Got Your Six

- Despite being separated by just 81 miles, Wednesday will be the first time Navy and Delaware will face one another in women's lacrosse. The Blue Hens are currently a member of the Atlantic Sun. The Midshipmen are 8-1 (.889) all-time against members of the ASun, posting a 5-0 (1.000) against Liberty and a 3-1 (.750) mark against Jacksonville.
- Head Coach **Cindy Timchal**, who is the winningest coach in Division I women's lacrosse history, is approaching another milestone. The Hall of Fame coach is **FIVE (5) victories shy of 600 career wins**. Timchal would become the first Division I women's lacrosse coach to reach 600 wins and the second women's lacrosse coach ever to hit the mark, joining The College of New Jersey (DIII) head coach **Sharon Pfuger**, who enters the 2026 season with 603 career wins.
- With her first save of the game against Villanova, starting goalie **Felicia Giglio** registered her 250th career save, becoming the fourth player in program history with 250 or more saves, joining **Ingrid Boyum** (2015-18) – 428 saves, **Elaina Ponchione** (2009-12) – 375 saves, and **Annie Foky** (2012-15) – 257 saves.
- The Tewaaraton Award announced its initial watch list and Navy's **Alyssa Chung** and **Mikayla Williams** were named to the list. Chung and Williams become the ninth and 10th Midshipmen, respectively, to be named to the Tewaaraton Watch List. Navy's **AJ Marsh** was selected to the list on the men's lacrosse side.
- Sophomores **Alyssa Chung** and **Taylor Miles** shined for the Midshipmen against Villanova, combining for 16 points on 10 goals and six assists. Chung finished with seven goals, which was the second-most in a Navy game in program history, while Miles concluded the game with nine points on three goals and six assists to finish with the fourth-most points and fifth-most assists in a game by a Midshipmen.
- The Navy women's lacrosse team added nine (9) members to its 2026 roster with the addition of the Class of 2029. Three of those freshmen – **Julia Frosch**, **Angelina Price**, and **Zoe Ryan** – saw their first collegiate action in the Midshipmen's home opener against Villanova on Saturday. Price recorded her first collegiate save during the contest.

ALL-TIME SERIES...

- Despite being separated by just 81 miles, Wednesday will be the first time Navy and Delaware will face one another in women's lacrosse.
- The Blue Hens are currently a member of the Atlantic Sun. The Midshipmen are 8-1 (.889) all-time against members of the ASun, posting a 5-0 (1.000) against Liberty and a 3-1 (.750) mark against Jacksonville.
- The Mids have no players from the state of Delaware, while 12 student-athletes for the Blue Hens – **Julia Ciuffo** (Reisterstown), **Ellie Dassoulas** (Towson), **Nichelle Desbordes** (Ellicott City), **Amanda Gazelle** (Odenton), **Maddie George** (Centreville), **Morgan Gore** (Crofton), **Lara Hoeflich** (Glenelg), **Erin Hussey** (Severna Park), **Jaclyn Marszal** (Catonville), **Steph Marszal** (Catonville), **Sam Paradise** (Perry Hall), and **Maggie Porter** (Stevenson) – call Maryland home.

SCOUTING THE MIDSHIPMEN...

- The Navy women's lacrosse team enters the week 2-0 on the young season, defeating #10 Virginia (W, 12-10) and routing Villanova (W, 18-5).
- As a team, the Midshipmen have tallied 30 goals with 19 assists, while picking up 35 ground balls, winning 26 draw controls, and causing 16 turnovers.
- Entering the week, **Taylor Miles**, **Alyssa Chung**, and **Ava Yovino** lead the team. Miles paces the team with 10 points on four goals and six assists, while Chung and Yovino are one point back with nine. Chung boasts a team-best eight goals with an assist, while Yovino has three scores and six helpers.
- **Chloe Brown**, **Maggie DeFabio**, and **Emma Kennedy** follow with four points apiece. Brown and DeFabio match one another with three goals and an assist, while Kennedy has four goals for her four points. One point back are **Anna Gotterup** and **Mikayla Williams**. Gotterup has three points on a goal and two assists, while Williams has two goals and one assist. **Caroline Gage** and **Grace Mitchell** have one goal apiece for one point each, while **Rowan Kimmel** has a point on an assist.
- Defensively, the Midshipmen have caused 16 of their opponents' 27 turnovers. Kennedy, Yovino, **Felicia Giglio**, and **Lily Schmalz** lead the charge with two takeaways apiece, while eight other Mids have been credited with caused turnovers. Schmalz and Yovino lead the team with five ground balls apiece, while Chung, DeFabio, Gage, Giglio, **Landen Cain**, and **Jalin Jenkins** follow with three each. Kennedy, Miles, and **Jaclyn Johns** also have multiple ground ball pickups.
- Giglio has played and started each game for Navy in the cage, working 115:36 minutes of action between the posts. The junior goalie has 14 of the Mids' 15 saves on the year with a 7.79 goals against average. Freshman goalkeeper **Angelina Price** saw her first collegiate action against Villanova. The rookie posted a clean sheet with a save in just under four and a half minutes of action.
- The Mids have a 26-21 advantage in draw controls on the young season. **Maura Murphy** boasts a team-high 10 draw wins with Yovino two back with eight. Kennedy adds four draw wins with four others chipping in one apiece.

