STARTING FIVE

- For the second time in the season's first seven games, Bradley will challenge a Top 25 team on the road when the Braves visit #12 Michigan State Saturday afternoon.
- Bradley is shooting for a fourth consecutive win.
- Sunday's game will complete a three-year series between the two programs and Michigan State has won each of the first two matchups to improve to 3-0 all-time against Bradley.
- Bradley is 7-29 all-time on the road against the current Big 10 membership and the Braves have not beaten an active Big 10 member on its home floor since Dec. 1, 1960 (Minnesota).
- Michigan State is the highest ranked team the Braves have played on the road since Dec. 7, 1996 (#7 Michigan).

105TH SEASON

- Bradley has started its 105th men's basketball season and the Braves rank 26th in NCAA Division I history with 1,520 all-time wins.
- Bradley played its first men's basketball game Jan. 1, 1903 defeating a YMCA program known as the Invincibles, 12-8.

POSTSEASON STREAK

- The Braves are attempting to reach the postseason for a fourth consecutive season, a streak the program has not enjoyed since 1994-97.
- In addition, Bradley has won at least one postseason game in each of the last three years, an accomplishment only previously achieved from 1949-51.

NEW-LOOK BRAVES

- While returning seven lettermen from the 2007-08 squad, Bradley is working six newcomers and a redshirt freshman into the lineup this season.
- Bradley entered the season with only two scholarship players boasting more than one year of experience in the program -- fifth-year senior center **Sam Singh** and junior guard **Andrew Warren**.

THREE IS THE KEY

- Due in large part to the loss of all-star big men **Patrick O'Bryant** (early entry NBA lottery pick) and **Marcellus Sommerville** (graduation) following the 2006 NCAA Tournament Sweet 16 season, head coach Jim Les installed a "spread motion" offense modeled after the Phoenix Suns' system in 2006-07.
- Bradley has recruited to the system for three years and has assembled an athletic, skilled lineup that continues to fit with the uptempo style of play.
- The system often utilizes a four-guard attack and has helped Bradley rank third nationally with 734 3-point field goals since the start of the 2006-07 season and finish among the two highest-scoring teams in the Missouri Valley Conference each of the last two years.
- More notably, Bradley has won at least 21 games three consecutive seasons and is tied for eighth nationally with seven postseason wins the last three years.

INJURY BUG BITES AGAIN

- For the third consecutive year, the injury bug has taken a big bite out of the Bradley lineup.
- Junior guard **Andrew Warren**, the team's top returning scorer (13.2 ppg in 2007-08), has yet to suit up this season as he continues to recover from offseason surgery to repair a broken foot.
- Sophomore center **Will Egolf**, who was making his third career start, suffered a torn ACL in his right knee with 10:02 remaining Nov. 29 versus East Tennessee State and is to undergo season-ending surgery.
- The absence of Egolf and Warren thins the Bradley lineup to five returning scholarship lettermen.

SCORING IN THREES

- Bradley is third nationally with 734 total treys since the start of 2006-07.
- Bradley became the first-ever Missouri Valley Conference team to make as many as 300 3-pointers in a season with 349 during the 2006-07 season and the Braves followed with 346 more last season.

SCORING BIG

- A player standing no taller than 6-foot-5 has led Bradley in scoring in 58 consecutive games, a streak dating back to Jan. 20, 2007 when 6-foot-8 Zach Andrews paced the Braves with 21 points versus Wichita State.

UNIQUE STAFF MAKEUP

- Bradley's coaching staff is believed to be one of just two in the country to boast two staff members with NCAA Tournament head coaching victories.
- Seventh-year head coach **Jim Les** led the Braves to the 2006 NCAA Tournament Sweet 16, while second-year Bradley assistant **Steve Merfeld** coached Hampton to the second round of the 2001 NCAA Tournament.
- North Carolina assistant Steve Robinson led Tulsa (1997) and Florida State (1998) to NCAA Tourney wins.

