PUCK DROP

The University of Delaware ice hockey team will drop the puck on year two this weekend, travelling north for a two-game set at Holy Cross.

The two teams met early last season, splitting a weekend series at Fred Rust Ice Arena. The Crusaders took the Friday night game 5-2, but the Fightin' Blue Hens came back on Saturday with a 2-1 win for the program's first-ever victory. **Charlotte Payne** stopped 49-of-50 shots, including six in the final two minutes as Holy Cross had the extra attacker. **Meera Smith** scored her first-career goal in the second period and **Katelynn Charlton** scored the program's first power play goal a few minutes later which proved to be the game-winner.

Delaware returns 17 letterwinners from its inaugural season, including 15 sophomores. Fifth-year **Tiana McIntyre** is back to anchor the UD blue line, while senior forward **Danica Mark** and senior goalie **Mattie Robitzer** round out the returning upperclassmen.

The Blue Hens welcome in eight newcomers to the squad this season, including two transfers and six freshmen. Fifth-year defenseman **Shea Frost** (Boston College) and junior forward **Hailey Anderson** (Franklin Pierce) join the Hens out of the portal, while the six freshmen include four forwards (**Katie Belk**, **Morgan Link**, **Lily Myers**, **Kyla Schneider**), a defenseman (**Reese Reid**) and a goalie (**Mackenzie Sunderbruch**).

Delaware led the country last season in blocked shots (758) and ranked third in total saves (1,357). The Blue Hens were the least penalized team in the AHA, taking 108 penalties (3.3/game) for an average of 7.1 minutes per game.

- Six freshmen - **Katie Belk**, **Morgan Link**, **Lily Myers**, **Reese Reid**, **Kyla Schneider**, and **Mackenzie Sunderbruch** - will make their collegiate debuts.

coaching connection

Delaware head coach **Allison Coomey** and Holy Cross head coach **Katie Lachapelle** have overlapped a couple of times throughout their careers. Lachapelle was an assistant coach at Niagara during Coomey's junior and senior seasons, including when the Purple Eagles reached the Women's Frozen Four in 2002. The two also spent nine seasons together behind the bench at Boston University (2008-17) as assistant coaches.

welcome back

Delaware returns 17 letterwinners from its inaugural season, including 14 sophomores. Fifth-year **Tiana McIntyre** is back to anchor the UD blue line, while senior forward **Danica Mark** and senior goalie **Mattie Robitzer** round out the returning upperclassmen.

Sophomores **Francesca Barresi** and **Katelynn Charlton** are the Blue Hens' two returning leading scorers after registering 12 and 10 points, respectively, as freshmen last season.

freshmen class

The Blue Hens welcome in six freshmen to this year's squad, including four forwards (**Katie Belk**, **Morgan Link**, **Lily Myers**, **Kyla Schneider**), a defenseman (**Reese Reid**) and a goalie (**Mackenzie Sunderbruch**).

pulled from the portal

Delaware brought in two key transfers to join the roster this season. Fifth-year defenseman **Shea Frost** comes to the Blue Hens after four years at Boston College. Junior forward **Hailey Anderson** will don the Blue & Gold after two seasons at Franklin Pierce. She had nine goals and 13 assists last year as a sophomore, helping lead the Ravens to a NEWHA championship and berth in the NCAA Tournament.

shattuck pipeline

The Blue Hens have opened up a pipeline from Shattuck St. Mary's School, the elite hockey prep school in Minnesota. Three members of this year's roster are products of Shattuck, including junior forward **Hailey Anderson**, sophomore defenseman **Lexie Lonask**, and freshman goaltender **Mackenzie Sunderbruch**. Additionally, assistant coach **Melissa Samoskevich** also attended and played at Shattuck St. Mary's before her collegiate playing career at Quinnipiac.

freshmen on a mission

Three members of Delaware's freshman class come to Newark with a lot of familiarity with each other. The trio of **Morgan Link**, **Lily Myers**, and **Kyla Schneider** are all coming from the Chicago area and played club hockey together on the same line for the Chicago Mission.

something in the "wooder"