SCOUTING THE OPPONENT...

- Delaware enters the game 0-2 on the season. The Blue Hens are in search of their first win of 2026 and looking to avoid their first 0-3 start since 2020.
- In Delaware's home-opening setback to Rutgers, junior **Kat Baseggio** finished with four caused turnovers and five ground balls. She set a new career high for ground balls, while tying her career high for caused turnovers. The junior reached the 50-career ground ball milestone in her 34th-career game. The five ground balls are the most in a game by a Delaware player since March 6, 2024.
- Against Rutgers, senior **Maggie Farragher** recorded a career-high four caused turnovers and sophomore **Sydney O'Donnell** had a personal-best three caused turnovers. Senior **McKenzie Didio** scored her 16th-career goal, and first since April 12, 2024.

TAWAARATON WATCH LIST...

- The Tawaaraton Award announced its initial watch list on Tuesday afternoon and Navy women's lacrosse players **Alyssa Chung** and **Mikayla Williams** were named to the list. The lists include the top players across all three divisions of NCAA lacrosse.
- Chung and Williams become the ninth and 10th Midshipmen, respectively, to be named to the Tawaaraton Watch List – **Erin Rawlick** (2010), **Jasmine DePompeo** (2012, '13), **Jenna Collins** (2018), **Kelly Larkin** (2018, '19, '20), **Nicole Victory** (2021), **Ava Yovino** (2023, '24), **Alyssa Daley** (2025), and **Emily Messinese** (2025).

ATHLETES OF THE WEEK...

- The Patriot League announced its weekly women's lacrosse award winners and Navy's **Taylor Miles** and **Felicia Giglio** were among the student-athletes recognized. Miles was named Attacker of the Week, while Giglio was selected as Goalkeeper of the Week. The duo helped lead Navy to home-opening win over Villanova, 18-5, on Saturday morning at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium.
- Miles recorded a career-high nine points on a season-high three goals and a career-best six assists with two ground balls and a caused turnover. Her nine points are the fourth-most in a game in program history, while her six assists are the fifth-most in school history in a single game. She is the first Navy player to record nine or more points in a game since senior **Ava Yovino** had 10 points as a freshman in 2023. Additionally, Miles is the first Midshipmen to have six or more assists since Yovino had six helpers as a freshman in 2023. The hat trick was Miles' first of the season and the second of her career. Navy used an 11-0 run to break the game open and Miles had a goal and four assists for the Mids during the run.
- Giglio earned her second win of the season, working 55:36 in the cage. She allowed just five goals, while registering eight saves. The junior helped Navy hold the prolific Villanova offense to just five goals, keeping the Wildcats out of the net in the entire second quarter. With her first save of the game, Giglio registered her 250th career save, becoming the fourth player in program history with 250 or more saves, joining **Ingrid Boyum** (2015-18) – 428 saves, **Elaina Ponchione** (2009-12) – 375 saves, and **Annie Foky** (2012-15) – 257 saves.

Opening Draw

NATIONAL RANKINGS...

- The Navy women's lacrosse team remained ranked in all three national polls, following an 18-5 victory over Villanova in the home opener over the weekend. The Midshipmen are 11th according to the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association (IWLCA) and the Inside Lacrosse KANE Women's Division I Media Polls, while coming in at #12 in the USA Lacrosse poll.
- The Midshipmen began the season 16th in the preseason polls according to the IWLCA and the Inside Lacrosse, while opening the year at #14 in the USA Lacrosse preseason poll.
- In its history, Navy has been ranked 110 total weeks, including a stretch of 46 weeks from the final poll of 2017 (May 30) to April 5, 2021. The Mids' first appearance in the national rankings came on March 11, 2013, coming in at #20. The Midshipmen's highest ranking – sixth – came in the final polls of the 2017 and 2018 seasons.
- Last season, the Midshipmen were in the top 25 poll for 14 weeks, rising as high as #16 and finishing the year 18th.