GRADUATE PLAYERS

- For the fourth consecutive year, Bradley's roster features a player who already owns his degree.
- Fifth-year senior center **Sam Singh** received his bachelor's degree in communications-public relations during commencement ceremonies May 17, 2008.
- Previously, Brandyn Heemskerk ('05), Danny Adams ('06) and Daniel Ruffin ('07) all earned their degrees before completing their eligibility the following season.

ABOUT MICHIGAN STATE

- Like Bradley, Michigan State has started the 2008-09 season with a 4-2 record.
- The Spartans returned 11 lettermen from last year's squad that finished 27-9 and advanced to the third round of the NCAA Tournament.
- Having played the last five games away from home, Michigan State is playing its first home game since its season-opening win versus Idaho (100-62) Nov. 16.
- The Spartans are playing their second game against a Missouri Valley Conference foe, having previously downed Wichita State (65-57) Nov. 30 in the fifth-place game at the Old Spice Classic in Orlando.
- Junior forward Raymar Morgan leads the team in scoring at 17.7 points per game, while seven other players average between 5.2 and 10.7 ppg.

- Michigan State has won each of the previous three meetings in the all-time series versus Bradley, which began with an 89-87 Spartans victory Dec. 19, 1969 in Salt Lake City, Utah.
- The teams began a three-year series in 2006 and the Spartans have won each of the first two rounds, 82-53 Dec. 3, 2006 at the Breslin Center and 66-61 Dec. 4, 2007 at Bradley's Carver Arena.

- Not counting its 1982 win at Penn State, which was not a member of the Big Ten at the time of the game, Bradley has not won on a Big Ten floor since a 62-58 win at Minnesota Dec. 1, 1960.
- The Braves have lost 11 consecutive road games against the Big Ten since that 1960 victory against the Gophers.

TOUGH BACK-TO-BACK

- Following Sunday's game at #12 Michigan State, the Braves will host another 2008 NCAA Tournament participant Wednesday night when Butler visits Carver Arena.
- With two Horizon League games on the docket before visiting Peoria, Butler (5-0) is currently undefeated and receiving votes in both the AP and Coaches polls.
- The Bulldogs lost four starters, however, from last year's squad that went 30-4 and reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

HEATING UP

- After a cold start from the floor, particularly from 3-point range, Bradley's offense has heated up in the last two games.
- The Braves have scored at least 80 in each of the last two games, while combining to shoot 54.8 percent (51-93) from the field and 51.3 percent (20-39) from 3-point range.

NEWCOMER IMPACT

- Through the first six games, Bradley has primarily utilized a nine-man rotation made up of five newcomers and four returning players.
- The returning player portion of the rotation took a hit with the news that sophomore Will Egolf will miss the remainder of the season with a torn ACL.
- Junior college transfer **Dodie Dunson** (13.7 ppg) is the team's top scorer.
- The five newcomers -- Dunson (32.5 mpg), **Chris Roberts** (27.7), **Eddren McCain** (17.8), **Taylor Brown** (12.8) and **Darian Norris** (12.2) -- have combined for 618 of the team's 1200 total minutes played.

GETTING TO THE LINE

- Bradley enters the weekend second in The Valley with 155 free throw attempts and the Braves are averaging 25.8 free throw attempts per game.
- By comparison, the 2007-08 Braves averaged 20.4 free throw attempts per game.
- Through the first six games, Bradley has made 111-of-155 (.716) free throw attempts.
- Bradley's number of made free throws are three more than the number of attempts by its opponents.
- The Braves have outscored the opposition by 31 points, 111-80, at the charity stripe through six games.

LEADING THE PARADE TO THE LINE

- Senior forward **Theron Wilson** continues to lead the parade to the line.
- After easily pacing the Braves with 179 free throw attempts last season (4.8 FTA/gm), Wilson has attempted 46 charity shots in the first five games (7.7 FTA/gm).
- Wilson already has been fouled 47 times in six games, drawing better than 35 percent of the total fouls (132) committed against the Braves.

