## At A Glance

The University of Central Oklahoma begins a two-game road trip to end the regular season Saturday, when the Bronchos take on Week 10 opponent Washburn in Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association play at Yager Stadium.

The Bronchos take a 5-4 record and a three-game win streak to Topeka. Washburn is 6-3 and a win by UCO would put the Bronchos third in the league standings heading into the final weekend of the season.

"We're only focused on doing our job in this game," UCO head football coach Nick Bobeck said. "What has worked for us during the last few games has been working for us all season. We got unlucky a few times early in the year against some really good teams, but we haven't changed what we're doing. We just need to go out and do that Saturday and see how it goes."

What has worked is getting the ball to J.T. Luper. The senior wide receiver heads into Week 10 as the nation's leader in catches and yards. Luper leads the NCAA (all divisions)

with 1,322 yards receiving on 83 catches through nine games this season. Luper ranks No. 1 in the land in those categories, as well as yards per game. He also ranks atop Division II in receptions per game (9.2).

The Sherman, Texas native has 282 yards in the return game, plus 27 rushing yards, to give him 1,631 all-purpose yards this season. That ranks sixth in Division II. Luper has 10 touchdowns this season, all hauled in in the passing game. But he also passed for one too in Week 8. With two games left in the season, Luper already has the UCO single season record for receptions and is just 147 yards short of the school record for yards in a season. He averages 146.9 per game.

Chas Stallard has found a way to get Luper the ball even as teams hone in their focus on the wideout. What has been most helpful for Stallard, is his other receivers. Josh Crockett (36 receptions, 524 yards, five touchdowns) and L'liott Curry (26 receptions, 507 yards, five touchdowns) are playing just as important a role on offense, as defenses have been forced to account for three score-at-will

receivers on almost every play.

Stallard, known for pulling down and taking off on the run, has progressed this season in standing in the pocket, being patient, and finding one of those targets. The senior quarterback, who owns nearly every UCO passing record, is 193 of 300 this season for 2,683 yards and 23 touchdowns. He ranks fourth in the country in yards, and ninth in touchdown passes.

For all to be said about the offense, Bobeck is right in that the Bronchos haven't changed anything on offense. The defense hasn't changed either, but it has stepped up and begun to make the big plays that put the Bronchos in control of a game.

Colton Lindsey's mid-season surge to becoming the leader of the defense has been key. The junior linebacker leads the team with 75 tackles this season – four for a loss – and last week got his first interception. UCO got four interceptions in a Week 9 win over Central Missouri.

Alex Figueroa has consistently been a force on defense. Also a junior linebacker, Figueroa is

second on the team with 63 tackles and has 8.5 for a loss including three sacks. He also got his first interception last week – a clutch stop in the red zone with less than 30 seconds to play in the first half. Both Lindsey and Figueroa also have three pass break-ups.

Washburn, currently tied for third in the league with Central Missouri, has both the fourth-best offense and the fourth-best defense in the league as well. The Ichabods average 34.6 points per game and allow just over 26 points per game. Washburn averages 205 passing yards per game, and 185 rushing yards per game, giving them the sixth-best offense in the league.

UCO and Washburn have played six times, with both teams winning thrice. Bobeck's first win as head coach of the Bronchos came against Washburn in 2012.

The Bronchos beat Washburn at Wantland Stadium when the Ichabods first visited UCO and came to Edmond as the No. 5-ranked team in the country.

### About Bobeck

Nick Bobeck is in his sixth season as head coach of his alma mater. Bobeck is 27-37 overall through five seasons plus four games this year. He led UCO to an 8-4 record in 2014 and an appearance in the Mineral Water Bowl and followed that up with a 7-5 record in 2015 with a win in the Live United Bowl over longtime rival Southwestern Oklahoma State.

### Rare Air on the Road

Central Oklahoma looks to make it two in a row in Topeka, as well as two in a row on the road. UCO beat Missouri Southern on the road in Week 8, winning away from Edmond for the first time since November of 2015.

### Get To The Red Zone

Central Oklahoma ranks ninth in the country in Red Zone Offense, scoring on 30 of 32 trips inside the opponents' 20-yard line this season. That's also tops in the MIAA.

The Bronchos have come away with 13 passing touchdowns, 13 rushing touchdowns, and four field goals in its 32 trips.

### Oskie

Central Oklahoma made four interceptions last week in a win over Central Missouri. The Bronchos have nine this season. Its four last week were nearly as much (six) as the Bronchos had in all of 2016.

Stephan Robinson leads that charge, grabbing three interceptions this season. He has one pick-6, taking an interception 98 yards for a touchdown three weeks ago against Nebraska-Kearney.