One of the top girls' club programs in the country is the Philadelphia Jr. Flyers, and a quartet of Blue Hens have made the stop in Philadelphia on their journey to Newark. Senior **Mattie Robitzer**, junior **Hailey Anderson** and sophomores **Billi Roman** and **Taylor Schooley** all played for the Jr. Flyers before embarking on their collegiate careers.

a day for the record books

The Blue & Gold picked up the first victory in program history on October 5, 2025, securing a 2-1 win against Holy Cross. **Charlotte Payne** made 49 saves, then a career-high, while **Meera Smith** scored her first-career goal in the second period and **Katelynn Charlton** scored the program's first power play goal which proved to be the game-winner.

impressive in the classroom

Delaware put up impressive numbers in the classroom in its inaugural year. With a roster that featured 17 freshmen in their first year of college, the Blue Hens had a team 3.50 GPA.

delaware degree

Fifth-year defenseman **Tiana McIntyre** earned her bachelor's degree in psychology this past May from the University of Delaware, along with a minor in Spanish. She is currently pursuing her master's certificate in strategic leadership.

oh captain, my captain(s)

Delaware will be led by three captains this season. Fifth-year **Tiana McIntyre** will wear the captain's "C" while seniors **Mattie Robitzer** and **Danica Mark** will serve as alternate captains. The trio were all captains during last year's inaugural season along with **Kaitlin Finnegan**.

bringing the payne

Sophomore **Charlotte Payne** was among one of the best freshman goaltenders in the country last season. She appeared in 20 games, posting a .914 save percentage and a 3.80 GAA with 802 saves. Payne had 11 games with at least 40 saves, including a season-high 51 twice. Nationally, she ranked third in total saves and fourth in save percentage among freshmen who played at least 20 games.

fearless shot blockers

The Blue Hens' defense blocked 758 shots to lead all of Division I last season. Saint Michael's ranked second with 579 blocks. UD had 12 games with at least 25 blocks, with a season-high 44 at Brown (Nov. 9).

Individually, **Lexie Lonask** led the entire country with 141 blocked shots and was one of just two players with more than 100. She had two games with at least 10 blocks, including a career-high 11 at Brown (Nov. 9). **Bailey Gray** (73) ranked 15th nationally.

saves on saves on saves

Delaware goaltenders **Mattie Robitzer** and **Charlotte Payne** were exceptionally busy in the crease last season, ranking third in all of Division I with 1,357 combined saves. Overall, the duo has 16 games with at least 40 saves and six games with at least 50 saves.

Robitzer had five games with at least 40 saves, including a career-high 63 saves at Mercyhurst. She also had 62 stops against Penn State, and 57 against Holy Cross.

Payne had 11 40-save performances, highlighted by her 49-save performance to earn her first collegiate victory against Holy Cross, sealing Delaware's first-ever win. Payne has made a career-high 51 saves twice.

first commit, first goal

Sophomore **Francesca Barresi** cemented herself in the program record book when she scored the first-ever goal in Delaware ice hockey history during the Blue Hens' inaugural game against LIU on September 26. The Ottawa, Canada native blocked a pass and came in alone on a breakaway to net her first-collegiate goal midway through the third period. It was only fitting as Barresi was the first player to commit to play for the program in November 2024.

diverse roster

Delaware's roster has 25 student-athletes made up of 17 Americans, seven Canadians, and one Norwegian. Twelve different states are represented on the roster with only four states (Illinois, Massachusetts, Minnesota, Pennsylvania) called home by more than one Blue Hen. The other eight states include Arizona, Colorado, Delaware, South Carolina, Texas, Utah, Virginia, and Wisconsin.

two is better than one

Delaware had three different players score two goals in a game during its inaugural season.

