FOR STARTERS

• Bradley hits the road for the first time in 44 days Friday for a game at Indiana State, after completing a school record eight-game home stand Sunday with an 80-47 setback to Drake.

• A two-game road swing through Indiana (Friday at Indiana State & Monday at Evansville) is Bradley's only games outside the state of Illinois during a 17-game stretch which spans from Nov. 30 through the Feb. 8 home game against Evansville.

• The Braves are trying to snap a six-game losing skid and trying for the team's first road win of the season.

• Bradley plays five of the next seven and seven of 11 games on the road starting with Indiana State Friday.

• Whitney Tinjum has averaged 17.2 points and 7.2 rebounds per game since making her debut against Chicago State Dec. 18. She is the eighth player in school history to score in double figures in each of their first five games.

• After the two-game road swing, Bradley returns to Renaissance Coliseum to play host to defending MVC champion Wichita State Friday, Jan. 16.

ABOUT INDIANA STATE

Indiana State will play its first home game since Dec. 7 Friday when Bradley visits the Hulman Center in the first MVC road game of the year for the Braves.

Senior forward Racheal Mahan leads Indiana State in scoring (12.1 ppg), rebounding (6.6 rpg) and field goal percentage (51.2 percent).

Fellow senior forward Jasmine Grier has connected on 25 three-pointers this season and is scoring 10.5 points per outing.

Senior guard Travecia Franklin is one of three players averaging better than two assists per contest, dishing out a team-high 2.7 per game.

Indiana State has seven seniors and a total of 10 upperclassmen. One of the top defensive units in the MVC, the Sycamores lead the league in steals (11.1 per game) and force a league-best 22.2 turnovers per tilt. Indiana State is second in the MVC in points allowed (59.7) and

rebounding (40.1 per game).

The Sycamores posted the best non-conference record in the MVC at 10-1, which included a perfect 6-0 road record and overtime victories at both Indiana and 25th-ranked St. John's.

ABOUT EVANSVILLE

Evansville owns a perfect 4-0 home record heading into a Thursday night matchup with Loyola at the Ford Center and the Purple Aces are 6-7 overall.

Sophomore guard Sara Dickey leads the MVC in minutes played (37.5 per game) and is third in the league in scoring at 17.5 points per outing.

Senior forward Mallory Ladd leads the Valley in free throw percentage at 86 percent, in addition to ranking in the top three in both assists (3.1 per game) and three-point field goal percentage (41.7 percent). Ladd, who is tied for fifth in the league in scoring at 15.2 points per outing, has made almost two three-pointers per game and is fifth in the MVC in rebounding (7.5 per game).

Sophomore forward Sasha Robinson is the top rebounder on the team at 8.0 boards per outing and is shooting 54.3 percent from the field.

Senior Khristian Hart scores 8.9 points per game to help lead UE, while fellow senior Kat Taylor has shot 52.9 percent from three-point range and scored 7.2 points per game since returning from an injury which sidelined her for the first eight games of the season.

Evansville is shooting 35.5 percent from beyond the three-point arc to lead the MVC and the Purple Aces are third in the league in three-point field goals per game.

ABOUT THE BRAVES

Bradley looks to end a six-game skid after an 80-47 loss to Drake Sunday which wrapped up an eight-game home stand.

The Braves have a new look in 2014-15, with the team returning just three letterwinners from last year's squad

in addition to welcoming eight newcomers this season.

Senior Michelle Young, who was an honorable mention All-Missouri Valley Conference pick last year has been slowed lately by illness and an injury, but is among the league leaders in the MVC in scoring at 14.3 points per game and also leads the team in field goal percentage (43.5 percent) and steals (2.3 spg). She has scored 15 or more in six of her last nine games, averaging 16.1 ppg during that span, which includes a Bradley single-game record 38 points at Columbia (Nov. 26).

Young, who led the MVC in free throws made with 137 as a junior (4.6 per game), was the fifth player in program history with 400 points and 55 or more steals in a season last year. Young is the only senior and one of just three upperclassmen on a roster which features six freshmen.

Junior guard Fantasia Vine made her first start of the year at Columbia and is scoring 6.7 points per contest. She was the most accurate three-point shooter on the team last season, making 36 percent of her shots from beyond the arc. Vine has scored in double figures in four of her last eight games.

