FOR OPENERS

- Bradley opened the season with a 98-92 home victory against Illinois and will be trying for the first 2-0 start to a season since 2008-09.
- Monday's game at Southeast Missouri State will mark the first meeting between the two teams.
- All five Bradley starters scored in double figures in Friday's 98-92 victory against Illinois, marking the first time each of the starting five had 10 or more points since Feb. 19, 2009 against Creighton.
- Bradley, which ranked 21st in the nation in scoring in 2012-13, reached 98 points in a 40-minute contest for the first time since topping Xavier 101-86 on Nov. 30, 1996.
- Monday's game will mark the home opener for the Redhawks, while Bradley will be looking for the earliest road win in program history.
- SEMO head coach Ty Margenthaler was an assistant coach at Bradley from 2000-01 through the 2005-06 season and was an assistant coach with the Braves while current Bradley head coach Michael Brooks' wife, Andi, served as BU's Director of Operations (2004-05) and as an assistant coach (2005-06).
- Following Monday's game, the Braves return to Peoria for a pair of games before playing five of the next away from home.

Southeast Missouri State returns seven letterwinners, including three starters from last year's team which finished 11-18 overall and was fifth in the West Division of the Ohio Valley Conference with a 5-11 league

Five freshmen highlight an incoming class of seven eligible newcomers for the Redhawks.

Senior guard Jordan Hunter is the team's top returning scorer (9.1 ppg) and rebounder (3.1 rpg). She also averaged a team-best 4.0 assists and 1.2 steals per outing.

Sophomore Kara Wright is one of three returning players to score better than eight points per contest in 2012-13 (8.5 ppg) and shot a team-best 45.5 percent from the field.

Junior guard Allyson Bradshaw was the team's top outside shooter, connecting on 33.3 percent from long range and averaged 8.2 points per game last season.

SEMO averaged just 16.2 turnovers per game last year and owned a 7-6 record at the Show Me Center in 2012-13.

The Redhawks opened the season with a 76-64 victory at Alabama A&M Friday.

ABOUT THE BRAVES

Bradley returns nearly 60 percent of its scoring from last year's squad which led the Missouri Valley Conference and ranked 21st in the nation in scoring, with three starters headlining a group of eight returning letterwinners for second-year head coach Michael Brooks.

While lacking in height, the Braves paced the MVC in steals and capitalized on the teams speed to use a strong transition game. The 2013-14 Bradley squad will

likely have the same philosophy as last year with only three players on the roster at six foot or taller.

Solidifying the backcourt will be the senior duo of Kelsey Budd and Catie O'Leary. Bradley is one of five teams to return two players which ranked in the top 25 in the league in scoring last year. Budd is the top returning scorer (10.0 ppg) for the Braves in addition to nearing the top 10 in career assists at Bradley.

O'Leary was the team's top rebounder last year at 6.7 boards per game to go with her 9.8 points-per-game average and is one of just two returning players in The Valley to collect 200 points, 200 rebounds and 50 assists in 2012-13.

Junior Michelle Young played an increased role down the stretch last year and will player a bigger part in the team's offense and defense this year. As a sophomore, she averaged 7.7 points and nearly two steals per outing on the year, but averaged 12.6 points on 58 percent shooting and came away with 2.4 steals over the final seven games.

Returning to the lineup will be 6-1 senior Kelly Frings to help bolster the frontcourt. Frings averaged 6.4 points and 7.2 rebounds over her final 11 games before suffering a torn ACL midway through the MVC schedule.

Also bolstering the front court will be sophomore Jenny Smith and 6-3 senior Alyson Spinas-Valainis. Smith averaged 6.4 points and 4.0 rebounds, while making 11 starts as a freshman and Spinas-Valainis was in the starting lineup seven times in 2012-13.

Sophomore guards Fantasia Vine and Taylor Shull will add depth in the backcourt.

