- Bradley closes out a two-game home stand Sunday with a 2 p.m. game against Evansville.
- The Braves will host a free post-game clinic for all children (ages 6-14) immediately following Sunday's contest at Renaissance Coliseum.
- Bradley is trying to snap a nine-game home losing skid and looking for its first Missouri Valley Conference home victory of the year.
- The Braves are 14-6 at home in the series with Evansville and own a 5-1 home mark in the last six meetings with the Purple Aces in Peoria.
- Senior Michelle Young was recently named a Senior CLASS Award candidate and is closing in on 1,000 career points. Bradley's leader scorer at 13.4 points per game, she is tied for 17th all-time with 980 career points.
- Young broke into Bradley's career top 10 in free throws made Friday against Indiana State and is tied for 10th with 253 career free throws.
- Sophomore Whitney Tinjum has scored in double figures in four consecutive games, scoring 14.3 points per game during that stretch.
- After Sunday's outing vs. Evansville, Bradley opens a two-game Valley road swing Friday with a 7 p.m. game at Missouri State.

ABOUT EVANSVILLE

Evansville is in a three-way tie with Indiana State and Southern Illinois at 5-5 for fifth in the MVC standings after suffering a 70-58 loss at Loyola Friday. The Purple Aces have lost four straight games. Sunday's contest is UE's seventh MVC road game of the year as the Purple

Aces play five of the final seven games of the year at home.

UE leads the MVC in three-point field goal percentage at 37 percent and the Aces connect on 6.5 triples per game to rank third in the league. One of the top defensive units in the Valley, Evansville is fourth in the conference in scoring defense (64.2 ppg) and commit just 14.5 turnovers per outing.

Sophomore guard Sara Dickey averages a league-leading 37.9 minutes per game and is second in the MVC in scoring at 18.6 points per game. She is shooting 34 percent from three-point range and also averages 2.7 assists and 1.6 steals.

Senior forward Mallory Ladd has missed the last five games, but is averaging 15.3 points and 7.6 boards per game, while shooting 43 percent from beyond the arc and 86 percent at the free throw line.

Senior guard Khristian Hart adds 10.9 points per game and has shot 40.5 percent from three-point territory. Sophomore forward Sasha Robinson is the team's top rebounder at 8.4 rebounds per game to rank fourth in the MVC.

ABOUT THE BRAVES

Bradley has won two of its last four games and is eighth in the MVC standings with a 2-8 league record. The Braves look to end a two-game skid after suffering a

65-55 home loss to Indiana State Friday at Renaissance Coliseum and will try to snap a nine-game home losing skid.

The Braves have a new look in 2014-15, with the team returning just three letterwinners from last year's squad in addition to welcoming eight newcomers this season.

Senior Michelle Young, who was an honorable mention All-Missouri Valley Conference pick last year, is among the league leaders in the MVC in scoring at 13.4 points per game and leads the team in steals (2.2 spg). She has scored 15 or more in eight of her last 17 games, averaging 14.1 ppg during that span, which includes a Bradley single-game record 38 points at Columbia (Nov. 26).

Young, who led the MVC in free throws made with 137 as a junior (4.6 per game), was the fifth player in program history with 400 points and 55 or more steals in a season last year. Young is the only senior and one of just three upperclassmen on a roster which features six freshmen.

Junior guard Fantasia Vine made her first start of the year at Columbia and is scoring 6.8 points per contest. She was the most accurate three-point shooter on the team last season, making 36 percent of her shots from beyond the arc, and is averaging 8.4 points, 5.4 rebounds and 4.4 assists per game in her last five outings.

Sophomore Leti Lerma was named to the MVC's All-Freshman team after a late-season surge which saw her average 6.9 points and 6.6 rebounds per game in league play. Lerma started the final 11 games of the year and averaged 9.3 points and 7.9 boards per contest over the final seven outings of 2013-14. This season, she has pulled down 6.4 rebounds per game to go with 6.0 points per tilt after recently collecting her second career double-double at Evansville (Jan. 12) with 18 points and 15 rebounds.