Sophomore Leti Lerma was named to the MVC's All-Freshman team after a late-season surge which saw her average 6.9 points and 6.6 rebounds per game in league play. Lerma started the final 11 games of the year and averaged 9.3 points and 7.9 boards per contest over the final seven outings of 2013-14. This season, she has pulled down 5.3 rebounds per game to go with 5.8 points per tilt.

Sophomore transfer Whitney Tinjum (Washington State) became eligible for the Dec. 18 game against Chicago State and has scored in double figures in each of her first five outings. After games of 10 and 15 points, she broke through with a career-best 28 points against Northern Illinois (Dec. 30) in which she was a perfect 14-for-14 from the free throw line. Tinjum, who is 36-of-41 from the line in just five games, is scoring 17.2 points per game and also averages 7.2 rebounds.

Junior college transfer Sameia Kendall gives the Braves another experienced guard after she earned honorable mention WBCA All-America honors at Johnson County where she helped her team to back-to-back 30-2 seasons. Kendall dishes out a team-best 2.2 assists per outing.

Helping highlight Bradley's largest incoming class since 2001-02 are six freshmen. Joining the Braves in 2014-15 are 5-10 forward Danielle Brewer, 5-8 guard Shareece Burrell, 5-6 guard Madison Dellamuth, 6-0 guard Anneke Schlueter, 6-2 forward Tamyra Sims and 6-3 center Haley Van Cleave.

The only player to start all 13 games this season, Schlueter is scoring 6.1 points per game and was named MVC Newcomer of the Week after a season-best 18 points in the win against Missouri.

Brewer has emerged as the top three-point threat on the squad, making 9-of-22 from long range over the last seven games, and is shooting a team-best 34.4 percent from beyond the arc.

Freshman forward Tamyra Sims missed eight games due to injury, but has returned to the lineup for the last three contests and started each of the last two. Despite playing just five games, she leads the team with 11 blocks and is scoring 7.8 points per outing.

THE COACHES

Michael Brooks (Western State '04) is in his third season as head coach at Bradley and fifth overall with the Braves. He owns a 23-50 (.315) record on The Hilltop and a 28-75 (.272) mark in his fourth season as a collegiate head coach. Brooks was part of both of Bradley's teams which advanced to the Women's Basketball Invitational, serving as an assistant coach for the Braves in 2011-12 and Director of Operations during the 2009-10 campaign. In between his two stints on the Bradley bench, Brooks was co-head coach at Central Methodist University in 2010-11.

Joey Wells (Fresno Pacific '96) is in his first year as head coach at Indiana State and as a collegiate head coach after spending the previous three seasons as an assistant coach with the Sycamores. Wells, who has a 10-3 (.769) record, also served as an assistant coach at Lamar for five years and three seasons at Missouri Western before arriving in Terre Haute, Ind.

Oties Epps (Wisconsin-Stout '02) is in his fourth year as head coach at Evansville after a three-year stint as an assistant coach at Wisconsin. Epps, who was an assistant coach at Cleveland State for four years prior to his tenure in Madison, Wis., is 35-69 (.337) in his time with the Purple Aces. He has led Evansville to an improved overall and conference record in each of his three years.

INDIANA STATE SERIES

Indiana State holds a 43-24 lead in the all-time series and has won five consecutive games against the Braves. Bradley is 7-25 on the road in the series and will be trying for its first win in Terre Haute, Ind., since Jan. 26, 1997.

EVANSVILLE SERIES

Bradley owns a 25-17 edge in the all-time series after the teams split the regular-season series last year. The Braves have won each of the last two road games in the series and the teams have split (10-10) 20 all-time meetings in Evansville. Bradley is 5-1 in its last six road games against the Purple Aces. The Braves have won four of the last five games overall in the series and own a 9-2 record against UE since 2009-10. In fact, Bradley is 10-2 over the last six seasons in regular-season matchups.

LAST TIME OUT

Bradley couldn't keep pace with the top scoring team in the league, falling 80-47 to Drake to conclude an eight-game home stand Sunday. Sophomore Whitney Tinjum scored in double figures for the fifth consecutive game, finishing with team highs of 20 points and eight rebounds. Lizzy Wendell, the MVC's leading scorer, had 23 points to pace five Drake players in double figures.

