FIRST PITCH

The University of Delaware will play its second straight Conference USA series at home as it hosts Kennesaw State for its first-ever meeting with the Owls.

Delaware is currently on a seven-game winning streak where it has outscored its opponents 43-18. As a team, UD is hitting .302/.413/.471 and has held the opposition to a .212 average. Delaware has allowed four runs or fewer in all seven games and has pitched to a 2.48 ERA during the streak.

During Delaware's seven-game win streak, **Katie Scheivert** is hitting .391/.444/.556 with nine hits and six RBIs, **Sydney Shaffer** is hitting .438/.630/1.188 with three home runs, nine RBIs, and eight walks, and **Sorella Gallucci** is hitting .385/.579/.385 with three stolen bases. **Karli Challburg** (1.97 ERA), **Claire Woods** (2.10 ERA), **Josie Crossman** (2.58 ERA), and **Kylie Wilkerson** (3.36 ERA) have all recorded wins.

UD went 4-0 last week against Villanova and Middle Tennessee. **Sorella Gallucci** hit .667/.778/.667, including the walk-off hit against MTSU on April 11. **Ellie Mulligan** hit two home runs and scored four runs, while **Bridget Chapman** and **Sydney Shaffer** each went 4-for-10. **Josie Crossman** went 3-0 with a 1.75 ERA with 11 strikeouts in 16 innings and was named NFCA/Wilson DI Top Performance Honorable Mention

Delaware has won 11 of its last 13 games at home, including its CUSA series against FIU, Missouri State, and MTSU. UD has also won 11 of its last 13 games overall to get to a season-best four games over .500 and 11-7 in league play. Delaware currently sits in a three-way tie for fourth place in the CUSA standings with Sam Houston and New Mexico State.

Among CUSA schools, Delaware is fourth in walks (150), fourth in stolen bases (42), and fifth in home runs (38). UD is also second in strikeouts (215) among pitching staffs, trailing only New Mexico State (231), and has allowed the fewest home runs (23).

Individually, **Sydney Shaffer** is first in walks (36), second in OBP (.513), second in OPS (1.288), third in home runs (13), third in SLG (.775), fifth in total bases (86), and seventh in RBIs (36). **Allie Nankivell** is fifth in stolen bases (14) and seventh in average (.398), **Maddie Diamond** is seventh in home runs (10) and ninth in walks (23), and **Sorella Gallucci** is eighth in walks (24).

Delaware is one of four CUSA teams (LA Tech, NM State, WKU) to have two players with at least 10 home runs this season.

Josie Crossman is fourth in wins (11) and strikeouts (92), and **Claire Woods** is seventh in BAA (.235).

A NEW ERA

After a nearly 18-month wait, the new era is finally here and the University of Delaware Fightin' Blue Hens are officially full members of Conference USA as of July 1, 2025. Fourteen of UD's 22 varsity programs will be housed in CUSA, with seven others joining as affiliate members in the Atlantic Sun (women's lacrosse, men's and women's swimming & diving), Atlantic 10 (men's lacrosse), Mid-American Conference (rowing), The Summit League (men's soccer), and Atlantic Hockey America (ice hockey). Field hockey will play an independent schedule this fall as the department continues to work diligently to finalize a new conference for the reigning CAA champions.

An athletic department built on history and tradition, Delaware brings an abundance of success to CUSA having won 10 national championships, 172 team conference titles, 282 individual conference crowns, 342 major conference awards, 2,655 all-league selections, and 543 all-americans.

UD student-athletes complement their athletic success with strong academic performances. During the 2024-25 academic year, the Blue Hens compiled a cumulative 3.41

grade-point average—the highest in department history, excluding academic terms impacted by COVID-19. This marked the 11th-consecutive year and the 23rd-straight semester in which UD student-athletes have posted a 3.00 GPA or better.

The move will push the Delaware brand across the nation, spanning from the northeast down into Florida, and west as far as New Mexico. However, the reach won't stop there. At least five football games will hit the national scene on CBS Sports Network/ESPN family of networks, including a non-conference tilt on FOX against Colorado. Men's and women's basketball will also have the chance to play nationally televised games as part of CUSA's media rights agreement with CBS Sports Network and ESPN.

Speaking of reach, Delaware's initial announcements about joining Conference USA reached over two billion people according to social media analytics. Put that into perspective - just over one million people live in the state of Delaware. That means these announcements reached over 2,000 Delawares.

Conference USA is an NCAA Division I conference championing success in college athletics through dedicated leadership, dynamic partnership, and diverse membership. Founded in 1995 and based in Dallas, CUSA is home to nine schools: FIU, Jacksonville State, Liberty, Louisiana Tech, Middle Tennessee, New Mexico State, Sam Houston, UTEP, and WKU. Kennesaw State joined the league in 2024 and Delaware begins competition in 2025.

“Adding the University of Delaware is a tremendous opportunity for Conference USA as we strategically position ourselves for continued success,” Conference USA Commissioner Judy MacLeod said. “We are excited to add the state's flagship university with its rich history in athletics and academics and look forward to our partnership with President Dennis Assanis, Director of Athletics Chrissi Rawak, and their leadership group.”

GAME NOTES

200 hit club

On April 10 against MTSU, **Katie Scheivert** became the seventh player in program history to reach 200 career hits. She joined **Jessica Grisler** (239), **Mariah Kondravy** (237), **Hanna Garber** (229), **Mandy Welch** (205), **Leanna Gearhart** (205), and **Anna Steinmetz** (201).

200 games, 200 starts

On Saturday, April 18, **Katie Scheivert** will become the ninth player in program history to play 200 games, the sixth player with 200 games started, and the fifth player with 200 consecutive games started.

100 runs scored

On April 8, **Sydney Shaffer** became the ninth player in program history to score 100 career runs after hitting a three-run home run against Villanova, and joined **Katie Scheivert** as active players to reach the century mark. Including Scheivert (125), Shaffer joins **Hanna Garber** (161), **Leanna Gearhart** (157), **Jessica Grisler** (135), **Brittney Mendoza** (126), **Mandy Welch** (119), **Chloe Blantz** (105), and **Katie Lee** (105).

upcoming milestones

Gianna Costaro enters the week at 97 career hits. She would become the 46th UD player to reach 100 career hits.

Katie Scheivert currently sits at 94 career RBIs. She would become the ninth UD player to reach 100 career RBIs.