Katelynn Charlton became the first Blue Hen to do it against Holy Cross (Oct. 4), including scoring the program's first power play goal and game-winning goal. **Kaitlin Finnegan** scored twice in the first period against Lindenwood (Nov. 14), including Delaware's first shorthanded tally. **Francesca Barresi** scored two power play goals in a 1:47 span against RIT (Jan. 8) to become the first Blue Hen to score two power play goals in a game.

cool cousin

Freshman forward **Katelynn Charlton** is the cousin of Mikyla Grant-Mentis who currently plays for the Seattle Torrent of the PWHL. Grant-Mentis played college hockey at Merrimack before playing four seasons in the PHF, earning MVP honors her rookie season.

taught them everything

Assistant coach **Melissa Samoskevich** has twin younger siblings who both play professional hockey. Her brother, Mackie, was a first-round draft pick (24th overall) by the Florida Panthers in 2021 and has won two Stanley Cups. He was traded to the Seattle Kraken before the 2026-27 season. Her sister, Maddy, was drafted in the fifth round (39th overall) by the Vancouver Goldeneyes in 2025 after a stellar playing career at Quinnipiac.

home sweet home

Even before putting on the Delaware sweater, a pair of Blue Hens were quite familiar with UD's Fred Rust Ice Arena. Sophomore **Billi Roman** played her high school hockey at Fred Rust while playing for The Tatnall School (Wilmington), and senior **Mattie Robitzer** grew up just over the Pennsylvania border in Kennett Square and often played youth hockey on UD's campus.

destined to be a blue hen

Sophomore **Billi Roman** is not only the lone Delawarean on the roster, but the only woman from the First State playing Division I hockey. Hailing from Hockessin, Roman attended The Tatnall School in Wilmington, where she suited up for the boy's hockey team that played its home games at Fred Rust Ice Arena.

Roman has several relatives who attended UD, including her father and grandfather, as well as an uncle and two cousins who played for Delaware's club hockey programs. She is wearing No. 21 in honor of her late uncle, Tim Roman, who played for the Blue Hens in the early 1990s.

no stranger to starting programs

Head coach **Allison Coomey** was hired as the Blue Hens' first head coach in March 2024. She spent 18 months compiling a roster and coaching staff ahead of the program's inaugural season.

This isn't the first time that Coomey has helped launch a new program. As a student-athlete, she was a member of the inaugural women's ice hockey team at Niagara University. She played four seasons for the Purple Eagles, serving as an alternate captain her senior season when Niagara advanced all the way to the 2002 NCAA Women's Frozen Four.

not exactly hockey hotbeds

Sophomore **Billi Roman** (Hockessin) is the only active Division I women's ice hockey player to hail from the state of Delaware. Likewise, junior **Hailey Anderson** (Greer) is the only active player in D1 from South Carolina.

When fifth-year **Tiana McIntyre** (Park City) entered her freshman season at Quinnipiac in 2022-23, she became the first woman from the state of Utah to play Division I ice hockey. There are now two as Eden Granley (American Fork) is a sophomore at St. Anselm.

Freshman goaltender **Mackenzie Sunderbruch** (Richland Hills) is one of three Texans on Division I rosters this year. She is joined by senior Victoria Petruska (Plano) of LIU and fellow freshman goalie Bianca Birrittieri (Flower Mound) at Providence.

Sophomore **Lexie Lonask** (Chandler) is one of four active players in Division I from Arizona. The other three include Union freshmen Natalie Andelova (Laveen Village) and Isabel Powers (Scottsdale) and Saint Michael's sophomore Kaydence Carpenter (Phoenix).

norwegian national

Sophomore **Ida Haave** is a member of the Norwegian National Team. A native of Kristiansand, Norway, Haave represented her home country at the last three IIHF Women's World Championships. In 2024 in Austria, Haave helped lead Norway to the top spot at the Women's World Championship Division I Group A in Austria, earning a promotion into the top division in 2025 for the first time since 1997. At the 2025 games in Czechia, Haave recorded one assist in four games as Norway went 1-3 in pool play, finishing fourth of five teams in Group B. She played in all five games for Norway at the 2026 Women's World Championship Division I Group A in Budapest,

there's something in the gene pool

The genetic trait of twins runs strong on the Blue Hens roster. **Mattie Robitzer** has a twin sister - Lily - while **Tiana McIntyre** has a twin brother - Colten - who is the traveling practice goalie and EBUG for the Utah Mammoth. Head coach **Allison Coomey** has a twin sister - Alissa - while assistant coach **Melissa Samoskevich** has two younger siblings who are twins - Mackie and Maddy - who both play professional hockey.