Sophomore transfer Whitney Tinjum (Washington State) became eligible for the Dec. 18 game against Chicago State and scored in double figures in each of

her first five outings. After games of 10 and 15 points, she broke through with a career-best 28 points against Northern Illinois (Dec. 30) in which she was a perfect 14-for-14 from the free throw line. Tinjum, who is 55-of-66 from the line (83.3 percent) in just 13 games, is scoring 13.0 points per game and also averages 6.9 rebounds. Tinjum is the 12th player in program history to score 100 points in their first eight games as a Brave.

Junior college transfer Sameia Kendall gives the Braves another experienced guard after she earned honorable mention WBCA All-America honors at Johnson County where she helped her team to back-to-back 30-2 seasons. Kendall dishes out a team-best 2.2 assists per outing.

Helping highlight Bradley's largest incoming class since 2001-02 are six freshmen. Joining the Braves in 2014-15 are 5-10 forward Danielle Brewer, 5-8 guard Shareece Burrell, 5-6 guard Madison Dellamuth, 6-0 guard Anneke Schlueter, 6-2 forward Tamyia Sims and 6-3 center Haley Van Cleave.

One of two players to start at least 17 games, Schlueter is scoring 6.2 points per game and was named MVC Newcomer of the Week after a season-best 18 points in the win against Missouri.

Brewer has emerged as the top three-point threat on the squad, making 10-of-30 from long range over her last 13 games, and is shooting a team-best 30 percent from beyond the arc.

Freshman forward Tamyia Sims missed eight games due to injury, but has returned to the lineup for the last 11 contests and started 11 times this year. Despite

playing just 13 games, she is second in the MVC with 28 blocks (2.2 per game) and is scoring 6.5 points per outing.

THE COACHES

Michael Brooks (Western State '04) is in his third season as head coach at Bradley and fifth overall with the Braves. He owns a 25-56 (.309) record on The Hilltop and a 30-81 (.270) mark in his fourth season as a collegiate head coach. Brooks was part of both of Bradley's teams which advanced to the Women's Basketball Invitational, serving as an assistant coach for the Braves in 2011-12 and Director of Operations during the 2009-10 campaign. In between his two stints on the Bradley bench, Brooks was co-head coach at Central Methodist University in 2010-11.

Oties Epps (Wisconsin-Stout '02) is in his fourth year as head coach at Evansville after a three-year stint as an assistant coach at Wisconsin. Epps, who was an assistant coach at Cleveland State for four years prior to his tenure in Madison, Wis., is 39-73 (.348) in his time with the Purple Aces. He has led Evansville to an improved overall and conference record in each of his three years.

SERIES HISTORY

Bradley holds a 25-18 advantage in the all-time series with Evansville, which dates back to the Purple Aces joining the Missouri Valley Conference for the 1994-95 season. The Braves have won four of the last six in the series, but the Purple Aces have won the last two meetings including the matchup earlier this season in Evansville, Ind. Bradley is 14-6 at home in the series and has won five of the last six home games vs. UE. Evansville won last year's matchup in Peoria, however.

LAST TIME OUT

Bradley opened a two-game home stand with a 65-55 loss to Indiana State Friday. The Braves outrebounded the Sycamores 44-31, but 27 turnovers proved to be the undoing for Bradley with Indiana State owning a 24-13 edge in points off those miscues. Senior Michelle Young scored a team-high 14 points on 6-for-11 shooting, while Whitney Tinjum and Fantasia Vine each joined her in double figures with 10 points each. Bradley shot just 37 percent from the field and was 1-for-17 from three-point range.

SECOND-HALF TEAM

Bradley has made a habit of posting a better record in the second half of Missouri Valley Conference play than it did in the first. The Braves have turned in a better mark the second time through the league slate in four consecutive seasons and eight of the last nine overall. In fact, Bradley has matched or exceeded its first-half MVC win total in each of the last 12 years dating back to the 2001-02 season when the Braves were 4-5 the first pass through the Valley before going 3-6 in the second half. During the 12-year stretch, Bradley was 38-70 (.352) in the first half of MVC play compared to a 54-54 (.500) record in the second half.