Sydney Shaffer also has 36 walks on the season. **Tori Conrad** (2013) currently holds the single-season record at 40.

mtsu sweep

Delaware had its second-straight series sweep and 20th under **Jen Steele** when it took all three games against Middle Tennessee. UD has swept UTEP on the road the week prior. Delaware recorded its 50th win via run-rule under Steele on April 10, 9-1. Twenty-three of those wins have come in conference play.

ellie's big day

Ellie Mulligan recorded the first multi-home run game of her career on April 10 against MTSU as part of a 3-for-3, three RBI, three run scored day. It was the fourth multi-home run game by a Delaware player this season, all by different players. **Sydney Shaffer** hit a pair against Stonehill in the season opener on Feb. 6, **Sorella Gallucci** homered twice against Le Moyne on March 1, and **Maddie Diamond** hit two against UTEP on April 3.

clutch weekend

Sorella Gallucci recorded her first career walk-off hit as UD defeated MTSU, 4-3, on April 11. Gallucci also drove in the first run of the game on April 12 in the second inning and then added an insurance run with another hit in the sixth during a 4-2 win.

battle of the blue

Delaware swept the season series over Villanova for the first time since 2017. UD also won all of its games against the Wildcats in a season in 2016, 1998, 1989, 1988, and 1986.

In Delaware's last nine games against Villanova, the pitching staff has held the Wildcats to a 1.56 ERA since 2021. UD has allowed two runs or fewer in six of the nine games in the stretch. UD has outscored the Wildcats 32-22 over the last nine games, going 6-3 in that stretch.

on a heater

Allie Nankivell has the second best batting average by a Conference USA freshman this season at .398, trailing Sophia Lundstrom (.415) of Sam Houston. Nankivell is hitting .463 since UD's game against Virginia on Feb. 21 - 24 games - and .427 in 34 games since Feb. 10. She was elevated to the leadoff spot for the first time during the series against Missouri State and is hitting .413 with a .518 on base percentage in 14 games. Nankivell became the first UD freshman to start in the leadoff spot since **Julz Garber** on May 1, 2021 against Mount St. Mary's.

Nankivell also has a 21-game on-base streak, the longest by a Delaware player this season.

GAME NOTES

power surge

Sydney Shaffer has hit seven home runs over Delaware's last 15 games while driving in 18 runs. Over that span, she has slashed .342/.527/.974.

on base machine

Sydney Shaffer has reached base in all but five games this season. Shaffer has a .563 on base percentage since March 21.

take a walk

Delaware is getting career-high walk rates from **Sydney Shaffer** (22.2 percent), **Sorella Gallucci** (20.2 percent) and **Katie Scheivert** (9.4 percent), while **Maddie Diamond** is walking at a 15.9 percent clip. Shaffer's career rate is 18.3 percent, Gallucci's walk rate last year was 8.6 percent, Scheivert's for her career is 8.5.

Shaffer's and Gallucci's walk rates are third and fourth best among CUSA players and Diamond is best among CUSA freshmen and 10th among all players.

advanced pitching by the #s

Josie Crossman's strikeout percentage is up from 11.9 percent last season to 18.1 percent this season and her WHIP is down from 1.51 to 1.35. She is ranked eighth in strikeout percentage and ninth in FIP (3.44).

Karli Challburg has a strikeout percentage of 19.2 (sixth in CUSA and second best among freshmen) and a 2.91 FIP (second in CUSA and best among freshmen).

youth movement

Delaware had five freshmen in the starting lineup (**Allie Nankivell**, **Maddie Diamond**, **Caylin Blazys**, **Morgan Chambers**, **Karli Challburg**) on April 4 against UTEP. It was the first time Delaware had five freshmen in a starting lineup since May 1, 2019 against La Salle (**Hanna Garber**, **Halle Kisamore**, **Brooke Glanden**, **Brittney Mendoza**, **Katie Stahre**)

utep sweep

UD outscored UTEP 21-10 in its three-game sweep, out-hitting the Miners 25-17. This marked Delaware's first road conference series win since joining CUSA.

multi-home run day

Maddie Diamond hit two home runs against UTEP on April 2. She became the first Delaware freshman to hit two home runs in a game since **Anna Steinmetz** on May 10, 2016 in the CAA Tournament against Elon.

double-digit bombs

Sydney Shaffer and **Maddie Diamond** became the first pair of Delaware teammates to hit at least 10 home runs in the same season.

up the freshmen leaderboard

Maddie Diamond became the third Delaware player to hit at least 10 home runs in a freshman season, joining Mariah Kondravy (15, 2015) and Anna Steinmetz (15, 2016). She also ranks fifth in RBIs by a Delaware player in a freshman season with 31.

big win in lynchburg

Delaware's 12 runs scored in its win against Liberty on March 28 were the most allowed by the Flames in a conference game since March 31, 2015 against Longwood and the most allowed by Liberty in a Conference USA game since joining the league. Delaware became the first team to beat Liberty by at least nine runs in a conference game since Radford on March 25, 2017.

gianna's big day

Gianna Costaro went 3-for-5 with a home run, two doubles, five RBIs, and two runs scored against Liberty on March 28. Costaro's five RBIs were a season high and the second most she'd ever had in a game in her career. It's the most she's had in a game since recording six against North Carolina A&T on March 17, 2024.

top 100 matchups

Delaware has already played 16 games against teams currently in the top 100 in RPI. It played eight such games in all of 2025. UD has won four games against the RPI top-100 this season (FIU twice, Ohio State, and Liberty).

Kristen Luzon hit .400/.400/.640 in March with zero strikeouts and seven RBIs.

Gianna Costaro hit .326/.415/.630 with three home runs, five doubles, and 11 RBIs in March.

Sydney Shaffer hit .302/.508/.651 with 16 walks, four home runs, and 12 RBI in March.

Bridget Chapman hit .282/.378/.513 with two home runs, three doubles, and eight RBIs.

As a team Delaware hit .285/.379/.487 with 20 home runs in 17 March games.

saves in three-straight games

Josie Crossman earned the save in back-to-back games on March 21-22. She became the first Delaware pitcher with a save in two-straight games since **Megan Stauffer** on April 23-24, 2022 against Hofstra.

Karli Challburg then earned the save in Delaware's win over Villanova, giving UD a save in three consecutive games for the first time since March 16-20, 2024. **Emily Winburn** and **Kendall Shank** were credited with saves during that streak.

back-to-back

Bridget Chapman and **Maddie Diamond** hit back-to-back home runs on March 21 to give Delaware a 3-1 lead in the fourth. This was the second time UD hit back-to-back home runs this season. Chapman has been involved in both instances as she followed up Sorella Gallucci's home run on March 1 against Le Moyne.

route 1 winners

Delaware defeated Delaware State, 9-0 on March 18, for its eighth-straight win over the Hornets. **Kylie Wilkerson** allowed just one baserunner in four innings. **Grace Hausmann** had a triple and a career-high three RBIs. UD has pitched four consecutive shutouts against Delaware State dating back to 2024 and has outscored the Hornets 30-0 in the four games.

first home run first grand slam

Marlayna Capaldi hit her first career home run on March 14 against LA Tech, a game-tying grand slam in the fourth inning.

