#### **OPENING PASS**

- ▶ Delaware Fightin' Blue Hens field hockey will begin its 55th season against the Temple Owls on August 29, 2025.
- ► The reigning CAA champions will play an independent schedule this fall as the department diligently works to find a conference affiliation. As an independent team, UD will still be eligible for an at-large bid to the NCAA Tournament.
- ► This will be the Hens' first season under head coach **Tara Zollinger**. She was hired as the seventh coach in program history on March 17, 2025. Assisting Zollinger this year, will be Ally Mooney, Devin Kinzel, and Sydney Rhodes-James.
- ► Thirteen new student-athletes joined the Blue Hens for the 2024-25 season, including nine fresh-
- ► For Temple, it is coming off of a 12-8 season, including a trip to the BIG EAST Championship game. The Owls lost their three top goal scorers, a trio including current Blue Hen assistant, Devin Kinzel.
- ► Temple returns its starting netminder in Isabelle Ospitale, while the Hens will look to Northeastern graduate transfer Kristi Merashoff in the cage.

#### A NEW ERA

After a nearly 18-month wait, the new Hens compiled a cumulative 3.41 era is finally here and the University of Delaware Fightin' Blue Hens are officially full members of Conference USA as of July 1, 2025. Fourteen of UD's 22 varsity programs will be housed in CUŚA, with seven others joining as affiliate members in the Atlantic Sun (women's lacrosse, men's and women's swimming & diving), Atlantic 10 (men's lacrosse), Mid-American Conference (rowing), The Summit League (men's soccer), and Atlantic Hockey America (ice hockey). Field hockey will play an independent However, the reach won't stop there. schedule this fall as the department continues to work diligently to finalize the national scene on CBS Sports a new conference for the reigning CAA champions.

An athletic department built on history and tradition, Delaware brings an abundance of success to CUSA having won 10 national championships, 172 team conference titles, 282 individual conference crowns. 342 major conference awards, 2,655 all-league selections, and 543 all-americans.

UD student-athletes complement their athletic success with strong academic performances. During the 2024-25 academic year, the Blue

grade-point average—the highest in department history, excluding academic terms impacted by COVID-19. This marked the 11thconsecutive year and the 23rdstraight semester in which UD student-athletes have posted a 3.00 GPA or better.

The move will push the Delaware brand across the nation, spanning from the northeast down into Florida, and west as far as New Mexico. At least five football games will hit Network/ESPN family of networks, including a non-conference tilt on FOX against Colorado. Men's and women's basketball will also have the chance to play nationally televised games as part of CUSA's media rights agreement with CBS Sports Network and ESPN.

Speakina of reach, Delaware's initial announcements about joining Conference USA reached over two billion people according to social media analytics. Put that into perspective - just over one million people live in the state of Delaware. That means these announcements

reached over 2,000 Delawares.

Conference USA is an NCAA Division I conference championing success in college athletics through dedicated leadership, dynamic partnership, and diverse membership. Founded in 1995 and based in Dallas, CUSA is home to nine schools: FIU, Jacksonville State, Liberty, Louisiana Tech, Middle Tennessee, New Mexico State, Sam Houston, UTEP, and WKU. Kennesaw State joins the league in 2024 and Delaware begins competition in 2025.

#### a new era

Delaware enters a new era of Blue Hens athletics as UD makes the jump to FBS football and Conference USA. The Blue & Gold were the first program to announce a transition from FCS to FBS once the transition fee jumped from \$5 thousand to \$5 million. The entire \$5 million was paid for by donors with the money being raised in a seven-month span.

#### new hen in the flock

Tara Zollinger was hired in March 2025 to be the seventh head coach in program history. She won three DII National Championships at Shippensburg, and made the semifinal game in all six of her NCAA Tournament appearances. Zollinger coached to a record of 118–25 (.825), producing 41 all-league players, and 23 All-Americans in her time with the Raiders.

#### portal combat

The Hens' coaching staff recruited four players out of the transfer portal this offseason. B Linde van Leeuwen (Bryant), M/F Ashlee Bucksar (Liberty), M/F Alexa Michielsen (Shippensburg), and GK Kristi Merashoff (Northeastern) all join the squad after spending the 2024 season at another institution. B Iris Bekker returns for her second season after transferring in from Kent State.

#### back home

Delaware hired Volunteer Assistant Coach **Sydney Rhodes-James** in July. The program alum returns to Newark after four seasons as an assistant coach at Penn. Rhodes-James appeared in 50 games in goal at Delaware, including nine in the Blue Hens national championship season of 2016.

#### familiar (masked) face

GK **Kristi Merashoff** joined the Fightin' Blue Hens for her final season of collegiate action and to pursue a master's degree in Business Analytics & Information Management. Previously, she was the goalie at former Coastal Athletic Association (CAA) foe, Northeastern. Merashoff won both games she was in the cage for against Delaware in her career, saving 15-of-17 shots on goal (.882).

