- Bradley continues a three-game home stand Friday with a 7 p.m. game against Southern Illinois.
- Friday's game will be Faculty Appreciation Night at Renaissance Coliseum.
- The Braves have won each of the last two home games and will be shooting for the team's first three-game home win streak since midway through the 2012-13 Missouri Valley Conference schedule.
- Bradley has won seven consecutive home games in the series with Southern Illinois.
- Senior Michelle Young was recently named a Senior CLASS Award candidate and enters Friday's outing 17th in school history with 1,017 career points. She needs two points to move into 16th in career scoring and is 16 points from jumping up three spots into 14th.
- Sophomore Whitney Tinjum became the 11th player in program history to score 200 points in their first 17 games on The Hilltop and first to do so since Stephanie White in 1998-99.
- After a season-high 16 points Friday against Loyola, freshman Tamya Sims is averaging 10.3 points and 8.0 rebounds per game in her last three outings.
- Bradley wraps up the three-game home stand Sunday against I-74 rival Illinois State in the final home game of the season.

ABOUT SOUTHERN ILLINOIS

Southern Illinois is fifth in the league standings with an 8-7 league mark and the Salukis are 15-11 overall after dropping a pair of home games last week. One of the top offensive teams in the MVC, SIU is scoring 66.7

points per game to rank second in the Valley and has four individuals scoring nine or more points per game.

The Salukis lead the MVC in rebounding margin at +4.8 per game and SIU ranks third in the Valley in both field goal percentage (.420) and three-point field goal percentage (.341).

SIU, which won the first meeting with Bradley 76-59 in Carbondale, Ill., back on Feb. 1, has won six of its last eight.

Sophomore guard Rishonda Napier leads the Valley in free throw percentage at 87.7 percent and ranks third in the league in both scoring (16.7 ppg) and assists (3.4 apg). Napier is shooting 36 percent from three-point range.

Junior forward Dyana Pierre is shooting a Valley best 55.5 percent from the field and also leads the conference in rebounding (11.5 rpg). Pierre is sixth in the MVC in scoring at 15.0 points per game.

Junior forward Azia Washington is now shooting 40.4 percent from three-point range to go with her 10.3 points and 7.0 rebounds per outing. Junior guard Cartaesha Macklin is scoring 9.3 points per game and ranks fourth in the Valley in assists (3.3 apg).

final two games of the year at Renaissance Coliseum. The Braves are eighth in the league standings, two games out of a tie with Indiana State and Evansville for

The Braves have a new look in 2014-15, with the team returning just three letterwinners from last year's squad in addition to welcoming eight newcomers this season.

Senior Michelle Young, who was an honorable mention All-Missouri Valley Conference pick last year, is among the league leaders in the MVC in scoring at 12.7 points per game and leads the team in steals (2.0 spg). She has scored 15 or more in eight of her last 21 games, averaging 13.2 ppg during that span, which includes a Bradley single-game record 38 points at Columbia (Nov. 26).

Young, who led the MVC in free throws made with 137 as a junior (4.6 per game), was the fifth player in program history with 400 points and 55 or more steals in a season last year. Young is the only senior and one of just three upperclassmen on a roster which features six freshmen.

Junior guard Fantasia Vine made her first start of the year at Columbia and is scoring 7.0 points per contest. She was the most accurate three-point shooter on the team last season, making 36 percent of her shots from beyond the arc, and is averaging 6.8 points, 4.1 rebounds and 3.4 assists per game in her last nine outings.

Sophomore Leti Lerma was named to the MVC's All-Freshman team after a late-season surge which saw her average 6.9 points and 6.6 rebounds per game in league play. Lerma started the final 11 games of the year and averaged 9.3 points and 7.9 boards per contest over the final seven outings of 2013-14. This season, she has pulled down 6.3 rebounds per game to go with 5.4 points per tilt after recently collecting her second career double-double at Evansville (Jan. 12) with 18 points and 15 rebounds.