growing the game out west

Fifth-year **Tiana McIntyre** is proud to own the title as the first Division I ice hockey player from Utah. For the last two summers, McIntyre began working for Smith Entertainment Group (SEG), the company that owns the NHL's Utah Mammoth and the NBA's Utah Jazz. In her role, she assists with the development and growth of youth hockey in Utah, going around the state and helping run camps and clinics. McIntyre has worked side-by-side with great women's hockey players such as former U.S. Olympians Hillary Knight and Lindsey Fry, Walter Cup Champion Dominique Petrie of the Minnesota Frost in the PWHL, and NHL veteran Alexander Kerfoot.

aha connections

Sophomore **Taylor Schooley** is the daughter of Derek Schooley, who has been the head coach of the Robert Morris men's ice hockey team since 2004. Additionally, her older sister, Kaitlyn is a senior defenseman for Robert Morris.

Head coach **Allison Coomey** (2017-24) and assistant coach **Melissa Samoskevich** (2020-22) both spent time behind the bench at Penn State.

Wasyn Rice, Delaware's first-year director of skill development, played 126 career games at Robert Morris, winning the 2021 CHA Championship.

Head coach **Allison Coomey** is married to Delaware Women's Soccer Head Coach **Kelly Lawrence**, who is in her fourth season at the helm of the Blue Hens.

international experience

The Blue Hens have loads of international experience among its roster and coaching staff.

Sophomore **Ida Haave** is currently a member of the Norwegian National Team, representing her country at the last three IIHF Women's World Championships.

Sophomore **Katelynn Charlton** represented the Caribbean at the 2025 Dream Nations Cup. She helped lead her squad to the championship game, where the Caribbean fell to Egypt in overtime. The tournament was played at The Rink at American Dream in East Rutherford, New Jersey and supported by the New Jersey Devils (NHL) and New York Sirens (PWHL).

Assistant coach **Melissa Samoskevich** won gold with Team USA at the 2019 IIHF Women's World Championship in Finland, playing in all seven games and scoring two goals. Samoskevich also represented the U.S. at the 2014 and 2015 U18 Women's World Championships. She had two assists in 2014 and six goals, including a hat trick against Russia, in 2015.

Assistant coach **Taylor Willard** won a silver medal with Team USA at the 2013 U18 Women's World Championships where she picked up three assists in five games.

Head coach **Allison Coomey** was on staff with the silver-medal winning USA National Team at the 2022 Beijing Olympic Games as a team scout. She served as the head coach for the U23 U.S. Women's National Team in 2021 and 2022 and spent time as an assistant coach for the senior national team during the 2021 IIHF World Championship.

45th in the first state

Delaware became the 45th college or university to sponsor a Division I women's ice hockey program. The Blue Hens are the first program to start at the Division I level since Assumption College started its program ahead of the 2023-24 season.

delaware's team

The Blue Hens are the first Division I ice hockey team, men or women, in the state of Delaware. The only NHL player to have ever come from the First State is Mark Eaton, who played for Philadelphia, Nashville, Pittsburgh, and the New York Islanders from 1999-2013.

22nd varsity program

Delaware announced the addition of ice hockey as the University's 22nd varsity sport in December 2023, with play beginning in the 2025-26 season. The addition of hockey was in conjunction with Delaware's transition to Conference USA and FBS football and UD's continued commitment to stay Title IX compliant.

hockey in the south

Of the 45 Division I women's ice hockey teams in the country, the University of Delaware is the second-most southern program. Only AHA-foe Lindenwood is further south. With a latitude of 38.79°, St. Charles, Missouri is approximately 62 miles south of Newark, Delaware (39.68°).

for the 302

Delaware is one of 11 states that are represented by one area code. Delaware is the 302, while the other states are: Alaska, Hawaii, Maine, Montana, New Hampshire, North Dakota, Rhode Island, South Dakota, Vermont, and Wyoming.

nhl partners

Shortly after announcing the addition of women's ice hockey as a varsity sport, the University of Delaware made another important announcement. In a first-of-its-kind pairing, Delaware and the Philadelphia Flyers formed a strategic partnership aligned around growing the game of hockey, community engagement, and launching a world-class women's ice hockey program. The Blue Hens became the only NCAA Division I women's ice hockey program in the country to have a partnership with an NHL team.