RUSHING TO THE CENTURY MARK

Sophomore Whitney Tinjum is the eighth player in program history to score in double figures in each of their first five games and is closing in on 100 career points. With 86 points through her first five games (17.2 per game), Tinjum is the first Brave with five consecutive double figure games to open their Bradley careers since Western Illinois transfer Michelle Nason in 1993-94. Tinjum could become just the fifth player in program history to score 100 points in their first six outings as a Brave with 14 points at Indiana State Friday and would be the eighth Bradley player to do so in seven games or less if she reaches the mark Monday at Evansville.

END OF THE HOME STAND

Sunday's game against Drake concluded a school record eight-game home stand. The longest previous home stand in school history was a six-game stretch to conclude the 1993-94 season. Bradley played the third latest home opener in the MVC this season (Nov. 30), with only Missouri State (Dec. 6) and UNI (Dec. 8) opening their home slate later. Despite the late home opener, the Braves have played the second most home games in the MVC this season through Sunday (8) and the eight-game home stand is the second longest in Missouri Valley Conference history behind a nine-game home stand by Northern Iowa during the 1984-85 season.

BLOCK PARTY

Freshman Tamyra Sims missed eight games due to injury, but leads the team with 11 blocks and has three multi-block games. Sims is ninth in the MVC in total blocks, despite playing in just five games this season. She needs two blocks to move into the top 10 in blocks among Bradley freshman and her 2.2 blocks per game would lead the MVC.

CHARITY STRIPE

Sophomore Whitney Tinjum has made a habit of getting to the free throw line, averaging 8.2 free throw attempts per game in her five outings. Tinjum, who had a streak of 18 consecutive made free throws, would lead the league in free throw percentage at 87.8 percent if she had enough games played to qualify. Despite playing in just five contests, Tinjum is sixth in the MVC in made free throws having made 36-of-41 attempts. Senior Michelle Young is second in the league in made free throws (46-for-57) despite not making a trip to the free throw line in any of Bradley's last three games.

WELCOME BACK

For the first time this season Bradley had its entire roster in uniform for the Missouri Valley Conference opener against Northern Iowa (Jan. 2). Sophomore Whitney Tinjum, who is averaging 17.2 points per game, was not eligible until the Dec. 18 contest against Chicago State. Freshman Tamyra Sims, who has scored 7.8 points per outing, returned from an injury which sidelined her for eight games Dec. 30 vs. Northern Illinois. Senior Michelle Young (14.3 ppg) and freshman center Haley Van Cleave both missed the Dec. 30 contest vs. NIU, but returned to the floor against Northern Iowa (Jan. 2). Young had played in 77 consecutive games before missing the

MVC OPENERS

Bradley opened Missouri Valley Conference play at home for the first time since 2011-12 and second time in nine seasons against Northern Iowa on Jan. 2. The Braves are 9-23 (.281) in Missouri Valley Conference openers and 5-9 when opening the league slate at home. Bradley and UNI squared off in Peoria to open Valley play for just the second time in 32 years, with the Braves winning the only previous home conference opener against UNI in 1994-95. The teams are 3-3 when playing each other in the league opener.

STEPPING UP

With leading scorer Michelle Young sidelined for the Dec. 30 game against Northern Illinois (Dec. 30) due to illness, sophomore Whitney Tinjum came up big in her absence with a career-best 28 points. Tinjum scored 16 of Bradley's first 20 points, helping the Braves to a 20-16 lead less than nine minutes into the contest. She finished with 28 points, nine rebounds and a pair of steals.

MAKING THEM COUNT

Sophomore Whitney Tinjum was a perfect 14-for-14 from the free throw line Dec. 30 against Northern Illinois, scoring a career-best 28 points. Her 14 free throws tied for the fifth best single-game total in school history and Tinjum is just the third individual in program history to make 14 or more free throws in a game without a miss. Stephanie White was 15-for-15 from the charity stripe against Western Illinois on Dec. 4, 1998 and Catie O'Leary was 16-for-16 at Wisconsin-Milwaukee on Dec. 4, 2012. Tinjum is 36-for-41 from the line this season (87.8 percent) and is averaging over eight free throw attempts per game. She had a streak of 18 consecutive made free throws between the Dec. 21 game against Bowling Green and the Jan. 2 contest vs. UNI.