Sophomore transfer Whitney Tinjum (Washington State) became eligible for the Dec. 18 game against

Chicago State and scored in double figures in each of her first five outings. After games of 10 and 15 points, she broke through with a career-best 28 points against Northern Illinois (Dec. 30) in which she was a perfect 14for-14 from the free throw line. Tinjum, who is 66-of-79 from the line (83.8 percent) in just 17 games, is scoring 12.2 points per game and also averages 6.6 rebounds. Tinjum is the 11th player in program history to score 200 points in their first 17 games as a Brave.

Junior college transfer Sameia Kendall gives the Braves another experienced guard after she earned honorable mention WBCA All-America honors at Johnson County where she helped her team to back-to-back 30-2 seasons. Kendall dishes out 2.1 assists per outing.

Helping highlight Bradley's largest incoming class since 2001-02 are six freshmen. Joining the Braves in 2014-15 are 5-10 forward Danielle Brewer, 5-8 guard Shareece Burrell, 5-6 guard Madison Dellamuth, 6-0 guard Anneke Schlueter, 6-2 forward Tamya Sims and 6-3 center Haley Van Cleave.

One of two players to start at least 21 games, Schlueter is scoring 6.2 points per game and was named MVC Newcomer of the Week after 18 points in the win against Missouri.

Brewer has emerged as the top three-point threat on the squad, making 14-of-38 (36.8 percent) from long range over her last 17 games, and is shooting a teambest 33.3 percent from beyond the arc.

Freshman forward Tamya Sims missed nine games due to injury, but has returned to the lineup and started 12 times this year. Despite playing just 16 games, she

THE COACHES

Michael Brooks (Western State '04) is in his third season as head coach at Bradley and fifth overall with the Braves. He owns a 27-58 (.318) record on The Hilltop and a 32-83 (.278) mark in his fourth season as a collegiate head coach. Brooks was part of both of Bradley's teams which advanced to the Women's Basketball Invitational, serving as an assistant coach for the Braves in 2011-12 and Director of Operations during the 2009-10 campaign. In between his two stints on the Bradley bench, Brooks was co-head coach at Central Methodist University in 2010-11.

Cindy Stein (Illinois '83) is in her second season as head coach at Southern Illinois and 18th overall as a collegiate head coach. The Richwoods High School and Illinois Central College product was head coach at Missouri for 12 seasons and served as head coach at ICC for the 2012-13 season prior to her arrival in Carbondale, Ill. She owns a 20-36 (.357) record with the Salukis and a 302-242 (.555) career coaching record.

SERIES HISTORY

Southern Illinois holds a 43-25 lead in the all-time series after winning the first matchup this season 76-59 in Carbondale, Ill. The teams split the regular-season series last year. The Braves are 13-18 at home in the series and have won seven consecutive home contests against the Salukis. Bradley is 12-2 vs. SIU since 2008-09 and has won 13 of the last 15 regular-season games in the series. Overall, the Braves are 23-7 in the last 30 contests against SIU.

LAST TIME OUT

Freshman Tamya Sims scored 12 of her season-best 16 points in the first half and also pulled down nine rebounds to help Bradley top Loyola 66-57 and complete a season sweep of the Ramblers. Sophomore Whitney Tinjum added 14 points and 10 rebounds off the bench in just her second game as a reserve. Senior Michelle Young added 13 points as Bradley limited Loyola to 35.1 percent shooting and outrebounded the Ramblers 47-31.

STEPPING UP

Freshman Tamya Sims had already made her presence known on the defensive end, averaging nearly two blocks per game, but has made a big impact on the offensive end of late as well. Sims scored a season-high 16 points in Friday's win against Loyola to go with nine rebounds and has averaged 10.3 points and 8.0 rebounds in her last three games. In eight games at Renaissance Coliseum, Sims has averaged 7.8 points and 7.0 rebounds per outing, compared to 6.8 points and 4.8 boards per game in road contests.