LAST TIME THEY MET (Feb. 18, 2026: First Meeting)...

- The game between Navy and Delaware will mark the first meeting between the two teams in women's lacrosse.

LAST TIME OUT (Feb. 14, 2026: Annapolis, Md. – #10 Navy 18, Villanova 5)...

- Leading by one towards the end of the first quarter, 4-3, the #10 Navy women's lacrosse team erupted for 11 straight goals to take control of the game en route to an 18-5 victory in the home opener against Villanova at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium.
- Sophomores **Alyssa Chung** and **Taylor Miles** shined for the Midshipmen, combining for 16 points on 10 goals and six assists. Chung finished with seven goals, which was the second-most in a Navy game in program history, while Miles concluded the game with nine points on three goals and six assists to finish with the fourth-most points and fifth-most assists in a game by a Midshipmen.
- With the win, Navy improved to 17-2 (.895) in home openers and 14-2 (.875) in morning games.
- Navy finished the game with 18 goals with eight different Midshipmen finding the back of the net. Four players finished with multiple scores, including Chung and Miles who notched hat tricks. Joining Chung and Miles with multiple scores was **Emma Kennedy** and **Mikayla Williams** who notched two scores apiece. **Chloe Brown**, **Anna Gotterup**, **Grace Mitchell**, and **Ava Yovino** also scored. Yovino followed Miles with two assists, while Gotterup, Williams, and **Rowan Kimmel** also added helpers in the game.
- The Mids' defense held its first opponent of the season to single digits, limiting the potent Wildcat offense to just five goals. Navy caused seven of Villanova's 15 turnovers and disrupted the visitors throughout the day. Eleven players picked up ground balls, including eight Midshipmen who notched multiple GB. **Jalin Jenkins** led the team with three ground balls with Chung, Kennedy, Miles, Yovino, **Landen Cain**, **Jaclyn Johns**, and **Lily Schmalz** grabbing two apiece.
- In goal, **Felicia Giglio** earned the victory. The junior worked 55 and a half minutes in the cage, making seven stops in the game. With her first save of the game, Giglio recorded her 250th career save. She became the fourth player in program history with 250 or more saves, joining **Ingrid Boyum** (2015-18) – 428 saves, **Elaina Ponchione** (2009-12) – 375 saves, and **Annie Foky** (2012-15) – 257 saves. Freshman **Angelina Price** took over for Giglio in the fourth quarter, working a scoreless four and a half minutes and notching her first collegiate save.
- Maura Murphy** led the Mids in the draw circle, winning five of Navy's 10 draws.
- For Villanova, five different players scored one goal with an additional three players notching assists. **Makenzie Fisher** worked a complete game in the cage allowing 18 goals and notching 13 saves.

Head Coach Cindy Timchal



Legendary head coach Cindy Timchal enters her 19th season at the helm of the women's lacrosse program at the United States Naval Academy in 2026. Timchal, who is entering her 44th year as a head coach, is the NCAA's all-time leader in career wins in Division I women's college lacrosse.

A Hall of Fame head coach, Timchal was named the Midshipmen's first women's lacrosse coach on August 5, 2006, and in short order, has laid the foundation for a Navy program that is moving quickly in its quest to become a NCAA Division I power.

In her 18 seasons at the helm of the Midshipmen program, Navy has accumulated a terrific 257-81 (.760) record, won seven Patriot League Championships (2010, '11, '12, '13, '17, '18, and '25) and has advanced to eight NCAA Tournaments (2010, '11, '12, '13, '17, '18, '19, and '25).

In 2017, Timchal and the Navy lacrosse team made history as it became the first Service Academy team from a women's sport to advance to the NCAA Final Four.

In 2018, the Midshipmen followed the 2017 NCAA run with a return trip to the NCAA Elite Eight. During the season, Timchal recorded her 500th career victory, becoming the first Division I lacrosse head coach to amass 500 wins.

The 2019 season saw Kelly Larkin, a junior at the time, became the Navy and the Patriot League all-time leader in career points (346). Additionally, Larkin became the first player in school and conference history with three 100-point seasons.

In her time at the Academy, Timchal has guided her student-athletes to countless honors and recognition.

She has had eight players – Erin Rawlick (2010), Jasmine DePompeo (2012, '13), Jenna Collins (2018), Kelly Larkin (2018, '19, '20), Nicole Victory (2021), Ava Yovino (2023, '24), Alyssa Daley (2025), and Emily Messinese (2025) – named to the Tewaaron Watch List, which annually honors the top male and female college lacrosse player in the United States.

