OPENING KICK

The University of Delaware women's soccer continues its five-game homestand to start the season as the Fightin' Blue Hens welcome VCU and Navy to Grant Stadium.

The Blue Hens coming off a dramatic 3-2 win over George Washington on Saturday. **Olivia Bley** scored the game winning-goal with less than five minutes remaining to secure the win. **Taisiya Reid** and **Maggie Groh** also had goal contributions in Saturday's win.

For the first time in over 15 years, the Blue Hens face off against VCU. The last meeting came on October 14, 2011 in Newark and ended in a 1-1 tie. The programs were both members of the CAA at the time.

Delaware hosts Navy for the first time since 2002. The two programs met last season and ended in a 1-0 win for the Blue Hens.

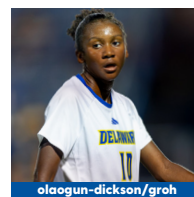

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WHAT TO LOOK FOR...

- A win would move the Hens to 3-6-3 all-time against VCU and 2-3 against Navy. It would be the Blue Hens first win over VCU since 2010.

- **Maggie Groh** is three points away from reaching 30 in her collegiate career. She has 10 goals and seven assists.

-A win on Saturday would be Lawrence's 23rd win of her coaching career. She needs 11 more wins to move second all-time in wins in a career at UD.

fun start to the season

The Fightin' Blue Hens kicked off their 2026 campaign with a thrilling 3-2 win over George Washington on August 15. **Olivia Bley** scored the game-winning goal with less than five minutes remaining to secure the win. **Taisiya Reid** and **Maggie Groh** also had goal contributions in the win.

returning talent

UD will return several key members to the squad for the 2026 season. Of the 26 athletes on the roster, 20 will be returners. The 20 returners account for 87 percent of the programs minutes played, 85 percent of the teams assists, and 80 percent of the goals scored.

returning offense

Delaware returns three of its four leading goal scorers: **Maggie Groh**, **Adiat Olaogun-Dickson** and **Brooke Vogel**, all of whom scored five goals. The Blue Hens also return **Gabby Riley**, who led the team in assists (6) and minutes played among field players (1566).

returning defense

On the defensive side, UD returns three of its top defenders: **Maura Fisher**, **Calista Collins** and **Ava Sallee**. All three played over 1,300 minutes on the field in 2025. UD had seven defensive shutouts. Fisher recorded two assists, while Collins had one.

impact transfer

The Blue Hens welcomes **Julia Hahn** for the 2026 season. The junior defender from Columbus, Ohio spent her first two seasons with Drexel, where she appeared in 28 games, made 25 starts, and logged over 2,200 minutes of time on the field. The Dragons had seven defensive shutouts in 2025.

sensational sophia

Goalkeeper **Sophia Hall** returns for her sophomore season for the Fightin' Blue Hens. Hall started in all 18 games in net in 2025. The Malvern, Pennsylvania native was a three-time CUSA Goalkeeper of the Week. She led all freshman goalkeepers in the conference in goals against average (0.834), save percentage (0.821), goals allowed (14), minutes played (1510:04), shutouts (six) and saves (64). The Blue Hens defense leads the conference in save percentage (0.823), second in goals allowed (14), goals against average (0.824). She earned CUSA All-Rookie team honors.

groh-ing talent

Senior forward **Maggie Groh** has been a key piece of the Blue Hens offense for the last two seasons. The senior from Dallastown, Pennsylvania led the team in points (15) and was tied for the team lead in goals (five) and assists (five). She earned Third Team All-CUSA honors in 2025.

She contributed a goal and had an assist on the game-winning goal in their home opener win over George Washington.

Groh started off last season in a big way, scoring three goals, and had two assists in the opening weekend. This led to wins over Mount St. Mary's and Bucknell, along with CUSA Offensive Player of the Week honors. She scored the game-winning goal with less than three minutes remaining in regulation against William & Mary, and scored her first CUSA goal against LA Tech.