#### not far from her roots

Delaware Assistant Coach **Devin Kinzel** spent the 2021 through 2024 seasons playing for today's opponent, the Temple Owls. She was named to the All-BIG EAST Second Team in 2024. Kinzel also served as the team's volunteer assistant coach in the beginning of 2025.

M **Kate Fiest** earned a spot on the 2025 NFHCA Preseason Watchlist, the organization announced Thursday.

#### early success

All six of Delaware field hockey's head coaches have earned wins in their coaching debuts. Most recently, Rolf van de Kerkhof defeated Bryant 7-1 in 2011.

#### last time out

Delaware returns 10 players to the roster that appeared in its last game against Temple in 2023, where the Hens fell 2-0. In that game, Assistant Coach **Devin Kinzel** dished out the pass leading to the Owls' second goal, icing the victory for the opposition.

#### around the world

The Hens roster includes five international student-athletes this season, including four from The Netherlands. B Linde van Leeuwen, B Iris Bekker, M/F Alexa Michielsen, and F Livia van't Hek hail from The Netherlands. While freshman M/F Charlotte Robertson is from Edinburgh, Scotland

#### bringing some friends along

Head Coach **Tara Zollinger** brought her assistant coach from Shippensburg in **Ally Mooney** to the 302 to coach the goalkeepers. Mooney also played for Zollinger from 2017-18, where the pair won two national championships. Graduate M/F **Alexa Michielsen** joins the Fightin' Blue Hens after three seasons at Shippensburg, where she played in 40 games, scoring 10 goals. She earned All-PSAC Third Team honors and was the 2024 PSAC Field Hockey Tournament MVP.

#### family ties

Delaware field hockey has become a family affair over the years. Many sisters and mother-daughter pairs have suited up in the Blue & Gold over the programs 55 seasons. The Blue Hens have four such duos across the 2025 roster.

M **Tetje Williamson** is the daughter of Kelly Cawley '99, a Delaware Athletics Hall of Famer who ranks second in all-time points.

M **Emma Miller** is the sister of Grace Miller, a 2022 graduate who played in 71 games, earning all-conference second team honors her senior year.

M **Sarah Rigual's** sister, Morgan Rigual, made 68 appearances for Delaware. She graduated in 2023, assisting the Blue Hens to the NCAA Tournament three times.

Volunteer Assistant Coach **Sydney Rhodes-James** and her twin sister Sabrina shared the field in 2016 and 2017, winning an NCAA Championship in Sydney's freshman season.

#### elite company

Tara Zollinger enters the 2025 season with the third-highest active winning percentage in the NCAA (.825) and is tied for the highest amongst active coaches who have coached at least 100 games (Brooke Good - DIII Messiah University).

#### **HEAD COACH TARA ZOLLINGER**

Three-time Division II national championship winning head coach Tara Zollinger enters her first season as the head coach for Delaware field hockey after her hire in March of 2025.

"Tara has a proven track record of winning and competing at the highest levels," Skolnick said. "We are excited to welcome her, her husband Eyoel, and children Isra and Elias to the Blue Hen family. It was clear that she is committed to providing a great student-athlete experience and has a strong vision for player development. We are all looking forward to seeing Tara continue the rich history of success of our field hockey program."

Zollinger comes to Newark after spending the previous eight seasons (2017-24) as the head coach at Dll Shippensburg in Pennsylvania where she won national championships in 2017, 2018, and 2021. She also led the Raiders to the 2022 national title game and semifinal appearances in 2023 and 2024.

A Jeannette, Pennsylvania native, Zollinger boasts a 118-25 career record, including 59-8 in conference play, and 10-3 in NCAA Tournaments. She has directed four National Field Hockey Coaches Association (NFHCA) Regional Coaching Staffs of the Year, and a trio of NFHCA National Coaching Staffs of the Year.

Over the course of her eight seasons in Shippensburg, Zollinger has produced 41 all-league players, and 23 All-Americans. She's claimed four regular season Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference (PSAC) titles and a pair of conference tournament titles.

Prior to taking the reins for the Raiders, she spent four seasons (2013–16) as an assistant coach at Syracuse where she worked for former Blue Hen and UD Athletics Hall of Fame inductee (2005) Ange Bradley. She helped Bradley and the Orange to a national championship, ACC regular season title, and both NFHCA regional and national coaching staff of the year awards.

At Syracuse, Zollinger was a part of one the school's most successful seasons. She helped instruct a 2015 team that posted a perfect 16-0 regular-season record – the first team in 25 seasons to achieve the feat. The No. 1-ranked Orange also

swept the 2015 ACC postseason awards, becoming the first team to do so since North Carolina in 1994.

A two-time PSAC Coach of the Year, Zollinger also serves as a coach with USA Field Hockey. She's held a number of roles including nexus coach (2021-25), supplemental coach for the women's U21 team (2024), high performance midatlantic region coach (2017-19), talent selection (2013-15, 2018, 2021-24), U14 futures national championship coach (2016-17), futures head coach and director (2014-17), and futures assistant coach (2010-14).