FINAL HOME STAND

The weekend home games against Southern Illinois and Illinois State will mark the final home outings for senior Michelle Young. Bradley's leading scorer at 12.7 points per game, Young tied Katie Yohn's Renaissance Coliseum career scoring record Friday against Loyola and has 479 career points at home in her career after a 13-point outing against the Ramblers. Young, who is averaging nearly two steals per game, needs three steals to become just the fourth player in program history to have three seasons with 50 or more steals. Young also holds the Renaissance Coliseum career records for made free throws (113) and steals (87).

TAMING THE SALUKIS

Senior Michelle Young has scored more points against Southern Illinois than any other team during her Bradley career, averaging 13.5 points in eight career outings against the Salukis. Young needs 18 points to become Bradley's all-time leading scorer in the series with Southern Illinois. One of three players in school history with 30 career made free throws against SIU, Young is sixth in program history with 16 career steals in the series.

SHOW-ME MATCHUPS

Freshman Anneke Schlueter scored a season-high 20 points on 7-of-9 shooting, including 4-for-5 from beyond the arc, to highlight the Feb. 13 game at Missouri State. In the two matchups with the Lady Bears, Schlueter averaged 18.0 points on 54.5 percent shooting and connected on 6-of-11 (54.5) three-point attempts. She also turned in an 18-point effort in the win against Missouri earlier this year and averaged 15.3 points, 3.0 rebounds

and 1.8 assists while shooting 47.8 percent (11-for-23) from three-point range along with 48.8 percent (20-for-41) from the field in four games this season against teams from the state of Missouri.

SECOND-HALF TEAM?

Bradley has made a habit of posting a better record in the second half of Missouri Valley Conference play than it did in the first. The Braves have turned in a better mark the second time through the league slate in four consecutive seasons and eight of the last nine overall. In fact, Bradley has matched or exceeded its first-half MVC win total in each of the last 13 years, including this season, dating back to the 2001-02 season when the Braves were 4-5 the first pass through the Valley before going 3-6 in the second half after last Friday's home victory against Loyola matched the team's win total from the first half of the league slate. During the 13-year stretch, Bradley has a 40-77 (.342) in the first half of MVC play compared to a 56-57 (.496) record in the second half of the Valley schedule.

GETTING DEFENSIVE

Bradley has held four of its last eight opponents to 57 points or fewer and the Braves have surrendered 60.4 points per game during that stretch. Opponents have shot 38.4 percent from the field and 25.5 percent from three-point range during the eight-game span compared to 45.1 percent from the field and 31.8 percent from beyond the arc in the first 17 games. In addition to the defensive pressure, the Braves have been crashing the boards of late averaging 38.4 rebounds per game and posting a +4.9 rebounding margin.

SENIOR CLASS CANDIDATE

Senior guard Michelle Young was one of 30 national candidates and the only Missouri Valley Conference player up for the Senior CLASS Award. The third Bradley women's basketball player to be selected as a Senior CLASS Award candidate, she is the first Brave since Jenny Van Kirk in 2009-10. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. Young is Bradley's leading scorer at 12.7 points per game and ranks in the top seven in the league in both free throw percentage and steals. She received the MVC's Leadership and Service Award in February 2014 and has served on Bradley's Student-Athlete Advisory Council each of the past three years in addition to being a part of Bradley's Ethnic Diversity Athletics Committee. A First-Team MVC Scholar-Athlete last year, she has a 3.87 cumulative grade point average and is majoring in elementary education.

YOUNG TOPS 1.000

Senior Michelle Young is 17th in career scoring at Bradley with 1,017 career points after netting her 1,000th-career point at Missouri State back on Feb. 13. The first player to reach 1,000 career points since Katie Yohn topped the mark in 2011-12, Young is two points from passing Carol Baresch for 16th and needs just 16 points to move up three spots into 14th. With at least five games remaining on the schedule, she would have 1,080 career points after Bradley's first game in the MVC Tournament at her current pace, which would rank 13th in school history.