In 2024, Groh was the Blue Hens leading goal scorer (three) and she leads all active Blue Hens in points (24) and goals (nine), and is second in assists (six).

sophomore star

A key member of the Blue Hens offense in the 2025 season was sophomore forward **Adiat Olaogun-Dickson**. The freshman from Sicklerville, New Jersey appeared in all 18 games, made 15 starts and logged 1111 minutes of playing time. She was tied for the team lead in goals (five) and tied for third in points (12). Her five goals is tied for 10th most by a freshman in program history.

She opened her collegiate career with a goal against Mount St. Mary's. She also scored the game-winning goal against Navy, was credited with the assist on the game-winning goal against William & Mary, and scored the game-tying goal against Missouri State.

preseason all-conference

Third year midfielder **Gabby Riley** and second year forward **Adiat Olaogun-Dickson** were named to the Conference USA Preseason All-Conference team. Both Riley and Olaogun-Dickson earned second team all-conference honors in 2025.

The women's soccer program was picked to finish third in the CUSA preseason poll, with one first place vote.

team captains

Gabby Riley, **Willa Pratt**, and **Calista Collins** were named team captains for the 2026 season. Riley and Pratt will be captains for the second year in a row, while it will be Collins first year as a captain.

hens in the pros

Four women's soccer alumnae currently compete for clubs in the professional ranks. **Kyla Burns '24** plays for Breidablik which plays in the top division in Iceland. **Paige Kenton '24** plays for Sporting JAX FC, which is located in Jacksonville and competes in the Gainbridge Super League. **Sara D'Appolonia '22** signed with Peninsula Power FC, and currently plays for Melbourne Victory FC in Australia. **Caitlin St. Leger '24** plays for the Shamrock Rovers Women from Ireland.

first-year spark

In her first season as a professional athlete, **Paige Kenton** had a big impact with Sporting Jax FC. She was one of three players to appear in and start all 29 games, was third in minutes played at 2,518, and third in goals scored with 10. She earned first team All-League honors.

historic start

The Blue Hens opened the 2025 season with a 7-0-2 record. It was the best start to the season in program history. The previous best start was in 2001 at 6-0-1.

million view zeppos

Over the summer, midfielder **Sophia Zeppos** went viral for a goal that she scored with her club program, Reading United AC. Zeppos received a pass from her teammate about 25-yards from the goal and immediately fired a shot that sailed past the diving goalkeeper and tucked into the top-right corner of the net. The clip went viral, amassing more than four million views.

welcome to the 302

The women's soccer program welcomes five freshmen who look to make an impact on the 2026 season: **Reese Reinmann**, **Claire Ballinger**, **Olivia Pillitteri**, **Tessa Poremba** and **Rianna Khananisho**.

four-sport high school athlete

Eight athletes competed in multiple sports during their time in high school. Sophomore goalkeeper **Sophia Hall** was a four-sport athlete, who competed in track & field, basketball, lacrosse, and soccer.

need for speed

Seven athletes also competed in track & field - **Maura Fisher**, **Ava Sallee**, **Adiat Olaogun-Dickson**, **Gabby Riley**, **Taisiya Reid**, **Brooke Vogel** and **Sophia Hall**. Sallee helped break the school record for the Fleetwood Area High School track & field team in the 4x100.

scoring goals with sticks, not feet

Three athletes competed in lacrosse: **Maura Fisher**, **Sophia Hall** and **Sophia Zeppos**. Zeppos was a starter her senior year.

ON THIS DATE IN DELAWARE WOMEN'S SOCCER HISTORY...