Highlighting the incoming class is 5-10 freshman Leti Lerma, who was a two-time conference player of the year

selection. Peoria Richwoods High School product Audrey Lawson will also compete for time at guard.

Western Illinois transfer Charnelle Reed will sit out the 2013-14 season and have three years of eligibility remaining after averaging 8.5 points per game as a freshman for the Leathnecks.

THE COACHES

Michael Brooks (Western State '04) is in his second season as head coach of the Braves after guiding Bradley to a 14-16 record in his first season as head coach and owns a 15-16 (.484) record with the Braves. Brooks was part of both of BU's teams which advanced to the Women's Basketball Invitational, serving as an assistant coach for the Braves in 2011-12 and Director of Operations during the 2009-10 campaign. In between his two stints on the Bradley bench, Brooks was co-head coach at Central Methodist University in 2010-11 and owns a 20-41 (.328) career coaching record in two seasons.

Ty Margenthaler (SIU Edwardsville '97) is in his third season as head coach at Southeast Missouri State and has led the Redhawks to an improved conference record in each of his first two seasons. Margenthaler owns a 19-40 (.322) record as head coach at SEMO. After spending six years as an assistant coach at Bradley, he was an assistant at Wisconsin for five seasons prior to arriving in Cape Girardeau, Mo.

SERIES HISTORY

Monday's game will be the first meeting between Bradley and Southeast Missouri State.

AGAINST THE OVC

Bradley is 33-19 (.635) against current members of the Ohio Valley Conference and has won three consecutive games against OVC foes. In fact, the Braves are 8-1 in their last eight matchups with current OVC members since a BU loss at Eastern Illinois on Nov. 14, 2006.

ROAD OPENER

Monday's game at Southeast Missouri State will mark the earliest road game for the Braves since playing the 2007-08 season opener at Northern Illinois on Nov. 9 and Bradley is looking for the earliest road win in program history. Last season's win at Ohio Valley Conference member Eastern Illinois on Nov. 12 was the earliest in the calendar year BU had earned a road victory. Bradley is 16-22 (.421) in the first true road game of the season all-time. Over the last 14 regular-season non-conference road tilts, the Braves have posted an 11-3 record (.786).

HIGH SCORING OPENER

Bradley topped Illinois 98-92 Friday in the season opener for BU's highest point total in a season opener since a 100-34 victory against Eureka to start the 1980-81 season. The 98 points scored were a Renaissance Coliseum record, surpassing the previous mark of 96 points against Iowa on Dec. 17, 2011 and was the Braves highest point total in a regulation contest since posting a 101-86 victory at Xavier on Nov. 30, 1996. All five BU starters scored in double figures for the first time since a home contest against Creighton on Feb. 19, 2009.

NICE CROWD

Friday's season opener featured a special 11 a.m. game and approximately 1,800 grade school students helped make up the largest crowd for a women's

basketball game at Renaissance Coliseum. The 2,402 in attendance was the largest for a season opener in program history and ranks as the fourth-largest crowd at Bradley. Friday's attendance was the best for a game against an opponent other than Illinois State and was the best since 3,004 fans were on hand at Robertson Memorial Field House for a contest against the Redbirds on Jan. 13, 2008.

HIGH-SCORING PAIR

Junior Michelle Young scored a game and career-high 32 points and senior Kelsey Budd added 23 points to help pace Bradley offensively in the season opener against Illinois. Young's 32 point-outing is tied for the eighth best scoring output in school history and was the highest point total for a Brave in a home game since Genny Mueller netted 33 points against Indiana State on March 6, 2004. Budd's 23-point effort gave the Braves a 30-point and 20-point scorer in the same game for the first time since Jenn Jolley had 31 and Sara Bailey netted 30 points against Illinois State on March 1, 2001. SEMO head coach Ty Margenthaler was in his first season as an assistant coach at Bradley when Jolley and Bailey both scored 30 points. Young's 32 points are the most in a season opener for the Braves.