HEATING UP

Freshman Danielle Brewer has emerged as Bradley's top outside scoring threat, making 9-of-22 three-point attempts (40.9 percent) over the last seven games. The top three-point shooter on the team, Brewer has made 11-of-32 (34.4 percent) from beyond the arc on the year. She is 10-for-24 from long range (41.6 percent) over the last 10 contests, after a 1-for-8 start from three-point range in her first three collegiate outings. Brewer has averaged 6.0 points, 4.2 rebounds, 1.2 assists and 1.3 steals per game over the last six tilts.

IN THE LINEUP

Freshman Anneke Schlueter is the only Bradley player to start all 13 games this season and is the first Bradley freshman to start their first 13 games on The Hilltop since Michelle Lund in 2008-09. In fact, Schlueter, who is averaging 6.1 points per game and is fourth on the squad with 19 assists, is just the fourth freshman since 1990-91 to start the first 13 games of their career. Joining her and Lund on the exclusive list are Jen Brown in 2003-04 (28 games) and Heather Best in 1995-96 (27 games). Both Lund and Brown were selected to the MVC All-Freshman Team, while Best is a Bradley Hall of Fame member who earned First-Team All-Valley honors as a senior.

ALL-AROUND EFFORT

Senior Michelle Young turned in arguably the best all-around performance of her career in the Dec. 6 win against Missouri, collecting 24 points, six rebounds, five assists and six steals to help highlight the victory. Young was the first Bradley player to collect 20 points, five boards, five assists and at least five steals in an outing since Raisa Taylor against Indiana State on March 5, 2011 and was the first player in the MVC to reach those numbers in a game this season. Young hit a career-high two three-pointers against Missouri in addition to matching a career-best with five assists.

WIN AGAINST THE SEC

Bradley improved to 3-1 against "Power 5" conference opponents all-time at Renaissance Coliseum and has won three straight home games against those squads after the 76-64 victory against Missouri on Dec. 6. The win was Bradley's first against a team from the South-eastern Conference in four attempts. Missouri was the first SEC team to play at Bradley since Dec. 1992.

ON THE MARK

Freshman Anneke Schlueter made 4-of-5 three-pointers and finished with a season-best 18 points to help highlight the Dec. 6 win against Missouri. Schlueter, who entered the game 3-for-20 from three-point range, helped key a 16-0 first-half run for the Braves with a pair of three-pointers and two assists. She helped Bradley hit a season-high nine three-pointers (34.6 percent) for the team's highest three-point field goal total since making 11 at Missouri State on Feb. 8, 2013. The Braves had made a combined 10 three-pointers in the three previous games combined.

POSTSEASON FOES

The Dec. 21 matchup with Bowling Green marked Bradley's sixth game in 10 outings against teams which played in the postseason in 2013-14. The Braves opened the season with four consecutive road games against squads which played in the postseason last year. Bradley's first three opponents this season have combined for a 27-13 (.675) record through Jan. 5 with losses coming against Arkansas, Connecticut, Duke, Kentucky, Mississippi State, Northwestern (2x), Notre Dame, Old Dominion, Texas A&M, South Florida, UALR and Villanova. Including Missouri, Bradley's first seven opponents have a 55-41 (.573) record through Jan. 5 and the 11 non-conference teams have combined for a 79-68 (.537) mark through that same date. Four Bradley non-conference foes own records of 10-5 or better and six of the 11 non-conference games were against teams that are .500 or better through Monday.

BREAKTHROUGH GAME

Sophomore Leti Lerma scored a career-high 21 points on 9-for-12 shooting Nov. 30 against Southeast Missouri State. Lerma is 23-of-48 (48 percent) from the field in her last nine games at Renaissance Coliseum going back to last season and has averaged 7.7 points per game in her last 14 home games. Lerma was the first Brave to score at least 20 points and shoot 75 percent from the field since Katie Yohn at Evansville on March 3, 2013 and she was the first Bradley player to shoot at least 75 percent and finish with 20 points or more in a home game since Kelsey Budd was 9-for-12, including 6-of-7 from three-point range, and had 25 points against Indiana State on Jan. 14, 2012. She has averaged 6.8 points per game at home this season.