AUG
23

The last time the Blue Hens played on August 23 was in 2019 when UD defeated Lehigh 2-0, which was the home opener that season. Alexis Montgomery scored multiple goals help secure the win. Delaware also defeated Army 2-0 back in 2015.

hoopin' with the hens Two athletes competed in basketball - **Maggie Groh**, **Sophia Hall** and **Sophia Zeppos**. In 2023, Groh hit a 3-pointer at the buzzer to win the league title for the Dallastown girls' basketball team over York-Adams. Hall was a four-year starter and team captain her senior season.

hens from up north

The Blue Hens roster consists of three student-athletes who hail from Canada: **Ava Ticconi**, **Rianna Khananisho** and **Olivia Pillitteri**. UD is one of two CUSA schools with three student-athletes from Canada, along with Kennesaw State.

high school teammates

Prior to their time with the Blue Hens, incoming freshmen **Rianna Khananisho**, and **Olivia Pillitteri** both went to Holy Cross Catholic Academic in Toronto, Canada. The two helped play a role in helping Holy Cross win the Ontario Federation of School Athletic Associations championship in 2025. Pillitteri was a three-year starter, while Khananisho was a two-year team captain and named team MVP in 2025.

fast starts

The Blue Hens under **Kelly Lawrence** have benefited from fast starts and strong first half performances. UD is 22-0-4 when scoring first, and 12-0-2 when leading at the half. In the 2025 season, Delaware was 10-0-2 when scoring first and were 5-0-2 when leading at halftime. The Blue Hens were also 10-2-2 when scoring two or more goals under Lawrence.

diverse group

The 2026 Blue Hens roster brings a wealth of diversity. The roster consists players from seven different states (Delaware, Maryland, New Jersey, Ohio, New York, Pennsylvania, Virginia), as well as three Canadians.

promoted

A critical piece of the Delaware women's soccer staff over the past three years, **Shannon Coley**, has been promoted to associate head coach. Under Coley, Delaware's goalkeeping has been a key part of the program's recent success. In her three years, UD has a .832 save percentage, a 0.83 GAA, and 21 shutouts over 55 games. The Fightin' Blue Hens' goalkeepers have earned all-conference honors all three seasons. UD has also made the conference tournament in back-to-back seasons.

new year, new number

Sophomore defender/midfielder **Ava Ticconi** will wear number six for the 2026 season. Last season, she wore the number four.

host school

The Blue Hens are set to host the Conference USA tournament at Grant Stadium this fall. The quarterfinals take place on November 8, semifinals on November 10 and the championship on November 13.

While the women's soccer program has not hosted an entire tournament, the Blue Hens have hosted four tournament games throughout the programs 36 year history. The Blue Hens record in those four games is 2-2.

The last time the Blue Hens have hosted a tournament game was on November 3, 2019 against James Madison. The other three contests UD hosted at home was in 2005 when the Blue Hens defeated William & Mary in a shootout, in 2003 when George Mason defeated UD 2-1, and in 2001 when the Blue Hens defeated New Hampshire 1-0 in 1999.

This will be the first of two CUSA championships that will be hosted at Grant Stadium in the 2026-27 academic year, along with the outdoor track & field championships next spring. UD will also host the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation (MPSF) field hockey tournament at Rullo Stadium later this fall. UD also hosted the CUSA softball tournament in May.

summer internships

Three Blue Hens student-athletes worked internships over the summer: **Willa Pratt** was an OLDP intern for Siemens Healthineers, **Olivia Bley** was a part of The Home Depot FIFA World Cup Activation Team through Octagon, and **Charlotte Kulikosy** had a part of the Summer Fellows Research Program through the University of Delaware.

built in the 302

Junior midfielder **Gabby Riley** is a native of Middletown, Delaware. Her mother, Dana Riley, and father, Matthew Riley both graduated from UD. Matthew, a member of the UD men's golf team, graduated in 1997. Dana graduated in 2000.

regional rankings

Last season, the Blue Hens were regionally ranked in the United Soccer Coaches south regional poll. UD was ranked for five-straight weeks and reached as high as fourth.

hens at the world cup

Over the summer, **Olivia Bley**, was a member of The Home Depots FIFA World Cup Activation team. At her internship, Bley and other members of the activation team represented The Home Depot at its fan festival called "Beckham's Backyard", named after David Beckham. The activation team creates a fun environment for fans to watch the world cup matches. They play games, hand out prizes, and meet fans from different cultures with the goal of creating an unforgettable experience, and a positive image of the Home Depot.