SENIOR CLASS CANDIDATE

Senior guard Michelle Young is one of 30 national candidates and the only Missouri Valley Conference player up for the Senior CLASS Award. The third Bradley women's basketball player to be selected as a Senior CLASS Award candidate, she is the first Brave since Jenny Van Kirk in 2009-10. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School®, the Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities. Young is Bradley's leading scorer at 13.4 points per game and ranks in the top five in the league in both free throw percentage and steals. She received the MVC's Leadership and Service Award in February 2014 and has served on Bradley's Student-Athlete Advisory Council each of the past three years in addition to being a part of Bradley's Ethnic Diversity Athletics Committee. A First-Team MVC Scholar-Athlete last year, she has a 3.87 cumulative grade point average and is majoring in elementary education.

CLOSING IN ON 1,000

Senior Michelle Young moved into a tie with Andrea McAllister for 17th in career scoring at Bradley with 980 career points after Friday's 14-point effort against Indiana State. Young is poised to become the 17th player in program history to reach 1,000 career points and first to reach the milestone since Katie Yohn in 2011-12, needing 20 points to reach the mark. In addition to approaching the 1,000-point mark, Young needs 27 points to break Yohn's Renaissance Coliseum career scoring record of 479 points.

SLOW & STEADY

Last Friday's 58-55 victory at Illinois State gave Bradley back-to-back wins at Redbird Arena and the Braves scored under 60 points in consecutive victories for the first time since Nov. 24, 2000 and Nov. 30, 2000. In fact, the Braves had never won back-to-back conference games when scoring fewer than 60 points. The Braves have averaged 54.5 points per game in the last four games compared to 52.1 points per outing in MVC play.

ROAD SWING SUCCESS

Bradley won two of three outings during the recently completed three-game road swing. In addition to the first road wins of the year, the Braves won twice on a three-game MVC road swing for the first time since 2009-10. Bradley had not won back-to-back outings at Redbird Arena since winning four consecutive road games against Illinois State between the 1991-92 and 1994-95 seasons.

LACK OF CHARITY

Bradley is scoring a league-high 23.7 percent of its points at the free throw line, but the Braves made just four trips to the charity stripe in the 58-55 victory at Illinois State (Jan. 30) and have averaged just 12.0 free throw attempts in the last four games. The four free throw attempts in a game were the fewest for Bradley since three attempts at Indiana State on March 1, 2009 and the Braves won a game when taking fewer than five free throws for the first time since Feb. 24, 1979. While Bradley has gotten to the line fewer during the last four games, they have made the best of their opportunities by shooting 77.1 percent from the stripe during that span.

CLOSE CALLS

Last week's 58-55 victory at Illinois State was Bradley's second straight victory by three points or less. The Braves had not won back-to-back games by three

points or less since March of 2010 and the consecutive road wins by three points or fewer marked the first time in program history Bradley won back-to-back road games by three or less.

GRINDING IT OUT

Bradley held on to edge Loyola 46-45 on Jan. 25 for the first Missouri Valley Conference win of the year for the Braves. The game against the Ramblers was the lowest scoring regular-season Missouri Valley Conference game since Indiana State topped Illinois State 47-44 on Jan. 12, 2014 and Bradley's 46 points were the fewest in a win in regular-season conference play since Creighton defeated Evansville 42-41 on Feb. 13, 2010. The Braves earned just the fifth victory in program history when scoring 50 points or less. The victory was the first for Bradley with 50 points or fewer since a 50-32 win at Illinois State on Feb. 21, 1979.