WELCOME BACK

Senior Kelly Frings came up big in Friday's victory against Illinois in her first game since suffering ACL tear midway through the 2012-13 season and missing the final 13 games last year. Frings scored a career-high 17 points on 6-of-10 shooting and also had seven rebounds, two assists and one block in 35 minutes of action to help the Braves to the victory. Over her last 13 games, Frings has averaged 6.8 points and 7.2 rebounds per game. The Braves are 6-4 when she has at least five points and five rebounds since the start of the 2012-13 season.

CRASHING THE BOARDS

Senior Catie O'Leary pulled down a career-high and Renaissance Coliseum record 18 rebounds Friday vs. Illinois, surpassing her previous career-best rebound total of 12 set last year in the win at Illinois. O'Leary also had 10 points for her second double-double in as many games against the Illini and the fourth of her career. The 18 rebounds were the most by a Brave since Latasha Hollingshed had 20 boards at Wisconsin-Milwaukee on Dec. 1, 2010 and O'Leary is the first BU player with 10 points, 15 boards and at least five assists in a game since Monica Rogers had 12 points, 16 rebounds and dished out five assists at Illinois-Chicago at on Nov. 22, 2008.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP

Bradley trailed Illinois by 11 points at halftime and was down 59-52 with 16:19 to play Friday against the Illini when senior Kelsey Budd helped spark the Braves. She tallied nine points, three steals and one assist to highlight an 18-2 Bradley run over a 4:20 stretch to help

the Braves go in front 70-61 en route to a 98-92 victory. Budd finished with 23 points, seven assists and eight steals for the most steals by a Brave since Skye Johnson had eight thefts against Creighton on Feb. 23, 2008. In addition, Budd is the first Bradley player with 20 points, five assists and eight steals in a game since Heather Best collected 25 points, six assists and eight steals against Loyola on Dec. 21, 1995.

SEASON OPENERS

Bradley opened its 39th season of intercollegiate competition Friday against Illinois, marking the earliest season opener in program history. The Braves won the first game of the year for the third time in the last four seasons and started the year at home for the fourth consecutive campaign. BU is 23-16 (.590) in season openers. Friday's win was Bradley's first in a season opener against a Big Ten Conference opponent (1-3) and the Braves opened the season against a Big Ten squad for the first time since 1985-86.

HOME OPENERS

Bradley is 28-11 (.718) in home openers and has won seven of the last eight games when playing the season opener in Peoria. BU is 18-6 (.750) when opening the season at home and 8-2 (.800) in the last 10 home openers overall.

BCS OPENER

Friday's matchup with Illinois marked the first time Bradley opened a season against a BCS Conference opponent since hosting Missouri in the 1999-2000 season opener. The Braves are 3-6 all-time when opening a season against a current BCS Conference member, with the win against the Illini the first against a BCS Conference foe in a season opener since topping Utah to begin the 1998-99 campaign.

BRING ON THE BIG TEN

Bradley improved to 3-1 in the last four matchups with a Big Ten Conference foe and the Braves have won three consecutive regular-season games against the Big Ten. BU is 10-28 all-time against current members of the Big Ten, but Bradley is 7-9 at home against Big Ten squads.

IN-STATE FOES

Friday's win against Illinois was the first of four games against in-state non-conference opponents and the Braves improved to 5-1 under head coach Michael Brooks against in-state non-conference foes. BU is 8-1 in the last nine matchups with non-conference teams from Illinois. In fact, BU is 11-2 (.846) against in-state non-league foes since the last time Illinois defeated the Braves during the 2010-11 season. Over the last six seasons, Bradley owns a 21-8 (.724) record against non-league squads from the Land of Lincoln, which includes a 12-2 (.857) home record.