It was Delaware's first grand slam of the season and first since **Mary Beth Cahalan** hit one against Drexel last season on March 9. Cahalan's home run was her first at Delaware after transferring from Dartmouth.

top 40 rpi series win

FIU was ranked 36 after the conclusion of its series against Delaware. It was Delaware's highest series win by RPI since defeating Hofstra in April 2021, who were ranked 49th.

conference openers

Under head coach **Jen Steele**, Delaware improved to 3-3-1 in conference series openers and 5-2 in the first game of conference play after its conference opening series win against FIU. UD swept Drexel in 2025, and won the weekend series against Charleston in 2024.

UD has won the opening conference game in four-straight years.

first cusa honor

Karli Challburg became Delaware's first-ever player to earn a Conference USA weekly award as she was named CUSA Freshman of the Week on March 2 after her performances at the Blue Hen Invitational.

She allowed zero runs in 12.2 innings while earning wins in both pitching decisions. Challburg surrendered eight hits and two walks while striking out 14 batters and held opponents to a .182 BAA.

GAME NOTES

Challburg joined **Josie Crossman** (2025), **Graceyn Frost** (2022), and **Emily Winburn** (2020) as recent Delaware pitchers under **Jen Steele** to earn a conference rookie of the week honor.

successful blue hen invite

UD went 3-1 at the Blue Hen Invitational against Le Moyne and Bryant. Delaware outscored the Bulldogs and Dolphins 27-9 as it hit .333/.403/.553 with six home runs and pitched to a 1.50 ERA with two shutouts.

Katie Scheivert had a big weekend where she hit .571/.625/.929 with a home run and two doubles. **Allie Nankivell** contributed with a .600 average, and **Sorella Gallucci** was 3-for-5 with two home runs, and six RBIs.

Sydney Shaffer (.357/.438/.643), **Gianna Costaro** (.333/.429/.583), and **Bridget Chapman** also homered during the weekend. Chapman's home run was the first of her career.

Karli Challburg and **Josie Crossman** led the pitching as they combined for 26.1 innings pitched, 15 hits, three walks, 25 strikeouts, and three earned runs allowed.

pair of shutouts

Karli Challburg and **Josie Crossman** both pitched shutouts on March 1 against Le Moyne and Bryant. It's the first time UD shut out two different opponents on the same day since March 7, 2020 against UMBC and Norfolk State.

sorella's big day

Sorella Gallucci hit two home runs and had six RBIs on March 1 against Le Moyne, both career highs. The six RBIs are tied for the third most in a single game in program history. It's the 14th game in program history that a Delaware player recorded at least six RBIs, and the first since **Sydney Shaffer** last season against Towson on May 1. Her six RBIs also equal a season-high for a game by a CUSA player this season.

30 syd bombs

Sydney Shaffer hit her 30th career home run on Feb. 28 against Bryant. She became the third player in program history to reach the 30-homer plateau, joining **Anna Steinmetz** (44) and **Mariah Kondravy** (34).

first pitch leadoff home run

Katie Scheivert went deep on the first pitch of the bottom of the first inning against Bryant on March 1 for her first home run of the season. It was the second leadoff home run of her career, also done against Stony Brook on March 14, 2025 which also came on the first pitch.

rare shutout

Josie Crossman pitched a one-hit shutout against Ohio State on Feb. 20. Ohio State had yet to be shutout this season, and only UCLA (Taylor Tinsley) and Tennessee (two pitchers) shut out the Buckeyes in 2025. Tennessee (twice) and Northwestern also recorded shutouts against Ohio State in 2024.

This was also the second time in the last two years a team held Ohio State to one hit or fewer, as UCLA All-America Taylor Tinsley did so on April 5, 2025.

UD became the first non-conference opponent to hold Ohio State to one hit since Arizona State on March 8, 2020, and the first non-conference opponent to do so in a seven-inning game since Florida allowed zero hits on May 20, 2018.

The Buckeyes had entered the weekend eighth in home runs per game (2.22), 33rd in runs scored per game (7.67), 51st in average (.340), 40th in OBP (.433), and sixth in SLG (.711).

Crossman's shutout was also her third of her career, and her eight strikeouts were a career high.

big wins

Delaware defeated Maryland, 5-2, and Ohio State, 2-0, on a historic night for UD on Feb. 20. It was the second time in program history Delaware has won multiple games against a Big Ten opponent in the same season and the third time it has recorded multiple wins over a power conference opponent in one season.

UD defeated Penn State and Purdue, along with N.C. State, in 2022 and Iowa State twice in 2024.

Delaware has defeated a Big Ten opponent in two-straight seasons after winning against No. 20 Michigan in 2025.

comeback hens

UD had two walk-off wins in its first three home games. Delaware rallied from a 7-3 sixth-inning deficit and scored four runs in the bottom of the seventh inning to defeat Georgetown 8-7 on Feb. 14. **Bridget Chapman** had the game-winning hit.

After defeating St. Joe's 11-3 in six innings in game one of a doubleheader on Feb. 15, Delaware again rallied in the seventh and scored three runs to win 4-3 on **Sydney Shaffer's** first career walk-off hit.

historic season opener

In the first game of the year, **Katie Scheivert** became the eighth player in program history to reach 100 career runs scored. Scheivert and **Sydney Shaffer** also both tied a program record for runs scored with four - thus becoming the first pair of teammates in program history to score four runs in the same game. Scheivert also became the second player (**Jessica Grisler**) in program history to have two games with four runs scored in a career.

Scheivert and Shaffer's four runs scored were also the most ever by a Delaware player in season-opening game.

opening day w

UD won its season-opener over Stonehill 11-3. **Katie Scheivert** reached base in all five plate appearances and went 4-for-4 with two doubles, four runs scored, a walk, and two stolen bases. **Sydney Shaffer** went 3-for-4 with two home runs, five RBIs, four runs scored, a walk, and a stolen base.

Karli Challburg became the first Delaware pitcher to appear in a season opener since **Delani Sheehan** in 2021 against UMass and the first to earn the Opening Day Start since **Kat Morris** in 2017, against Michigan.

Delaware's 11 runs scored were its most in a season-opening game since defeating UMass 18-0 in 2021.

two-run debut

Allie Nankivell earned the start in center field in Delaware's first game of the season. She became the first player since 2021 to score at least two runs in her collegiate debut since **Julz Garber, Grace Hrustich, Emily Blum, and Lexi Moore** all did so against UMass.

two-hit debut

Morgan Chambers came off the bench in the opener and became the first Delaware player with two hits in their collegiate debut since **Leanna Gearhart** on Feb. 15, 2015 against Toledo.

pitching u

Delaware is one of two schools in the past two years to be nationally ranked in the top 10 in team ERA in each of the last two seasons (Tennessee). UD ranked ninth in ERA in 2024 at 1.98 and fourth in 2025 at 2.07.

loving palmer park

Delaware competed in the Mizuno Classic, hosted by University of Virginia, for the third-straight season. UD went 2-2 in the four games with wins against Big Ten opponents Maryland and Ohio State. Delaware is 7-6 at the Mizuno Classic over the last three years, including two wins over Iowa State in 2024 - its first two wins ever over the Big 12.