SLOW & STEADY

Bradley's 58-55 victory at Illinois State (Jan. 30) gave Bradley back-to-back wins at Redbird Arena and the Braves scored under 60 points in consecutive victories for the first time since Nov. 24, 2000 and Nov. 30, 2000. In fact, the Braves had never won back-to-back conference games when scoring fewer than 60 points.

ROAD SWING SUCCESS

Bradley won two of three outings during the recently completed three-game road swing (Jan. 25 through Feb. 1). In addition to the first road wins of the year, the Braves won twice on a three-game MVC road swing for the first time since 2009-10. Bradley had not won back-to-back outings at Redbird Arena since winning four consecutive road games against Illinois State between the 1991-92 and 1994-95 seasons.

LACK OF CHARITY

Bradley is scoring a league-high 23.7 percent of its points at the free throw line, but the Braves made just four trips to the charity stripe in the 58-55 victory at Illinois State (Jan. 30) and have averaged just 14.0 free throw attempts in the last eight games compared to an average of 13.4 made free throws per game for the season. The four free throw attempts in a game were the fewest for Bradley since three attempts at Indiana State on March 1, 2009 and the Braves won a game when taking fewer than five free throws for the first time since Feb. 24, 1979. While Bradley has gotten to the line fewer during the last eight games, it has made the best of its opportunities by shooting an impressive 78.6 percent from the stripe during that span.

CLOSE CALLS

The Jan. 30 58-55 victory at Illinois State was Bradley's second straight victory by three points or less. The Braves had not won back-to-back games by three points or less since March of 2010 and the consecutive road wins by three points or fewer marked the first time in program history Bradley won back-to-back road games by three or less. Three of Bradley's last eight games have had a final margin of six points or less and the Braves have won all three outings. Last season Bradley tied a school record with six wins by five points or less.

GRINDING IT OUT

Bradley held on to edge Loyola 46-45 on Jan. 25 for the first Missouri Valley Conference win of the year for the Braves. The game against the Ramblers was the lowest scoring regular-season Missouri Valley Conference game since Indiana State topped Illinois State 47-44 on Jan. 12, 2014 and Bradley's 46 points were the fewest in a win in regular-season conference play since Creighton defeated Evansville 42-41 on Feb. 13, 2010. The Braves earned just the fifth victory in program history when scoring 50 points or less. The victory was the first for Bradley with 50 points or fewer since a 50-32 win at Illinois State on Feb. 21, 1979.

SWAT TEAM

Bradley is among the conference leaders in blocks, averaging 3.4 rejections per game in league play, thanks in part to the defensive efforts of freshman Tamya Sims, who has had three or more blocks in three of her last eight games. Her four blocks at Loyola (Jan. 25) were the most by a Bradley player since MacKenzie Westcott had five rejections at UNI on Jan. 20, 2012. With 31 rejections, Sims has the fifth best block total by a Bradley freshman and most by a frosh on The Hilltop since Sonya Harris had 34 in 2007-08. She is averaging 1.8 blocks per game in league play and her 24 swats against Valley foes are better than two squads this season. Despite missing nine contests due to injury, her 31 blocks overall this season rank as the third highest total in the Valley this year.

DROPPING DIMES

Junior Fantasia Vine dished out a career-best nine assists in the season's first meeting with Missouri State (Jan. 18) in addition to matching a season-high with 14 points in her first start since Dec. 21. Vine, who drew a charge with 0.9 seconds left to help Bradley seal a 46-45 win at Loyola Jan. 25, has averaged 6.8 points, 4.1

rebounds, 3.4 assists and 1.1 steals per game in her last nine outings. Her nine assists against the Bears were the most by a Brave since Kelsey Budd had nine assists against Western Illinois on Dec. 21, 2011 and she was the first Bradley player with at least 14 points, six rebounds and nine or more assists since Libby Magnuson (14 points, six rebounds & 10 assists) vs. Creighton on Dec. 31, 2005.

