion people according to social media analytics. Put that into perspective - just over one million people live in the state of Delaware. That means these announcements reached over 2.000 Delawares.

Conference USA is an NCAA Division I conference championing success in college athletics through dedicated leadership, dynamic partnership, and diverse membership. Founded in 1995 and based in Dallas, CUSA is home to nine schools: FIU, Jacksonville State, Liberty, Louisiana Tech, Middle Tennessee, New Mexico State, Sam Houston, UTEP, and WKU. Kennesaw State joins the league in 2024 and Delaware begins competition in 2025.

"Adding the University of Delaware is a tremendous opportunity for Conference USA as we strategically position ourselves for continued success," Conference USA Commissioner Judy MacLeod said. "We are excited to add the state's flagship university with its rich history in athletics and academics and look forward to our partnership with President Dennis Assanis, Director of Athletics Chrissi Rawak, and their leadership group."

groh-ing talent

Maggie Groh kicked off the 2025 season in a big way against Mount St. Mary's and Bucnkell. She scored two goals and added one assist in the 5-2 win over the Mountaineers. Against the Bison, she scored one goal, and had the assist on Tasiya Reid's gamewinning goal in the 86th minute. Groh was named the Conference USA Player of the Week on Tuesday, August 19

good starts

Despite it being early in the season, multiple Blue Hens have statistically had their best seasons of their career.

Heading into the 2025 season,

Maggie Groh had four career
goals and one career assist. She
scored one goal her freshman
season, and scored three
goals and had one assist in her
sophomore season. In 2025, she
already has three goals, and three
assists.

Taisiya Reid entered the 2025 season with one career goal. She doubled her career goal total with two on the season.

Freshman **Sophia Hall** started in net and played all 180 minutes through the first two games of the season. She boast a 3-0 record and recorded 10 saves. She became the first freshman goalkeeper since 2022 to record a solo shutout win against George Mason on August 21.

point streaks

Maggie Groh has recorded a point in each of the first three games of the season. She leads the Blue Hens in points with nine. Last season, Groh recorded seven points.

historic start

The Blue Hens 3-0 record to open the season is the programs best start under third year Head Coach **Kelly Lawrence**, and is the best since the spring of 2006. The last time the Blue Hens started 4-0 also was back in 2006.

fast starts

The Blue Hens under **Kelly Lawrence** have benefitted from fast starts and strong first half performances. The Blue Hens are 14-0-2 when scoring first, as well as 9-0-0 when leading at the half. In the 2025 season, the Blue Hens are 4-0 when scoring first and when leading at halftime. The Blue Hens are also 8-2-1 when scoring two or more goals under **Kelly Lawrence.**

improvements. In Lawrence's first season in 2023, the program nearly tripled its win total. The Blue Hens shut out opponents six times in 2023, including a shutout over the CAA Regular Season and Tournament Champions Towson. Its defense allowed the least amount of goals in the conference (13), leading to the second-best goals against average in the conference of 0.72. Both those marks rank third all time in program history, and is the defensive season for the Blue Hens since 2009.

In 2023, the Blue Hens goalkeepers put up one of the best seasons in program history. Their save percentage of .851 ranks third in program history and is the best mark since 2009. Individually, goalkeeper Kyla Burns also had one of the best seasons in net in program history. She ranks second all time in save percentage in a season at .911. Burns also led the country in save percentage as well. She became the first Blue Hen ever to lead the NCAA in any statistical category.

team improvements - 2024

The Delaware women's soccer program in 2024 earned their first trip to the CAA Tournament since the 2019 season. During the 2024 campaign, the Blue Hens started off conference play 4-0, while also winning five games in a row. It was the best stretch for the program since 2011. During the stretch, the Blue Hens had late game heroics from Maggie Groh and **Brooke Vogel**, as the two scored game winning goals to defeat Hofstra and Campbell. In 2024, **Kyla Burns** became the first Blue Hen in program history to

earn the conference goalkeeper of the year. Burns also earned first team all-conference honors, along with Conny Viehmann, Carly Binn, Caitin St. Leger, Brooke Vogel and Olivia Bley all earned all-conference honors.

The Delaware defense allowed six goals in 10 CAA contests. UD had seven shutouts in CAA play and eight throughout the season.

diverse group

The 2025 Blue Hens roster brings a wealth of diversity. The roster consists of six different states (Delaware, Maryland, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Virginia) and three different countries (Canada, Germany, United States).

out of country members

Defenders Ava Ticconi and Connny Viehmann are two athletes who come from different countries. Ticconi is from Ontario Canada, and Viehmann is from Landenburg, Germany.

bia shoes to fill

The Blue Hens will look to fill some big shoes during the 2025 season. UD will look to replace **Kyla Burns**, one of the programs best goalkeepers. Burns is a twotime All-CAA athlete, including the conference goalkeeper of the vear, and First Team All-CAA nods. Her career save percentage of .852 is the best in program histroy. The Blue Hens will also look to replace all-conference athletes **Caitlin** St. Leger and Carly Binn, as well as impact starters Paige Kenton, Laura Fluegge, Amy Swain, Morgan Tilley and Sydni Wright