Twelve (12) different players under Timchal have combined to earn 30 different All-American distinctions, including Jasmine DePompeo (Third Team in 2013), Jenna Collins (First Team in 2018), Kelly Larkin (Third Team in 2019), and Alyssa Daley (Second Team in 2025) who were named IWLCIA All-Americans. As a freshman, Kelly Larkin was named the 2017 Inside Lacrosse Rookie of the Year, while Timchal claimed IWLCIA Regional Coach of the Year in the same season.

Additionally, there have been nine Midshipmen who have combined for 18 IWLCIA All-Region honors including four – Jenna Collins (2018), Alyssa Daley (2025), Jasmine DePompeo (2013), and Kelly Larkin (2018, '19) – who earned First Team All-Region.

In the Patriot League, Timchal, who is a two-time Coach of the Year (2012, '13), had guided eight Mids to the conference's major awards.

Jasmine DePompeo (2011, '12, '13), Kelly Larkin (2019), and Erin Rawlick (2010) were named Patriot League Attacker (formerly offensive player) of the Year, while Jenna Collins (2016, '17, '18) was a three-time Midfielder of the Year. Annie Foky (2013) earned Defender of the Year, while Alyssa Chung (2025), Loren Generi (2012), Larkin (2017), and Mikayla Williams (2024) were each named Rookie of the Year.

Under Timchal, forty-eight (48) student-athletes have combined for 86 All-Patriot League honors, including 53 first-team all-conference nods.

In the classroom, six (6) Midshipmen have combined to earn seven CSC Academic All-American honors, including Jasmine DePompeo (2013), Tori DiCarlo (2025), and Anne Richter (2019) who earned first-team distinction. Additionally, Navy has had 14 CSC All-Academic honors among the women's lacrosse team. DiCarlo (2025) and Richter (2019) were named IWLCIA Scholar-Athletes of the Year for their performance in the classroom with DiCarlo (2024, '25) and Mary Ruttm (2010) being selected Patriot League Scholar-Athletes of the Year for women's lacrosse.

Timchal has had three players – Lizzy Rullan ('16), Jenna Collins ('18), and Kelly Larkin ('20) – awarded the Vice Admiral Lawrence Sword for Women, which is presented to the woman of the graduating class who is considered by the Association's Athletic Council to have personally excelled in women's athletics during her years of varsity competition.

Additionally, Jasmine DePompeo ('13) was the 2013 recipient of the Thompson Trophy Cup, presented to the midshipman, male or female, declared by the Association's Athletic Committee to have done the most during the year for the promotion of athletics at the Naval Academy.

Timchal began her tenure at Navy in August of 2006. In her first season at the helm, the Midshipmen club team played for the USL WDIA championship game, falling to Cal Poly, 16-9. Navy ended its transition season with an 18-5 record and as national club runners-up. The game was Navy's final contest before making its full transition to a Division I program.

Timchal's coaching career got its start at Northwestern in 1982. During her nine-year tenure with the Wildcats, she compiled a 76-40 (.655) record while leading the program to five NCAA appearances.

In 1991, she made the move to College Park to revive the University of Maryland women's lacrosse team. While at Maryland, Timchal won eight National Championships, including seven consecutive titles from 1995-01. Timchal amassed a 260-46 (.850) overall record with the Terrapins, including undefeated campaigns in 1995, '96, '99, and '01.

Timchal, a graduate of Haverford High School, lettered in lacrosse, tennis and track and field at West Chester (Pa.) University before beginning a now legendary career coaching lacrosse at Unionville High School, where she coached field hockey, lacrosse and basketball. In 1979, she joined the collegiate ranks, becoming an assistant lacrosse and field hockey coach at the University of Pennsylvania.

Timchal is a member of numerous halls of fame, including the National Lacrosse Hall of Fame (2012) and the IWLCIA Hall of Fame (2017 – inaugural member).

THE U.S. NAVAL ACADEMY...

- As the undergraduate college of the Naval service, the Naval Academy prepares young men and women to become professional officers in the U.S. Navy and Marine Corps. Naval Academy students are midshipmen on active duty in the U.S. Navy. They attend the academy for four years, graduating with bachelor of science degrees and reserve commissions as ensigns in the Navy or second lieutenants in the Marine Corps. Naval Academy graduates serve at least five years as Navy or Marine Corps officers.
- Founded in 1845 by Secretary of the Navy George Bancroft, the Academy started as the Naval School on 10 acres of old Fort Severn in Annapolis with an original class of 55. In 1850 the Naval School became the United States Naval Academy. A new curriculum went into effect requiring midshipmen to study at the Academy for four years and to train aboard ships each summer. Congress authorized the Naval Academy to begin awarding bachelor of science degrees in 1933. Today, the Academy offers 25 major fields of study, a wide variety of elective courses and advanced study and research opportunities.