CHARITY STRIPE

Bradley has scored a large percentage of its points at the free throw line, mainly due to the team's shooting ability from the charity stripe. The Braves rank second in the league in free throw percentage at 73.1 percent and have made 75.5 percent during MVC play. Senior Michelle Young is second in the MVC in free throw percentage at 80.6 percent and she ranks fifth in the league with 75 made free throws. With 259 made free throws in her career, Young is 10th in school history in made free throws. She is six makes from the charity stripe from jumping up three spots into seventh in Bradley history.

CRASHING THE BOARDS

Sophomore Leti Lerma has had 11 or more rebounds in three of her last 10 games and is averaging 7.5 boards per game during that stretch. Recently, Lerma was the first Bradley player with consecutive games with 10 or more rebounds since Catie O'Leary opened the 2013-14 season with 10+ rebounds in the first two games and is the first Brave to do so in back-to-back MVC games since Katie Yohn to end the 2012-13 regular season. In addition, Lerma was the first underclassmen with consecutive 10+ rebound games since Sonya Harris as a sophomore in March 2009. In MVC play, Lerma has averaged 4.7 points on 45.8 percent shooting and 7.2 rebounds per game, compared to 6.2 points on 43.1 percent shooting and 5.3 rebounds per tilt in non-conference action. She snagged a season-best 15 boards at Evansville (Jan. 12) to go with a team-high 18 points for her second career double-double. Her 18 point and 15 board effort, while making 9-of-14 from the field, at Evansville made her the first Bradley player with at least 15 points and 15 rebounds while shooting over 50 percent from the field since Monica Rogers had 26 points and 16 rebounds against Drake on Feb. 21, 2009.

SPREADING THE WEALTH

For the first time in program history, Bradley has had 12 players hit at least one three-pointer. In fact, the Braves are one of just three teams in the MVC (Drake & Missouri State) to have 11 individuals with at least one three-pointer this season and Bradley has more than 10 individuals with at least one make from beyond the arc for the first time since 2012-13.

TAKING ADVANTAGE

Sophomore Whitney Tinjum has made a habit of getting to the free throw line, averaging 4.6 free throw attempts per game in her 17 outings. Tinjum, who had a streak of 18 consecutive made free throws, would rank second in the league in free throw percentage at 83.5 percent if she had enough games played to qualify. Despite playing in just 17 contests, Tinjum is eighth in the MVC in made free throws having made 66-of-79 attempts. Senior Michelle Young (75-for-93) is attempting 3.9 trips to the line per game after leading the league in free throw attempts last season. Young is second in the Valley in free throw percentage at 80.6 percent. In addition, freshman Tamya Sims made her first 12 free throws of the year, before her first miss from the line against Wichita State (Jan. 16), while junior Fantasia Vine is an impressive 86.8 percent (33-for-38) at the line this year.

WELCOME BACK

For the first time this season Bradley had its entire roster in uniform for the Missouri Valley Conference opener against Northern Iowa (Jan. 2). Sophomore Whitney Tinjum, who is averaging 12.2 points per game, was not eligible until the Dec. 18 contest against Chicago State. Freshman Tamya Sims, who has scored 7.3 points per outing, returned from an injury which sidelined her for eight games Dec. 30 vs. Northern Illinois. Senior Michelle Young (12.7 ppg) and freshman center Haley Van Cleave both missed the Dec. 30 contest vs. NIU, but returned to the floor against Northern Iowa (Jan. 2). Young had played in 77 consecutive games before missing the game against NIU due to illness and came off the bench vs. UNI. The Braves have had their full roster in uniform for a total of six games this season.

SCORING BINGE

Sophomore Whitney Tinjum has been on a tear since making her debut against Chicago State, scoring in double figures in her first five games and collecting eight or more in 14 of 17 outings. Tinjum is the eighth player in school history to score 10 or more points in each of their first five games on The Hilltop and first to do so since Western Illinois transfer Michelle Nason scored in double figures in each of her first eight outings in 1993-94.