SWAT TEAM

Bradley is fourth in blocks per game in MVC play at 4.0 rejections per game, thanks in part to the defensive efforts of freshman Tamyia Sims, who has had three or more blocks in three of the last five games. Her four blocks at Loyola were the most by a Bradley player since MacKenzie Westcott had five rejections at UNI on Jan. 20, 2012. With 28 rejections, Sims has the fifth best block total by a Bradley freshman and most by a frosh on The Hilltop since Sonya Harris had 34 in 2007-08. She currently leads the MVC with 2.1 blocks per game in league play and her 21 swats against Valley foes are better than two squads this season. Despite missing eight contests due to injury, her 28 blocks overall this season rank as the second highest total in the Valley this year.

DROPPING DIMES

Junior Fantasia Vine dished out a career-best nine assists against Missouri State (Jan. 18) in addition to matching a season-high with 14 points in her first start since Dec. 21. Vine, who drew a charge with 0.9 seconds left to help Bradley seal a 46-45 win at Loyola Jan. 25, has averaged 8.4 points, 5.4 rebounds and 4.4 assists and 1.6 steals per game in her last five outings. Her nine assists against the Bears were the most by a Brave since Kelsey Budd had nine assists against Western Illinois on Dec. 21, 2011 and she was the first Bradley player with at least 14 points, six rebounds and nine or more assists since Libby Magnuson (14 points, six rebounds & 10 assists) vs. Creighton on Dec. 31, 2005.

Bradley has scored a large percentage of its points at the free throw line, mainly due to the team's shooting ability from the charity stripe. The Braves are second in the league in free throw percentage at 72.1 percent and have made 73.7 percent during MVC play. Senior Michelle Young is third in the MVC in free throw percentage at 79.3 percent and she ranks third in the league with 69 made free throws. With 253 made free throws in her career after making a pair Friday against Indiana State, Young moved into a tie with Jenn Jolley (1997-2001) for 10th in school history in career made free throws. Young is seven made free throws behind Catie O'Leary (260) for ninth in Bradley history.

CRASHING THE BOARDS

Sophomore Leti Lerma has had 11 or more rebounds in three of her last six games and is averaging 8.7 boards per game during that stretch. Recently, Lerma was the first Bradley player with consecutive games with 10 or more rebounds since Catie O'Leary opened the 2013-14 season with 10+ rebounds in the first two games and is the first Brave to do so in back-to-back MVC games since Katie Yohn to end the 2012-13 regular season. In addition, Lerma was the first underclassmen with consecutive 10+ rebound games since Sonya Harris as a sophomore in March 2009. In MVC play, Lerma has averaged 5.7 points on 46.9 percent shooting and 7.8 rebounds per game, compared to 6.2 points on 43.1 percent shooting and 5.3 rebounds per tilt in non-conference action.

RACING TO THE CENTURY MARK

Sophomore Whitney Tinjum became the 12th player in program history to score 100 points in the first eight games of their Bradley career against Wichita State (Jan. 16). Tinjum, who was the eighth Brave to score in double figures in each of their first five outings on The Hilltop, is averaging 13.0 points per game and a team-high 11.6 points per game in Valley play. She was the first Brave with five consecutive double figure games to open their Bradley careers since Western Illinois transfer Michelle Nason in 1993-94 and first to reach 100 points in their first eight games since Missouri transfer Stephanie White in 1998-99 (8 games).

ON THE REBOUND

Sophomore Leti Lerma has grabbed seven or more rebounds in six of her last 10 games and snagged a season-best 15 boards at Evansville (Jan. 12) to go with a team-high 18 points for her second career double-double. Her 18 point and 15 board effort, while making 9-of-14 from the field, at Evansville made her the first Bradley player with at least 15 points and 15 rebounds while shooting over 50 percent from the field since Monica Rogers had 26 points and 16 rebounds against Drake on Feb. 21, 2009.

SPREADING THE WEALTH

For the first time in program history, Bradley has had 12 players hit at least one three-pointer. In fact, the Braves are the only team in the MVC to have more than 11 individuals with at least one three-pointer this season and Bradley has more than 10 individuals with at least one make from beyond the arc for the first time since 2012-13.