BROADWAY STAR

Senior Michelle Young was the star of the show in Bradley's setback at Columbia (Nov. 26) in the first game in program history in New York City for the Braves. Young tied the Bradley single-game scoring record with 38 points against the Lions to match the school record set by Judy Burns against Loyola on Feb. 1, 1983. Young is the third player in program history with three career 30-point games and first to have three outings of at least 30 points since Shelli Braud (1984-88). Burns

and Braud are the only other Braves with three or more career 30-point games. Young is averaging 14.3 points per game this season and 16.1 points per outing over her last nine outings. She has climbed up seven spots on Bradley's career scoring list in her last six games into 22nd.

SCORING BINGE

Michelle Young improved her scoring output in each of the first five games of the season and has scored in double figures in nine of 11 games heading into the first MVC road swing of the year. She has scored 10 or more points in 13 of the last 16 games dating back to last season, averaging 16.7 points per game during that stretch. In the last seven games, Young has climbed 12 spots on Bradley's career scoring list.

GETTING TO THE LINE

Bradley is second in the Missouri Valley Conference in free throw attempts per game, making 21.3 trips to the line each outing and the Braves lead the league in free throw percentage (72.6 percent). BU has more made free throws (201) than two MVC squads have attempted this season through Jan. 4. Senior Michelle Young has helped spearhead the Braves many trips to the line by connecting on 46-of-57 attempts, while sophomore Whitney Tinjum has averaged over eight attempts in her five outings so far. Bradley set school season records for free throws made and attempted last year as a team, while Young led the MVC in free throws made (137 - 4.6 per game). This year, Young is averaging 3.8 made free throws per contest.

ANOTHER RECORD

In addition to tying the Bradley single-game scoring record at Columbia, senior Michelle Young tied the school record for field goals in a contest by making 17 against the Lions. Young matched the school record of 17 field goals set by Karen Anderson vs. St. Xavier on Dec. 14, 1981. Young has climbed into 22nd on Bradley's career scoring list and enters the road swing 37 points from taking over 21st.

NEW FACES

Bradley had four newcomers in the starting lineup at Illinois-Chicago in the season opener, including three freshmen. The Braves had not had four newcomers in the starting five of a season opener since 1984-85 when the starting five consisted of four first-year junior college transfers and one returning junior (Lisa Cech). Freshman Tamya Sims led Bradley in scoring with 12 points and was the first freshman to lead the team in scoring in a season opener since Katie Yohn had 16 points to open the 2009-10 campaign.

STRONG DEBUT

Freshman Tamya Sims, who recently missed eight games due to injury, led Bradley with 12 points, six rebounds and three blocks in the season-opening setback at Illinois-Chicago Nov. 14. Sims was the first Bradley freshman to score in double figures in their debut since Katie Yohn (16 points) and Olivia Allen (15 points) both scored in double figures in the 2009-10 season opener at Northern Illinois. Sims is the 15th Bradley freshmen to score in double figures in their debut since the start of the 1978-79 season and joins Hall of Fame member Val Wancket, Maureen Hogan and Kelly Krumwiede as the only freshmen in school history to collect at least 12 points and six boards in their first games as a Brave.

40TH SEASON

The 2014-15 season is the 40th year of intercollegiate competition for the Bradley Women's Basketball team. The Braves are playing their fifth season at Renaissance Coliseum and this winter's campaign marks the team's 32nd as a member of the Missouri Valley Conference. Head coach Michael Brooks is in his third season as head coach of the Braves and fifth overall with the program.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

With eight newcomers on the roster, including six freshmen, Bradley has arguably the youngest squad in the Missouri Valley Conference. The Braves have six freshmen on a squad for the first time since 2008-09 when Bradley had seven freshmen. With only three upperclassmen, including a league-low one senior, the Braves have the fewest upperclassmen in the MVC. Wichita State, with three seniors and one junior, is the only other Valley team to have fewer than five upperclassmen in 2014-15. Bradley's three upperclassmen are the fewest on the roster since 2002-03 when the Braves had three seniors and no juniors.