USNA MISSION STATEMENT...

- "To develop midshipmen morally, mentally and physically and to imbue them with the highest ideals of duty, honor and loyalty in order to graduate leaders who are dedicated to a career of naval service and have potential for future deployment in mind and character to assume the highest responsibilities of command, citizenship and government."

MIDSHIPMEN...

- The word midshipman first appeared in English in the 17th century in the form of the word midshipman to designate those men who were stationed "amidships," i.e. in the waist or middle portion of the vessel, while on duty. By 1687, however, the second 's' had been dropped to give the current form of the word. Midshipmen were originally boys, sometimes as young as seven or eight, who were apprenticed to sea captains to learn the sailor's trade.
- In the early days of the American Navy, midshipmen trained aboard ship until they were eventually commissioned as ensigns. With the founding of the Naval Academy in 1845, it became possible, as it still is, for a midshipman to enter the Navy directly from civilian life.
- The name of students at the Naval Academy changed several times between 1870 and 1902, when Congress restored the original title of Midshipman. It has remained unchanged since.

News and Notes

Tewaaraton Watch List

- The Tewaaraton Award announced its initial watch list on the evening of Tuesday, Feb. 10 and Navy women's lacrosse players **Alyssa Chung** and **Mikayla Williams** were named to the list. The lists include the top players across all three divisions of NCAA lacrosse.
- Chung and Williams become the ninth and 10th Midshipmen, respectively, to be named to the Tewaaraton Watch List – **Erin Rawlick** (2010), **Jasmine DePompeo** (2012, '13), **Jenna Collins** (2018), **Kelly Larkin** (2018, '19, '20), **Nicole Victory** (2021), **Ava Yovino** (2023, '24), **Alyssa Daley** (2025), and **Emily Messinese** (2025).
- The Tewaaraton Award annually honors the top male and female college lacrosse player in the United States. The selection committees are made up of premier collegiate coaches and are appointed annually by The Tewaaraton Foundation.

National Spotlight

- On Tuesday, Feb. 10, the Intercollegiate Women's Lacrosse Coaches Association (IWLCA) announced its National Players of the Week and Navy senior team captain **Ava Yovino** was selected as the Offensive Player of the Week for Division I.
- Yovino helped lead Navy to an upset road victory over #10 Virginia, posting a 12-10 win over the Cavaliers.
- She led the team with six points on a pair of goals and a team-high four assists, while adding a team-best seven draw controls, and tying for the team lead with three ground balls and two caused turnovers.

Inside Lacrosse Preseason All-Americans

- Inside Lacrosse announced its Nike Lacrosse Preseason Media All-Americans and Navy sophomore attacker **Alyssa Chung** was selected to the second team.
- As a freshman in 2025, Chung earned USA Lacrosse All-American (Honorable Mention), Inside Lacrosse All-American (Honorable Mention), ECAC Rookie of the Year, Patriot League Rookie of the Year, All-ECAC, and All-Patriot League (First Team).
- Additionally, she was named Patriot League Rookie of the Week a conference record seven times, including six consecutive.
- After being named to the top 10 of the Inside Lacrosse Power 100 Preseason Freshman Ranking (#8), finished the year in second among the ILWomen Freshman Impact Ranking.

Preseason All-Patriot League

- In a vote cast by the league's coaches, defending champion Navy has been picked to finish first in the 2026 Patriot League Women's Lacrosse Preseason Poll, it was announced by the conference office.
- The Midshipmen boasted a league-best five student-athletes – **Alyssa Chung**, **Jaclyn Johns**, **Emma Kennedy**, **Mikayla Williams**, and **Ava Yovino** – on the Preseason All-Patriot League Team with Johns claiming Defensive Player of the Year honors.
- It is the fifth time in program history that Navy has earned the top spot in the preseason poll and the first time since 2018. The Mids were tabbed as the Patriot League favorites in 2011, '12, '13, and '18 prior to the 2026 selection.
- Additionally, Johns becomes the first Midshipmen to be named Preseason Defensive Player of the Year since **Annalise Hayward** ('20) claimed the honor as a senior prior to the 2020 season.
- Head coach Cindy Timchal and the Mids received 80 points and eight first-place votes, while Loyola, the 2025 regular-season champions, received 71 points and one first-place vote. Army placed third in the preseason poll with 68 points and one first-place vote. Holy Cross (51), Colgate (48) and Boston University (41) ranked fourth through sixth, with Lehigh (35), Bucknell (23), American (15) and Lafayette (13) rounding out the 10-team preseason poll.
- Navy placed a League-high five student-athletes on the 18-member Preseason All-Patriot League Women's Lacrosse Team, while Army had four student-athletes recognized, including three major awards. Loyola had three Preseason All-Patriot League selections, Colgate had two, and Bucknell, Boston University, Holy Cross, and Lehigh each had one representative on the squad.
- Fifteen of the 18 preseason team selections were selected to one of the two 2025 All-Patriot League squads, including seven first-team honorees. Navy's Williams and Chung were the 2024 and 2025 Patriot League Rookies of the Year, respectively.
- Voting for the Patriot League women's lacrosse preseason poll, major awards and All-Patriot League team was conducted by League head coaches. The group was not permitted to vote for its own team or student-athletes.