TAKING ADVANTAGE

Sophomore Whitney Tinjum has made a habit of getting to the free throw line, averaging over five free throw attempts per game in her 13 outings. Tinjum, who had a streak of 18 consecutive made free throws, would rank third in the league in free throw percentage at 83.3 percent if she had enough games played to qualify. Despite playing in just 13 contests, Tinjum is sixth in the MVC in made free throws having made 55-of-66 attempts. Senior Michelle Young (69-for-87) is attempting 4.4 trips to the line per game after leading the league in free throw attempts last season. Young is third in the Valley in free throw percentage at 79.3 percent. In addition, freshman Tanya Sims made her first 12 free throws of the year, before her first miss from the line against Wichita State (Jan. 16) and is 18-of-22 (81.8 percent) from the charity stripe. As a team, Bradley is second in the Valley in free throw percentage at 72.1 percent.

WELCOME BACK

For the first time this season Bradley had its entire roster in uniform for the Missouri Valley Conference opener against Northern Iowa (Jan. 2). Sophomore Whitney Tinjum, who is averaging 13.0 points per game, was not eligible until the Dec. 18 contest against Chicago State. Freshman Tanya Sims, who has scored 6.5 points per outing, returned from an injury which sidelined her for eight games Dec. 30 vs. Northern Illinois. Senior Michelle Young (13.4 ppg) and freshman center Haley Van

Cleave both missed the Dec. 30 contest vs. NIU, but returned to the floor against Northern Iowa (Jan. 2). Young had played in 77 consecutive games before missing the game against NIU due to illness and came off the bench vs. UNI. The Braves have had their full roster in uniform for a total of four games this season.

SCORING BINGE

Sophomore Whitney Tinjum has been on a tear since making her debut against Chicago State, scoring in double figures in her first five games and collecting eight or more in 11 of 13 outings. Tinjum is the eighth player in school history to score 10 or more points in each of their first five games on The Hilltop and first to do so since Western Illinois transfer Michelle Nason scored in double figures in each of her first eight outings in 1993-94.

STEPPING UP

With leading scorer Michelle Young sidelined for the Dec. 30 game against Northern Illinois (Dec. 30) due to illness, sophomore Whitney Tinjum came up big in her absence with a career-best 28 points. Tinjum scored 16 of Bradley's first 20 points, helping the Braves to a 20-16 lead less than nine minutes into the contest. She finished with 28 points, nine rebounds and a pair of steals. Recently, Tinjum has scored 15 or more in three of the last four games and has averaged 14.3 points and 8.5 rebounds during that span.

MAKING THEM COUNT

Sophomore Whitney Tinjum was a perfect 14-for-14 from the free throw line Dec. 30 against Northern Illinois, scoring a career-best 28 points. Her 14 free throws tied for the fifth best single-game total in school history and Tinjum is just the third individual in program history to make 14 or more free throws in a game without a miss. Stephanie White was 15-for-15 from the charity stripe against Western Illinois on Dec. 4, 1998 and Catie O'Leary was 16-for-16 at Wisconsin-Milwaukee on Dec. 4, 2012. Tinjum is 55-for-66 from the line this season (83.3 percent) and is averaging five free throw attempts per game. She had a streak of 18 consecutive made free throws between the Dec. 21 game against Bowling Green and the Jan. 2 contest vs. UNI.

HEATING UP

Freshman Danielle Brewer has emerged as Bradley's top outside scoring threat, making 10-of-30 three-point attempts (33.3 percent) over her last 15 games. The top three-point shooter on the team, Brewer has made 12-of-40 (30 percent) from beyond the arc on the year. She is 11-for-32 from long range (34.4 percent) over the last 18 contests, after a 1-for-8 start from three-point range in her first three collegiate outings.

IN THE LINEUP

Freshman Anneke Schlueter is one of two Bradley players to start at least 17 games this season, appearing in the starting lineup in each of the first 14 games of her career before coming off the bench at Evansville (Jan. 12). Schlueter was the first Bradley freshman to start their first 14 games on The Hilltop since Michelle Lund in 2008-09. In fact, Schlueter, who is averaging 6.2 points per game and leads the squad with 15 three-pointers, is just the fourth freshman since 1990-91 to start the first 14 games of their career. Joining her and Lund on the exclusive list are Jen Brown in 2003-04 (28 games) and Heather Best in 1995-96 (27 games). Both Lund and Brown were selected to the MVC All-Freshman Team, while Best is a Bradley Hall of Fame member who earned First-Team All-Valley honors as a senior.