The Blue Hens have not won a game on August 24th in program history. The lone time they've played on this date was against Georgetown in 2017 (L, 1-0)

starters, they will also return several key players. Key returners include **Connny Viehmann**, who is a three year starter on the defensive side and earned All-CAA honors in 2024. Viehmann logged nearly 1500 minutes on the field, which is second most amonst returners. Other additional key returners include **Maggie Groh**, and **Brooke Vogel**, both of whom had three goals and one assist, **Olivia Bley**, and **Gabby Riley**.Vogel and Bley were named to the conference all-rookie team. Riley leads returners in minutes played at 1656 and assists at four.

team captains

Gabby Riley, Willa Pratt, and **Conny Viehmann** were named team captains for the 2025 season.

hens in the pros

Three women's soccer alumnae currently compete for clubs in the professional ranks. **Kyla Burns** plays for Breidablik which plays in the top division in Iceland. **Paige Kenton** plays for Sporting JAX FC, which is located in Jacksonville and competes in the Gainbridge Super League. **Sara D'Appolonia** signed with Peninsula Power FC, and currently plays for Melbourne Victory FC in Australia.

siblings on the team

The Blue Hens roster includes sisters Ava and Leilah Sallee. Leilah is currently a senior, while Ava is a sophomore.

club connections

The Blue Hens roster consists of multiple athletes who competed for the same club soccer team.

Goalkeeper **Sophia Hall**, defender **Maura Fisher**, foward **Olivia Bley**, defender **Alayna Eyman**, and midfielder **Brooke Vogel** all played for Penn Fusion, located in West Chester, Pennsylvania. With Penn Fusion, Vogel earned first team All-ECNL honors in 2022 and 2023.

Additionally, defender **Maggie Holloway** and midfielder **Sophia Zeppos** competed for FC Revolutions, located in Reading, Pennsylvania. Both Holloway and Zeppos were starters while Zeppos served as a team captain. FC Revolution won three state up championships and were regional champions in 2022.

multi-sport athletes

Several athletes competed in multiple sports during their time in high school. Freshman goalkeeper **Sophia Hall** was a four sport athlete, who competed in track & field, basketball, lacrosse, and soccer

In addition, seven athletes competed in track & field:

Maura Fisher, Ava Sallee, Adiat Olagun-Dickson,

Gabby Riley, Taisiya Reid, and Brooke Vogel. Sallee
helped break the school record for the Fleetwood Area
High School track & field team in the 4 by 100-meters.

Three athetes competed in basketball: Maggie Groh, Ryan Mundy, and Sophia Zeppos. In 2023, Groh hit a 3-pointer at the buzzer to win the league title for the Dallastown girls' basketball team over York-Adams. Hall was a four-year starter and team captain her senior season.

Two athletes competed in lacrosse: **Maura Fisher** and **Sophia Zeppos**. Zeppos was a starter her senior year.

cross-sports connections

Midfielder **Gabby Riley** and incoming freshman **Taylor Stone** for the Delaware track & field team both competed for the Middletown High School track & field and soccer teams. Stone also competed for Sporting Delaware soccer club, the same club as defender Ryan Mundy.

best buddies

In high school freshman midfielder **Sophia Zeppos** was the vice president of the Best Buddies club and was a part of the club unified bocce team her junior and senior seasons.

Unified bocce is a Special Olympics program that pairs students with and without intellectual disabilities on the same sports team. This inclusive sport promotes teamwork, friendship, and a sense of belonging for all participants. It's part of the larger Unified Champion Schools program, which also includes youth leadership and whole school engagement components.

Zeppos was partnered with an special education athlete and was paired with them for the entire season. They would practice after school in the winter and played other schools in the area once a week. Unified bocce was treated as a varsity sport.

"For me personally, it was really heart warming seeing how much the season meant to our partners and seeing them make the enviorment what they wanted," Zeppos said. "Sometimes we take for granted how easy it is to make friends on our own sports teams. So, seeing how much it meant to them being on a team was the most important thing to me."

coaches experience in the pros

Head coach **Kelly Lawrence** and associate head coach **Becky Edwards** both have experience playing professionally. Edwards was selected 12th overall in the 2010 Women's Professional Soccer draft, leading FC Gold Pride to a WPS Championship in her rookie season. That was the start of a nine-year pro career which also included titles with Western NY Flash and Portland Thorns, as well as two stints in Sweden.

At the international level, Edwards captained the United States to the 2008 FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup title, and in 2011 she helped the U.S. U-23 National Team win a championship at the Four Nations Tournament in La Manga, Spain.

Lawrence played competitively for the Boston Breakers Reserves (2010) and the Orange County Waves Professional (2011) of the WPSL. Lawrence also played on the England National Team (U15-U23) and Team Great Britain.

Kelly Lawrence was named the women's soccer head coach on November 14, 2022. Lawrence begins her third season as the programs head coach.