USA Lacrosse Preseason All-Americans

- USA Lacrosse announced its Division I Women's Preseason All-Americans as part of its 2026 preseason coverage. Navy women's lacrosse had two student-athletes named to the list with junior **Mikayla Williams** earning third-team honors and sophomore **Alyssa Chung** claiming honorable mention accolades.
- In total, 75 players from 30 teams were honored as a Preseason All-Americans. Preseason All-Americans were compiled by USA Lacrosse Magazine staff and contributors with input from college coaches.

Last season, she finished with 32 points on 18 goals and 14 assists with 39 ground balls, 15 caused turnovers, and three draws. Yovino scored goals in 13 games with five multi-goal performances.

Top Gun: Mavericks

- There are officially 22 communities for Naval Academy seniors to be assigned to for service upon graduation, including, but not limited to, Surface Warfare Officer (SWO), Marine Corps (Ground), Submarines, Medical Corps, Intelligence, etc.
- Over the years, Navy women's lacrosse has found a home within the Aviation community – Naval Pilot, Naval Flight Officer (NFO), and Marine Corps (Pilot).
- Over the last 11 years, 51 of the women's lacrosse team's 90 seniors (56.7 percent) has been assigned aviation. (35 Navy Pilots; 12 Naval Flight Officers; 4 Marine Corps Pilots)
- Between 2021 and 2025, that percentage grew to 73.3, as 33 of 45 seniors have received aviation assignments. (24 Navy Pilots; 6 Naval Flight Officers; 3 Marine Corps Pilots)
- In 2024 and 2025, 15 of 17 seniors (88.2-percent) were assigned aviation with 13 Navy Pilots, one NFO, and one Marine Corps Pilot.
- However, this season only 41.7-percent (5 of 12) of the Navy women's lacrosse seniors – **Anna Gotterup** (Navy Pilot), **Emma Kennedy** (Navy Pilot), **Maura Murphy** (Navy Pilot), **Bella Paradiso** (Navy Pilot), and **Ava Yovino** (Naval Flight Officer) – received aviation service assignments.

Outstanding Assistant Coach Award

- The IWLC announced the recipients of the 2025 Outstanding Assistant Coach Award, recognizing exceptional assistant coaches across all three NCAA divisions. Navy associate head coach **Gabby Capuzzi Solomon** was the Division I recipient, while Jordan Anderson of Slippery Rock (Division II), and Nicky Clauter of York College of Pennsylvania (Division III) were also honored for their significant contributions to their programs.
- These coaches have demonstrated outstanding dedication, hard work, and sportsmanship, making a distinct impact on the success of their teams.
- Last season, Navy concluded the year with a 15-6 overall record, including an 7-2 mark in the Patriot League. The Mids won the Patriot League Tournament Championship – the seventh in program history and the first since 2018. The Midshipmen earned the conference's automatic berth into the NCAA Tournament. It was the eighth time in program history the Mids advanced to the NCAA Tournament and the first time since 2019.
- Under Capuzzi Solomon's direction, the Navy defense held eleven (11) opponents to single-digit goals, including seven during Patriot League regular season play. Defensively, the Midshipmen caused 160 of its opponents 300 turnovers (53.3 percent), including 76 unsuccessful clear attempts.
- In addition, Capuzzi Solomon worked directly with draw control specialist **Alyssa Daley** ('25), who earned second-team IWLC All-American honors. Daley led the team with a single-season school record 236 draw controls, topping the previous record of 191 she set in 2024 under Capuzzi Solomon's direction. She broke the Navy and Patriot League record for career draw controls of 493 by Loren Generi ('15), finishing her collegiate career with 504 draws. Daley became the 11th player in NCAA history with 500 or more career draws.
- The Midshipmen concluded the year ranked among the NCAA's top 10 in draw controls per game (3rd / 18.10) and draw control percentage (5th / .633). Individually, Daley and **Felicia Giglio** ranked in the NCAA's top 25. Daley ranked fourth in draw controls per game (11.24), while Giglio was 21st in goals against average (10.20).