ALL-AROUND EFFORT

Senior Michelle Young turned in arguably the best all-around performance of her career in the Dec. 6 win against Missouri, collecting 24 points, six rebounds, five assists and six steals to help highlight the victory. Young was the first Bradley player to collect 20 points, five boards, five assists and at least five steals in an outing since Raisa Taylor against Indiana State on March 5, 2011 and was the first player in the MVC to reach those numbers in a game this season. Young hit a career-high two three-pointers against Missouri in addition to matching a career-best with five assists.

WIN AGAINST THE SEC

Bradley improved to 3-1 against "Power 5" conference opponents all-time at Renaissance Coliseum and has won three straight home games against those squads after the 76-64 victory against Missouri on Dec. 6. The win was Bradley's first against a team from the Southeastern Conference in four attempts. Missouri was the first SEC team to play at Bradley since Dec. 1992.

ON THE MARK

Freshman Anneke Schlueter made 4-of-5 three-pointers and finished with a season-best 18 points to help highlight the Dec. 6 win against Missouri. Schlueter, who entered the game 3-for-20 from three-point range, helped key a 16-0 first-half run for the Braves with a pair of three-pointers and two assists. She helped Bradley hit a season-high nine three-pointers (34.6 percent) for the team's highest three-point field goal total since making 11 at Missouri State on Feb. 8, 2013. The Braves had made a combined 10 three-pointers in the three previous games combined.

POSTSEASON FOES

The Dec. 21 matchup with Bowling Green marked Bradley's sixth game in 10 outings against teams which played in the postseason in 2013-14 and the Braves have now played a total of 10 games against teams which were in the postseason last year. Bradley opened the season with four consecutive road games against squads which played in the postseason last year. Bradley's first three opponents this season have combined for a 45-21 (.682) record through Feb. 6 with Arkansas, Connecticut, Duke, Kentucky, Mississippi State, Northwestern (2x), Notre Dame, Texas, Texas A&M, South Florida, West Virginia and Villanova combining for 12 of the 21 losses. Bradley's first eight opponents have a 99-78 (.559) record through Friday and the 11 non-conference teams have combined for a 120-117 (.506) mark through that same date. Six Bradley non-conference foes own records of 12-10 or better.

BREAKTHROUGH GAME

Sophomore Leti Lerma scored a career-high 21 points on 9-for-12 shooting Nov. 30 against Southeast Missouri State. Lerma is 29-of-58 (50 percent) from the field in her last 11 games at Renaissance Coliseum going back to last season and has averaged 7.4 points per game in her last 16 home games. Lerma was the first Brave to score at least 20 points and shoot 75 percent from the field since Katie Yohn at Evansville on March 3, 2013 and she was the first Bradley player to shoot at least 75 percent and finish with 20 points or more in a home game since Kelsey Budd was 9-for-12, including 6-of-7 from three-point range, and had 25 points against Indiana State on Jan. 14, 2012.

BROADWAY STAR

Senior Michelle Young was the star of the show in Bradley's setback at Columbia (Nov. 26) in the first game in program history in New York City for the Braves. Young tied the Bradley single-game scoring record with 38 points against the Lions to match the school record set by Judy Burns against Loyola on Feb. 1, 1983. Young is the third player in program history with three career 30-point games and first to have three outings of at least 30 points since Shelli Braud (1984-88). Burns and Braud are the only other Braves with three or more career 30-point games. Young is averaging 13.4 points per game this season and 14.1 points per outing over her last 17 outings. She has climbed up 12 spots on Bradley's career scoring list in her last 14 games into a tie for 17th.