GAME NOTES

In 12 games in her career at Palmer Park, **Gianna Costaro** is hitting .406/.525/.719 with three home runs, 11 RBIs, and six walks. She has earned two conference weekly player of the week awards in her career and both have come after playing in the Mizuno Classic.

Costaro's signature moment her freshman year came in 2024 at the classic against Iowa State, where she helped Delaware complete a five-run, two-out, seventh inning comeback by hitting a game-tying three-run home run on an 0-2 pitch to even the game at six. **Julia Boyet** then immediately followed that up with a walk-off home run.

preseason honors

Sydney Shaffer was selected to the CUSA Preseason All-Conference Team at the designated player/utility position. D1Softball also ranked Shaffer as the 31st best mid-major player in its rankings. She was one of seven CUSA players listed and was the second-highest rated player, joining Emma Elrod (12) of Jacksonville State, Savannah Whatley (38) of Liberty, Allie Floyd (47) of LA Tech, Brynn McManus (59) of Liberty, Reagan Marchant (60) of LA Tech, Kally Meredith (65) of FIU, and Paige Doerr (70) of Liberty.

consistent katie

Katie Scheivert has hit over .300 in all three seasons of her collegiate career, earning CAA All-Rookie honors with a .313 average while playing left field before transitioning back to her natural position at second base ahead of her sophomore year where she hit .305. She had her best offensive season in 2025 as a junior, hitting .333/.396/.467 with three home runs as Delaware's primary leadoff hitter.

Scheivert is looking to become the seventh player in program history to hit at least .300 in all four seasons of her collegiate career, joining **Hanna Garber** (five seasons), **Laura Streets**, **Jessica Grisler**, **Mariah Kondravy**, **Leanna Gearhart**, and **Anna Steinmetz**.

winning trio

The senior trio of **Kristen Luzon**, **Katie Scheivert**, and **Sydney Shaffer** have won 106 games through their first three seasons. They need 35 wins to match **Emily Winburn's** (141, 2020-24) total for most wins accumulated during a career by a player and 29 to tie **Chloe Blantz's** and **Graceyn Frost's** (135, 2022-25) record for most by a class. **sydney's 2025**

Sydney Shaffer put together the greatest offensive season in Delaware history in 2025. She set program records for home runs (19), RBIs (57), total bases (135), extra base hits (33), batting average (.421), on base percentage (.540), slugging percentage (.888), and OPS, (1.428). Her overall OPS and conference-only OPS (1.504) were the best by a CAA player since 2021. In the CAA, she ranked first in home runs, walks, total bases, slugging percentage, OPS, second in RBIs and on base percentage, third in average, runs scored, and doubles, and sixth in hits. She led the CAA in multi-RBI games with 16 and was second with 22 multi-hit games. Nationally, she ranked 16th in slugging percentage, 24th in on base percentage, 32nd in home runs, 36th in total bases, 52nd in batting average, and 62nd in RBIs. In eight games against power conference opponents, Shaffer hit .375/.464/.792 with 10 RBIs and home runs against Florida, Virginia, and Maryland.

Additionally, she was the CAA Player of the Year, First-Team All-CAA selection, NFCA East Region First-Team, All-ECAC Selection, CSC Academic All America First-Team selection - the first in Delaware history, and was ranked No. 51 in D1Softball's Top 100 Mid-Major Player Rankings.

Billie Kerwood pitched the 19th no-hitter in program and set the UD single-season strikeout record with her 188th and Delaware set its program record for consecutive run-rule victories with its fifth in a row.

Sorella Gallucci hit her first career home run.

APRIL 19

Delaware is 8-20 on April 19, but has won three of its last four games. Last season, UD defeated Hampton 13-5 as **Sydney Shaffer** hit her 15th home run of the year to tie the single-season program record

GAME NOTES

no. 1 option

Kristen Luzon has developed into Delaware's go-to option off the bench as the primary pinch hitter. In 2025, she hit .412/.400/.588 as a pinch hitter with 14 hits, one home run, three doubles, and hit .419 with runners on base and .370 with runners in scoring position.

On March 15 against Stony Brook, she hit a go-ahead pinch-hit three-run home run in the fifth inning to lead UD to a win. She also had pinch hits in all three games against Elon on March 28, 29, and 30, recording a game-ending RBI single in game one, a single in the seventh inning of a one-run game in game two, and a single with two runners on in the bottom of the eighth to set up a walk-off win.

In 2024, Luzon hit .500/.556/.792 as a pinch hitter with 12 hits, two home runs and a double and hit .533 with runners in scoring position and .500 with runners on base.

versatile sorella

In her first season, **Sorella Gallucci** was an all-conference and all-rookie selection while seeing action at third base (26 games), first base (15 games), left field (one game), and right field (one game). She also earned starts in the lineup hitting second (six games), third (one game), fourth (three games), sixth (eight games), seventh (13 games), eighth (four games), and ninth (one game). This fall, she has gotten reps in practice at shortstop as well. In 2025, Gallucci struck out just three times, including zero against CAA teams.

Gallucci's breakout game came on March 9 against Drexel, where she went 3-for-3 with a program-record tying-three doubles and two RBIs in a 17-3 win. She became the first Delaware freshman to make an all-conference team since **Graceyn Frost** in 2022, and first position player since **Hanna Garber** in 2019.

returners

Delaware is returning 16 players from the 2025 roster - **Marlayna Capaldi, Jamie Chandler, Bridget Chapman, Gianna Costaro, Josie Crossman, Emma Denison, Sorella Gallucci, Grace Hausamann, Gracie Jacobs, Kristen Luzon, Ellie Mulligan, Katie Scheivert, Sydney Shaffer, Ellie Talley, Ryleigh Thomas, and Claire Woods.**

newcomers

UD added eight players to the 2026 roster - freshmen **Caylin Blazys, Karli Challburg, Morgan Chambers, Maddie Diamond, Allie Nankivell, and Gabriella Pudimott**, and transfers **Kylie Wilkerson** from George Mason and **Gianna Poletti** from Penn State.

production to replace

UD will need to replace significant production from the 2025 team after multiple players graduated. **Billie Kerwood** was the CAA and ECAC Pitcher of the Year and was a First Team All-Region selection after setting UD's single-season strikeout (250) and wins (23) records and pitching to a 1.59 ERA in her lone season with UD. Also in her only season with Delaware, **Mary Beth Cahalan** was the CAA Defensive Player of the Year at catcher and a First Team All-CAA selection and Third Team All-Region pick. Two-way player **Morgan Hess** was a two-time First Team All-Region pick in two seasons at UD and ranked in the top 10 in program history in BAA, slugging percentage, OPS, home runs, and WHIP. **Chloe Blantz** started at shortstop all four years of her career and played in 189 games with 144 hits.