HITTING THE BOARDS

- Bradley has been criticized for its lack of rebounding during the first two years of the "spread motion" system, but the Braves have beaten on the boards in just one of the season's first six games.
- Through six games, the Braves are averaging 33.8 rebounds per game and boast a +2.2 rebound margin.

TURNOVERS SLOW THE OFFENSE

- Bradley has committed 104 turnovers (17.3 tpg) in the first six games.
- On the defensive end, the Braves have forced just 88 turnovers (14.7 tpg).
- The disparity has helped the opposition to a 109-81 advantage in points off turnovers.

CARVER ARENA - HOME OF THE BRAVES

- The Peoria Civic Center's Carver Arena has served as the Bradley men's basketball program's home arena since the start of the 1982-83 season.
- Now in its 27th year playing in downtown Peoria, Bradley enters Wednesday's game with Butler with a 286-91 (.759) record at Carver Arena.
- The Braves own a 126-29 (.813) non-conference record at Carver Arena, where Bradley has won five consecutive non-conference games.
- Seventh-year head coach **Jim Les** owns a 38-4 (.905) non-conference home record.

- Peoria manufacturer Maui Jim Sunglasses is sponsoring Bradley's 3-point shooting in 2008-09, with proceeds to benefit the Jimmy V Foundation for Cancer Research.

Jim Les is in his seventh season as the head men's basketball coach at Bradley University, but his name has been synonymous with Braves hoops for the better part of two decades and his connection to the program goes back even farther. Since first arriving at Bradley in December 1983, Les has etched his name in Bradley history as one of the best players in program history, won the 1986 Frances Pomeroy Naismith Hall of Fame Award, enjoyed a seven-year NBA playing career and has now embarked on a coaching career that has produced seven postseason victories in the last three years.

Les first began patrolling the baselines at Robertson Memorial Fieldhouse, Bradley's former home arena, as a ball boy from 1972 to 1975 when his older brother, Tom,

handled the point guard duties for the Braves. Jim Les returned to The Hilltop eight years later as a player and etched his place in Bradley Basketball lore as one of the best, if not the best, point guards in the program's proud history.

Following a nine-year professional playing career, which included seven seasons in the National Basketball Association, Les enjoyed a successful venture into the financial world before returning to his basketball roots. After three years of whetting his coaching whistle as an assistant for the WNBA's Sacramento Monarchs, Les returned to Bradley once more and was named the 12th men's basketball coach in Braves history on April 7, 2002.

DID YOU KNOW?

Jim Les is one of three active NCAA Division I coaches -- Matt Doherty and Lon Kruger -- to lead his team in scoring during an NCAA Tournament victory as a player, then direct his alma mater to a NCAA Tournament win as a head coach. Les scored 22 points in Bradley's 1986 first-round win against UTEP and coached the Braves to the 2006 NCAA Tournament Sweet 16.

PEORIA, Ill. -- Bradley overcame a cold-shooting first half by staying locked in on the defensive end and junior college transfers **Dodie Dunson** and **Chris Roberts** triggered a second-half comeback, leading the Braves (1-0) to a 67-61 season-opening win against UIC (0-1) in front of 10,034 fans Friday night at Carver Arena. Bradley won its 12th consecutive season-opening game played at home and improved to 14-1 all-time in season-openers at Carver Arena.

Dunson, who began his career at Iowa State during the 2006-07 season and transferred to Bradley from Vincennes University, scored a career-best 21 points, including seven straight during a 9-0 Bradley run late in the second half that stretched a 52-50 lead to 61-50 with just 1:07 remaining. A fellow transfer from Navarro Junior College, Roberts added 12 points and seven rebounds in his Bradley debut and swung the momentum to Bradley's favor with acrobatic baskets on consecutive possessions. First he rose high for a one-handed follow slam of a **Sam Maniscalco** 3-point attempt for a 46-41 lead with 8:20 remaining, then followed with an up-and-under move for a 48-42 lead with 7:36 left.