SCORING BINGE

Michelle Young improved her scoring output in each of the first five games of the season and has scored in double figures in 15 of 20 games heading into Sunday's home game against Evansville. She has scored 10 or more points in 19 of the last 24 games dating back to last season, averaging 14.6 points per game during that stretch.

GETTING TO THE LINE

Bradley is third in the Missouri Valley Conference in free throw attempts per game, making 18.8 trips to the line each outing and the Braves are second in the league in free throw percentage (72.1 percent). BU has more made free throws (284) than one MVC squad has attempted this season through Feb. 6. Senior Michelle Young has helped spearhead the Braves many trips to the line by connecting on 69-of-87 attempts, while sophomore Whitney Tinjum has averaged over five attempts in her 13 outings so far. Bradley set school season records for free throws made and attempted last year as a team, while Young led the MVC in free throws made (137 - 4.6 per game).

ANOTHER RECORD

In addition to tying the Bradley single-game scoring record at Columbia, senior Michelle Young tied the school record for field goals in a contest by making 17 against the Lions. Young matched the school record of 17 field goals set by Karen Anderson vs. St. Xavier on Dec. 14, 1981.

YOUNG GUNS

Bradley had four freshmen in the starting lineup at 18th-ranked DePaul (Nov. 18) with freshman Madison Dellamuth making her first career start and joining fellow freshmen Danielle Brewer, Anneke Schlueter and Tamy Sims in the starting five. The game against the Blue Demons marked the first time in program history four freshmen started a game for the Braves. In fact, Bradley had not had four freshmen start at least one game in the same season since 1988-89. Schlueter is the first freshmen to start the first 14 games of their careers since Michelle Lund made 23 consecutive starts as a frosh to open the 2008-09 campaign. Freshmen have accounted for 48 percent of the team's starts this season and 44 percent of the minutes played, while upperclassmen have accounted for 31 percent of the starts and 33 percent of the minutes through 21 games.

NEW FACES

Bradley had four newcomers in the starting lineup at Illinois-Chicago in the season opener, including three freshmen. The Braves had not had four newcomers in the starting five of a season opener since 1984-85 when the starting five consisted of four first-year junior college transfers and one returning junior (Lisa Cech). Freshman Tamy Sims led Bradley in scoring with 12 points and was the first freshman to lead the team in scoring in a season opener since Katie Yohn had 16 points to open the 2009-10 campaign.

STRONG DEBUT

Freshman Tamy Sims, who recently missed eight games due to injury, led Bradley with 12 points, six rebounds and three blocks in the season-opening setback at Illinois-Chicago Nov. 14. Sims was the first Bradley freshman to score in double figures in their debut since Katie Yohn (16 points) and Olivia Allen (15 points) both scored in double figures in the 2009-10 season opener at Northern Illinois. Sims is the 15th Bradley freshmen to score in double figures in their debut since the start of the 1978-79 season and joins Hall of Fame member Val Wancket, Maureen Hogan and Kelly Krumwiede as the only freshmen in school history to collect at least 12 points and six boards in their first games as a Brave.

40TH SEASON

The 2014-15 season is the 40th year of intercollegiate competition for the Bradley Women's Basketball team. The Braves are playing their fifth season at Renaissance Coliseum and this winter's campaign marks the team's 32nd as a member of the Missouri Valley Conference. Head coach Michael Brooks is in his third season as head coach of the Braves and fifth overall with the program.

YOUTH MOVEMENT

With eight newcomers on the roster, including six freshmen, Bradley has arguably the youngest squad in the Missouri Valley Conference. The Braves have six freshmen on a squad for the first time since 2008-09 when Bradley had seven freshmen. With only three upperclassmen, including a league-low one senior, the Braves have the fewest upperclassmen in the MVC. Wichita State, with three seniors and one junior, is the only other Valley team to have fewer than five upperclassmen in 2014-15. Bradley's three upperclassmen are the fewest on the roster since 2002-03 when the Braves had three seniors and no juniors.