On the national level, Zollinger served a two-year term (2017-18 and 2018-19) as the field hockey representative on the coaches' council for WeCOACH (formerly Alliance of Women Coaches). She was one of 15 coaches from across the country spanning all three NCAA divisions that served on the council, serving as an ambassador in coaching communities and networks. At the completion of her term, Zollinger graduated from WeCOACH Academy 2.0.

She played college field hockey for former Blue Hen and UD Athletics Hall of Famer (1998) Missy Meharg at Maryland. For the Terps, Zollinger was an attacker who won two NCAA Championships (2010, 2011) and two ACC Championships (2009, 2010) – reaching the Final Four in all four of her collegiate seasons. She received Maryland's Kateri Simon Award in 2012, recognizing an athlete that persevered in times of adversity and displayed courage while bringing positive energy to all team sessions.

Zollinger earned her undergraduate degree in sociology in 2013 and was an active member of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC). She was also a development assistant with the University of Maryland Terrapin Club, coordinating and organizing member and donor events.

She also holds two master's degrees in sport administration (2019) and sport and exercise psychology (2018) from Lock

Zollinger and her husband Eyoel have two children - Isra and Elias.

### ALLY MOONEY ASSISTANT COACH

Mooney enters her first season as an assistant coach with Delaware field hockey in 2025 after being hired in April of 2025

Mooney comes to Newark after spending the previous three seasons under Zollinger at DII Shippensburg, where she served as the program's defensive coordinator. She led a

unit that sat atop the nation in goals against average (0.80) and scoring margin (+2.71), while sitting third in shutouts per game (0.48).

In charge of the Raider goalkeepers, Mooney oversaw the emergence of the NCAA Division II leader in save percentage (.821) and helped guide the Raiders to the PSAC Championship game and the NCAA Division II Semifinals during the 2023 season.

Mooney joined the coaching staff at her alma mater in 2022, and helped guide the Raiders to their second-consecutive NCAA Division II National Championship Game appearance.

Mooney returned to Shippensburg after spending three seasons as an assistant coach at Appalachian State University, contributing to numerous accomplishments with the Mountaineers. In 2021, Mooney helped lead the Mountaineers to their first win over a ranked opponent in program history with a 2-0 shutout of James Madison. In 2019, Mooney helped lead App State to its first winning season since 2003 and set a program best for wins to begin a season with a 6-0 start.

Among the players Mooney coached at App State include the school's first-ever conference player of the year and three All-MAC performers overall. 2019, including five in the team's first six games.

As a student-athlete at Shippensburg, Mooney was a starting goalkeeper who helped the Raiders win three consecutive NCAA Division II National Championships from 2016-18. She registered a 68-16 record and had an incredible .816 save percentage, recording 24 shutouts between the posts and allowing less than a goal per game over the course of her career.

Mooney was a two-time team captain and earned multiple awards during her collegiate career. Along with three notional championships, Mooney was named an NFHCA All-American in 2014 and 2016. As a freshman, she earned a spot on the Synapse Sports All-Rookie Team after allowing just 0.76 goals per game.

A native of Spring City, Pa., Mooney earned a bachelor's degree in exercise science with a minor in coaching in December 2018 and her master's degree from Shippensburg in 2023 in organizational development and leadership with a concentration in business.



## **DEVIN KINZEL**ASSISTANT COACH

Kinzel will begin her first campaign as an assistant coach with the Delaware field hockey program in the 2025 season.

Kinzel spent four seasons on the Temple University field hockey team and assumed a role as a volunteer assistant with her alma mater beginning in January of 2025.

During her playing career, she was a team captain her senior season and earned All-BIG EAST Second Team honors while helping the Owls achieve their furthest postseason run since 2015.

Her stint as a coach with her former team allowed her to assist with team management and game preparation, as well as mentoring players while encouraging academic and athletic success.



### SYDNEY RHODES-JAMES VOLUNTEER ASSISTANT COACH

Rhodes-James joins the Delaware field hockey staff for her first season as a volunteer assistant coach in 2025.

Rhodes-James returns to Newark after graduating in 2019 and making multiple coaching stops along the way.

The Delaware alum was a five-year goalie for the Blue Hens, who made 50 appearances, including nine during the Hen's run to capturing the 2016 NCAA Division I Championship. She graduated in 2019 with a bachelor's degree in health behavior science from Delaware's College of Health Sciences.

Rhodes–James started her coaching experience working with Harford Hockey Organization (H20) in Harford County, Md., in 2014, a position she held through 2021.

Her collegiate coaching experience includes time as an assistant coach with the University of Pennsylvania, where she spent four seasons from 2021-24 with a specialized focus in coaching the goalkeepers and organizing team logistics.

During that time, Penn was able to have a goalie earn First Team All-Ivy League under Rhodes-James' tutelage.

After leaving Philadelphia, Rhodes-James reconnected with H20 in January 2025, becoming the program's co-director, head coach, and head goalkeepers coach for players aged 10-19.