OUT OF STATE

With only two eligible players on the roster from the state of Illinois, Bradley's starting lineup in the season opener featured three players from Wisconsin, an Iowa native and Minnesota product Michelle Young. Friday's game against Illinois marked just the third time since the start of the 1981-82 season that the Braves had five players from outside the state of Illinois in the starting lineup. Last season's game at Drake (1/25/13), which featured Wisconsin natives and current seniors Kelsey Budd, Kelly Frings and Catie O'Leary along with Michelle Young (Minnesota) and Shrona Butts (Iowa), was the last time. The game at Drake last year ended a span of 409 consecutive games with at least one starter from the Land of Lincoln. The only other game on record with five starters not from the Prairie State was a home contest against Creighton on Jan. 14, 1999.

YOUNG GUNS

Bradley's 11-person roster features four seniors and one junior, giving the Braves their fewest upperclassmen

(5) on a roster since the 2009-10 campaign when BU had just four upperclassmen. The 2009-10 squad finished the year with a 17-14 overall record and tied for third in the MVC with a 12-6 Valley mark. Bradley is one of six teams in the MVC to have just five upperclassmen on the roster in 2013-14.

FILLING IT UP

Bradley head coach Michael Brooks' first season on The Hilltop saw his squad lead the Missouri Valley Conference in scoring with a 71.3 points per game average in 2012-13. The Braves, which ranked 21st in the nation in scoring, led the league in offense for the first time since 1986-87 (72.8 ppg) and marked Bradley's highest season scoring average since 1991-92 (71.6 ppg). The Braves got off to a strong start again in 2013-14, scoring 98 points in the season-opening win against Illinois.

ON THE MARK

In addition to leading the league in scoring, Bradley paced the Missouri Valley Conference in free throw percentage, ranking eighth in the country by shooting a school record 78.1 percent from the charity stripe in 2012-13. The Braves led the MVC in free throw percentage for the second consecutive year and have a chance to become just the third team to lead the conference in free throw percentage in three straight years. Bradley's 434 made free throws last year rank as the fifth best season total in school history and BU's 14.5 made free throws per game was second in the MVC in 2012-13. BU's free throw percentage of 78.1 percent was the best by a Valley squad since Illinois State shot a MVC season record 80.5 percent from the charity stripe in 2009-10. The previous Bradley record for free throw percentage in a season was 75.8 percent in 2006-07.

FOREVER YOUNG

Junior forward Michelle Young ended the 2012-13 season on a high note and continued where she left off last year with a career-best 32 points against Illinois to open the season. Young scored in double figures in three of her first 43 career games, but scored 10 or more points in nine of the final 13 games in 2012-13 and 10 of the last 14 outings overall. Over her last 14 games, Young has shot 51.9 percent from the field and averaged 12.4 points per game and has also averaged 2.1 steals per contest. In the final seven games of the 2012-13 season, she averaged 12.6 points on 58 percent shooting and came away with 2.4 steals per contest.

Points In The Paint

MOVING ON UP

Bradley finished sixth in the regular-season Missouri Valley Conference race in 2012-13, marking the squad's best finish since tying for third in the Valley in 2009-10. The Braves closed the 2012-13 season with a 14-16 overall record and BU had 14 or more wins in a season for the fifth consecutive year. Bradley's 85 victories over the last five seasons are the most in a five-year period in school history. The previous best for wins in a five-year stretch was 82.

TRANSITIONING

One of the main reasons for Bradley's success in 2012-13 was the squad's ability to create turnovers. Over the final 12 contests of the season, the Braves forced an average of 21.1 turnovers per outing and came up with 12.0 steals per game during that stretch. Bradley was 10-6 when it matched or led in points off turnovers. During the final 12-game stretch, the Braves averaged 21.1 points off turnovers compared to a 14.4 points-per-game average for their opponents. Bradley ranked 42nd in the country and led the MVC in steals per game (10.4 per game).