mid-year additions

Delaware has added a mid-season transfer in three-consecutive years; **Julia Boyet** from Duke in 2024, **Claire Woods** from Middle Tennessee in 2025, and **Gianna Poletti** from Penn State in 2026. Boyet was Delaware's starting third baseman in 2024 on her way to a Third Team All-Region selection, while Woods sat out for the 2025 season, and Poletti will sit for the 2026 season.

anticipated debuts

In addition to the debuts of the six freshmen and pitcher **Kylie Wilkerson**, outfielder **Gracie Jacobs** and pitcher **Claire Woods** are expected to make their debuts for the 2026 season. After playing two seasons at DePaul, Jacobs transferred to Delaware ahead of the 2025 season and was expected to compete for a starting outfield job before missing the year due to injury. Woods arrived to Delaware as a mid-year addition from Middle Tennessee before the 2025 season and sat out for the year.

hot finish

Outfielder **Ryleigh Thomas** ended the year driving in 11 runs with four home runs, seven extra-base hits, and a .650 slugging percentage in her final 15 games of the season. She had some of the biggest hits of Delaware's season down the stretch, including the Blue Hens' 40th home run of the year to set its single-season record, a three-run home run on May 1 to cap off a five-run first inning against Towson in a 19-0 win, and a home run during the CAA Tournament against First Team All-Conference selection Megan Gregory of Campbell to tie the game in the fourth inning.

long time coming

After missing her freshman year due to injury, **Jamie Chandler** made her collegiate debut as a sophomore in 2025 as a pinch hitter against Delaware State on April 9. She hit an RBI single in her first career at bat in the 11-0 win. In total, she missed 88 games while battling back from injury.

solid debut season

In 2025, **Josie Crossman** became the first Delaware freshman to throw two shutouts in the same season since **Delani Sheehan** in 2021 and was the first Delaware pitcher since 2022 to earn a rookie of the week honor since **Graceyn Frost** on April 11, 2022.

consecutive games with a run

Delaware scored a run in a program record 56-consecutive games from May 10, 2024 until Feb. 6, 2026 before being shutout by Army the next day. The previous program long was in 38-straight games in 2015.

homegrown

Wilmington, Delaware native **Marlayna Capaldi's** sister, cousin, aunt, and uncle all graduated from the University of Delaware.

track star

Freshman **Allie Nankivell** also competed in track & field in high school, and was first team all county in the 55m hurdles, was a member of the 2024 Essex County Relay Champions, and finished 14th at New Balance Nationals in shuttle hurdles.

captains

Seniors **Marlayna Capaldi, Katie Scheivert, Sydney Shaffer,** and sophomore **Bridget Chapman** will serve as captains for the Blue Hens in 2026.

elite athlete

In high school, **Josie Crossman** became the first South Forsyth High School student to compete in four sports in a single year (softball, track & field, basketball, and flag football).

historical win

On Feb. 7, 2025 UD defeated nationally-ranked Michigan, 8-2, for its first nationally-ranked win in program history. **Billie Kerwood** was the winning pitcher, with 4.2 IP and zero earned runs allowed. **Sydney Shaffer** went 3-for-4 with three RBIs and **Katie Scheivert** went 2-for-4 with three runs scored. Michigan was ranked No. 22 by USA Softball, No. 20 by D1Softball, and No. 23 by Softball America at the time.

walk-off winners

UD had three walk-off victories in 2025 - March 18 against Rider on a ninth-inning home run from **Ellie Talley**, March 30 against Elon on an eighth-inning sacrifice fly by **Morgan Hess**, and May 2 against Towson on a double by Talley.

Delaware has hit a walk-off home run in two-straight seasons, as **Julia Boyet** hit one against Iowa State on Feb. 24 at Palmer Park during the Mizuno Classic. Talley's was the first at Delaware Softball Diamond since April 10, 2022, when **Hanna Garber** hit a walk-off home run against Drexel in the 14th inning.

no no's

Delaware has thrown a no-hitter in three-consecutive seasons, including two last year - the first time since 2000 UD threw multiple no-hitters in a season. **Morgan Hess** no-hit Monmouth on April 26 and **Billie Kerwood** no-hit Hampton on April 18, with the only baserunner reaching on a dropped third strike. In 2024, Hess also no-hit Hofstra on April 20. **Emily Winburn** threw a no-hitter against Hampton, on May 5, 2023.

Hess is the third player in program history to throw multiple no-hitters, joining **Kristi O'Connell** (six) and **Patty Freeman** (three).

defense defense defense

The Blue Hens have won four-consecutive conference defensive player of the year awards at four different positions - **Hanna Garber** at third base in 2022, **Kiara Mills** at first base in 2023, **Julz Garber** in center field in 2024, and **Mary Beth Cahalan** at catcher in 2025. **Hanna Garber** was playing third base for the first time in her career, while Mills and Cahalan were in their first and only seasons with the Blue Hens. **Julz Garber** became the first outfielder in CAA history to win the award.

awards on awards

The Blue Hens have earned multiple all-conference pitcher selections in four-consecutive seasons (2022 - **Emily Winburn** and **Graceyn Frost**, 2023 - Winburn and **Taylor Wroten**, 2024 - Winburn and **Morgan Hess**, 2025 - **Billie Kerwood** and Hess). UD also became the first school in CAA history to earn a defensive player of the year in four-straight seasons, doing so at four different positions (**Hannah Garber** - 2022 at third base, **Kiara Mills** - 2023 at first base, **Julz Garber** - 2024 in center field, **Mary Beth Cahalan** - 2025, catcher). Delaware has had four all-region selections in four-consecutive seasons.

Also in 2025, UD earned a CAA weekly honor in all but one week it had played in.

cusa hosts

Delaware will host the CUSA Tournament from May 6-9 at the newly renovated Delaware Softball Diamond. The title game will be broadcast on CBS Sports Network. This will be the first time the Blue Hens have hosted a conference tournament for softball since the 2001 America East Championship.

from player to coach

Upon graduating, **Billie Kerwood** joined the coaching staff as Director of Player Development, Data & Analytics. For her career, she pitched in 135 games and 673.1 innings with a 2.80 ERA, 709 strikeouts, and 51 complete games. She finished her career as one of five active pitchers with at least 700 strikeouts. Her 574 strikeouts while a member of the CAA are the ninth most in the conference's history. She was the CAA and ECAC Pitcher of the Year and an NFCA East Region First Team selection in her only season at Delaware.

pro players

Following the conclusion of their college careers, **Billie Kerwood** signed to play with the Atlanta Smoke of Women's Professional Fastpitch and **Morgan Hess** signed with the Beveren Lions in Belgium. Kerwood helped the Smoke win the league championship.