Paradiso Selected to Wear #6 to Honor Fallen Former Women's Lacrosse Player

- Navy women's lacrosse senior **Bella Paradiso** has been selected by her teammates to wear #6 this season to honor former Navy women's lacrosse player the late **Lt. Valerie (Cappelaere) Delaney**.
- Spearheaded by the Class of 2024, the Navy women's lacrosse team wanted to begin a tradition to honor Cappelaere's legacy by selecting a member of the senior class to wear #6 for the season. The player selected has shown the spirit and character with which Cappelaere lived her life.
- Cappelaere earned an appointment to the United States Naval Academy's Class of 2009. She was instrumental in Navy's transition from a club sport to an NCAA Division I varsity program. Her love for lacrosse and her teammates resulted in deep friendships, and she inspired and mentored many of her teammates to pursue aviation with her same fearlessness and determination.
- Upon graduation in May 2009, she was selected to be a Naval Aviator, and to pursue her dream of becoming a pilot. Cappelaere earned her Wings of Gold in February 2012. She perished on March 11, 2013, when the Navy jet she was piloting crashed in eastern Washington state during a training mission. Her military achievements include the National Defense and Global War on Terrorism Service Medals, and she was posthumously promoted to Lieutenant.
- Cappelaere will always be remembered as a person of great integrity, strong faith and an unyielding compassion for all those she met. Her legacy is an inspiration to future aviators and all women.





News and Notes

Ranked Competition

- Since earning its first win against a ranked team in 2017, Navy has posted at least one victory over a ranked team each year, except a Covid-shortened 2021 season (9 of last 10 seasons).
- Navy opened up the 2026 campaign with a 12-10 road victory over #10 Virginia for their first win of the season.
- Last season, the Mids posted an early 21-11 win over #20 Richmond for their first win over a ranked opponent.
- The Midshipmen notched a 14-12 victory over #11 Virginia for their second win against a ranked opponent in 2025.
- The Mids bested #19 Army, 18-9, in the Patriot League Semifinal for the third win against a ranked foe this year.
- Navy won the Patriot League Tournament Championship with a 14-13 overtime win over #15 Loyola for its fourth ranked win.
- Navy has defeated two or more ranked opponents in the same season seven times (2017, '18, '19, '22, '23, '24, and '25).
- Four (4) of Navy's last five losses to ranked opponents have been by one (1) goal, including three overtime losses.

Coaching Excellence

- Navy coaches has combined for 11 national championships (8 coaching; 3 playing) with numerous Final Fours on their resume.
- Head coach **Cindy Timchal** coached Maryland to eight national championships (1992, '95, '96, '97, '98, '99, '00, '01)
- Associate head coach **Gabby Capuzzi Solomon** helped Navy to three consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances as a coach, including a trip to the Final Four (2017) and the Elite Eight ('18).
- Associate head coach **Brooke Shriver** ('11) won three national titles as a player (2008, '09, '11) at Northwestern.
- Assistant coach **Taylor Pinzone** ('21) made a pair of Final Four appearances (2019, '21) as a player at Northwestern.
- Timchal led Navy to the 2017 Final Four, making the Hall of Fame coach the first head coach to lead three different teams (Northwestern, Maryland, and Navy) to the NCAA Semifinals. Capuzzi Solomon – an assistant for Navy at the time – and Shriver – an assist coach at Penn State at the time – was also at the 2017 Final Four.

Lock Down Defense

- Through two games this year, the Navy defense has held opponents to just 15 goal, including holding Nova to single digits.
- The Midshipmen have held both #10 Virginia and Villanova scoreless in the second quarter, leading to a 12-0 advantage for the Mids in the second period.
- Over the previous two seasons, the Midshipmen have stepped it up on the defensive side of the ball, holding 24 (of 41) opponents to single digits (58.5-percent).
- Last season, Navy held eleven (11) opponents to single-digit goals, including seven during Patriot League regular season play.
- In 2024, the Mids held thirteen (13) opponents to single-digit goals, including six during Patriot League play.
- In their 18-year history, the Mids have registered 12 seasons of holding 10 or more opponents to single-digit goals, including a season-best 15 games in back-to-back seasons (2013, '14).
- The longest streak for holding an opponent to single digits in Navy history is 15 straight games in 2014.
- In it's 18-year history, Navy has posted streaks of five games or more holding an opponent to single digits eight (8) times.
- Navy is 188-3 (.984) when holding an opponent to single digits.