SPREADING IT AROUND

Bradley is one of five teams to return two players which ranked in the top 25 in scoring in the Missouri Valley Conference last season and the Braves return a pair of players which have 600 or more career points in their time on The Hilltop for the first time since 2004-05. Senior Kelsey Budd is the squad's active career leading scorer with 671 points to rank 37th in school history. Fellow senior Catie O'Leary has averaged 10.1 points per game as a Brave in her two-plus seasons after transferring from Wisconsin after her freshman season. O'Leary is 40th in career scoring at BU with 657 points. The last time the Braves returned two players with 600 or more career points to start a year (2004-05), Bradley finished with a 15-13 record and was 8-10 in Valley play. Genny Mueller started that season with 911 points and Dena Williams had 658 points to open the 2004-05 campaign.

MAKING THEM COUNT

Junior Catie O'Leary ranked 28th in the country in free throw percentage in 2012-13 at 85.5 percent, making 100 of 117 attempts. Her 100 made free throws were the most by a non-senior at Bradley since Carol Baresch made a school season record 158 free throws as a junior in 1988-89 and tied for the 10th most free throws made in a season in school history. In fact, O'Leary's 85.5 percent free throw shooting ranked as the best by a Bradley player with 100 or more attempts in a season. Only three other players in school history had 100 free throw attempts and shot 80 percent or better from the free throw line. In addition, O'Leary is the fifth player in school history to have 80 or more made free throws in back-to-back seasons.

DISHING THE ROCK

Senior guard Kelsey Budd is the team's top returning scorer after averaging a career-best 10.0 points per game in 2012-13 as a junior. In addition to ranking as the squad's active career scoring leader with 671 points as a Brave, Budd also ranks as the team's active career leader in assists with 234. She is the first player to dish out 200 assists before the start of their senior season since Jen Brown, who is third in career assists at Bradley, started her senior season of 2006-07 with 348 assists. In addition, Budd is the first returning Bradley player with 600 career points and 200 assists since Bradley Hall of Fame member Heather Best opened the 1998-99 campaign with 999 points and 255 assists.

SHOWING HER VERSATILITY

Senior Catie O'Leary pulled down a team-best 200 rebounds (6.7 per game) in 2012-13 in addition to averaging 9.8 points and 2.1 assists per game. O'Leary is one of two returning players in the Missouri Valley Conference which had 200 points, 200 rebounds and 50 assists last year. She is the first Bradley player to reach those numbers since Lora Weber did so (211 points, 203 rebounds & 121 assists) as a senior in 2001-02. O'Leary is just the fifth player in program history to have 200 points, 200 rebound and 50 assists in a season and joined Bradley

Hall of Fame member Val Wancket as the only player to reach those numbers in a season prior to their senior year. Wancket had 246 points, 226 boards and 86 assists as a sophomore in 1988-89. The only other players to reach those numbers in a season were Carrie Coffman in 1994-95 and Eileen Yerkes in 1991-92.

SCHEDULE NOTES

Four of Bradley's five home non-conference opponents played in the 2012-13 NCAA Tournament or WNIT and six of the 11 overall were in the postseason. The Braves will play at Carver Arena (9:30 p.m.) against Stony Brook as part of a men's and women's doubleheader on Nov. 15 for the team's first regular-season appearance at the downtown arena since 2004-05. NCAA Tournament participant South Florida will play Bradley at Renaissance Coliseum Nov. 17 after a sixth-place finish in the Big East last year. The Braves face back-to-back NCAA Elite Eight squad Kentucky in Lexington, Ky., Nov. 27 in the first contest against an SEC opponent since 1992-93. A men's and women's doubleheader at Renaissance Coliseum (Dec. 4 vs. Eastern Illinois) is one of just two home games in December for Bradley. The Braves travel to Columbia, Mo., to take on Missouri Dec. 7 in the final game before finals. After a trip to Dayton, Ohio, for a tournament at Wright State (Dec. 21 & 22), Bradley closes out the non-conference schedule against NCAA Tournament participant DePaul in the first meeting in the series since 1991-92.