GAME NOTES

new conference, new opponents

UD will play Missouri State, UTEP, Kennesaw State, and New Mexico State for the first time in program history. Delaware has also only played FIU five times (last in 2016), LA Tech once (last in 2013), Liberty five times (last in 2018), Middle Tennessee twice (last in 2024), and Western Kentucky once (last in 2023).

expanded recruiting

Jordyn Henderson, a member of Delaware's class of 2030, will be Delaware Softball's first-ever player who hails from the state of Oregon when she suits up for the Blue Hens beginning in 2027.

Joining her in next year's class is **Bayli Glanden** from Harrington Del., whose sister Brooke played for Delaware from 2019-2022 and ranks top-five in program history in career home runs, RBIs, slugging percentage, OPS, and extra-base hits, and **Grace Ely** from Masuk, Conn.

transfer u

Delaware has been highly successful in the transfer portal under head coach **Jen Steele**. For the 2025 season, UD nabbed **Billie Kerwood** from Monmouth and **Mary Beth Cahalan** from Dartmouth, who went on to win major CAA awards and were all-region selections.

Prior to 2024, UD added **Morgan Hess** from Presbyterian and **Julia Boyet** from Duke, who also went on to be all-region picks. In 2023, **Kiara Mills** came over from Creighton and **Taylor Wroten** was picked up from Indian River State College. Mills was the CAA Defensive Player of the Year and both were second Team all-region selections. **Megan Stauffer** transferred from Marshall in 2022 and set the Delaware single-season saves record with five. **Karolina Flores** transferred from Division II Lynn and ranks in the top-five in program history in batting average, on-base percentage, and slugging percentage.

Delaware has seven transfers on the roster this season - **Marlayna Capaldi** (South Alabama), **Emma Denison** (Bowling Green), **Grace Hausamann** (Lafayette), **Gracie Jacobs** (DePaul), **Gianna Poletti** (Penn State), **Kylie Wilkerson** (George Mason), and **Claire Woods** (Middle Tennessee).

spring fever

UD has combined to go 59-10 in the months of March and April during the 2024 and 2025 season. This includes 16-2 in March 2024, 14-2 in April 2024, 15-4 in March 2025, and 14-2 in April 2025.

Delaware ripped off a 27-2 stretch from March 9-April 28, 2024 that featured a 12-game win streak. UD also had a 12-game win streak in March 2025 and a 10-game win streak in April 2025. It was the first time in program history Delaware had two win streaks of 10 or more in a single season.

new coach on staff

Jill Moore was announced to Delaware's coaching staff on July 24, 2025. Moore comes to Newark after spending three historic seasons as the head coach at Division III Maryville College, where she went 85-48 and 34-14 in CCS play, leading the program to an at-large NCAA Tournament appearance in 2024. In 2024, Maryville set a program record for wins with 35, won the CCS Tournament, and was ranked No. 21 nationally by the NFCA.

Before Maryville, Moore was a coach at Lynn University from 2012-2021, where she was on staff with current associate head coach **Amy Bellisari**. She served as head coach for her final three years with the program after having been an assistant.

saac reps

Claire Woods was selected chair for Conference USA Student-Athlete Advisory Committee, while McKenzie Didio of women's lacrosse was named vice chair. Woods and Didio were selected as chair and vice chair based on voting by the executive board for the 2025-26 academic year.

Additionally, **Katie Scheivert** is vice president of Delaware's SAAC. During Fall 2025, Scheivert helped organize Trick or Treat So Others Can Eat, which collected 1,016 pounds of food to donate to the Food Bank of Delaware.

Also through SAAC, Scheivert helped organize a Teddy Bear Toss at Delaware men's and women's basketball game to donate to Kind To Kids. In conjunction with the softball program, the team held a home run derby to help raise money for UDance - Delaware's student-run philanthropic organization dedicated to fighting childhood cancer.

head hen

Jordan Skolnick was named the University of Delaware's Director of Athletics & Campus Recreation. Skolnick joined UD Athletics in 2016 and served as interim director of athletics & campus recreation since March 2025. He is the eighth person in the department's history to hold the permanent role. Skolnick will be responsible for leading the Fightin' Blue Hens' 22 varsity teams, spirit program, and robust campus recreation unit. A native of Storrs, Conn., Skolnick successfully guided the department through its transitions to Conference USA and the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS), while prioritizing a renewed focus on campus collaboration to increase partnerships and ensure the University's ability to capitalize on increased national exposure.

HEAD COACH JEN STEELE

Jen Steele is in her eighth season as the University of Delaware softball head coach during the 2026 season, and has engineered an impressive turnaround of the Blue Hens' program.

Delaware orchestrated a historic 2025 season, the 50th season in program history. UD went 38-16 and 23-4 in the CAA to win the regular season title. Along the way, UD set over 40 program records, including conference wins (23), most wins in CAA history (23), hits (461), doubles (96), home runs (57), RBIs (304), runs scored (336), total bases (748), on base percentage (.390), slugging percentage (.519), extra base hits (163), run-rule victories (17), strikeouts (347), and consecutive conference wins (13).

Sydney Shaffer was named CAA Player of the Year, Billie Kerwood was named CAA and ECAC Pitcher of the Year, and Mary Beth Cahalan was named CAA Defensive Player of the Year as Delaware had eight conference postseason honors between First, Second, and All-Rookie selections. The eight postseason honors and six players selected on first and second-team were program records. Shaffer, Kerwood, and Morgan Hess were First-Team All-Region selections, the most First-Team All-Region selections in program history and Cahalan was a Third-Team selection. The four All-Region honors tied a program record. Delaware also had a program record 13 conference weekly honors. Shaffer and Hess became the second and third Academic All-Americans in program history and first since 1998, while Shaffer was the program's first First-Team selection. On Feb. 7, UD defeated Michigan 8-2 - Delaware's first ever win against a ranked opponent.

In 2024, Delaware set program records for wins in a season (39) and conference wins in a season (21) while tying their program record for longest win streak (13) and longest conference win streak (10). The Blue Hens also had seven players earn All-Conference honors, with three players named to First-Team All-CAA, two named to the Second-Team, and two All-Rookie selections. The five players named to All-Conference teams tied a program record, also done on in 1984, 2004, 2022, and 2023. Delaware also tied a program record for All-Region selections with four, also done in 2022 and 2023. The team also set program records in doubles (84), double plays turned (24), and scored its second most runs (259) and had its second most shutouts (13). Delaware also led the CAA in in average (.297), on base percentage (.374), slugging percentage (.446), runs scored, doubles, total bases (622), ERA (1.98), runs allowed (144), home runs allowed (11), and were in the top three in hits (410), triples (16), home runs (31), walks (162), shutouts, batting average against (.225), hits allowed (302), and walks allowed (114). Julz Garber also became the first outfielder in conference history to be named CAA Defensive Player of the Year, Delaware's third-straight conference Defensive Player of the Year award.