"This internship is so special, it's too perfect for me. As a fall athlete, it can be tricky to do summer internship," Bley said. "With the internship being the World Cup, it's the biggest sporting event in the world and the biggest sporting event of my lifetime. Being involved in this as a student-athlete is so unique. It's not that far away from campus because it's in Philadelphia. It's such an amazing opportunity to be so close to the world cup as a division I soccer athlete. I get to meet people from other countries, including people from my dad's country, the Ivory Coast. It gave me a sense of what loving a job feels like and now I feel affirmed in my choices for my majors, and what job I want to go to. I feel like I got to meet some of the home depot representatives, it was good to get to speak to them."

postgraduate scholarship

This past summer, 2026 graduate **Leilah Sallee** was named one of 10 recipients of the Jim Castañeda Postgraduate Scholarship. Every season, CUSA grants a \$4,000 scholarship to distinguished graduates selected by the league's faculty athletics representatives and approved by the Conference USA Board of Directors. The award has been named after Dr. Jim Castañeda, who served Rice for 46 years as an educator, coach and Faculty Athletics Representative before he passed in 2008.

returning to the field

After missing all of the 2025 season due to an injury, senior captain **Willa Pratt** returns to the field. Through her first two seasons, Pratt appeared in 37 games, made 10 starts, scored three goals and one assist. She's saw more than 1,500 minutes of field action in her two seasons.

head coach connections

Head coach **Kelly Lawrence** is married to Delaware ice hockey head coach **Allison Coomey**. She is in her second year with UD, as the 2025 season was the ice hockey program's inaugural campaign.

celebrating the seniors

The women's soccer program will honor five seniors for the 2026 season: **Calista Collins**, **Maggie Groh**, **Willa Pratt**, **Taisiya Reid**, and **Cassie Saldarini**.

b2b conference tourney appearances

The 2024 and 2025 seasons mark the first time the women's soccer program has made to consecutive conference tournaments since 2012 and 2013 seasons.

club connections

The Blue Hens roster consists of multiple athletes who competed for the same club soccer team. Goalkeeper **Sophia Hall**, defender **Maura Fisher**, forward **Olivia Bley**, and midfielder **Brooke Vogel** all played for Penn Fusion, located in West Chester, Pennsylvania. With Penn Fusion, Vogel earned first team All-ECNL honors in 2022 and 2023.

Additionally, defender **Maggie Holloway** and midfielder **Sophia Zeppos** competed for FC Revolutions, located in Reading, Pennsylvania. Both Holloway and Zeppos were starters while Zeppos served as a team captain. FC Revolution won three state championships and were regional champions in 2022.

college connections

Daniela Vogel, the sister of junior midfielder **Brooke Vogel**, plays for the Miami women's soccer team. The 2026 season will be her first year with the Hurricanes soccer program.

non-conference

In 2025, the Blue Hens went undefeated in non-conference play with a 7-0-2 record, making it the first time in program history. Under Lawrence, the Blue Hens are 12-7-4 in non-conference play.

year two in cusa

The University of Delaware athletics department enters its second as a member of Conference USA. Fourteen of UD's 22 varsity programs are housed in CUSA. The Blue Hens had 59 all-conference selections between their 14 programs in their first year as league members

moving up the career rankings

Gabby Riley enters the 2026 season with 10 career assists. She needs three assists to crack the top 10 in program history. The program record for assists is held by **Kristy Hendrickson** with 31.

Despite only playing in one season, **Sophia Hall** enters 2026 with the third best save percentage in program history at .826. **Kyla Burns** holds the program record with an .852 career save percentage.

smart hens

Four returning student-athletes on the women's soccer team earned 4.0 GPAs last spring: **Willa Pratt**, **Olivia Bley**, **Maura Fisher**, and **Charlotte Kulikosky**. The women's soccer program had 14 student-athletes on the CUSA Academic Honor Roll and eight were CUSA medal recipients. **Olivia Bley** was also named to the CUSA all-academic team last season.