With leading scorer Michelle Young sidelined for the Dec. 30 game against Northern Illinois (Dec. 30) due to illness, sophomore Whitney Tinjum came up big in her absence with a career-best 28 points. Tinjum scored 16 of Bradley's first 20 points, helping the Braves to a 20-16 lead less than nine minutes into the contest. She finished with 28 points, nine rebounds and a pair of steals.

MAKING THEM COUNT

Sophomore Whitney Tinjum was a perfect 14-for-14 from the free throw line Dec. 30 against Northern Illinois, scoring a career-best 28 points. Her 14 free throws tied for the fifth best single-game total in school history and Tinjum is just the third individual in program history to make 14 or more free throws in a game without a miss. Stephanie White was 15-for-15 from the charity stripe against Western Illinois on Dec. 4, 1998 and Catie O'Leary was 16-for-16 at Wisconsin-Milwaukee on Dec. 4, 2012. Tinjum is 66-for-79 from the line this season (83.5 percent) and is averaging almost five free throw attempts per game. She had a streak of 18 consecutive made free throws between the Dec. 21 game against Bowling Green and the Jan. 2 contest vs. UNI.

HEATING UP

Freshman Danielle Brewer has emerged as Bradley's top outside scoring threat, making 14-of-38 three-point attempts (36.8 percent) over her last 19 games and is 4-for-6 from three-point territory in her last two home games. The top three-point shooter on the team, Brewer

has made 16-of-48 (33.3 percent) from beyond the arc on the year. She is 15-for-40 from long range (37.5 percent) over the last 22 contests, after a 1-for-8 start from three-point range in her first three collegiate outings.

IN THE LINEUP

Freshman Anneke Schlueter is one of two Bradlev players to start at least 21 games this season, appearing in the starting lineup in each of the first 14 games of her career before coming off the bench at Evansville (Jan. 12). Schlueter was the first Bradley freshman to start their first 14 games on The Hilltop since Michelle Lund in 2008-09. In fact, Schlueter, who is averaging 6.2 points per game and leads the squad with 19 three-pointers, is just the fourth freshmen since 1990-91 to start the first 14 games of their career. Joining her and Lund on the exclusive list are Jen Brown in 2003-04 (28 games) and Heather Best in 1995-96 (27 games). Both Lund and Brown were selected to the MVC All-Freshman Team, while Best is a Bradley Hall of Fame member who earned First-Team All-Valley honors as a senior. Schlueter's 21 starts are the seventh most by a freshman since 1984-

Senior Michelle Young turned in arguably the best all-around performance of her career in the Dec. 6 win against Missouri, collecting 24 points, six rebounds, five assists and six steals to help highlight the victory. Young was the first Bradley player to collect 20 points, five boards, five assists and at least five steals in an outing since Raisa Taylor against Indiana State on March 5, 2011 and was the first player in the MVC to reach those numbers in a game this season. Young hit a careerhigh two three-pointers against Missouri in addition to matching a career-best with five assists.

WIN AGAINST THE SEC

Bradley improved to 3-1 against "Power 5" conference opponents all-time at Renaissance Coliseum and has won three straight home games against those squads after the 76-64 victory against Missouri on Dec. 6. The win was Bradley's first against a team from the Southeastern Conference in four attempts. Missouri was the first SEC team to play at Bradley since Dec. 1992.

POSTSEASON FOES

The Dec. 21 matchup with Bowling Green marked Bradley's sixth game in 10 outings against teams which played in the postseason in 2013-14 and the Braves have now played a total of 12 games against teams which were in the postseason last year. Bradley opened the season with four consecutive road games against squads which played in the postseason last year. Bradley's first three opponents this season have combined for a 53-27 (.663) record through Feb. 23 with Arkansas, Connecticut, Duke, Kentucky, Mississippi State, Northwestern (2x), Notre Dame, Texas, Texas AGM, South Florida, West Virginia and Villanova combining for 12 of the 27 losses. Bradley's first eight opponents have a 119-93 (.561) record through Tuesday and six Bradley non-conference foes own records of 15-12 or better.