ADDING EXPERIENCE

Despite Bradley adding a total of eight newcomers to the squad for 2014-15, the Braves welcomed two experienced players with the addition of a pair of transfers. Junior Sameia Kendall earned honorable mention WBCA All-America honors at Johnson County Community College as a sophomore in 2013-14 after she averaged 12.0 points, 3.8 rebounds, 3.5 assists and 2.1 steals per game and the 5-8 guard helped her junior college to back-to-back 30-2 seasons. Mid-year transfer Whitney Tinjum made her Bradley debut Dec. 18 against Chicago State after sitting out the 2014 Fall semester. The 6-1 forward played in 12 games as a freshman at Washington State. The four-time North Suburban Conference Player of the Year is the career scoring and rebounding leader at Chisago Lakes High School in Minnesota. Bradley has a NCAA Division I transfer on the roster for the fifth

consecutive year and the Braves have had at least one Division I transfer all but one year (2009-10) since the start of 2006-07.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

The Braves will play 15 home games in 2014-15 for the most regular-season home contests since 1984-85 (15). In addition to playing the most regular-season home games in 30 years, Bradley completed the longest home stand in program history during 2014-15. After opening the season with five consecutive road games, the Braves played the final six non-conference games of the year at Renaissance Coliseum to kick off a school-record eight-game home stand to break the previous record of six consecutive home games to conclude the 1993-94 regular season.

FILLING IT UP

Senior Michelle Young scored in double figures a team-high 19 times in 2013-14 and she has scored 10 or more points in 43 of her last 63 games. Bradley's active career scoring leader with 980 points, she is tied for 17th on BU's all-time scoring chart. Young is the 15th player in program history to score 700 career points before the end of their junior season. Fourteen of the 16 Braves who have scored 1,000 career points had 700 or more points before the start of their senior year. Young had eight 20-point games last year and she was the first non-senior to lead the team in scoring since Katie Yohn did so as a freshman in 2009-10. Young has a chance to become the first Bradley player to lead the team in scoring in back-to-back seasons since Sara Bailey paced the Braves in scoring in 2000-01, 2001-02 and 2002-03. In addition, she could be the first player to lead Bradley in both scoring and steals in consecutive seasons since Shelli Braud in 1986-87 and 1987-88.

WELCOME TO THE PRAIRIE STATE

Bradley's nine newcomers come to Peoria from four states and one foreign country (Germany). The 2014-15 roster has individuals representing seven different states or countries. Bradley has not had seven states or countries represented on a roster since 1998-99 when the Braves had five states and two foreign countries. Freshman Anneke Schlueter (Ulm, Germany) is the first foreign born Bradley player since Hanna Muegge wrapped up her four-year career on The Hilltop in 2011-12. Freshman Danielle Brewer (Coatesville, Ind.), who was home schooled, is the first Brave from the Hoosier State since Amanda Reash in 2000-01. Bradley has a player from Minnesota for the 10th consecutive year, while freshman Tamya Sims gives the Braves a player from Wisconsin for the fifth straight season. A pair of freshmen from Iowa (Shareece Burrell & Haley Van Cleave) give Bradley at least one individual from the Hawkeye State for the seventh consecutive year. Junior college transfer Sameia Kendall (Kansas City, Kan.) is the first BU player from the Sunflower State since Megan Klingler in 2007-08.

WHEN OPPORTUNITY KNOCKS

With eight newcomers on the roster, the new Braves will have plenty of opportunities to show off their abilities in 2014-15. Bradley ranked third in the MVC in scoring at nearly 70 points per game, but the Braves return a league-low 37.9 percent of their scoring from last year. One of three MVC teams to return less than 50 percent of the team's scoring from the previous year, Bradley and Loyola are the only squads in the Valley to have less than 50 percent of the squad's scoring, rebounding and assists from 2013-14.

The Bears hold a 48-23 lead in the all-time series after winning at Renaissance Coliseum earlier this season and MSU has won four straight overall against the Braves. Bradley is 9-28 in road games against Missouri State, but is 2-2 in its last four trips to Springfield, Mo., and 5-5 on the road in the series over the last 10 years.