Three returning student-athletes were named to the College Sports Communicators All-District team: **Olivia Bley**, **Maggie Groh**, and **Gabby Riley**. To be eligible for the CSC Academic All-District Team, a player must carry a 3.50 cumulative GPA and be at least a sophomore academically. The student-athlete must have either played in 90-percent of the team's games or started in 66-percent.

one corner at a time

Under head coach **Kelly Lawrence**, the Blue Hens boast a record of 16-1-12 when they lead in corner kicks.

home field advantage

The Blue Hens are 13-7-8 under head coach **Kelly Lawrence** at home. The program's all-time record in home contests is a 172-106-39.

multi-goal game

Brooke Vogel is the last Blue Hen to score multiple goals in a game. She scored two goals against Kennesaw State on October 12, 2025 to help secure a 4-0 win.

new season, new foe

The Blue Hens will face two opponents for the first time in their 35-year history - Middle Tennessee State and Western Kentucky. In addition, they will face five non-conference foes for the first time under head coach Kelly Lawrence: George Washington, VCU, Georgetown, Villanova, and Columbia.

coaches experience in the pros

Head coach **Kelly Lawrence** and associate head coach **Becky Edwards** both have experience playing professionally. Edwards was selected 12th overall in the 2010 Women's Professional Soccer draft, leading FC Gold Pride to a WPS Championship in her rookie season. That was the start of a nine-year pro career which also included titles with Western NY Flash and Portland Thorns, as well as two stints in Sweden.

At the international level, Edwards captained the United States to the 2008 FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup title, and in 2011 she helped the U.S. U-23 National Team win a championship at the Four Nations Tournament in La Manga, Spain.

Lawrence played competitively for the Boston Breakers Reserves (2010) and the Orange County Waves Professional (2011) of the WPSL. Lawrence also played on the England National Team (U15-U23) and Team Great Britain.

best buddies club

In high school, midfielder **Sophia Zeppos** was the vice president of the Best Buddies club and was a part of the club unified bocce team her junior and senior seasons.

Unified bocce is a Special Olympics program that pairs students with and without intellectual disabilities on the same sports team. This inclusive sport promotes teamwork, friendship, and a sense of belonging for all participants. It's part of the larger Unified Champion Schools program, which also includes youth leadership and whole school engagement components.

Zeppos was partnered with a special education athlete and was paired with them for the entire season. They would practice after school in the winter and played other schools in the area once a week. Unified bocce was treated as a varsity sport.

HEAD COACH KELLY LAWRENCE

Kelly Lawrence was named the women's soccer head coach on November 14, 2022. Lawrence begins her fourth season with the program.

Delaware women's soccer has achieved significant success and program milestones under Lawrence. In 2025, the Blue Hens excelled in their first season in Conference USA, opening with a program-record 7-0-2 start and earning back-to-back conference tournament appearances for the first time since 2012-13. The team received eight all-conference selections, six postseason academic honors, and spent much of the season regionally ranked.

In 2024, Kyla Burns became the first Blue Hen in program history to earn the conference goalkeeper of the year. Burns also earned first team All-Conference honors, along with Conny Viehmann, Carly Binn, Caitin St. Leger, Brooke Vogel and Olivia Bley all earned all-conference honors.

The Blue Hens' women's soccer program made big strides in its first year under Lawrence in 2023. She started off her coaching career in a big way, defeating Syracuse 1-0. It was the program's first ever win over a power-four school. The Blue Hens picked up a victory over La Salle on the road for the first time since 1994, and tied the program record for goals in a game in its 9-1 win over Hampton.

Prior to UD, Lawrence was the associate head coach at Penn State for one season in 2022. The Nittany Lions made an NCAA second round appearance.

Prior to Penn State, Lawrence served as the associate head coach at Boston University from 2019-22. While at Boston U, she helped coach the team to the 2021 Patriot League Spring North Division Champions and the 2021 Patriot League Regular Season Champions.

Previous stops for Lawrence include serving as the interim head coach/assistant coach at Syracuse University from 2015-19.