BREAKTHROUGH GAME

Sophomore Leti Lerma scored a career-high 21 points on 9-for-12 shooting Nov. 30 against Southeast Missouri State. Lerma is 33-of-65 (50.8 percent) from the field in her last 13 games at Renaissance Coliseum going back to last season and has averaged 7.1 points per game in her last 17 home games. Lerma was the first Brave to score at least 20 points and shoot 75 percent from the field since Katie Yohn at Evansville on March 3, 2013 and she was the first Bradley player to shoot at least 75 percent and finish with 20 points or more in a home game since Kelsey Budd was 9-for-12, including 6-of-7 from three-point range, and had 25 points against Indiana State on Jan. 14, 2012.

BROADWAY STAR

Senior Michelle Young was the star of the show in Bradley's setback at Columbia (Nov. 26) in the first game in program history in New York City for the Braves. Young tied the Bradley single-game scoring record with 38 points against the Lions to match the school record set by Judy Burns against Loyola on Feb. 1, 1983. Young is the third player in program history with three career 30-point games and first to have three outings of at least 30 points since Shelli Braud (1984-88). Burns and Braud are the only other Braves with three or more career 30-point games.

DOUBLE DIGITS

Michelle Young improved her scoring output in each of the first five games of the season and has scored in double figures in 17 of 24 games heading into Friday's home game against Southern Illinois. She has scored 10 or more points in 21 of the last 26 games dating back to last season, averaging 13.8 points per game during that

stretch. Her 48 career double-digit scoring efforts are 15th most in school history.

ANOTHER RECORD

In addition to tying the Bradley single-game scoring record at Columbia, senior Michelle Young tied the school record for field goals in a contest by making 17 against the Lions. Young matched the school record of 17 field goals set by Karen Anderson vs. St. Xavier on Dec. 14, 1981.

YOUNG GUNS

Bradley had four freshmen in the starting lineup at 18th-ranked DePaul (Nov. 18) with freshman Madison Dellamuth making her first career start and joining fellow freshmen Danielle Brewer, Anneke Schlueter and Tamya Sims in the starting five. The game against the Blue Demons marked the first time in program history four freshmen started a game for the Braves. In fact, Bradley had not had four freshmen start at least one game in the same season since 1988-89. Schlueter is the first freshmen to start the first 14 games of their careers since Michelle Lund made 23 consecutive starts as a frosh to open the 2008-09 campaign. Freshmen have accounted for 46 percent of the team's starts this season and 45 percent of the minutes played, while upperclassmen have accounted for 33 percent of the starts and 33 percent of the minutes through 25 games.

STRONG DEBUT

Freshman Tamya Sims, who recently missed nine games due to injury, led Bradley with 12 points, six rebounds and three blocks in the season-opening setback at Illinois-Chicago Nov. 14. Sims was the first Bradley freshman to score in double figures in their debut since Katie Yohn (16 points) and Olivia Allen (15 points) both scored in double figures in the 2009-10 season opener at Northern Illinois. Sims is the 15th Bradley freshmen to score in double figures in their debut since the start of the 1978-79 season and joins Hall of Fame member Val Wancket, Maureen Hogan and Kelly Krumwiede as the only freshmen in school history to collect at least 12 points and six boards in their first games as a Brave.

40TH SERSON

The 2014-15 season is the 40th year of intercollegiate competition for the Bradley Women's Basketball team. The Braves are playing their fifth season at Renaissance Coliseum and this winter's campaign marks the team's 32nd as a member of the Missouri Valley Conference. Head coach Michael Brooks is in his third season as head coach of the Braves and fifth overall with the program.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

With eight newcomers on the roster, including six freshmen, Bradley has arguably the youngest squad in the Missouri Valley Conference. The Braves have six freshmen on a squad for the first time since 2008-09 when Bradley had seven freshmen. With only three upperclassmen, including a league-low one senior, the Braves have the fewest upperclassmen in the MVC. Wichita State, with three seniors and one junior, is the only other Valley team to have fewer than five upperclassmen in 2014-15. Bradley's three upperclassmen are the fewest on the roster since 2002-03 when the Braves had three seniors and no juniors.