FOREVER YOUNG

Senior Michelle Young was an honorable mention All-Missouri Valley Conference selection as a junior after averaging 14.3 points per game in 2013-14. The fifth individual in program history with 400 points and 55 or more steals in a season, her scoring average was the best by a Bradley individual since 2001-02. Young was the ninth player in school history with a 400-point season prior to her senior year and is the team's active career scoring leader with 866 points. Her 429 points in 2013-14 rank as the 10th best scoring output by a Brave prior to their senior season.

ADDING EXPERIENCE

Despite Bradley adding a total of eight newcomers to the squad for 2014-15, the Braves welcomed two experienced players with the addition of a pair of transfers. Junior Sameia Kendall earned honorable mention WBCA All-America honors at Johnson County Community College as a sophomore in 2013-14 after she averaged 12.0 points, 3.8 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 2.1 steals per game and the 5-8 guard helped her junior college to back-to-back 30-2 seasons. Mid-year transfer Whitney Tinjum made her Bradley debut Dec. 18 against Chicago State after sitting out the 2014 Fall semester. The 6-1 forward played in 12 games as a freshman at Washington State. The four-time North Suburban Conference Player of the Year is the career scoring and rebounding leader at Chisago Lakes High School in Minnesota. Bradley has a NCAA Division I transfer on the roster for the fifth

consecutive year and the Braves have had at least one Division I transfer all but one year (2009-10) since the start of 2006-07.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

The Braves will play 15 home games in 2014-15 for the most regular-season home contests since 1984-85 (15). In addition to playing the most regular-season home games in 30 years, Bradley completed the longest home stand in program history during 2014-15. After opening the season with five consecutive road games, the Braves played the final six non-conference games of the year at Renaissance Coliseum to kick off a school-record eight-game home stand to break the previous record of six consecutive home games to conclude the 1993-94 regular season.

FILLING IT UP

Senior Michelle Young scored in double figures a team-high 19 times in 2013-14 and she has scored 10 or more points in 37 of her last 55 games. Bradley's active career scoring leader with 885 points, she is 22nd on BU's all-time scoring chart. Young is the 15th player in program history to score 700 career points before the end of their junior season. Fourteen of the 16 Braves who have scored 1,000 career points had 700 or more points before the start of their senior year. Young had eight 20-point games last year and she was the first non-senior to lead the team in scoring since Katie Yohn did so as a freshman in 2009-10. Young has a chance to become the first Bradley player to lead the team in scoring in back-to-back seasons since Sara Bailey paced the Braves in scoring in 2000-01, 2001-02 and 2002-03. In addition, she could be the first player to lead Bradley in both scoring and steals in consecutive seasons since Shelli Braud in 1986-87 and 1987-88.

WELCOME TO THE PRAIRIE STATE

Bradley's nine newcomers come to Peoria from four states and one foreign country (Germany). The 2014-15 roster has individuals representing seven different states or countries. Bradley has not had seven states or countries represented on a roster since 1998-99 when the Braves had five states and two foreign countries. Freshman Anneke Schleiter (Ulm, Germany) is the first foreign born Bradley player since Hanna Muegge wrapped up her four-year career on The Hilltop in 2011-12. Freshman Danielle Brewer (Coatesville, Ind.), who was home schooled, is the first Brave from the Hoosier State since Amanda Reash in 2000-01. Bradley has a player from Minnesota for the 10th consecutive year, while freshman Tamya Sims gives the Braves a player from Wisconsin for the fifth straight season. A pair of freshmen from Iowa (Shareece Burrell & Haley Van Cleave) give Bradley at least one individual from the Hawkeye State for the seventh consecutive year. Junior college transfer Sameia Kendall (Kansas City, Kan.) is the first BU player from the Sunflower State since Megan Klingler in 2007-08.

WHEN OPPORTUNITY KNOCKS

With eight newcomers on the roster, the new Braves will have plenty of opportunities to show off their abilities in 2014-15. Bradley ranked third in the MVC in scoring at nearly 70 points per game, but the Braves return a league-low 37.9 percent of their scoring from last year. One of three MVC teams to return less than 50 percent of the team's scoring from the previous year, Bradley and Loyola are the only squads in the Valley to have less than 50 percent of the squad's scoring, rebounding and assists from 2013-14.

The home team has won just one of the last six games in the series. Bradley is 18-13 at home against Wichita State.