Delaware ice hockey student-athletes will have access to career and professional development with the Flyers, as well as a chance to participate in the Flyers Next Shift program. The program was developed to allow women in college to shadow professional women throughout the organization on game nights. Other opportunities for internships in both business and hockey operations could happen as well.

HEAD COACH ALLISON COOMEY

With over two decades of women's ice hockey coaching experience, the University of Delaware selected Allison Coomey to be the inaugural head coach of the women's ice hockey program on March 26, 2024.

In Delaware's first season, the Fightin' Blue Hens saw continuous growth throughout the year. With a roster featuring 17 freshmen, the program recorded its first-ever victory with a 2-1 win over Holy Cross on October 5, 2025. It was also Coomey's first win as a head coach. UD had 11 games decided by two goals or less, and went to overtime four times. Delaware was the least-penalized team in Atlantic Hockey America.

Coomey came to Newark after spending the past seven seasons at Penn State. She served as an assistant coach for three seasons before being promoted to associate head coach in 2020-21.

Over the course of her career, Coomey has coached four student-athletes to the Olympics, eight to national teams, four All-Americans, 15 major conference award winners, and 47 all-conference selections.

Coomey and the Nittany Lions captured two CHA tournament titles and three regular season championships in her last four seasons. Primarily responsible for the defense, Coomey's leadership turned Penn State into one of the best defensive units in the country by allowing just 1.88 goals per game from 2019-24.

Selected for various international coaching roles with USA Hockey, Coomey was on staff with the silver-medal winning USA National Team at the 2022 Beijing Olympic Games as a team scout and extension of the coaching staff. Coomey served as the head coach for the U23 US Women's National Team in 2021 and 2022. She also spent time as an assistant coach for the USA senior national team during the 2021 IIHF World Championship and was also a member of USA Hockey's scouting staff at the 2019 IIHF U18 Women's World Championship.

At the 2019 America Hockey Coaches Association Convention, Coomey received the AHCA Women's Hockey Assistant Coach of the Year award for her outstanding career resume.

Prior to Penn State, Coomey spent nine seasons at Boston University where she helped the Terriers qualify for the NCAA Tournament six times, including a pair of NCAA Championship appearances in 2011 and 2013. While at BU, Coomey coached four Olympians who combined to win six gold medals for the Canadian National Team at the 2010 and 2014 Winter Olympic Games.

A four-year letterwinner at Niagara, Coomey returned to her alma mater as an assistant coach from 2004-08, helping the Purple Eagles reach the CHA title game twice.

Before Niagara, Coomey served as an assistant coach at Plattsburgh in 2003-04 where she helped guide the Cardinals to the 2004 Eastern Collegiate Athletic Conference (ECAC) West Division III regular-season title and the NCAA Division III semifinals. Coomey secured her first job in the industry as an assistant women's hockey coach at Connecticut College.

The Baldwinsville, New York, native earned two degrees from Niagara, a bachelor's degree in education in 2002 and a master's degree in school counseling in 2008. She was a two-time ECAC All-Academic Team member and earned a spot on the Metro Atlantic Athletic Conference All-Academic Team.

Coomey was a two-sport letterwinner at Niagara, playing ice hockey and lacrosse from 1998-2002. On the ice, she served as an alternate captain during her senior season and helped the team to its most successful campaign in program history. The Purple Eagles reached the 2002 NCAA Women's Frozen Four and finished tied for third in the final national poll. On the lacrosse field, she earned the team's rookie of the year award.

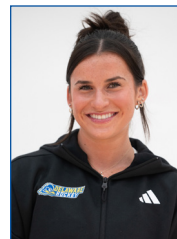

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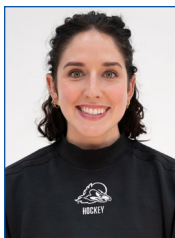