USS Travis Manion

- In January of 2025 in Dahlgren Hall at the United States Naval Academy, then-Secretary of the Navy **Carlos Del Toro** announced that a future San Antonio-class amphibious transport dock (LPD 33) would be named USS Travis Manion after Marine Corps 1st Lt. **Travis Manion** ('04), who gave the ultimate sacrifice in 2007, on his second deployment to Iraq.
- Manion, a 2004 graduate of the Academy, was a member of the Navy wrestling team. In addition, Manion was uncle and godfather to current Navy women's lacrosse player **Maggie Borek** ('28).
- On April 29, 2007, while on patrol searching for a suspected insurgent house in Fallujah, Manion, his fellow Marines, and Iraqi Army counterparts were ambushed. He led a counterattack against enemy forces, drawing fire away from his wounded comrades and allowing every member of his patrol to survive. For his actions, Manion was awarded the Silver Star and Bronze Star with Valor.
- Today, over 300,000 Spartans nationwide carry forward the legacy of fallen heroes like Travis Manion by leading with character and living out the "If Not Me, Then Who..." ethos.

Draper Laboratory Internship

- In January of 2025, junior defender **Jalin Jenkins** was selected as one of eight Midshipmen for the Draper Laboratory Internship.
- As part of the Draper Laboratory Internship, Jenkins and the other seven Midshipmen selected were involved in solving challenging, cutting-edge problems in areas such as Autonomous System Design and Analysis, Advanced Autonomy, Navigation, and Machine Learning, Intelligence Algorithms, Search Programs, and Modeling/Simulation Techniques, and more.
- Past projects have included underwater implosions, anomaly detection methods for UUVs, UUV sonar system integration, robust mission planning/navigation for UUVs, and autonomous control software development for UUVs.

NU Connections

- The Navy women's lacrosse team has several connections to the Northwestern University Wildcats.
- Sophomore attacker **Taylor Miles** has two older sisters – **Niki** and **Jordan** – who both were members of the 2025 Northwestern women's lacrosse team. Sister, Niki, transferred to Northwestern to play lacrosse after an All-American career at the University of Pennsylvania, while sister, Jordan, transferred to Northwestern after three seasons at High Point University, where she was a First Team All-Big South player in 2024.
- **Cindy Timchal** was the head coach of Northwestern for nine years (1982-90), leading the Wildcats to a 76-40 (.655) overall record with five NCAA Tournament appearances, including a trip to the quarterfinals in 1984.
- Current, Northwestern head coach **Kelly Amonte Hiller** ('96) played lacrosse for Timchal at the University of Maryland.
- Navy associate head coach **Brooke Shriver** ('11) won three national titles as a player (2008, '09, '11) at Northwestern, while assistant coach **Taylor Pinzone** ('21) made a pair of Final Four appearances (2019, '21) as a player for the Wildcats. Both Shriver and Pinzone played for Amonte Hiller at NU.

Proposed Navy Lacrosse Center

- The Naval Academy Athletic Association in conjunction with the USNA Foundation has accepted a leadership gift from an anonymous donor earmarked for constructing a new 33,000-square-foot lacrosse facility on the Yard. Additional commitments have also been realized and as a result, the NAAA is coordinating development efforts towards raising the \$22 million necessary for construction. The process is advancing in cooperation with NAVFAC Washington and pending final endorsement by the Secretary of the Navy. The anticipated facility would be constructed adjacent to the Glenn Warner Soccer Facility on the Academy grounds.
- The two-story Navy Lacrosse Center would celebrate the history and traditions of Navy lacrosse, while serving as a testament to the Naval Academy's commitment to the Physical Mission of the Brigade of Midshipmen. The men and women who play for Navy Lacrosse would train, learn and build relationships in one of college lacrosse's preeminent facilities. Every area and detail of the Navy Lacrosse Center is designed for the development of our midshipmen and would provide the resources for the Navy men's and women's lacrosse programs to compete for and win championships at the highest level.
- Coaches' offices, locker rooms and wardrooms for both the men's and women's programs would provide cutting-edge technology and amenities to include athletic training and rehabilitation spaces, a strength and conditioning facility, a nutrition center and theater. Additionally, a rooftop terrace that features a 360-degree view of the Naval Academy and the Severn River is planned and would provide an inviting gathering space for recruits and their families, as well as a space to host alumni functions.