ADDING EXPERIENCE

Despite Bradley adding a total of eight newcomers to the squad for 2014-15, the Braves welcomed two experienced players with the addition of a pair of transfers. Junior Sameia Kendall earned honorable mention WBCA All-America honors at Johnson County Community College as a sophomore in 2013-14 after she averaged 12.0 points, 3.8 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 2.1 steals per game and the 5-8 guard helped her junior college to back-to-back 30-2 seasons. Mid-year transfer Whitney Tinjum made her Bradley debut Dec. 18 against Chicago State after sitting out the 2014 Fall semester. The 6-1 forward played in 12 games as a freshman at Washington State. The four-time North Suburban Conference Player of the Year is the career scoring and rebounding leader at Chisago Lakes High School in Minnesota. Bradley has a NCAA Division I transfer on the roster for the fifth consecutive year and the Braves have had at least one Division I transfer all but one year (2009-10) since the start of 2006-07.

FILLING IT UP

Senior Michelle Young scored in double figures a team-high 19 times in 2013-14 and she has scored 10 or more points in 45 of her last 67 games. Bradley's active career scoring leader with 1,017 points, she is 17th on BU's all-time scoring chart. Young had eight 20-point games last year and she was the first non-senior to lead the team in scoring since Katie Yohn did so as a freshman in 2009-10. Young has a chance to become the first Bradley player to lead the team in scoring in back-to-back seasons since Sara Bailey paced the Braves in scoring in 2000-01, 2001-02 and 2002-03. In addition, she could be the first player to lead Bradley in both scoring and steals in consecutive seasons since Shelli Braud in 1986-87 and 1987-88.

WELCOME TO THE PRAIRIE STATE

Bradley's nine newcomers come to Peoria from four states and one foreign country (Germany). The 2014-15 roster has individuals representing seven different states or countries. Bradley has not had seven states or countries represented on a roster since 1998-99 when the Braves had five states and two foreign countries. Freshman Anneke Schlueter (Ulm, Germany) is the first foreign born Bradley player since Hanna Muegge wrapped up her four-year career on The Hilltop in 2011-12. Freshman Danielle Brewer (Coatesville, Ind.), who was home schooled, is the first Brave from the Hoosier State since Amanda Reash in 2000-01. Bradley has a player from Minnesota for the 10th consecutive year, while freshman Tamya Sims gives the Braves a player from Wisconsin for the fifth straight season. A pair of freshmen from Iowa (Shareece Burrell & Haley Van Cleave) give Bradley at least one individual from the Hawkeye State for the seventh consecutive year. Junior college transfer Sameia Kendall (Kansas City, Kan.) is the first BU player from the Sunflower State since Megan Klingler in 2007-08.

WHEN OPPORTUNITY KNOCKS

With eight newcomers on the roster, the new Braves will have plenty of opportunities to show off their abilities in 2014-15. Bradley ranked third in the MVC in scoring at nearly 70 points per game, but the Braves return a league-low 37.9 percent of their scoring from last year. One of three MVC teams to return less than 50 percent of the team's scoring from the previous year, Bradley and Loyola are the only squads in the Valley to have less than 50 percent of the squad's scoring, rebounding and assists from 2013-14.

Bradley closes out the home portion of the schedule Sunday afternoon looking to complete a season sweep of I-74 rival Illinois State after topping the Redbirds 58-55 in Normal, Ill., back on Jan. 30. The Redbirds lead the all-time series 50-27, but the Braves have won three straight games in the series for the first time since the two teams have been members of the Missouri Valley Conference and Bradley has won four straight regular-season matchups. The Braves are 15-21 at home in the series and have won each of the last two home games against Illinois State.