In 2023 UD won its second-straight CAA Regular Season title and Steele brought home her second-straight CAA Coach of the Year. UD finished with a 29-20 record and an 18-5 conference mark. Emily Winburn became Delaware's first-ever CAA Pitcher of the Year while Kiara Mills became the second Blue Hen in as many years to take home CAA Defensive Player of the Year honors. Six Blue Hens garnered All-CAA honors while four were recognized on NFCA All-Region teams.

Delaware won its first-ever CAA Regular Season Championship in 2022, putting together an overall record of 29-16 and 11-4 in conference play. Steele was named the CAA Coach of the Year while Hanna Garber became the program's first CAA Defensive Player of the Year in her first year at third base. Garber, Brittney Mendoza and Emily Winburn all earned All-CAA First Team honors, while Julz Garber and Graceyn Frost were both named to the second team. A program-record four Blue Hens were selected to all-region teams.

The Blue Hens went 25-9 in 2021 and advanced to the CAA Tournament finals for the first time since 2004. Delaware finished with an RPI of 23, while its three all-region selections were a program record at the time. UD's six All-CAA honorees were the most since UD joined the league.

Delaware went 19-4 during the shortened 2020 season, tied for the best start in program history, while the Blue Hens' improvement of 98 spots in the RPI was the 13th highest in Division I.

Delaware posted a 10-game winning streak, the third longest in school history, and ended the year by winning seven games in a row. The Blue Hens led the CAA in multiple statistical categories including winning percentage, hits, doubles, triples, stolen bases, saves, wins, ERA, strikeout to walk ratio, caught stealing and runners picked off. Additionally, Delaware ranked 10th in the nation in doubles and steals per game.

During Steele's first season the Blue Hens stole 91 bases, the second most in a UD single season. They ranked 23rd in the country in steals and 29th in triples, leading the CAA in both categories.

Prior to arriving in Newark, Steele spent the 2018 season as the head coach at Marshall, where she led the Thundering Herd to a third place finish in the east division of Conference USA. Marshall featured two All-Region selections and the league's Freshman of the Year during Steele's season in Huntington.

Steele served as Jacksonville head coach from 2015 through 2017, making an eight-win improvement while leading the Dolphins to an appearance in the Atlantic Sun Tournament during her first season. During her final year the Dolphins won 30 games and finished ninth in the country with 113 stolen bases. During her Jacksonville tenure, 10 players were named All-Conference and five received ASUN All-Academic honors.

Steele has also served as assistant coach at George Mason and Longwood during her coaching career.

Steele was a four-year member of the Longwood softball team from 2002-05, helping lead the squad to a 143-53 record. She was named the 2002 Carolinas-Virginia Conference Freshman of the Year and the 2005 Division I All-Independent Pitcher of the Year. A two-time All-CVAC selection, she finished with 73 wins, 652.2 innings pitched, 409 strikeouts and a 1.75 ERA in the circle while batting .324 at the plate with 129 RBI and 112 runs scored.

A native of Manassas Park, Va., Steele earned her Bachelor of Arts in communication studies from Longwood in 2005 and went on to earn a Master's of Science in exercise and sport studies from Smith College in 2007.

ASSISTANT COACHES

AMY BELLISARI



Amy Bellisari joined the University of Delaware softball coaching staff prior to the 2019 season. She was promoted to associate head coach in June 2021 and works primarily with Delaware's defense.

In 2025, Delaware won its third CAA Regular season title in four seasons and Mary

Beth Cahalan became Delaware's fourth consecutive CAA Defensive Player of the Year winner - the first catcher since 2016.

During the 2024 season, UD set a program record for double plays turned with 24 while Julz Garber also became the first-ever outfielder to earn CAA Defensive Player of the Year, and Delaware's third-straight winner.

In 2023, the Blue Hens won its second-straight CAA Regular Season Championship. Bellisari helped lead the Blue Hens to the best fielding percentage in the CAA with a .973. Kiara Mills earned Delaware's second-consecutive CAA Defensive Player of the Year in her only year in the Blue & Gold, posting a .995 fielding percentage in 435 chances at first base.

Delaware won its first CAA Regular Season Championship in 2022 with an overall record of 29-16 and 11-4 in conference play. As UD's primary fielding coach, Bellisari helped Delaware rank second in the CAA with a .970 fielding percentage and Hanna Garber brought home the program's first-ever CAA Defensive Player of the Year in her first season at third base.

Prior to arriving in Newark, Bellisari spent the previous seven years as the head coach at Division II Lynn University in Boca Raton, Fla. She led the squad to 26 victories in 2017, the program's most since 2004. In 2018, Lynn had 13 conference wins - its most since 2003. The Fighting Knights finished .500 or better in consecutive seasons for the first time since 2003-04.

Prior to arriving at Lynn, Bellisari served as an assistant coach at Bethune-Cookman for four years and helped the program to two conference titles. Bellisari began her coaching career as a graduate assistant at Ohio University in 2005-06.

Bellisari played at Florida Atlantic from 2001-04, leading her squads to a 208-80 record with four league titles and four NCAA Tournament appearances. The 2002 team set a school record and led the nation with 62 victories while earning a No. 1 seed in the NCAA Regionals. She graduated from FAU in 2004 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in social sciences.

NIKKI ANDRADE



Nikki Andrade joined the University of Delaware softball coaching staff prior to the 2019 season and works with the offense and as the recruiting coordinator.

In 2025, Delaware won its third CAA Regular season title in four seasons. UD set program records in hits (461), doubles (96), home runs (57), RBIs (304), runs scored (336), total bases (748), on base percentage (.390), slugging percentage (.519), extra base hits (163),

During the 2024 season, Andrade helped coach the team to a program record 84 doubles and UD scored its second most runs (259) in a season. Delaware also led the CAA in in average (.297), on base percentage (.374), slugging percentage (.446), runs scored, doubles, and total bases (622).

In 2023, Delaware won its second-straight CAA Regular Season Championship and Andrade helped lead Delaware to a .280 team batting average - third in the CAA. Six players were named All-CAA and four earned NFCA All-Region honors.

Delaware won its first CAA Regular Season Championship in 2022 with an overall record of 29-16 and 11-4 in conference play Under Andrade's tutelage, Delaware ranked third in the CAA with a .275 batting average and second with a .438 slugging percentage. Hanna Garber was top five in the conference multiple categories, including slugging percentage, on-base percentage, OPS, hits, triples, and first in runs scored.

Prior to arriving in Newark, Andrade spent the previous year with head coach Jen Steele on the Marshall coaching staff. Prior to her stint in Huntington, Andrade spent six seasons as the head coach of the Vienna Stars travel team and three years as an assistant coach at James Madison High School in Vienna, Va.