WESTERN ILLINOIS TRANSFER

Flossmoor, Ill., native Charnelle Reed transferred to Bradley in August following her freshman year at Western Illinois and will have three years of eligibility remaining after sitting out the 2013-14 season. Reed started two games as a freshman with the Leathernecks and was fourth on the team in scoring at 8.5 points per game. She was the top three-point shooter for the Leathernecks, connecting on 40.2 percent of her attempts from beyond the arc. Reed is the first player to transfer to Bradley from Western Illinois since Michelle Nason came to The Hilltop after spending the 1990-91 and 1991-92 seasons in Macomb, Ill. Nason averaged 16.0 points per game in her Bradley career during the 1993-94 and 1994-95 campaigns and holds the Bradley career record for three-point field goal percentage at 40.6 percent.

SPEAKING OF TRANSFERS

Senior guard Catie O'Leary has averaged 10.1 points per game in her Bradley career after transferring from Wisconsin and is closing in on Michelle Nason's school career mark for points scored by a transfer. The team's top rebounder at 6.7 boards per game in 2012-13, O'Leary averaged 9.8 points per game last year as a junior. Her 353 points scored as a sophomore in 2011-12 ranked as the most points scored by a transfer in their first season at Bradley since Nason scored 417 points in 1993-94 after transferring from Western Illinois. O'Leary is fourth

NAIL BITERS

Eight of Bradley's 18 Missouri Valley Conference games in 2012-13 were decided by five points. The Braves played a program record 11 contests in which the final margin was five points or fewer last year. Despite the close calls, only one game in 2012-13 went to overtime, with Bradley falling in double overtime at Wisconsin-Milwaukee in a 112-116 decision. The 112 points scored were the third most in school history and was the highest point total since a Bradley record 129 points at Chicago State on Nov. 27, 1982.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

The Braves will play 14 home games in 2013-14 for the most regular-season home contests since 2011-12 (14). Bradley was 8-5 at Renaissance Coliseum in 2012-13 for the squad's best home record since posting a 9-3 record at Lorene Ramsey Gym in 2009-10 while Renaissance Coliseum was under construction. Bradley has finished with a winning home record each of the last six seasons, marking the first time that has been accomplished since the Braves had eight consecutive years (1984-85 through 1991-92) with winning home records.

WINNING AWAY FROM HOME

Winning on the road is not new for the Braves. BU is a combined 34-38 in true road games since the start of the 2008-09 season and the team's 34 road victories are third most in the Missouri Valley Conference during that stretch. Illinois State has earned 43 road wins as of Nov. 9 during that same time, while Northern Iowa is second with 35 road wins during that span.

BU PICKED 7TH IN PRESEASON POLL

Bradley was picked to finish seventh in the Missouri Valley Conference preseason poll despite picking up the team's highest point total since 2010-11 in the preseason vote of league coaches, sports information directors and media. The Braves received 194 points to place seventh and were 17 points behind conference newcomer Loyola, which was sixth at 211 points. Bradley's 194 points are the highest point total for a seventh-place team since the current voting method was first used in 1996-97. Indiana State garnered 26 of 40 first-place votes and is

the preseason league favorite with 378 points. Defending MVC co-champion Wichita State was second at 360.

The women's basketball team will play the second game of a doubleheader, which starts at 7 p.m. with the Bradley men taking on Chicago State. The women's game will start at approximately 9:30 p.m. The Braves will be playing Stony Brook for the second time after defeating the Sea Wolves 87-60 at Robertson Memorial Field House on Nov. 21, 2004 in the only previous meeting.

Her 32 points are tied for the eighth-best single-game total in school history and were the most by a Brave in a home game since Genny Mueller had 33 points vs. Indiana State on March 6, 2004 ... In addition, the 32 points were the most in a season opener by a Bradley player.