Senior forward **Theron Wilson** turned in his fourth career double-double by matching his career-best with 13 rebounds to go along with his 12 points. Maniscalco added 14 points for the Braves. Sophomore guard Robo Kreps led the Flames with 24 points, including eight points in the final 58 seconds after the Braves built their lead to 61-50. Senior center Scott VanderMeer posted a double-double of his own with 15 points and 11 rebounds and senior guard Josh Mayo added 13 points.

Dunson drained a 3-pointer 27 seconds into the game to give Bradley a 3-0 lead, but the Braves managed only two more field goals the rest of the half and did not make a shot from inside the arc until Maniscalco's deuce with his foot on the 3-point line with 1:45 remaining in the half. Bradley limited UIC to just 9-for-30 from the floor in the first half, however, and stayed in the game by making 12-of-17 free throw attempts in the first 20 minutes. UIC managed to stretch its lead to 12 points, 28-16, on a pair of VanderMeer free throws with 1:54 left in the half, but Bradley closed the gap to 28-20 at the break.

After making only 3-of-17 (.176) field goal attempts in the first half, Bradley hit 12-of-29 (.414) in the second period. Although the Flames made five more field goal attempts (20-for-57), Bradley continued to counter at the free throw line. The Braves finished 33-for-47 (.702) from the stripe. The 33 charity makes were the most by the team since hitting 35 in a 93-64 win against Bowling Green Dec. 3, 2005 and the 47 attempts were just three shy of the school record 50 tries Jan. 4, 1990 against Lamar.

Bradley stormed back into the game by scoring nine of the first 11 points of the second half. Senior center **Sam Singh** gave the Braves their first lead, 37-36, since it was 7-6 by making a pair of free throws with 12:16 left and Dunson delivered a lasting lead when he broke a 39-39 tie with a corner trey with 10:04 left. Wilson's 3-point play with 6:29 to go gave the Braves their first double-digit lead, 52-42.

The Flames did not go away easily, however, scoring the next eight points to pull within 52-50 on a Mayo jumper with 4:26 left. Dunson's two free throws with 3:29 left halted the UIC run and the junior guard scored eight of Bradley's final 15 points to help seal the win.

GAINESVILLE, Fla. -- Florida enjoyed one of the most-prolific 3-point shooting games ever against a Bradley team and the 19th-ranked Gators (2-0) took advantage of some sloppy play by the Braves (1-1) to earn an 81-58 victory in the first round of the O'Reilly Auto Parts CBE Classic in front of 10,122 fans Sunday afternoon at the Stephen C. O'Connell Center.

Florida's 14-3-pointers were one off the record for a Bradley opponent, set by Southern Illinois in a 1996 overtime game, and equalled the most by a Bradley opponent since Wichita State sank 14 against the Braves in the quarterfinals of the 2003 State Farm Missouri Valley Conference Tournament. Although Bradley limited Florida to 41.5 percent shooting from the field, the Gators worked the boards for 19 offensive rebounds and a 23-2 advantage in second-chance points.

Bradley scored the game's first four points and the lead changed hands five times before Florida used a 13-0 run in a span of 1-minute, 38-seconds to take control of the game. Walter Hodge drained a 3-pointer with 6:43 left in the first half to give the Gators a 22-18 lead and a Dan Werner layup with 5:05 left made it 32-18.

After Florida eventually built its advantage to 17 points, a **Sam Maniscalco** 3-pointer with 14 seconds left appeared to give the Braves a bit of momentum heading into the break, but Nick Calathes hit a 30-footer at the buzzer to give the Gators a 42-25 halftime advantage.

Bradley shook off the Calathes shot, however, and hit the Gators with a 10-1 burst to start the second half, pulling to within 45-37 on a David Collins free throw line jumper with 16:27 left. The Braves were still within nine, 54-45, when Sam Singh scored

FT. MYERS, Fla. -- Sophomore guard **Sam Maniscalco** turned in a solid game with 12 points, six rebounds and six assists and Bradley (3-2) turned in its best all-around effort of the season en route to a 80-66 men's basketball victory against Richmond (3-2) in the final round of the O'Reilly Auto Parts CBE Classic Wednesday evening at Alico Arena.