As an assistant coach at Monmouth from 2013-14, she helped the team win the 2013 MAAC Tournament Championship and earn back-to-back MAAC Regular Season Championships in 2013 and 2014.

Lawrence competed for Indiana University from 2006-10. While in college she was named to the Mac Hermann Watch List (2008), NCAA Sweet Sixteen Finalist (2007), First Team All-BIG TEN (2007), BIG Ten All-Freshman Team (2006), All BIG Ten Freshmen Team, and three-time NSCAA All-Region. She was the only player in Indiana History to win All-BIG Ten honors in all four years.

She played competitively for the Boston Breakers Reserves (2010) and the Orange County Waves Professional (2011) of the WPSL. Lawrence also played on the England National Team (U15-U23) and Team Great Britain.

Lawrence is married to Delaware Ice Hockey Head Coach Allison Coomey.

Becky Edwards enters her second season with the Delaware women's soccer program in 2026. Edwards helped lead Delaware's offensive resurgence in 2025, as the Blue Hens scored 30 goals—the program's highest total since 2019 and a 12-goal improvement from the previous season. Nine players scored goals, with five recording at least three. Several returners posted career-best offensive seasons as well.

Prior to Delaware, Edwards spent three seasons at Tennessee, helping the Volunteers reach three consecutive NCAA Tournaments and capture a share of the 2022 SEC East title behind one of the conference's top offenses. She also coached at Penn and Florida State, contributing to successful postseason runs and conference championships.

Beyond the collegiate level, Edwards serves as an assistant coach for the U.S. U-20 Women's National Team, helping the program earn medals at both the FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup and CONCACAF U-20 Championship. • Served as the Bulldogs' Recruiting Coordinator and was elevated to Associate Head Coach in 2022.

A former standout player at Florida State, Edwards was a two-time First Team All-American, a member of the Florida State Athletics Hall of Fame, and the 12th overall pick in the 2010 Women's Professional Soccer Draft. During a nine-year professional career, she won championships with FC Gold Pride, Western New York Flash, and Portland Thorns, while also representing the United States internationally, including captaining the U.S. to the 2008 FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup title.



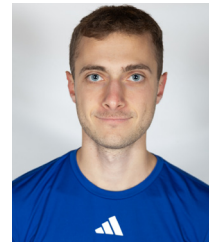

• Enters her fourth season with women's soccer as the program's goalkeeper coach. Since joining Delaware, Coley has helped elevate the Blue Hens into one of the program's most successful eras. The program earned consecutive conference tournament appearances for the first time since 2012–13.

In 2025, freshman Sophia Hall earned CUSA All-Rookie honors and national recognition as one of the country's top freshman goalkeepers. In 2024, Delaware secured its first CAA Tournament berth since 2019, highlighted by a 4-0 conference start, a five-game winning streak, and one of the conference's top defenses. Under Coley's guidance, Kyla Burns became the first Blue Hen to earn Conference Goalkeeper of the Year honors, while the team recorded eight shutouts and allowed just six goals in conference play. Coley's impact was immediate in 2023, helping Delaware earn its first-ever win over Power Five opponent Syracuse, and post one of the strongest defensive seasons in school history. Goalkeeper Kyla Burns led the nation in save percentage, becoming the first Blue Hen to lead the NCAA in a statistical category.

Before Delaware, Coley coached at the University of Rhode Island, Western Michigan, and Lawrence Tech, helping each program achieve on-field success and individual player recognition. A former standout goalkeeper at Oakland University, she ranks among the program's all-time leaders in wins and shutouts and helped lead the Golden Grizzlies to an NCAA Tournament victory over Ohio State in 2012.

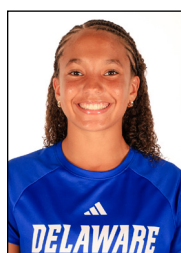

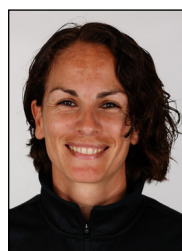