The Delaware women's soccer program earned its first trip to the CAA Tournament since the 2019 season. During the 2024 campaign, the Blue Hens started off conference play 4-0, while also winning five games in a row. It was the best stretch for the program since 2011.

In 2024, Kyla Burns became the first Blue Hen in program history to earn the conference goalkeeper of the year. Burns also earned first team All-Conference honors, along with Conny Viehmann, Carly Binn, Caitin St. Leger, Brooke Vogel and Olivia Bley all earned all-conference honors.

The Blue Hens women's soccer program made big strides in their first year under Lawrence in 2023. They started off her coaching career in a big way, defeating Syracuse 1-0. It was the program's first ever win over a power-five school. The Blue Hens picked up a victory over La Salle on the road for the first time since 1994, and tied the program record for goals in a game in its 9-1 win over Hampton.

Prior to UD, Lawrence was the associate head coach at Penn State for one season in 2022. The Nittany Lions made a sweet 16 apperance

Prior to Penn State, Lawrence served as the associate head coach at Boston University from 2019–22. While at Boston U, she helped coach the team to the 2021 Patriot League Spring North Division Champions and the 2021 Patriot League Regular Season Champions.

Previous stops for Lawrence include serving as the interim head coach/ assistant coach at Syracuse University from 2015–19.

As an assistant coach at Monmouth from 2013–14, she helped the team win the 2013 MAAC Tournament Championship and earn back-to-back MAAC Regular Season Championships in 2013 and 2014.

Lawrence competed for Indiana
University from 2006-10. While in college
she was named to the Mac Hermann
Watch List (2008), NCAA Sweet Sixteen
Finalist (2007), First Team All- B1G TEN
(2007), B1G Ten All-Freshman Team (2006),
All B1G Ten Freshmen Team, and threetime NSCAA All-Region. She was the only
player in Indiana History to win All-B1G
Ten honors in all four years.

She played competitively for the Boston Breakers Reserves (2010) and the Orange County Waves Professional (2011) of the WPSL. Lawrence also played on the England National Team (U15-U23) and Team Great Britain.

Lawrence is married to Delaware Ice Hockey Head Coach Allison Coomey.

Becky Edwards enters her first season with the Delaware women's soccer program in 2025.

Prior to joining the Blue Hens staff, Edwards spent three seasons with Tennessee. The Volunteers boasted a 29-20-10 record in

the three seasons Edwards was there, including three straight trips to the NCAA Tournament. In 2022, the Volunteers offense ranked second in the Southeastern Conference (SEC) in goals per game at 2.26, and third in total goals with 43 en route to a SEC East Division Co-Championship.

Before her time in Rocky Top, Edwards was an assistant coach at Penn for one season. She helped lead the Quakers to a 9-5-2 record in 2021 and working directly with the offense, which turned in 29 goals over 16 games.

Outside of collegiate coaching, Edwards is a current Assistant Coach for the US U-20 Women's National Team. With US women's soccer, the team won a bronze medal in the FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup, and a a silver medal in the CONCACAF U20 Championships

During her playing career, Edwards was an accomplished athlete at both the collegiate and professional levels. A two-time First Team All-America selection, she led Florida State to a 72-18-11 record during her four years, making NCAA Tournament appearances every season and twice advancing to the College Cup. She was named to the Florida State Athletics Hall of Fame in 2021.

She graduated magna cum laude from FSU in 2010 before being drafted as the 12th overall pick in the 2010 Women's Professional Soccer draft

At the international level, Edwards captained the United States to the 2008 FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup title, and in 2011 she helped the U.S. U-23 National Team win a championship at the Four Nations Tournament in La Manga, Spain. Following that performance, she earned a call-up to the senior USWNT camp.

With the help of Coley, Kyla Burns became the first Blue Hen in program history to earn the conference goalkeeper of the year. Burns also earned first team all-conference honors, while Conny Viehmann, Carly Binn, Caitin St. Leger, Brooke Vogel and Olivia Bley all earned all-conference honors.

The Delaware defense allowed six goals in 10 CAA contests. They had seven shutouts in CAA play and eight throughout the season.

The Blue Hens shutout opponents six times in 2023, including a shutout over the CAA Regular Season and Tournament Champions Towson. Their defense allowed the least amount of goals in the conference (13), leading to the second best goals against average in the conference of 0.72. Both those marks rank third all time in program history, and is the defensive season for the Blue Hens since 2009.

In 2023, under the help of Coley, the Blue Hens goalkeepers put up one of the best seasons in program history. Their save percentage of .851 ranks third in program history and is the best mark since 2009. Individually, goalkeeper Kyla Burns also had one of the best seasons in net in program history. She ranks second all time in save percentage in a season at .911. Burns also led the country in save percentage as well. She became the first Blue Hen ever to lead the NCAA in any statistical category.

Coley previously coached at Rhode Island, Western Michigan and Lawrence Tech.

She graduated from Oakland as the single-season record for shutouts with eight in 2012 and was a Summit League All-Tournament Team selection in 2012.