Andrade was a three-time All-Pac 10 performer, two-time All-Pacific Region honoree, two-time scholar athlete and 2002 NFCA All-American during her stellar career at Arizona State from 1999-2002. She led the Sun Devils to 40 wins three times, including Women's College World Series appearances in 1999 and 2002. She finished with 253 career hits and a .333 batting average.

Andrade played for the USA Blue Team in 2001 and USA Elite in 2003, and played five years in the National Pro Fastpitch League. She was an All-NPF performer in 2007 when she led the Washington Glory to the championship. She also had successful coaching stints at Corona Del Mar and Mission Viejo High Schools in California.

JILL MOORE



Jill Moore joined the Delaware coaching staff on August 1, 2025.

Moore comes to Newark after spending three historic seasons as the head coach at Division III Maryville College, where she went 85-48 and 34-14 in CCS play and led the program to an at-large NCAA Tournament appearance in 2024.

Under Moore's guidance, Maryville had 10 All-Conference honorees and six All-Region selections. In 2024, Maryville set a program record for wins with 35, won the CCS Tournament, and were ranked 21st nationally by the NFCA. Maryville had also reached the conference championship game in 2023, Moore's first season.

In 2025, Maryville finished third in the conference, but rallied to win 13 of its last 16 regular season games and went 3-2 in the conference tournament before falling in the semifinals. Moore also managed academic programs, recruiting, budgeting, scheduling, and travel - including managing the construction of a \$100,000 facility project to enhance the program's batting cages.

Before Maryville, Moore was a coach at Lynn University from 2012-2021. She served as head coach for her final three years with the program after having been an assistant. Four athletes earned All-Conference honors during her tenure as head coach. She also has made stops at UMBC and Saint Francis to begin her coaching career.

As a player, Moore was a two-time All-Northeast Conference catcher at Robert Morris and hit .345 in her four-year career. She helped the Colonials to their first-ever NCAA Regional Appearance in 2005 while also claiming the NEC Regular Season and Tournament titles. She graduated from Robert Morris with a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration and then earned her master's in Education from St. Francis.

DELAWARE SOFTBALL DIAMOND

The Blue Hens play their home games at the Delaware Softball Diamond. In conjunction with the State of Delaware, the stadium underwent major renovations prior to the 2025 season, with phase two being completed in time for the 2026 season.

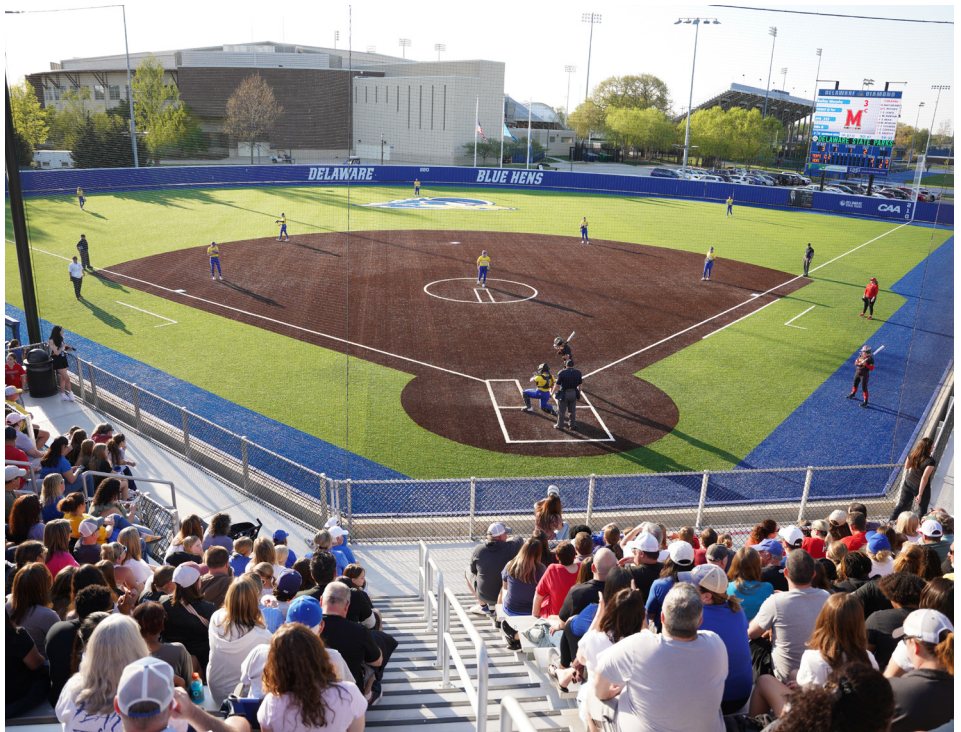
The project significantly enhanced the experience for student-athletes, coaches, staff, fans, and the community. Phase one of the project included the installation of AstroTurf Diamond Series that allows for more durability and ability to play in poor weather conditions, larger, heated dugouts with bathrooms, expanded grandstands for increased fan capacity, a new video board, padded outfield walls, and stadium lights for the capability of playing night games.

Phase two featured an expanded press box with the installation of an HVAC system, a concession and restroom building located between the softball field and Fred Rullo Stadium, new batting cages with a roof structure, and a roof structure for the home bullpen.

The stadium's capacity is roughly 750 people, and is used as a host site for numerous softball events including the DIAA state playoffs. In its game against Maryland on April 23, 2025, Delaware drew a crowd of 703 people on a Wednesday night.

With the new renovations and addition of concessions and restrooms, the UD will be able to support more external events, bringing an increased revenue and tourism impact to the state. Currently, DACCR drives a \$33M economic impact in the state annually from athletics hosted events. That impact is expected to increase now that renovations are complete with events and other youth tournaments taking place in Newark.

Delaware will host the Conference USA Softball Tournament in its first season in the new conference, beginning on May 6.



It marks the first time the Blue Hens will host a conference tournament since the 2001 America East Championship.

The Blue Hens have gone 85-29 (.746) at home under head coach Jen Steele entering the 2026 season, including 76-20 (.791) since 2021.

Delaware has dropped just one conference series at home since 2020. During the 2025 season, the Blue Hens had three walk-off victories - March 18 against Rider, March 30 against Elon, and May 2 against Towson.

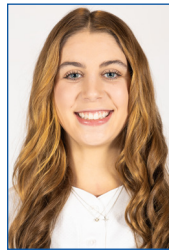

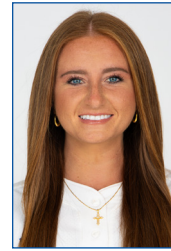

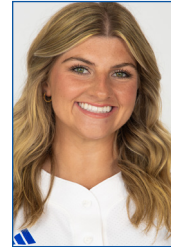