The Braves scored a season-high 80 points by shooting 52.1 percent from the field, recorded 19 assists on their 25 field goals, outrebounded Richmond 29-23 and committed only 11 turnovers.

Junior guards **Dodie Dunson** and **Chris Roberts** shared team-high scoring honors with 13 points, while senior forward **Theron Wilson** chipped in with 12 points. The Braves also received solid contributions from freshmen reserves **Taylor Brown** (seven) and **Darian Norris** (three), who combined for all 10 points during a 10-2 Bradley run that stretched a 51-47 lead to 61-49 with 8:09 remaining. Norris started the surge with a corner 3-pointer with 9:46 left and Brown scored the next seven in a span of just 1-minute, 10-seconds on four free throws and a corner trey of his own.

Dunson opened the game by hitting a 3-pointer on Bradley's first possession and the Braves held the lead the rest of the way. After a David Gonzalez triple pulled Richmond to within 25-19 with 5:48 left in the first half, Bradley scored the next nine points to stretch its lead to 34-19 with 3:31 left in the period, before settling for a 40-28 lead at the break.

The Braves came out of the break cold and did not score before the first media timeout of the second half, allowing Richmond to pull within 41-38 with 15:13 remaining. Roberts drained a 3-pointer with 14:52 left for a 44-38 lead and the Spiders got no closer than four points the remainder of the game. After Brown's outburst, the Braves maintained their double-digit lead the rest of the way, ultimately stretching their lead to 18 points, 75-57, on a Maniscalco drive with 2:52 left.

PEORIA, Ill. -- Bradley hit its first five 3-point field goal attempts en route to a 17-2 lead to start the games and the Braves (4-2) rode the hot start to their 15th consecutive November home win, an 82-69 victory against East Tennessee State (3-3) Saturday night at Carver Arena. Playing its fourth game in six days, Bradley extended its winning streak to three games with its season-best scoring output.

Junior guard **Dodie Dunson** led four Braves in double figures with 17 points. Junior swingman **Chris Roberts** added a season-best 16 points, senior forward **Theron Wilson** added 12 points and a game-high eight rebounds and freshman guard **Eddren McCain** hit double-figures for the first time with 10 points. East Tennessee State guard Courtney Pigram scored a game-high 27 points, but forward Kevin Tiggs was the only other Bucs player to reach double-figures, chipping in 15 points.

After cruising to a 44-25 lead at halftime, Bradley twice built its lead to as many as 24 points in the second half, but with the Braves leading 64-42 the game took a sour turn for Bradley. Sophomore guard Will Egolf, who had made his third career start and had scored six points in a career-high 20 minutes, injured his right knee after catching the ball on the baseline and spinning toward the basket with 10:02 remaining. Egolf was helped to the lockerroom by two teammates and is scheduled to have an MRI exam on the injured knee Sunday.

East Tennessee State took advantage of the emotional swing and cut its deficit to single digits, 75-66, on a Tommy Hubbard basket in the paint with 2:21 remaining. Dunson answered with an old-fashioned 3-point play with 1:58 remaining, but after Pigram brought the Bucs back to within nine, 78-68, with a 3-pointer with 1:42 left, Sam Maniscalco sank two free throws and Wilson threw down a dunk to close out the scoring.

Ranked among the nation's top 3-point shooting teams each of the last two seasons, the Braves had gotten off to a cold start from behind the arc this season and entered Saturday's game without making more than seven treys in a game and shooting just 26.5 percent from behind the arc. Sparked by Dunson's 4-for-6 effort from long range in the first half, Bradley made 8-of-13 (.615) 3-point tries in the first 20 minutes. The Braves finished the game 13-for-24 (.542) from behind the arc, equalling the eighth-best single-game total in program history.

And while Bradley was firing away early, the Braves also limited ETSU to just 9-for-27 (.333) shooting from the field in the first half and a 6-for-24 (.250) effort from 3-point range for the game.
